1. GENERAL SITUATION AND HIGHLIGHTS

THE GENERAL SITUATION IN UNOMUR OPERATIONAL AREA CONTINUES TO BE CALM. THERE IS NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGE.

2. MILITARY

(A) DEPLOYMENT

(1) HQ/CP

THE A/CMO AND THE OUTGOING CMO VISITED KAMPALA FROM 2 TO 4 MARCH 1994 TO MEET THE ARMY COMMANDER, THE HIGH COMMISSIONERS/AMBASSADORS OF USA/UK/France/EGYPT/RWANDA/KENYA/TANZANIA/NIGERIA AND RESIDENT REP. OF UNDP. THE A/CMO RETURNED TO KABALE ON 051500 MARCH 94.

CMO OPS

THE DEPUTY COMMANDER OF BOTSWANA DEFENCE FORCE VISITED THIS HEADQUARTERS ON 041630 MARCH 1994. HE WAS BRIEFED ON THE CURRENT SITUATION. A/CMO HAD DISCUSSION WITH HIM AT KAMPALA ON 3 MARCH AND ON 5 MARCH NEAR MBARARA. HE ALSO MET DEPUTY FORCE COMMANDER, UNAMIR AT KATUNA CP ON 5 MARCH 1994. HE RETURNED TO KAMPALA ON 051000 MARCH 1994.

ON 281100 FEBRUARY THE A/CMO ADDRESSED ALL MILOBS AT THE HQ. HE EMPHASIZED THE NEED TO BE MORE ACTIVE ON THEIR ROLE DUE TO PREVAILING SITUATION IN RWANDA.

(2) OP/CP

THE DEPUTY COMMANDER OF BOTSWANA DEFENCE FORCE VISITED KATUNA ON 050900 MARCH 1994.

THE DEPUTY FORCE COMMANDER OF UNAMIR VISITED KATUNA ON 050900 MARCH 1994. HE MADE A COURTESY CALL ON THE DEPUTY FORCE COMMANDER OF BOTSWANA DEFENCE FORCE.

(3) PATROLS

DURING THE PERIOD OUR REPORTED PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT AS FOLLOWS: TOTAL OF FIFTY FIVE (55) PATROLS INCLUDING FOURTEEN (14) NIGHT PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT. ON 04 MARCH OUR PATROLS WERE RESCHEDULED DUE TO CHANGE OVER OF ZIMBABWE CONTINGENT.

DURING THIS TIME, IT SEEMS THAT THE RPF AND NRA HAS INCREASED THEIR STRENGTH IN THE BORDER ALONG LUBIRIZI AND KASHEKYE.

OUTGOING CMO ALONG WITH ZIMBABWEAN CONTINGENT LEFT UGANDA DN 5 MARCH 1994. INCOMING DCMO, L/COL LEEN NOORDSY AND CAPT. ERIC A. DE LANDMETER ARRIVED 2ND MARCH 1994.

(4) MEDICAL SITUATION

ALL OUR MILITARY AND CIVIL PERSONNEL ARE IN GOOD HEALTH.

**(C) RELATIONS WITH NRA**

USUALLY GOOD BUT DURING THE BEGINNING OF THE WEEK, NRA DID NOT FIND COMFORTABLE WITH OUR PRESENCE IN THE BORDER AREAS IN PARTICULAR LUBIRIZI.

**4. POLITICAL**

THERE WAS A BIG ELECTION CAMPAIGN FOLLOWED BY A RALLY ON 051500 MARCH. IT WENT ON PEACEFULLY.

**5. ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICAL SUPPORT**

(A) ONE OF UNOMUR VEHICLE (4/4) MADE AN ACCIDENT WHILE CARRYING OUT PATROLLING DUE TO MUDDY ROAD. THE DAMAGE IS MODERATE IN NATURE. THERE WAS NO HUMAN INJURY AND CASUALTY. IT IS EXPECTED THAT THE VEHICLE WILL BE REPAIRED SOON.

(B) CONSTRUCTION OF LUBIRIZI CP THOUGH SLOW BUT IT IS EXPECTED TO BE HANDED OVER BY A WEEK OR SO. OUR EFFORT TO PURSUE THE CONTRACTOR IS ON.

- (C) MEANWHILE, WE ARE LOOKING INTO THE POSSIBILITY OF OPENING A TEMPORARY CP AT KASHEKYE UNDER TENTS PROVIDED MINIMUM LOGISTIC SUPPORT IS MADE AVAILABLE BY CIV. STAFF.
- (D) LACK OF WATER TRAILERS/PUMPS CAUSING DIFFICULTIES TO MILOBS AT KISORO AND KYANIKA. REQUISITION ALREADY FORWARDED TO CAO.

6. LIAISON, CONTACTS AND MEDIA

7. OBSERVATIONS/COMMENTS

- (A) THERE WAS NO SIGNIFICANT MOVEMENT OF CONVOYS EXCEPT WFP CONVOY AND RED CROSS CONVOY (REFER TO DAILY SITREP OF 5 MARCH 1994).
- (B) MOST OF THE MOVEMENTS WERE OF ROUTINE NATURE CARRYING FOOD STUFF/SUPPLIES.
- (C) NRA AND RPF FOUND TO BE EXTRA ALERT ALONG THE BORDER LINE DURING THE EARLY PART OF THE WEEK.
- (D) OPERATIONAL ACTIVITIES COULD NOT BE MAXIMIZED DUE TO SHORTAGE OF VEHICLES AND ABSENCE OF HELICOPTERS. WE ARE EXPECTING TO GET ELEVEN (11) VEHICLES FROM SAMOLIA WAS DUE TO BE SHIPPED ON 28 FEBRUARY 1994 BUT NOT EXECUTED.
- (E) HELICOPTERS ARE SUPPOSED TO BE DELIVERED TODAY BUT NO SIGN OF IT'S COMING.

- (F) A GUIDELINE FOR COLLECTION AND ANALYSIS OF INFORMATION CIRCULATED TO ALL MILOBS (REF TO OUR FAX NO. 336). HOPEFULLY THIS WILL BRING IN QUALITATIVE IMPROVEMENT OF SITREPS.
- (G) WE STEPPED UP THE MODUS OPERANDI OF CHECKING AND PATROLLING. NO SIGNIFICANT SUSPICIDUS MOVEMENT NOTICED.

1. GENERAL SITUATION AND HIGHLIGHTS

THE GENERAL SITUATION IN UNOMUR OPERATIONAL AREA CONTINUES TO BE CALM. THERE IS NOT MUCH CHANGE.

2. MILITARY

(A) DEPLOYMENT

(1) HQ/CP

THE INCOMING CMO ARRIVED AT KABALE HQ ON THE 23RD FEBRUARY 1994. ON THE 24 AND 25 HE MADE OPERATIONAL VISITS AT THE AREAS. ON 26TH FEBRUARY IN THE PRESENCE OF FC AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES THE HAND OVER/TAKE OVER PROCEDURE TOOK PLACE. IT IS EFFECTIVE FROM 26 FEBRUARY 1994, 1200 HRS. THE UNOMUR HQ SENT A SPECIAL



PATROL TO VISIT THE REFUGEE CAMPS AROUND MBARARA.  
DETAILED REPORT IN THE UNOMUR INFOSUM ND 10.

(2) OP/CP

IN KISORO ALL THE RADIO EQUIPMENT HAVE BEEN INSTALLED  
IN THE NEW HQ, BUT WE ARE STILL WAITING FOR FURNITURE.  
AT KATUNA ON 24TH FEBRUARY A TRUCK WAS OFF-LOADED,  
NOTHING SIGNIFICANT WAS FOUND.

(3) PATROLS

DURING THE REPORTING PERIOD OUR PATROLS WERE GOING  
ON AS FOLLOWS: TOTAL OF FIFTY TWO (52) PATROLS WERE  
CONDUCTED INCLUDING FOURTEEN (14) NIGHT PATROLS. ON  
THE 26 FEBRUARY THE PATROLS WERE RESCHEDULED DUE TO  
UNOMUR MEETING/BRIEFING.

GENERALLY IT SEEMS THAT THE FLOW OF THE REFUGEES  
FROM UGANDA TO RWANDA IS DECREASING. THIS FACT CAN  
BE A RESULT OF THE MEETING BETWEEN THE CMO AND 2<sup>ND</sup>  
DIVISION COMMANDER AT MBARARA. HOWEVER, WE  
CONTINUE TO MONITOR ACTIVITIES IN THOSE SPECIFIC AREAS.

4. POLITICAL

IN KABALE TWO ELECTION EVENTS WERE HELD IN THE FOOTBALL STADIUM.

5. ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

(A) WITH FRESH RECEIPT OF WALKIE TALKIES NOW THERE ARE A TOTAL OF 51 SETS. AT PRESENT ALL TEAMS, AREA HQS, MISSION HQ STAFF ARE IN POSSESSION OF WALKIE TALKIE SET.

(B) ONE OF UNOMUR VEHICLE (4/4) FACED AN ACCIDENT WITH WORLD FDOO PROGRAMME TRUCK. THE DAMAGE IS MAJOR IN NATURE

THERE IS NO HUMAN INJURY AND CASUALTY. LEGAL ACTIONS ARE IN PROGRESS. IT IS EXPECTED THAT THE VEHICLE WILL BE REPAIRED SOON.

6. LIAISON, CONTACTS AND MEDIA

7. OBSERVATIONS/COMMENTS

THE VISIT OF FORCE COMMANDER FROM UNAMIR AND INTER-ACTIONS WITH UGANDAN GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS DURING HANDING/TAKING OVER CEREMONY HAVE CONTRIBUTED TOWARDS HARMONIZING MORE GOODWILL AND COOPERATION BETWEEN UNOMUR AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

1. THE SITUATION INSIDE UNOMUR AREA IS CALM.
2. FROM 09 NOV 93 UP TO 21 FEB 94 UNOMUR CP/OPs AND PATROLS HAVE EFFECTIVELY MONITORED THE TRAFFIC OF PERSONNEL AND SUPPLY THROUGH THE BORDER UGANDA/RWANDA. THE FIGURES ACCUMULATED TILL THE LAST DATE ARE AS FOLLOWS:
  - A. AT KATUNA OP/CP:
    - NUMBER OF CROSSINGS: 1,116 VEHICLE CROSSINGS, BEING 568 TO RWANDA AND 548 TO UGANDA (WFP AND ICRC CONVOYS ARE COUNTED AS A SINGLE CROSSING EACH).
    - WITHIN THE CROSSINGS TO RWANDA, 223 WERE CARRYING FOOD, WITH A PARTICULAR INCREASE IN JANUARY (SEE INFOSUM/09); 19 WERE CARRYING FUEL, KEEPING AN AVERAGE OF 05 FUEL TRANSPORTS PER MONTH.
    - 2,181 PEOPLE CROSSED TO RWANDA AND 2,113 TO UGANDA; THESE FIGURES INCLUDE THE DRIVERS OF THE VEHICLES.
  - B. AT LUBIRIZI CP/OP (MONITORED BY PATROLS):
    - NUMBER OF CROSSINGS: 12, BEING 08 TO RWANDA AND 04 TO UGANDA.

- WITHIN THE CROSSINGS TO RWANDA, 04 WERE CARRYING FOOD; NO FUEL SUPPLY WAS DETECTED PASSING THROUGH LUBIRIZI.
  - 89 PEOPLE CROSSED BY VEHICLES TO RWANDA AND 08 TO UGANDA, ALSO INCLUDING THE DRIVERS.
- C. AT CYANIKA OP/CP NO CROSSINGS WERE SEEN DURING THE PERIOD.
3. ON THE 23RD AND 24TH OF FEBRUARY, A MIXED PATROL INCLUDING THE COO, MIO AND DCMPO VISITED THE REFUGEE CAMPS OF NAKIVALE AND CHAKA II. FOR DETAILS OF THIS RECONNAISSANCE SEE THE PATROL REPORT SENT TO UNAMIR. SOME COMMENTS FROM THE INFORMATION BRANCH ARE:
- A. THE ADMINISTRATOR OF NAKIVALE SEEMED TO BE DENYING INFORMATION ABOUT THE NUMBER OF REFUGEES THAT HAD LEFT THE CAMP. A SINGLE VIEW OF THE SURROUNDINGS OF THE CAMP SHOWS THAT A LOT OF HUTS WERE DESTROYED ALONG THE MAIN ROAD. THE PATROL ALSO SAW TWO REFUGEES MOVING OUT OF THE CAMP ON THEIR BICYCLES.
- B. AT CHAKA II THE ADMINISTRATOR DID NOT EVEN KNOW ABOUT THE EXISTENCE OF UNOMUR. THE CHIEF OF THE REFUGEE'S WELFARE COMMITTEES, ASKED THE MILOBS WHY WE SHOULD TELL TO HIS PEOPLE TO WAIT A BIT TO GO BACK TO THEIR HOMELAND, IF THEY (THE REFUGEES) ARE WILLING TO MOVE. THE MILOBS EXPLAINED THAT THE SITUATION IN RWANDA IS NOT STILL DEFINED AND THAT THE INTERNATIONAL AGENCIES ARE AWARE AND COULD HAVE MORE CAPABILITY TO ORGANIZE THIS MOVEMENT WHEN THE TIME COMES, LIKE THE ICRC DID IN KISORO, LAST OCTOBER, WITH 1,225 RWANDAN REFUGEES.
4. RANDOM MOVEMENT OF REFUGEES BACK TO RWANDA HAS SOMEWHAT REDUCED IN TERMS OF NUMBERS, IT IS STILL UNCLEAR WHETHER THIS WAS A RESULT OF THE UGANDAN AUTHORITIES' INTERVENTION OR REDUCED THE MOVEMENT ON THEIR OWN.

## 1. GENERAL SITUATION AND HIGHLIGHTS

THE GENERAL SITUATION IN UNOMUR OPERATIONAL AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY IS QUITE CALM. THERE IS NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGE IN THE ATTITUDE OF THE LOCAL POPULATION.

## 2. MILITARY

### (A) DEPLOYMENT

#### (1) HQ/CP

(A) ON THE 17 AND 18 FEBRUARY A GROUP OF MILITARY ATTACHÉS FROM KENYA, GHANA, SUDAN, RUSSIA AND UK VISITED THE UNOMUR IN THE FRAMEWORK OF AN OFFICIAL NRA INVITATION. IN KABALE, AT THE MISSION HQ, THE A/CMO AND COO BRIEFED THEM ACCORDINGLY.

*CMO OPS*

ON THE 17 FEBRUARY THE DELEGATION VISITED WEST AREA, ESPECIALLY KISORO HQ AND KYANIKA OP. ON THE 18 FEBRUARY THEY PROCEEDED VISITING ON KATUNA OP THEN LUBIRIZI KASHEKYE AREA.

THE UNOMUR HQ STAFF IS WORKING ON THE ROTATION PLAN OF THE CONTINGENTS OF NETHERLANDS AND ZIMBABWE. THE HAND OVER/TAKE OVER PROGRAMMES FOR THE NEWCOMING CMO AND DCMO ARE ALREADY DONE. THE DECISION CONCERNING THE REORGANIZATION OF THE HQS AND CREATION OF THE TENTH TEAM HAS BEEN MADE AND WAITING FOR APPROVAL.

(B) THERE WAS A SIGNIFICANT PROGRESS IN KISORO HQ CONSTRUCTION DETAILS IN PARA 5.

(2) OP/CP

THE STATIC OP/CPS (KATUNA AND KYANIKA) CONTINUE TO BE MANNED AROUND THE CLOCK.

AT KATUNA ON 17 FEBRUARY 1994 A TRUCK WAS OFF-LOADED, NO THING SIGNIFICANT WAS FOUND.

(3) PATROLS

DURING THE REPORTING PERIOD OUR PATROLS WERE GOING ON AS SCHEDULED. WE HAVE CONDUCTED FIFTY NINE (59) PATROLS AS FOLLOWS: FORTY FIVE (45) DAY PATROLS,

INCLUDING TWO BOAT PATROLS AT LAKE BUYONYI WHICH WERE CARRIED OUT WITHOUT ANY PROBLEM; FOURTEEN (14) NIGHT PATROLS. IN THE EAST AREA ALL THE NIGHT PATROLS WERE SENT TO THE LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE AREA.

GENERALLY IT SEEMS THAT THE FLOW OF THE REFUGEES FROM UGANDA TO RWANDA IS DECREASING. THIS FACT CAN BE A RESULT OF THE MEETING BETWEEN THE CMO AND 2<sup>ND</sup> DIVISION COMMANDER AT MBARARA. HOWEVER, WE CONTINUE TO MONITOR ACTIVITIES IN THOSE SPECIFIC AREAS.

ROTATION

THE ZIMBABWE CONTINGENT WILL ROTATE SHORTLY. AT THE END OF FEBRUARY (22<sup>ND</sup>) THE NEW CONTINGENT



WILL PROBABLY ARRIVE. IN THE BEGINNING OF MARCH (3<sup>RD</sup>), THE OLD CONTINGENT WILL DEPART.

THE NETHERLANDS CONTINGENT WILL ALSO ROTATE SHORTLY. THE NEW CONTINGENT WILL ARRIVE IN THE BEGINNING OF MARCH (2<sup>ND</sup> AND 7<sup>TH</sup> PROBABLY) AND THE OLD CONTINGENT WILL DEPART ON THE 10<sup>TH</sup> OF MARCH.

#### ORGANIZATION

A NEW PLAN FOR THE ORGANIZATION OF UNOMUR HAS BEEN MADE. IN THIS NEW ORGANIZATION, HQ AREA EAST NO LONGER EXISTS, HQ AREA WEST IS SMALLER AND A TENTH TEAM HAS BEEN CREATED. BECAUSE OF THE ROTATIONS OF TWO CONTINGENTS THIS ORGANIZATION WILL BE IN EFFECT IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE DEPARTURE OF THE OLD NETHERLANDS CONTINGENT.

#### VISITS

RECENTLY UNOMUR WAS VISITED BY THE DFC OF UNAMIR, A THREE MAN DELEGATION FROM THE NETHERLANDS ARMY HQ AND A GROUP OF MILITARY ATTACHÉS. FROM 2 TO 8 MARCH UNOMUR WILL BE VISITED BY THE DEPUTY COMMANDER OF THE BOTSWANA DEFENCE FORCE.

(3) MEDICAL SITUATION

ALL OUR MILITARY AND CIVIL PERSONNEL ARE HEALTHY. THE REPAIR OF THE VOLKSWAGEN AMBULANCE IS GOING TO BE FINISHED ONLY SMALL ACHIEVEMENTS ARE MISSING.

(C) RELATIONS WITH NRA

3. VIOLATIONS, INCIDENTS AND COMPLAINTS

IN THE 17 FEBRUARY 1994 THE NRA SOLDIERS AT NKURUNGURA (WEST AREA) FIRED THREE (3) ROUND AT THE SMUGGLERS WHO WERE SMUGGLING CLOTHES AND ARRESTED ONE (1) SMUGGLER.

4. POLITICAL

VICIOUS CA CAMPAIGNS STILL IN PROGRESS, IN KABALE 3 OUT 15 CANDIDATES ARE STILL EFFECTIVE. KAMPALA BASED INTELLECTUALS ARE STILL UNHAPPY WITH NRM CLAMP DOWN ON POLITICAL PARTIES. REVIVAL OF CHEAP POLITICKING GAINING MOMENTUM, AS THE RACE DRAWS TO AN END. AT PRESENT UNCLEAR IF NRM WILL HAVE AN OVERWHELMING MAJORITY. AN ULTIMATUM BY PRESIDENT MUSEVENI FOR THE REBELS (KARIMAJONG) TO SURRENDER THEIR WEAPONS WAS COMPLETELY IGNORED.

5. ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

COMMAND POST CONSTRUCTION OF COMMAND POST HAS BEEN COMPLETED IN AREA WEST. AREA WEST WILL REQUIRE NEW FURNITURE, OFFICE EQUIPMENTS ETC. FOR THE OFFICE. REQUISITION FOR THESE THINGS HAS ALREADY BEEN PLACED.

CONSTRUCTION AT LUBIRIZI IS MOVING AT A SNAILS' PACE. CONTRACTOR UNABLE TO MEET THE AGREED DEADLINE AND AS A RESULT OPERATIONS ADVERSELY AFFECTED NEW SAO ACTIVELY PURSUING THE ISSUE. MANNING OF LUBIRIZI HIGH PRIORITY TO ENSURE CONFIDENCE IS GENERATED IN THE INTEREST OF PEACE.

VHF COMMUNICATIONS STILL UNSATISFACTORY EVEN AFTER THE INSTALLATION OF THE FIRST REPEATER STATION, RECCO FOR A SUITABLE POSITION ON HIGH GROUND TO INSTALL THE 2ND REPEATER STATION CONCLUDED BUT HELICOPTER TO LIFT REPEATER STATION TO HILL TOP, UNAVAILABLE, AS RESULT NO PROGRESS HAS SO FAR BEEN MADE. THE AREAS WHICH ARE AFFECTED ARE KAMWEZI/LUBIRIZI/KASHEKYE/MBALE. NIGHT PATROLS VERY DIFFICULT IF NOT IMPOSSIBLE, AS THIS ENTAILS CLIMBING STEEP HILLS WITH DANGEROUS. CARNIVOROUS ANIMALS FOR COMMUNICATIONS PURPOSES, DESPITE, HARSHIPS PATROLS SOLDIERING ON WITH HIGH MORAL.

6. LIAISON, CONTACTS AND MEDIA

THE DFC'S PLANE FROM KIGALI TOUCHED THE RUNAWAY AT EXACTLY 1235 HRS ON 11 FEBRUARY 1994 AND THE SENIOR OFFICER EMERGED OUT OF THE SMALL RWANDESE AIRCRAFT FLANKED BY TWO UNAMIR OFFICERS. HE WAS MET AT THE VIP LOUNGE BY THE A/CMO UNOMUR, AFTER THE AIRPORT CLEARANCE PROCEDURES WERE CONCLUDED WAS DRIVEN STRAIGHT TO KAMPALA'S SHERATON HOTEL WHERE HE CHECKED IN.

AT 1500 HRS THE SAME DAY, THE DFC MET THE RES REP. AT THE UNDP OFFICES AND LATER THE DFC MET THE RWANDESE AMBASSADOR AT THEIR EMBASSY AND THE ITINERARY FOR THE DAY ENDED UP WITH A MEETING WITH THE NIGERIAN HIGH COMMISSIDNER. ALL THE MEETINGS WERE HELD IN AN UNBELIEVABLY PLEASANT AND ENCOURAGING ATMOSPHERE.

THE NEXT DAY 12 FEBRUARY 1994, AT 0630 HRS, THE DFC LEFT KAMPALA FOR KABALE AND ON THE WAY VISITED LUBIRIZI CP1/KAMWEZI/KASHEKYE AND ON ARRIVAL AT KABALE MISSION HQ, THE 2ND DIVISION (NRA) COMMANDER WAS PRESENT TO MEET THE SENIOR OFFICER ACCOMPANIED BY THE 309 BRIGADE COMMANDER. THE DA KABALE DID THE SAME IN AT THE HOTEL LATER IN THE EVENING. THE DFC WAS BRIEFED AT THE UNOMUR HQ AND LATER IN THE AFTERNDON, HE VISITED KATUNA BUT WAS UNABLE TO GET TO BIGAGA BECAUSE OF THE BAD WEATHER. DFC SPENT A NIGHT IN THE KABALE WHITE HORSE INN, IN THE MORNING 0530 HRS 13 FEBRUARY 1994 LEFT KABALE FOR KISORO/KYANIKA RETURNING TO KABALE ABOUT MID DAY. AND DEPARTED KABALE FOR KAMPALA ON THE WAY BRANCHED OFF TO NAKIVALE REFUGEE CAMP EAST OF MBARARA,

THE DFC DELIBERATED USEFUL INFORMATION ABOUT THE REFUGEES WITH THE COMMANDANT OF THE REFUGEE CAMP. AFTER AN HOUR IN THE REFUGEE CAMP, THE DFC CONTINUED HIS TRIP TO KAMPALA SHERATON HOTEL WHERE HAD A REST FOR THE NIGH.

THE DFC FIRST MEETING WAS WITH THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR AT 1000 HRS FOLLOWED BY BRITISH HIGH COMMISSIONER. AT 1500 HRS THE DFC MET THE AMERICAN EMBASSY. AT 1700 HRS THE DFC MET THE ARMY COMD. NRA. THE DFC'S PROGRAMME FOR THE 14 FEBRUARY WAS CONCLUDED BY A FORMAL DINER HOSTED BY THE NIGERIAN AMBASSADOR. A/CMO DELIBERATELY LEFT OUT THE COMMENTS ON THE SENIOR OFFICER'S VISIT ASSUMING THAT EVERYTHING WILL BE HIGHLIGHTED IN HIS (DFC'S) REPORT.

7. OBSERVATIONS

THERE IS ORASTIC DECREASE OF REFUGEES CROSSING FROM UGANDA TO RWANDA.



1. GENERAL SITUATION AND HIGHLIGHTS

THE GENERAL SITUATION IN UNOMUR OPERATIONAL AREA CONTINUES TO BE CALM. THERE IS NOT MUCH CHANGE SINCE OUR LAST REPORT.

2. MILITARY

(A) DEPLOYMENT

THE CP IN KISORO IS ALMOST COMPLETE AND SHOULD BE READY FOR OCCUPATION VERY SOON.

KYANIKA AND KATUNA CONTINUE TO BE MANNED AROUND THE CLOCK. CONSTRUCTION AT LUBIRIZI IS PROGRESSING AT AN APPALLINGLY SLOW PACE. COMPLAINTS HAVE BEEN MADE AND WE HOPE THE CONTRACTOR WILL EXPEDITE THE JOB. AT THE CURRENT PACE, THE OP/CP MIGHT BE READY FOR OCCUPATION SOMETIME MID OR END OF MARCH 1994.

(3) PATROLS

A TOTAL OF FIFTY FOUR (54) PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED DURING THE REPORTING PERIOD, FORTY (40) OF WHICH WERE DAY AND FOURTEEN (14) WERE NIGHT PATROLS. WE HAVE MADE SLIGHT ADJUSTMENTS IN OUR PATROL SCHEDULES BECAUSE OF LOGISTICAL AND IMPENDING RELIGIOUS (RAMADAN) REASONS.

IN AREA EAST, RANDOM DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS CONTINUE TO BE LAUNCHED, AND AS PER OUR LAST REPORT, LUBIRIZI KASHEKYE HAS BEEN OBSERVED TO BE A REFUGEE CROSSING POINT.

THE HQ OPS STAFF HAVE AUGMENTED THE PATROL EFFORT BY CONDUCTING DEPTH PATROLS UP TO MIRAMA HILLS (BORDER POST WITH RWANDA).

IN AREA WEST RANOOM DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS HAVE ALSO BEEN CONDUCTED, AS WELL AS DEPTH PATROLS TO THE ZAIRIAN

BORDER. OUR PATROLS COULD NOT GET ANY INFORMATION ABOUT REFUGEES CROSSING INTO UGANDA AS REPORTED BY THE MEDIA.

THE AMBULANCE HAS BEEN REPAIRED BUT A RED CROSS STILL HAS TO BE PAINTED ON IT. THE MEDICAL OFFICER TOOK A TOUR OF THE OPERATIONAL TO ASSESS THE ACCESSIBILITY OF THE ROUTES BY THE NON-4X4 AMBULANCE. HE DISCOVERED THAT THE ROUTES WOULD BE VERY DIFFICULT, PARTICULARLY DURING RAINY PERIODS.

(C) RELATIONS WITH NRA

THE NRA NCO BASED AT KATUNA CONTINUES TO BE A PROBLEM. HE WAS, THIS TIME, REPORTED TO HAVE DECLARED THAT HE WOULD SHOOT DOWN ANY AIRCRAFT



FLYING ALONG THE BORDER. A FORMAL COMPLAINT BY UNOMUR HO HAS BEEN MADE THROUGH THE NRA CHIEF LIAISON OFFICER, SUGGESTING THAT HE BE REMOVED FROM THE POST.

3. VIOLATIONS, INCIDENTS AND COMPLAINTS

THE SHIPMENT OF COW HORNS BY RPF HAS CONTINUED UNABATED DURING THE REPORTING PERIOD. THE INCIDENT OF AN EARTH TREMOUR OCCURRED AT APPROXIMATELY 060300C LT, THE BBC LATER REPORTED THAT THE TREMOR HAD AFFECTED, ZAIRE AND RWANDA AS WELL AND MEASURED 6,4 ON THE RICHTER SCALE. TWO PEOPLE ARE REPORTED TO HAVE DIED IN NORTH WESTERN UGANDA, AS WELL AS A LOT OF DAMAGE TO PROPERTY.

4. POLITICAL

THE CA CAMPAIGNS ARE STILL IN PROGRESS BUT WITHOUT ANY REPORTED INCIDENTS. RECENTLY, THE OPPOSITION WEEKLY (THE MONITOR) REPORTED THE POLITICAL WRANGLE BETWEEN THE RULING NATIONAL RESISTANCE MOVEMENT (NRM) AND OTHER POLITICAL PARTIES, WHERE THE NRM ORDERED THE BAN OF OLD POLITICAL PARTIES. THERE IS NO CLEAR OUTCOME YET.

5. ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

THE SECOND REPEATER STATION IS NOT YET INSTALLED. OTHER LOG PROBLEMS ARE AS REFLECTED IN OUR LAST WEEKS SITREP.

6. LIAISON, CONTACTS AND MEDIA

ON 01 FEBRUARY 1994, THE A/CMO HAD A LIAISON MEETING WITH THE NRA 2ND DIVISION CMDR BASED IN MBARARA. THE MEETING VERY FRUITFUL. FOR MORE DETAILS, SEE OUR WEEKLY INFORMATION SUMMARY NO.7 DATED 6 FEBRUARY 1994.

7. OBSERVATIONS

THE NON ARRIVAL OF HELICOPTERS IS PULLING OUR OPERATIONS BACK, AS DEPLOYMENT OF MY PATROLS BY HELIS WOULD BE GREATLY COMPLEMENT, OUR AILING TRANSPORT FLEET. PERIOD IN QUESTION ACTIVITY PACKED, IT IS MY INTENTION TO LEAVE NO STONE UNTURNED, EVEN WITH INADEQUATE RESOURCES BUT WOULD BE MUCH HAPPIER IF THIS ISSUE IS URGENTLY SOLVED.

WITH RAMADAN CLOSE, MY MOSLEM OFFICERS ALREADY LOOKING FORWARD TO IT, AND WHERE POSSIBLE WILL EXERCISE FLEXIBILITY BUT NOT AT THE DETRIMENT OF OPERATIONS.

**1. GENERAL SITUATION AND HIGHLIGHTS**

THE GENERAL SITUATION IN UNOMUR OPERATIONAL AREA REMAINS CALM. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THE ATTITUDE OF THE LOCAL POPULATION SINCE OUR LAST REPORT FOR MORE DETAILS SEE SPECIAL REPORT BY A/CMO SENT TO THE FC, DATED 28 JANUARY 1994.

**2. MILITARY**

**(A) DEPLOYMENT**

THE COMMAND POST IN KISORO (AREA WEST) IS STILL UNDER CONSTRUCTION.

(2) **OP/CP**

KYANIKA AND KATUNA CONTINUE TO BE MANNED ON A 24/7 BASIS. THE CONSTRUCTION IN LUBIRIZI AREA IS STILL IN PROGRESS.

(3) **PATROLS**

IN THIS REPORTING PERIOD, OUR PATROLS HAVE BEEN CARRIED OUT AS FOLLOWS: A TOTAL OF FIFTY ONE (51) PATROLS; THIRTY ONE (31) DAY PATROLS AND TWENTY (20) NIGHT PATROLS. IN THE EAST AREA SIX (6) MDBILE PATROLS WERE CONVERTED INTO FOOT PATROLS. THE WHOLE LAST WEEK WE MANAGED TO COVER LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE AREA CONTINUOUSLY EMPLOYING FOUR TEAMS. DUE TO THE VEHICLE PROBLEM, THREE (3) BORDER PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED BY THE KATUNA CP TO KAFUNZO CP4 AND BIGAGA CP2.

GENERALLY, IT SEEMS THAT LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE AREA IS CONFIRMED AS A CROSSING POINT FOR REFUGEES. SO FAR, APPROXIMATELY ONE HUNDRED (100) REFUGEES CROSSED THE BORDER TO RWANDA IN THIS PARTICULAR AREA. SOME OF THEM CAME WITH OFFICIAL CERTIFICATES ISSUED BY THE UGANDAN AUTHORITIES IN MBARARA. OFFICIAL STATEMENT WAS ISSUED THROUGH THE UGANDAN RADIO AND NEWS PAPERS, SAYING THAT, THE RWANDESE REFUGEES SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO RETURN TO THEIR COUNTRY, UGANDA IS NOT A DUMPING GROUND.

THE SHIPMENT BY THE RPF OF LARGE QUANTITIES OF COW HORNS REFLECTED IN ONE OF OUR PREVIOUS SITREPS IS STILL A CAUSE FOR CONCERN, THE FACT THAT THEY ARE MOVED IN LARGE QUANTITIES INDICATES THAT THEY COULD BE USED FOR SOMETHING CARRIERS OR TRANSPORTERS OF COW HORNS, NOT WILLING TO DISCLOSE REASON. MOVEMENT OF 64 MALE AND 5 FEMALE PERSONS FROM TRAINING SCHOOL IN MBARARA HAS RAISED A LOT OF EYE BROWS. ALTHOUGH, NO TANGIBLE PROOF WAS FOUND, IT IS STRONGLY SUSPECTED THAT THEY ARE REINFORCEMENTS FOR THE RPF.

### 4. POLITICAL

CA ELECTIONS ARE STILL GOING ON. ON 26 JANUARY THE LIBERATION DAY WAS CELEBRATED, THE A/CMO AND THE AVAILABLE UNMDS WERE PRESENT IN KABALE FOOTBALL STADIUM FOR THIS CELEBRATION. THE SECOND GROUP OF 170 NRA SOLDIERS DEPARTED ON 25 JANUARY FOR LIBERIA AS PART OF THE ECDMDG FORCES IN THAT COUNTRY.

### 5. ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

REPEATER STATION. INTENSIVE RECCE PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED TO FIND THE MOST SUITABLE LOCATION OF THE SECOND REPEATER STATION HAVING AN ALMOST DIRECT LINE OF SIGHT BETWEEN THE MISSION HQ AND THE LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE AREA. THE OPTIMUM PLACE WAS FOUND TO BE AN UNKNOWN HILL GRID RJ 130633 CLOSE TO KINYINYA VILLAGE. FROM THAT POINT WE HAD A VERY STRONG SIGNAL COVERING THE WHOLE AREA WEST AND EAST WITHOUT ANY PROBLEM. AFTER SOME SERIOUS

CONSIDERATIONS AND ACCORDING TO THE RADIO TECHNICIAN AND OUR SIGNALS QUALIFIED OFFICERS, THE OPTION WAS TO CONDUCT THE RECCE BY HELICOPTER SUPPORT.

CAMERAS. OUR REQUEST FOR CAMERAS HAS NOT YET BEEN MET. THESE ARE VERY ESSENTIAL FOR VERY OBVIOUS REASONS.

AGEING VEHICLE FLEET CONSTANTLY BREAKING DOWN, AS A RESULT BADLY AFFECTING OUR OPERATIONS, HOWEVER RESPONSE BY FDD ON THE SUBJECT GIVES HOPE.

FLAK JACKETS AND COMBAT HELMETS PATIENTLY AWAITED.

**6. LIAISON, CONTACTS AND MEDIA**

THE A/CMO ATTENDED HIS ROUTINE MEETING WITH THE DA OF KABALE AND THE NRA BRIGADE COMMANDER AS WELL. DETAILS IN HIS SPECIAL REPORT.

A/CMO, CONTINUING WITH HIS LIAISON MEETINGS, WILL BE TRAVELLING TO MEET THE NRA DIV COMD, AT HIS DIV HQ IN MBARARA ON THE 01 FEBRUARY 1994.

A SOCIAL SOCCER GAME WAS PLAYED BETWEEN A LOCAL POLICE TEAM AND OUR UNMOS' TEAM. THE RESULT WAS A PLEASING 3-2 IN FAVOUR OF OUR TEAM. MORE GAMES WILL CONTINUE TO BE ARRANGED IN FUTURE.

## 7. OBSERVATIONS

THE NON ARRIVAL OF HELICOPTERS IS PULLING OUR OPERATIONS BACK, AS DEPLOYMENT OF MY PATROLS BY HELIS WOULD ~~BE~~ GREATLY COMPLEMENT, OUR AILING TRANSPORT FLEET. PERIOD IN QUESTION ACTIVITY PACKED, IT IS MY INTENTION TO LEAVE NO STONE UNTURNED, EVEN <sup>WITH</sup> INADEQUATE RESOURCES BUT WOULD BE MUCH HAPPIER IF THIS ISSUE IS URGENTLY SOLVED.

WITH RAMADAN CLOSE, MY MOSLEM OFFICERS ALREADY LOOKING FORWARD TO IT, AND WHERE POSSIBLE WILL EXERCISE FLEXIBILITY BUT NOT AT THE DETRIMENT OF OPERATIONS.

1. ON THE 25 JANUARY 1994, A/CMO HAD <sup>A</sup> FORMAL LIAISON MEETING WITH THE DA KABALE AND THE BRIG COMD AT THE DA'S OFFICES. THE MEETING WAS CONDUCTED IN AN UNBELIEVABLY CALM AND FRIENDLY ATMOSPHERE. THE TWO OFFICIALS WERE VERY FRANK AND OPEN. THEY EXPRESSED THEIR APPRECIATION FOR THE JOB THE UN WAS DOING AND SUGGESTED THAT REGULAR FORMAL MEETINGS BE ARRANGED IN FUTURE. THEY ALSO MENTIONED THAT THE GOOD COOPERATION WHICH SO FAR EXISTS BETWEEN THE UN AND ALL THE GOVERNMENT AGENCIES SHOULD BE MAINTAINED.
2. ON THE 26 JANUARY 1994, THE A/CMO WAS FORMALLY INVITED TO 8TH NRM/NRA VICTORY ANNIVERSARY CELEBRATIONS AT KABALE STADIUM. DESPITE RAINS WHICH ALMOST DISRUPTED THE WHOLE PROGRAMME, THE ATTENDANCE WAS GOOD ABOUT 10000 PEOPLE FROM FAR AND NEAR ATTENDED. ALL THE LOCAL DIGNITARIES WERE PRESENT AND THE GUEST OF HONOUR WAS NONE <sup>O</sup> ~~OTHER~~ THAN THE DA KABALE. ALTHOUGH HIS SPEECH WAS PRIMARILY ON DEVELOPMENT, FOR THE FIRST TIME, IN A PUBLIC, HE SPOKE BOUT THE PRESENCE OF THE UN AND THAT HE WAS WORKING VERY WELL WITH UNOMUR. IT WAS A COLOURFUL OCCASION, THE HIGHLIGHT OF WHICH WAS A <sup>R</sup> MATCH PAST

CMO

BY WELL TURNED OUT DETACHMENTS FROM THE POLICE, <sup>AND THE</sup> PRISONS, MUNICIPALITY POLICE. A WELL REHEARSED DRILL DISPLAY BY THE NEW UNIFORMED NRA WAS THE BENCHMARK OF THE WHOLE OCCASION. CULTURAL DANCES WERE A PLEASURE TO WATCH. A UNOMUR/POLICE FOOTBALL MATCH PROGRAMMED FOR THE CELEBRATION WAS CANCELLED BUT FRANTIC LAST MINUTE EFFORTS BY THE DA AND BRIG COMD TO REARRANGE IT WERE FRUITLESS BUT THE MERE ACCEPTANCE IS A CREDIT FOR THE UN.

3. ON THE 27/01/94 A/CMO ATTENDED A FUNERAL OF THE COMMANDANT OF MILITARY POLICE IN THE NATIONAL RESISTANCE ARMY, THE LATE LT/COL BENON TUMUKUNDE WHO WAS KILLED IN A MOTOR CAR ACCIDENT. THE BURIAL TOOK PLACE AT HIS COMMUNAL HOME, 50 KM NORTH OF KABALE. THE FUNERAL WAS ATTENDED BY THE UGANDAN PRESIDENT, SEVERAL CABINET MINISTERS, SENIOR ARMY OFFICERS AND SEVERAL THOUSAND MOURNERS.
4. RELATIONS BETWEEN UNOMUR AND UGANDAN GOVERNMENT AGENCIES HAVE IMPROVED<sup>ED</sup> TREMENDOUSLY OF LATE AT DISTRICT LEVEL. WE HAVE IMPROVED OUR SOCIAL INTERACTION WITH LOCALS AND THE DONATIONS BY INDIVIDUAL UNOMOS TO THE POOR FAMILIES AND TO THE COMMUNITY BASED PROJECTS, HAS<sup>VE</sup> HAD<sup>A</sup> FAR REACHING IMPACT ON THE IMAGE AND ROLE OF THE UNOMUR. THE ANTI UNOMUR LOCAL PAPERS ARE AT THE MOMENT SILENT, VERY LITTLE OR NO PUBLICATION ABOUT UNOMUR HARDLY APPEARS IN THE PAPERS BE IT NEGATIVE OR POSITIVE.
5. AT THE MOMENT, COOPERATION AT THE GRASS ROOT LEVEL IS GOOD BUT WORK STILL HAS TO BE DONE WITH HIGH<sup>ER</sup> AUTHORITIES IN KAMPALA. OF LATE, THEY HAVE BECOME MORE AND MORE<sup>T</sup> BITTER YET IN THE PAST THEY WERE ACCOMMODATIVE, FORCE COMMANDER'S INTENTION TO CONSOLIDATE LIAISON AT THE VERY TOP LEVEL IS A STEP IN THE RIGHT DIRECTION WHILE THE A/CMO CONCENTRATES ON THE DIVISIONAL COMMAND LEVEL DOWN WARDS, ON THE

MILITARY SIDE AND ON THE CIVILIAN SIDE, TARGETS ON THE DA/RC V AND BELOW.

6. IN OUR OPERATIONAL AREA AS<sup>A</sup>WHOLE THE PUBLIC HAS FINALLY ACCEPTED THE PRESENCE OF THE UNOMUR AND ANTI UNOMUR STANCE IS DYING IN FAINT ECHOES.

1. GENERAL SITUATION AND HIGHLIGHTS

THE GENERAL SITUATION IN UNOMUR OPERATIONAL AREA IS QUITE CALM. NO SIGNIFICANT CHANGE IN THE ATTITUDE OF THE LOCAL POPULATION.

THE NEW COMMAND POST IN AREA WEST IS STILL UNDER CONSTRUCTION, LIKELY TO BE COMPLETE EARLY FEBRUARY 1994. IN REACTION TO YOUR CODE CABLE 19TH JANUARY 1994, THE PATROL PROGRAMMES OF BOTH AREAS WERE RESCHEDULED. THE PATROL LEADERS WERE BRIEFED IN DETAIL ABOUT THE REFUGEES. ALL INFORMATION CONCERNING THIS ISSUE WILL BE REPORTED TO YOU SOONEST.

KYANIKA AND KATUNA ARE MANNED AROUND THE CLOCK 24/7 BY "G" TEAM AT KATUNA AND "C" TEAM AT KYANIKA.

(3) PATROLS

IN THE REPORTING PERIOD, WE CONDUCTED SIXTY FOUR (64) PATROLS AS FOLLOWS: FORTY ONE (41) DAILY PATROLS, TWENTY ONE (21) NIGHT PATROLS. THE CMO AND TWO STAFF OFFICERS VISITED KISORO AND LEAD A SPECIAL PATROL TO LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE-KAFUNZO AREA. TWO (2) COMMS PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT TO FIND ALTERNATIVE POSITIONS FOR THE SECOND REPEATER STATION WITH THE AIM OF ESTABLISHING PERMANENT COMMUNICATION BETWEEN MISSION HQ AND PATROLS MOVING IN LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE AREA. THE MISSION RADIO TECHNICIAN CONTINUES TO MAKE A LOT OF EFFORT TO FIND A PROPER PLACE HAVING LINE OF SIGHTS. FINAL RESULTS EXPECTED NEXT WEEK. OUR PATROL ACTIVITIES ARE GOING ON AS PER SCHEDULE, EXCEPT TWO (2) PATROLS WERE CANCELLED DUE TO VEHICLES PROBLEM. GENERALLY, WE CONCENTRATED OUR PATROL ACTIVITY TO LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE, ON THE REPORTING PERIOD WE MANAGED TO COVER THIS AREA FROM 0800 TO 24 HRS. FROM 24 JANUARY LUBIRIZI AND KASHEKYE AREAS WILL BE MANNED PERMANENTLY 24/7 BASIS. FOUR (4) TEAMS ARE TASKED TO COVER THAT AREA, THE CHANGE OVER WILL TAKE PLACE AT KASHEKYE NRA POST (RJ 220608), EVERY SIX (6) HOURS. ALSO FROM 24 JANUARY, CP1

(KATUNA) WILL BE REINFORCED WITH AN EXTRA 4X4 VEHICLE, SO THAT THE KATUNA TEAM WILL BE ABLE TO CARRY OUT DAILY PATROL<sup>S</sup><sub>A</sub> IN SUBZONE E-3 (FOCUSING BIGAGA), SUBZONE E2 (REAR PATROL) AND F2 SUBZONE (UP TO KAFUNZO). BOAT PATROLS WILL COMMENCE AS SOON AS POSSIBLE BECAUSE THE OWNER OF THE BOAT WHO HAD GONE IN HIDING HAS RESURFACE. THE BOAT OWNER REQUIRES 48 HRS PRE WARNING.

THE ARRIVAL OF A VOLKSWAGEN AMBULANCE FOR THE MISSION IS GREATLY APPRECIATED BUT THE ONLY SNAG IS THAT IT IS NOT A 4X4, ARE WORRIED WHETHER IT WILL BE CAPABLE OF MOVING IN THE PREDOMINANTLY STEEP AND SLIPPERY PARTS OF OUR OP AREA PARTICULARLY DURING THE RAIN PERIOD. THE AMBULANCE

DOES NOT BEAR THE UN AND MEDICAL SIGNS YET, BUT THE TRANSPORT OFFICER IS LOOKING INTO THE ISSUE.

(C) RELATIONS WITH NRA

THE RELATIONS WITH THE NRA IS ACCEPTABLE BUT WE ARE STILL NOT IMPRESSED BY THEIR LACK OF OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS TO SUPPORT THE MISSION. CLO STILL IN KAMPALA TO MAKE APPOINTMENTS FOR THE FC. THE EVASIVENESS OF THE NRA (TOP BRASS) NOT VERY IMPRESSIVE, THE CANCELLATION OF THE FC'S APPOINTMENTS CAME AS A SURPRISE, HOPEFULLY FC WILL STRAIGHTEN UP THINGS ON ARRIVAL.

4. POLITICAL

CA ELECTIONS ARE STILL GOING ON. FOR MORE DETAILS SEE OUR INFORMATION SUMMARY SENT TO YOUR HQ ON 22 JANUARY 1994.

RUMOURS HAVE ONCE AGAIN STARTED IN KABALE, BUT THIS TIME FOR A DIFFERENT REASONS ALTOGETHER. THE RUMOUR IS THAT THERE ARE SOME YOUTHS WHO HAVE BEEN TASKED TO PRICK CERTAIN PEOPLE WITH POISONOUS NEEDLES. THE VICTIMS ONCE ADMINISTERED, DIE AFTER COUPLE HOURS. THE AFFECTED AREAS ARE SAID TO BE MBARARA AND KABALE BUT THE RUMOUR IS ALL OVER THE COUNTRY. FROM OTHER SOURCES, THIS RUMOUR SEEM TO HAVE SOME POLITICAL OVERTONES, AS THE RACE TOWARDS THE CA ELECTIONS DRAWS TOWARDS THE END. ONE PERSON

ALLEGED TO BE CONNECTED TO THE POISONOUS PRICKING GROUP IS SAID TO HAVE BEEN MURDERED BY AN ANGRY CROWD 5 KM FROM KABALE ALONG THE KABALE/KATUNA ROAD. INTERVIEWS CONDUCTED ON THE ISSUE TO THE LOCAL MEDICAL DOCTORS INDICATE THAT THE RUMOUR IS LIVE BUT CONFIRMATION OF THE SICK AND DEAD IS A PROBLEM. THE NATIONAL PAPERS CARRIED ARTICLES ON THE SUBJECT BUT NO CONCLUSIVE INFORMATION HAS COME TO LIGHT.

REPEATER STATION. EXTENSIVE GROUND RECCE IS BEING CARRIED OUT IN THE GENERAL AREA OF KAMWEZI AND LUBIRIZI TO INSTALL A SECOND REPEATER STATION. THIS HILLY AREA IS GIVING GREAT PROBLEMS TO COVER THE WHOLE AREA, AND ALSO THE DEAD GROUND.

REPROGRAMMING OF RADIO. REPROGRAMMING OF 4X4 RADIO IS GOING ON SO THAT COMMUNICATION CAN EASILY BE MADE BETWEEN 4X4 TO 4X4 AND 4X4 TO DIFFERENT HQS AND VICE VERSA.

CONSTRUCTION OF AREA WEST HQ AND LUBIRIZI CHECK POST IS GOING ON. IT IS PRESUMED THAT IT MAY TAKE MORE A MONTH TO BE READY.

A HELIPAD HAS BEEN IN CONSTRUCTED IN THE BATUMA COMPLEX NEAR TO MISSION HQ AND AREA EAST HQ.

OUR TRANSPORT SITUATION IS STILL FAR FROM IMPROVING. VEHICLE BREAKDOWNS ARE COMMON PLACE. TRANSPDRT OFFICER DOING HIS BEST BUT FLEET



FROM ANGOLA TOO OLD AND SPARES A PROBLEM TO FIND IN KABALE LET ALONE IN UGANDA AS A WHOLE. STRONGLY REQUEST YOU TREAT THIS ISSUE AS URGENT.

**6. LIAISON, CONTACTS AND MEDIA**

THE A/CMO INTENDS CONDUCTING HIS NORMAL LIAISON MEETINGS WITH THE DIVISIONAL COMD (MBARARA) BRIG. COMD AND THE DA KABALE THIS WEEK.

A FRIENDLY SDCCER GAME HAS BEEN FIXED ON 26 JANUARY (LIBERATION DAY IN UGANDA) BETWEEN UNOMUR AND KABALE POLICE TEAM. THIS GAME IS INCLUDED IN THE OFFICIAL LOCAL PROGRAM.

**7. OBSERVATIONS**

THE INCREASED MOVEMENTS IN THE LUBIRIZI/KASHEKYE AREA IS BEING TREATED AS A PRIORITY AND PATROLS MONITORING THE AREA ON 24/7 BASIS ON SHIFT BASIS UNTIL ACCOMMODATION IS COMPLETE.

HELICOPTERS STILL AWAITED, REQUEST YOU EMPHASE NEED TO FOD.

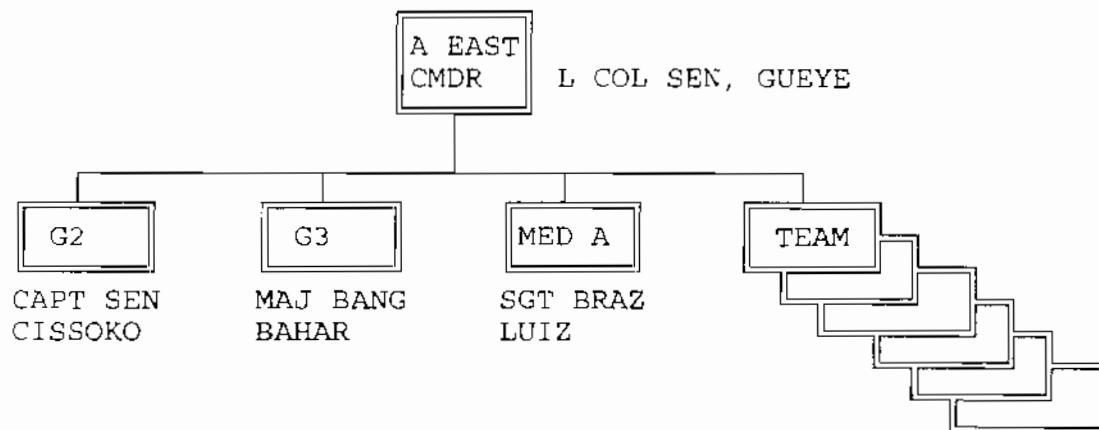




UNOMUR - AREA WEST HQ

a. Walkie Talkies - We have a total of 18 Walkie Talkies. The distributions are as follows:

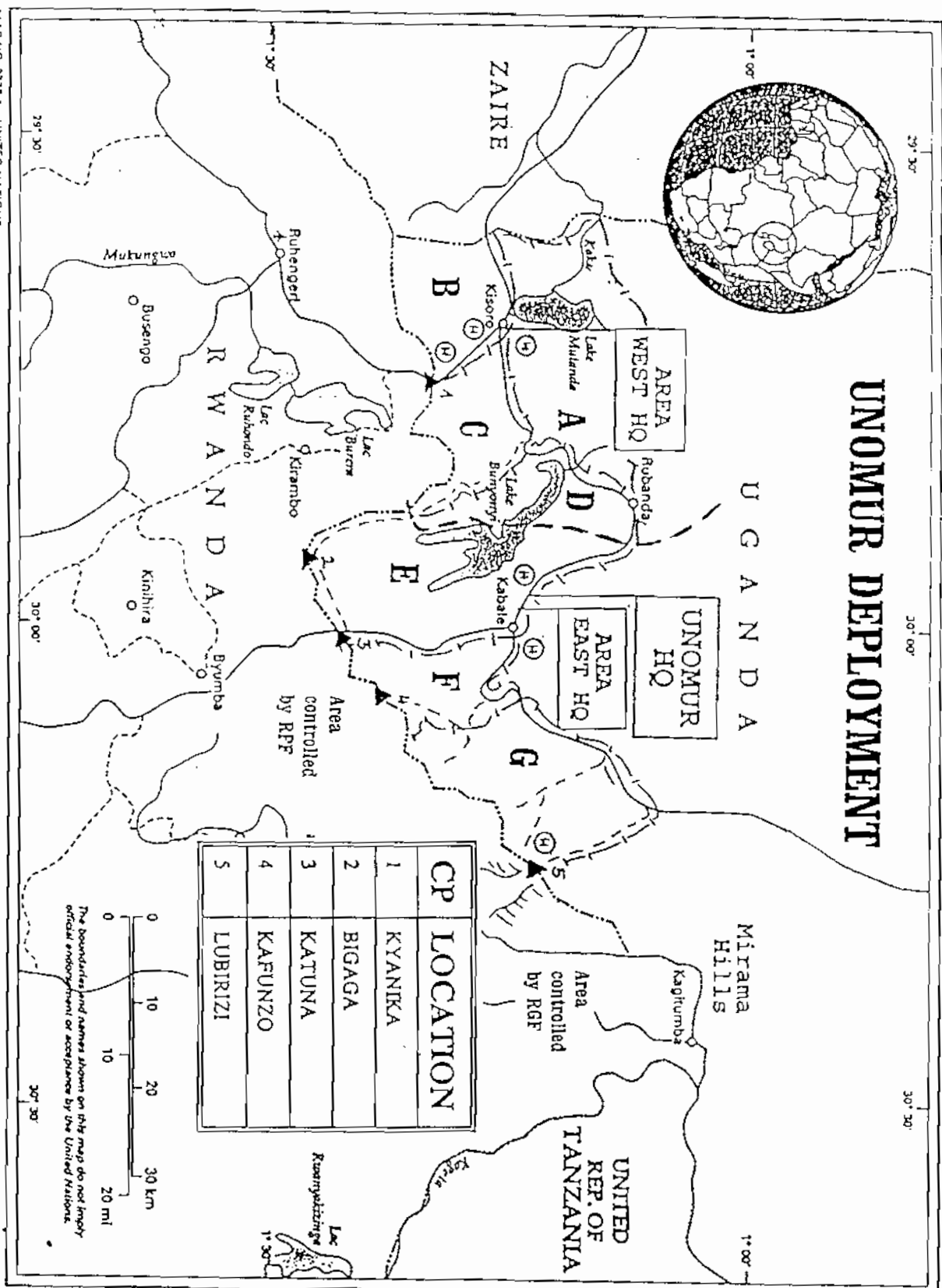
b. Repeater Station - A Repeater station was installed to improve communications, our previous comms problems with Cyanika are now over we need a base station in Area West HQ. A 2nd Repeater Station is going to be installed near the Lubirizi area to cover the whole of operational area.

c. Radio Set in 4/4 - All operational 4x4 vehicles are now fitted with Motorola radio sets.

**Deployment**

CP1 and 3 are manned on 24/7 basis, plans are at an advanced stage to up grade the operational manning of Lubirizi to 24/7 irrespective of whether the infrastructure is complete. The urgency to rapidly mann Lubirizi on a 24/7 is precipitated by the increased movement of people and vehicles of late. Temporarily the teams will leave in tents up to the time when their accommodation at Lubirizi is ready. A section of NRA soldiers plus one X Officer have been lined up for the task.

Four (4) Caravans, two at each CP (Bigaga and Kafunzo) are being arranged but still far out of sight, recommendations sent to NY.



**DETAILED ORGANIZATION OF NRA SUPPORT****1. Personnel**

To date, the NRA has provided a total of five (5) Liaison Officers (four (4) in kabale and one (1) in Kampala and 65 soldiers which are deployed as follows:

One Officer and a Section of Seven soldiers are deployed at Katuna and four (4) soldiers are at Cyanika on permanent basis. The remainder provide escort and guard duties.

**2. Transport:**

The NRA transport situation is very desperate up to now only two (2) 4x4 landrovers have been given to the NRA by their Army HQ. These vehicles are old and therefore, their serviceability is doubtful. At present, only used for purely admin. by the NRA Officers. Their monthly fuel allocation of 2000 litres is by far insufficient. By modest calculations a minimum of 7500 litres a month will be adequate.

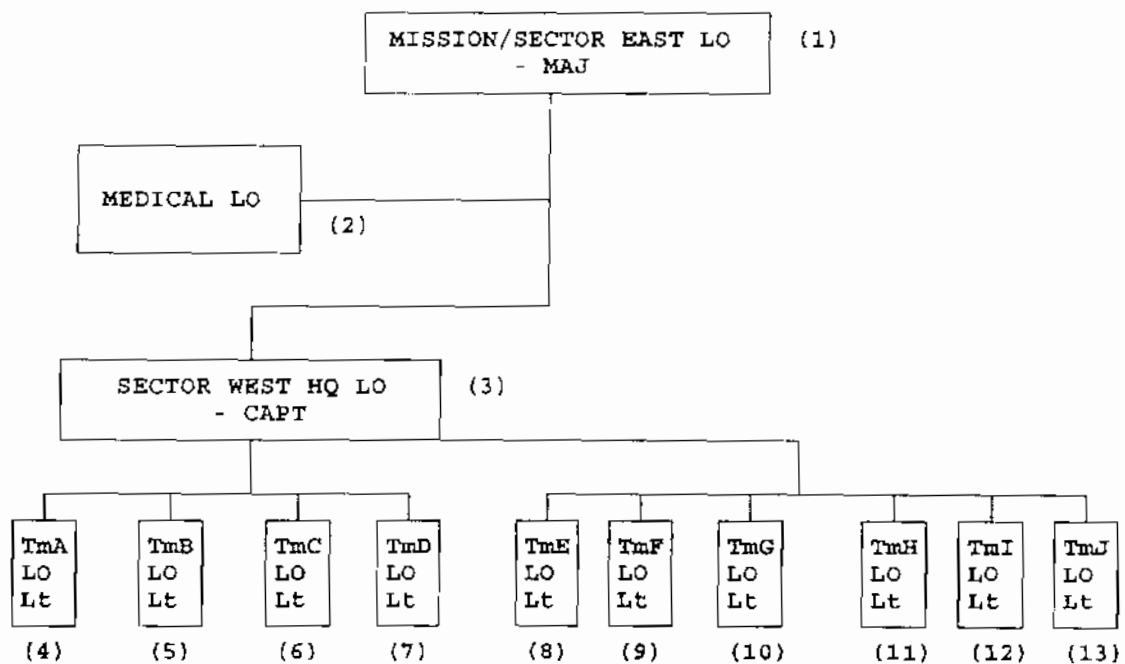
One vehicle is allocated to their HQ in Kabale while one is in Kisoro.

**3. Communication:**

The NRA has no comms. They rely heavily on a single Walkie Talkie radio on loan from UNOMUR. Of recent, they also acquired a telephone in their Office. This is indeed very sad and our patrols are seriously affected as a result thereof.

1. REFERENCE YOUR CODE CABLE DATED 19 JANUARY 1994 IN WHICH YOU FURNISHED US WITH INFORMATION ON THE REFUGEES IN RWANDA AND THE CROSS BORDER MOVEMENTS FROM UGANDA TO RWANDA.
2. AN IMPROMPTU MEETING WAS IMMEDIATELY CONVENED WITH AREA COMMANDERS TO STUDY THE SITUATION AND RESCHEDULE PATROLS TO COMFORTABLY MEET YOUR TASK.
3. THE TANGIBLE INFORMATION AT HAND IS THAT THERE EXISTS A LIVE TRACK THAT RUNS FROM KANABA GRID RJ (6210) SOUTH, TO THE BORDER, BOUNDARY PILAR NO. 12 A - GRID RJ (1355). OUR PATROLS ALREADY ACTIVELY PATROLLING THE AREA ON REGULAR BASIS BUT TO DATE, NO MOVEMENT EMASSE WAS NOTICED.
4. AT LUBIRIZI/KASHEKYE AREA A MINIBUS CARRYING EIGHTEEN (18) PASSENGERS CROSSED TO RWANDA ON THE 19TH JANUARY 1994. NDRMAL CHECKS WERE CONDUCTED BUT OCCUPANTS OF THE MINIBUS HAD A FEW PERSONAL BELONGINGS.

5. AS A RESULT OF THE INCREASED MOVEMENTS IN AREA, WE STEPPED UP THE FREQUENCY OF BOTH DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS PARTICULARLY, IN THE AREA OF LUBIRIZI/KASHEKYE BUT NO SUSPICIOUS MOVEMENT WAS NOTICED.
6. CONNECTION BETWEEN THE BISHOP AND THE RPF NOT A NEW STORY HOWEVER, INTENO KEEPING A HAWK EYE ON ACTIVITIES IN HIS FARMS AND YOU WILL BE INFORMED OF ANY DEVELOPMENTS.

1. GENERAL SITUATION AND HIGHLIGHTS

THE GENERAL SITUATION IN UNOMUR OPERATIONAL AREA REMAINS CALM. THERE IS NO CHANGE IN THE ATTITUDE OF THE LOCAL POPULATION SINCE OUR LAST REPORT.

2. MILITARY

(A) DEPLOYMENT

(1) HQ/CP

THE COMMAND POST IN AREA WEST (KISORO) IS STILL UNDER CONSTRUCTION. IT WILL HOPEFULLY BE READY ON THE 31 OF JANUARY.

CMO

(2) CP/OP

KYANIKA AND KATUNA CONTINUE TO BE MANNED ON 24/7 BASE. THE LOGISTIC ON BOTH POSTS IS GETTING MORE AND MORE SATISFACTORY; ONLY SOME MINOR REPAIRS HAVE TO BE DONE. AT LUBIRIZI, CONSTRUCTIONS HAS EARNESTLY STARTED BUT AT A SLOW PACE. THE CONSTRUCTOR HAS HOWEVER, PROMISED THAT THE CONSTRUCTION WILL BE READY BY THE 10 FEBRUARY.

(3) PATROLS

OUR PATROLS ARE GOING ON AS SCHEDULED. THE BOAT PATROLS ARE NOT BEING CONDUCTED ANYMORE BECAUSE THE OWNER OF THE BOATS DISAPPEARED LAST WEEK. WHEN WE INVESTIGATED THE SITUATION THE WIFE OF THE BOAT OWNER SAID THAT HER HUSBAND HAD GONE TO KAMPALA FROM WHERE HE WOULD GO OUTSIDE UGANDA. FURTHERMORE, ONE OF OUR AREA EAST PATROLS FOUND A 5 TON LORRY AT KAMWEZI MARKET AT 10:30 HRS. THE LORRY WAS STUCK IN MUD DUE TO BAD ROAD CONDITIONS. THE PATROL ENQUIRED FROM THE DRIVER THE NATURE OF HIS CONSIGNMENT AND WHERE HE WAS GOING TO. THE DRIVER REPLIED THAT HE WAS CARRYING MAIZE AND HE WAS GOING TO RWANDA. WHEN THE PATROL ASKED HIM WHY HE WAS USING SUCH BAD ROADS, HE REPLIED THAT HE KNEW BETTER HOW AND WHERE TO GO. REALIZING THE SITUATION THE PATROL IMMEDIATELY WENT TO THE NRA BATTALION AND MET THE COMMANDING OFFICER MAJOR KAMORIRI. HE ORGANIZED SOME SOLDIERS AND TRIED TO GO NEAR TO THE 5 TONNER BUT BY THEN THE LORRY STARTED MOVING TOWARDS THE BORDER. THE



CO (MAJOR KAMORIR) STOPPED THE VEHICLE AND CHECKED IT LIGHTLY AND OPENING A PART OF THE OUTER COVER, HE THEN SAID TO US THE VEHICLE WAS CARRYING MAIZE. THE PATROL TRIED TO LET THE NRA CHECK THE VEHICLE AGAIN AT KASHEKYE POST. THEY DID NOT SUCCEED BECAUSE THE DRIVER TOLD THE NRA GUARD THAT IT WAS A RED CROSS VEHICLE CARRYING FOOD, SO THE GUARDS DID NOT CHECK IT. THE VEHICLE THEN CROSSED THE BORDER HURRIEDLY INTO RWANDA. THE DRIVER WAS FRENCH SPEAKING, THE TRUCK NUMBER WAS UPB 737 THE COLOR OF THE TRUCK IS ORANGE. SINCE THE TRUCK CROSSED THE BORDER HURRIEDLY AND THE NRA DID NOT CHECKED THE TRUCK FULLY, SO THERE IS A POSSIBILITY THAT THE TRUCK WAS CARRYING UNAUTHORIZED EQUIPMENT. OUR HELICOPTER PATROLS HAVE NOT TAKEN OFF THE GROUND, BUT ARE ENERGETICALLY PURSUING THE HELIPAD CONSTRUCTION.

BUT AT THE AREA OF KAMWEZI AND LUBIRIZI/KASHEKYE THEY DO NOT SHOW A POSITIVE ATTITUDE TO OUR PATROLS MAY BE THEY HOLD BACK SOME INFORMATION OF VEHICLE MOVEMENT (SEE PT 3 PATROLS), THEREFORE THE ROLE OF THE NRA AT KAMWEZI AND THEIR RELATION WITH THE RPF MAY BE REASSESSED.

3. VIOLATIONS, INCIDENTS AND COMPLAINTS

SEE SITREP OF 14 JANUARY 1994 PARA III/B.

AT 171000C JANUARY 1994 RECEIVED A CDMPLIANT FROM RWANDESE EMBASSY, KAMPALA BY TELEPHONE, THEY COMPLAINED ABOUT THE MOVEMENT OF RWANDESE PEOPLE (RPF) IN THE KAMWEZI GENERAL AREA. COMPLAINANT WAS INFORMED THAT NECESSARY ACTION HAD ALREADY BEEN TAKEN.

ON WEDNESDAY 15 JANUARY 1994 AT LUBIRIZI AREA THE RGF AND RPF EXCHANGED SOME MORTAR ROUNDS. THE NRA TRODPS IN THE AREA REMAINED CALM.

4. POLITICAL

CA ELECTIONS ARE IN PROGRESS. VICIOUS CAMPAIGNS ARE GOING ON WITHOUT ANY INCIDENTS. A NUMBER OF OBSERVERS FROM THE EMBASSIES ARE NOW IN THE AREA.

5. ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

RECENTLY, A COMMUNICATION REPEATER STATION WAS INSTALLED, AT LAKE BUNYONYI. COMMUNICATION WITH AREA WEST HQ AND CYANIKA CHECK POST HAS IMPROVED NOW BUT IT IS NOT SUFFICIENTLY COVERING THE WHOLE AREA. PLANS ARE ON THE DRAWING BOARDS TO INSTALL A SECOND REPEATER STATION TO COVER THE KAMWEZI/LUBIRIZI AREA. OUR TECHNICIAN IS WORKING FLAT OUT TO ENHANCE OUR COMM'S AS IT IS AFFECTING OUR DEPLOYMENTS. ONCE 2ND REPEATER STATION IS INSTALLED YOUR HQ WILL BE INFORMED ACCORDINGLY.

COMMUNICATION BETWEEN THE PATROL PARTY I.E 4X4 TO 4X4 NOW IMPROVED, ALL 4X4S ARE FITTED WITH NEW MOTOROLA RADIO SET.

THE NRA CHIEF LIAISON OFFICER'S ARGUMENTS ON THE MATTER WERE DISCUSSED AND THE ISSUE WAS AMICABLY SOLVED - OUR LAST WEEK'S SITREP REFERS. ALSO OUR DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS IN THE LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE AREAS HAVE CONTINUED TO OBSERVE VEHICLES AND FRESH TRACKS LEADING TO RWANDA BUT THE NRA AT KASHEKYE HAVE BEEN REFUSING THE FACT THAT THESE VEHICLES WERE CROSSING THROUGH THEIR POST. THIS COMPLAINT HAS BEEN TAKEN UP WITH THE NRA CHIEF LIAISON OFFICER, WHO PROMISED TO SOLVE THE ISSUE WITH THE NRA COMMANDERS OF THE GROUND. THERE HAS NOT BEEN ANY SERIOUS INCREASE IN MOVEMENT IN THE BIGAGA AREA BUT WE ARE KEEPING AN EAGLE'S EYE IN THE AREA. RECENTLY, OUR AREA WEST FOOT PATROL - OBSERVING FROM THE VUGAMBA RANGE APPROXIMATELY AREA OF GRID SQUARE RJ 1050 - MANAGED TO IDENTIFY ANOTHER RPF CAMP INSIDE RWANDA AT KAGOGO. ELSEWHERE IN AREA WEST IS VERY QUITE. THE LONG PROMISED HELICOPTERS, HAVE NOT YET ARRIVED. IT IS OUR WISH TO SEE OUR PATROLS HAVING MORE TEETH. #### (2) OP/CP



THE STATIC OP/CP AT CYANIKA AND KATUNA CONTINUE TO BE MANNED ON A 24/7 BASIS. NOTHING IMPORTANT HAS BEEN FOUND AFTER OUR THOROUGH SEARCHES OF VEHICLES THAT CROSS INTO RWANDA AT KATUNA. THE OP/CP AT LUBIRIZI IS STILL UNDER CONSTRUCTION AND FROM THE LOOK OF THINGS, IT MIGHT BE READY FOR PERMANENT OCCUPATION BY THE END OF THIS MONTH OR MAYBE EARLY NEXT MONTH.

(3) PATROLS

THE DCMO, COO, AND AREA EAST OPERATIONS OFFICER CONDUCTED THE VERY FIRST BOAT PATROL ON LAKE BUNYONYI ON 31 DEC 93, HOWEVER, THE NRA CHIEF LO SEEMED A LITTLE APPREHENSIVE, ARGUING THAT THE LAKE WAS NOT ON THE COMMON BORDER WITH RWANDA. AREA EAST PATROLS HAVE CONTINUOUSLY FOUND FRESH TRACKS COMING FROM A NRA CAMP IN THE LUBIRIZI - KASHEKYE AREA GOING ACROSS INTO RWANDA THROUGH MBALE. THE NRA HAVE BEEN INTERVIEWED BY OUR MILOBS IN CONNECTION WITH THE MATTER, BUT THEY HAVE REFUSED THE FACT. OUR DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS CONTINUE TO BE CONCENTRATED IN THE AREA, AND ALSO IN THE BIGAGA AREA.

AREA WEST PATROLS HAVE BEEN MAINLY CONCENTRATED IN THE BORDER AREAS OF LAKE CHAHAFY, NKURUNGURU AND LUGENDABARE BUT NOTHING SIGNIFICANT HAS BEEN DISCOVERED. OUR HELICOPTER PATROLS HAVE NOT TAKEN OFF THE GROUND SINCE WE ARE STILL AWAITING THE ARRIVAL OF THE HELICOPTER(S) ON 07 JAN 94 AS EARLIER PROMISED.

THE COMMS REPEATER STATION RECENTLY INSTALLED, IS NOT SUFFICIENTLY COVERING THE WHOLE OPERATIONAL AREA. THERE IS A NEED FOR A SECOND REPEATER STATION. ONCE INSTALLED, YOUR HQ WILL BE INFORMED ACCORDINGLY. LAST WEEK WE COULD NOT COMMUNICATE UNAMIR HQ BY TELEPHONE, MAYBE DUE TO BAD TELEPHONE LINES. ALSO, RADIOS INSTALLED IN OUR 4X4 CARS HAVE TO BE RE-PROGRAMED IN ORDER TO ACHIEVE PROPER COMMUNICATIONS THROUGH THE REPEATER/RELAY STATION. THE NECESSARY TOOLS FOR

THE RE-PROGRAMMING SHOULD BE SENT TO US AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

6. LIAISON, CONTACTS AND MEDIA
