SUBJECT: FC DIRECTIVE FOR HANDOVER OF EX-RGF SOLDIERS TO  
RWANDESE GOVERNMENT FOR INTEGRATION INTO RPA

GENERAL

1. Ex-RGF soldiers continue to respond positively to the Rwandese Governments integration policy. Hundreds have already voluntarily requested to be integrated into the RPA and many more are expected to follow.

AIM

2. The aim of this directive is to streamline the procedure for the handover of ex-RGF soldiers by UNAMIR to the Rwandese Government.

PROCEDURE

3. All ex-RGF soldiers who voluntarily surrender to UNAMIR Troops/units will be disarmed and evacuated to the appropriate sector/sub-sector HQ as applicable for documentation under the supervision of the sector/sub-sector UNMO and ICRC or UNHCR representative.

4. After documentation a consolidated list will be forwarded to UNAMIR Force HQ for the necessary clearance to be sought from the appropriate government agency through the RPA Liaison Officer to transport the ex-RGF soldiers to Kigali.

5. On receipt of clearance, the clearance certificate is to be forwarded to the sector HQ concerned for the necessary transportation of the soldiers to be effected under MILOB escort to Force HQ.

6. The convoy commander must carry the clearance certificate to be shown at each RPA check point en route if necessary.


7. Units requiring transport assistance will request Force HQ to make the necessary arrangements to move the soldiers to Kigali.

HANDOVER

8. The convoy commander will report to G3 Ops on arrival for the necessary transfer of the soldiers to be made to the

4. RUSIZI TWO - DRASTIC REDUCTION IN NUMBERS SINCE YESTERDAY - APPROX 500-1000 (PROB NEARER 500). THE SY OFFICIAL CLAIMED 500 → ZAIRE AND 200 → RWANDA. THE REST HAD MOVED TO THE AIRPORT (TAKEN BY TRUCK THIS AM?).

8. FURTHER REPORTS OF ZAIREAN SOLDIERS CHARGING FEES TO CROSS TO RWANDA. SPOKE TO ONE MALE WHO HAD A RECENT MODEL CAR, HAD BROUGHT HIS FAMILY TO RWANDA AND WANTED TO RETURN TO COLLECT HIS BELONGINGS. THE ZAIRE BORDER GUARDS CHARGED \$80 PER CAR, BETWEEN \$7 - \$10 PER PERSON (AGE) AND SIGNIFICANTLY MORE FOR A VEHICLE WITH POSSESSIONS. HE HAS ASKED ONE OF THE NGO'S TO REPORT IT AND WOULD LIKE UNAMUR TO AS WELL!

9. A NUMBER OF PEOPLE AGAIN EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT THE BANDITS. IT IS PROBABLE THAT SIGNIFICANTLY MORE PEOPLE WOULD HAVE RETURNED HAD THIS PROBLEM NOT EXISTED.

THE BRITS ARE RUNNING ALMOST CONTINUOUS CONVOYS FULL OF REFUGEES AND IT MAY BE THAT THE MAJORITY HAVE TO GO THAT WAY IF BANDIT PROBLEM IS NOT RESOLVED.

The strategy calls for the humanitarian community to work in the prefectures of Gitarama, Kibungo, Bugesera and Butare to increase the absorptive capacity of the areas to which people return and to increase the level of confidence of returnees. While UNREO believe this approach is necessary now that the situation in the South West appears to have stabilized, such a policy would require the switching of resources from the South West region to the homelands.

The flow of refugees leaving Rwanda has slowed; returnees are increasing in some areas but there are significant problems with intimidation, especially in the North West zone. The JTF estimate that flows of returnees from Tanzania and Burundi have reduced to under 300 per day.

UNHCR and IOM continue to repatriate refugees and displaced persons from three pick up sites along the Gisenye-Ruhengeri road. Large-scale organized repatriation is not underway because of militia intimidation at the camps and insufficient government guarantees of returnee safety. However, spontaneous returnees who reach the pick-up points are transported. Every two days the convoys carry between 400-600 people to Kigali. Once they have arrived at the UNHCR reception centre they are fed and provided with blankets. Those who need onward transport are moved the following day.

In the South West, UNHCR is establishing a waystation in Butare to provide a resting site for returnees from Cyangugu en route to Kigali. IOM, who have the mandate to provide transport assistance to migrants in need, will move people from Cyangugu to Butare where they will stay overnight before continuing on to the capital the following day. IOM will provide up to 12 trucks on this route.

Since 12 August IOM has transported a total of 3,423 people from points in the North, Central and South of Rwanda



2) The Rwandese Government, currently concerned about the increasing tension in Burundi, has asked UNHCR and IOM to help repatriate some 80,000 long term refugees. Some of these Rwandese have been living in Burundi for over twenty years. Approximately one-third of them are living in refugee camps.

#### HEALTH

There is still concern that the continuing rain will jeopardize the health of hundreds of thousands of refugees and internally displaced because of shortages of shelter and inadequate sanitation. This applies to all areas.

UNICEF note that they are beginning a major vaccination programme; the cold chain store will be stocked next week with the following vaccines: measles (500,000 vaccines), DPT (600,000), Meningitis (100,000), Polio (600,000), Tetanus (200,000) and BCG (250,000).

#### DE-MINING

The presence of unexploded ordnance continues to be a problem; the senior British bomb disposal officer has said that nowhere in Kigali can be guaranteed as safe. A \$4.2 million de-mining package still needs to be agreed before training of local staff can begin. Two people continue to die every day from accidents with unexploded munitions. Many booby-traps have been discovered in public buildings and houses. It is likely these booby-traps were placed to protect homes as the inhabitants retreated.

#### TRANSPORT

Several trucks delivering humanitarian relief are stranded at the border between Uganda and Rwanda because Rwandese officials are charging an entry tax of \$150 per truck. At an UNREO General Meeting held on 30 August, a Government official agreed that humanitarian assistance should not be taxed and that he would investigate with the Ministry of Finance.

IOM are also providing a logistician to be based in the UNREO Logistics Cell. When he arrives, he will help UNREO in the coordination of returnee movements.

Airserv, an NGO that acts as a travel agent and charter service for other NGOs, has established a presence at UNREO to provide air travel services in the region. They are currently carrying out a survey of NGO travel requirements before scheduled flying operations start. It is expected an initial service will begin on 5 September, flying on Monday, Wednesday, Thursday and Saturday between Nairobi and Kigali. After offloading cargo and passengers at Kigali, the aircraft will travel Kigali-Goma-Buakavu-Kigali. Payment will usually be met from the travel budget of the client NGO. A radio link has already been established between the main centres which will allow rapid booking and schedule confirmation.

#### SOUTH WEST

UNAMIR report that armed RGF troops have been seen moving into sector 4 while there have also been reports of infiltration by RPA troops. This is despite assurances from the government that troops will only be moved into the region after civil administration has been established.

Mururu camp now contains some 6400 people; approximately 500 people arrive every day. The camp, which is 5km from Rusizi II bridge, has a capacity of 10,000. A second site, Kigali, has

③ UNAMIR report that in the week from 23 August to 29 August some 9840 people crossed from Rwanda to Zaire and 2447 crossed from Zaire to Rwanda. As the week progressed more people returned to Rwanda than left. Between 26 August and 29 August only 640 moved to Zaire while 2447 returned to Rwanda.

A UNICEF mission to the South West identified 33 camps with a population of 525,000. An additional 5 camps are yet to be assessed. Of the 33 camps only 10 were found to have an adequate water supply.

There has been serious water shortage problems in Cyangugu; when the French were operating the sector they provided fuel, salaries, spare parts etc. UNAMIR can now provide fuel but the UNREO Field Office reports that the 18 workers have not been paid recently and that there is a shortage of transportation, tools and spare parts. Apparently the water station is losing up to 50% of the water pumped because of leaks in the system. In the short term, ICRC has agreed to pay workers with food, MSF is trying to arrange transport and AICF is raising money for emergency repairs. UNICEF, who are lead agency for water and sanitation, are sending a team to examine the situation and try to find a long term solution to water supply.

#### NORTH EAST

Byumba prefecture now have two NGO liaison representatives from the Ministry of Rehabilitation. Robert Gashemeza and Emmanuel Shema (both anglophone) are posted at the Prefectural office and are in the process of conducting a survey of community needs so that NGO activity can be more accurately targeted.

#### OTHER INFORMATION

Baroness Chalker, UK Minister for Overseas Development, met with heads of agencies and NGOs at UNREO base on 31 August. She announced that the UK would support the idea of a radio station broadcasting across the country. The UK will provide funding and equipment to establish the station. The aim is to provide a service in Kinyarwanda and French that will educate, inform and entertain the population and provide a fair and unbiased explanation of the conditions within the country. Editorial control would rest with the UN.

There are now 82 NGOs registered with the UNREO NGO Liaison Office. Of these, 8 are Rwandese.

UNREO and UNHCR are investigating possibilities to bring in a professional demographer to examine population flows and movement on an inter-agency basis. Currently, it has proved extremely difficult to consistently identify population movements with an acceptable degree of accuracy.


