2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.** THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE UN SECRETARY-GENERAL, MR SHAHARYAR M KHAN, MET THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER, MR FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, TODAY TO DISCUSS UNAMIR'S NEW MANDATE, INCLUDING BACKGROUND DEVELOPMENTS AND THE NEW ORIENTATION OF POLICY IN IMPLEMENTING THE MANDATE. THE PRIME MINISTER WELCOMED THE NEW MANDATE, BUT ADDED THAT HE BELIEVED THE CURRENT DECEMBER 8TH DEADLINE SHOULD NOT BE CONSIDERED THE FINAL EXPIRATION DATE OF UNAMIR'S MANDATE, AND THAT THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT WOULD CONTINUE TO SEEK UNAMIR'S ROLE IN THE COUNTRY'S ECONOMIC AND SOCIAL DEVELOPMENT. THEY ALSO DISCUSSED THE NEED FOR SWIFT JUSTICE IN RWANDA, THE FORTHCOMING DONOR'S ROUNDTABLE CONFERENCE TO BE HELD IN KIGALI FROM 06 TO 07 JUL 95, AS WELL AS THE NEED FOR THE EARLY REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES FROM NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. THE MEETING WAS HELD IN A VERY POSITIVE AND COOPERATIVE ATMOSPHERE.

AND MATIMBA GR 4786. THE PROJECT IS HOWEVER SAID TO HAVE BEEN STOPPED BY THE PREFECT OF BYUMBA.

(C) MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE COMMUNE COURT IN RUTONGO IS NOT FULLY FUNCTIONAL ALTHOUGH THERE IS A MAGISTRATE. THE MAGISTRATE SITS ON CASES JOINTLY WITH THE BOURGMESTRE. SEVENTY-TWO PRISONERS ARE IN THE COMMUNE CELL. THE INCREASE IN NUMBER IS DUE TO PRISONERS MENTIONING NAMES OF THEIR NEIGHBOURS. MILOBS ASSESS THAT IF THIS PRACTICE IS NOT STOPPED, MANY INNOCENT PERSONS MAY BE ARRESTED.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(C) PTL REPORTED THAT UNHCR AND IOM TRUCKS TODAY CONVEYED 350 RETURNEES FROM NYAKARAMBI TRANSIT CAMP TO MULINDI GR 7667 AND NASHO GR 9054 FOR SETTLEMENT.

THEY WERE TOLD BY THE SENIOR PRISON WARDEN THAT THERE WAS AN ATTEMPT BY PRISONERS TO ESCAPE AND AS A RESULT, FOUR INMATES WERE SHOT DEAD AND THREE OTHERS WOUNDED, ONE OF THEM SERIOUSLY. TWO OF THE WOUNDED WERE TREATED AT THE PRISON'S DISPENSARY AND THE OTHER SENT TO KABGAYI MSF HOSPITAL.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED A HELI PATROL FROM KIBUYE TO CYANAZA (5464). THE AIM WAS TO VERIFY REPORTS OF BANDITRY IN THE AREA. LOCALS WERE INTERVIEWED AND THEY SAID RPA TROOPS NORMALLY COME IN THE NIGHT AND GRAB COWS. SITUATION WAS CALM EXCEPT FOR BANDITRY ACTIVITIES.

A REPORTED OUT-BREAK OF CHOLERA IN THE AREA. THEY FOUND OUT THAT TEN PERSONS WERE TREATED FOR THE DISEASE AS FAR BACK AS MARCH. THERE IS NO EPIDEMIC IN THE AREA.

(8) IN SECTOR 4B - BUTARE. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

(C) MILOBS PATROLS INCLUDED A HELI RECCE OVER YOVE GR 1034, RUGABE GR 2247, GASHIHA GR 2651, MUKO GR 3840, MUSEBEY GR 4033, GAKANGAGA GR 3931 AND THEN KIGALI ROAD. THE HELI LANDED AT YOVE AND GASHIYA. THESE PATROLS WERE INFORMED ON BANDITRY IN GATARE COMMUNE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS COORDINATED THE EVACUATION OF A 15 YEAR OLD GIRL FROM GISENYI TO KIGALI TODAY. IN ANOTHER DEVELOPMENT, THE INSPECTOR OF RUHENGERI SCHOOLS REQUESTED UNAMIR ASSISTANCE TO CONVEY 218,332 KG OF FOOD STUFF FROM KIGALI MEANT FOR TEACHERS ON "FOOD FOR WORK" CONTRACT.

(C) MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE LOCALS OF KINUNU SECTOR IN KAYOVE COMMUNE, ON 24 JUN 95. FOUND A BOAT WITH GRENADES AND A MINE AT THE SHORES OF LAKE KIVU. THEY INFORMED LOCAL RPA TROOPS WHO SEARCHED THE GISHWATI FOREST IN THE AREA AND FOUND TEN MEN SUSPECTED TO BE INTERHAMWE. IN AN ENSUING SHOOT-OUT, TWO INTERHAMWE AND A LOCAL WHO HAD BEEN TAKEN PRISONER WERE KILLED. TWO OTHERS FROM THE GROUP WHO MANAGED TO ESCAPE TO MUTURA WERE LATER ARRESTED THERE. MILOBS/HUMAN RIGHTS INVESTIGATING.

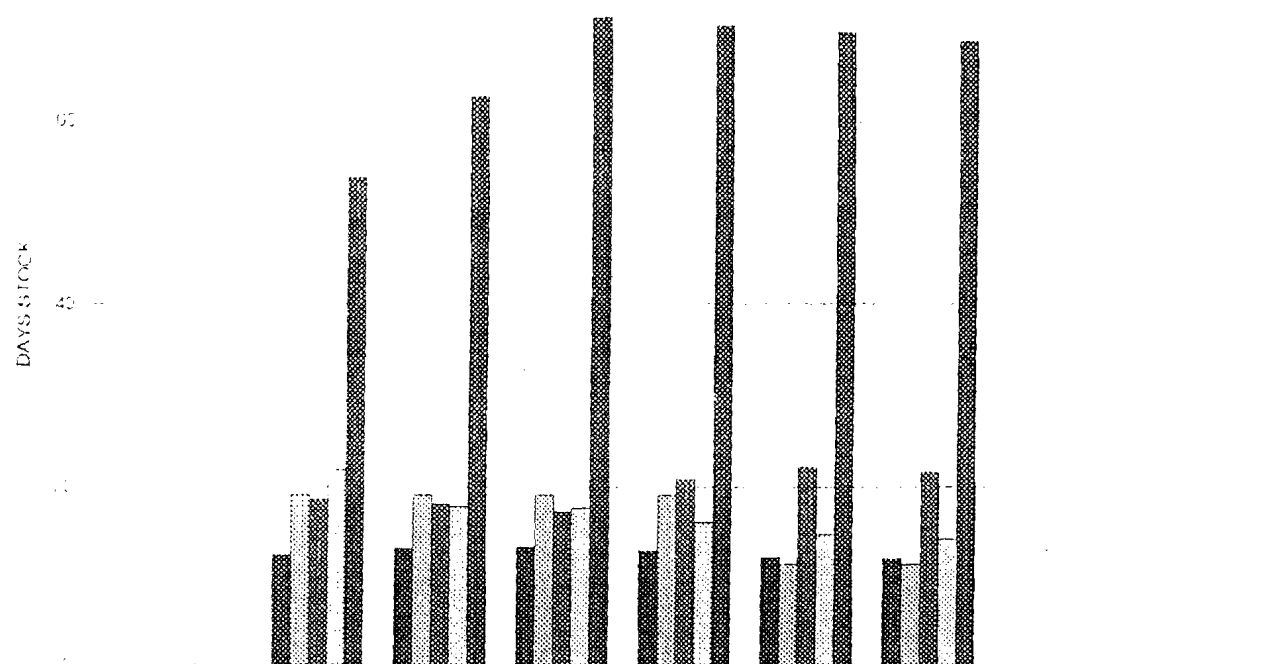

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT RWANDESE PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU DELIVERED A SPEECH AT THE 31ST OAU SUMMIT CONFERENCE ON TUESDAY IN ADDIS ABABA IN WHICH HE SOUGHT THE LIFTING OF THE UN ARMS EMBARGO ON RWANDA BECAUSE, HE CLAIMED, FORMER RWANDESE GOVERNMENT FORCES IN EXILE WERE RE-ARMING IN PREPARATION FOR AN ARMED ATTACK ON RWANDA. HE REPORTEDLY ALSO CRITICISED AFRICAN COUNTRIES FOR HARBOURING PERPETRATORS OF THE GENOCIDE IN RWANDA AND FOR THEIR FAILURE TO EXTRADITE SUCH CRIMINALS.

B. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT THE ZAIRIAN PRIME MINISTER, MR. KENGO WA DONDO, IN A PUBLIC ADDRESS IN GOMA, ZAIRE, STATED THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF ZAIRE WANTED ALL RWANDESE REFUGEES TO RETURN HOME AS THEY WERE CREATING A CLIMATE OF INSECURITY. HE REPORTEDLY CRITICISED RWANDESE REFUGEES FOR DUPLICATING THE ADMINISTRATIVE AND LEADERSHIP STRUCTURES OF THEIR HOME COUNTRY IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS, AND ADDED THAT THE PRESENCE OF RWANDESE REFUGEES IN ZAIRE POSED AN OBSTACLE TO THE ORGANISATION OF ELECTIONS TO BE HELD IN ZAIRE IN THE NEAR FUTURE.

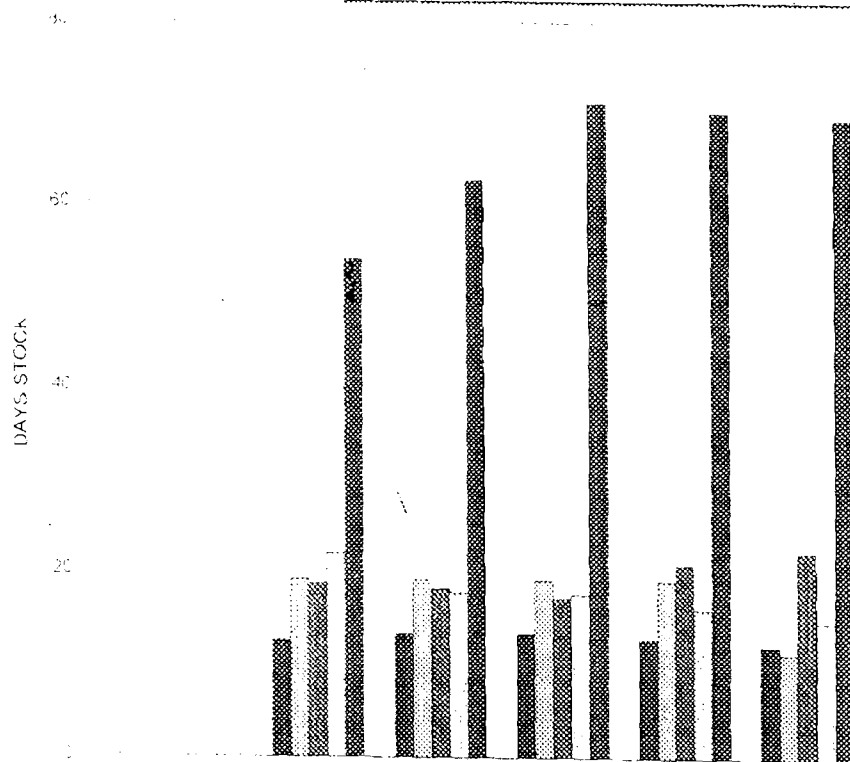



AT GIKONGORO PREFECTURE, ON 25 JUN 95, PTL TEAM TO KINYAMAKARA COMMUNE MET THE BOURGEMESTRE WHO DISCLOSED THAT OUT OF 649 LOCALS FROM THE COMMUNE WHO TOOK REFUGE AT KIBEHO CAMP AFTER THE WAR, ONLY 448 HAVE SO FAR RETURNED. THE BOURGEMESTRE FURTHER REVEALED THAT 24 OF THE RETURNEES WERE FOUND TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THE LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE AND WERE ARRESTED AND DETAINED IN THE COMMUNE CELL BY RPA. THE TEAM VISITED THE DETENTION CENTRE AND FOUND THAT THE SUSPECTS WERE DETAINED IN A SMALL ROOM WITH POOR SANITARY CONDITION. THE BOURGEMESTRE HOWEVER MENTIONED THAT THEIR CONTINUED DETENTION IN THE CACHOT WAS DUE TO LACK OF TRANSPORT TO TRANSFER THEM TO GIKONGORO MAIN PRISON. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED. THE TEAM WAS ALSO INFORMED THAT A GRENADE WAS FOUND A FEW METERS AWAY FROM THE MAIN GATE OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS OFFICE AND LATER PICKED BY RPA SOLDIERS. INVESTIGATIONS REVEALED THAT A DRUNK RPA SOLDIER DROPPED THE GRENADE ACCIDENTALLY WHEN HE WAS BEING PURSUED BY HIS COLLEAGUES AFTER FIRING INDISCRIMINATELY.

D. AT GITARAMA PREFECTURE, PTL TEAM TO NYABINKENKE COMMUNE VISITED THE COMMUNE CELL. DURING THEIR INTERVIEW WITH THE INMATES, THE RPA OFFICER IN CHARGE OF THE CACHOT ORDERED THE TEAM TO STOP FURTHER DISCUSSIONS AND HAND OVER THEIR NOTES TO HIM. AFTER AN HOUR AND HALF DELIBERATIONS, THE TEAM WAS ALLOWED TO LEAVE THE AREA. THE RPA OFFICER ACCUSED UNAMIR OF SPREADING FALSEHOOD ABOUT THE COMMUNE TO HIS SUPERIORS.

E. AT CYANGUGU PREFECTURE, PTL TEAM REPORTED THAT ON 24 JUN 95, BETWEEN 2030 TO 2200 HRS, A GROUP OF BANDITS ARMED WITH AUTOMATIC WEAPONS ROBBED 2 LOCALS IN KAGONO COMMUNE OF SOME UNSPECIFIED AMOUNT OF MONEY AND PERSONAL EFFECTS. THE BANDITS ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE COME FROM ZAIRE. INVESTIGATION IN

PROGRESS.

F. ON 25 JUN 95, A JOINT CIVPOL/HUMAN RIGHTS PTL TEAM VISITED TOKABAYA COMMUNE AND REPORTED THAT 285 REFUGEES COMPRISING OF 50 MEN, 50 WOMEN, 110 CHILDREN AND 75 HERDSMEN WERE IN RWILI SECTOR. THE REFUGEES WERE SAID TO HAVE CROSSED INTO RWANDA FROM ZAIRE SINCE MAY 95. THE REFUGEES COMPLAINED OF LACK OF FOOD AND FARM IMPLEMENTS. HAC INFORMED.

G. AT BUTARE PREFECTURE, CIVPOL MONITORING TEAM TO RUSATIRA COMMUNE PRISON ON 26 JUN 95 REPORTED THAT THE PRISON IS OVERCROWDED WITH 165 INMATES AND POOR SANITARY CONDITIONS. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

B. FOOD. IT HAD BEEN EXPECTED TO SIGN A NEW FOOD CONTRACT IN LATE APRIL, IT WAS FINALLY SIGNED THIS WEEK. BECAUSE OF CONTINUAL DELAY IN SIGNING THE NEW CONTRACT THE OVERLAP BETWEEN THE CURRENT LOA AND THE FRESH FOOD DELIVERIES UNDER THE NEW CONTRACT HAS BEEN REDUCED AND LED TO THE NEED FOR CONTINGENTS TO GO ONTO COMBAT RATIONS. THE CIVILIAN STAFF OF UNAMIR HAVE FOUGHT HARD FOR US, BUT DESPITE THEIR EFFORTS THERE WILL BE A DEGRADATION IN THE MILITARY STANDARD OF LIVING IN THE KEY AREA OF FOOD. ANY ACTION BY YOU THAT CAN LIMIT THIS PERIOD TO ABSOLUTE MINIMUM WOULD BE FULLY APPRECIATED.

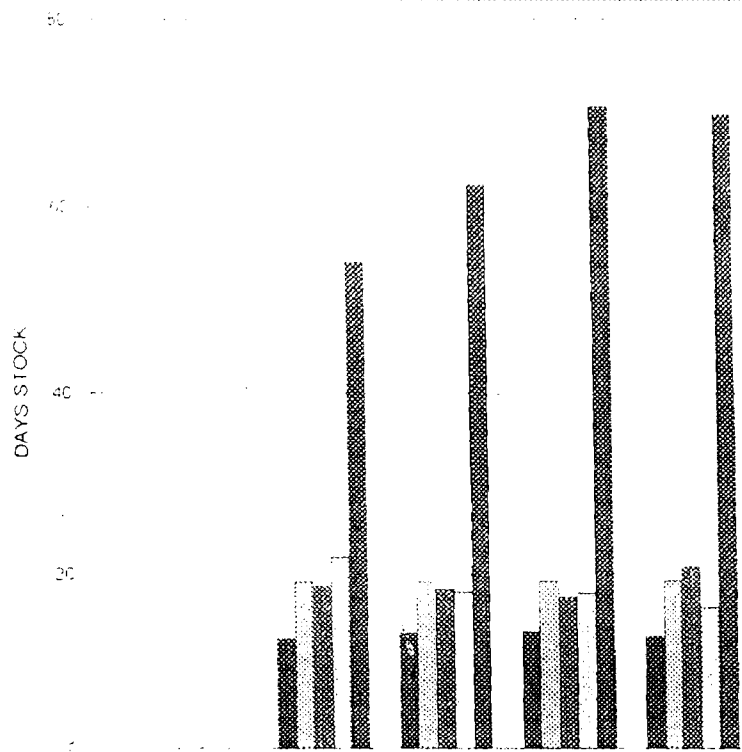





AT GIKONGORO PREFECTURE, ON 25 JUN 95, PTL TEAM TO KINYAMAKARA COMMUNE MET THE BOURGEMESTRE WHO DISCLOSED THAT OUT OF 649 LOCALS FROM THE COMMUNE WHO TOOK REFUGE AT KIBEHO CAMP AFTER THE WAR, ONLY 448 HAVE SO FAR RETURNED. THE BOURGEMESTRE FURTHER REVEALED THAT 24 OF THE RETURNEES WERE FOUND TO HAVE TAKEN PART IN THE LAST YEAR'S GENOCIDE AND WERE ARRESTED AND DETAINED IN THE COMMUNE CELL BY RPA. THE TEAM VISITED THE DETENTION CENTRE AND FOUND THAT THE SUSPECTS WERE DETAINED IN A SMALL ROOM WITH POOR SANITARY CONDITION. THE BOURGEMESTRE HOWEVER MENTIONED THAT THEIR CONTINUED DETENTION IN THE CACHOT WAS DUE TO LACK OF TRANSPORT TO TRANSFER THEM TO GIKONGORO MAIN PRISON. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED. THE TEAM WAS ALSO INFORMED THAT A GRENADE WAS FOUND A FEW METERS AWAY FROM THE MAIN GATE OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS OFFICE AND LATER PICKED BY RPA SOLDIERS. INVESTIGATIONS REVEALED THAT A DRUNK RPA SOLDIER DROPPED THE GRENADE ACCIDENTALLY WHEN HE WAS BEING PURSUED BY HIS COLLEAGUES AFTER FIRING INDISCRIMINATELY.

D. AT GITARAMA PREFECTURE, PTL TEAM TO NYABINKENKE COMMUNE VISITED THE COMMUNE CELL. DURING THEIR INTERVIEW WITH THE INMATES, THE RPA OFFICER IN CHARGE OF THE CACHOT ORDERED THE TEAM TO STOP FURTHER DISCUSSIONS AND HAND OVER THEIR NOTES TO HIM. AFTER AN HOUR AND HALF DELIBERATIONS, THE TEAM WAS ALLOWED TO LEAVE THE AREA. THE RPA OFFICER ACCUSED UNAMIR OF SPREADING FALSEHOOD ABOUT THE COMMUNE TO HIS SUPERIORS.

E. AT CYANGUGU PREFECTURE, PTL TEAM REPORTED THAT ON 24 JUN 95, BETWEEN 2030 TO 2200 HRS, A GROUP OF BANDITS ARMED WITH AUTOMATIC WEAPONS ROBBED 2 LOCALS IN KAGONO COMMUNE OF SOME UNSPECIFIED AMOUNT OF MONEY AND PERSONAL EFFECTS. THE BANDITS ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE COME FROM ZAIRE. INVESTIGATION IN

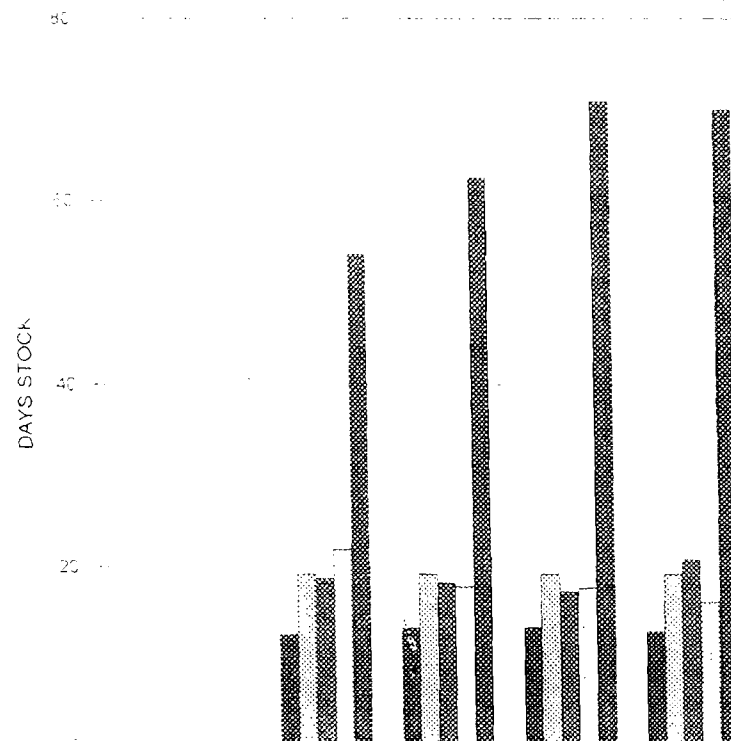

A. THE SPECIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE U.N. SECRETARY-GENERAL FOR RWANDA, MR. SHAHARYAR M. KHAN, RETURNED TO KIGALI TODAY FOLLOWING AN EXTENDED ABSENCE FROM THE MISSION AREA.

B. THE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA, H.E. MR. PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU, LEFT KIGALI YESTERDAY, 25 JUN 95 TO PARTICIPATE IN THE 31ST SUMMIT CONFERENCE OF THE ORGANISATION OF AFRICAN UNITY (OAU) TO BE HELD IN ADDIS-ABABA, ETHIOPIA FROM 26 TO 28 JUN 95.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, WHO ATTENDED THE 62ND MINISTERIAL CONFERENCE OF AFRICAN FOREIGN MINISTERS HELD IN ADDIS-ABABA, STATED THAT THE NEWLY-FORMED RWANDESE POLITICAL PARTY, THE RALLY FOR RETURN AND FOR DEMOCRACY IN RWANDA (RDR), WAS COMPOSED OF FORMER MEMBERS OF THE MRND PARTY OF THE LATE PRESIDENT HABYARIMANA WHO INTENDED TO OFFER PROTECTION TO THOSE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE GENOCIDE IN RWANDA. HE REPORTEDLY URGED AFRICAN LEADERS TO IGNORE STATEMENTS MADE BY THE LEADERS OF THE RDR PARTY.

D. THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT SPOKESMAN AND MINISTER FOR INFORMATION, MR. JEAN BAPTISTE NKURIYINGOMA, STATED IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA THAT THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT DID NOT INTEND TO CONDUCT POLITICAL NEGOTIATIONS WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF RWANDESE REFUGEES IN NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES AS NEGOTIATIONS IMPLIED THE SETTING OF CONDITIONS BETWEEN PARTIES. HE EXPLAINED THAT THE GOVERNMENT ONLY INTENDED TO CONTINUE CONTACTS WITH INNOCENT RWANDESE REFUGEES IN ORDER TO PERSUADE THEM TO RETURN HOME. DURING THE INTERVIEW, HE CONFIRMED THAT THE CHAIRMAN OF THE RDR PARTY HAD WRITTEN TO THE RWANDESE PRIME MINISTER PROPOSING TO ENTER INTO NEGOTIATIONS WITH THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT IN ARUSHA, TANZANIA TO DISCUSS THE REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES, BUT THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAD REFUSED TO RECOGNISE THE RDR AS BEING REPRESENTATIVE OF RWANDESE REFUGEES DUE TO ITS ASSOCIATION WITH THE MRND PARTY.

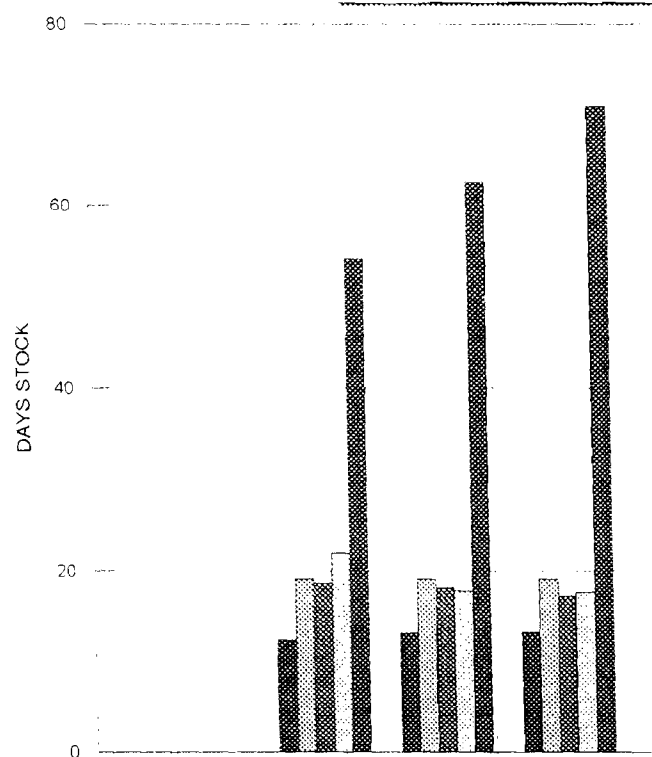

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE ALTHOUGH CERTAIN AREAS REMAIN TENSE. BANDITRY ACTIVITIES SUCH AS THEFT, HIJACKING OF VEHICLES AND ARMED ROBBERIES HAVE REDUCED APPRECIABLY SINCE THE FC MADE A PERSONAL APPEAL TO THE RWANDESE VICE PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE TO ASSIST IN CURBING THE RAMPANT CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES AIMED AGAINST UNAMIR, UN AGENCIES AND NGOS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE U.N. SECRETARY-GENERAL, MR. ALDO AJELLO, ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 20 JUNE TO CONSULT GOVERNMENTS OF NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES ON THE POSSIBILITY OF DEPLOYING U.N. MILITARY OBSERVERS TO MONITOR THE ARMS EMBARGO ON RWANDA IMPOSED BY THE U.N. SECURITY COUNCIL. DURING HIS VISIT TO RWANDA, HE HELD CONSULTATIONS WITH THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME. HE ALSO ATTENDED A MEETING WITH THE HEADS OF U.N. AGENCIES OPERATING IN RWANDA. FOLLOWING AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO BURUNDI AND ZAIRE WHERE HE HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH SENIOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS, HE RETURNED TO KIGALI ON 24 JUNE.

B. THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT ISSUED A COMMUNIQUE ON 20 JUNE RENEWING ITS COMMITMENT TO THE REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES. ACCORDING TO THE COMMUNIQUE, THE GOVERNMENT HAS AGREED TO ESTABLISH CONTACTS WITH THOSE RWANDESE REFUGEES NOT INVOLVED IN ACTS OF GENOCIDE, AS WELL AS TO ALLOW REPRESENTATIVES OF RWANDESE REFUGEES TO VISIT RWANDA TO ASSESS CONDITIONS FOR THEIR RETURN HOME.

C. THE FORMER PRESIDENT OF TANZANIA, H.E. MR. JULIUS NYERERE, ENDED HIS 5-DAY VISIT TO RWANDA. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, HE STATED DURING HIS VISIT THAT THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY SHOULD NOT BLAME THE CURRENT RWANDESE GOVERNMENT FOR EVERY MINOR INCIDENT REPORTED IN THE COUNTRY, BECAUSE THE GOVERNMENT WAS NOT RESPONSIBLE FOR THE SITUATION IT HAD INHERITED. HE ALSO VISITED RWANDESE REFUGEES IN TANZANIA WHO REPORTEDLY TOLD HIM THAT THEY COULD NOT RETURN HOME FOR FEAR OF BEING KILLED, AND BECAUSE THEIR FARMS AND HOMES WERE STILL OCCUPIED BY OTHERS. MR. NYERERE REPORTEDLY STATED SUCH FEARS WERE UNFOUNDED. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT MR. NYERERE, IN A PUBLIC SPEECH, QUESTIONED THE U.N. SECURITY COUNCIL'S INACTION IN APPREHENDING SUSPECTED PLANNERS OF THE RECENT GENOCIDE IN RWANDA. HE REPORTEDLY ADDED THAT RWANDA WAS NOT YET PREPARED FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF A MULTIPARTY SYSTEM OF GOVERNMENT.

D. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF INTERIOR AND COMMUNAL DEVELOPMENT, MR. SETH SENDASHONGA, HAS ORDERED THE SUSPENSION OF THE DISTRIBUTION OF RESIDENCE PERMITS TO THE RESIDENTS OF KIGALI. A COMMUNIQUE READ ON RADIO RWANDA STATED THAT THIS INITIATIVE OF THE PREFECT OF KIGALI WAS A VIOLATION OF THE ARUSHA PEACE ACCORDS, AND THAT THE DISTRIBUTION OF TWO DIFFERENT TYPES OF RESIDENCE PERMITS TO OLD CASELOAD RETURNEES AND SURVIVORS OF THE GENOCIDE GAVE RISE TO A CLIMATE OF INSECURITY AND FEAR.

E. SPEAKING AT A HUMAN RIGHTS SEMINAR ON 19 JUNE, THE

RWANDESE MINISTER OF INFORMATION, MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE NKURIYINGOMA, CRITICISED INSTANCES OF DISTORTED REPORTING ON RADIO RWANDA AND IN THE MEDIA WHICH MINIMISED INCIDENTS OF VIOLENCE AND IGNORED HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES, SUCH AS THE ILLEGAL SEIZURE OF PROPERTY.

F. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT AT A SECURITY MEETING HELD ON 23 JUNE BY THE PREFECT OF CYANGUGU, THE GENERAL SECURITY SITUATION IN THE REGION WAS DEEMED TO BE GOOD DESPITE THE LOCAL POPULATION'S PROVISION OF SHELTER TO INTERAHAMWE MILITIA ELEMENTS INFILTRATING FROM ZAIRE. THE PARTICIPANTS REPORTEDLY DECIDED TO IMPOSE A NIGHT CURFEW ON THE REGION FROM 19:00 TO 05:00, AND ALSO COMPLAINED ABOUT ZAIRE'S CLOSURE OF ITS BORDER WITH RWANDA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS WHICH PREVENTED RWANDESE NATIONALS FROM CROSSING OVER INTO THE ZAIREAN TOWN OF BUKAVU.

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPA.

(A) IN SECTOR 4C, MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA HAS AUTHORIZED FISHING ON LAKE KIVU, EAST OF ISHARA PENINSULA GR 0142 AND KIRAMBO COMMUNE GR 0444. IN THE SAME SECTOR, MILOBS REPORTED THAT A FERRY OPERATES REGULARLY BETWEEN KIRAMBO COMMUNE AND ISHARA PENINSULA.

(B) IN SECTOR 4A, ZAMBATT REPORTED THAT AN RPA SOLDIER SHOT DEAD TWO CIVILIANS AT RWAMIKO COMMUNE ON 21 JUN 95 FOR NO APPARENT REASON.

(C) SECTOR 1 MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA LOCATED IN KIVUYE COMMUNE ARE DIGGING TRENCHES AND CONSTRUCTING DEFENSIVE POSITIONS AROUND THE COMMUNE BUREAU.

(D) IN SECTOR 3, RPA SOLDIERS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE INTENSIFIED SECURITY ALONG THE SHORES IN THE AREA OF RWARAMBA GR 2063.

(2) FRGF/MILITIA

(A) IN SECTOR 4C, MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 19 JUN 95, AN UNIDENTIFIED AIRCRAFT WAS OBSERVED FLYING WEST OF KAMEMBE COMMUNE TOWARDS BURUNDI. NO FURTHER DETAILS AVAILABLE.

(B) A LOCAL INTERPRETER AT GAHINGA GR 760215 REPORTED TO MILOBS THAT FRGF ELEMENTS VISITED LOCALS IN MURURU SECTOR GR 7521 AND INFORMED THEM OF AN IMPENDING FRGF ATTACK FROM ZAIRE IN MID JUL 95.

(C) IN SECTOR 4C, TWO INCIDENTS OF BANDITRY WERE REPORTED AT KAVAZA AND AT CYETE GR 7618 ON 22 JUN 95. CASH, HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND WEAPONS WERE STOLEN AND ONE LOCAL WAS INJURED. STILL IN THE SAME SECTOR, MILOBS REPORTED THAT ARMED BANDITS ROBBED TWO HOUSES AND FORCED THE VICTIMS TO CARRY THE STOLEN GOODS TO A BOAT AT GASAYO GR 995417 ON 24 JUN 95.

B. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) UNAMIR

(A) ON 19 JUN 95, THE FC MET WITH HIS SENIOR STAFF OFFICERS TO DISCUSS STAFF ROTATION PLAN FOR UNAMIR HQ IN CONCERT WITH THE REVISED MANDATE. HE LATER MET MR KENT OF UNREO TO DISCUSS FUTURE ROLE AND POTENTIAL OF UNREO IN THE NEW UNAMIR MANDATE.

(B) ON 21 JUN 95, THE FC RECEIVED THE SPECIAL ENVOY OF THE UN SECRETARY GENERAL, MR ALDO AJELLO. IN THE AFTERNOON, MR AJELLO WAS GIVEN A DETAILED BRIEFING BY UNAMIR STAFF OFFICERS ON THE CURRENT SITUATION IN RWANDA.

(C) ON 22 JUN 95, THE FC MET THE NEW MISSION CHIEF OF ICRC. HE THEN MET SOME US EMBASSY OFFICIALS TO DISCUSS MANDATE ISSUES AND THE CURRENT POLITICAL AND MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA. HE ALSO MET THE RPA COS TO DISCUSS RENOVATION OF SCHOOLS IN BUTARE. THE RPA COS ASKED FOR UNAMIR ASSISTANCE TO REHABILITATE A SCHOOL FOR USE BY UNDERAGE SOLDIERS.

(D) ON 23 JUN 95, THE FC MET MR KRATZ OF THE EUROPEAN UNION TO DISCUSS THE PURPOSE OF THE VISIT OF THE DELEGATION. HE ALSO ATTENDED THE MEDAL PRESENTATION CEREMONY OF AUSMED. LATER HE VISITED THE FORCE SIGNAL COY ON AN OFFICIAL VISIT.

(E) ON 24 JUN 95, THE FC ATTENDED THE TUNISIAN NATIONAL ARMY DAY CEREMONIES AT NYUNDO IN SECTOR 5.

(F) ON 25 JUN 95, THE FC SAW OFF THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT AT KIGALI AIRPORT. THE PRESIDENT WAS ON

HIS WAY TO ATTEND A OAU MEETING IN ADDIS-ABABA.

(2) SECTOR 1 (NIBATT).

(A) EOD TEAM RECOVERED 4 ANTI PERS MINES, 132 ROUNDS OF 7.62, 244 ROUNDS OF 8.5MM, 02 ROUNDS OF ANTI-AIRCRAFT GUN AND HAND GRENS AT NYAGAHANGA GIRLS HIGH SCHOOL GR 2420.

(B) A TOTAL OF 659 LOCALS RECEIVED MEDICAL ASSISTANCE IN MED CENTRE DURING THE WEEK.

(A) ON 24 JUN 95, 5 ROUNDS WERE FIRED AROUND RILIMA PRISON GR 2561.

(C) PTL TO RWARAMBA GR 2063 REPORTED THAT LOCALS IN THE AREA WERE LIVING IN FEAR FOLLOWING THE KILLING OF 11 PEOPLE IN THE AREA. RPA HAS INTENSIFIED SECURITY ARRANGMENTS IN THE AREA.

(D) TREATED A TOTAL OF 23 PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(5) SECTOR 3B (MALICOY). TREATED A TOTAL OF 91 PATIENTS DURING THE WEEK.

(6) SECTOR 4A (ZAMBATT).

(A) THREE LOCALS WERE MATCHETED BY UNKNOWN PERSONS AT IVIRIRO CLINIC IN NYAKIZU GR 5196 ON 19 JUN 95.

(C) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTOR.

(K) IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI. PTLs TO KACYIRU AND KICUKIRO COMMUNES REPORTED THAT LOCALS WERE PREPARING FOR INDEPENDENCE CELEBRATIONS TO BE HELD ON 01 JUL 95. ALSO A CEREMONY WILL BE HELD IN KIGALI TO MARK THE FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF THE CAPTURE OF KIGALI BY THE RPA ON 04 JUL 95.

(A) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.

(B) CONTINUED DOZER WORK FOR IMPROVEMENT OF ROADS IN BUTARE.

(D) RECOVERED 3 X HAND GRENS, 9 X RIFLE GRENS, 3 X MOR BOMBS AND 600 ROUNDS OF SA AMMO FROM THE UNIVERSITY OF PUBLIC FINANCES IN KIGALI.

(E) COMPLETED WORK FOR IMPROVEMENT OF SANITARY CONDITIONS FOR MALAWICOY AT KIBUYE.

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED STABLE ALTHOUGH SECURITY SITUATION IN CERTAIN AREAS ESPECIALLY ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER, REMAINED TENSE.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT A TWO-DAY TRIPARTITE MEETING OF REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE RWANDESE AND TANZANIAN GOVERNMENTS AND UNHCR ENDED ON 19 JULY IN KIGALI. THE PARTICIPANTS REPORTEDLY DISCUSSED MODALITIES FOR THE REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES FROM TANZANIA AND SIGNED AN AGREEMENT TO CREATE A COMMISSION ON SECURITY AND THE RESETTLEMENT OF RETURNEES.

B. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA ON THE OCCASION OF THE FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF THE FORMATION OF THE NEW GOVERNMENT IN RWANDA, THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT, MR. PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU, STATED THAT POLITICAL PARTIES AND FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION WERE NOT BANNED IN RWANDA, BUT THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAD BANNED "POLITICAL COMPETITION, MUTUAL ACCUSATIONS AMONG POLITICAL PARTIES WHICH CAUSE INSTABILITY AND DIVISIONS."

C. THE US DEPUTY ASSISTANT SECRETARY OF STATE FOR POLITICAL AND MILITARY AFFAIRS, MR. MICHAEL LEMMON, VISITED UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS ON 22 JULY WHERE HE WAS RECEIVED BY THE FORCE COMMANDER. HE WAS BRIEFED BY HIM AND OTHER UNAMIR OFFICIALS ON POLITICAL, MILITARY AND CIVILIAN POLICE OPERATIONS AND LATER MADE AN AERIAL VISIT ON A UN HELICOPTER TO VARIOUS SECTORS AROUND THE COUNTRY.

3. MILITARY

A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

(1) RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(A) IN SECTOR 5C MILOB PATROL TO RUBAZO GR 2862 REPORTED THAT THE SITUATION IS TENSE DUE TO HARASSMENT OF LOCALS BY RPA AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES. IT IS FURTHER REPORTED THAT MEN OF 15 YEARS OLD AND ABOVE ARE BEING ACCUSED OF PARTICIPATION IN GENOCIDE IN THIS AREA. THE LOCALS TOLD THE TEAM HARASSMENT IS ACUTE SPECIALLY ON THE HUTU POPULATION.

(B) IN SECTOR 3B MILOBS REPORTED THAT ONE RPA SOLDIER WAS SEEN WEARING A LIGHT BLUE BERET WITHOUT A BADGE, IN MBAZI (GR 7117). MATTER WILL BE INVESTIGATED AND DISCUSSED WITH LOCALS RPA COMD.

(C) IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT TWO RPA PLATOONS WERE SEEN OCCUPYING THE FORMER POSITION VACATED BY THE ETHIOBATT PLATOON AT KABAYAGO CELL (GR 7917).

(D) SECTOR 1 MILOBS REPORTED THAT A RPA PLATOON IS CONDUCTING PLATOON LEVEL TRAINING IN THE AREA

OF MASANGO (GR 6254). THE SECTOR COMMANDER MAY BE INVITED TO WITNESS TRAINING AT A LATER DATE.

(E) AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF RPA SOLDIERS VISITED NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP IN SECTOR 4 ON 17, AND 19 JUL. THEY PATROLLED THE CAMP MANY TIMES. THERE WAS NO ARREST AND THEIR PRECISE INTENTIONS WERE UNKNOWN.

(F) HEAVY PRESENCE OF ARMED TROOP CONTINUE IN BUTARE.

(G) MILOB REPORTED THAT ONE PERSON BELIEVED TO BE INTERAHAMWE WAS ARRESTED BY RPA IN GITARAMA TOWN. THE ARRESTED MAN CAME FROM RULI SECTOR SQ 7570 NYAMABUYE COMMUNE. DETAILED REPORT TO FOLLOW.

(H) MILOBS FROM SECTOR 3B REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS AT MUVIRA (GR 8639) AND MUYAGA SQ 9026 COMMUNE WERE ASKING MILOBS TEAM ON PTL FOR THE LETTER OF AUTHORITY TO ENTER THE COMMUNES.

(2) MILITIA/FRGF

(A) SECTOR 4 MILOBS REPORTED THAT AT ABOUT 0042 HRS ON 18 JUL 95 A LARGE EXPLOSION WAS HEARD APPROX 2-3 KM FROM MILOB SECTOR HQ IN A SOUTH WESTERN DIRECTION. THE EXPLOSION WAS BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN CAUSED BY A GRENADE LAUNCHER FIRED BY RPA. A MILOB TEAM SENT TO THE AREA WAS INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT THE EXPLOSION WAS FOLLOWED 10 MINUTES LATER BY SMALL ARMS FIRE BUT THEY COULD NOT AGREE ON THE EXACT LOCATION. IT WAS NOT POSSIBLE FOR MILOBS TO GO TO A LOCATION INDICATED BY ONE OF THE INFORMANTS BECAUSE OF AN UNCONFIRMED RPA CAMP THERE. THE CAUSE OF THE FIRING IS NOT YET KNOWN BUT ONE LOCAL BELIEVED THE RPA ENGAGED BANDITS WHO WERE ATTEMPTING TO STEAL THREE COWS. MILOBS DID NOT SEE ANY VISIBLE SIGNS OF EXCHANGE OF FIRE. THE AREA OF THE INCIDENT IS EAST OF PANZI REFUGEE CAMP. MILOBS ARE STILL INVESTIGATING.

(B) IN SECTOR 5A INVESTIGATING THE EXPLOSION THAT OCCURRED ON 16 JUL MILOBS REPORTED THAT AN ATTEMPT, USING ABOUT 100 GRS OF UNDETERMINED EXPLOSIVE, WAS MADE TO FELL A POWER PYLON. IN DOING SO A TRANSFORMER WAS COMPLETELY DESTROYED. ONE PERSON WAS TAKEN INTO CUSTODY AND CHARGED WITH HARBOURING THE SABOTEURS.

(C) IN SECTOR 1 MILOB PTL TO GITINDA (GR 5958) REPORTED THAT ON 16 JUL UNKNOWN PEOPLE BURNT A HOUSE. 15 PEOPLE BELIEVED TO BE INTERHAMWE FROM KIBUYE PREFECTURE WERE ARRESTED BY RPA SOLDIERS

AND SENT TO PRISON. LOCAL AUTHORITIES INVESTIGATING THE INCIDENT.

B. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) UNAMIR

(A) FC CONTINUED HIS DUTIES AS FORCE COMMANDER AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION DURING THE ABSENCE OF THE SRSG ON LEAVE. THE SRSG WILL RETURN TO THE MISSION AREA APPROX 5 AUG 95.

(B) FC MET WITH THE GERMAN AMBASSADOR TO COORDINATE THE UPCOMING VISIT OF THE GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER. THE AMBASSADOR ALSO DISCUSSED WITH THE FC HIS CONCERNS OF THE MILITARY THREAT TO RWANDA FROM OUTSIDE.

(C) FC MET WITH UNAMIR POLITICAL LIAISON OFFICER ASSIGNED TO ZAIRE FROM UNAMIR. MR GAYE WILL INITIALLY BE STATIONED IN KINSHASA WHERE HE IS TO BEGIN TASKS OF FIRST HAND OBSERVATION OF THE GENERAL SITUATION IN ZAIRE.

(D) FC VISITED GHANBATT AND MILOBS LOCATED IN KIBUNGO AND GHANBATT 'D' COMPANY LOCATED NEAR RUKIRA. BOTH LOCATIONS WERE WELL ORGANIZED WITH MINIMAL PROBLEMS. PLANS FOR THEIR SCALEDOWN AND REDEPLOYMENT TASKS HAVE BEEN PREPARED. MILOBS ARE MAINTAINING GOOD RELATIONS WITH LOCALS AND RPA. MUGESERA, WEST OF KIBUNGO, HAS ACCESS PROBLEM. MOVEMENT ACROSS IS SOMETIMES ONLY ALLOWED WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE BOURGEMESTRE.

(E) A COPY OF UN RESOLUTION 1005 (95) WAS RECEIVED BY THE FC AND AN INFORMAL DISCUSSION TOOK PLACE WITH SOME AMERICAN MILITARY OFFICIALS AS TO THE NATURE AND AMOUNT OF EQUIPMENT AND EXPLOSIVES THAT WOULD BE EXPECTED FOR USAGE BY THE DEMINING TEAM.

(F) AS FORCE COMMANDER AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION, THE FC HONOURED AN INVITATION FROM THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA AT A RECEPTION MARKING ITS FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF COMING TO POWER.

(G) FC ATTENDED A GARDEN RECEPTION HOSTED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA ON OCCASION OF THEIR FIRST YEAR ANNIVERSARY AS A GOVERNMENT. SECURITY WAS VERY TIGHT. THE PRESIDENT, VICE-PRESIDENT, PRIME MINISTER, MANY MINISTERS AND SOME RPA COMMANDERS AND STAFF WERE IN ATTENDANCE. THE PRIME MINISTER, MR FAUSTIN TWAGIRAMUNGU, GAVE A BRIEF WELCOME TO ALL OFFICIALS ATTENDING. IT WAS THE ONLY PUBLIC ADDRESS DURING THE FUNCTION.

(H) FC HELD A WORKING MEETING WITH RPA COS. RPA COS AGREED TO CONCEPT OF FORMING A WORKING COMMITTEE TO INVESTIGATE THE OPTIONS IN THE COSTING AND USAGE OF THE PRESIDENTIAL HANGAR WHICH IS CURRENTLY OCCUPIED BY UNAMIR'S HELICOPTER FLEET. HE ALSO AGREED TO EXPEDITE THE LONGSTANDING ISSUE OF THE CONTAINERS FROM INDIA FOR THE SIGNAL COMPANY BEING HELD AT CUSTOMS. RPA COS INQUIRED INTO THE POSSIBILITY OF UNAMIR TROOPS PROVIDING TRAINING TO RPA. THE DISCUSSION CONCLUDED THAT INDIVIDUAL COUNTRIES WOULD DECIDE THROUGH A BILATERAL AGREEMENT IF APPROACHED BY RWANDA. UNAMIR PEACEKEEPING SOLDIERS ARE NOT IN A POSITION THAT WOULD ALLOW THEM TO BE INVOLVED IN SUCH TRAINING.

(I) FC ATTENDED RECEPTION AT AMERICAN AMBASSADOR'S RESIDENCE TO MEET US DEMINING TEAM TO DISCUSS ON BILATERAL AGREEMENT WITH RWANDAN GOVERNMENT. ALSO IN ATTENDANCE WERE COL MUHIRE, G3 OF THE RPA AND SAM NKUZI, RWANDAN OFFICIAL AND DIRECTOR OF RWANDATEL. THERE WAS OPPORTUNITY TO DISCUSS SOME SIDE ISSUE REGARDING GOVERNMENT COMMUNICATION GUIDELINES AND THE UPCOMING VISIT ON 22 JUL OF THE US DEPUTY ASSISTANT SECRETARY, MR LEMMON. ALSO SUGGESTED AREAS WHERE PRACTICAL DEMINING TRAINING COULD BE CONDUCTED IN THE MUTUAL COOPERATION AND BENEFIT OF THE UNITED STATES, UNAMIR AND THE RPA.

(J) FC MET WITH THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR AND REPRESENTATIVES OF THE LOIRET REGION IN FRANCE REGARDING THE CONTINUED USE OF A FACILITY IN BUTARE CURRENTLY HOUSING MILOBS AND SENBATT HQ, FORMERLY UNAMIR TAC HQ. THEY VISITED THE BUILDING FACILITY ON SUNDAY 23 JUL TO INSPECT THE GENERAL SITUATION IN BUTARE AND CONDITION OF THE SITE. IT IS ANTICIPATED THAT THE USAGE OF THE SITE BY UNAMIR WILL BE ALLOWED TO CONTINUE UNDER A RENEWED AGREEMENT.

(K) FC MET WITH SECTOR COMMANDERS, DCMO AND SENIOR HQ STAFF FOR FC'S CONFERENCE. IN HIS OPENING REMARKS THE FC REMINDED SECTOR COMMANDERS OF THE DETAILS OF THE NEW MANDATE AND THEIR ROLE. THE NEED FOR PROMPT AND ACCURATE REPORTING AND THOROUGH INVESTIGATIONS WERE EMPHASIZED BY THE FC. BATTALION COMMANDER GAVE AN UPDATE OF TASKS ASSIGNED BY THE FC AT THE LAST CONFERENCE WHICH DEALT WITH THE DOWNSIZING PREPARATIONS OF FORMED TROOPS. THE INCREASED IMPORTANCE IN THE ROLE OF MILITARY OBSERVERS IN THE NEW MANDATE WAS REITERATED. IT WAS FELT BY THE DCMO THAT WITH THE IMPROVEMENT IN COMMUNICATIONS (TELEPHONE AND RADIO) AND INCREASE IN VEHICLES THAT THE MILOBS ARE READY FOR THIS IMPORTANT PHASE OF THE

MISSION.

(2) SECTOR 1 INDBATT/MALICOY.

(A) INDBATT INSTALLED WATER SUPPLY SYSTEM AT 'SISTERS OF CHARITY' ORPHANAGE AT KIBUNGO. THE MEDICAL TEAM OF INDBATT TREATED 18 CHILDREN AND DISTRIBUTED MEDICINES AT THE SAME ORPHANAGE.

(B) INDBATT GUARD AT COMMUNICATION COMPOUND REPORTED SOUND OF SINGLE SHOT HEARD FROM GENERAL DIRECTION OF KIMIHURURA AT 2030 HRS 19 JUL 95.

(C) A TOTAL OF 657 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM GISENY AND BUTARE. 864 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI, KIBUNGO, NGENDA, KANZENZE, GASHORA, BUTARE, BYUMBA AND NYAGATARE.

(D) MALICOY PROVIDED TWO BEDFORD TRUCKS TO TRANSPORT FIREWOOD FROM RUTOBWE (GR 7781) TO CYEZA ORPHANAGE IN THE SAME COMMUNE, FOOD FOR TEACHERS FROM GITARAMA TO TABA COMMUNE AND FIVE TONS OF FOOD FROM GITARAMA TO KIGOMA COMMUNE (GR 7649).

(E) UNIT JAZZ BAND PLAYED FOR THE ORPHANS AT MASAKA ORPHANAGE AT GAHINI RUN BY 21 JUL 95 ON THE OCCASION OF CHILDREN EXPRESSION WEEK CELEBRATIONS.

(3) SECTOR 2 (GHANCOY).

(A) A LOCAL INTERPRETER AT RUKIRA GR 6556 ACCUSED OF GENOCIDE WAS FORMALLY HANDED OVER TO THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

(B) FC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO AOR.

(C) FIRE AT KIBUNGO CATHOLIC ORPHANAGE WAS PUT UNDER CONTROL WITH ASSISTANCE OF GHANBATT TROOPS.

(D) BROWN AND ROOT MOVED CONTAINERS FOR LOADING.

(4) SECTOR 3 (SENBATT/ZAMBATT).

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(B) SENBATT TRANSPORTED FOOD FOR BUTARE TEACHERS AND KIGEMBE TEACHERS.

(5) SECTOR 4 (MALAWICOY). ESCORTED REFUGEES FROM CYANGUGU GR 7624 TO KITABI GR 3520.

(6) SECTOR 5 (NICOY). NICOY HAVE ESTABLISHED A HUMANITARIAN CLINIC OUTSIDE NYUNDO CAMP.

(11) MILOB GP. CONTINUED CO-ORDINATION AND MONITORING MILOB ACTIVITIES.

(A) BORDERS. THE FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED TO TRAFFIC DURING THE PERIOD.

I. GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

II. RUSUMO.

III. REMERA AND AKABUGA.

IV. KANYARU-HAUTE AND KANYARU-BAS.

V. GISENYI AND RUSIZI I AND II BORDER POSTS WERE CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE.

(B). POLITICAL SECTOR 1 COMMANDER WAS INVITED TO A COCKTAIL PARTY HOSTED BY GITARAMA PREFECTURE TO CELEBRATE THE FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF THE CURRENT GOVT. IN ATTENDANCE WERE LOCAL MEMBERS OF THE PARLIAMENT, RPA BRIGADE COMMANDER AND LOCAL CIVIL LEADERS. AFTER SPEECHES FROM THE PREFECT AND THE BRIGADE COMMANDER, THE SECTOR COMMANDER WAS ASKED TO SPEAK AND, AS SPECIFICALLY REQUESTED BY THE MASTER OF CEREMONY, TO "EVALUATE" THE PERFORMANCE OF THE CURRENT GOVERNMENT. THE SECTOR COMMANDER GAVE A "MIDDLE OF THE ROAD SPEECH" WHICH WAS WELL RECEIVED. IN SECTOR 5C, KIBUYE PREFECT HELD A SECURITY MEETING IN THE STADIUM WITH THE RESIDENTS.

(C) IN SECTOR 1A - KIGALI. NSTR.

(D) IN SECTOR 1B GITARAMA.

I. MILOBS CONDUCTED JOINT PATROL WITH CIVPOL TO THE MUGINA COMMUNE (GR 9267). THE BOURGEMESTRE CONFIRMED AN EARLIER REPORT OF THE MURDER OF A MAN BY AN RPA SOLDIER IN AN APPARENT CASE OF SELF DEFENCE. THE BOURGEMESTRE REFUSED TO GIVE ANY FURTHER DETAILS WITH THE REASON THAT IT WAS A PURELY MILITARY CASE. A VISIT TO THE COMMUNE PRISON REVEALED 120 PRISONERS ON CHARGE OF PARTICIPATION IN THE GENOCIDE AND 27 ON OTHER CRIMINAL CHARGES, FEMALE PRISONERS INCLUDED THREE WHO WERE PREGNANT. PRISON WAS CLEAN AND NOT OVERCROWDED.

II. MILOBS PATROLS TO MUSAMBIRA COMMUNE GR 8274 WERE INFORMED BY A PRIEST (FATHER VERDON) THAT ON 7 JUL 95 AN RPA SOLDIER KILLED ONE PERSON AND INJURED TWO OTHERS. HE CLAIMED HE FIRED ACCIDENTALLY. HE WAS SAID

TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED AND TRANSFERRED TO THE KIGALI PRISON. MILOBS ARE TO CONFIRM THIS REPORT. ALSO ON 12 JUL 95 AT 1000 HRS THE DIRECTOR OF THE SECONDARY SCHOOL WAS ARRESTED BY RPA ON SUSPICION OF TAKING PART IN GENOCIDE AND ALSO PROVIDING TRANSPORT TO INTERHAMWE DURING THE WAR. THE PRIEST WAS CONVINCED THAT THE REASON OF THE ARREST WAS DUE TO THE FACT THAT RPA IS OCCUPYING HOUSE OWNED BY VICTIM IN KIGALI.

III. MILOBS PATROL TO MASANGO COMMUNE (GR 254) REPORTED THAT CHILDREN WERE BEING VACCINATED AGAINST VARIOUS DISEASES. 11 BICYCLES AND BLANKETS DONATED BY CRS WERE DISTRIBUTED BY MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION TO ALL SECTORS.

IV. MILOBS VISITED "POLE DE DEVELOPMENT" PROJECT IN BUGORA (GR 9188) WHICH IS BEING RUN BY SPANISH CATHOLIC CHURCH. IT IS COMPOSED OF A PRIMARY SCHOOL, A MEDICAL CENTRE, A CENTRE FOR PLUMBERS, METAL WORKERS AND WELDERS. THE CHIEF COORDINATOR FOR THE PROJECT HAS ASKED UNAMIR ENGINEERS TO HELP IMPROVE THE ROAD BETWEEN THE PROJECT AND THE ROAD TO KIGALI. A MILOB WITH ENGINEER EXPERTISE WILL BE DISPATCHED TO INSPECT THE 13 KM ROAD SEGMENT.

V. PATROL TO THE RUTABO SECTOR (GR 9356) REPORTED SHORTAGES OF SEEDS AND AGRICULTURAL MATERIALS. THE RECENT RETURN OF 20 IDPs FROM GIKONGORO TO THEIR OWN PREVIOUSLY EVACUATED HOMES WAS ALSO REPORTED. 10 FAMILIES RECENTLY RETURNED FROM BURUNDI AND UGANDA WERE REPORTED TO BE LIVING IN VACATED HOUSES.

VI. MILOB TEAM PATROLLED RUTOBWE COMMUNE (GR 7781). FOUR PERSONS WERE ARRESTED LAST MONTH AT GATOVU SECTOR (GR 7579). THEY ARE AT PRESENT IN THE COMMUNE PRISON. THEY WERE ACCUSED OF GENOCIDE.

(E) IN SECTOR 2A - BYUMBA.

I. PATROLS TO THE MUKARANGE COMMUNE (GR 0831) REPORTED AN OUTBREAK OF TUBERCULOSIS AND MALARIA IN THE COMMUNE. LOCAL AUTHORITIES, WITH THE HELP OF TEACHERS AND THE NGO GOAL IRELAND ARE CURRENTLY UNDERTAKING A PROGRAMME TO EDUCATE LOCALS ON PREVENTIVE MEASURES FOR SEVERAL TROPICAL DISEASES.

(F) IN SECTOR 2B - KIBUNGO.

I. MILOBS REPORTED THAT MSF OPENED 1 MEDICAL CENTRE ON 17 JUL 95 AT THE SECTOR OFFICE AT MUSAZA GR 6843. THE CENTRE TREATS ABOUT 50 PATIENTS DAILY AND CONDUCTS VACCINATION FOR CHILDREN AND PREGNANT WOMEN TWICE A MONTH.

II. MILOBS PATROLS OBSERVED 9 WFP TRUCKS LOADED WITH FOOD HEADING TOWARDS KIGALI FROM TANZANIA. KABARONDO HOSPITAL RUN BY AFRICAN HUMANITARIAN ACTION (AHA) COMPLAINED OF SHORTAGE OF DOCTORS AND NURSES. THERE IS INADEQUATE SUPPLY OF WATER AT ZAZA (GR 4859).

(G) IN SECTOR 3A - GIKONGORO.

I. MILOBS PATROLS TO THE RWAMIKO COMMUNE REPORTED AN INCIDENT OF ARMED ROBBERY WHICH OCCURRED IN THE BUKORO SECTOR (GR 4612) ON 8 JUL 95. THREE ARMED, UNIFORMED MEN, SUSPECTED TO BE RPA SOLDIERS, RAIDED THE HOUSE OF A LOCAL AND STOLE 5 COWS AND 2,000 RFR. THE GANG WAS TRACED TO MATAZO MARKET IN BUTARE. THE VICTIM WAS SHOT IN THE LEG DURING THE INCIDENT. LOCALS IN THE VILLAGE PANICKED AS A RESULT OF A GRENADE EXPLOSION DURING THE INCIDENT AND WENT TO HIDE IN THE BUSHE. LOCAL RPA CMD WAS INFORMED ABOUT THE INCIDENT.

II. MILOB TEAM INVESTIGATING REPORTS OF ARRESTS AND ALLEGED FLEEING OF LOCALS FROM RWAMIKO COMMUNE GR 4914 TO BURUNDI, CONFIRMED THAT AS A RESULT OF RPA HARASSMENT INCLUDING AN ALLEGED KILLING OF TWO LOCALS TOWARDS THE END OF JUNE AND ARREST OF SEVEN LOCALS, MANY HAD FLED TO BURUNDI ON 10 JUL 95.

III. ANOTHER TEAM REPORTED THAT AT KIRARO GR 5135 ON 17 JUL 95 AT ABOUT 2000 HRS THREE RPA SOLDIERS WENT TO THE HOUSE OF MR BAROMEZA EZECHIEL, A LOCAL DOCTOR WORKING WITH TROCARE AT KIRARO SECTEUR CLINIC, BEAT UP THE FAMILY AND ROBBED THEM OF 260,000 RW FRs. IT IS REPORTED THAT THE SAME GROUP ATTACKED THE HOUSE ON 21 JUN 95 AND SHOT THE DOCTOR IN THE LEG. HE IS STILL RECEIVING TREATMENT.

IV. MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON 17 JUL 95 BETWEEN 2200 HRS AND 2300 HRS, A GROUP OF

FOUR ARMED BANDITS, ONE WITH AN RPA UNIFORM, BROKE INTO THE PREMISES OF THE SECTOR LEADER OF BUHORO AND STOLE 13 COWS. THE RPA PURSUED AND ARRESTED THE BANDITS. 12 OF THE COWS WERE RECOVERED.

V. PATROL TO THE KIVU COMMUNE (GR 4210) REPORTED THAT THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES WERE PREPARING A LIST OF FORMER RESIDENTS OF THE COMMUNE WHO HAD STILL NOT RETURNED SINCE THE WAR. HE ADDED THAT THE RETURNEES IN THE SECTOR WERE RECLAIMING THEIR PROPERTY FROM THE LOCALS.

(H) IN SECTOR 3B - BUTARE. PATROL TO THE KABILIZI TRANSIT CAMP REPORTED THE PRESENCE OF ABOUT 450 PERSONS INCLUDING CHILDREN IN THE CAMP. THE RETURNEES ARE REPORTED TO BE WITHOUT FOOD AND WATER. MILOBS ASSESS THAT AN IMMEDIATE SUPPLY OF FOOD AND WATER IS REQUIRED TO PREVENT DEATH FROM STARVATION ESPECIALLY AMONG THE CHILDREN. MILOBS FURTHER RECOMMENDED THAT THE MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION SHOULD BE INFORMED TO EXPEDITE ACTION TO MOVE THE RETURNEES TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

(I) IN SECTOR 4 - CYANGUGU.

I. ON 19 JUL AT 1107 HRS AN AIRCRAFT IDENTIFIED AS A BN 2 ISLANDER WAS OBSERVED WEST OF KAMEMBE COMMUNE ALONG THE RWANDA ZAIRE BORDER FLYING NORTH TO SOUTH. AT 1330 HRS ANOTHER AIRCRAFT BELIEVED TO BE A BN 2 ISLANDER WAS OBSERVED OVER KIRAMBO COMMUNE FLYING DIRECTLY NORTH TO SOUTH.

II. MILOBS REPORTED THAT IN THE CYANGUGU COMMUNE, UNARMED WATCH GROUPS BEGAN PATROLS ON 17 JUL 95. THE PATROLS ARE CO-ORDINATED BY RPA. THE CYANGUGU BOURGEMESTRE ALLEGED THAT MILITIA FROM ZAIRE ARE INFILTRATING CYANGUGU COMMUNE.

III. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN THE AOR. A TOTAL OF 110 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT THE NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP FROM 19 TO 20 JUL 95.

(J) IN SECTOR 5A - RUHENGARI.

I. MILOBS CONDUCTED HELI PATROLS TO THE MEMISA CLINIC AT MURUNDA (GR 6489) ON THE BOUNDARY BETWEEN SECTORS 5B AND 5C. IT WAS REPORTED TO BE SOME ETHNIC TENSION IN THE AREA. MILOBS CONTINUE TO CONDUCT INTENSIVE

PATROLS IN THE AREA.

II. PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED TO THE EDGE OF THE GWISHATI FOREST. THERE WAS A NEW SETTLEMENT OF ABOUT 40-50 FAMILIES AT (GR 3709). THE SITUATION WAS HOWEVER NORMAL IN ALL AREAS PATROLLED.

(K) IN SECTOR 5B - GISENYI.

I. MILOBS CONDUCTED HELI PATROL ALONG SHORES OF THE LAKE KIVU TO DETERMINE THE ORIGIN OF THE 3 BODIES WASHED ASHORE ON 16/17 JUL 95. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT WAS OBSERVED.

II. ONE MILOB TEAM WAS TASKED TO RECCE NEWLY PROPOSED ROUTES: GISENYI-KORA (GR 3821)-KORA (GR 3821)-RUKARE (GR 3625)-MUTOVU (GR 2929) AND TO ASSESS SECURITY SITUATION. THE ROAD WAS ROCKY AND INCIDENTS OF THEFTS OF CATTLE, GOATS AND PERSONAL ITEMS BY SUSPECTED BANDITS FROM ZAIRE WERE REPORTED.

(L) IN SECTOR 5C - KIBUYE.

I. MILOBS PATROLLED THE RUTSIRO COMMUNE TO INVESTIGATE THE REFUGEES SITUATION. A REP OF THE SOCIAL REHABILITATION MINISTRY INFORMED THE PATROL ABOUT THE INCREASING RATE OF RETURN OF REFUGEES OF THE 1959/60 CASELOAD. A TOTAL OF 1284 REFUGEES HAD SO FAR BEEN REGISTERED OUT OF WHICH 466 HAD BEEN RESETTLED IN BWIZA (GR 3794). FOOD AND WARM CLOTHING WERE HOWEVER REPORTED TO BE IN SHORT SUPPLY. A MEDICAL CENTRE FOR THE AREA IS ALSO REQUIRED. HAC INFORMED.

II. TWO OFFICIALS FROM SRSG'S OFFICE VISITED THE SECTOR. THEY VISITED GISHYATA COMMUNE ON A FAMILIARIZATION TOUR. THEY ACCOMPANIED MILOBS TO MPEMBE SECTOR (GR1766) TO SEE THE BOUNDARY AND HOW LOCALS ARE SETTLED.

III. THE SEMINAR CONDUCTED BY HUMAN RIGHTS ON LEGAL EDUCATION AND ORIENTATION OF BURGEMESTRES AND PREFECTS WAS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN A SUCCESS.

IV. PATROL TO MUFOMBEZI (GR 3773) IN THE MABANZA COMMUNE WAS INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT PEOPLE FROM ZAIRE OFTEN COME ACROSS THE BORDER TO VISIT THEIR RELATIVES AND TO ASK FOR FOOD.

(8) FORCE ENGR COY.

(A) DEPLOYED ONE EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER AND THREE DUMP TRUCKS FOR CONVEYING LATERITE FROM NYANZA SITE TO TRANSIT CAMP ANNEX.

(B) CONSTRUCTION SUPERVISORS CONTINUED TO SUPERVISE CONSTRUCTION WORK AT SHAGASHA.

(C) CONTINUED TO EMPLOY EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER FOR CREATING SANITARY AND DRAINAGE FACILITIES IN TRANSIT CAMP ANNEX.

(D) CARRIED OUT RECCE FOR CONSTRUCTION AT GIKONGORO.

(E) COMMENCED REPAIR OF ABLUTION UNITS FOR BMS AT GIKONGORO.

(9) AUSMED

(A) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE MEDICAL SUPPORT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MEDICAL SUPPORT TO CITIZENS OF RWANDA.

(B) TREATED A TOTAL OF 298 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 22 DENTAL PATIENTS DURING THE PERIOD. CHK IS CURRENTLY HOLDING 4 IN-PATIENTS.

(C) RIFLE COY PROVIDED SECURITY AT THE MIL BKS AND CHK.

(10) AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS WERE IN OPERATION AT THE AIRPORT. A TOTAL OF 103 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.

(11) UN MP COY

(A) INVESTIGATED 14 TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS INVOLVING UNAMIR VEHICLES. NO INJURIES WERE RECORDED. FOUR CASES OF RADIO ANTENNA THEFT WERE ALSO RECORDED.

(B) MP COY MEDAL PARADE TOOK PLACE ON 17 JUL 95 PRESIDED OVER BY THE FC.

(C) BOTH KIGALI AND BUTARE DET CONTINUED TO PROVIDE PREVENTIVE MOBILE POLICING PATROLS.

(12) 95 FLSG.

(A) CONTINUED TO GIVE GENERAL SUPPORT TO UNAMIR, THE CONTINGENTS AND THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(B) ABLUTION CONTAINERS WERE DELIVERED TO CYANGUGU, AND A WATER BLADDER WAS LAID IN THIS PLACE.

(C) TRANSPORTED EXPLOSIVES FOR US EMBASSY.

(D) PAX WERE MOVED FROM TRANSIT CAMP TO KIA.

(E) THE FM STATION IN BYUMBA WAS MOVED TO MILOB SECTOR HQ.

(F) A WATER BLADDER WAS PLACED IN SECTOR 5, NYUNDO.

(G) A RECCE WAS DONE OF ALL MILOB LOCS TO PREPARE THEIR LOG RESUPPLY PLANS.

4. UNCIVPOL UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ CONTINUED CO-ORDINATION AND MONITORING ACTIVITIES OF CIVPOL OBSERVERS IN SECTORS.

A. MEDICAL. FORCE MEDICAL STAFF INCLUDING CONTINGENTS TREATED 1,485 LOCALS DURING THE WEEK THROUGHOUT RWANDA BY PROVIDING PRIMARY HEALTHCARE.

B. TRANSPORTATION. UNAMIR PROVIDED TRANSPORT ASSISTANCE FOR THE FOLLOWING:

10. CONCLUSION. THE SECURITY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUED TO IMPROVE DURING THE WEEK. EXCEPT SECTOR 4 WHERE INCIDENTS OF AIR VIOLATION AND BANDITRY CONTINUED, ALL SECTORS WERE CALM. THE DOWNSIZING OF THE FORCE CONTINUED WITH THE DEPARTURE FROM THE MISSION OF THE WHOLE ETHIOPIAN BATTALION.

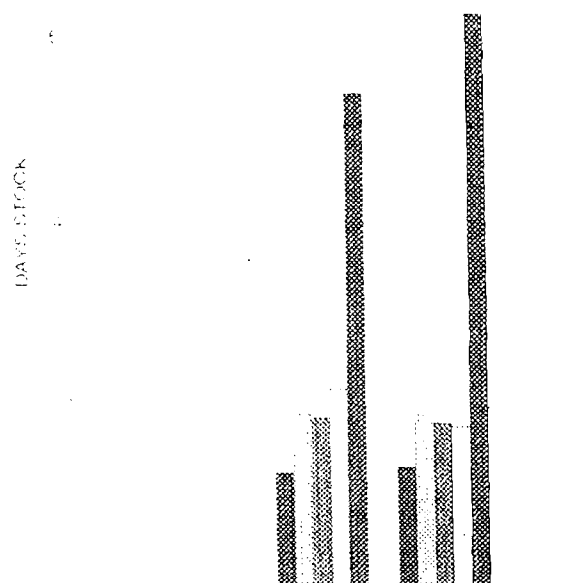

ALDO AJELLO, ARRIVED KIGALI TODAY FOLLOWING AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO BURUNDI AND ZAIRE WHERE HE HELD CONSULTATIONS WITH SENIOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS ON THE DEPLOYMENT OF UN MILITARY OBSERVERS TO MONITOR THE ARMS EMBARGO IMPOSED ON RWANDA BY THE UN SECURITY COUNCIL.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT AT A SECURITY MEETING HELD ON 23 JUN 95 BY THE PREFECT OF CYANGUGU, THE GENERAL SECURITY SITUATION IN THE REGION WAS DEEMED TO BE GOOD DESPITE THE LOCAL POPULATION'S PROVISION OF SHELTER TO INTERAHAMWE MILITIA ELEMENTS INFILTRATING FROM ZAIRE. THE PARTICIPANTS REPORTEDLY DECIDED TO IMPOSE A NIGHT CURFEW ON THE REGION FROM 1900 TO 0500 HRS AND ALSO COMPLAINED ABOUT ZAIRE'S CLOSURE OF ITS BORDER WITH RWANDA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS WHICH PREVENTED RWANDESE NATIONALS FROM CROSSING OVER INTO THE ZAIREAN TOWN OF BUKAVU.

THESE VISITORS TOLD THE LOCALS TO RUN TO ETHIOBATT PLATOON LOCATION SHOULD THERE BE AN ATTACK BY THE FRGF COMING FROM ZAIRE. THE OPERATION OFFICER REMINDED THEM THAT AN "AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL" REPORT DATED 13 JUNE 95, CITED COL THEONESTE BAGASORA, FORMER LEADER OF "INTERAHAMWE", THAT A "DESTABILISATION INSURGENCY CAMPAIGN AND A SMALL SCALE INCURSION INTO RWANDA WAS BEING PLANNED FOR MID-JULY". 19 JUL 95, WOULD BE THE FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF THE RPF VICTORY.

RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF INTERIOR AND COMMUNAL DEVELOPMENT, MR SETH SENDASHONGA, ORDERED THE SUSPENSION OF THE DISTRIBUTION OF RESIDENCE PERMITS TO THE RESIDENTS OF KIGALI. A COMMUNIQUE READ ON RADIO RWANDA STATED THAT THIS INITIATIVE OF THE PREFECT OF KIGALI WAS A VIOLATION OF THE ARUSHA PEACE ACCORDS, AND THAT THE DISTRIBUTION OF TWO DIFFERENT TYPES OF RESIDENCE PERMITS TO OLD CASELOAD RETURNEES AND SURVIVORS OF THE GENOCIDE GAVE RISE TO A CLIMATE OF INSECURITY AND FEAR.

C. RADIO RWANDA ALSO REPORTED THAT THE FORMER PRESIDENT OF TANZANIA, H.E. MR JULIUS NYERERE, IN A PUBLIC SPEECH DELIVERED YESTERDAY DURING THE COURSE OF HIS VISIT TO RWANDA, QUESTIONED THE UN SECURITY COUNCIL'S INACTION IN APPREHENDING SUSPECTED PLANNERS OF RECENT GENOCIDE IN RWANDA. HE REPORTEDLY FURTHER ADDED THAT RWANDA WAS NOT YET PREPARED FOR THE INTRODUCTION OF A MULTI-PARTY SYSTEM OF GOVERNMENT, AND THAT INSTEAD OF FOSTERING NATIONAL UNITY SUCH PLURALISM WOULD SOW DIVISIONS AND RESULT IN "MACHETE DEMOCRACY".

D. SPEAKING AT A HUMAN RIGHTS SEMINAR YESTERDAY IN KIGALI, THE RWANDESE MINISTER OF INFORMATION, MR JEAN-BAPTISTE NKURIYINGOMA, CRITICISED INSTANCES OF DISTORTED REPORTING ON RADIO RWANDA AND IN THE MEDIA WHICH MINIMISED INCIDENTS OF VIOLENCE AND IGNORED HUMAN RIGHTS ABUSES, SUCH AS THE ILLEGAL SEIZURE OF PROPERTY, HE ADDED THAT THE GOVERNMENT'S SEIZURE OF CERTAIN NEWSPAPER EDITIONS HAD BEEN UNDERTAKEN DUE TO THE INABILITY OF RWANDESE COURTS TO FUNCTION PROPERLY AND CONTROL JOURNALISTIC ABUSES, AND ALSO TO PREVENT JOURNALISTS FROM REPEATING MISTAKES OF THE PAST.

(1) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT UNKNOWN BANDITS DRESSED IN CIVILIAN INJURED ONE LOCAL AND ROBBED HOUSEHOLD ITEMS AROUND NDEBTARE AT ABOUT 1900 HRS ON 20 JUN 95. THE INJURED PERSON IS A HUTU. HE HAS SOUGHT REFUGE AT THE MILOBS LOC.

(2) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT UNKNOWN ARMED ELEMENTS STOLE TWO COWS. THESE BANDITS CAME FROM ZAIRE.

(3) ICRC TODAY DISTRIBUTED FOOD TO LOCALS IN MUBUGA SECTOR.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED 09 LOCALS IN AOR.

THE DISPENSARY IN MUYUNZWE IS IN NEED OF BEDS AND APPEALING TO UNAMIR TO PROVIDE ABOUT 20 BEDS. THERE IS ALSO A PRIVATE SECONDARY SCHOOL WHICH HAS 132 STUDENTS HOUSED IN 8 CLASSES. THE DIRECTOR OF THE SCHOOL INFORMED MILOBS THAT THEY LACK SPORTING, TEACHING AIDS AND ELECTRICITY AND HE WAS SEEKING ASSISTANCE FROM UNAMIR. HE ALSO MENTIONED THAT THERE WERE 38 ORPHAN STUDENTS WHOM THE GOVERNMENT HAD PROMISED TO MEET THEIR SCHOOL EXPENSES BUT UP TO NOW THERE WAS NOTHING DONE.

(D) A JOINT HUMAN RIGHTS/MILOB TEAM WENT TO RUHANGO COMMUNE GR 7653 AND REPORTED THAT MR. ELIAS MBARUBUKEYE, 58 YEARS OLD, WAS ARRESTED AND SENT TO GITARAMA PRISON. IT IS BELIEVED THAT HIS SON WHO IS STUDYING IN USA ADDRESSED A PRESS CONFERENCE IN USA AND MADE SOME STATEMENTS THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA IS VIOLATING HUMAN RIGHTS. THE TEAM ALSO WENT TO MUKINDO CELLULE GR 8551 AND NYARURAMA SECTOR GR 8751 AND REPORTED THAT THE SCHOOL IN THE AREA WAS IN NEED OF TEACHING MATERIALS AND UNICEF WHO HAD PROMISED TO HELP ARE STILL BEING AWAITED.

(E) THE SUB SECTOR CDR HELD A MEETING WITH THE PREFECT, RPA BN CDR, SECURITY OFFICER AND THE HEAD OF LOCAL GENDARMERIE REGARDING THE STOLEN VEHICLE. THE FOLLOWING MEASURES WERE INSTITUTED:

I. RPA PATROLS IN THE CITY OF KIBUYE WILL BE INCREASED AND REINFORCED.

II. RPA CHECK POSTS IN THE PREFECTURE WILL BE INCREASED AND REINFORCED.

III. ALL NGOS AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL WILL LIMIT THEIR MOVEMENTS PAST MIDNIGHT TO ONLY THOSE FOR REASONS OF DUTY.

AT KABILIZI SECTOR 765 PEOPLE MOSTLY TUTSI WERE STILL AWAITING TRANSPORT TO THEIR COMMUNES OF GIKONGORO PREFECTURE. THEY COMPLAINED OF LACK OF FOOD, BLANKETS AND COOKING UTENSILS. AT RUHASHYA GR 7026 THE BOURGEMASTER COMPLAINED OF LACK OF CLEAN DRINKING WATER DUE TO A BROKEN WATER PUMP AND SAID THEY REQUIRED TOOLS AND SEEDS.

RPA THEN ATTACKED THE HOUSEHOLD AND KILLED ALL SIX PERSONS RESIDING IN THAT HOUSE. IN ADDITION THE LOCALS REPORTED THAT INFILTRATORS HAVE BEEN CROSSING REGULARLY AND STEALING LIVESTOCK. THE CELLULE HAS REQUESTED THE RPA TO ESTABLISH A POST IN THAT AREA.

D. IN RUHENGERI, CIVPOL MONITORS VISITED BUTARE COMMUNE ON

19 JUN 95 AND WAS INFORMED BY THE BOURGMESTRE THAT 80 FAMILIES OF RETURNEES FROM THE YEAR 59/60 WERE HAVING ACCOMMODATION PROBLEMS. THE BOURGMESTRE FURTHER DISCLOSED THAT THE FAMILIES MAY BE RESETTLED IN KAYANGE COMMUNE.

E. IN GISENYI, CIVPOL MONITORS REPORTED THAT RUMOURS FROM LOCALS INDICATE THAT THERE HAVE BEEN A REINFORCEMENT OF MILITARY TRAINING OF THE FORMER RWANDESE TROOPS IN THE ZAIRE CAMPS. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

F. THE TEAM ALSO REPORTED THAT IT HELD A MEETING WITH GISENYI GENDARMERIE BRIGADE COMMANDER ON 19 JUN 95. THE MEETING CENTRED ON SECURITY SITUATION IN THE PREFECTURE.

G. THEY FURTHER REPORTED THAT ON 19 JUN 95 AT KIRAGA SECTOR IN NYAMYUMBA COMMUNE A PREGNANT LOCAL WAS KILLED BY TWO LOCALS. THE PERPETRATORS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA AND HANDED OVER TO GISENYI GENDARMERIE BRIGADE. CIVPOL MONITORS ARE ASSISTING IN THE INVESTIGATION.

H. THE GRADUATED UNAMIR TRAINED GENDARMES AT RUHENGARI NATIONAL TRAINING SCHOOL ARE NOW AWAITING DEPLOYMENT. ALSO PREPARATION OF HANDOUT IN ENGLISH LESSONS IS IN PROGRESS. IN THE SAME VEIN, THE TEACHING DOCUMENTS FOR THE TAKE OFF OF THE COMMUNAL POLICE IS IN THE PIPELINE.

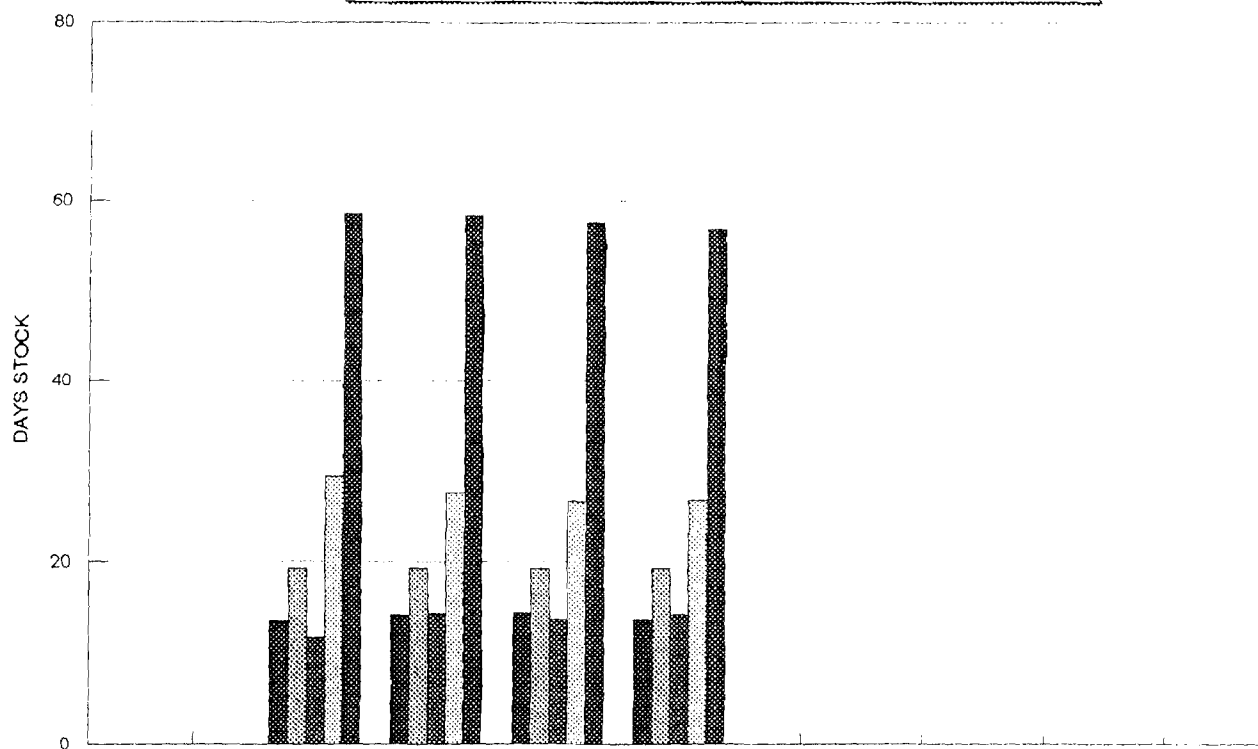
