

4. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE), MILOBS PTL TO RUNYINYA COMMUNE GR 6012 REPORTED THAT THE SECURITY SITUATION WAS WORSENING DUE TO THE INTERHAMWE ACTIVITIES WITHIN THE COMMUNE. THE LOCALS ARE REPORTED TO HAVE STARTED SLEEPING AT NIGHT IN THE BUSH OUT OF FOR FEAR OF BEING ATTACKED.

2. OVERVIEW. NSTR.

3. RPA.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), THE MILOB TEAM PATROLLING THE RUKINA SECTOR WAS INFORMED BY THE LOCALS THAT RPA SOLDIERS OF A REGULAR PATROL, ROBBED AN UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF SEWING MACHINES AND RADIOS FROM LOCALS IN THE AREA.

4. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

A. IN SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO), MILOB PATROL FOLLOWED UP THE REPORTS OF SHOOTING INCIDENT REPORTED IN YESTERDAYS SITREP. THE TEAM ACCOMPANIED BY RPA REPRESENTATIVES AND 05 LOCALS WENT TO THE SITE BUT COULD LOCATE ONLY THREE DEAD BODIES AND SOME CLOTHING ITEMS OF MILITARY ORIGIN. FURTHER INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

B. IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE), LOCALS INFORMED THE MILOB PATROL THAT INTERHAMWE ARMED WITH SPEARS AND MACHETES WERE HIDING IN THE FOREST AND WERE CARRYING OUT RAIDS IN HUYE, MBAZI AND MARAMBA COMMUNES WITH THE AIM OF STEALING FOOD ITEMS AND OTHER HOUSEHOLD GOODS.

C. IN SECTOR 5B (GISYENI), MILOB TEAM REPORTED THE MURDER OF COUNCILLOR OF NUYAMUEGO SECTOR (4703) ON THE NIGHT OF 30 NOV 95 BY UNKNOWN ASSAILANTS. A NOTE SAYING "DEATH IS THE FATE OF ALL COLLABORATORS" WAS LEFT BY THE BODY. LOCALS INFORMED THE MILOB PATROL THAT A COUPLE WAS MURDERED IN MUHUNGWE COMMUNE (5015) ON THE NIGHT OF 28 NOV 95 WITH KNIVES. THE KILLERS ALSO THREW A GRENADE IN THE HOUSE OF ASSASSINATED COUPLE INJURING ONE OF THEIR THREE CHILDREN.

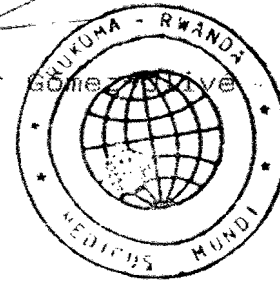

2. OVERVIEW. NSTR.

3. RPA.

A. MILOB SECTOR 1B, GITARAMA, REPORTED (UNCONFIRMED) THAT AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF SOLDIERS FROM UGANDA ARRIVED IN GITARAMA APPROX TWO WEEKS AGO. IT IS SUSPECTED THAT IT WAS THESE SOLDIERS, DRESSED IN CIVILIAN, THAT TORTURED AND KILLED FOUR PEOPLE ON 03 DEC 95.

False info.

B. IN SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA), IN BWISIGE COMMUNE THERE WERE TWO MEN ARRESTED AT THE COMMUNE CENTRE AND ACCUSED OF BEING MEMBERS OF THE FRGF AND WERE HANDED OVER TO THE GENDARMERIE. HOWEVER, THEY CLAIM THAT THEY ARE REFUGEES FROM ZAIRE AND HAVE NOTHING TO DO WITH THE FRGF.

C. IN SHYANDA COMMUNE, IN SECT 3B-BUTARE, NINE PERSONS WERE ARRESTED ON 04-05 DEC 95. THEY ARE SUSPECTED OF GENOCIDE RELATED OFFENSES.

4. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. IN SECTOR 3A, GIKONGORO, MILOBS PATROL TO RUKONDO COMMUNE WERE INFORMED OF INCREASE OF BANDITRY ACTIVITIES IN THE KIRAMBI SECTOR (GR 6234). BANDITS ARE ARMED WITH FIREARMS AND MACHETES. IN NSILI COMMUNE ONE LOCAL WAS KILLED ON 02 DEC 95 APPARENTLY BY BANDITS COMING FROM BURUNDI.

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING WITH SENIOR STAFF MEMBERS OF UNAMIR ON THE ISSUE OF THE MANDATE AND LATER HELD ANOTHER MEETING WITH RWANDAN GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVES ON THE SAME SUBJECT. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE SEMINAR ON "CONSULTATION EVALUATION EPR" AT EGLISE PRESBYTERIENNE AU RWANDA AND ADDRESSED THE GATHERING OF THE CHURCH.

B. IN THE AFTERNOON, AMBASSADOR BOGOSIAN, SPECIAL COORDINATOR AT THE US DEPARTMENT OF STATE CALLED ON THE SRSG AND HELD DISCUSSIONS ON UNAMIR'S MANDATE AND ON OTHER RELATED MATTERS.

C. FINALLY, THE SRSG GAVE A BRIEFING TO MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS AND HEADS OF AGENCIES ON CURRENT DEVELOPMENTS CONCERNING UNAMIR'S MANDATE.







SUBJECT: Security of UNAMIR Vehicles

Further to the previous Administrative Instructions issued on this subject, please be advised that effective 1 January 1996, all personnel to whom UNAMIR vehicles are assigned will be required to park their vehicles in the compound of the Amahoro Hotel, in the parking area of premises where UNAMIR provides security such as the Belgian Village, Trafipro or in areas where security is provided by the establishment such as the Meridien, in the absence of their being able to provide secure overnight parking at their residences. For those in a position to provide secure parking at their residence, a statement to this effect should be sent to the CITMM with copy of the Chief of Security and Safety Unit, attesting to and describing such an arrangement. These parking areas must be utilized during the hours from the cessation of official duties in the evening (including a reasonable time for shopping and meals) to resumption of duties on the following morning.

Owing to the prevailing security situation in Rwanda all UNAMIR vehicles must be parked by 23:00 hours, except when exigencies of work or operational needs require that a vehicle be driven beyond that hour.

Under no circumstances should UNAMIR vehicles be parked unattended, on streets or outside discos or nightclubs during the hours of darkness or for prolonged periods during daytime, unless securely guarded. Loss of or damage to UNAMIR vehicles, while parked unattended in areas other than those outlined in paragraph 1 above will be regarded as being the direct responsibility of the driver or custodian of the vehicle, who will be requested to make financial restitution to the United Nations for such loss or damage.

UNAMIR Military Activity Highlights: Month of November 1995

KIGALI, RWANDA -- Did you know that during the month of November 1995, in addition to normal duties, the following UNAMIR military activities were conducted under the command of Canadian Forces Major General Guy Tousignant to help assist the people of Rwanda?

CONSTRUCTION/ENGINEERING

- provided an excavator cum digger to RPA for digging a canal in Gikongoro; a latrine at the Kigali Military Hospital and laying of pipes at a transit camp;
- deployed a bulldozer for preparing the shifting of the transmitter site in Gikongoro; for a rehabilitation project in Kigali; for the building of a playground in Rwamagana; for work on Nakamera Transit Camp; to improve the Zindoro-Krama road; and, to improve the road approaching the Ramagana commune police training school;
- completed work on building water supplies and on the electrification at the Butare Rehabilitation school;
- repaired a hand pump for the Gashora administration offices;
- recovered a minibus belonging to the RPA near Kanombe as well as a World Food Programme vehicle;
- prepared for the launching of the bridge at Gashora and assisted in repairing the bridging at Gitarama;
- deployed dumptrucks for transporting earth for the Nakamera Transit Camp in Gisenyi;
- continued to conduct rehabilitation work on the 8 km Birenga road;
- conducted lectures and demonstrations about mine awareness in Gitarama, Byumba, Butare and other communes throughout Rwanda;
- the Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) team defused grenades, mortar bombs, anti-pers mines around Kigali; and,
- activated local lines of Rwandatel.

MEDICAL

- a. evacuated two RPA soldiers injured in a mine and vehicle accident to Kanombe Hospital;
- b. medical personnel assisted in the national anti-polio vaccine campaign;
- c. evacuated the bourgemestre of Rubavu and an RPA soldier to Kigali Hospital;
- d. provided ambulance transport to injured locals to Kigeme Hospital as well as medical staff assistance to Kigeme Hospital;
- e. delivered oral rehydration salts to health centres and orphanages in Byumba;
- f. medical staff treated local Rwandese throughout the country; and,
- g. medical staff treated orphans at various orphanages around Rwanda.

FIREFIGHTING

- a. UNAMIR soldiers joined the Rwandan Fire Brigade to fight a fire at the Yamaha Spare Parts Centre in Kigali.

MILITARY OBSERVERS

- a. assisted in the distribution of mine awareness campaign posters;
- b. monitored the transfer of prisoners to the Nsinda Prison;
- c. discovered live explosives and identified mines - local Rwandese made aware and Force Engineers defused the explosives safely;
- d. monitored the safe return of refugees, hospital and prison conditions, schools and consulted with Prefects/Bourgemestres to assist in local communes; and,
- e. advised human rights monitors of any possible human rights violations and investigated infiltrations, thefts, assaults, illegal arrests.

TRANSPORT ASSISTANCE

- a. provided trucks to the Byumba Prefect to transport 10 tons of seeds and 20 tons of paddy seeds for the Ministry of Agriculture;
 - b. provided transport for returning refugees to their home communes and from
-

Nyamasheke to the Nyagatare Transit Camp;

- c. provided trucks to the RPA for the transportation of more than 50 tons of food to RPA sub-units, for troop transportation, to transport laterite from to a firing range in Kigali, and to conduct RPA administration business;
- d. provided trucks to the local (Rwandan) organization "ARDEC" to transport wood;
- e. provided trucks for the transport of prisoners at Byumba and Kibungo to Nsinda and Rwamiko to ease the congested prison situation;
- f. provided vehicles for use by RwandaTel;
- g. provided trucks for the transportation of foodstuffs to: the ACEJ College Mushubati; Ponts et Chaussures to Gasarenda; to the Remera Parents School for Street Children; to Rambura Girls Community School; and to Terres des Hommes for the transport of cereals;
- h. provided trucks for the transport of new recruits to the Gendarmerie School in Rwamagana and to transport gendarmes to Kibungo;
- i. provided trucks to assist in the transport and reburial of remains of genocide victims;
- j. provided trucks for the transportation of construction materials to: SOS Children's Village; for a mosque in Kigali; to ARDEC for the construction of houses; to TROCAIRE for the transport of cement and bricks; to CONCERN for the transport of gravel at Nyarushishi Transit Camp; to IRC for construction materials to Buyeye; and, to CARE in Gikongoro;
- k. transported 80 mattresses to Butare for the Groupe Scolaire;
- l. transported seven tons of fertilizer to Gisenyi for Hungry International;
- m. transported bridging material to Kayenzi for the Salvation Army; and,
- n. transported tons of stationary and school materials to the Karago and Kirambo communes.

ORPHANAGES

- a. medical teams visited orphanages throughout Rwanda to administer first aid and to receive any future medical/humanitarian requirements;

- b. screened movies for orphans at Missionaries of Charity orphanage, Kibungo;
- c. barbers from IndBatt and 95 CMSG donated part of their earnings to local orphanages;
- d. transported 18 tonnes of firewood and furniture to the Cyeza orphanage;
- e. donations provided to the MSF orphanage in Rubabu commune; and,
- f. delivered tentage, cleaning supplies, sandals and blankets to various orphanages in Kigali.

7. The IOM request for a generator and a rub hall was also considered by UHAAG. It was decided that their request be put on the database for generator requests. For the rub hall FHQ Log could check if it can be provided out of the unserviceable stock held.

Action - CLOGO

8. The request for Septic truck by Caisse Sociale du Rwanda was considered and decision taken to put their request on the waiting list.

Action - STO

9. The Ministry of High School, Scientific Research and Culture request for vehicles and office items was considered and it was decided to advise them to apply through the Ministry of Planning to UNDP/UNICEF, as such items were not available with UNAMIR.



2. On 10 Oct 95, the UN MP Coy received a memo from Milob Sector 1B, Gitarama, reporting a theft of about 1500 ltrs of diesel fuel and six empty jerricans from that location on the night of 8 Oct 95. A copy of this memo is attached to this report as Annex 'A'. Note the following extracts;

- a. Approximately 1000 to 1500 litres of diesel fuel at a cost of 38c a litre, total estimated cost \$ 585 US, were stolen from the complex on the night of 8 Oct 95.
- b. Six empty jerricans were used to steal the diesel. Estimated cost of the jerricans is \$ 12 USD.
- c. Two spare wheels were also stolen from UNAMIR 1019 and UNAMIR 1051 which were also parked at the office complex on that night. Estimated cost of the wheel is \$ 299.46 US.
- d. Total estimated cost for all the items stolen is \$ 896.46 US.
- e. There had been earlier thefts of small items like soap, blankets and kitchen sets belonging to UNHCR, who are co-located with Milob Sector 1B, in Kagbayi, Gitarama, Rwanda.

3. Following the report, UN MP Coy sent a Memo to Sector 1B requesting Major S. Sabharwal, the Operation Officer, to attend the UN MP Coy Kigali Detachment on 16 Nov 95, to relate more details on the occurrence, but due to the fact that, the Officer was on leave until the end of Nov 95, he could not attend the company. A copy of this memo is attached to this report as Annex 'B'.

4. On 27 Nov 95, UN MP Coy received another Memo from Sector 1B Gitarama dated 25 Nov 95, requesting a UN MP Investigation team to visit the location as there were other incidents that happened at the same location. A copy of this memo is also attached as Annex 'C' to this report.

5. Following this request, on 29 Nov 95 WOII Akyepong and Sgt Hanyinda travelled to Gitarama (Sector 1B) and met with Major S. Sabharwal who verbally confirmed the contents of annex 'A' of this report and disclosed that the following necessary security measures were taken after the theft;

- i) On the morning of 9 Oct 95 after detecting the theft, Brown and Root corporation was called to re-inforce the windows and doors to the complex with bulglar proof bars.
- ii) Brown and Root also recruited three day and night security guards for the office complex.

- iii) The UNHCR store room was also shifted from its original place to a more secured place to avert further recurrence.

6. The team after looking at the security measures put in place, was satisfied as they were enough to prevent or minimise any further thefts at the location.

7. May the following points of this investigation be noted;

- a. On the night of 8 Oct 95, approximately 1500 ltrs of diesel fuel, six empty jerricans and two spare wheels were stolen from Milob Sector 1B Office complex at Kagbayi in Gitarama Rwanda.
- b. UNHCR items which were prone to thefts at the location, had been moved to a more secured place.
- c. After the theft, Brown and Root were called to fix burglar proof bars in all the windows and doors to prevent further recurrence.
- d. Brown and Root also recruited three guards for the place, one during the day and two at night.
- e. Apart from the Milobs and UNHCR staff members, no one else is now allowed entry into the office complex.
- f. The team of UN MP Investigators who visited the location were satisfied with the security measures taken to prevent further break-in and thefts at the location.
- g. Since these security measures were put in place in mid Oct 95, no thefts had so far been detected.

8. No further investigation is anticipated into this incident. This report is CONCLUDED.

1. THIS IS TO INFORM YOU THAT ON NIGHT 09/10 OCT 95 A THEFT OCCURRED IN OUR SECTOR HQ AT KABGAYI. THE DETAILS ARE COVERED IN SUCCEEDING PARAS.

2. THE THIEVES BROKE THE GLASS WINDOWS OF ONE OF THE OUTER ROOMS, WHICH IS NOT BEING USED, TO MAKE AN ENTRY IN TO THE SECTOR HQ COMPLEX. THERE AFTER THEY BROKE THE GLASS WINDOW OF THE ROOM WHERE PETROL AND SPARE JERRICANS ARE KEPT. THE JERRICANS WERE ACQUIRED SO THAT IT COULD FACILITATE IN TRANSPORTATION OF DIESEL. THE FOLLOWING ITEMS WERE FOUND STOLEN :-

- (a) DIESEL : APPROX 1000 TO 1500 LITERS.
- (b) JERRICANS : SIX.
- (c) SPARE WHEELS : TWO. 1019 1051

3. IT IS ALSO SUBMITTED THAT THIS IS NOT THE FIRST INCIDENT OF THEFT IN OUR COMPLEX. EARLIER THE THEFTS WERE CONFINED TO SMALL ITEMS LIKE COAPS, BLANKETS AND KITCHEN SETS BELONGING TO UNCHR, BUT NOW IT SEEMS THAT THE THIEVES HAVE BECOME BOLDER, BECAUSE THERE IS NO DETERRENCE.

4. THERE IS AN URGENT NEED FOR A NIGHT GUARD FOR THE PROTECTION OF UNAMIR PROPERTY HELD ON CHARGE OF SECTOR 1B. IT IS THERE FORE SUGGESTED THAT OUR REQUEST FOR A SECURITY GUARD SHOULD BE ACCDED IMMEDIATELY. IN THE MEAN WHILE IND BATT MAY PLEASE BE REQUESTED TO PROVIDE A GUARD FOR THE INTERVENING PERIOD.

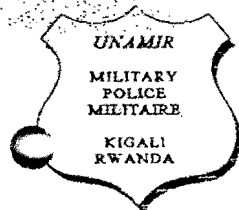

La situation humanitaire générale du pays s'améliore visiblement. Par sa cellule d'aide humanitaire, le HAC (de l'anglais: Humanitarian Assistance Cell), la MINUAR continue d'assurer la bonne coordination de cette assistance dans des efforts concertés avec l'Unité de coordination de l'aide (HACU) du Ministère de la Réhabilitation, avec les organisations du système des Nations Unies et les ONG.

Certaines requêtes reçues ne sont pas de nature strictement humanitaire; elles sont cependant prises en considération et quelques unes sont rapportées ci-dessous.

Ci-après, les principales activités en matière d'aide humanitaire entreprises durant la semaine du 11 au 17 décembre 1995.

- Le HAC a organisé un briefing avec les ONG et le HACU au Ministère de la Réhabilitation.
- A Gitarama, les MILOBs ont fourni 100 housses et linceuls en plastique pour l'inhumation des victimes du génocide dans la commune de Rutobwe, et 100 couvertures aux soeurs du Sacré Cœur de St. Anne à l'intention des orphelins de ce Centre dans la commune de Runda.
- INDBATT a fourni deux camions à l'orphelinat Cyeza.
- Les MILOBs ont secouru et transporté à l'hôpital de Kabgayi trois blessés graves, victimes d'un accident de la circulation.
- LFW et CARITAS ont participé à la reconstruction de maisons d'habitation dans les communes de Kigoma et Ntongwe, pendant que l'Armée du Salut construit de nouvelles dans la commune de Kayenzi.
- ASSIST et LWF ont été occupés à réaliser des programmes agricoles et de réhabilitation dans la commune de Mugina.
- ARDEC a achevé la reconstruction de 100 maisons dans la commune de Runda au bénéfice des veuves.

- A Kibungo, le service médical de GHANCOY a soigné 180 malades et 18 patients dentaires, tous rwandais.
- Le HCR a organisé des visites au Rwanda de représentants de réfugiés en Tanzanie dans le but d'encourager le retour massif de ces réfugiés.
- Le PAM a participé au projet "maisons d'habitation" entrepris par le PNUD dans la commune de Rusumo.
- A Gikongoro, le HC a pris livraison d'une quantité importante de sels de réhydratation orale (SRO) à distribuer dans les hôpitaux, centres de santé et cliniques à travers Gikongoro.
- La cellule humanitaire a fourni le transport au Préfet de Gikongoro afin de l'aider à remplir ses fonctions dans les communes éloignées.
- A Butaré, l'ONG italienne LVIA a continué de contribuer à faire fonctionner une clinique locale dans la commune de Kibaye. Elle y fournit des médicaments, de l'équipement médical et des salaires du personnel.
- En prévision du retour massif des réfugiés, le HCR a identifié, à Nyamasheke et à Cyangugu les lieux qui serviront de camps de transit.
- Le PAM a continué à fournir de la nourriture à l'orphelinat de Kibogora, à Cyangugu.
- A Gisenyi, le HAC a coordonné, avec la NICOY, la fourniture d'équipements scolaires aux écoles dans les communes de Ramba, Kibilira, Kanama, Mutura, Rubavu et Nyamyumba. Le HAC a aussi donné divers objets utilitaires aux orphelinats de Murara et Nyundo.
- Toutes les ONG à Gisenyi ont poursuivi, avec le HCR, les préparatifs en vue du rapatriement massif des réfugiés.





REVIEW OF NGOS OPERATIONS IN RWANDA.

Following the mayhem which befell Rwanda between the month of April and July last year, it became obvious that the country was to be rebuilt from scratch.

This tragedy caused innumerable problems and many challenges to the rwandese people: about one million people were brutally killed by militia and army men. This brought about thousands of orphans and unaccompanied children who had neither medical care nor basic protection: survivors were deprived of everything and most of the time were seriously wounded, we had many defenseless widows and the entire population was displaced. All kinds of infrastructure were either completely or partially destroyed, collective or individual equipment were looted, harvests vandalized all over the countryside. In short, the country was wrecked and populations in total confusion.

Given the situation, especially at the end of the drama, numerous humanitarian organisations offered to come and assist in rebuilding the country. The Rwandese government and the whole population of Rwanda appreciate these tireless efforts employed to give support to Rwanda at the time of need.

However, it is important to note that a big number of humanitarian organisations in such a short time required better co-ordination in order to maximize the use of the assistance rendered.

It is in response to the need of coordination that the Ministry of Rehabilitation and Social Integration, whose mandate amongst other tasks is the coordination of Humanitarian Assistance, decided to set up a structure of the Humanitarian Assistance and NGOs operations Coordination Unit (HACU). It was created among other things to render all services required by NGOs and to be at the same time fully informed about their activities in the country on one hand, and on the other to follow up the evolution of the humanitarian assistance operations.

To date, the task is still big although it is clear that NGOs' coordination is now established. This will facilitate better working relationships and continuous reviews.

A year after the drama, it is important to note that some of these organisations have intervened successfully while others were not up to standard, either because of lack of adequate means and capacities, or not having clear programmes or even having no experience in the various field of intervention.

Therefore, after adequate consultation with the relevant Government authorities, the Ministry of Rehabilitation and Social Integration has resolved to review NGOs operations in Rwanda.

The review concerns particularly non-governmental organisations which have not been successful in setting up programmes that suit different needs of our country, or have failed to comply with the Government regulations by refusing to apply for the registration, and signing basic agreements with the Government.

Other organisations have individual problems namely weak performances in the accomplishment of their programmes, failure to go through the local authorities and technical ministries plus other irregularities.

According to the regulations set up in the working procedures for NGOs, 102 NGOs have been registered and allowed to operate legally in Rwanda having satisfied all requirements.

38 NGOs have been requested to cease operations and leave the country. While 18 others have been asked to suspend their activities and explain their individual cases before any further action can be taken.

The Government of Rwanda wishes to take this opportunity to thank all those assisting Rwanda and to renew its assurances for the continued co-operation with its partners in the reconstruction and development of the country.

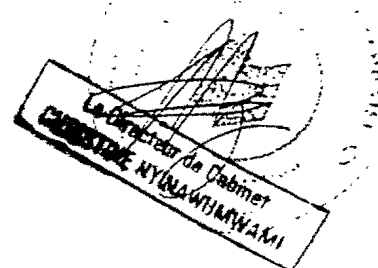

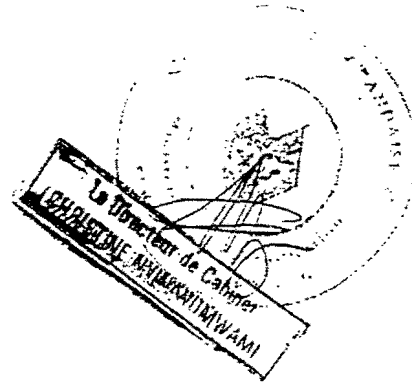

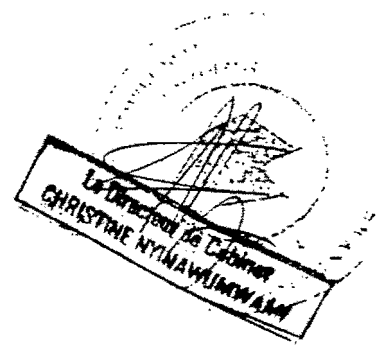

A. MILOBS SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) REPORTED THE ARREST OF MALACHIE NYAMULEMYE, IPS OF KAGAME COMMUNE, IN KIGALI WHILE ON A TRAINING COURSE. THE ALLEGED REASON FOR HIS ARREST IS THE RELEASE OF INDIVIDUALS ARRESTED FOR GENOCIDE WHO HAVE NOW FLED TO ZAIRE.

B. MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) WERE INFORMED BY THE LOCALS OF THE ARREST OF AN INFILTRATOR BY RPA ON 13 DEC 95. THE ARRESTED PERSON CAME FROM ZAIRE AND WAS IN POSSESSION OF A GRENADE.

C. MILOBS SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS OF RUSTIRO COMMUNE (GR 4185) THAT SOME LOCALS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS AND WERE TAKEN TO MILITARY CACHOT IN MUHIRA (GR 4185).

4. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

A. IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) THE ICRC OFFICE IN CYANGUGU WAS ROBBED OF US \$4,500, RWF 700,000 AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS ON 14 DEC 95. THE ROBBERY WAS CARRIED OUT BY THREE ARMED MEN. 3. RPA. IN SECTOR 3A GIKONGORO, IN KIRAMBO COMMUNE, TWO RPA SOLDIERS WITH TWO WOMEN VISITED A BAR IN MURANDI SECTOR (GR 3538) ON 19 DEC 95. AFTER CONSUMING LIQUOR, THEY DEMANDED A ROOM FROM THE LADY RUNNING THE BAR. WHEN THE LADY REFUSED, THE RPA SOLDIERS STARTED MANHANDLING THE LADY. THE HUSBAND, BROTHER AND MOTHER OF THE LADY RUSHED TO HER ASSISTANCE AND IN THE ENSUING SCUFFLE, ONE OF THE RPA SOLDIERS WHO WAS ARMED, SHOT THE HUSBAND OF THE LADY. THE RPA THEN LAUNCHED A SEARCH OP AND ARRESTED MOST OF THEM. HOWEVER THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE DESERTERS IS PRESENTLY NOT KNOWN.

B. IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE), IN MUGUSA COMMUNE GR 8425, IT WAS LEARNED THAT A LOCAL WHO WAS ARRESTED BY THE RPA FOR BEING IN POSSESSION OF UNIFORMS, WAS SHOT DEAD ON 20 DEC 95. THE RPA CLAIM THAT THE DECEASED WAS KILLED WHILE TRYING TO ESCAPE. HR INFORMED AND INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

C. IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), IN MUGINA COMMUNE, RPA SOLDIERS SHOT DEAD A LOCAL ON 19 DEC 95 FOR ALLEGEDLY SUPPLYING WEAPONS TO THE INTERHAMWE DURING THE GENOCIDE. INVESTIGATIONS BY THE IPJ AND THE BOURGEMESTRE ARE IN PROGRESS. HR INFORMED.
