I also consider that their appointment ensure adequate representation on the Tribunal of the principal legal systems of the world.

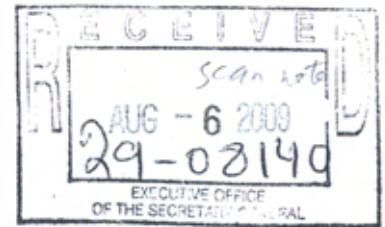
