1. UNAMIR has been directed to implement the manifesting of passengers that travel in UNAMIR helicopters. Enclosed is a revised AIR TASK REQUEST FORM, UNAMIR HELICOPTER PROGRAMME AND UNAMIR HELICOPTER PASSENGER LIST.

2. The following AIR TASK points will be discussed at UNAMIR OPS Officer meeting on 18 Apr 95:

a. The revised AIR TASK FORM should be submitted 48 hours or more in advance of the requested helicopter tasking. Late submissions risk not being actioned when requested.

b. By 1200 hours the day before the flight, AIR TASKS should be consolidate into the UNAMIR HELICOPTER PROGRAMME. Changes to your requested tasking may be required to assist other users of the helicopters.

c. By 1800 hours, sector Ops Os should receive by fax, a copy of the UNAMIR HELICOPTER and PASSENGER programmes.

d. After 1700 hrs daily, UNAMIR (ext 11150) and MILOB (11060) duty officers may be contacted to confirm latest changes.

e. New passengers are either to phone AIR OPS (ext 11161) or appropriate duty officers. Passengers not manifested will not be picked up by the helicopter.

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UNAMIR INFOSUM FOR 01 APR 95

1. OVERVIEW. FRGF/MILITIA ACTIVITY ON THE INCREASE IN SECTORS 4C AND 5 FURTHER AGGRAVATING THE SECURITY SITUATION IN BOTH SECTORS.

2. RPA

A. IN SECTOR 4A, MILOBS OBSERVED APPROXIMATELY A PLATOON STRENGTH OF RPA MOVING FROM NDAGO GR 520023 TO MUNINI GR 4899. THEY WERE CARRYING THEIR PERSONAL WEAPONS, MORTARS AND RPGS. THE SAME GROUP WAS SEEN AT NYARURE GR 5195, PROCEEDING TO NYAKIZU COMMUNE GR 5796.

B. MILOBS IN SECTOR 4B REPORTED HAVING OBSERVED A COMPANY STRENGTH OF RPA SOLDIERS MOVING TOWARDS SAVE GR 7419.

C. IN SECTOR 4C, MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA WERE SUSPECTED IN THE MURDER OF AN EMPLOYEE OF NUNS IN THE AREA OF MURWA GR 9741 (NYAMASHEKE) AT APPROXIMATELY 1930 HRS ON 31 MAR 95. THE RPA HAD SPOKEN TO THE VICTIM AN HOUR EARLIER BEFORE HE WAS MURDERED. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT, RPA LAST NIGHT ENGAGED THREE BOATS AT ISHARA PENINSULA AT 2400 HRS. THE OCCUPANTS RETURNED FIRE AND RETREATED. STILL IN THE SAME SECTOR, THE RPA ARRESTED A LOCAL FOR REPORTING A ROBBERY WHICH NEVER TOOK PLACE. THE RPA CLAIMED THEY HAD INFO THAT THE LOCAL'S SON WAS AMONG A GANG OF ROBBERS OPERATING IN THE AREA.

D. IN SECTOR 4C ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA KILLED A LOCAL AT MURAINA GR 1546. AN F1 GREN WAS FOUND AT THE SITE OF THE KILLING. RPA HAVE DENIED INVOLVEMENT. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

E. IN SECTOR 6, 95 FLSC REPORTED THAT TWO OF THEIR PERS WERE STOPPED BY AN RPA SOLDIER WHO ACCUSED THEM OF TRAVELLING THE WRONG WAY ON A "ONE WAY STREET" AT THE TIME, VARIOUS OTHER VEHs WERE TRAVELLING IN BOTH DIRECTIONS AND THERE WERE NO MARKINGS INDICATING THAT IT WAS A ONE WAY STREET. THE TWO CANADIAN SOLDIERS WERE ORDERED TO FOLLOW THE RPA VEH AND PAY A FINE OF \$50.00 OR 10,000 RWANDAN FRANCS OR GIVE UP THEIR VEH. THE RPA ACCEPTED \$40.00 IN EXCHANGE FOR THE RELEASE OF THE VEH.

G. IN SECTOR 6, INDBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAS INTENSIFIED FOOT AND VEHICLE PATROLS IN KIGALI CITY. THE NUMBER OF CHECK POINTS HAVE ALSO BEEN INCREASED.

3. FRGF. IN SECTOR 4C, AT 2330 HRS ON 31 MAR 95, A GROUP OF

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BANDITS, SOME DRESSED IN COMPLETE MILITARY ATTIRE, ENGAGED RPA PATROL AT GASHARO GR 9838 ALONG NYAMASHEKE ROAD. ONE RPA SOLDIER WAS INJURED DURING THE ATTACK. THE SAME GROUP IS BELIEVED TO HAVE CARRIED OUT ROBBERIES THAT NIGHT IN THE AREA. IN A SEPARATE INCIDENT, ANOTHER GROUP OF BANDITS RAIDED KAGARAMA GR 9633 AND SHOT DEAD ONE MAN WHEN VILLAGERS ATTEMPTED ALERTING RPA AND UNAMIR BY BEATING THEIR DRUMS. THE GROUP CONTINUED WITH THE ROBBERY AND ESCAPED.

4. MILITIA/BANDITRY. SEE FRGF.

6. REGIONAL. NTR.

6. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.

A. SECTOR 1.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) REPORTED A TRAFFIC ACCIDENT INVOLVING UNAMIR 4614 WHICH HIT A LOCAL WOMAN IN BYUMBA. THE VICTIM SUSTAINED A CUT ON THE HEAD AND MINOR BRUISES. SHE IS CONSCIOUS AND RESPONDING TO TREATMENT IN NIBATT MED CENTRE.

(3) 1,513 DPs ENTERED RWANDA THROUGH KAGITUMBA BORDER ON 01 APR 95.

(4) MED STAFF TREATED 31 LOCALS AT MED CENTRE.

C. SECTOR 2.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) GHANBATT PTLs TO KANZENZE COMMUNES GR 1564 REPORTED THAT LOCALS WERE BEING HARASSED ON THEIR FARMS BY UNIDENTIFIED UNIFORMED PERSONS. GHANBATT HAS INTENSIFIED PTLs IN MENTIONED AREA.

(3) 171 IDPs FROM GIKONGORO ARRIVED AT NGENDA COMMUNE. THEY WERE REGISTERED AND CONVEYED TO THEIR VARIOUS HOMES IN GHANBATT VEHs.

(4) 16 DPs ENTERED RWANDA THROUGH RUSUMO BORDER ON 31 MAR 95.

(5) MILOBS PATROLS TO IDAGAZA GR 5739 WERE DENIED ACCESS BY THE RPA THROUGH THEIR CHECK-POINT. MILOBS HOWEVER USED AN ALTERNATE ROUTE. SITUATION IN AREA WAS REPORTED CALM.

D. SECTOR 3 (KIBUYE AND GITARAMA)

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(1) THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR CONTINUED TO BE TENSE.

(2) THE MED ASSISTANT OF HANIKA CLINIC AT RUVUMBU INFORMED PTLs THAT REFUGEES WERE COMING TO THE AREA IN SMALL NUMBERS ESPECIALLY AT NIGHT BECAUSE MOVEMENT ACROSS THE LAKE WAS DIFFICULT.

(3) ICRC DISTRIBUTED RELIEF FOOD ITEMS TO LOCALS IN RWAMATAMU.

(4) MALAWICOY MED STAFF TREATED 49 LOCALS AT MED CENTRE AND TRANSPORTED ONE PATIENT FROM MUGUNGA TO KIBUYE HOSP.

(5) MILOBS PATROLLED RUNDA COMMUNE GR 5882 AND WERE INFORMED BY THE BOURGMESTRE THAT EFFORTS TO RETRIEVE ARMS ISSUED TO THE PUBLIC BY THE FORMER GOVERNMENT YIELDED 150 ASSORTED FIREARMS. HE BELIEVED THERE WERE MANY MORE OTHERS AND HAD A LIST OF SUSPECTS. THE PATROL CONTINUED TO MUGINA COMMUNE GR 9267 AND WAS INFORMED THAT THOSE ARRESTED ARE NORMALLY BEATEN TO NEAR DEATH BEFORE BEING SENT TO GITARAMA PRISON. MILOBS WILL INFO HUMAN RIGHTS TO INVESTIGATE.

(6) SECTOR MILOBS ALSO WENT TO MASANGO GR 6254 AND MURAMA GR 6749 COMMUNES TO INVESTIGATE REPORTS OF FRESH MASS GRAVES. NO EVIDENCE WAS FOUND. THEY WERE HOWEVER INFORMED OF NUMEROUS ARRESTS IN THE AREA. A PATROL TO RUCURA GR 3653 REPORTED THAT THERE WAS DISPUTE AMONG RETURNEES OVER LAND AND CATTLE IN THE AREA.

(7) A MILOB TEAM ACCOMPANIED TECHNICIANS TO MOUNT KARONGI TO REPAIR THE CHANNEL 13 REPEATER.

(8) THE SECTOR COMMANDER AND OPS OFFICER RECEIVED A SURPRISE VISIT FROM THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA WHO WISHED TO DISCUSS SOME HUMANITARIAN ISSUES.

E SECTOR 4A.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) ZAMBATT PROVIDED SY TO SDA CHURCH DURING BAPTISMAL SESSION IN KIBEHO.

(3) RURAMBA CHECK POINT RECORDED 50 IDPs FROM BUHORO DPC PROCEEDING TO KIBEHO AND 20 IDPs FROM RWAMIKO HAVE MOVED TO KIBEHO DPC.

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(4) ON 31 MAR 95, 370 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT KAMANA DPC FROM BURUNDI AND 20 IDPs WHO HAD EARLIER LEFT KAMANA DPC FOR THEIR HOME COMMUNES HAVE RETURNED TO THE CAMP.

(5) ZAMBATT MED STAFF TREATED 93 LOCALS IN AOR.

(6) MILOBS PATROLS TO DPCs ALSO OBSERVED THAT THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE RETURNING TO THE CAMPS HAD BEEN INCREASING DAILY. AT KIBHO, MOST OF THE RETURNEES WERE FROM BUTARE GR 7111, NYAMINYINA GR 4523 AND RWAMIKO GR 4914. SOME DPS FROM MUNINI WERE REPORTED TO HAVE MOVED TO NDAGO DP CAMP.

(7) MILOBS PATROLS TO KAMANA GR 5196, WERE INFORMED BY THE KAMANA CAMP CHIEF THAT 370 PERSONS HAVE ARRIVED IN THE CAMP FROM BURUNDI DUE TO THE DETERIORATING SITUATION IN THAT COUNTRY. HE ALSO INFORMED THE PTL THAT ABOUT 25 FAMILIES EVACUATED FROM THE CAMP DURING OP RETOUR, HAD RETURNED DUE TO INTIMIDATION BY THE RPA.

F. SECTOR 4B.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) TRANSPORTED RATIONS FOR RPA FROM KIGALI TO BUTARE AND CARRIED OUT MAINTENANCE ON THEIR VEH.

G. SECTOR 4C

(1) THE SITUATION IN THE SECTOR IS FAST DETERIORATING WITH SEVERAL REPORTS OF SHOOTING, MURDER, ROBBERY AND MINE EXPLOSIONS OVER THE PAST 24 HRS. THE LOCAL POPULATION AND NGOS ARE TENSE. RUMOURS OF SUBVERSIVE ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTOR ARE FAST GAINING GROUND WITH NGOS AND MILOBS. THE ADDITION OF THE USE OF MINES IS A GREAT SOURCE OF WORRY AND NGOS ARE CURTAILING THEIR ACTIVITIES IN REMOTE AREAS UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE.

(2) COMBAT ENGINEERS DETECTED TWO ANTI-PERS MINES AT MBILIZI GR 8116. ONE OF THESE WAS FOUND AT SAME PLACE WHERE AN MDM VEH WAS INVOLVED IN AN ACCIDENT ON 31 MAR 95.

H. SECTOR 5

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) A LOCAL FROM KANAMA COMMUNE GR 2812 REPORTED TO TUNBATT COY IN NYUNDO GR 2411 THAT HIS BROTHER WAS

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KILLED ON 31 MAR 95 BY UNKNOWN PERSONS. CIVPOL AND HR INFORMED.

(3) TUNBATT MED STAFF TREATED 125 LOCALS IN AOR .

(4) A JOINT MILOB/HUMAN RIGHTS/TEAM WITNESSED MEETINGS OF LOCALS WITH THEIR BOURGMESTRES IN GASEKE GR 5004 AND KARAGO GR 4516 COMMUNES. THE AIM OF THE MEETINGS WAS TO REASSURE THE POPULATION THAT THERE WOULD NOT BE A RE-EMERGENCE OF MASS KILLINGS ON THE EVE OF 07 APR 95, BUT RATHER THE DAY HAS BEEN DECLARED BY THE GOVERNMENT AS A NATIONAL MOURNING DAY.

(5) MILOBS CONTINUED MONITORING UNHCR PILOT PROGRAMME ON RESETTLEMENT OF 59/60 RETURNEES FROM GISENYI TRANSIT CAMP, IN MUTARA GR 3223 AND RWERERE GR 2722 COMMUNES. THE MOVEMENT OF RETURNEES IS SCHEDULE TO COMMENCE ON 03 APR 95.

(6) RPA WERE OBSERVED BY MILOBS, CONDUCTING PATROLS ALONG LAKE KIVU AND AERODROME IN GISENYI.

I. SECTOR 6

(1) CONDUCTED PATROLS AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) ONE SHOT WAS HEARD NEAR UN SERVICE STATION LOCATION AT 1900 HRS ON 31 MAR 95. IT IS LIKELY THE SHOT WAS FIRED IN THE AIR.

(3) INFO RECEIVED FROM LOCALS INDICATES THAT THE GOVERNMENT PROPOSES TO CARRY OUT THE FOLLOWING:

(A) PUBLIC ADDRESSES WITH EFFECT FROM 03 APR 95.

(B) REBURIAL CEREMONY NEAR HOTEL ROBERO HORIZON ON 07 APR 95.

(C) OFFICES WILL BE CLOSED IN THE AFTERNOONS FROM 07 - 14 APR 95 TO ALLOW THE LOCAL POPULATION TO ATTEND PUBLIC MEETINGS AND ADDRESSES DURING THE PERIOD.

(D) POSSIBLY ERECT A MEMORIAL/MONUMENT AS A MARK OF REMEMBRANCE AT TRAFFIC ROUNDEL AT GR 068854 (KIGALI CITY MAP) AND POSSIBLY AT TRAFFIC ROUNDEL NEAR PARLIAMENT HOUSE.

(4) MILOBS CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PATROLS IN GIKOMERO.

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KACYIRU AND BUTAMWA COMMUNES. IN GIKOMERO COMMUNE, PATROL WAS INFORMED OF THE EXISTENCE OF A PRISON IN THE AREA, WHERE INMATES WERE DENIED ANY VISITS. PATROL COULD NOT LOCATE ANY PRISON BUT BELIEVE THERE IS ONE. FURTHER PATROLS WILL BE CARRIED OUT TO CONFIRM. SITUATION IN AREAS PATROLLED WAS CALM.

J. FORCE ENGR COY. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE ENGR SP TO UNAMIR.

K. AUSMED.

(2) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN KAZENZE, NGENDA AND GASHORA COMMUNES. ANOTHER PATROL WENT TO RUNDU ( GR 2475 ) AND WAS AGAIN DENIED PASSAGE BEYOND RUNDU BY THE RPA. A MEETING HAS BEEN PLANNED WITH THE RPA BN COMMANDER IN KIBUNGO ON 10 FEB TO RESOLVE THE ISSUE.

(3) MILOBS ALSO ACCOMPANIED HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM TO MUHAZI ( GR 4590 ) TO INVESTIGATE THE KILLING OF A WOMAN AND HER TWO CHILDREN BUT COULD NOT FIND THE BOURGEMESTRE.

(3) MILOBS ALSO PATROLLED REMERA BP, AKABUGA, GISORORA ( GR 4991 ) AND KIRARANGOMBE ( GR 4789 ) AS PART OF OP RUBY.

f. SECTOR 4B - KIBUYE

(1) THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(2) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS TO KARAMBO ( GR 1860 ) TO MONITOR THE LOCAL SITUATION THERE. MILOBS WERE INFORMED THERE HAD NOT BEEN ANY FURTHER INCURSIONS IN THE AREA AFTER THE 25 JAN 95 INCIDENT DUE TO THE RPA'S VIGILANCE.

(3) PATROLS WERE ALSO CONDUCTED TO KIBINGO ( GR 2980 ). ROADS IN THE AREA WERE REPORTED TO BE IN A VERY BAD STATE AND MOST AREAS INACCESSIBLE.

g. SECTOR 4C - CYANGUGU

(1) THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(2) PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT IN SEVERAL AREAS OF THE AO. THE SECURITY SITUATION IN AREAS PATROLLED WAS REPORTED CALM.

(3) MILOBS LEARNT THAT ZAIREAN SOLDIERS WERE PERSUADING REFUGEES NOT TO RETURN TO RWANDA BECAUSE THE UN WILL REDUCE THE QUANTITY OF FOOD SUPPLY IF THEY DID.

h. SECTOR 5 - GISENYI

(1) THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. THERE WAS LOOTING OF WFP FOOD ITEMS FROM TRUCKS AWAITING CLEARANCE AT THE GISENYI BORDER.

(2) MILOBS, TOGETHER WITH HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM AND A PLATOON FROM TUNBATT WENT TO THE SCENE OF THE LOOTING MENTIONED ABOVE AT ABOUT 1500 HRS TO CONTROL THE SITUATION. SOME VEHICLES WERE SECURED BY THE TEAM AND WERE ON THE WAY TO TUNBATT HQ AT THE TIME OF THIS REPORT. SEVEN VEHICLES WERE LEFT UNDER THE PROTECTION OF RPA AT THEIR CHECK-POINT.

(3) THE COS OF NIGERIAN ARMY VISITED THE SECTOR WAS BRIEFED BY MILOBS.

(4) MILOBS ACCOMPANIED A GROUP OF PARLIAMENTARIANS TO NYANYUMBA (GR 3223 ) AND KANAMA (GR 2722 ) COMMUNES WHERE MEETINGS WERE HELD WITH THE LOCALS.

(5) MILOBS CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PATROLS IN THE AOR. THE SITUATION ELSEWHERE WAS REPORTED CALM.

(6) MILOBS, HUMAN RIGHTS AND CIVPOL INVESTIGATED THE DETENTION OF A RWANDESE SUSPECTED TO BE INVOLVED IN THE ATTACK ON TUNBATT HQ. THE PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE HAS BEEN INFORMED AND WAS STANDING BY TO TAKE OVER THE SUSPECT FROM TUNBATT.



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
