FORCE COMMANDER'S DIRECTIVE ON MASS GRAVES AND  
ALLEGED MASSACRE SITE REGISTRATION, INVESTIGATION AND HANDLING.

GENERAL

1. Instances of widespread killing during the recent civil war in RWANDA are well known. The development of a strategy to investigate these occurrences is in progress. However, a comprehensive database on mass graves is required to focus the Human Rights Committee investigation and to provide the BBGNU with limited assistance from NGOs and UNAMIR to deal with the situation in a dignified manner.

2. Additionally, it has been revealed in recent reports that a number of mass graves discovered to date present a health hazard to the neighbouring population.

AIM

3. The aim of this directive is to outline the UNAMIR policy on registration and handling of mass graves.

PROCEDURE

4. Reports of mass graves and alleged massacre sites are random and do not identify a trend. The recording of relevant data has been equally sporadic. Accordingly, a database is to be established at HQ UNAMIR by the MILINFO cell in Operations Branch.

5. Reporting. Action addressees are to report the discovery of mass graves to HQ UNAMIR. Reports are to include the following details:

a. Location.

(1) map coordinates (8 figures).

(2) nearest town, village, commune or camp.

b. General description.

(1) dimensions.

(2) condition.

- (a) sealed.
- (b) unsealed.
- (3) proximity to water source.
- (4) proximity to population concentration.
- (5) approximate age.
- (6) estimated number of persons buried therein.
- (7) cause of death where discernable.

c. Remarks.


6. Recording. MILINFO cell, HQ UNAMIR is to record mass grave reports in a format which will be useful to military, government departments, UN agencies and NGOs. Cooperation amongst all parties will ensure that maximum information is collectively made available. Accordingly, the MILINFO cell is to gather from and share information with all available sources.

7. Investigation. Investigation of all the circumstances surrounding mass graves and alleged massacres is the responsibility of Human Rights and the BBGNU of RWANDA. The involvement of UNAMIR personnel will be specifically ordered when necessary.

8. Handling. FMO staff is to inspect reported mass graves to ascertain the health risk if any. If a clear health risk to the civilian population and/or UNAMIR personnel is identified, the FMO inspection report, including recommendations to the Government on the appropriate procedure to effectively address the matter, is to be submitted to Operations Branch. Due to the limited resources currently at the government's disposal, UNAMIR is to be prepared to provide the resources and expertise required. Requests to provide such resources are to be approved by DCOS OPS in consultation with the FMO and DCOS SP.

CONCLUSION

9. The handling of mass graves has legal, moral and memorial implications which are properly the responsibility of the BBGNU of RWANDA to address. UNAMIR personnel are to treat mass grave issues with appropriate sensitivity and are to limit their involvement to the essential requirements of reporting unless specifically ordered otherwise.

**GENERAL**

1. UNAMIR and NGO installations in KIGALI are vulnerable to trespass by armed or unarmed unauthorised personnel; there have been attempted encroachments in the past. The Rapid Reaction Force (RRF) has been constituted to provide a direct response to this threat. On order, INDBATT will assume RRF responsibilities from GHANBATT, AUSMED and CANCON.

**MISSION**

2. To protect UNAMIR and NGO installations in Kigali against unauthorised encroachments.

**EXECUTION**

3. **General Outline.** The RRF is a motorised platoon. It is capable of responding to an immediate threat at section level, and to augment that force as required, up to platoon level. INDBATT will assume full Sector 6 RRF responsibilities on order.

4. **Groupings and Tasks.**

a. **INDBATT.**

(1) **Grouping.** No change.

(2) **Tasks**

(a) Assume responsibility for RRF.

(b) Detail one infantry section as RRF.

(c) Undertake the following on order:

(i) Guard threatened UNAMIR/NGO installations,



(ii) Provide sentries for unmanned UN property,

(iii) Protect NGO facilities,

(iv) Escort unauthorized persons out of UN property or installations, and

(v) Arrest and handover trespassers to local authorities with the assistance of UNAMIR Military Police, in accordance with Ref B.

(vi) Escort HQ UNAMIR civilian staff to respective homes during the hours of darkness.

(d) Be prep to reinforce RRF section with up to two Inf Sections.

(e) Be prepared to reinforce or provide guards at the installations indicated at Annex A.

(f) Be prepared to protect VIPs.

b. AUSMED.

(1) Grouping. No change.

(2) Task

(a) Discontinue RRF responsibilities.

(b) Handover designated responsibilities to INDBATT.

c. CANCON.

(1) Grouping. No change.

(2) Task

(a) Discontinue RRF responsibilities.

(b) Handover designated responsibilities to INDBATT.

d. Coordinating Instructions

(1) Section at 30 mins NTM daily.

(2) First reinforcement section at 60 min NTM.

(3) Reinforcement section 2 at 90 min NTM.

(4) Assy area - sect location.

(5) Rules of Engagement as per Ref A.

C. MILITIA. AT REMERA (7294) ABOUT FORTY BANDITS FROM BURUNDI ARMED WITH MACHETES AND RIFLES ATTACKED THE VILLAGE. THE LOCALS FLED. SO NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED. THE VILLAGE WILL BE INTENSIFIED. INVESTIGATION CONTINUES.

B. GITARAMA TEAM. ONE MILOB TEAM COVERED VISIT OF RWANDA MINISTER (PARA 2). ONE TEAM ESCORTED 5 NUNS FROM ST. BERNARDS FROM BUTARE TO CYANGUGU, WHERE THEY VISITED THE BISHOP.

C. BUTARE TEAM. ONE TEAM PATROLLED TO KIGEMBE (6994) WHERE THEY LIASED WITH THE MALAWI COY AND LOCAL AUTHORITIES. SIT SEEMS TO BE CALM. PEOPLE APPRECIATE UN PRESENCE IN THE AREA. ANOTHER TEAM PATROLLED TO KANYARU-HAUT TO LIASE WITH RPA BORDER TROOPS. SIT CALM.

D. MALAWI COY. ONE TEAM INVESTIGATED INCIDENT AT KEGEMBE (PARA 3C). MALAWI COY INTENSIFIES PATROLS IN THE AREA. ONE TEAM PATROLLED TO RUYENZI (8132) WHERE THE PRIMARY SCHOOL IS NOW OPERATING WITH 281 PUPILS. PEOPLE COMPLAIN ABOUT FEW RPA PRESENCE.

E. MALI COY. AT NTONGWE (9056) CO MALICOY AND HIS SOLDIERS WERE WITNESSES OF A MINE INCIDENT. 3 BOYS FOUND AN UNEXPLODED ROCKET, WHICH EXPLODED WHEN THEY WERE THROWING STONES ON IT. 3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

a. RPA the RPA continued to conduct patrols and mount road blocks throughout the country.



(i) MILOBs reported that on 092030B Nov 94 approx 8 drunken RPA soldiers entered a DP camp in Sector 4A (GR 543273) and began to search the inhabitants at gunpoint. When MILOBs arrived the RPA justified their actions by saying that the DPs had thrown stones at them while they were on patrol. GHANBATT provided security for the remainder of the evening. This is reported to be the second such incident at the camp within 48 hrs.

(ii) MILOBs in Sector 5 reported that the RPA are reinforcing their positions in the RUTAGARA area (GR 1919). Truckloads of troops were also seen moving towards the BURUNDI border in Sectors 3 and 4a.

(iv) MILOBs reported that the RPA fired 1 Mor round from RUHENGARI at an unknown target on 091640B Nov 94.

(v) MILOBs reported that locals in GANHARZO (GR 2920) claim that the RPA are taking local men away to an unknown destination.

(vi) Sector 4A reported that RPA soldiers forcibly evicted DPs from a camp near MUSANGE (GR 5247) on 10 Nov 94. The RPA burnt huts and opened fire with small arms. No casualties were reported. During this action a ZAMBATT platoon position was surrounded by the RPA. A detailed report is to follow.

5. ASSESSMENT

a. The RPA may be reinforcing the RUTAGARA area in order to prevent a repetition of the cross border raid which took place there on 31 Oct 94. After the raid the RPA Bn Comd in the area commented that he felt his forces were too widely distributed to form a cohesive defence. Another option for the reinforcement of the area could be that they have intelligence to suggest that the rumours of an FRGF attack on the 12 or 13 Nov 94 may be more than rumours.

b. The report that RPA trucks carrying troops were seen moving into the border area with BURUNDI in Sectors 3 and 4A could be part of an RPA troop rotation or it could be indication that the situation in BURUNDI has worsened and the RPA intend to prevent BURUNDI based Hutu extremist groups from operating in RWANDA.



c. The report of the RPA firing a single Mor round in RUHENGARI is believed to form part of some sort of military training as there are no obvious targets in the area. The nearest border to RUHENGARI is the UGANDA border which is 13kms away.


