1. GENERAL SITUATION

- a. The situation in the Sector remains calm.
- b. Various UN agencies and NGOs continue to provide relief assistance to the people throughout the sector but a considerable number of them have indicated that their support mainly food and medicine supplies will be stopped.
- c. All Primary Schools in the Sector are open. General shortage of teachers and books, etc was reported. UNICEF and UNESCO promised support.
- d. General shortage of local staff in Dispensaries and Orphanages was detected in the sector.
- e. Diseases such as malaria, tuberculosis and diarrhoea are reported in all the sector.
- f. No Refugee Camps were detected in the Sector.

2. AREA BREAKDOWN

A. BORDERS

The major border posts within the Sector remain open with some restrictions.
Returnees from UGANDA, ZAIRE and TANZANIA continue to cross over to Rwanda mainly in NYAGATARE area.
Gatuna border post maintain immigration and customs activities.
Many NGOs and individual entrepreneurs were observed crossing Gatuna into Kigali daily.
Convoys of relief supplies observed crossing from Uganda into Rwanda.
The temporal bridge built by Eng Coy is not wide enough for the traffic and there is a general complain by the drivers on that matter. A permanent bridge is required.

- Local Dispensary still operating.
- World Vision has opened an office in Byumba and still maintaining stores.
- An orphanage exists at URUMURI Village (B0625) with 250 orphans. Orphanage being supported by World Vision. There are no serious problems with his management.

C. MUKONO (B1428)

- ICRC is maintaining a health centre. A feeding centre with 44 children run by GOAL.
- British Eng in Byumba working on water supply system.
- Local Dispensary has problems of water supply, electricity and lack of furniture.

E. RUTARE (B 1908)

- Local Hospital still operational. Hospital mainly run by local staff now.
- Orphanage moved to KIGALI on Saturday 24 Sep 94.

- The Hospital needs urgent supply of drugs and food for the inpatients.
- At Kinyami (B135183) there is a dispensary operating. Approx 10 inpatients per day. No drugs No NGOs operating in the village.

D. MANYAGIRO (B 994323)

- AMREF run dispensary.

F. NGARAMA (B 2628)

- SOS KINDERDORF operates an orphanage with 85 children. Drugs electricity, water supply, food and qualified staff continue to be major problems in the Hospital.
- ICRC and WFP assisting the people.
- Number of patients treated daily increased to 800. Diseases such as malaria, tuberculosis and diarrhoea reported.
- Lack of drugs supply and no NGOs providing medicine for the Dispensary.
- Shortage of fuel for generator was reported.

G. GAHINI (B 5396)

- Italian Cooperation run the hospital.
- Number of children in the orphanage run by UNICEF now is around 115.
- ICRC and Atlas Logistique continue to support the hospital.
- Common disease treated is malaria.
- There are 160 in-patients in the hospital. Number of out patients increasing daily.
- Electricity generating sets urgently required.

H. MUHURA (B 3008)

-The dispensary is run by International SOS Organization. Average patients daily is 100. The clinic has 66 beds capacity.

Area is calm. Roads in this area not motorable now. Locals are repairing portions of road through communal labour.

-UNICEF distributed food and medicine regularly.
-Farming activities observed. People erecting buildings for shelter.
-Austrian NGO called ARP, distributing bags of maize. This NGO distributes food at least once a month.

M. RUTONGO (C 0493)

Hospital run by Action Nord-Sud still operating.

N. RUKARA (B 5601)

-Majority of inhabitants are RPA soldiers. Most buildings in the town destroyed.
-No NGOs operating in the area. People go up to Kayonza and Gahini for food and medication.

O. MBOGO (B 4807)

No NGOs in the area. Road not motorable.

P. GATSIBO (B 2523)

Population is approx 4116 people in the Sector. No NGOs activities within 7 Km. No water and food supply.

Q. GITUZA (B 3122)

-There are approx 4000 people in the commune.
-People appealed for supply of seedlings and farming tools.
No NGOs activities observed in the area.
-ICRC is planning to reactivate the local dispensary.

R. NYAKAYAGA (B 4016)

Population of the Sector is approx 2000 people.

-There is a dispensary run by the local staff. Approx 150 patients attended to daily. UNICEF and PSF assisting.

-Population is around 23000. About 50 to 100 people per day returning.

U. MYOVE (A 9722)

Dispensary run by AMREF.

V. RUSHAKI (B 1138)

RPA has moved out of the town. The displaced persons have therefore returned to their homes.

3. LIAISON

a. The Sector HQ Humanitarian Cell continues to liaise with representatives of NGOs in KABALE, UN agencies, individuals and Local Authorities. Cooperation is good.

b. ACPAR asked for a patrol in MUHURA zone because they intend opening a dispensary. A report covering all the information about the area was sent to them.

c. Suspected mine field was reported by NGOs at MUKARANGE (B 7530).



1. After cessation of hostilities in RWANDA the situation in Sector 1 concerning displaced people has remarkably improved. The residents of KIGALI who fled the city during the war to the north have already returned.

2. For security reasons RPF concentrated the local population to camps where they were depending on provision with food, water, etc. Unless accompanied by armed escorts it was not possible for these people to collect food from their fields. However the villagers are now free to return to their homes. Patrols in the various areas MILOB Teams could confirm movements of these people along the roads. It could also be observed that farming has started in the areas.

3. The area of MUTARA valley E.G. NYAGATARE and communes south of that village were abandoned when the war started. During a recently conducted patrol it was observed that most of the villages are occupied. It may be assumed that many of these people came from the North and occupied the vacated buildings.

4. CIVIL ADMINISTRATION : The civil administration was initially installed by RPF to administer the displaced people camps. At present civil administration exist in large settlements (E.G. BYUMBA) only. At village level so far no administration has been established.

5. TRANSIT CAMPS: Some returnees from ZAIRE use BYUMBA now as a transit for KIGALI.

6. As a result of these developments and the Humanitarian crisis in GOMA the NGOs have thinned out in Sector 1.

7. AREA BREAKDOWN:

BYUMBA:

Most of the displaced people from KIGALI returned home. Some returnees from ZAIRE on transit.

KISARO:

8,000 displaced people from communes near KIGALI awaiting transport to their homes.
NGO: Red Cross (Food Supply).

NYAMBARE:

Number of people significantly decreased. No number of residents available yet (Civil Administrator not present)

RUTARE:

6,000 displaced people. 3,000 residents from KIGALI awaiting transport.

NGO:

-Red Cross from TANZANIA: Food Supply twice a week.
-Red Cross from UGANDA: Food Supply three times a week.

MUHURA:

2,000 displaced people from surrounding villages after security clearance given by RPA people will return (Expected soon).

MURAMBI:

Civil Administrator stated that camp will close this week. People can be observed enroute to their villages.

GAHINI:

Main Hospital for Eastern Region. MEDICENS DU MONDE is operating the Hospital.

NGARAMA:

SOS Kinderdorf operates orphanage.

TABAGWE/NYAGATARE AREA:

TABAGWE camp closed. People (Mainly nomads) with their cattle are now there in increased number, reoccupying vacated villages.

NGO: Red Cross supplies food in TABAGWE.

SUBJECT: SITREP ON HUMANITARIAN SITUATION IN SECTOR 1

1. GENERAL ASSESSMENT

Calm throughout the Sector.

In the last few days the camps in RUSHAKI, NYANGE and NYAMBARE were dismantled.

The population reoccupied their homes to start farming.

Evacuation of people from KISARO camp finished this week.

Food distribution (Mainly by ICRC) throughout the area.

2. AREA BREAKDOWN

GATUNA BORDER: No significant border crossing for returnees. This border is mainly used by NGO convoys and business men from UGANDA entering and leaving RWANDA. Visas obtainable at immigration office in GATUNA.

BYUMBA: Orphanage KAGEYO evacuated to KIGALI. Dispensary supplied by AMREF and food by ICRC. World Vision has a store in town.

KISARO: ICRC food distribution.

KIVUYE: AMREF supplies local Dispensary.

GAKUBO: AMREF supplies local Dispensary.

NYAMBARE: Camp dismantled. Displaced people returning to their homes.

MUKONO: AMREF opened a feeding centre for malnourished children.

RUTARE: Orphanage operated by Samaritan's Purse, awaiting for a place in KIGALI for evacuate the children.

NGARAMA: SOS Kinderdof operates orphanage.

GAHINI: Hospital for Eastern Region (Medicins du Monde)

TABAGWE/KARAMA/NYAGATARE AREA: Returnees from UGANDA still entering and resettling.

KYOMBE/CYONDO AREA: All camps closed. Villages reoccupied by people, farming started. Central ICRC food distribution point for area is NGONDORE.

RUTONGO: Action Nord-Sud operates an Hospital. Refugee camp closed.

3. LIAISON

Sector continues to liaise with representatives from various NGOs and Rwandese Administration. Cooperation with representatives is very good except in KIBUYE area, where the politic responsible didn't give to our patrol any information and she said that UN presence in the place was not good.
