





SITREP COVERING PERIOD 220600B MAY TO 221800B MAY 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE DAY OBSERVED WITH THE VICTORY OF RPF BY CAPTURING KIGALI AIRPORT AND CAMP KANOMBE WITH OUT ANY RESISTANCE FROM RGF. RPF HAVE TAKEN OVER AREAS FROM CND TO CAMP KANOMBE. RPF TROOPS ARE CURRENTLY DEPLOYED AT KIA AND CAMP KANOMBE. NO OF REFUGEES SEEN COMING TO THE AIRPORT. RGF HAVE ABANDONED KIA AND CAMP KANOMBE LIVING ARMS, AMMUNITION, EQUIPMENTS AND A LOT OF PERSONAL BELONGINGS. IT SEEMS THAT RGF HAVE VACATED THOSE TWO POSITIONS IN A HURRY. RGF IS NOW CONSOLIDATING THEIR MAJOR EFFORTS AT PRESIDENTIAL GUARD REGIMENT LOCATED NEAR KIMIHURURA. THE FIGHTING STILL CONTINUING BETWEEN RPF AND RGF AT KICHIKIRO AREA. RPF CONTINUED TO PUT PRESSURE ON THE RGF AT PRESIDENTIAL GUARD LOCATIONS AT KIMIHURURA. RGF STILL CONTROLLING RUHENGERI IN THE NORTH. THE INTERHAMWES AND MILITIA ARE FOUND QUITE DISORGANIZED IN THE EASTERN PART OF KIGALI. THEY ARE ALSO SEEN TAKING OUT A LOT OF PRIVATE VEHICLES AND GOODS FROM MAGERWA (RWANDA GENERAL STORES).

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SRSG ARRIVED NAIROBI TO CONTINUE HIS EFFORTS IN SEEKING THE ASSISTANCE AND COOPERATION OF GOVERNMENTS IN THE REGION TO END THE HUMANITARIAN CRISIS IN RWANDA. FC WAS INTERVIEWED BY RADIO FRANCE INTERNATIONAL AND DR. KABIA BY CNN, CBC AND BBC. DR. KABIA GAVE HIS REGULAR TELEPHONE BRIEFING TO MEDIA CORRESPONDENTS RESIDENT IN NAIROBI.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF HAVE TAKEN OVER THE CONTROL OF KIGALI AIRPORT AND CAMP KANOMBE. THEY HAVE DEPLOYED APPROX TWO BATTALIONS AT KIA AND ONE BATTALION AT CAMP KANOMBE. THEY ARE STILL HOLDING THE HIGH GROUNDS DOMINATING THE AIRPORT. THEY ARE INFILTRATING INTO GIKONDO FROM REBERO HILLS. RPF HAVE CAPTURED LOTS OF ARMS AND AMMUNITION INCLUDING 8 X 37MM ANTI AIRCRAFT GUN, 4 X 23MM QUADRI - TUBER, 1 X 50 BROWNING MACHINE GUN, 3 X 60MM MORTAR, HUGE AMOUNT OF SMALL ARMS AMMUNITION AND VEHICLES. CONTINUING PRESSURE ON RGF POSITIONS IN THE KIGALI CITY.

B. RGF. RGF LOST THE BATTLE AT CAMP KANOMBE AND KIA BY SUSTAINING HEAVY CAUSALITIES. THEY ABANDONED BOTH THE LOCATIONS IN A HURRY. THEY ARE NOW CONSOLIDATING THEIR MAIN EFFORTS IN KIGALI CITY. THE MORALE OF RGF HAS BEEN AFFECTED BUT NO PANIC HAS BEEN NOTICED AMONG THE LEADERSHIP. PRESENTLY RGF IS NOT IN A POSITION TO LAUNCH ANY COUNTER OFFENSIVE AGAINST RPF DUE TO SERIOUS SHORTAGE OF AMMUNITION (ARTY/SMALL ARMS) AND SUPPLIES.

B. UNOMUR. UNOMUR OPERATIONAL AREA IS CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN AOR. CMO WENT TO KAMPALA TO RECEIVE GEN BARIL AND HIS TEAM. DCMO CARRIED OUT RECCE IN AOR. A COORDINATION MEETING WAS HELD AT UNOMUR HQ ON 212000 HRS BETWEEN NGOS AND DIFFERENT HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES WHO ARE OPERATING IN RWANDA. THE TEAM DEPLOYED AT MERAMA HILLS CROSSING POINT HAS INFORMED THAT ALMOST EVERY DAY TRUCKS CARRYING YOUNG MEN, AGED 19-25 YEARS LIKELY TO BE NEW RECRUITS OF RPF. THESE TRUCKS AND DRIVERS ARE WELL KNOWN AND NORMALLY CROSS THROUGH KATUNA CP/OP. ONE OF THE TRUCKS WENT TO MBARARA THREE DAYS BEFORE AND MBARARA IS SUSPECTED AS MILITARY TRAINING CENTER OF RPF. MR STEPHAN KANMYISHA ONE RPF COMMANDER IS CROSSING THE BORDER EVERY DAY AT CYANIKA OP/CP. HE OFTEN GOES TO KISORO TO MEET THE NRA BATTALION COMMANDER OR TO VISIT THE KISORO HOSPITAL. HE NORMALLY RETURNS IN THE EVENING. THE TEAM ALSO INFORMED THAT NRA SOLDIERS IN CIVIL CLOTHES ARE COMPLAINING AGAINST UNOMUR PATROLS AT BUSANZA AREA (SQ-5655) AND ALSO INSTIGATING LOCALS TO DO THE SAME. ON 21 MAY 94 SEVEN VEHICLES OF ICRC, NINE VEHICLES OF OTHER HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES CROSSED THE BORDER THROUGH KATUNA TO RWANDA AND RETURNED ON THE SAME DAY. TOTAL TWENTY VEHICLES CROSSED THE BORDER AT KATUNA, KASHEKYE AND MERAMA HILLS TO RWANDA WITH 159 PASSENGERS INCLUDING 103 REFUGEES. ANOTHER 16 VEHICLES CROSSED THE BORDER AT KATUNA, KASHEKYE, AND KYANIKA TO UGANDA WITH 57 PASSENGERS INCLUDING NINE REFUGEES. 

MAJOR AREAS OF CONTINUED ACTIVITIES INCLUDE KICHIKIRO CAMP, GIKONDO, THE PRESIDENTIAL GUARD CAMP (KIMIHURURA) AND THE CITY CENTRE. IQBAL RIZA AND THE MILITARY ADVISER TO THE UNITED NATIONS, GENERAL MAURICE BARRIL ARRIVED IN KABALE, UGANDA, ON THEIR WAY TO RWANDA TO DISCUSS ALL ASPECTS OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF UNAMIR II MANDATE. FORCE COMMANDER RECEIVED POSITIVE RESPONSES FROM THE WARRING FACTIONS TO HIS PROPOSAL FOR A TRUCE DURING THE VISIT OF THE SPECIAL ENVOY. THE MILITARY SPOKESMAN COORDINATED A VISIT OF PRESSMEN TO THE AIRPORT AND KANOMBE CAMP. THE FORCE COMMANDER WAS INTERVIEWED BY CBC AND DR. KABIA BY CBS RADIO.







1. GEN SITUATION. WAR BETWEEN RGF AND RPF IS GOING ON. SITUATION IS MARKED BY MOVEMENT OF BOTH FORCES AND THE EVACUATION EFFORTS FOR EXPATRIATES AND UNESSENTIAL UNAMIR CIVILIAN PERSONNEL. CND HAS BEEN HEAVILY SHELLED IN THE LATE AFTERNOON. THE MOVEMENT OF THE RPF FORCES TOWARDS KIGALI IS NOT MONITORED BY UNAMIR SINCE OUR UNMOS HAVE BEEN CONCENTRATED AT MULINDI. ABOUT TWO RPF BATTALIONS OF THE NORTH ARRIVED AT KIGALI AND ARE TAKING OVER CONTROL OF THE CITY. THE GOVERNMENT FORCES ARE SEALED OFF AND RPF SEEMS VERY CONFIDENT AND HAS A LARGE CONSOLIDATING CAPACITY. THE FIRST EXPATRIATE CONVOY IS STOPPED AND CHECKED BY RGF/GENDARMERIE. AIRPLANES WITH WATER AND FOOD RATIONS ARRIVED AT KIGALI AND READY TO EXPATRIATE A FIRST BATCH OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL. FORCE COMD TRIED TO NEGOTIATE A CEASE FIRE BUT DID NOT SUCCEED SO FAR. US EMBASSY STARTED THE EXPATRIATION OF US/CANADIAN EXPATRIATES WITH ESCORTS PROVIDED BY UNAMIR WHENEVER REQUESTED. E. MILOB. MILOB HQ IS CO-LOCATED WITH THE FORCE HQ AND MILOBS ARE PRINCIPALLY CARRYING OUT LIAISON AND STAFF DUTIES.

(1) RPF SECTOR RPF SOURCES AT MULINDI HAVE INFORMED THAT THE RPF ACTIVITY AT KIGALI IS DESIGNED TO TIE DOWN THE RGF AT KIGALI AND TO FACILITATE THE MOVEMENT FROM THE NORTH. INTERNATIONAL PRESS REPRESENTATIVES ARE STILL WITH THE RPF HQ AT MULINDI. SEC COMD LIAISED WITH UNOMUR FOR POSSIBLE WITHDRAW THROUGH UGANDA.

(2) RGF SECTOR THE SITUATION IN RUHENGERI IS CALM. KILLINGS OF TUTSI HAPPENED AT KIBUNGO. ABOUT 5.000 DISPLACED PERSONS HAVE GATHERED AT NKUMBA.

(3) SOUTH SECTOR AT BUTARE SEVERAL CONVOYS BELONGING TO RED CROSS, UNDP AND US EMBASSY PASSED AT BUTARE AND WERE ESCORTED TO BURUNDI BY UNAMIR. ONE CONVOY WAS FIRED AT IN GITARAMA. TWO CHILDREN AND ONE WOMAN WERE SLIGHTLY INJURED BY BROKEN GLASSES.



1. GEN SITUATION. THE GENERAL SITUATION FURTHER DETORiated WHICH BROUGHT PANIC AND CONFUSION AMONG THE LOCAL PEOPLE AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL. SPORADIC SHOOTING, SHELLING AND EXPLOSIONS CONTINUED THROUGHOUT THE PERIOD. LIFE IS AT A STAND-STILL AND THOUSANDS OF CIVILIANS ARE DISPLACED IN KIGALI AND OTHER TOWNS SPECIALLY IN THE WEST AND NORTH-WESTERN RWANDA. THE WIDE SPREAD KILLING CONTINUES. TEN DEAD BODIES OF BELGIAN TROOPS WERE BROUGHT TO UNAMIR FIELD HOSPITAL. THREE FRENCH C-130 AIRCRAFT ARRIVED AT KIGALI AIRPORT ON 090330 APR 94 WITH 280 TROOPS. THE MISSION OF THE FRENCH TROOPS IS TO DEFEND THE AIRPORT AND TO EVACUATE THE FRENCH AND OTHER FOREIGN NATIONALS WHO ARE WILLING TO BE REPATRIATED. WE WERE ALSO TOLD THAT BELGIAN TROOPS WILL ARRIVE AT KIGALI AIRPORT IN NEXT TWELVE HOURS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. A NEW GOVERNMENT HAS BEEN FORMED. THE NATIONAL RADIO OF RWANDA BROADCAST THE SPEECH OF THE CURRENT PRESIDENT OF RWANDA, MR. THEODOI, THE FORMER PRESIDENT OF CND. HE ANNOUNCED THE NAME OF THE MEMBERS OF THE INTERIM GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

A. RGF. THE PRESIDENTIAL GUARD BATTALION AND A FACTION OF RGF CONTINUE FIRING RANDOMLY IN ORDER TO CREATE A SITUATION OF PANIC AND TO CONDUCT THE PLANNED ASSASSINATIONS OF MAINLY OPPOSITION POLITICAL LEADERS AND RPF SUPPORTERS.

B. RPF. ON 090940 APR 94 IT WAS REPORTED FROM THE DMZ SECTOR THAT RPF IS ADVANCING FROM MULINDI IN THREE AXES:

- (1) ROAD MIYOVE-KIGALI.
- (2) ROAD MUVUMBA-KIGALI.
- (3) ROAD NKUMBA-RUHENGERI.

RPF BN LOCATED AT CND COMPLEX CAPTURED AREAS IN BETWEEN CND AND AIRPORT. ALSO CND TO MERIDIEN HOTEL WHERE MOST OF UN MILITARY AND CIVIL PERSONNEL STAYING. THEY ARE NOW IN DEFENSIVE POSITION AROUND RUTBAT IN AMAHORO STADIUM AND THE FORCE HQ. IT IS SUSPECTED THAT RPF IS GOING TO LAUNCH A MASSIVE ATTACK ON RGF AND THE PRESIDENTIAL GUARDS ONCE THEY ARE REINFORCED FROM MULINDI.

C. OTHERS

- (1) RUTBAT LOCATION AT AMAHORO STADIUM IS OVERCROWDED DUE TO INFLUX OF REFUGEES. NUMBER OF REFUGEES IS AROUND 3000. THE NUMBER IS STILL INCREASING.

(2) THERE WAS A CROSS FIRING BETWEEN RGF AND RPF ON THE HOUSE OF THE AMBASSADOR OF THE UNITED STATES. ONE PERSON WAS KILLED AND TWO OTHER WERE SERIOUSLY INJURED. THE INJURED PERSONNEL WERE TAKEN TO THE UNAMIR FIELD HOSPITAL AND DEAD BODY EVACUATED BY THE UNAMIR FIELD HOSPITAL.

(3) ONE BELGIAN CITIZEN, MR. MUGUALNEGA REPORTED THAT HIS FAMILY WAS ATTACKED AND HIS WIFE WAS KILLED ON 081830 APR 94 AT KICUKIRU. HE REQUESTED BELGIAN EMBASSY FOR IMMEDIATE EVACUATION FROM THAT AREA.

(4) ANOTHER HOUSE OF BELGIAN CITIZEN, MR. LAMBO CHURISTI, WAS ATTACKED AT KIMIHURURA. HIS WIFE WAS KILLED AND ONE CHILD IS MISSING.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. MOVEMENT OF UN TROOPS WERE NOT ALLOWED IN THE CITY BY THE RGF AND GENDARMERIE. BUT RPF IS ALLOWING THE MOVEMENT OF APCs THROUGH THE ROAD INFRONT OF CND COMPLEX. UNAMIR FORCE HAS EVACUATED ITS OWN PERSONNEL AND CARRIED OUT MEDICAL EVACUATION OF WOUNDED UNAMIR AND OTHER PEOPLE. FC CONTINUED HIS EFFORTS TO NEGOTIATE AMONG THE RGF, GENDARMERIE AND RPF TO IMPLEMENT A CEASEFIRE. IN THIS REGARD A CRISIS COMMITTEE COMPRISING OF SOME RGF SENIOR OFFICERS AND OTHER IMPORTANT PERSONNEL HEADED BY THE COMMANDER OF GENDARMERIE MET UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE FORCE COMMANDER TO REACH THE CEASEFIRE AGREEMENT. HOWEVER, CEASEFIRE COULD NOT BE IMPLEMENTED. ON 090900 APR 94 ONE MEETING WAS SUPPOSED TO BE HELD AT KIGALI SECTOR HQ AMONG HIGH OFFICIALS OF RGF, RPF AND GENDARMERIE. BUT NO PARTIES TURNED UP TO ATTEND THE MEETING.

B. UNOMUR. NTR.

C. DMZ. RPF HAS BEEN SEEN ADVANCING TOWARDS KIGALI THROUGH DMZ SECTOR ON THREE AXIS (SEE PARA 3 B).

D. MILOB. MILOB EVACUATED ABOUT 100 DISPLACED PERSONS FROM THE FORCE HQ TO AMAHORO STADIUM AT 1700 HOURS ON 08 APR 94.

(1) RGF SECTOR. MILOBS PTLS WERE DENIED ENTRY INTO RGF AREAS AT NKUMBA. THEY WERE ALSO DENIED ACCESS TO ANY SENIOR OFFICERS OF RGF.

(2) RPF SECTOR. MILOBS REPORTED THAT CHAIRMAN RPA HIGH COMMAND MAJ GEN KAGAME MOVED OUT TOWARDS THE EAST OF RPF CONTROLLED AREA WITH FEW STAFF OFFICERS AND RETURNED ON 082200 APR 94.

(3) SOUTHERN SECTOR. MILOBS REPORTED THAT SOME BANDITS LOOTED SHOPS AT CYANGUGU. ALL SHOPS WERE MARKED WITH LETTER "H" AND "T" PROBABLY FOR EASY IDENTIFICATION OF HUTUS AND TUTSIS.

E. KIGALI SECTOR

(1) KIBAT. 1 PLATOON IS STILL DEPLOYED AT AIRPORT IN ALL ROUND DEFENCE. THE HQ WAS REDEPLOYED AT HOTEL MERIDIEN AND IS NOW OPERATING FROM THERE. THEY ALSO PROVIDE SECURITY TO THE HOTEL WHERE MANY EXPATRIATES AND LOCALS TOOK SHELTER.

(2) RUTBAT. RUTBAT WAS PLACED UNDER COMMAND OF FORCE HQ AND WAS GIVEN THE TASK OF DEFENDING THE FORCE HQ AND STADIUM COMPLEX. RUTBAT PROVIDED ARMED ESCORT FOR MOVEMENT OF UN CONVOYS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL. 25 KIBAT PERSONNEL, 63 MILOBS, 11 CIVPOL AND 3000 CIVILIANS HAVE TAKEN SHELTER IN THE STADIUM. INTENSE FIRING AROUND AMAHORO CONTINUED. RPF IS IN POSITION AROUND THE STADIUM. WHOLE RUTBAT WAS UNDER CROSS FIRE. ONE CIVILIAN WAS INJURED BY BULLET ON 090830 APR 94 AT AMAHORO STADIUM. NO LOSS OF LIFE MATERIAL BUT ONE SOLDIER HAS A MINOR BULLET INJURY AND IS PRESENTLY UNDER TREATMENT.

(3) BYUBAT GOLF. DRAWN ALL PERSONNEL BACK TO DEFENSIVE POSITION AFTER THEY WERE OVERPOWERED BY LARGE AND BETTER EQUIPPED PRESIDENTIAL GUARDS AT VIP GUARD POINTS. EXCEPT FROM FORCE HQ, KIGALI SECTOR HQ AND SRSG'S HOUSE WHERE THE GUARDS STILL MAINTAIN THEIR POSITION.

(4) TUNISIAN COY. NOW DEPLOYED AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL AND DEFENSIVE POSITION AT MERIDIEN HOTEL WHERE MOST OF UN PERSONNEL ARE TAKING REFUGEE.

5. UNCIVPOL. ALL PERSONNEL ARE SAFE AND UNDER PROTECTION OF UNAMIR FORCE.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. ALL UNHCR PERSONNEL AND OTHER NGOS AT BUTARE LEFT FOR BURUNDI ON 08 APR 94. SERIOUS FOOD SHORTAGE IS ENVISAGED AT BUTARE.

7. CIVIL AFFAIRS. NINE JOURNALISTS REPRESENTING BBC, DAILY TELEGRAPH, THE GUARDIAN, REUTERS, ASSOCIATED PRESS AND BELGIAN TV ARRIVED AT MULINDI ON 08 APR 94 FROM NAIROBI THROUGH UGANDA. THEY WERE INTERVIEWED BY DR. RUDASINGUA, SECRETARY GENERAL OF RPF. THEY HOPE TO HAVE TALK WITH GEN KAGAME ON 09 APR 94.

8. LOGISTICS. NO LOGISTICS AND RATION COULD BE SUPPLIED TO ANY UNITS OWING TO INTENSIVE FIRING ON ALL ROUTE FROM COY LOCATION.



(1) ON 311130 MAR 94, MISS EMMA, WORKER OF HOTEL MERIDIEN, INFORMED THAT THERE WAS A LIVE GRENADE IN HER RESIDENCE AT NYAMIRAMBO. KIBAT EOD TEAM WAS INFORMED AND THEY PICKED UP THE GRENADE AND KEPT IT AT THE CAMP KANOMBE FOR DESTRUCTION. GENDARMERIE IS INVESTIGATING THE INCIDENT.

(2) ON 311205 MAR 94, ONE CIVILIAN CAR NO. AC-2261 WAS HIJACKED FROM THE AREA NYAMIRAMBO. MATTER WAS INFORMED TO THE GENDARMERIE FOR NECESSARY INVESTIGATIONS.

(3) ON 312125 MAR 94 ONE GRENADE WAS EXPLODED AT IN A HOUSE NEAR DONBOSCO AREA. FOUR CIVILIANS WERE INJURED AND THEY WERE EVACUATED TO KIGALI HOSPITAL. GENDARMERIE IS INVESTIGATING THE CASE.

(4) ON 312245 MAR 94 TWO GRENADES WERE EXPLODED AT KACIKIRU AREA AND ANOTHER GRENADE EXPLODED AT KIMISAGARA. NO ONE WAS INJURED. GENDARMERIE IS INVESTIGATING.

(5) ON 010130 APR 94 ONE BANDIT WAS KILLED BY THE SECURITY PERSONNEL NEAR U.S. EMBASSY WHILE CARRYING OUT ROBBERY IN A HOUSE NEAR EMBASSY.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. FC RETURNED FROM LEAVE ON 31 MAR 94. HE HELD A CONFERENCE WITH ALL SECTOR COMDS AND ALL BRANCH HEADS OF FHQ. FC WAS BRIEFED ON THE MAJOR ACTIVITIES/INCIDENTS THAT OCCURRED DURING HIS OUT STATION PERIOD.

B. UNOMUR. UNOMUR OPERATIONAL AREA IS REPORTED TO BE CALM. SECTOR KABALE AND KISORO CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PTLs IN AOR. NO INCIDENT REPORTED. ON 311500 MAR 94 A/CMO HELD A MEETING WITH NRA COMD MAJ GEN MUSHA MUNTU AT UNOMUR HQ. NRA COMD STATED THAT HE HAD IMPOSED RESTRICTIONS ON MONITORING

UGANDA/ZAIRE BORDER BY UNOMUR UNMOS BECAUSE IT IS NOT ACCORDANCE WITH THE UNOMUR MANDATE. A/CMO AGREED WITH NRA COMD'S STATEMENT AND HE ASSURED NOT TO MONITOR ANY PART OF UGANDA/ZAIRE BORDER AREAS. HE ALSO POINTED OUT THAT SOME ROADS IN THE IMMEDIATE BORDER OF UGANDA/ZAIRE AREA LEADING DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY FROM THE MAIN ROAD BUNAGANA (KJ8957)-KISORO TO THE BORDER AREAS OF UGANDA/RWANDA. THEREFORE, THIS PART BE MONITORED BY UNMOS. AFTER STUDIED THOROUGHLY NRA COMD WAS SATISFIED THAT THE PRESENT ACTIVITIES OF UNOMUR ARE ACCORDANCE WITH THE UNOMUR MANDATE. THE NRA COMD AND A/CMO AGREED UPON THE FOLLOWING POINTS:

(1) UNOMUR WILL NOT MONITOR UGANDA/ZAIRE BORDER.

(2) NRA COMD WILL NOT IMPOSE ANY RESTRICTIONS ON UNOMUR OBSERVING ACTIVITIES CONCERNING THE MONITORING OF THE UGANDA/RWANDA BORDER.

(3) BYUBAT A, B AND C COYS CONDUCTED PTLs IN RESPECTIVE AORs WITHOUT ANY INCIDENT. 1 X AK-47, 2 X EMPTY MAGAZINES AND OTHER PERSONAL DOCUMENTS BELONGING TO THE ARRESTED RPF SOLDIER (REF OUR SITREP OF 30/31 MAR) HELD AT SECTOR HQ PENDING FURTHER ACTION.

(4) FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED SECURITY AT NGONDORE. CARRIED OUT DEVELOPMENT WORKS OF THE BASE CAMP. CONDUCTED ENGR RECCE OF THE ROAD MOVOMBO (A8818) - MEMBA (A8427) - KABINGO (A8232) - CYANGE (A8134) - RUHANGA (A8139).

D. MILOB. SITUATION IN THE SECTORS OBSERVED TO BE CALM. NO INCIDENT REPORTED.

(1) RGF SECTOR. IN RUHENGERI SOME FLAGS ARE HOISTED HALF MAST BY CDR PARTY IN MEMORY OF ONE OF THEIR PARTY MEMBER WHO WAS KILLED ON 30 MAR 94 AT KIGALI. THE FUNERAL WILL TAKE PLACE ON 01 APR 94 AT RUHENGERI.

UNMOS ARE MONITORING. ROUTINE PTLs WERE CARRIED OUT. NO INCIDENT REPORTED.

(2) RPF SECTOR. ROUTINE PTLs WERE CARRIED OUT. NO INCIDENT REPORTED. TEAM 503 CARRIED OUT PTLs AT GATUNA AND MET UNOMUR UNMOS. UNOMUR UNMOS STATED THAT THE SITUATION IN THEIR SECTOR IS CALM.

(3) SOUTHERN SECTOR. ROUTINE PTLs WERE CARRIED OUT BY RGF AND GENDARMERIE. TEAMS CARRIED OUT ONLY FOOT PTLs DUE TO LACK FUEL IN PETORWANDA FILLING STATIONS IN THE SOUTHERN SECTOR. UNHCR PERSONNEL HAVE REQUESTED UNMOS TO ASSIST THEM IN PROVIDING SECURITY DURING THEIR ACTIVITIES AT GITIZI REFUGEE CAMP WHERE PREVIOUSLY THEY WERE THREATENED TO BE ATTACKED BY HAND GRENADES.

(1) RUTBAT CARRIED OUT 4 FOOT PATROLS, 24 VEHICLE PATROLS AND 3 CHECK POINTS DUTIES. PROVIDED 6 VIPs ESCORTS. 1 FOR SRSG, 1 FOR PM DESIGNATE, 1 FOR PRESIDENT OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL COURT, 1 FOR MR NGANGO, 1 FOR MINISTER OF SOCIAL AFFAIRS AND 1 FOR RPF PERSONNEL. RUTBAT MECH COY CARRIED OUT NIGHT TRAINING ON VIP ESCORTING WITH APCs.

(2) KIBAT CARRIED OUT 7 FOOT PATROLS, 25 VEHICLE PATROLS AND 4 CHECK POINTS DUTIES. PROVIDED SECURITY TO THE KIGALI AIRPORT. ALSO PROVIDED SECURITY TO THE RESIDENCE OF MR. GULINZIRA BONIFACE AND MR. NGANGO. THEY EMPLOYED TWO APCs FOR THE SECURITY OF CND COMPLEX. PROVIDED FOUR ARMED ESCORT. 1 FOR PM, 2 FOR RPF, 1 FOR MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS.

(3) BYUBAT GOLF PROVIDED SECURITY TO THE FORCE HQ AND KIGALI SECTOR HQ. ALSO PROVIDED SECURITY TO THE RESIDENCE OF SRSG, PM, PM DESIGNATE, MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, MINISTER OF SOCIAL AFFAIRS AND PRESIDENT OF THE CONSTITUTIONAL COURT. ALSO CARRIED OUT PATROLLING AROUND THE RESIDENCE OF FORCE COMMANDER.

(4) TUNISIAN COY CARRIED OUT 2 FOOT PATROLS, 5 VEHICLES PATROLS AND PROVIDED SECURITY TO THE CND COMPLEX.

(5) SECTOR KIGALI MILOBS MONITORED 11 RGF CAMPS, 7 GENDARMERIE CAMPS AND ALSO RPF BATTALION AT CND COMPLEX. PROVIDED 7 ESCORTS, 4 FOR RPF, 2 FOR GENDARMERIE AND 1 FOR RGF.

5. UNCIVPOL. DURING LAST 24 HOURS THE SITUATION OBSERVED TO BE CALM. NO MAJOR INCIDENT TOOK PLACE IN KIGALI CITY. ON 302200 MAR 94 TWO PERSONS WERE ARRESTED AND BROUGHT TO THE PRISON OF KICUKIRO. ONE OF THEM WAS IN POSSESSION OF AN ARMS WHO WANTED TO

SHOOT SOME ONE IN A BAR. UNAMIR WAS ASKED BY THE LO OF RPF TO CONTACT GENDARMERIE FOR THE RELEASE OF THE ARRESTED PERSONS. CIVPOL IS INVESTIGATING THE ISSUE.

8. LOGISTICS. LOG COY PROVIDED SECURITY TO THE UNAMIR WORKSHOP AND UNAMIR SUPPLY AND COMMUNICATION WAREHOUSE. DRY, FRESH AND FROZEN FOOD WERE ISSUED TO THE VARIOUS COMPONENTS OF UNAMIR AS USUAL. THEY ALSO PROVIDED TRANSPORTS FOR ROTATION OF TROOPS OF BYUBAT GOLF AND FOR CARRYING UNAMIR FURNITURE FROM KIGALI CITY. 4 PERSONNEL ARE DEPLOYED AT BYUMBA TO SUPPLY FOODS TO THE UNITS LOCATED THERE. LOG COY AND ENGR COY VEHICLES/EQUIPMENTS STILL SEEMS DEFICIENCY.

A. SUPPLY OF WATER AT CND COMPLEX IS MORE ACUTE. AS A RESULT, RPF BN AND TUNISIAN COY ARE FACING ACUTE PROBLEM DUE TO WATER SCARCITY.

B. SUPPLY OF WATER AT AMAHORO STADIUM HAS BEEN OFF SINCE LAST FOUR DAYS CAUSING ACUTE THREAT TO THE HEALTH AND HYGIENE OF THE TROOPS OF RUTBAT.
