SITREP COVERING PERIOD 150600 JUN TO 151800B JUN 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE DAY WAS OBSERVED TO BE RELATIVELY QUIET. HOWEVER, HARASSING FIRE CONTINUED BETWEEN BOTH SIDES FROM THEIR RESPECTIVE POSITIONS WITHIN KIGALI UP TO 1400 HRS LOCAL TIME THEN A SURPRISING QUIETNESS. THERE ARE NO MAJOR CHANGES IN THE DISPOSITION OF THE TWO WARRING FACTIONS IN KIGALI AND IN THE NORTH OF THE COUNTRY. IN THE SOUTH, RPF TROOPS ARE REPORTED TO BE SOME 7-10 KMS WEST OF GITARAMA. MILITIA AND INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES CONTINUE TO BE ON THE INCREASE WHILE, SOME ARE STILL MANNING ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN RGF CONTROLLED AREAS IN THE CITY. THE EXERCISE ON TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS REMAINS SUSPENDED FOR ANOTHER SECOND DAY DUE TO SECURITY REASON. THE DFC HAD A MEETING WITH THE RGF COS IN THE AFTERNOON AT HOTEL DIPLOMAT. THEIR DISCUSSIONS CENTERED ON THE MUCH PUBLICIZED CEASE FIRE AGREEMENT ANNOUNCED FROM TUNIS, THE ESCALATION IN THE ACTIVITIES OF THE MILITIA/INTERHAMWE, AND THE REOPENING OF THE KIA, TO UN FLIGHTS. THE CMO ALSO MET WITH THE PREFECT OF KIGALI, AND REPS OF THE RGF, GENDARMERIE AND THE MILITIA.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES RTLM RADIO HAS BEEN BROADCASTING TO THE PEOPLE NOT TO BELIEVE IN THE CEASE FIRE REPORTEDLY AGREED BY BOTH SIDES IN TUNIS. THE INTERIM PM IS QUOTED AS SAYING THAT THE INTERIM GOVT WILL OFFICIALLY ABIDE BY AND RESPECT THE CEASE FIRE AGREEMENT. IN NEIGHBORING BURUNDI, THE INTERIM PRESIDENT HAS EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT THE DETERIORATING SITUATION.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO HARASS RGF POSITIONS IN KIMIHURURA, KIMISAGA AND THE CITY CENTER USING MORTAR, HMG AND SMALL ARMS FIRE. IT IS REPORTED THAT ABOUT 50% OF NYAMIRAMBO IS NOW UNDER RPF CONTROL. THERE ARE NO MAJOR CHANGES IN DISPOSITIONS AND THE BATTLE SCENARIO IN THE NORTH. MOPPING UP OPERATIONS HOWEVER CONTINUE AROUND GITARAMA. TROOPS REPORTED DUG IN SOME 7-10 KMS WEST OF GITARAMA. TROOPS MORALE REMAINS VERY HIGH.

B. RGF. CONTINUE TO DEFEND POSITIONS UNDER THEIR CONTROL IN KIGALI. THE CONTINUOUS DEFEAT APPEARS TO BE AFFECTING THEIR MORALE. THEY CONTINUE TO FACE SEVERE SHORTAGES OF WAR MATERIAL. NO MAJOR CHANGES IN DISPOSITIONS AND BATTLE SCENARIO IN THE NORTH. THEY ARE REPORTED TO HAVE SUFFERED SEVERE CASUALTIES IN THE FIGHT FOR GITARAMA.

C. MILITIA. MILITIA/INTERHAMWE CONTINUE TO JOINTLY CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS WITH IN THE RGF CONTROLLED AREAS. THEIR PRESENCE WAS OBSERVED AROUND HOTEL MILLE COLLINES THIS AFTERNOON. SITUATION BEING MONITORED.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED. STAFF BRIEFING WAS CONDUCTED BY THE DFC AT 0700 HRS. THE FC HAS ARRIVED IN KABALE FROM NAIROBI. HE PRESENTED UNOMUR MEDALS TO DESERVING UNMOs AT A SHORT CEREMONY THIS AFTERNOON. HE WILL SPEND THE NIGHT IN KABALE. AT 1530 HRS, THE CMO HELD A MEETING WITH THE COS OF RGF, OPS OFFICER GENDARMERIE AND THE PREFECT OF KIGALI. DISCUSSIONS WERE ON THE ROLE OF MILOBs AND OTHER SUBJECTS BORDERING ON THE COOPERATION REQUIRED FROM THESE PARTIES IN THE FUTURE MONITORING ROLE OF UNMOs. THE DFC ALSO HELD A MEETING WITH THE CHIEF OF STAFF OF RGF AT 1630 HRS.

B. UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION IS CALM. ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT IN AOR. 16 DIFFERENT HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES CROSSED THE BORDER INTO RWANDA WITH HUMANITARIAN SUPPLIES. 57 VEHICLES CROSSED THE BORDER INTO RWANDA WITH 765 PASSENGERS INCLUDING 449 REFUGEES. 50 VEHICLES CROSSED INTO UGANDA WITH 235 PASSENGERS 25 OF WHICH WERE REFUGEES. TWO HELICOPTERS ARE PRESENTLY OPERATIONAL.

C. GHANBATT. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ. PROVIDED PROTECTION AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE AT KIA AND AMAHORO STADIUM. UNIT MEDICAL OFFICER TREATED 69 DISPLACED PERSONS FROM KIA AND AMAHORO STADIUM.

D. TUN PLATOON (+). AREA OF OPERATION WAS RELATIVELY CALM. PROVIDED SECURITY AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PERSONS AT MILLIE COLLINS HOTEL, MERIDIEN HOTEL AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. ALSO CARRIED OUT APC ESCORTS.

E. MILOB. MILOB TEAMS WERE EMPLOYED FOR THE FOL DUTIES DURING THE PERIOD:

(1) MONITORING ACTIVITIES AROUND DISPLACED PERSONS CAMPS AT ST PAUL CHURCH. FOLLOWING THE INCIDENT OF YESTERDAY AT ST PAUL'S, THE MILITIA PUT A ROAD BLOCK ON THE ROAD LEADING TO THE CHURCH. THEY ALSO DENIED ENTRY TO THE UNMOs WHO WERE ON MONITORING DUTIES AT THE CAMP. THE MILITIA WERE VERY HOSTILE AND CARRIED WEAPONS AND GRENADES.

(2) ONE MILOB TEAM ESCORTED THE OFFICIALS OF WFP TO KIGALI CITY TO VISIT ALL NGO LOCATIONS.

(3) ONE TEAM ESCORTED THE OFFICIALS OF PHARMACIES SANS FRONTIERS TO REFUGEE CAMPS AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL, KIA AND AMAHORO STADIUM.

THE CMO HELD A MEETING WITH THE COS RGF, OPS OFFICER GENDARMERIE AND THE PREFECT OF KIGALI CITY AT HOTEL DIPLOMAT. THE AIM OF THE MEETING WAS TO EXPLAIN THE ROLES OF MILOBs AND THE PLAN TO RELOCATE THE MILOB HQ AT HOTEL MILLE COLLINES. THEY REQUESTED THE CMO TO PRESENT THESE POINTS IN WRITING SO THAT THEY CAN EDUCATE THE LOCALS ON THEIR ROLES. THEY ALSO WELCOMED THE IDEA OF LOCATING ONE OF THE UN FORCES HQ IN THEIR AREAS.

5. UNCIVPOL. THE SIX IN KIGALI ARE BEING EMPLOYED WITH THE UNMOs CURRENTLY.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES UNICEF CONTINUED WITH THE VACCINATION CAMPAIGN AT AMAHORO STADIUM. ICRC DELIVERED 60 TONS OF FOOD TO 15,000 PEOPLE AT RWAMAGANA, 43 TONS OF FOOD TO 4,000 PEOPLE AT BUTORO, ASSISTED IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF 120 SHELTERS, AND ALSO DELIVERED 1600 METERS OF PLASTIC SHEETS AND 100 BLANKETS IN CYANGUGU. 1256 PERSONS WERE TRANSFERRED FROM NYARUSHISHI CAMP TO MIBIRIZI BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES, THE ICRC ASSISTED IN THE TRANSFER OF 110 MEDICAL CASES. TWO PLANES LANDED IN GISENYI CARRYING 70 TONS OF FOOD FOR DISTRIBUTION IN GISENYI/RUHENGERI AREAS. ICRC TREATED 33 OUT-PATIENTS AND ADMITTED 20 PATIENTS IN THERE HOSPITAL. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS REMAINS SUSPENDED.

8. LOGISTICS. THE FORCE RESERVE STOCKS AS OF TODAY ARE:

A. RATION - 15 DAYS. (10 DAYS RATION HAS BEEN ISSUED TO FORCE HQ, GHANBATT, TUN COY AND THE CIVILIAN STAFF). WE CONTINUE MAINTAIN JOURNALISTS AND ALL VISITORS TO KIGALI UNAMIR HQ.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 141800B JUN TO 150600B JUN 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE NIGHT WAS RELATIVELY QUIET IN KIGALI CITY. EXCHANGES OF MORTAR, HMG AND SAs FIRE HOWEVER CONTINUED THROUGHOUT THE NIGHT. RPF CONTINUE TO HARASS AND ISOLATE RGF POSITIONS AND MAKING SOME SLOW PROGRESS IN THE CITY. RGF CONTINUED TO RESIST AND FIGHT BACK WITH MORTARS AND HMGs. NO CHANGES IN DISPOSITIONS IN THE NORTH. GENDARMERIE AND MILITIAS CONTINUE TO CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS IN RGF AREAS IN KIGALI CITY. FIGURES OF DISPLACED PERSONS CONTINUE TO RISE AS MORE AND MORE PEOPLE MOVE OUT FROM GITARAMA AND BUTARE TO CYANGUGU. EFFORTS ARE CONTINUING TO FIND SOLUTIONS TO THE PROBLEMS BEING EXPERIENCED WITH THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE TO SAFE AREAS. FORCE HQ WAS HIT BY SOME SMALL ARMS FIRE LAST NIGHT. THERE WERE NO CASUALTIES. THE SITUATION IN STE FAMILLE CONTINUES TO BE TENSE.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE RPF DELEGATION TO THE OAU HEADS OF STATES MEETING IN TUNIS IS REPORTED TO HAVE DECLARED A CEASE FIRE AFTER A REGIONAL CONFERENCE WAS HELD IN TUNIS BETWEEN THE TWO DELEGATIONS AND THE HEADS OF STATES OF THE FIVE NEIGHBORING STATES OF BURUNDI, TANZANIA, ZAIRE, UGANDA AND KENYA. TENSION CONTINUES TO MOUNT IN NEIGHBORING BURUNDI. THE SITUATION IS BEING CLOSELY MONITORED FROM HERE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. CONTINUED TO HARASS AND ISOLATE RGF POSITIONS WITH MORTARS, HMG AND SAs FIRE AND APPEAR TO BE MAKING SOME PROGRESS IN THE CITY. NO MAJOR CHANGES HAVE BEEN OBSERVED IN DISPOSITIONS IN THE NORTH. CONTINUED TO CONSOLIDATE THEIR POSITIONS IN AND AROUND GITARAMA. THEY SEEM TO BE IN HIGH SPIRITS DUE TO THEIR RECENT SUCCESSES.

B. RGF. CONTINUE TO BE IN DEFENSIVE POSITIONS IN AREAS UNDER THEIR CONTROL AROUND IN KYCHIKIRU, NYAMIRAMBO AND THE CITY CENTER. MORALE OF THE TROOPS APPEARS TO BE DWINDLING DUE TO THE LACK OF AMMUNITION AND THEIR RECENT FAILURES. NO MAJOR CHANGES IN DISPOSITIONS AND BATTLE SCENARIO IN THE NORTH. IN THE SOUTH, THE RGF SEEMS DISORGANIZED AFTER LOSING GITARAMA.

C. MILITIA. CONTINUED TO MAN ROAD BLOCKS, CHECK POINTS AND FIGHT ALONG SIDE GOVERNMENT FORCES. THE TENDENCY TO ABDUCT AND KILL INNOCENT CIVILIANS, INCLUDING CHILDREN IS ON THE INCREASE.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. CONTINUED TO CARRY OUT THE NORMAL ROUTINE. DFC HELD NORMAL STAFF BRIEFING AT 1900 HRS. THE PROBLEMS BEING ENCOUNTERED, THE PROGRESS OF THE CEASE FIRE TALKS AND

THE INSECURITY IN RESPECT OF THE EXERCISE TO TRANSFER DISPLACED PEOPLE WERE DISCUSSED.

B. UNOMUR. AREA GENERALLY CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT. THE FC ARRIVES KABALE LATER TODAY AND WILL BE PRESENTING MEDALS TO DESERVING UNOMUR UNMOs.

C. GHANBATT. KIA GENERAL AREA WAS CALM. CONTINUED TO PERFORM SECURITY DUTIES AT KIA, FORCE HQ AND AMAHORO STADIUM. PROVIDED SECURITY TO DISPLACED PERSONS AT KIA AND AMAHORO STADIUM. PATROLLED WITHIN KIA GENERAL AREA AND ALONG RUNWAY FROM 2300 HRS TO 0010 HRS AND 0405 HRS TO 0500 HRS.

D. TUN PLATOON(+). PROVIDED SECURITY TO DISPLACED PERSONS AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL, MERIDIEN HOTEL AND HOTEL MILLES COLLINS.

E. MILOB. THE CMO MET WITH MILOBS LAST NIGHT. HE DISCUSSED THE PRESENT SECURITY SITUATION, AND THE ROLE MILOBS ARE TO PLAY IN THE EVOLVING SITUATION.

5. UNCIVPOL. AN ADVANCE PARTY OF SIX ARE PRESENTLY IN KIGALI.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. EFFORTS ARE BEING MADE TO SOLVE CURRENT PROBLEMS ON TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE. MORE DISPLACED PEOPLE ARE REPORTED TO BE CONVERGING IN THE SW OF THE COUNTRY PARTICULARLY IN CYANGUGU AND GISENYI.

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 06 JUN 94 TO 12 JUN 94.

1. **GEN SITUATION.** THE TWO WARRING PARTIES CONTINUED TO EXCHANGE HEAVY ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAs FIRE THROUGHOUT THE WEEK. IN KIGALI, FIGHTING CONTINUED IN AND AROUND KYCHIKURU, GATSATA KIMIHURURA, GIKONDO, NYAMIRAMBO, KIMISAGARA AND THE CITY CENTRE. THE RPF CONTINUED TO TIGHTEN THEIR GRIP TO ISOLATE RGF POCKETS IN THE NORTH AND WEST OF THE CITY. AN ASSAULT ON GITARAMA BY THE RPF WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN REPELLED BY THE RGF EARLIER ON IN THE WEEK. THEY HOWEVER MANAGED TO CUT THE ROAD GITARAMA - KIBUYE JUST OUTSIDE GITARAMA LATER ON IN THE WEEK THEREBY OPENING ANOTHER FRONT IN THE CONTINUING WAR. A REPORTED MASSACRE OF THE ARCHBISHOP OF KIGALI TOGETHER WITH 2 BISHOPS AND SOME CLERGYMEN WAS ACCEPTED BY THE RPF AS AN ACT OF INDISCIPLINE ON THE PART OF THEIR TROOPS. OTHER MASSACRES WERE REPORTED IN KIGALI WHERE 13 ORPHANS WERE INSTANTLY KILLED BY ARMED MILITIAS AND 180 OTHERS WERE TAKEN AWAY TO AN UNDISCLOSED LOCATION AND LATER BRUTALLY MURDERED IN COLD BLOOD. SOME MORE KILLINGS WERE REPORTED IN OTHER PARTS OF THE COUNTRY. THE RPF IS REPORTED TO HAVE ESTABLISHED A RECRUIT TRAINING CAMP AROUND GABIRO. THE RPF CONTINUED TO ADOPT A DEFENSIVE POSTURE IN THE CITY AND OTHER AREAS UNDER THEIR CONTROL. THEY WERE ENGAGED IN FIERCE EXCHANGES WITH THE RPF IN THE NORTHERN PART OF THE CITY, SHYORONGI, KIMIHURURA, THE CITY CENTRE AND AROUND GITARAMA. CASUALTIES TO BOTH SIDES ARE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN HIGH. THE RESURGENCE OF THE MILITIA IN THE CITY WAS OBSERVED DURING THE WEEK. TWO OTHER MILITIA GROUPS WERE REPORTED TO BE OPERATING AROUND KIBUYE. 3 X MORTAR SHELLS LANDED AT ST FAMILLE COMPOUND KILLING 2 ORPHANS AND WOUNDING 8 OTHERS. A FRENCH JOURNALIST WITH CAPA, MR JEAN CHRISTOPHE KLOTZ WAS SHOT IN THE THIGH AT NYAMIRAMBO WHILE COVERING EVENTS WITH THE HUMANITARIAN TEAM. HE WAS EVACUATED TO NAIROBI ON 09 JUN 94. THE FORCE HQ BUILDING RECEIVED TWO DIRECT HITS FROM AN ANTI-AIRCRAFT GUN AND A 75mm RECOILLESS GUN CAUSING DAMAGES TO THE BUILDING. THERE WERE NO CASUALTIES. THREE TRIPARTITE CEASE FIRE MEETINGS WERE HELD WITHIN THE WEEK. THE FC CHAIRED THE FIRST ONE WHILE THE DFC CHAIRED THE OTHER TWO. SOME PROGRESS WAS MADE IN THE DISCUSSION OF THE CEASE FIRE DOCUMENT. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS TO SAFER AREAS EXERCISE REMAINED SUSPENDED DUE TO INSECURITY. WITH THE CLOSURE OF KIA, THE FIRST ROAD RESUPPLY ARRIVED IN KIGALI AFTER THE INITIAL ADMINISTRATIVE HITCHES WERE SOLVED. THE MOVEMENT OF PERSONNEL THROUGH ENTEBBE ALSO STARTED DURING THE WEEK. THE KIA REMAINED CLOSED DUE TO THE INSECURITY PREVAILING IN KIGALI. THE DFC RETURNED TO KIGALI FROM NAIROBI VIA KABALE WHILE THE FORCE COMMANDER LEFT FOR NAIROBI ON 09 JUNE 1994.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.** THE INTERIM GOVERNMENT HELD A CABINET MEETING DURING WHICH THE MINISTERS PRAISED THE PERFORMANCE OF THE RGF TO DATE. THEY APPEALED TO THE POPULATION TO CONTRIBUTE THEIR RESOURCES TOWARDS THE WAR EFFORT. THEY ALSO EXPRESSED THEIR DISAPPOINTMENT OVER THE LARGE NUMBER OF DESERTERS FROM THE RGF. THE INTERIM PRESIDENT IN A COMMUNIQUE OVER RADIO RWANDA POINTED OUT THAT PHASE 1 OF THE PACIFICATION HAS GONE WELL DESPITE SOME

SHADOWS. HE CONSIDERED POSITIVE, THE ATTITUDE OF THE UN ON THE RAPID DEPLOYMENT OF UN TROOPS TO ASSIST IN HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES IN THE COUNTRY. IN ANOTHER COMMUNIQUE ISSUED AFTER A VISIT TO GISENYI, SOME RESERVATIONS ABOUT THE PERFORMANCE OF UNAMIR WERE EXPRESSED. COL MAVERUKA WAS DURING THE WEEK APPOINTED THE NEW CHIEF OF STAFF OF THE GENDARMERIE, AN APPOINTMENT MANY HARDLINERS WELCOMED. THE OAU MINISTERIAL MEETING WAS HELD IN TUNIS. THE CURRENT CRISIS IN RWANDA WAS DISCUSSED AND AUDIENCE GRANTED TO BOTH DELEGATIONS OF THE WARRING FACTIONS. A RESOLUTION ISSUED AT THE END OF THE CONFERENCE CONDEMNED THE KILLINGS BUT STOPPED SHORT OF APPORTIONING BLAME.

3. MILITARY.

A. FORCE HQ. IN ADDITION TO NORMAL ROUTINE, BRIEFS WERE CONDUCTED EVERY MORNING AND EVENING. THE FC, COO AND UNAMIR POLITICAL ADVISOR MET MAJ GEN KAGAME DURING THE WEEK. DISCUSSIONS WERE CENTERED AROUND SECURING A CEASE FIRE, THE SHELLING OF THE AIRPORT AND THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A CENTRAL REFUGEE CAMP UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE UN. THREE ROUNDS OF CEASE FIRE MEETINGS WERE HELD WITHIN THE WEEK UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE FC/DFC. THE DFC RETURNED FROM NAIROBI VIA KABALE AND MET WITH THE RGF COS. THE DISCUSSIONS WERE ABOUT THE DELAY IN THEIR RESPONSE TO THE PROTEST LETTER SENT TO THE RGF ON THE SHELLING OF THE AIRPORT AND THE RESUMPTION OF THE DISPLACED PERSONS MOVEMENT EXERCISE. THE FORCE HQ BUILDING RECEIVED DIRECT HITS FROM AN AA WEAPON AND A CANON THERE WAS NO CASUALTY.

B. UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION HAS BEEN CALM. ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED DURING THE WEEK. THEY ASSISTED AND COORDINATED THE MOVEMENT OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL AND THE RESUPPLY CONVOY FROM UGANDA TO KIGALI. TWO HELICOPTERS WERE OPERATIONAL DURING THE PERIOD. THE DFC STOPPED OVER ON HIS RETURN TRIP AND ADDRESSED AVAILABLE OFFICERS. BORDER CROSSINGS CONTINUED WITH MORE REFUGEES COMING TO RWANDA THAN PROCEEDING INTO UGANDA. THE DETAILS ARE AS FOLLOWS:

(1) UGANDA-RWANDA.

(A) TOTAL NO. OF VEHICLES : 343.

(B) TOTAL NO OF PASSENGERS: 1082.

(2) RWANDA-UGANDA.

(A) TOTAL NO OF VEHICLES : 341.

(B) TOTAL NO OF PASSENGERS: 1413.

(3) REFUGEES FROM UGANDA. A TOTAL OF 1956 CROSSED THE BORDER INTO RWANDA.

(4) REFUGEES TO UGANDA. A TOTAL OF 36 CROSSED INTO UGANDA.

MORE HUMANITARIAN AID CONTINUED TO BE BROUGHT INTO NORTHERN RWANDA BY VARIOUS NGOS. THESE WERE DISTRIBUTED TO DISPLACED PERSONS IN THE RPF CONTROLLED AREAS. A TOTAL OF 178 NGO VEHICLES CROSSED INTO RWANDA WITH DIFFERENT RELIEF ITEMS DURING THE PERIOD. A MEETING OF HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE AGENCIES AND ALL NGOS WAS HELD TO COORDINATE THEIR ACTIVITIES AND OPERATIONS IN RWANDA. THE MEETING WAS WELL ATTENDED. THE DEPUTY CHIEF OF OPERATIONS, ROYAL NETHERLANDS ARMED FORCES, BRIGADIER GENERAL POLLEE VISITED UNOMUR DURING THE WEEK.

C. GHANBATT. THE KIA AREA WAS GENERALLY CALM IN SPITE OF OCCASIONAL NIGHT MORTAR SHELLING FROM RGF POSITIONS. ELEMENTS OF THE BATTALION (-) PROVIDED SECURITY AT THE AMAHORO STADIUM, KIA AND FORCE HQ. HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE AND PROTECTION WAS ALSO PROVIDED TO DISPLACED PEOPLE IN A CAMP AT KIA AND THE AMAHORO STADIUM. PROVIDED ARMED SECURITY FOR THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE TO SECURE AREAS AND FOR THE RGF DELEGATES TO THE CEASE FIRE TALKS. THE DFC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO THE BATTALION DURING THE PERIOD. TROOPS MORALE CONTINUE TO BE HIGH.

D. TUN PLATOON (+). CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ARMED ESCORTS FOR VISITORS AND OTHER DUTIES. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY FOR THE DISPLACED PERSONS AT KING FAISAL HOSPITAL, HOTEL MERIDIEN AND HOTEL MILLES COLLINS. MORALE OF TROOPS REMAIN HIGH.

E. MILOB GP HQ. DEPLOYMENT FOR PHASE 1 STARTED WITH THE NEW KIGALI SECTOR WHICH IS NOW OPERATIONAL FROM THE AMAHORO STADIUM. PROVIDED ESCORT TEAMS TO THE RED CROSS, JOURNALISTS, HAC AND RESUPPLY CONVOYS. ALSO PROVIDED TEAMS FOR LIAISON DUTIES BETWEEN THE WARRING FACTIONS.

F. FORCE LOGISTICS, MEDICAL, ENGINEERS AND SECURITY ELEMENTS. THERE ARE ONLY 2 X CIVILIAN SECURITY MEN LEFT WITH THE FORCE.

G. UNAMIR FORCE STRENGTH. THE FORCE LEVEL AT THE END OF THE WEEK IS AS FOLLOWS:

(1) TROOPS. INF - 353, (4 ON ADMISSION IN NAIROBI), STAFF - 24. TOTAL - 377.

(2) MILOBS. RWANDA - 117. UGANDA (UNOMUR) - 78. KENYA - 111. TOTAL - 306.

H. MEDICAL AND HEALTH STATE. THE FORCE CONTINUES TO OPERATE WITH ONLY ONE MEDICAL OFFICER AND NO PROPER MEDICAL FACILITIES. A TOTAL OF 86 CASES WERE TREATED BY THE FORCE MEDICAL OFFICER, 36 OF WHICH WERE MALARIA CASES.

4. UNCIVPOL. ALL 15 ARE STILL IN NAIROBI. THE ADVANCE PARTY IS YET TO ARRIVE.

5. ADMINISTRATION AND LOGISTICS. THE FORCE RESERVE STOCK OF RATION WAS COMPLETELY DEPLETED DURING THE WEEK. THE FIRST RESUPPLY CONVOY OF FUEL ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON THE 8 JUNE AFTER CLEARING THE ADMINISTRATIVE BOTTLENECKS ENCOUNTERED WITH THE UGANDAN AUTHORITIES IN ENTEBBE. THE SECOND CONVOY CARRYING RATION AND WELFARE ITEMS ARRIVED ON THE 10 JUNE ABOARD WFP TRUCKS. THE PRESENT RESERVE STOCK LEVEL IS AS FOLLOWS:

- A. RATION - 15 DAYS.
- B. WATER - 25 DAYS.
- C. FUEL - 9,632 LTRS (DIESEL)

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE EXERCISE REMAINED SUSPENDED DUE TO INSECURITY. THE ICRC DISTRIBUTED RELIEF AID TO DISPLACED PEOPLE IN CAMPS IN THE SOUTH AND WEST OF THE COUNTRY. 352 ORPHANS WERE EVACUATED BY ICRC TO BURUNDI WITH ASSISTANCE OF THE RGF. IN RPF CONTROLLED AREAS MORE NGOS CONTINUED TO DISTRIBUTE RELIEF AID BROUGHT IN THROUGH UGANDA. UNICEF STARTED VACCINATING DISPLACED PEOPLE AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. COORDINATING CONFERENCES WERE HELD IN MULINDI TO COORDINATE NGO ACTIVITIES IN THE NORTH. THE MEETING WAS WELL ATTENDED BY REPS OF NGOS OPERATING IN THE AREA.

7. CIVIL AFFAIRS. NTR.

8. CONCLUSION. THE GENERAL SITUATION REMAINED TENSE AND VOLATILE WITH BOTH SIDES REMAINING BELLIGERENT. BOTH SIDES CONTINUED TO EXCHANGE HEAVY ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAS FIRE IN THE CITY, THE NORTH AND SOUTHERN PARTS OF THE COUNTRY. THE RPF CONTINUED TO MOUNT PRESSURE ON RGF POSITIONS IN THE CITY AND AROUND GITARAMA. THE ARCHBISHOP OF KIGALI, THE BISHOPS OF KABGAYE AND BYUMBA TOGETHER WITH SOME PRIESTS WERE KILLED IN KABGAYE. MORE MASSACRES WERE ALSO CARRIED OUT BY ARMED MILITIAS IN KIGALI AND OTHER PARTS OF THE COUNTRY. THREE ROUNDS OF CEASE FIRE TALKS WERE HELD DURING THE PERIOD. DELIBERATIONS PROGRESSED SLOWLY BUT STEADILY. THE FC LEFT FOR NAIROBI AND THE DFC RETURNED FROM NAIROBI VIA KABALE. THE HQ BUILDING RECEIVED DIRECT HITS FROM AN AA GUN AND A 75mm CANON BUT THERE WERE NO CASUALTIES. THE OAU MINISTERIAL CONFERENCE IN TUNIS DISCUSSED THE RWANDESE CONFLICT AND PASSED A RESOLUTION CONDEMNING THE KILLINGS. THE FORCE CONTINUES TO OPERATE WITH ONLY ONE MEDICAL OFFICER WHOSE RESOURCES ARE GETTING OVERSTRETCHED AT THE MOMENT. RESUPPLIES OF RATIONS AND FUEL WERE RECEIVED BY ROAD FROM ENTEBBE DURING THE WEEK. VARIOUS NGOS AND HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES CONTINUE TO OPERATE IN RWANDA.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 130600B JUN TO 131800B JUN 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE DAY WAS RELATIVELY CALM. EXCHANGE OF ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAS FIRE CONTINUED THROUGHOUT THE DAY. RPF CONTINUED TO SHELL RGF POSITIONS IN KYCHIKIRU, NYAKABANDA, GIKONDO, KIMIHURURA AND NYAMIRAMBO. THE INTERIM GOVT IS REPORTED TO HAVE MOVED TO GISENYI. REPORTS RECEIVED INDICATE THAT GITARAMA FELL TO RPF. IN THE NORTH THERE ARE NO CHANGES IN THE BATTLE SCENARIO. MILITIAS AND GENDARMERIE CONTINUE TO MAN ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN RGF AREAS WITHIN KIGALI CITY. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PEOPLE EXERCISE RESUMED TODAY WITH ABOUT 550 PEOPLE BEING MOVED. THE EXCHANGE WAS SUCCESSFUL DESPITE THE FACT SOME DISPLACED PERSONS EXPRESSED FEARS ABOUT MOVING OUT DUE TO THE CURRENT SECURITY SITUATION. THE SIXTH TRIPARTITE CEASE FIRE TALKS WERE HELD TODAY. THE TALKS, CHAIRED BY THE DFC, CONTINUE TOMORROW. THE PROGRESS OF DELIBERATIONS WERE ENCOURAGING.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES RWANDA RADIO IS GIVING PROMINENCE TO THE CEASE FIRE TALKS AND AT THE SAME TIME RAISING SENTIMENTS ABOUT THE PERFORMANCE OF UNAMIR TO DATE. IN BURUNDI TENSION IS STILL HIGH OVER THE IMPENDING ELECTIONS.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO SHELL RGF POCKETS OF RESISTANCE IN KYCHIRU, NYAMIRAMBO, KIMIHURURA AND THE CITY CENTER. RPF RETALIATED TO THE RGF FIRE WITH MORTARS, HMG AND SAS FIRE. SOME SHELLS LANDED CLOSE TO THE ICRC HOSPITAL. NOW CONTROLLING CHADAFFI JUNCTION BY FIRE. REPORTED TO BE STILL OCCUPYING THE ISLAMIC CENTER IN NYAMIRAMBO. MOPPING UP OPERATION BY RPF WAS REPORTED AROUND GITARAMA AND REPORTS INDICATE THAT GITARAMA IS NOW UNDER RPF CONTROL. NO MAJOR CHANGES IN DISPOSITIONS AND BATTLE SCENARIO IN THE NORTH.

B. RGF. RGF CONTINUE TO RETALIATE TO RPF FIRES WITH MORTARS, HMG AND SAS FIRE FROM POSITIONS IN KIMIHURURA, KYCHIKIRU, NYAMIRAMBO AND THE CITY CENTER. GENDARMERIE CONTINUE TO CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN THE CITY. NO MAJOR CHANGES IN BATTLE SCENARIO IN THE NORTH. REPORTED TO HAVE LOST GITARAMA TO THE RPF AND SUSTAINED HEAVY CASUALTIES IN THE FIGHTING.

C. MILITIA. REPORTED TO BE FIGHTING ALONGSIDE THE RGF. THE LEADERSHIP WAS SEEN IN TOWN TODAY. THEY CONTINUE TO MAN ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN RGF AREAS IN THE CITY WITH THE INTERHAMWE.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD. DFC HELD NORMAL STAFF BRIEF AT 0700 HRS. DFC CHAIRED THE SIXTH ROUND OF CEASE FIRE TALKS TODAY. THE PROGRESS WAS QUITE ENCOURAGING. HE ALSO HELD TALKS WITH MAJ

GEN KAGAME EARLIER ON IN THE MORNING. DISCUSSIONS TOUCHED ON THE HARVESTING OF CROPS ABANDONED BY FLEEING INHABITANTS, USE OF THE KIGALI-KAGITUMBA ROAD AND THE BUILDING OF A UN DISPLACED PERSONS CAMP, AMONG OTHERS.

B. UNOMUR. AREA REMAINED CALM. ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED WITHIN THE AREA OF OPERATION. A TOTAL OF 3 HUMANITARIAN AID AGENCIES CROSSED THE BORDER INTO RWANDA WITH HUMANITARIAN RELIEF ITEMS. 44 VEHs CROSSED INTO RWANDA WITH 583 PASSENGERS INCLUDING 446 REFUGEES. 56 VEHs CROSSED INTO UGANDA WITH 293 PASSENGERS. APPROXIMATELY 200 RWANDESE CROSSED TO UGANDA AND RETURNED IN THE EVENING. TWO HELICOPTERS ARE OPERATIONAL. ONE HELICOPTER HAS DEVELOPED MECHANICAL FAULT.

C. GHANBATT. AREA AROUND KIA WAS GENERALLY CALM. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ. PROVIDED PROTECTION AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE AT KIA AND AMAHORO STADIUM. PROVIDED ESCORTS FOR HUMANITARIAN DUTIES AND THE RGF DELEGATION TO THE CEASE FIRE TALKS. UNIT MEDICAL OFFICER TREATED 82 DISPLACED PERSONS AT THE KIA AND AMAHORO STADIUM.

D. TUN PLATOON (+). AREA OF OPERATION WAS RELATIVELY CALM. PROVIDED SECURITY AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PERSONS AT MILLE COLLINS HOTEL, MERIDIEN HOTEL AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. ALSO PROVIDED APC ESCORT TO THE RGF DELEGATION TO THE CEASE FIRE TALKS DURING THE DAY.

E. MILOB RPF SECTOR MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN BYUMBA AREA AND VISITED DISPLACED PERSONS CAMPS IN THE AREA. TWO OTHER TEAMS PATROLLED THE ROAD MULINDI-KIZIGURO-RWAMAGANA-KIGALI. PROVIDED ESCORTS FOR MOVEMENT OF DISPLACED PERSONS, DELEGATES TO THE CEASE FIRE TALKS AND NAIROBI BOUND UNAMIR STAFF TO KAGITUMBA.

5. UNCIVPOL. 6 ARRIVED FROM NAIROBI TODAY.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS RESUMED TODAY. THE INITIAL RELUCTANCE BY SOME REFUGEES NOT TO MOVE OUT DUE TO THE CURRENT SECURITY SITUATION WERE OVERCOME LATER. 300 PERSONS WERE TRANSFERRED TO RPF SIDE WHILE 250 WERE TRANSFERRED TO THE RGF SIDE. THE VACCINATION OF DISPLACED PEOPLE CONTINUED AT AMAHORO STADIUM. 77 DISPLACED PEOPLE RECEIVED TREATMENT AT KIA AND 5 AT AMAHORO STADIUM. THEY WERE ATTENDED TO BY UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF. ICRC CONTINUED TO ATTEND TO PATIENTS AT THE OVERCROWDED ICRC HOSPITAL.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 121800B JUN TO 130600B JUN 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE PERIOD SAW SPORADIC EXCHANGES BETWEEN THE TWO WARRING PARTIES IN NYAMIRAMBO, KYCHIKURU AND THE CITY CENTER. THE RPF CONTINUED TO ISOLATE AND PUT PRESSURE ON RGF POSITIONS WITH ARTY/MORTARS, HMG AND SAs FIRE, TO WHICH THE RGF RETALIATED. GENDARMES AND MILITIA CONTINUE TO JOINTLY CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN RGF CONTROLLED AREAS. NO CHANGES HAVE BEEN OBSERVED IN DISPOSITIONS IN THE NORTH OF THE COUNTRY. FIGHTING IS REPORTED TO BE CONTINUING WEST OF GITARAMA. A HEAVY INFLUX OF DISPLACED PEOPLE IS ALSO REPORTED IN THE GISENYI AND KIBUYE AREAS DUE TO THE FIGHTING. EFFORTS ARE CONTINUING FOR UNAMIR TO RESUME THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS TODAY. THE SIXTH ROUND OF THE TRIPARTITE CEASE FIRE MEETING BETWEEN RGF AND RPF WILL BE HELD TODAY UNDER THE CHAIRMANSHIP OF THE DFC. THE DFC IS ALSO SCHEDULED TO MEET MAJ GEN KAGAME THIS MORNING BEFORE THE CEASE FIRE MEETING. TWO TEAMS OF MILOBs LEFT KIGALI THIS MORNING FOR KAGITUMBA, ESCORTING PERSONNEL PROCEEDING TO NAIROBI.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES THE OAU HEADS OF STATE MEETING STARTING IN TUNIS THIS MORNING WILL BE DISCUSSING THE RWANDESE PROBLEM. THE INTERIM PRESIDENT OF RWANDA WHO IS IN TUNIS HAS CALLED ON THE DELEGATES TO CONDEMN UGANDA FOR THE PART IT IS PLAYING IN THE WAR. HE IS ALSO REPORTED TO HAVE SAID THAT HE WILL AGREE TO ABIDE BY THE ARUSHA ACCORD IN THE FORMATION OF A NEW INTERIM GOVT. THE PREFECT OF BUTARE IS REPORTED TO HAVE CONDEMNED THE KILLINGS AND HAS ASKED RWANDESE TO COME BACK TO THEIR SENSES AND PUT A STOP TO IT. IN NEIGHBORING BURUNDI, THE INTERIM GOVT IS REPORTED TO HAVE SAID THAT ELECTIONS WOULD BE HELD BEFORE JULY 1 DEPENDING ON THE BEHAVIOR OF THE ARMY.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF HARASSING FIRE CONTINUED ON RGF POSITIONS IN KIMIHURURA, NYAMIRAMBO, GATSATA, KIMISAGARA AND THE CITY CENTER USING ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAs. FIGHTING CONTINUES AROUND GITARAMA IN THE SOUTH. THERE ARE NO CHANGES IN DISPOSITIONS IN THE NORTH.

B. RGF. RGF CONTINUE TO RESPOND TO RPF FIRE WITH SIMILAR TYPE WEAPONS FIRE FROM THEIR POSITIONS IN THE CITY. THE GENDARMES CONTINUE TO MAN ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN RGF CONTROLLED AREAS IN THE CITY. FIGHTING CONTINUES IN GITARAMA. NO CHANGES IN DISPOSITIONS IN THE NORTH.

C. MILITIA. MILITIA CONTINUE TO JOINTLY CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS WITHIN THE RGF CONTROLLED AREAS.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WAS CONDUCTED DURING THE PERIOD. DFC HELD THE ROUTINE STAFF BRIEF AT 121900 JUN 94. FC IS STILL IN NAIROBI. THE DFC WILL MEET MAJ GEN KAGAME THIS MORNING BEFORE CHAIRING THE SIXTH ROUND OF THE TRIPARTITE CEASE FIRE MEETING.

B. UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION REMAINED CALM. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

C. GHANBATT. KIA GENERALLY AREA WAS CALM. CONDUCTED PATROLS AROUND THE KIA GENERAL AREA BETWEEN 2000 HRS AND 2400 HRS AND FROM 0410 HRS TO 0520 HRS. CONTINUED SECURITY DUTIES AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ. PROVIDED PROTECTION TO DISPLACED PERSONS AT AMAHORO STADIUM AND KIA.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. THE TRANSFER OF DISPLACED PERSONS EXERCISE WILL RESUME THIS MORNING. MORE DISPLACED PERSONS ARE REPORTED TO BE FLEEING IN THE SOUTH TOWARDS THE WEST AS FIGHTING CONTINUES AROUND GITARAMA.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 111800B JUN TO 120600B JUN 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE NIGHT WAS CALM WITHOUT MUCH FIRING BETWEEN THE WARRING PARTIES. HEAVY ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAs FIRE ERUPTED EARLY THIS MORNING AS RPF TOOK A STRONG GRIP ON THE PRESIDENTIAL GUARD POSITION AT KIMIHURURA AND OTHER POSITIONS IN THE CITY CENTER. RGF RETALIATED WITH MORTARS, HMG AND SAs FIRE. REPORTS FROM THE NORTH INDICATE NO MAJOR CHANGES IN THE BATTLE SCENARIO. THE RPF HAVE HOWEVER OPENED A NEW FRONT NW OF GITARAMA ON THE ROAD GITARAMA - KIBUYE WHERE HEAVY FIGHTING IS REPORTED. AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBERS OF DISPLACED PERSONS CONTINUE IN THE SOUTH. TWO TEAMS OF MILOBS ESCORTED PERSONNEL PROCEEDING TO NAIROBI THROUGH UGANDA TO KAGITUMBA BORDER POST THIS MORNING. DFC IS SCHEDULED TO MEET MAJ GEN KAGAME OF THE RPF LATER IN THE DAY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES A NEW PREFECT FOR GITARAMA HAS BEEN APPOINTED BY THE INTERIM GOVT. THE GOVT IS ALSO CALLING ON THE UN TO IMPLEMENT RESOLUTION 918 WITHOUT DELAY. THE OAU MINISTERIAL MEETING ENDED WITH A RESOLUTION CONDEMNING THE WAR IN RWANDA AND CALLING ON BOTH PARTIES STOP THE CARNAGE. THE RESOLUTION STOPPED SHORT OF APPORTIONING BLAME TO ANY OF THE PARTIES.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO ISOLATE RGF POSITIONS IN KIMIHURURA, AND THE CITY CENTER WITH HEAVY BOMBARDMENT THIS MORNING FROM THEIR GUN POSITIONS IN THE SOUTH OF THE CITY. REPORTED TO HAVE OPENED A NEW FRONT ON THE ROAD GITARAMA - KIBUYE AT MUSHUBATI WHERE FIGHTING IS REPORTED TO BE GOING ON. CONTINUING TO HOLD RGF FORCES AT BAY UP NORTH.

B. RGF. RGF CONTINUE TO RESPOND TO RPF FIRE WITH MORTARS AND HMG FIRE. STILL HOLDING ON TO THEIR POSITIONS IN KYCHIKIRU, KIMIHURURA, AND THE CITY CENTER. REPORTED TO HAVE SUSTAINED HEAVY CASUALTIES IN FIGHTING AROUND OF GITARAMA IN THE SOUTH. HOLDING ON TO RUHengeri AND ITS IMMEDIATE ENVIRONS IN THE NORTH. ELEMENTS OF THE GENDARMERIE CONTINUE TO MAN ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS WITHIN RGF CONTROLLED AREAS.

C. MILITIA. MILITIA CONTINUE TO JOINTLY CONTROL ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN RGF AREAS IN THE CITY. OUTSIDE THE CITY TWO OTHER MILITIA GROUPS HAVE BEEN IDENTIFIED IN KIBUYE.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED. DFC HELD THE ROUTINE STAFF BRIEF AT 1900 HRS. FC IS STILL IN NAIROBI. THE DFC IS SCHEDULED TO MEET MAJ GEN KAGAME LATER IN THE DAY.

B. UNOMUR. AREA REMAINED CALM. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

C. BYUBAT. AREA AROUND KIA WAS GENERALLY CALM. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ. PROVIDED PROTECTION AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO DISPLACED PEOPLE AT KIA AND AMAHORO STADIUM. CONDUCTED PATROLS AROUND KIA FROM 2300 TO 0020 HRS.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE NIGHT WAS RELATIVELY CALM. SPORADIC HARASSING ARTY/MORTAR AND HMG FIRE CONTINUED BETWEEN THE TWO WARRING PARTIES. THERE ARE NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN DISPOSITIONS IN THE CITY. THE RGF POCKETS IN THE CITY REMAIN UNDER RPF ISOLATION. IN THE NORTH THERE IS NO MAJOR CHANGE IN THE SITUATION. GITARAMA REMAINS UNDER RPF SEIGE. DISPLACED CIVILIANS CONTINUE TO INCREASE IN NUMBERS IN THE SOUTH OF THE COUNTRY. IT IS REPORTED THAT, IN GISENYI ABOUT 100 PEOPLE AND A PRIEST HAVE BEEN MURDERED BY GOVERNMENT FORCES. GENDARMERIE AND SOME INTERHAMWE CONTINUE TO MAN ROAD BLOCKS IN RGF CONTROLLED AREAS. REPORTS RECEIVED THIS MORNING INDICATE THAT THERE WAS A MASS KILLING OF ORPHANS AT THE ST ANDRE ORPHANAGE LAST NIGHT. INVESTIGATIONS ARE BEING CONDUCTED THIS MORNING AND WILL BE INCLUDED IN THE EVENING SITREP. ABOUT 5000 RECRUITS OF RPF HAVE BEEN OBSERVED UNDERGOING MILITARY TRAINING AROUND GABIRO. IT IS ALSO REPORTED THAT THE RPF HAS STOCKPILED A LOT OF AMMUNITION IN THE NORTH. THE ROTATION OF UNAMIR PERSONNEL AND JOURNALISTS, FROM NAIROBI THROUGH ENTEBBE IS PLANNED TO BEGIN TOMORROW. THE TRIPARTITE CEASE FIRE MEETING BETWEEN RGF AND RPF CONTINUES TODAY AT 0900 HRS. THE DFC WILL CHAIR THE MEETING.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES THE OAU MINISTERIAL MEETING IN TUNIS HAS FORMED A COMMITTEE TO DISCUSS AND PROPOSE SOLUTIONS TO THE CURRENT PROBLEMS IN RWANDA. THE COMMITTEE IS REPORTED TO HAVE HAD AUDIENCE WITH DELEGATES OF THE WARRING FACTIONS. THE INTERIM PRIME MINISTER IS REPORTED TO HAVE PAID A VISIT TO GISENYI AREA YESTERDAY. A COMMUNIQUE ISSUED AFTER THE VISIT PAINTS THE PICTURE OF SOME RESERVATIONS ABOUT UNAMIR.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF CONTINUED TO HARASS RGF POSITIONS WITH SPORADIC ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAs FIRE. CONTINUED TO PUT PRESSURE ON RGF POSITIONS IN THE CITY. HEAVY FIGHTING WAS REPORTED IN THE WESTERN PART OF THE CITY. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THEIR DISPOSITION IN THE NORTH AND SOUTH OF THE COUNTRY. ABOUT 5000 RECRUITS WERE OBSERVED UNDERGOING MILITARY TRAINING AT GABIRO YESTERDAY.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 091800B JUN TO 100600B JUN 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. HARASSING ARTY/MORTAR AND HMG FIRE CONTINUED TO BE EXCHANGED BETWEEN THE TWO WARRING PARTIES IN KIGALI CITY. FIRES WERE DIRECTED AT KYCHIRU, NYAMIRAMBO AND KIMIHURURA. FIGHTING ALSO CONTINUED IN KIBUGIZA AND GIKONDO. RGF POSITIONS STILL REMAIN ISOLATED BY THE RPF AS THEY CONTINUE TO REINFORCE THEIR POSITIONS. RUHENGERI REMAINS UNDER RGF CONTROL. IN THE SOUTH, THE RPF SQUEEZE ON GITARAMA CONTINUES. FIGURES OF DISPLACED PERSONS CONTINUE TO RISE IN THE SOUTH OF THE COUNTRY. DFC IS SCHEDULED TO MEET COS RGF LATER TODAY. THE UNAMIR FOOD CONVOY LEAVES KABALE THIS MORNING FOR KIGALI. THE CONVOY WILL BE MET BY UN ESCORT TEAM FROM KIGALI AT MERAMA HILLS. MR FLETCHER OF HAC LEAVES TODAY FOR MULINDI TO ATTEND A MEETING WITH HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES AND OTHER NGOS WORKING IN THE NORTH OF RWANDA.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES THE INTERIM PRESIDENT OF RWANDA HAS POINTED OUT THAT THE FIRST PHASE OF PACIFICATION HAS GONE WELL DESPITE SOME SHADOWS. HE ALSO CONSIDERED POSITIVE, THE ATTITUDE OF THE UN ON THE RAPID DEPLOYMENT OF UN TROOPS TO ASSIST IN HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES IN RWANDA. TENSION IS REPORTED TO BE MOUNTING IN NEIGHBORING BURUNDI OVER THE DELAY IN BRINGING TO BOOK THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE FAILED COUP OF OCTOBER 93.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE SITUATION REMAINED RELATIVELY CALM IN KIGALI OVER THE PERIOD. THERE WERE HOWEVER SPORADIC EXCHANGES OF ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAs FIRE BETWEEN THE WARRING FACTIONS. HEAVY EXCHANGES COMMENCED AT FIRST LIGHT, ORIGINATING FROM RPF GUN POSITIONS IN THE SOUTH OF THE CITY TO KIMIHURURA AND KYCHIRU. THERE ARE NO MAJOR CHANGES IN THE DISPOSITIONS IN THE CITY. HEAVY FIGHTING WAS ALSO REPORTED AROUND RICUNSHO, SE OF KABGAYE. RGF C-ATTACKS WERE REPELLED BY THE RPF AROUND REBERO HILLS IN THE SOUTH OF KIGALI AND KABGAYE. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THE GENERAL SITUATION AS BOTH SIDES CONTINUE TO EXCHANGE HEAVY ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAs FIRE IN THE WESTERN PART OF THE CITY AND AROUND THE CITY CENTER OVERNIGHT. THREE SHELLS LANDED IN THE ST FAMILLE COMPOUND KILLING TWO AND WOUNDING EIGHT CHILDREN. HEAVY ARTY/MORTAR, HMG AND SAs FIRE ERUPTED EARLY THIS MORNING FROM RPF POSITIONS AROUND THE CND AND MERIDIEN HOTEL AND GUN POSITIONS IN THE NORTHERN PART OF THE CITY INTO KYCHIRU, KIMIHURURA, PARTS OF GIKONDO AND THE CITY CENTRE AS THE RPF CONTINUES TO TIGHTEN THEIR GRIP ON RGF POSITIONS IN THE CITY WITH THE RGF ALSO RETALIATING. 





SITREP COVERING PERIOD 250600B MAY TO 251800B MAY 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. GEN SITUATION REMAIN TENSE AND FLUID. RGF AND RPF ARE OBSERVING TRUCE PARTIALLY. OCCASIONAL EXCHANGE OF MORTAR AND SMALL ARMS FIRE CONTINUED THROUGH OUT THE DAY AROUND KIMIHURURA AND THE CITY CENTER. TWO SHELLS LANDED AT ICRC HOSPITAL KILLING TWO PERSONS ON THE SPOT. NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGES IN THE DISPOSITIONS OF BOTH THE WARRING GROUPS IN THE CITY. RPF CONTINUED TO PUT PRESSURE ON THE RGF POSITIONS IN CITY. RGF STILL CONSOLIDATING THEIR POSITIONS AT PRESIDENTIAL GUARD REGIMENT LOCATED AT KIMIHURURA. MILITIA STILL CONTROLLING ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN RGF CONTROLLED AREAS IN KIGALI CITY. THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL AND HIS TEAM HAVE SPENT ANOTHER VERY BUSY SCHEDULE IN GITARAMA AND RETURNED TO UNAMIR HQ KIGALI FOR A MEETING WITH RGF CHIEF OF STAFF.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. MR. RIZA AND GENERAL BARRIL MET WITH THE PRIME MINISTER OF THE INTERIM GOVERNMENT IN GITARAMA TO DISCUSS THE IMPLEMENTATION OF NEW MANDATE OF UNAMIR. THEY ALSO HELD FOLLOW-UP DISCUSSIONS WITH THE ARMY CHIEF OF STAFF IN KIGALI. DR. KABIA BRIEFED THE PRESS ON THE VISITS OF THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL AND ON THE SITUATION IN RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL AND HIS TEAM ALONG WITH FORCE COMMANDER WENT TO GITARAMA THIS MORNING. THEY HELD A MEETING WITH THE INTERIM GOVERNMENT. THEY DISCUSSED ON ISSUE RELATED TO THE DEPLOYMENT OF UNAMIR II AND POSSIBLE CEASE FIRE BETWEEN RPF AND RGF. THE TEAM RETURNED TO KIGALI AT 1515 HRS. AT 1530 THE DELEGATION HELD A MEETING WITH COS RGF AND CHIEF OF GENDARMERIE AT HOTEL DIPLOMAT AND DISCUSSED VARIOUS ISSUES.

B. UNOMUR. UNOMUR OPERATIONAL AREA IS CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN AOR. ALSO CONDUCTED AERIAL PATROLLING FROM KISORO TO OP 20, OP21, OP 22 AND OP 23. ON 24 MAY 94 FIVE VEHICLES OF ICRC, SIX VEHICLES OF WORLD VISION, ONE

VEHICLE OF CARE, ONE VEHICLE OF UNICEF AND TWELVE VEHICLES OF OTHER HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES CROSSED THE BORDER THROUGH KATUNA TO RWANDA AND RETURNED ON THE SAME DAY. TOTAL FIFTEEN VEHICLES CROSSED THE BORDER AT KATUNA, KASHEKYE AND MERAMA HILLS TO RWANDA WITH 90 PASSENGERS INCLUDING 43 REFUGEES. ANOTHER 13 VEHICLES CROSSED THE BORDER AT KATUNA, KASHEKYE, AND KYANIKA TO UGANDA WITH 37 PASSENGERS. D. TUN PL PROVIDED SECURITY TO REFUGEES AT MILLES COLLINS, MERIDIEN HOTEL AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. ALSO CARRIED OUT ESCORT DUTIES WITH APCs.







MAJOR AREAS OF CONTINUED ACTIVITIES INCLUDE KICHIKIRO CAMP, GIKONDO, THE PRESIDENTIAL GUARD CAMP (KIMIHURURA) AND THE CITY CENTRE. RPF HAVE FULL CONTROL OF THE AIRPORT AND KANOMBE CAMP AND THEY ARE CONSOLIDATING THEIR POSITIONS IN AND AROUND THESE TWO KEY INSTALLATIONS. A NUMBER OF REFUGEES ARE STILL AT THE AIRPORT WHILE ARRANGEMENTS ARE BEING MADE TO EVACUATE THEM TO SAFER AREAS. RPF HAS NOT CLEARED USE OF RPF SECURED ROUTE TO SPECIAL ENVOY'S CONVOY UP TO KIGALI. EFFORTS ARE BEING MADE TO HAVE HIM COME DOWN THROUGH AN ALTERNATE ROUTE. THEIR FIRST MEETING IS SCHEDULED FOR THIS MORNING WITH CHAIRMAN OF THE RPF.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL MR. IQBAL RIZA AND THE MILITARY ADVISER TO THE UNITED NATIONS, GENERAL MAURICE BARRIL ARRIVED IN KABALE, UGANDA, ON THEIR WAY TO RWANDA TO DISCUSS ALL ASPECTS OF THE IMPLEMENTATION OF UNAMIR II MANDATE. FORCE COMMANDER RECEIVED POSITIVE RESPONSES FROM THE WARRING FACTIONS TO HIS PROPOSAL FOR A TRUCE DURING THE VISIT OF THE SPECIAL ENVOY. THE MILITARY SPOKESMAN COORDINATED A VISIT OF PRESSMEN TO THE AIRPORT AND KANOMBE CAMP. THE FORCE COMMANDER WAS INTERVIEWED BY CBC AND DR. KABIA BY CBS RADIO.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF ARE IN FULL CONTROL OF THE AIRPORT, CAMP KANOMBE AND ARE CONSOLIDATING THEIR POSITIONS IN AND AROUND THE TWO KEY INSTALLATIONS. ABOUT TWO BATTALIONS ARE DEPLOYED AT KIA AND ONE BATTALION AT KANOMBE CAMP. FIGHTING STILL CONTINUES AT KICHIKIRO, GIKONDO AND KIMIHURURA CAMPS. THE MORALE OF RPA IS VERY HIGH.

B. RGF. RGF IS NOW CONSOLIDATING THEIR EFFORTS IN OTHER PARTS OF KIGALI CITY AFTER WITHDRAWING FROM THE AIRPORT AND KANOMBE CAMP. CONTINUE TO RECEIVE HEAVY ARTY/MORTAR AND SAS FIRE FROM RPF POSITIONS. MORALE OF RGF TROOPS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN AFFECTED AFTER WITHDRAWING FROM KIA AND KANOMBE CAMP. RGF CLAIMS IT WAS A TACTICAL WITHDRAWAL AND WOULD REORGANIZE FOR A POSSIBLE C-ATTACK SOON. STILL HOLDING ON TO OTHER AREAS UNDER THEIR CONTROL IN THE NORTH AND SOUTHWEST.

C. MILITIA. MILITIA ARE STILL FIGHTING SIDE BY SIDE WITH GOVERNMENT FORCES AND CONTINUE TO MAN ROAD BLOCKS AND CHECK POINTS IN THE CITY.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED. FC HELD NORMAL BRIEFING WITH STAFFS AT 221800 ON CURRENT SITUATION AND VISIT OF UN SPECIAL CONVOY AND GEN BARRIL. FC

MEETING WITH COS RGF THIS MORNING TO DISCUSS LATEST DEVELOPMENTS.

B. UNOMUR. AREA OF OPERATION GENERALLY CALM. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

C. BYUBAT. KIA AREA GENERALLY CALM AFTER FOUR DAYS OF HOSTILITIES. CONDUCTED SECURITY DUTY AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND FORCE HQ AND PROVIDED PROTECTION TO 660 DISPLACED PERSONS SEEKING REFUGE AT THE AIRPORT.

D. TUN PLATOON (+). REPORTS HEAVY FIGHTING AROUND KIMHIRURA CAMP OVERNIGHT. PROVIDED SECURITY AT MILLES COLLINS HOTEL, MERIDIEN HOTEL AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL.

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 200600B MAY TO 201800B MAY 94.

1. **GEN SITUATION.** THE SITUATION REMAIN VERY TENSE. SPORADIC EXCHANGES OF FIRE CONTINUED THROUGH OUT THE DAY BETWEEN RGF AND RPF. THE MAJOR FIGHTING AREAS WERE AIRPORT, KANOMBE, KICHIKIRO, REMEMA AND DOWN TOWN KIGALI. FIGHTING BETWEEN RPF AND RGF REPORTED FROM RUHENGERI IN THE NORTH. BUGESERA IS STILL UNDER CONTROL OF RPF. NO CHANGE IN THE POSITION BEING HELD BY BOTH THE FACTIONS IN CITY. MILITIA STILL CONTROLLING MAIN STREETS IN KIGALI CITY.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.** FORCE COMMANDER INFORMED RPF AND THE INTERIM GOVERNMENT REGARDING THE ENSUING VISIT OF MR. RIZA SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE SECRETARY GENERAL TO DISCUSS MATTERS ON UNAMIR'S EXPANDED MANDATE. MR. RIZA WILL BE ACCOMPANIED BY GENERAL BARIL AND MR. TITOU. FORCE COMMANDER AND DR. KABIA WERE INTERVIEWED BY DIFFERENT OF THE BBC CORRESPONDENCE ON THE CURRENT ISSUES IN RWANDA. DR. KABIA WAS ALSO INTERVIEWED BY THE VOICE OF AMERICA AND CNN. HE ALSO BRIEFED PRESS REPRESENTATIVE IN NAIROBI ON UNAMIR AND OTHER UN ACTIVITIES IN RWANDA.

3. **FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. **RPF.** STILL PUTTING PRESSURE ON RGF POSITIONS AT THE AIRPORT AND KANOMBE CAMP BY USING MORTAR AND MULTIPLE ROCKET LAUNCHER, AND SEEMS TO BE SQUEEZING THE CITY AND ISOLATING RGF POSITION. A MASSIVE RECRUITMENT IN THE RPF HAVE BEEN REPORTED. AFTER THE TRAINING OF THE RECRUITS THEY WILL BE EMPLOYED IN THE RPF HELD TERRITORY FOR THE SUBSEQUENT OPERATIONS. INFORMATION ALSO REVEALED THAT RPF HAVE CARRIED OUT MASSIVE MASSACRES IN THEIR HELD TERRITORY.

B. **RGF.** RGF HAVE CONTAINED RPF AROUND KIA AND STILL HOLDING KIA IN STRENGTH. RGF SEEMS TO BE MORE DETERMINED AND HOLD GROUND AS LONG AS POSSIBLE. THEY ARE STRENGTHENING POSITIONS AND HOLDING EFFECTIVELY AT KANOMBE, KIGALI CITY AND PRESIDENTIAL GUARD REGIMENT POSITIONS. THEY ARE STILL CONTROLLING RUHENGERI AND NKUMBA IN THE NORTH.

C. **MILITIA.** NO CHANGE.

4. **OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES**

A. **FORCE HQ.** NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED. CARRIED OUT PATROLLING IN CITY AREA. FC HELD NORMAL BRIEFING WITH COMMANDERS AND STAFFS AT 200700. FORCE COMMANDER PAID A WORKING VISIT TO THE TROOPS LOCATED AT KIA.

EIGHT VEHICLES OF ICRC, TWO VEHICLES OF CARE AND SIX VEHICLES OF OTHER HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES CROSSED THE BORDER THROUGH KATUNA TO RWANDA AND RETURNED ON THE SAME DAY. ON 20 MAY NINE VEHICLES OF WFP AND TWO VEHICLES OF OTHER HUMANITARIAN AGENCIES CROSSED THE BORDER THROUGH KATUNA TO RWANDA. TOTAL TWENTY TWO VEHICLES CROSSED THE BORDER AT KATUNA, KASHEKYE AND MERAMA HILLS TO RWANDA WITH 224 PASSENGERS INCLUDING 142 REFUGEES. ANOTHER 18 VEHICLES CROSSED THE BORDER AT KATUNA, KASHEKYE, AND KYANIKA TO UGANDA WITH 83 PASSENGERS. APPROXIMATELY 4200 RWANDESE CROSSED THE BORDER AT KYANIKA FOR WORKS AND MARKETING AND THEY RETURNED ON THE SAME DAY. ONE HELICOPTER IS PRESENTLY OUT OF ORDER DUE TO MECHANICAL FAULT.

C. **BYUBAT**. CONDUCTED SECURITY DUTY AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND PROVIDED ESCORT DUTIES FOR HUMANITARIAN TASK. SHELLS LANDED AT KIA TOWER AND ARRIVAL HALL CAUSING SOME DAMAGES TO SIX UNAMIR VEHICLES. INTENSIVE EXCHANGE OF FIRE AROUND THE AIRPORT CONTINUED FROM THE MORNING.

D. **TUN PL** PROVIDED SECURITY AT MILLES COLLINS, MERIDIEN HOTEL AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. ALSO CARRIED OUT ESCORT DUTIES WITH APCs.

E. **MILOB** MILOB TEAM WAS SENT OUT ON PATROLLING TO REHENGIRI. THE TEAM BROUGHT FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

(1) THE TEAM DISCOVERED TWO DISPLACED CAMPS AT CABONA AND NDAGO. APPROX 5500 DISPLACED PERSONS ARE STAYING IN THOSE CAMPS. THE PEOPLE OF THOSE TWO CAMPS HAVE COME FROM NYARUTOVU AREA.

(2) THE ICRC HAS SUPPLIED BEANS, OIL, SOUP AND BLANKETS TO 5500 DISPLACED PERSONS IN CABONA AND NDAGO CAMPS ON 13 MAY 94.

(3) IN BURAMBI AND BUTETE AREAS MANY DISPLACED PERSONS ARE NOT MOVING TO THE CAMPS. ICRC IS EXPECTED TO PROVIDE FOOD SUPPLIES IN THOSE CAMPS ON 21 MAY 94. HOWEVER THOSE CAMPS NEED WATER, MEDICINE AND DIGGING MATERIALS.





1. GEN SITUATION. SITUATION REMAINS VERY TENSE WITH SPORADIC EXCHANGES OF FIRE OVERNIGHT. MAJOR AREAS OF ACTIVITIES INCLUDE REMERA, KICHICKYURU, SOUTH AND SOUTH WEST OF THE CITY AND THE AIRPORT. TWO ARTY SHELLS FELL BEHIND THE KIA TOWER AND ARRIVAL HALL CAUSING SOME DAMAGES TO TWO UNAMIR VEHICLES. HEAVY SA FIRE AND MORTAR FIRE WAS ALSO REPORTED AROUND HOTEL MERIDIEN. 

SITREP COVERING PERIOD 190600B MAY TO 191800B MAY 94.

1. GEN SITUATION. OBSERVED TO BE A VERY HARD HITTING DAY BETWEEN THE TWO FACTIONS. HEAVY EXCHANGE OF ARTY/MOR/SA FIRING CONTINUED THROUGH OUT THE DAY. THE MAJOR BATTLE AREAS WERE KIGALI AIRPORT, KICHIKORO, KIMIHURURA, REMERA , KANOMBE AND DOWN TOWN AREA. FIGHTING BETWEEN RPF AND RGF REPORTED FROM RUHENGERI IN THE NORTH. BUGESERA IS STILL CONTROLLED BY RPF IN THE SOUTH. NO CHANGE IN THE POSITION BEING HELD BY BOTH THE FACTIONS IN CITY. MILITIA STILL CONTROLLING SOME AREA IN KIGALI CITY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. FORCE COMMANDER ACCOMPANIED BY MR. DESSANDE FROM SRSG'S OFFICE VISITED GITARAMA AND DISCUSSED THE UNAMIR II MANDATE AND OUTSTANDING ISSUES WITH THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF SOCIAL AFFAIRS OF THE INTERIM GOVERNMENT. DR. KABIA, THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR WAS INTERVIEWED BY CBS RADIO (US) NEW YORK TIMES AND BBC (FOCUS ON AFRICA PROGRAMME). HE ALSO BRIEFED CORRESPONDENTS OF REUTERS, AFP AND AP ON THE CURRENT SITUATION IN RWANDA AND ON THE ACTIVITIES OF UNAMIR AS WELL AS THOSE OF NON-GOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATIONS AND UN AGENCIES RELATING TO HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPF. RPF LAUNCHED A DELIBERATE ATTACK ON KIA FROM THE NORTH AT MID NIGHT ON 19 MAY 94 AND THEY KEPT ON ENGAGING KIA BY ARTY/MOR AND SA THROUGH OUT THE DAY. IN THE AFTERNOON RGF SOLDIERS WERE SEEN VACATING POSITIONS SOUTH OF KIA. LAST NIGHT RPF SHELLED AT KIGALI HOSPITAL KILLING 30 PATIENTS AND INJURING MANY. RGF ALSO SHELLED 12 ARTY/MOR ROUNDS AT UNAMIR FORCE HQ AROUND 1400 HRS DAMAGING SOME WINDOW GLASSES.

B. RGF. RGF WERE BUSY ON REPULSING RPF ATTACK AT KIA AND ALSO ADOPTING A DEFENSIVE POSTURE AND CONSOLIDATING POSITION HELD IN KIA, CAMP KANOMBE AND KIGALI CITY. RGF USED THEIR ANTI AIRCRAFT GUNS ON GROUND ROLE AT KIGALI AIRPORT. RGF STILL CONTROLLING RUHENGERI AND NKUMBA.

C. MILITIA. NO CHANGE.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ. NORMAL ROUTINE WORKS WERE CONDUCTED. CARRIED OUT PATROLLING IN CITY AREA. FC HELD NORMAL BRIEFING WITH COMMANDER AND STAFFS AT 190700. FORCE COMMANDER ACCOMPANIED BY MR. DESSANDE FROM SRSG'S OFFICE VISITED GITARAMA AND DISCUSSED THE NEW UNAMIR II MANDATE AND OUTSTANDING ISSUES WITH THE PRIME MINISTER AND MINISTER OF SOCIAL AFFAIRS OF THE INTERIM GOVERNMENT AT 1900 HRS. FC VISITED KIGALI HOSPITAL ON THE WAY BACK TO GITARAMA.

B. UNOMUR. UNOMUR OPERATIONAL AREA IS CALM. CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN AOR. ON 18 MAY 94 ONE VEHICLE OF ICRC CROSSED THE BORDER THROUGH KATUNA TO RWANDA AND RETURNED 11 VEHICLES OF ICRC ON THE SAME DAY. TOTAL 26 VEHICLES CROSSED THE BORDER AT KATUNA, KASHEKYE AND MERAMA HILLS TO RWANDA WITH 191 PASSENGERS INCLUDING 103 REFUGEES. APPROXIMATELY 42 YOUNG PERSONS AGED BETWEEN 19 TO 25 YEARS CROSSED THE BORDER AT MERAMA HILL OP. WHILE ASKING ABOUT THEIR IDENTITY THEY CLAIMED THEMSELVES TO BE REFUGEES. BUT OUT OF THEIR GESTURE THEY SEEM TO BE THE NEW RECRUITS OF RPF. ANOTHER 30 VEHICLES CROSSED THE BORDER AT KATUNA, KASHEKYE, AND KYANIKA TO UGANDA WITH 51 PASSENGERS. APPROXIMATELY 4200 RWANDIES CROSSED THE BORDER AT KYANIKA FOR WORKS AND MARKETING AND THEY RETURNED ON THE SAME DAY. ONE HELICOPTER IS PRESENTLY OUT OF ORDER DUE TO MECHANICAL FAULT. TWO OTHERS ARE OPERATIONAL.

C. BYUBAT. CONDUCTED SECURITY DUTY AT KIA, AMAHORO STADIUM AND PROVIDED ESCORT DUTIES FOR HUMANITARIAN TASK. SHELLS LANDED AT AMAHORO STADIUM, NO CASUALTIES.

D. TUN PL PROVIDED SECURITY AT MILLES COLLINS, MERIDIEN HOTEL AND KING FAISAL HOSPITAL. ALSO CARRIED OUT ESCORT DUTIES WITH APC'S. WHILE CROSSING KADDAFI JUNCTION, THE APCs WERE FIRED. NO CASUALTIES.

5. UNCIVPOL. NTR.

6. HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES. UNMO PATROLS COULD NOT CONDUCT SECURITY PATROLS TO CAMPS IN KIGALI CITY DUE TO HEAVY SHELLINGS. UNMO PATROL MONITORED A PLANNED EVACUATION OF ORPHANS FROM GISIMBA AND GITEGA ORPHANAGES BY THE GENDARMERIE. THE EVACUATION COULD NOT BE CARRIED OUT DUE TO RESISTANCE GIVEN BY LOCALS. ICRC ATTEMPTED TO DELIVER FOOD TO DISPLACED CAMP NEAR GITARAMA. THEY COULD NOT CARRY OUT FOOD DISTRIBUTION DUE TO FIRING BY RPF. THE TEAM WAS EVACUATED BY UNAMIR APC.
