



SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF INCIDENTS INVOLVING RPA ON 27 FEB 95.

1. In sector 1, Nicoy reported that an RPA soldier at a road block at RUTARE was found with a UN peak cap. The soldier was confronted to explain how he got the cap and attempts to retrieve it was not successful. The RPA Comd at RUTARE was not available at the time of the incident. However, the case was reported to RPA sy offr at the Commune HQ who promised to inform the RPA Comd and feed Nicoy back with any action taken.
2. In sector 1, at GITI the Assistant Bourgmestre informed Nicoy ptl team that RPA arrested 3 locals on 18 feb 95 and conveyed them to an unspecified destination. Reasons for the arrest not known. He said the 3 locals are yet to be released.
3. In sector 4A, Zambatt reported that 14 IDPs from KIBEHO, NDAGO and KAMANA DP camps, were detained at MASIGA RPA camp for illegal border crossing.
4. In sector 4A, Zambatt reported an increased presence of RPA soldiers in MURAMBI area who at night are forcing locals to open their shebeens (unlicensed bars) until early hours of morning. These RPA soldiers are moving in twos or fours. Zambatt ptls sent out to the mentioned area confirmed the report but the RPA soldiers disappeared when they saw the Zambatt troops.
5. In sector 4a Zambatt reported that 3 IDPs were killed and another injured by RPA troops when they were prevented from arresting two FRGF soldiers by IDPs in KIBEHO DP camp at 2030hrs on 26 feb 95. Milobs and UN Military Police investigating.
6. Sector 5 Milobs reported the movement of between 200 to 300 RPA troops on the BUSOGO-RUHENGARI road. The soldiers were heading in the direction of RUHENGARI and appeared to be carrying their personal belongings with them. The reason for their movement was not known.

SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF INCIDENTS INVOLVING RPA ON 25 AND 26 FEB 95.

1. In sector 2, RPA established a check point about 10 metres from GHANBATT pl posn at MULINDI GR 7667 but was persuaded through negotiations to move it.
2. In MULINDI in sector 2, GHANBATT reported that RPA is preventing locals from communicating with GHANBATT tps.
3. In sector 2, a girl aged 15 from GATI GR 4392 reported to GHANBATT tps at GISHALI GR 4788 that at 1200 hrs on 24 Feb 95, a group of soldiers suspected to be RPA accompanied by some policemen from MUHAZI commune GR 4789, arrested her father for no apparent reason. The mother of the girl was reported to have abandoned the house. The Sous-Prefect of RWAMAGANA was contacted about the incident and he has assured GHANBATT troops of details by 27 Feb 95. The girl has however refused to go back to GATI for fear of harassment by RPA elms. Milob and HR have confirmed the arrest. Meanwhile, villagers reported that about 15 more people were arrested by the RPA on the same day.
4. Civpol observers in sector 3 visited the Bourgmestre of TAMBWE/RUHANGO commune to investigate a case in which the Counsellor of NTENHYO sector, a Hutu, was arrested by RPA whilst at a meeting at RUHANGO on 16 feb 95 and was allegedly tortured. The Bourgmestre confirmed the incident and added that the Counsellor of NTENYO sector had been mentioned as one of the perpetrators of the genocide in the country. He is currently detained at GITARAMA prison. He further disclosed that 20 other locals were being detained in the commune cells for taken part in the genocide. Human rights informed.
5. In sector 3, Milobs conducted investigations of reports of a secret RPA prison in KIGOMA (GR 7750). Three locals have confirmed the existence of the prison. It was also reported that the prisoners have not been registered. The locals added that arrests were normally made at night. The holding facility at the KIGOMA commune office was empty.
6. A local businessman who was abducted from GAHIRA in sector 4a has been brought back by RPA from KADUHA where they had detained him.

7. Sector 4a Milobs reported that RPA troops in KIBEHO DP camp (GR 5107) tried to arrest a local without prior warning to the ZAMBATT platoon providing security in the camp. The IDPs became violent and stoned the RPA troops. The timely intervention of ZAMBATT troops prevented the situation getting out of control.

8. In sector 4c ETHIOBATT was informed by locals that a local was found dead at KIBOGORA GR 0343 and another at BUHORO GR 1346. The 2 were allegedly killed by RPA. Reasons for the killings not known. Investigations in progress.

9. In KAMEMBE in sector 4c rpa shot and killed one alleged bandit who tried to escape from custody. The bandit was arrested by locals and was alleged to be carrying 2 grenades at the time of his arrest. Investigations in progress.

10. In sector 4c, Civpol observers in CYANGUGU, reported that there is feeling of insecurity among the locals of NYAMASHEKE commune, due to arbitrary arrests by the RPA especially at night. They further revealed that the whereabouts of the arrested persons were unknown and have appealed to UNAMIR for protection. Human Rights informed.

11. In sector 5, Milobs reported that the RPA check-point at the entrance of GISENYI had been shifted to area GR 189125.

SUBJECT: SECURITY FOR KIBEHO IDP CAMP

1. It has been reliably learnt, that the RPA is planning to increase its presence around KIBEHO Camp shortly with the possible motive of closing the camp forcibly.

2. In view of the above developments the following have been tasked as under.

a. ZAMBATT. Increase presence gradually in Kibeho camp to a coy strength by 1800 hrs on 27 Feb 95. Thinning out of tps to present strength will take place only on orders of this HQ.

b. MILOBS. Increase patrolling and monitoring activities in Kibeho camp with immediate effect.

c. CIVPOL. Increase presence gradually in Kibeho camp from present strength to 6 teams from 1800 hrs on 27 Feb 95 to 0800 hrs on 02 March 95.

d. G3 AIR. Provide two helis on 28 Feb 95, on standby with effect from 0600 hrs for AME and conveyance of offrs to Kibeho camp.

e. FMO. Earmark a AME team for cas evac and provision of first aid to any wounded at Kibeho camp.

f. ICRC and HAC. Monitor any Human Rights violation.

3. If any of our activities are objected by RPA, it will be ensured that no one gets into a direct confrontation or altercation with the RPA on any account. This HQ will be kept informed at all times of the developments taking place in Kibeho camp.

SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF INCIDENTS INVOLVING RPA ON 24 FEB 95

1. In sector 2, GHANBATT reported that RPA prevented locals from communicating with GHANBATT troops in the sector.
2. In sector 2, at about 212200B Feb 95, while ptl on route 200m south west of RWANTERU base GR 7948, one armed RPA soldier Twagira Bisimungu of 21st mobile bn, halted ptl team, and told them he had been authorised by KIBUNGO RPA Comd to prevent UNAMIR from using APC's on their roads including 3rd class roads. Ptl comd managed to defuse tension and team proceeded on the scheduled ptl. Attempts being made to show letter from UNAMIR HQ authorising mobile ptls in sector.
3. In sector 3, MILOBS reported that as a result of the cordon and search exercise carried out by RPA yesterday, a lot of seized goods including furniture, audio-visual equipment, motor cycles and miscellaneous household items were seen piled beside the road near the market at RUHANGO.
4. In sector 3, a joint MILOB/UNHCR patrol went to IMBARE Cellule of MUSAMBIRA (GR 8374) Commune. The patrol was informed by some women that there were only 3 men left in the village, all over 60 years. The rest had been arrested by RPA or fled the village for fear of such arrest. The Prefect of GITARAMA when contacted, confirmed the arrests. The Sector Commander plans visiting the Bourgemestre to discuss the issue.
5. In sector 4A, MILOBS reported that approximately one platoon of RPA cordoned KAMANA IDP camp GR 5196 and apprehended six suspects who were in possession of two grenades. One of the suspects was a former RGF soldier and the rest civilians. They have been taken to ZAMBATT HQ at GIKONGORO. Investigation in progress.
6. In sector 4A, unconfirmed reports indicate that the RPA intends to close KIBEHO camp on 28 Feb 95 and will be increasing the strength of its tps in the camp from 7 sections to 11 sections with effect from the night of 26 Feb 95. A senior RPA officer will be in command of the tps instead of the platoon commander currently in the camp.

7. In sector 4B, Milob ptl was sent to KIBUYE and MABANZA (3473) communes to check the security situation in view of increased arrests of locals by RPA in the recent past. The Bourgemestre of MABANZA confirmed that some persons identified by the locals as having taken part in the genocide have been arrested and detained in the MABANZA prison. The number is currently 80 and initial interrogation by commune officials has been completed. They are to be moved to KIBUYE for further investigations. Milob team was not permitted to visit the prison.

8. In sector 4B, Milobs escorted a human rights team to GIAHANGO GR 2560 where situation was found to be tense owing to harassment by RPA in the area. Locals reported that the whereabouts of seven people arrested in Jan 95 was still not known.

9. In sector 4C, MILOBS reported that RPA troops fired two short bursts from small arms in general area GR 7925. Investigation in progress.

10. In sector 4C, ZAMBATT reported that between 2200-2300 hrs on 23 Feb 95 in KIVU Commune, an unknown number of bandits attacked one local and his wife both aged 36 at their home using a grenade. The man lost his leg in the grenade blast whilst the wife was severely beaten. An uncle to the victim disclosed that the bandits went away with 2.5 Million Rwandese francs and a radio. The male victim was rushed to BUTARE hospital where he later died whilst the wife is in KIBEHO hospital. It is further reported that the relatives who accompanied the man to the hospital, were harassed by RPA in BUTARE for no known reason. Investigations in progress.

11. In sector 5 sub-sector HQ in RUHENGARI, MILOBS reported that one platoon of RPA moved to GISENYI Prefecture to reinforce the existing RPA deployment due to incidents of the last week.

12. Deputy Army Chief of Staff of RPA, Col Bem Gatsinzi, accompanied by Comdt Rwandan Mil Academy, Col Rusatira, Maj Twagrunukiza and Capt Gatera visited to inspect the mil academy printer. The party was escorted by CO AUSMED. After a walk around the area, it was discovered the printer lay outside AUSMED bdry. Party apologised for inconvenience and left. Visit was friendly and relaxed throughout.

13. In sector 6 KIGALI, CIVPOL observer team reported that RPA have intensified vehicular and foot patrols in KIGALI city with a number of check points mounted at strategic locations. Also traffic gendarmes were seen controlling motor traffic.

1. In ref " A" above, para 8d, of the letter indicates that communes closer to sector 4A area, are more vulnerable to security problems particularly during the night hours.

2. In view of this, it is requested that MALAWI COY be tasked to conduct night patrols in those communes that are affected by the INERAHAMWE activities.

3. The patrol plan should be coordinated with the local RPA commanders within the sector.

SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF INCIDENTS INVOLVING RPA ON 23 FEB 95

(1) IN SECTOR 2, GHANBATT REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS AND LOCALS IN MULINDI AREA GR 7567 HELD A MEETING TO DISCUSS SY SITUATION IN THE COMMUNE. LOCALS AND RPA REPS LATER CAME TO THE PTL TO EXCHANGE GREETINGS.

(2) GHANBATT TROOPS AT RUKIRA GR 6557 REPORTED THAT THEY HAVE ARRESTED A DRUNKEN RPA SOLDIER (CPL EMMANUEL RUJIGA) WITH A GRENADE AND A LOCAL WHO WAS ATTEMPTING TO CROSS GHANBATT TROOPS LOCALITY AT APPROX 232105 B FEB 95. THE SOLDIER WAS DISARMED AND HANDED OVER TO THE BOURGMESTRE. THE HAND GRENADE IS IN GHANBATT CUSTODY PENDING COLLECTION.

(3) IN SECTOR 3, MALAWICOY REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED A MAN BELIEVED TO BE INTERHAMWE LEADER NEAR NGOZI BORDER GR 6989. THE MAN HAD FLED INTO BURUNDI AND SAID TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR MOST OF THE RECENT ATTACKS ON LOCALS IN KIGEMBE COMMUNE. HE IS ALSO BELIEVED TO HAVE ADMITTED KILLING MORE THAN 20 PEOPLE WITH HIS FRIENDS WHO ARE STILL AT LARGE. HE IS IN CUSTODY AT THE COMMUNE HQ. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(4) AUSMED REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 1540 HRS, TWO RPA SOLDIERS ENTERED THE NGO WARD OF CHK. ONE DRESSED IN TRACKSUIT AND UNARMED. THE OTHER IN UNIFORM CARRYING A RIFLE. WHEN STAFF WORKING IN NGO WARD GREETED THE RPA SOLDIERS IN FRENCH, THE ONE IN TRACKSUIT STATED THAT HE WAS AN RPA OFFR AND THAT HE SHOULD NOT BE ADDRESSED IN FRENCH. THE OFFR BECAME HEATED AND ABUSED THE AUSMED STAFF. THE OTHER ASSAULTED A CHILD AND KICKED THE CHILD IN THE HEAD. THE CHILD DID NOT REQUIRE MED ATTENTION. TWO UNARMED AUS INF SOLDIERS ENTERED THE WARD TO ASSIST AND THE TWO RPA SOLDIERS DEPARTED. NO FURTHER INCIDENTS OCCURRED. RPA LO AT UNAMIR HQ INFORMED.

(5) RPA TROOPS IN SECTOR 3 CONDUCTED A CORDON AND SEARCH EXERCISE TO SEIZE LOOTED GOODS FROM THE LOCALS IN RUHANGO (GR 7754). THE BDE COMD INFORMED MILOBS THAT RESIDENCY CARDS WERE TO BE ISSUED TO LOCALS. THE SEARCH OPERATION WAS SUCCESSFULLY CONDUCTED. NO ARRESTS WERE OBSERVED OR REPORTED TO MILOBS.

(6) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT TWO LOCALS FROM KAMANA COMMUNE GR 5197 INFORMED UNAMIR TPS THAT RPA LAY AMBUSHES BETWEEN RUNYOMBYI AND KAMANA ON WEDNESDAYS AND SATURDAYS WITH THE AIM OF GRABBING ITEMS FROM LOCALS CROSSING THE BORDER FROM BURUNDI.

(7) RPA TROOPS AT MARABA HAVE ARRESTED TWO LOCALS IN THE AREA FOR NO APPARENT REASONS.

(8) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED 12 LOCALS AROUND GISUMA AND TRANSPORTED THEM TO KAMEMBE. REASON FOR THE ARRESTS NOT KNOWN. HR INFORMED.

(8) RPA TROOPS IN SECTOR 4C HAVE RELEASED THE BOURGEMESTRE OF BUGARAMA. IT IS ESTIMATED THAT 25 PERSONS INCLUDING 5 COUNCILLORS AND 20 INTELLECTUALS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED IN THE SECTOR ON CHARGES OF PARTICIPATING IN THE GENOCIDE.

(9) RPA TROOPS NEAR THE APEEDUC ORPHANAGE (GR 782278) IN SECTOR 4C WERE REPORTED TO HAVE OPENED FIRE ON SOME BOATS ON AN ISLET NEAR THE ORPHANAGE BETWEEN 222200B -222330B FEB 95. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED. RPA LOCAL COMMANDERS REFUSED TO COMMENT ON THE INCIDENT WHEN QUESTIONED BY SECTOR MILOBS.

(10) TWO LOCALS WERE ARRESTED IN BUGARAMA (SECTOR 4C) ON 16 FEB 95. ONE WAS ARRESTED FOR POSSESSING TWO GRENADES AND A WEAPON. THE OTHER LOCAL WAS ARRESTED FOR MURDER OF HIS NEIGHBOUR. IN THE SAME SECTOR, MILOBS REPORTED THAT HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS WERE STILL BEING REFUSED ACCESS TO THE CELLS IN KAMEMBE.







1. In sector 2, RPA tps arrested 4 civilians crossing the border from BURUNDI using an unauthorised route. They were later released after OC ZAMBATT intervened.
2. In sector 2, MILOBS investigated an incident of banditry at RWAMANYONI GR 535138 in which armed bandits, killed a woman and stole her household goods. RPA ambushed the bandits on their escape route towards the Akagera National Park, killed two of them and recovered the stolen items.
3. In sector 3, an RPA vehicle escorting the Rwandese Vice President reportedly knocked down a girl in BUTARE. The child was evacuated to BUTARE hospital.
4. In sector 3, RPA detained 37 locals at RAMBA GR 5414 for possessing hand grens while being repatriated from the IDP camp.
4. In sector 4C, a joint team of CIVPOL observers and HR special investigation unit, travelled to CYANGUGU to investigate the killings of 13 locals by the RPA.
5. In sector 4C, MILOBS reported an increase in the strength of RPA tps in KAMEMBE commune. It is not known wether it was normal troop rotation or a build up for a specific operation. RPA was also reported to have arrested the Bourgemestre of GISHOMA and another local on 16 Feb 95, for having allegedly participated in the genocide.
6. RPA tps in sector 5, informed TUNBATT of the arrest of the Counsellior of TAMIRA GR 3125 on charges of murder and have requested MILOBS and HR monitors to investigate the charges.







1. In sector 2, RPA tps at IDAGAZG GR 5739 and MUGOGO GR 5737 stopped MILOBS at their check points. After some negotiations, the MILOBS were allowed to proceed.
2. In sector 3, MILOBS were informed of numerous arbitrary arrests by the RPA and local authorities from RUTOBWE and NYABIKENKE communes. Most of the victims were said to be men and are usually picked at night. One particular case involving a Mr Samuel who is being held incommunicado in the TAMBWE commune jail GR 7653, is under investigation. In NDORA commune, similar arrests were reported. The matter is being taken up with the RPA liaison officer and Human Rights.
3. In sector 3, CIVPOL observers reported that 19 locals who were suspected to have taken part in the genocide, have been detained at KIYUMBU for over a month and are being fed by their relatives. Human Rights were informed.
4. RPA tps in MUBUGA commune in sector 4A, arrested a local for no apparent reason. Human Rights were informed.
5. In sector 4C, MILOBS reported that the RPA exchanged fire with bandits in the area of KIREHE GR 0547 on night 19/20 Feb 95. There were no casualties or arrests reported.
6. In sector 5, an RPA officer informed TUNBATT that the RPA had arrested the counsellor of NKUMIRA commune for genocide. MILOBS and Human Rights were informed.


SUBJECT : SUMMARY OF INCIDENTS INVOLVING RPA ON 18 AND 19 FEB 95

1. RPA in RUNDU in Sector 2 on 18 Feb 95, again denied passage to MILOBS beyond their check-point.
2. At RUNTONGO Commune in Sector 3 on 18 Feb 95, the Bourgmestre informed UN CIVPOL ptl, that 12 suspects who were alleged to have murdered a 20 year old woman on 04 Feb 95, have been detained by RPA. Human rights were informed.
3. ZAMBATT reported the arrest of 5 locals by RPA in Musange in Sector 4A on the 18 Feb 95. No reasons were given and their whereabouts are not known. In another incident in the same sector, RPA soldiers in Runyini were alleged to have beaten a local for no apparent reason. One RPA soldier was identified and investigations in progress.
4. An RPA soldier in Gikongoro on 18 Feb 95, went to NYAKIZU GR 5796 and demanded two cows from a local saying that the animals belonged to his late father. Zambatt OC in loc advised the RPA soldier to follow the right procedures. Witnesses to both parties were interviewed.
5. RPA soldiers on 18 Feb 95, searched the house of the Bourgmestre of RUNYOMBYI for weapons. When they found nothing, they attempted to take away his motor bike claiming it was government property but MILOBS, to whom wife reported the case, intervened with the assistance of ZAMBATT OC in loc.
6. RPA troops were reported to have arrested a local aged 22 in the BRUSSERIE MUETZIG in Gisenyi on 08 Feb 95. He was accused to have taken part in last year's genocide. HR informed and investigations is in progress.
7. In sector 5, UN CIVPOL ptl team reported that 2 young men were alleged to have been killed in custody of RPA at BIGOGWE military camp on 15 Feb 95. RPA authorities in the area claimed they were shot when they attempted to escape from custody. Investigation is in progress.
8. UN CIVPOL on 18 Feb 95, reported that RPA have intensified patrols within KIGALI city and have also mounted snap check points in some strategic locations in Kigali.
9. In Sector 4A, UNAMIR veh assigned to ZAMBATT which was involved in an accident with an RPA veh, has been impounded by the Gendarmerie in GIKONGORO pending investigations of the cause

of accident.

10. In Sector 5, TUNBATT reported that an RPA Comd intercepted TUNBATT APCs which were returning to GISENYI GR 2612. After negotiations, the APCs were allowed to move to NYUNDO. The RPA Comd claimed that APCs would damage the road.

1. In sector 2, MILOBS went to RUNDU GR 2475 to investigate a case in which a GHANBATT patrol was threatened with a gren by an unknown person. MILOBS reported that an RPA soldier with grens challenged them in the same area but allowed them to pass when they pretended to be on recce to locate a suitable place for an orphanage.
2. The RPA at GAKO GR 1953 in sector 2, is carrying out training and reintegration of the FRGF. Access to the training camp was denied to the MILOBS.
3. MILOBS in sector 4C, reported that the local population remained tense due to the increased arrests and curfew imposed by the RPA. The curfew applies to all personnel within the communes.
4. In sector 5, MILOBS reported the killings of two persons by the RPA for allegedly knocking down an RPA soldier with their motorcycle. Their mutilated bodies were handed over to their families on 15 Feb 95. A joint MILOB/Human Rights team is investigating the report.
5. In KIGALI, AUSMED reported that RPA pursued an AUSMED ambulance to the Presidential hanger at KIA, after it accidentally knocked over a witch hat at a RPA road block. The driver was unaware of this and proceeded to the airport. The RPA became abusive at the airport and threatened to shoot the ambulance crew if they repeated the act. The incident was peacefully resolved and the RPA departed.

1. Reference Daily Sitrep of 15 Feb 95 para 4i. Patrols were despatched by TUNBATT at first light on 16 Feb to search the vicinity of the target UN installation for possible clues of the perpetrators of the previous night's attack. During this investigation, elements of the TUNBATT patrol stepped on a mine, possibly of fragmentation type, which resulted to injuries to eight Tunisian soldiers. Of these, four received serious injuries; the remainder of the injuries were moderate and minor.

2. Details of the casualties are as follows:

3. Seven of the casualties were evacuated to Kigali. Four of these casualties have been evacuated to Nairobi for further treatment. A Military Police investigation team was despatched to the scene this afternoon, and a detailed report of the incident is awaited.

1. Zambatt reported that RPA arrested 2 locals on 13 Feb and 14 Feb 95 at GISEKI GR 4614 and GISORORA GR 486174 in RWAMIKO. Reasons for arrests unknown. HR was informed.
2. Zambatt reported that people in KADHUA have gone into hiding because RPA tps asked them to exhume bodies of people who were massacred at the Roman Catholic church, for reburial.
3. At MBUGA GR 422245 at about 2200 hrs on 14 Feb 95, armed men believed to be RPA lobbed two smoke grens into the DP camp. They then proceeded to GAHIRA in WINKINGI sector GR 418366 where , after firing shots in the air, they abducted a local businessman. It is believed that the RPA took away a vast sum of money kept in the abducted man's shop. The whereabouts and condition of the abducted man is not known. RPA have denied any involvement in the incident and have promised to investigate.
4. In sector 5, a local woman from KANAMA commune GR 2812, reported to TUNBATT that her husband had been abducted on 13 Feb 95 by the RPA for no apparent reason. Sector MILOBS and HR informed.
5. In sector 5, TUNBATT reported that RPA soldiers exchanged fire with bandits near MUTURA commune GR 3223 on night 14/15 Feb 95. Two bandits were killed and one RPA soldier was injured.
6. In sector 6, a traffic accident took place between a AUSMED vehicle and a RPA vehicle at the Australian camp in KIGALI. The RPA vehicle reversed into the UNAMIR vehicle which was waiting to come onto the road. The situation escalated when one RPA soldier cocked his weapon to which the AUSMED soldiers retaliated. The situation was defused and the AUSMED vehicle impounded by the Gendarmerie. Efforts underway at UNAMIR HQ to defuse the tension between RPA and AUSMED.



1. In sector 3, returnees at MPUNGWE GR 6414 and RURARA GR 6512 reported that RPA arrested some of their relatives and sent them to BUTARE prison. Reasons for the arrest not known. HRFO informed.
2. In sector 3, MILOBS patrolled MUSAMBIRA to investigate reports of massive arrests of locals by RPA. Investigation is continuing; two specific cases were however handed over to sector Human Rights monitors for further investigation.
3. In sector 4B, locals of MUHIRA GR 4185 and RUBOREZA GR 1158, reported to the sector MILOBS, that the RPA arrested a total of 31 people in the two communes. The locals were not specific about the date of the arrests. Local police and RPA commanders contacted, declined to comment or give reasons for the arrests. It was also reported that there had been armed incursions into the RUBOREZA about three weeks earlier. The deployment of RPA tps had however stabilised the security situation in the area.
4. In sector 4C, MILOBS reported that two persons were arrested by the RPA in GISHUMA commune for their alleged participation in the genocide during the war. The suspects are being held in GISHUMA jail.
5. In sector 5, a local from MUTURA commune GR 3223, reported that RPA tps arrested his brother and three locals on 09 Feb 95. Reasons for arrest not known. In another incident, a local at NKULI GR 4724 reported to TUNBATT that he had been living in the forest due to threats to his life by the RPA for unknown reasons. MILOBS sector 5 and Human Rights were informed.
6. One local requested for protection from TUNBATT at NYUNDO GR 2411 alleging that RPA tps wanted to arrest him. He further stated that the RPA had arrested his two wives and eight children. HRFO has been informed and investigation is in progress.
7. In sector 5, CIVPOL observers assisted the Human Rights field team in GISENYI during the investigation of the arbitrary arrests of 2 local employees of ELECTROGAZ by RPA tps. Reasons for arrest still not known.





1. In sector 2, GHANBATT reported that a FRGF soldier from KAGASHA GR 3968 who was hunted by the RPA, sought refuge in KABILIZI ptl base . He has been transferred to BARE ptl base. MILOBS and HR informed.

2. In sector 4B, RPA tps in NYABINAGA GR 1450, arrested a local for stealing livestock during the war. The report stated that the accused refused to pay the cost of the livestock and was subsequently arrested and placed in custody in the RWAMATAMU prison.

3. In sector 4B, MILOB ptl to NYABINAGA GR 1450 which investigated the shooting of a local on 07 Feb 95 who is a member of the vigilance group, reported that the info gathered so far indicated that the individual, despite instructions to the contrary by the local RPA commanders, insisted on going on the patrol. The victim is currently undergoing treatment in KIBUYE hospital.

4. In sector 4C, sector MILOBS reported that in two separate incidents on 06 and 09 Feb 95, two locals were arrested by the RPA in GITAMBI GR 8815 for associating with known bandits.

5. In sector 5, TUNBATT reported the arrest of a boy from RUBAVO commune GR 2911 in CYANIKA sector on 30 Jan 95 while on the way from GISENYI to KIGALI. His family requested info about him. MILOBS and HR informed.

6. In sector 5, a local from NKULI commune reported that on 07 Jan 95, RPA arrested one local who owned many herds of cattle. No reason for the arrest was given and neither are the whereabouts of the prisoner known. HR informed.

7. ZAMBATT reported that RPA presence in MUNINI scared away IDPs who were willing to be escorted from MUNINI DP camp to their home communes in NYAKIZU commune in sector 3.

8. In sector 6, investigation into the killing of a local by an RPA soldier on 06 Feb 95, revealed that the soldier killed the civilian due to personal enmity. The Gendarmerie HQ at REMERA is taking action against the RPA soldier.

3. In sector 4B, MILOBS patrols to GISOVU GR 2952 and MATUNTU GR 3553, reported that that the locals were uneasy of the RPA presence as the RPA had arrested several persons in the area. The locals were reluctant to provide the details. Investigations are in progress.

This is the second such incident in the sector during the week and MILOBS investigation is in progress.
5. Reports from locals of NKULI GR 4724 indicate that three RPA soldiers forcibly took away 47 heads of cattle from the locals for no apparent reason. MILOBS and HRFO informed and investigation is in progress.







1. Eight (8) IDPs from NTONGWE Commune in GITARAMA Prefecture seeking anonymity on 28 Jan 95 while at Rukondo DPC expressed concern over a certain civilian in their NTONGWE Commune named KABARIRA and his brother BIZURU who is an RPA soldier.
2. They are claiming these two are terrorising and detaining a lot of the male returnees and locking them up in a Co-operative house. They further stated that at one time some UNAMIR Forces in the area were tipped about this house, but when they went to investigate, the RPA soldiers told them the house was a storeroom and not a prison as alleged, and were not allowed access to it.
3. In addition, these IDPs have also claimed that just at the beginning of this year 95, a certain man called NTAKIRUTIMANA was arrested upon returning home, had his fingers cut by these RPA soldiers and that he is still so detained in the same house. These IDPs have raised a lot of concern about this Co-operative house and that a lot of people are languishing in it.
4. It is in this regard that we write to request your good offices to verify these concerns and possibly probe further.





1. As a result of the improved security situation in the DP Camps, the directive that all UNAMIR troops operating in DP Camps are to wear Flak Jackets and Helmets is no longer deemed necessary.

2. Henceforth only personnel dedicated to providing close protection to UNAMIR personnel, NGOs and IDPs are required to wear the protective equipment while working in the camps.
