Special excursions (which are not otherwise limited)
Scenic auto tours (Information Desk in Veteran's Building Lobby)

It must be understood that regardless of the fact these reservations are placed on the manifests they must still be considered as ALTERNATE in the event that any late reservations are made for delegation officials and accredited out-of-town press. The reservations should be made at the Press-Radio Information Desk located in the basement of the Veteran's Building.

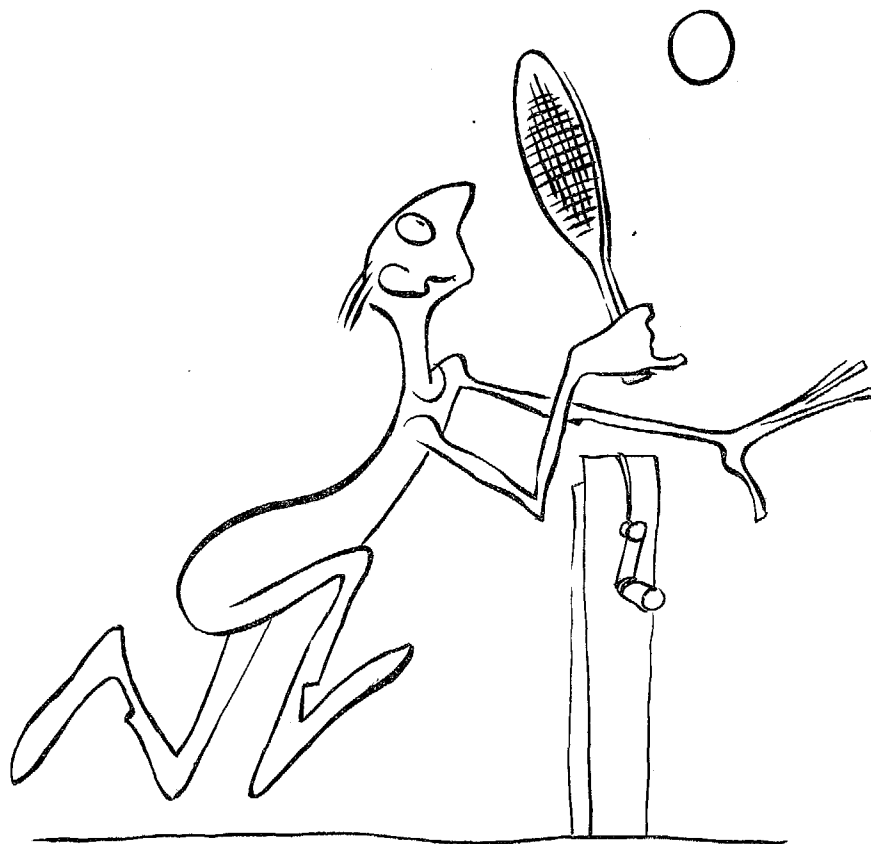

SUBJECT: Release of Personnel of International
Secretariat for Recreation, Motor Trips, etc.

All members of the staff of the International Secretariat have been working long hours under great pressure and should be encouraged to take advantage of the recreational facilities offered by the Conference and by the citizens of San Francisco to the greatest extent consistent with carrying on the work of the Secretariat efficiently and without interruption.

Accordingly, supervisors should see that members of their staffs understand that during their time off week-days or Sundays they are free to take advantage of these facilities. The Local Information Desk in the lobby of the Veterans Building offers a variety of motor trips in and around San Francisco and forms are provided so that reservations may be made in advance. 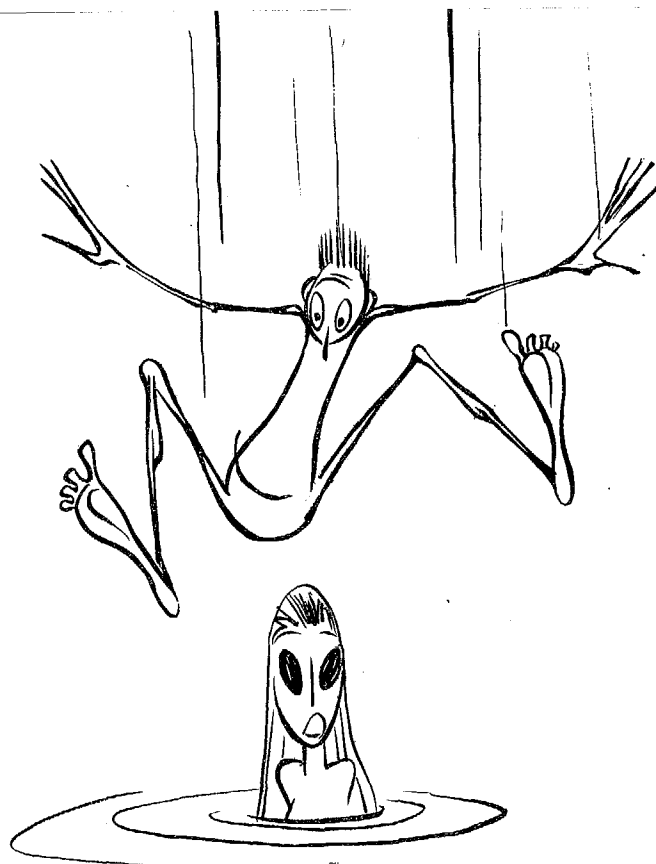
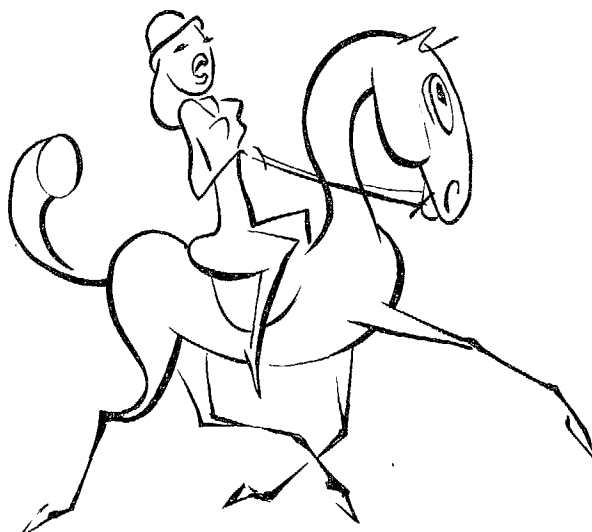
ENTERTAINMENT
