Reference your LEOKIT 163. Borgonovo has been in sole charge of all technical installations here since November 1960. He is by training an electrical engineer but has been able to turn his hand to water purification, oil burners, refrigeration, telephones, radio, and general machinery. He knows the base and its installations thoroughly and is versatile, conscientious and resourceful in keeping the installations running. He gets on well with his civilian colleagues and with the Swedish military personnel. His approach to Congolese workers is a little authoritarian but they work satisfactorily under his direction. He has a thoroughly adequate command of english and french. Major Brand's report recommends Borgonovo's retention as base electrical engineer. I suggest that his status vis-a-vis the Swedish military engineer who will be in charge of the Swedish team will have to be carefully defined beforehand. In his memorandum to you of 10 August Borgonovo states that he is unwilling to serve longer in ONUC unless his employment status is revised, and I think he will certainly resign if his request is not met at least partly. The conditions set out at the end of his letter of 10 August fall somewhat short of full international status and I would suggest that if practicable he should be offered a local contract on the general lines stated in his letter. I would certainly be sorry to see him leave.

Reference FG 418 of 8 August. The two ANC officers at Kitona base have been inspecting certain stores and equipment including vehicles and building materials not purchased by U.N. but still at Kitona base. They have complained to me that U.N. guard is insufficient and have requested me to hire additional congolese staff to inventory and look after non-U.N. property. They also told certain congolese store keepers not to let U.N. use any more Non-U.N. items on the base. Hence my KITLEO 743 to Ahmed. Their relations with Swedish detachment here are perfectly correct and I should perhaps add that their relations with me are equally correct it is merely that our views on their functions at Kitona are diametrically opposed. In any case the problem may soon solve itself as I understand unofficially that they will be returning to Leo by the end of the week.-

He drove straight to our offices but we transferred the group to officers' mess. Banana territorial administrator explained that main purpose of visit was to ease tense situation in the region but President stated that on the contrary he has come to study the incidents which had taken place here. I started to explain how our civilian staff member had been arrested at Moanda airfield but as he did not seem too willing to listen I said that the matter had already been investigated by Col. Kiembe previously. I raised question of ANCs blocking U.N. supplies from Boma and he replied that orders had been given to OTRACO to proceed with shipments upon presentation of cargo manifests. This answer seemed evasive to me. President made no tour of base but reviewed Indonesian company at their Captain's request. On the whole visit was courteous and cordial but discussions were brief as President had to return to Boma same day. Left Kitona at 1310.

After events of last week at Banana an observers outpost was placed at junction of Banana/Boma road with entry road to base by Sudanese for checking passing traffic. However not a single vehicle was stopped. After your first cable in order to avoid possible misunderstandings we moved outpost slightly before the crossroads and Indonesian CO subsequently decided to draw it almost 100 meters back toward entry to base. ANC accusation is further disproved by the following; We are allowing normal evacuation of base vehicles and equipment sold by Belgians to Congolese Public Works Boma. We have even facilitated their convoys by selling them gasoline. However CO of Boma ANC is stopping all UN traffic and supply to and from Boma. We ordered gasoline from Boma but order was stopped and has never reached base. Ends.

We have received official confirmation that gasoline shipment from Petrocongo Boma is definitely forbidden. Pol situation critical and requires imperative supply. As we previously mentioned convoys of Belgian vehicles and equipment consigned to Boma public works are proceeding normally with their own gasoline supply. Next convoy scheduled for tomorrow morning. We could stop it with probably of strong reaction from ANC. Accusation of our blocking Boma Banana road is completely false as actually it is ANC who is blocking road and stopping all U.N. communications to Boma. Morale of Sudanese contingent very low and they expect to be airlifted at any moment. They state instructions from their Ministry Foreign Affairs are not to fight Congolese, and that they have orders from their CO in Leo to withdraw all outposts outside the base and confine themselves to Barracks and HQ. You realize gravity of this situation in event of an attempt against the base. Would appreciate your earliest comments.
