ECOLE TECHNIQUE OFFICIELLE-KIBUYE

1. The Ecole Technique Officielle is a government owned school situated in Kibuye town and is designed to provide quality instructions in Automechanics and General mechanics to about 300 students(Males) for the Kibuye prefecture.

2. A visit to the school on 29 Nov 95 by the Sector Humanitarian Cell revealed that following the occupation of the schools premises by the then Francophone Battalion which departed somewhere in Mar 95, most of it's resources were found either looted or damaged. The following problems were identified during the visit :

a. The distruction of the football field, basketball and volley pitches caused by the frequent and continous use of UN and NGO vehicles across the pitches on to the football field serving as a helipad for this sector. This issue is being given attention.

b. As an urgent request, the school needs quantity 150 mattresses for two other dormitories and replacements respectively to aid in the enrolment of it's student intake.

c. Assistance in rehabilitation in areas of electrical, doors and ablution units.

d. A limited number of games material particularly foot and hand balls to make teaching interesting.

3. Notably, a German organisation recently assisted the school in reconditioning six of it's eleven classrooms, a situation which made it possible for the desperate re-opening of the school on 23 Oct 95 and the subsequent enrolment of 180 students.

4. The school authorities are anticipating that every effort would be made to assist them where possible.



1. Milobs visited Cyinama Primary School (217674), Gishyita Commune on 21 Nov 95. This school has 450 students and the staff is working very hard to try and provide a high standard of education for these children.

2. ADRA is in the process of repairing the roof and installing doors and windows and repairing the infrastructure of this facility. This work is proceeding on schedule and will be completed by Feb 96. Milobs visited the classrooms while school was in progress and they desperately need the following supplies:

- 100x student desks and chairs (or benches)
- 450x school notebooks
- 450x pencils and pens
- 10x boxes of chalk (assorted colours)
- 450x erasures
- Any other paper, crayons or school supplies which are available.

3. This school is in a remote area and has not received proper support in the past. Milobs Kibuye have a truck available which could pick up these supplies from Kigali if they are available in the next two weeks.





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

REFERENCE: Milob visit to Bwiza Returnee Camp, dated 28 Sep 95.

1. A humanitarian tm composed of Milobs, the Prefet, UNHCR and WFP representatives visited the returnees in Bwiza (SC3794). This visit revealed that the 500 families there require much support. In particular seeds (beans, peas, mais and potatoes), hoes (100), tarps (200), cooking materials, blankets, and medical support are the biggest priorities. UNHCR will take the lead in coordinating their needs.

2. UNAMIR is requested to establish 5 water point in the area of grids 355968, 358962, 365965, 3697 and 3698. An engr recce is required to confirm the technical feasibility of these sites.

3. UNAMIR is also requested to provide medical support to this remote location. This could take the form of a twice weekly medical visit for several weeks until health conditions have improved. After that a once weekly schedule would greatly help these people.

4. If UNAMIR could provide this support quickly it would provide excellent service to our citizens and secondly improve our credibility in supporting our new mandate and improve our relations in this prefecture.

1. Milob teams have visited several health centers in this Prefecture on many occasions and have found that some of them are consistently short of blankets and sheets. These small health centers have attempted to request additional blankets and sheets through their own support systems for several months without success. Two of these many locations are in particularly desperate need.

2. The following blankets and sheets are requested from UNAMIR resources:

- a. 50 x blankets and 100 x sheets for Karengera health center (134511).
- b. 50 x blankets and 100 x sheets for Murunda health center (3088).

3. Karengara does not have any NGO support at this time and Murunda was sponsored by MEMISA however they stopped providing support as a result of an increased mine threat in this area. It is requested that the above mentioned blankets and sheets be delivered to Milobs Kibuye so that milob patrols can deliver them to the health centers during our patrols.

GENERATOR REPAIR KIBUYE HOSPITAL

1. The generator at the Kibuye hospital does not work and is in urgent need of repair. This week we have experienced power outages frequently which resulted in unnecessary loss of services and could have resulted in unnecessary loss of life. For example this week a cesarian delivery was underway at night when the power went out and the delivery was completed by candle light. In addition perishable medications and medical test equipment require a reliable uninterrupted source of power.

2. This hospital has attempted to have this generator repaired or replaced through their normal administrative channels without success for the past one year. MSF and SDR are the NGO's which run this hospital.

3. It is requested that UNAMIR provide a replacement 10 kw generator immediately and the technical support required to get back up power running. The existing generator has been inspected by MSF technical services section but they did not determine exactly what was required to repair the existing generator. They expect it will need a major overhaul and may be beyond economical repair. Technical support from UNAMIR is also requested to attempt to repair the old generator after the new generator is in place.

4. 1. The School's Principal called me today to verify if I received the claim (ref. A). I confirmed to her receipt thereof.
2. In the above conversation I mentioned to her that the list of items and repairs claimed is much longer than what she gave me to understand in our conversation in Kibuye on 6 July 1995 (where I asked her to send us a list). In response she said the list she sent (i.e. - ref. A) comprises all the repairs needed to put the school back in order, [REDACTED]. She would be grateful if we could attend to all items, or to as many as we can. I replied that we would do our best, but in the first place, as I promised to her in our earlier conversation in Kibuye, we would repair the damage we may have caused.
3. Given the above nature of the list, it is indeed essential to send a person to the school, to establish the damage attributable to us. This should then definitely be repaired by us (or else financial compensation paid to the school). We should then really do as much as possible to repair items not attributable to us.

BACK TO THE OFFICE REPORT FROM KIBUYE

Ref: Mr C.Ouziel's letter to Mr. Lessanu and Mr. Ncube

A visit was made by me on 04 August '95 after being briefed by Mr Eddy C. Oler, CEOS.

Mme Mukandiza Leoncie
Director, Ecole Normale Technique de Kibuye.

Farida Seif
Care taker, Ecole Normale Technique de Kibuye.

Before making a thorough investigation I had a brief meeting with the above persons. There I learnt that first french troops stayed there then Senegalese Battalion came there finally Malawi Company lived there.

It is not known to me whether UNAMIR got any inventories of materials prior to the SENBATT-entrance. Now it could not be ascertained who has damaged the school materials; It might happen that during the genocide the school materials were damaged and plundered by the bandits, or those might be damaged by either of the three troops. Even it could not be guessed what sort of equipment the school authority was possessing. Procurement section was communicated regarding this. Thence no inventories were found out.

However, I made a thorough investigation regarding the claim submitted by the school authority. The compensation they are demanding now resembles to the current market price.

The following was the breakup of their claim.

The school authority informed me that those materials may be repaired, replaced or bought if need be or they may be reimbursed the above amount.

List of damaged materials is attached herewith in french. Translation for that list is being done now; that will be sent later.

No they did not. The french humanitarian zone was set up in June. Senegalese went there then. Jan and myself did not go in until last week August. It was well into September by the time I got back there. There is no way that all this damage was done by the troops. They admit themselves that on the list there are items not attributable to UNAMIR.

This information is from UNHCR Kibuye as of 1 Aug 95. Please find the statistics as follows:

2. Please note that the numbers of the returnees in each commune are changing constantly due to the desire of the returnees to live in Rutsiro commune.


3. The bourgmestre of Rutsiro has identified land for the returnees currently in Rutsiro. This land is in Bwiza,(gr 3694) Rutsiro and is located close to the forest and the border with Gisenyi prefecture.

4. The returnees do not, however, have any housing and continue to live in disused schools and empty shops/houses near the bourgmestre's office. They state that would go to Bwiza if they received agricultural tools.

5. UNHCR Kibuye does not yet know of one case where housing has been identified for the returnees. The houses that the returnees are currently living in are houses that were vacated in 1994. The housing is therefore only a temporary measure.

6. All of the returnees were provided with a one month's supply of food by WFP. CRS/CARITAS has a programme in which food will be distributed to returnees on a monthly basis for the next three months, with a possible extension of supply. WFP Kibuye is going to start distributing food to the returnees in each commune and this is being done with MINIREISO Kibuye and the prefect.

OPENING

1. The Chairman declared the meeting open at 0935 hrs by discussing some selected issues arising from the previous meeting.

BUTARE SCHOOL PROJECT

2. On the Butare School Project, the Chairman called on Mr. DAO to highlight on plans UNAMIR has for the project.

3. Mr. DAO on his part explained that the SRSG apparently made a pledge to join forces with UNICEF to initiate the project. However, Mr. DAO said, the pledge has not been fulfilled due to UNAMIR's limited resources. Mr. DAO further said the Office of the SRSG has written to UNREO to make funds available from the trust fund to finance the project. He further explained that UNREO has communicated the request to its headquarters. He said UNREO has suggested allocations of current balance of the trust fund for selected projects of which \$50,000 is proposed for the Butare School Project. He further said what is left now is the fulfillment of the \$30,000 pledge made by UK.

4. At the meeting the G3 Engrs submitted the final estimates on the project to Mr. DAO.

WATER SUPPLY TO SCHOOLS IN BUTARE

5. The Chairman informed the meeting that the FC has tasked him to find out what was the cause of water problem to the schools in Butare. He explained that while he was at the TAC HQ, schools in Butare enjoyed water supply from UNICEF with the assistance of the TAC HQ. He said he does not know what is actually the problem now. He said the FC has called for UHAAG's intervention for restoration of water to the schools.

6. The Chairman promised to tasking the Sector Humanitarian Officer through the Sector Commander to investigate the problem for the necessary action.

7. On his part, Mr. DAO said UNICEF has a visible presence in Butare as far as water and sanitation are concerned. He further said UNICEF has the capability to undertake most of these humanitarian assistance, he therefore suggested that UNICEF be contacted to help alleviate the water problems facing the schools.

8. Mr. DAO also suggested that UHAAG contact UNESCO to assist in humanitarian needs of schools.

RUNDA BRICK FACTORY

9. The Chairman told the meeting of an assistance request from ARDEC, a brick project at Runda Commune. He explained that the request was channelled through the FC who tasked UHAAG to ascertain details of their needs. He disclosed that from reliable sources, the project is on a top priority.

10. The Chairman further said a recce to the place would soon be conducted to assess the assistance needed by the company.

11. Mr. AB Sidique DAO gave a brief background information of the project. He explained that from all indications, the top echelon of UNAMIR would want to see assistance given to the project since a prominent personality was deeply involved. Mr. DAO therefore suggested that a meeting be arranged between UHAAG and ARDEC to know exactly what their problems were.

12. Mr DAO further explained that UNAMIR had earlier offered ARDEC some assistance in terms of transport and a provision of photocopier.

OTHER MATTERS

REQUEST FOR TRANSPORT BY MINISTRY OF INFORMATION

13. Mr. DAO told the meeting that 1 x Pax bus has been approved for the ministry.

UHAAG ROLE IN THE NEW MANDATE

14. Mr DAO said UHAAG role in the new mandate is very important. Therefore there should be a policy on humanitarian assistance in this new mandate. He further explained that in fulfilling the task of the new mandate, UHAAG requires a budget to undertake this task. He said UHAAG cannot effectively execute its tasks without a budget allocation. He therefore suggested that the authorities do all within their power to secure funds for humanitarian needs.

13. Mr. DAO also expressed concern about certain developments in some departments with regards to humanitarian assistance requests directed to them for necessary action. He explained that even though UHAAG has been tasked to deal with all humanitarian requests of UNAMIR, some departments seem to have negative attitude towards humanitarian requests sent to their depts. He said there seem to be a show of power on the part of some departmental heads. He therefore called on all those in authority to assist in making UHAAG task easy.

14. A member expressed concern about the CAO's rep irregular attendance to meetings. He explained that the CAO has a vital role to play in the provision of humanitarian assistance and the presence of his representative would facilitate actions on humanitarian requests submitted to his outfit.

BRIEF ON MEDICAL HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE

15. The representative of the FMO briefed the meeting on humanitarian assistance being initiated within the independent companies.


REQUEST BY PSF

16. The FMO's rep informed the meeting that PSF is winding their operations in Rwanda due to financial constraints by its donors. He explained that PSF has assisted UNAMIR with the provision of level one humanitarian medical care since 1994. He said PSF has donated 30 days medical supplies to UNAMIR free of charge.

17. A request from PSF asking UNAMIR to provide transport for its heavy equipments from Kigali to Nairobi was tendered in by the FMO's rep.

CONCLUSION

18. The meeting ended at 1040 hrs with the Chairman expressing concern about the low attendance of the meeting.



1. PLEASE BE INFORMED THAT THE PRIMARY SCHOOL IN THE TOWN OF SURE
(3078) IS EXPERIENCING THE FOLLOWING SIGNIFICANT PROBLEMS:

- A. THEIR SEVEN TEACHERS HAVE NOT BEEN PAID SINCE MARCH AND THEREFORE HAVE NO MONEY TO PURCHASE FOOD OR OTHER NECESSITIES. THE WFP DISTRIBUTED A LIMITED AMOUNT OF MAIS, HARICOT, AND OIL IN JANUARY BUT THESE SUPPLIES HAVE LONG BEEN CONSUMED. I WILL DIRECT LIAISE WITH THE LOCAL WFP OFFICIAL TO ATTEMPT TO GET FOOD PROVIDED, HOWEVER HAC IS REQUESTED TO ADDRESS THIS CONCERN AT A HIGHER LEVEL ALSO.
- B. THIS SCHOOL HAS NO RUNNING WATER OR ELECTRICITY AS WELL AS INADEQUATE FURNITURE. A WATER HOLDING CAPABILITY AS WELL AS IMPROVED LATRINE FACILITIES ARE REQUIRED.
- B. THESE 465 STUDENTS, IN 10 CLASSES REQUIRE WORK BOOKS, PAPER, PENCILS, PENS, CHALK, AS WELL AS ANY OTHER SCHOOL SUPPLIES WE CAN GET FOR THEM. PLAYGROUND BALLS WOULD ALSO BE A DEFINITE BENEFIT TO THEIR QUALITY OF LIFE.


2. YOUR KIND CONSIDERATION AND ACTION REGARDING THESE MATTERS WOULD BE HIGHLY APPRECIATED. THIS INVESTMENT IN THE YOUTH NOW WILL PAY DIVIDENDS IN THE REHABILITATION OF RWANDA IN THE FUTURE.
