



Dear Sir,

Your letter of 30th July addressed to the High Commissioner for Canada, has been referred to us for attention. In reply we would say that under our existing regulations the only nationals of Continental European countries admissible as immigrants to Canada are:-

- (a) an agriculturist having the means to farm;
- (b) the wife, unmarried son or daughter, or fiancée of a person legally resident in Canada provided the settlement arrangements are satisfactory at destination;
- (c) a person who, having entered Canada as a non-immigrant, enlisted and served in the Canadian Armed Forces and has been honourably discharged therefrom;
- (d) the father or mother, unmarried brother or sister, the orphan (bereaved of both parents) nephew or niece under sixteen years of age, of a person legally admitted to and resident in Canada who is in a position to receive and care for such relatives.

Persons coming within the above-mentioned classes must also pass our medical examination before sailing and comply with our other requirements applicable such as good character, valid travel document, make their own transportation arrangements, and procure visa from a Canadian Immigration Officer stationed in Europe. All applicants must appear in person for examination before competent medical and civil Officers.

Agricultural applicants under category (a) are required to satisfy that they are bona fide farmers and have sufficient funds of their own available in Canada for their actual settlement on the land; the regulations do not specify any amount as this depends on individual circumstances.

Persons coming within category (c) usually complete their Immigration requirements upon demobilisation from the Canadian Armed Forces in the Dominion.



As regards aliens coming within categories (b) and (d) the procedure is for the Canadian resident interested to communicate with our Immigration Service in his district, with a view to having instructions issued through the usual official channels upon conditional entry being approved.

As far as persons of Asiatic race are concerned, the Law only authorises the entry of the wife or unmarried child under eighteen years of age of a Canadian citizen legally admitted to and resident in Canada, who is in a position to receive and care for his dependants. The entry of Chinese is subject to the provisions of the Chinese Immigration Act; there are also several other details and aspects of our requirements which would be too long and complex to explain.

Under PC. 1373 of 9th April, 1946 the entry to or landing in Canada of enemy aliens is prohibited unless, if otherwise admissible, they can satisfy the Minister that they were opposed to an enemy government, however, the wives and unmarried children under eighteen years of age of legal Canadian residents are exempt from this regulation. Any cases of enemy alien nationals must be submitted to the Director of Immigration at Ottawa.

For the time being London is our only place of examination outside Canada and we do not know when circumstances will permit the re-opening of our Immigration Offices on the Continent as existed before the war. Any eligible immigrants now in continental Europe will have to await until such time as we have inspectional facilities available before their movement can be considered.

We are not establishing advanced lists of eligible applicants, nor encouraging applications from ineligible aliens.

I wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter, Ref:DP2/5564, of the 30th July.

In reply I have to advise that we have very much the same experience in this Office as that which you have outlined in that whenever any reference is made in the press or over the radio to the subject of immigration generally, considerable numbers of applications are received from people wishing to make their home in New Zealand.

Briefly stated, the position is that New Zealand has rather a shortage of labour at the present time, but there is also a very serious shortage of houses and for that reason we are unable to encourage people to go to New Zealand immediately. Moreover, shipping facilities are not sufficient to allow people wishing to emigrate to obtain passages.

Applications from aliens for permission to settle in New Zealand cannot be considered favourably now unless there is some special reason to support the application.

So far as aliens are concerned, I do not think the New Zealand Government will be able to make any change in this attitude until the housing position has been substantially improved and, despite best endeavours, two or three years must elapse before that can be done.

I have for reply your memorandum of the 30th July on the subject of emigration of Displaced Persons.

So far as the Commonwealth of Australia is concerned, an Agreement has been reached between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the migration of British nationals as and when the terms of the Agreement become operative. The date for this has not yet been determined.

With regard to the migration of persons other than British nationals, no arrangements have yet been made and it is not anticipated that any decision herein can be made for some little time to come. 1. This office deals exclusively with the repatriation and resettlement of Displaced Persons and from time to time notices appear in the press and announcements are made over the wireless to the effect that such and such a country is eventually going to take so many immigrants.
2. These notices are invariably followed by a flood of applicants, to whom one can give no definite information: this HQ has however evolved the enclosed pro forma which is filled up and filed under the desired country of immigration, against the day when immigration may be opened up.
3. It would be greatly appreciated if the latest policy on immigration, as decided on by your Government, could be communicated to this HQ, so that up to date information can be available for applicants. Would you also please inform this HQ, as and when, any change in policy takes place.

Your letter of 30th July addressed to the High Commissioner for Canada, has been referred to us for attention. In reply we would say that under our existing regulations the only nationals of Continental European ~~countries~~ admissible as immigrants to Canada are:-

- (a) an agriculturist having the means to farm;
- (b) the wife, unmarried son or daughter, or financee of a person legally resident in Canada provided the settlement arrangements are satisfactory at destination;
- (c) a person who, having entered Canada as a non-immigrant, enlisted and served in the Canadian Armed Forces and has been honourably discharged therefrom;
- (d) the father or mother, unmarried brother or sister, the orphan (bereaved of both parents) nephew or niece under sixteen years of age, of a person legally admitted to and resident in Canada who is in a position to receive and care for such relatives.

Persons coming within the above-mentioned classes must also pass our medical examination before sailing and comply with our other requirements applicable such as good character, valid travel document, make their own transportation arrangements, and procure visa from a Canadian Immigration Officer stationed in Europe. All applicants must appear in person for examination before competent medical and civil Officers.

Agricultural applicants under category (a) are required to satisfy that they are bona fide farmers and have sufficient funds of their own available in Canada for their actual settlement on the land; the regulations do not specify any amount as this depends on individual circumstances.

Persons coming within category (c) usually complete their Immigration requirements upon demobilisation from the Canadian Armed Forces in the Dominion.

As regards aliens coming within categories (b) and (d) the procedure is for the Canadian resident interested to communicate with our Immigration Service in his district, with a view to having instructions issued through the usual official channels upon conditional entry being approved.

As far as persons of Asiatic race are concerned, the Law only authorises the entry of the wife or unmarried child under eighteen years of age of a Canadian citizen legally admitted to and resident in Canada, who is in a position to receive and care for his dependants. The entry of Chinese is subject to the provisions of the Chinese Immigration Act; there are also several other details and aspects of our requirements which would be too long and complex to explain.

Under PC. 1373 of 9th April, 1946 the entry to or landing in Canada of enemy aliens is prohibited unless, if otherwise admissible, they can satisfy the Minister that they were opposed to an enemy government, however, the wives and unmarried children under eighteen years of age of legal Canadian residents are exempt from this regulation. Any cases of enemy alien nationals must be submitted to the Director of Immigration at Ottawa.

For the time being London is our only place of examination outside Canada and we do not know when circumstances will permit the re-opening of our Immigration Offices on the Continent as existed before the war. Any eligible immigrants now in continental Europe will have to await until such time as we have inspectional facilities available before their movement can be considered.

We are not establishing advanced lists of eligible applicants, nor encouraging applications from ineligible aliens.

I wish to acknowledge receipt of your letter, Ref:DP2/5564, of the 30th July.

In reply I have to advise that we have very much the same experience in this Office as that which you have outlined in that whenever any reference is made in the press or over the radio to the subject of immigration generally, considerable numbers of applications are received from people wishing to make their home in New Zealand.

Briefly stated, the position is that New Zealand has rather a shortage of labour at the present time, but there is also a very serious shortage of houses and for that reason we are unable to encourage people to go to New Zealand immediately. Moreover, shipping facilities are not sufficient to allow people wishing to emigrate to obtain passages.

Applications from aliens for permission to settle in New Zealand cannot be considered favourably now unless there is some special reason to support the application.

So far as aliens are concerned, I do not think the New Zealand Government will be able to make any change in this attitude until the housing position has been substantially improved and, despite best endeavours, two or three years must elapse before that can be done.

I have for reply your memorandum of the 30th July on the subject of emigration of Displaced Persons.

So far as the Commonwealth of Australia is concerned, an Agreement has been reached between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and the Government of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the migration of British nationals as and when the terms of the Agreement become operative. The date for this has not yet been determined.

With regard to the migration of persons other than British nationals, no arrangements have yet been made and it is not anticipated that any decision herein can be made for some little time to come. Whether Displaced Persons will be included within any proposal for the migration of other than British nationals is a matter for later consideration.

For the present therefore, it is suggested that it would not be an appropriate course for this Office to encourage Displaced Persons to complete the questionnaire submitted by you, until we are in a position to offer more definite information.

In the past few weeks we have had several enquiries regarding the possibility of Displaced Persons in this Zone emigrating to the United States of America, in accordance with the President's Directive dated 22nd December, 1945.

For your information we are transcribing below the ruling received from the American Consul General with regard to applications for emigration to the United States of America:

"At this time the Consulate General is in a position to accept visa applications only from certain close relatives of American citizens who are entitled to nonquota or preference status under the immigration laws, and from the wives and unmarried children under twenty-one years of age of legally admitted aliens in the United States who are entitled to preference status.

In accordance with the President's Directive of December 22 1945, all nonpreference quota numbers are being used solely for displaced persons residing in the American zones of occupation in Austria and Germany on the date the Directive was issued. Should there be any change regarding visa applications at a later date, a notice to that effect will appear in the Austrian press and prospective nonpreference applicants will then be invited to register for visas.

It is pointed out that this ruling applies to all persons desirous of immigrating to the U.S.A., including those in possession of Affidavits of Support from relations in the States; Therefore no advantage can be gained by forwarding such applications to this H.Q. They must be held by the applicant until such time as the non-preference quota is open to applicants from the British Zone of Austria."





Perhaps it would be also possible for you to send a girl which would be employed for house work or in the industry, as would be suitable. But it is essential to get only girls or women who do not steal, and who are of good moral deportment and healthy,

Kindly give us details about this matter as we do not know, what sort of people you have on hand and if you can get the exit permit for them. The entry permit will be procured by us. We have no posts for men, as there is no scarcity and the trades-union would not permit it. On the other hand we give all guarantee for good treatment and a comfortable income.







Some D.P.s in my camp have drawn my attention to the paragraph reproduced below, which appeared in page 2 of the Salzburger Nachrichten of 8th July.

They request the intervention of UNRRA, to secure for Allied D.P.s at present in UNRRA camps equal consideration as is given to Germans and Austrians so far as opportunities for work in England are concerned. They are anxious to know the date when the Ministry official is due to arrive in Austria.

" England will relax restriction of immigration.



The British Home Secretary Chuter Ede declared on Friday before the House of Commons, that he hopes to come to an agreement about immigration to Great Britain, which will fix a greater admission -quota for Germans and Austrians. An official of the Home Office will be sent to the continent to ascertain for which countries the restrictions of immigration could be relaxed.
