WITH US MAJOR (RECENTLY PROMOTED FROM COMMANDANT MENA) AND CAPTAIN
KAMBA OF ANC ON MISSION TO STUDY SITUATION AT TSHIKAPA AND DIMBELENGE
WITH VIEW TO POSTING ANC TROOPS THERE. OUR VISIT FOLLOWED REPORTS OF
A MINOR INCIDENT BETWEEN SIERRA LEONEAN TROOPS AND GENDARMERIE ON 25
OCTOBER MENTIONED TO OUR OPS/554 OF 25 OCTOBER AND A DEMAND FROM
ADMINISTRATOR AT TSHILAPA, MUABI (A LULUA) TRANSMITTED THROUGH
LULUABOURG GOVERNMENT, THAT WE SHOULD HAND OVER RESPONSIBILITY FOR
MAINTENANCE OF ORDER TO GENDARMERIE. IN MEETING WITH UNIKAS MINISTER
OF INTERIOR KENGELE AND MUABI, AT WHICH ADJUSTANT COMMANDING
GENDARMERIE WAS PRESENT, MENA STATED THAT GENDARMERIE

BEING PART OF ANC, WERE CONTROLLED BY CENTRAL GOVERNMENT BUT WERE AT DISPOSAL OF PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT (UNIKAS) FOR MAINTENANCE OF ORDER (AND NOT AT DISPOSAL OF ADMINISTRATOR, WHO SHOULD APPLY TO UNIKAS GOVERNMENT IF HE NEEDED GENDARMES FOR ANY PARTICULAR PURPOSE). MUABI STATED THAT HE COULD NOT RECOGNISE AUTHORITY OF UNIKAS GOVERNMENT OVER TSHIKAPA TERRITORY AND THAT HE CONSIDERED HIMSELF AS STILL DEPENDANT ON LULUABOURG GOVERNMENT TO WHICH HE CONTINUED TO REPORT, AS HE HAD RECEIVED NO INSTRUCTIONS THAT THE TERRITORY FORMED PART OF UNIKAS. KENGELE SAID MUABI TOTALLY IGNORED UNIKAS GOVERNMENT AND THAT EMISSARY OF LULUABOURG GOVERNMENT. MULAMBA, WHO HAD BEEN SENT TO TSHIKAPA TO ORGANISE THE ADMINISTRATION HAD MADE NO CONTACT WITH UNIKAS GOVERNMENT. KENGELE ADDED THAT THERE WAS STILL NO COMMUNICATION (EXCEPT UN) OF ANY KIND BETWEEN TSHIKAPA AND LULU OR LEO. AN ACCOUNT OF THE INCIDENT OF OCTOBER 25 BETWEEN SIERRA LEONEANS AND GENDARMERIE AT TSHIKAPA BY KENGELE BEING POUCHED. MENA SAYS HE IS ASKING FOR ONE COMPANY OF ANC FOR TSHIKAPA. IT IS MOST DESIREABLE WE SHOULD WITHDRAW OUR TROOPS FROM TSHIKAPA (WHICH THEY HAVE NOW BEEN FOR 5 WEEKS) EARLIEST POSSIBLE. LEWIS IS REPRESENTING THIS URGENTLY ON THE MILITARY NET. ALSO IT MIGHT BE HELPFUL IF APPROPRIATE CENTRAL GOVERNMENT AUTHORITY WOULD INSTRUCT ADMINISTRATOR MUABI TO WHICH PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT HE SHOULD WORK.
