URGENT HUM CASE !!!

SUBJECT: NEED OF WATER

~~SECRET~~  
HEAD OF UNHCR FIELD OFFICE KIBUNGO INFORMED ME THIS AFTERNOON THAT ANOTHER THOUSAND RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI HAVE ARRIVED TODAY UNEXPECTEDLY AND ARE AT BIRENGA CAMP 5959 AT THE MOMENT TOGETHER WITH MORE THAN THOUSAND NEW COMERS WHO ARRIVED YESTERDAY.

NO WATER AT ALL IS AVAILABLE FOR THE NEW COMERS NEITHER THE CAMP NOR BY UNHCR AND BY GHANBATT.

UNHCR IS PROVIDING LITTLE AMOUNT OF WATER WITH JERRY CANS BUT THE SITUATION IS HOPELESS.

UNHCR FIELD COMD MADE AN URGENT REQUEST TO ME TO GET A WATER TRAILER FROM UNAMIR KIGALI. ANY AMOUNT OF WATER MORE THAN TWO THOUSAND LITRES IS HIGHLY APPRECIATED.

SITUATION WILL BECOME CRITICAL BY THE END OF TOMORROW AND WITHOUT HELP SOME CHILDREN AND ELDERLIES MOST LIKELY WILL NOT SURVIVE THE NIGHT FROM TOMORROW TO THE DAY AFTER TOMORROW.

4. a. It was reported to our team that 200 returnees were expected today from Tanzania at Nyakarambi Transit camp 7549 but only 114 have physically arrived. The UNHCR has brought about 60,000 litres of drinking water to the camp today to overcome the shortage of water.

b. It was also reported to the team by the UNHCR staff at Birenga Transit camp 5959 that a total of 997 returnees have arrived today at the camp from Burundi.



a. One team visited Musaza Health centre manned by Medicos San Fronteras. It was reported to the team that approximately 50 patients are being treated daily in the health centre. The most common disease in the area is malaria.

b. It was reported to our team by the staffs of the Rwinkwavu hospital that shortage of water supply was the major problem faced by the hospital. It has a water reservoir with a capacity of 45,000 litres. The reservoir is presently filled up by the UNHCR once per two (02) weeks. However, this arrangement does not meet the hospital's water demand. The authorities are of the view that supplying them at least once a week would probably make ends meet. The prevalent diseases in the area reported are malaria, intestinal and chronic respiratory diseases. The hospital is also providing vaccination and immunization facilities to the locals twice a week on Tuesdays and Thursdays.

c. It was reported to our team that there were 99 returnees from Burundi at Nyakarambi Transit camp 7549. The main problem faced by this camp is the shortage of drinking water.





2000 hours. Even none is allowed to call a hospital staff from his residence to attend an emergency patient during the curfew time. Further details are being ascertained and will be forwarded as soon as possible.

b. An NGO called LUTHERIAN WORLDWIDE FEDERATION (LWF) distributed 135 bags of food stuffs like maize, beans and flour to the people of RWAINKAVU area.


c. There is a shortage of drinking water in MULUNDI area and an inconsistent supply of water prevails in RUKARA commune, because of the limited capacity of the diesel engine pumping water from lower ground into the commune water supply system. The Bourgemestre of the commune requested for assistance in the rehabilitation of a water reservoir in GAHINI Sectuer for constant supply.

d. The administrator of GAHINI Hospital under RWAMAGANA Sous Prefecture complained of insufficient food for the patients, lack of medical staffs and laboratory equipments. The hospital is assisted by Italian Aid - a NGO and the World Food Programme provides food for the patients. At present there are 115 returnees in the NYAKARAMBI Transit Camp. The officials of the camp are ready to receive any returnees from Zaire.

They met the Prefect of KIBUNGO and found answers to pertinent questions like refugees houses and farms being occupied by old caseload returnees. The Prefect assured the leaders that when such cases do arise efforts were always made for settlement. The community leaders, 12 from MUGANO and the remaining 8 from NTAMBA Camps, visited BIRENGA, SAKE and KIGARAMA Communes. They made random interviews of locals in their communes and were more impressed to see their former refugee mates who returned about a fortnight ago fully settled-in. The leaders are expected to return to Burundi tomorrow.
5. The community in GATI is facing a major problem of housing as a result of destruction of houses during the civil war. The earlier returnees to the community occupied houses not belonging to them. With the return of the actual owners of the houses the illegal occupants are being ejected resulting in acute shortage of accn. It was again reported that parents also find it quite

difficult of sending their children to school because they cannot meet the school fees of RFW 300 a year plus school uniform cost.

The celebration started by a route-march by over 210 soldiers. It was followed by a parade of soldiers, primary school children and traditional cultural troupes displays. Speakers at the parade included a witness of the genocide Mr HATEGEKIMANA DONACIEN, Bourgemestre of BIRENGA, 201 A/Bde Comd and the Prefect of KIBUNGO who was the Guest of Honour. Mr Hategekimana thanked the RPA for saving the lives of innocent people including children; the Bourgemestre asked for the observance of a Minute's Silence for the dead; the 201 A/Bde Comd recounted events that led to the taking over of government which included the destruction of the economy and debasing the life of ordinary people of Rwanda by the former government; and finally the Prefect of KIBUNGO assured the people of good governance. The parade was watched by a crowd of about 5,000 which included UN Agencies and NGOs stationed in the prefecture. At a reception, the Catholic Bishop of KIBUNGO thanked God for saving the lives of innocent people and prayed for a new christian in Rwanda. Later, 201 Bde engaged KIBUNGO Town XI in a friendly football match which ended 3 - 1 in 201 Bde's favour. Finally, a Disco session and fund raising ceremony was to be held in the evening to run off the celebration.
