2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. VISIT OF GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER TO RWANDA

1. THE FOREIGN MINISTER OF GERMANY, MR. KLAUS KINKEL, ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 25 JULY FOR AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA AND WAS GREETED AT THE AIRPORT BY THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR-GENERAL PAUL KAGAME. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, MR. KINKEL STATED THAT GERMANY WAS SATISFIED WITH THE RETURN OF NORMALCY TO RWANDA, AND THAT IT WOULD ASSIST RWANDA IN EFFORTS TO STRENGTHEN PEACE IN THE COUNTRY AND CONTINUE ECONOMIC COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES.

2. THE FORCE COMMANDER HELD A MEETING WITH MR. KINKEL ON 26 JULY AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS DURING WHICH THEY DISCUSSED, AMONG OTHER SUBJECTS, THE PROSPECTS FOR THE RETURN OF RWANDESE REFUGEES, THE STABILITY OF THE PRESENT RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AND THE UN ARMS EMBARGO ON RWANDA.

3. MR. KINKEL ATTENDED AN OFFICIAL DINNER THE SAME DAY GIVEN BY THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME. AT THE RECEPTION, MR. KINKEL STATED THAT GERMAN AID TO RWANDA WOULD BE CONTINGENT UPON THE ACHIEVEMENT OF GREATER PROGRESS BY THE RWANDESE IN THE AREAS OF REFUGEE RETURN, PRISON CONDITIONS AND THE REHABILITATION OF THEIR JUSTICE SYSTEM.

4. THE GERMAN EMBASSY ANNOUNCED IN A COMMUNIQUE DATED 27 JULY THAT MR. KINKEL SIGNED AN AGREEMENT WITH THE RWANDESE FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, TO PROVIDE RWANDA WITH DM 50 MILLION OF ASSISTANCE TO BE USED IN THE AREAS OF HEALTH, EDUCATION AND JUSTICE, AS WELL AS THE PRIVATE SECTOR.

5. IN A PRESS CONFERENCE GIVEN PRIOR TO HIS DEPARTURE FROM KIGALI ON 27 JULY, MR. KINKEL STATED THAT THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT SHOULD MAKE VISIBLE EFFORTS ABROAD TO DEMONSTRATE ITS FIRM COMMITMENT TO THE RETURN OF RWANDESE REFUGEES. REGARDING THE DEPLORABLE CONDITIONS IN RWANDESE PRISONS, MR. KINKEL STATED THAT IT IS NOW NECESSARY TO DO EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO ENSURE THAT NEW INJUSTICES ARE NOT ADDED TO THE INJUSTICES OF THE PAST IN RWANDA. HE ALSO CITED THE IMPERATIVE AND URGENT NEED OF CONVENING A CONFERENCE TO ADDRESS THE PROBLEMS OF THE SUBREGION.

B. OTHER DEVELOPMENTS IN RWANDA

1. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE NEWLY-APPOINTED BURUNDIAN FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. PAUL MUNYEMBARI, ENDED HIS THREE-DAY VISIT TO RWANDA ON 23 JULY. HE REPORTEDLY STATED IN A RADIO INTERVIEW THAT HE HAD REACHED POSITIVE CONCLUSIONS IN HIS DISCUSSIONS WITH HIS RWANDESE COUNTERPART, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, WHICH HAD CENTRED ON POLITICAL ISSUES OF COMMON INTEREST AND COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES.

2. ACCORDING TO REPORTS BY RADIO RWANDA AND UNAMIR MILITARY

OBSERVERS, THE SUB-PREFECT OF RUHANGO, MR. PLACIDE KORONI, WAS APPARENTLY MURDERED AND BURNED TO DEATH ON 27 JULY, TOGETHER WITH HIS WIFE AND CHILDREN, BY UNIDENTIFIED GUNMEN AT HIS HOME IN SOUTH-CENTRAL RWANDA. THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT HAS OFFICIALLY DENIED ANY INVOLVEMENT IN THE INCIDENT AND IS CONDUCTING AN INVESTIGATION INTO THE MATTER.

3. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT DENIED REPORTS MADE BY A RADIO STATION BASED IN GOMA, ZAIRE ON 19 JULY ALLEGING THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA HAD SENT MILITARY COMMANDOS TO THE ZAIRIAN PROVINCE OF KIVU TO KILL RWANDESE REFUGEES. IN A COMMUNIQUE ISSUED BY THE RWANDESE MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL INTEGRATION, THE GOVERNMENT REPORTEDLY CRITICISED THE ZAIRIAN PRESS FOR CONDUCTING A CAMPAIGN TO PREVENT REFUGEES FROM RETURNING HOME, AND THE FORMER RWANDESE GOVERNMENT LEADERS OF CONNIVING WITH THEIR ZAIRIAN ACCOMPLICES IN ATTEMPTING TO HALT THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES.

4. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT AT A MEETING HELD BY THE PREFECT OF KIGALI RURAL PREFECTURE TO DISCUSS THE GENERAL SECURITY SITUATION, THE PARTICIPANTS STATED THAT THE GENERAL SECURITY SITUATION WAS GOOD DESPITE ACTS OF BANDITRY IN THE COMMUNES NEIGHBOURING KIGALI. THEY ALSO EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF PROPERTY DISPUTES AMONG THE LOCAL POPULATION.

5. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED ON 28 JULY THAT UNAMIR TROOPS LEFT RUHENGERI PREFECTURE IN NORTHWESTERN RWANDA WITHOUT PAYING COMPENSATION TO THE LOCAL POPULATION FOR CROP DAMAGE CAUSED BY UNAMIR TROOPS IN FIELDS USED AS ENCAMPMENT SITES DESPITE PREVIOUSLY AGREEING TO DO SO. COMMENT: CLAIM HAS BEEN APPROVED BY UNAMIR AND SHOULD BE SETTLED EARLY AUGUST.

### 3. MILITARY

#### A. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES

##### (1) RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(A) IN SECTOR 1B, THE RPA BRIGADE COMD TOLD THE SECTOR COMD THAT UN HELICOPTER LANDED AT KIBUYE AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL DISEMBARKED AND ENCOURAGED LOCALS TO COOPERATE WITH INTERAHAMWE. WHEN CONFRONTED, THE COMD COULD NOT PROVIDE ANY DETAILS.

(B) MILOB IN SECTOR 1B REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS IN MASANGO COMMUNE (GR 6254) WERE ROTATED DUE TO RPA SOLDIERS' POOR BEHAVIOUR.

(C) SECTOR 1 MILOB REPORTED THAT IN MUSAMBIRA SQ 8274 AND RUNDA SQ 9882 COMMUNES, RPA SOLDIERS WERE NO LONGER CONDUCTING NIGHT PATROLS TO FIGHT BANDITRY. THEY DELEGATED THE TASK TO THE LOCALS WHO FORMED PATROL GROUPS AT THE CELLULE LEVEL.

(D) IN SECTOR 2, GHANBATT REPORTED THAT RPA MOV THROUGH BARE HAD INCREASED. INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THEY WERE ROTATING. RPA ARE PRESENTLY OCCUPYING AN ABANDONED PINEAPPLE JUICE FACTORY AT BARE (GR 5347).

(E) MILOB FROM SECTOR 3 REPORTED THAT AT NYARUHENGARI RPA WERE CONDUCTING INTENSIVE TRAINING IN DRILL AND FIRING PRACTICE.

(F) MILOB FROM SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT THE RPA LIAISON OFFICER ACCOMPANIED THE SECTOR COMMANDER TO INVESTIGATE THE BRUTAL KILLING OF A LOCAL BUSINESSMAN FROM KAMUHOZA (SQ 8127) IN KAMEMBE COMMUNE. THE LOCAL RPA COMD ENSURED THE SAFE RETURN OF REFUGEES FROM ZAIRE. AS OF NOW NO RETURNEES ARE BEING DETAINED BY THE RPA.

(G) MILOB IN NYAMASHEKE SUB-SECTOR OF SECTOR 4, REPORTED THAT RPA SUB-UNITS HAD TACTICALLY DEPLOYED IN ISHARA PENINSULA (GR 0143).

(H) A CONVOY OF AMPHIBIOUS ARMoured VEHICLES, ONE OF WHICH HAD A HEAVY-CALIBRE GUN MOUNTED, MOVED FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE AIRPORT TOWARDS KIGALI TOWN. THE CONVOY WAS BEING LED BY A PICK-UP VAN DRIVEN BY A LIEUTENANT. ANOTHER VAN LOADED WITH ARMED MEN ESCORTED THE CONVOY.

(I) TEN RPA SOLDIERS WERE FOUND IN KAMEMBE SECTOR 4 WEARING ETHIOBATT UNIFORMS. ONE WAS FOUND WEARING A LIGHT BLUE BERET. RPA COMD INFO.

(J) MILOBS SECTOR 4 REPORTED APPROX 7 RPA PATROLS OF 8-10 MEN EACH WERE SEEN PATROLLING THE JUNGLE ROAD BETWEEN PINDURA GR 1325 AND GISAKURA GR 9829 ON THE NIGHT 29\30 JUL 95.

(2) MILITIA/FRGF

(A) IN SEC 4, MILOB REPORTED THAT MILITIA CARRIED OUT OPERATIONS ACROSS THE BORDER ON 21 AND 22 JULY 95 IN BUGARAMA SUB-SECTOR. BOURGEMESTRE OF GISHOMA COMMUNE CONFIRMED MILITIA OPERATION IN RUHOKO (GR 8304), NYENJI (7907), GISAGARA (7912) AND KIRANGA (8008) WHICH WAS REPELLED BY RPA. NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED ON BOTH SIDES. INVESTIGATION ONGOING.

(B) IN SECTOR 4, MILOB REPORTED THAT ONE MAN LOST HIS RIGHT LEG AND SUFFERED SEVERAL SPLINTER INJURIES AND TWO COWS WERE KILLED BY A MINE EXPLOSION WHICH OCCURRED ON 22 JULY 95 IN RUHOKO SECTOR.

(C) MILOB SECTOR 4 REPORTED SIX SEPARATE ACTS OF

ARMED ROBBERY BY UNIFORMED MEN IN GISAGARA (GR 8907), MUHEHWE (GR 8609), AND CYETE (GR 7618). ALL THE INCIDENTS OCCURRED FROM 14 TO 23 JUL 95 AND RESULTED IN GUNSHOT OR MACHETE WOUNDS ON FIVE VICTIMS. THE BANDITS WERE SUSPECTED TO HAVE MOVED ACROSS THE BORDER FROM ZAIRE. THE SPATE OF ARMED ROBBERY WAS REPORTED TO BE CREATING CONSIDERABLE TENSION IN THE AREAS CONCERNED. MILOB CONTINUE TO MONITOR THE SITUATION.

(D) SECTOR 4 MILOB REPORTED THAT REFUGEES OBSERVED FRGF AND INTERHAMWE PATROL ON THE EASTERN SHORE OF IJWI ISLAND BOTH DAY AND NIGHT. THESE FORCES HAD INTENSIFIED THEIR EFFORTS TO PREVENT THE REFUGEES FROM RETURNING TO RWANDA. MANY REFUGEES WERE REPORTEDLY ARRESTED AND SOME KILLED.

(E) MILOB REPORTED THAT AT KAVUNE CELLULE (GR 9740), IN NYAMASHEKE SUB SECTOR, AT ABOUT 2300 HRS ON 27 JUL 95, A GROUP OF BANDITS ARMED WITH RIFLES AND MACHETES BROKE INTO THE HOUSE OF A MAN AND SHOT THE SON IN THE ARM. THE BANDITS WERE FORCED TO FLEE BY LOCALS NEARBY WHO WENT TO THEIR NEIGHBOUR'S AID. THE RPA WHO ARRIVED ON THE SCENE SHORTLY AFTER RECOVERED A MACHETTE, SOME EMPTY CARTRIDGES AND ONE LIVE CARTRIDGE FOR A BELGIAN "CEFRONI" WEAPON.

#### B. OWN ACTIVITIES

##### (1) UNAMIR

(A) ON THE 24 JUL THE FC MET WITH MR. CISSE OF UNDP, WHO IS CURRENTLY IN CHARGE OF UNDP OFFICE IN KIGALI. THEY DISCUSSED ISSUES RELATED TO PROJECTS AND THEIR FUNDING AND THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN UNDP, UNAMIR AND THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA. IT WAS DISCUSSED HOW THE GOVERNMENT'S REQUESTS WERE RECEIVED BY THE HAC OF UNAMIR, BUT COULD NOT BE ACTIONED DUE NOT ONLY TO NO DIRECT FUNDS, BUT TO EQUIPMENT SHORTAGES AND INAPPROPRIATE TYPES OF RESOURCES IN THE NEW MANDATE. THIS WAS ESPECIALLY APPARENT DURING THE REDUCTION AND ROTATION OF UNAMIR TROOPS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MANDATE IMPOSED BY RWANDA. THE HAC WOULD ONLY COPE WITH MATTERS THAT THE CURRENT MILITARY RESOURCES COULD PROVIDE.

(B) THE FC AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION MET WITH SENIOR UNAMIR STAFF TO DISCUSS AND BETTER COORDINATE THE NUMEROUS GOVERNMENT AND PRIVATE REQUESTS FOR HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE FROM UNAMIR. THE ACTING HEAD OF MISSION EXPRESSED HIS CONCERN AT THE INCREASED RATE OF THE HUMANITARIAN REQUESTS AND FURTHER ADVISED THAT IF THESE

REQUESTS WERE NOT HONOURED DUE TO LACK OF RESOURCES UNAMIR SHOULD PROVIDE SOME EXPLANATION TO THE GOVERNMENT BEFORE HOSTILE REACTIONS AND CRITICISMS AGAINST UNAMIR BECAME APPARENT. ALSO DISCUSSED WERE IDEAS TO MORE SMOOTHLY ACCOMMODATE CIVILIAN AND MILITARY VIP VISITS IN VIEW OF UPCOMING REDUCTIONS IN UNAMIR STAFF AT THE HEADQUARTERS.

(C) FC GRANTED AUDIENCE TO LT COL RJ POWELL ON THE DEPARTURE OF 95 FLSC WHICH TOOK PLACE ON 26 JULY 95. THE FC COMMENDED THE CO FOR THE EFFORTS AND SUCCESSES OF THE FLSC AND OF THE POSITIVE REPUTATION THEY GAINED WITHIN UNAMIR. THE MAIN BODY OF 95 CMSG, ITS REPLACEMENT, ARRIVED SAME DAY FROM CANADA. FC VISITED KIA TO BID FAREWELL TO CANADIANS FROM 95 FLSC WHO WERE RETURNING TO CANADA AFTER 6 MONTHS WITH UNAMIR. FC MET BRIEFLY WITH THE CO, DCO AND ALL DEPARTING MEN AND WOMEN OF THE UNIT BEFORE THEY BOARDED THE CRAFT.

(D) FC AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE. HE EXPLAINED THE NEW DEPLOYMENT OF UNAMIR IN THE NEW SECTORS AND EMPHASIZED THE NEW LIMITATIONS TO PROVIDING HUMANITARIAN RESOURCES TO RWANDA, ESPECIALLY DURING THE SCALE-DOWN PERIOD. THERE ARE MANY AREAS IN THE COUNTRY THAT WOULD NO LONGER HAVE FORMED TROOPS FROM UNAMIR TO CARRY ON ASSISTANCE AND SECURITY TO THOSE IN NEED. EQUIPMENT AND OTHER UNAMIR RESOURCES WERE CURRENTLY OF PRIORITY TO UNAMIR CONTINGENTS AND MILOBS, AND WERE EXTREMELY LIMITED. NOTWITHSTANDING THESE LIMITED RESOURCES, UNAMIR WOULD CONTINUE TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE, WHERE POSSIBLE. IT WOULD ALSO CONTINUE TO TRAIN THE GENDARMERIE AND ASSIST IN DEMINING OPERATIONS.

(E) AT THE PRESS GATHERING, THE FC MENTIONED THE IMPROVEMENT IN THE LOCAL SECURITY SITUATION IN THE KIGALI AREA AND CONGRATULATED THE RPA AND GENDARMERIE FOR THEIR EFFORT IN CURBING ACTS OF BANDITRY AND MURDER. THE FC ANNOUNCED THE LIFTING OF THE CURFEW IMPOSED ON UNAMIR PERSONNEL FROM 2130 TO 2300 HRS.

(F) FC VISITED AUSMED BARRACKS AND THE HOSPITAL. HE BRIEFLY ATTENDED A NURSING CONFERENCE AND A PADRES CONFERENCE DURING HIS VISIT TO THE UNIT. HE ALSO OBSERVED PATIENTS UNDER CARE IN THE INTENSIVE CARE UNIT WHICH INCLUDED AN EXPATRIATE FROM BELGIUM AND A RWANDAN CHILD WHO WAS SERIOUSLY MAIMED BY AN ACCIDENTAL GRENADE EXPLOSION. DURING HIS VISIT HE ALSO MET WITH AIR VICE MARSHALL COX, CHIEF OF PERSONNEL OF THE AUSTRALIAN DEFENCE FORCE. THEY DISCUSSED THE CURRENT SITUATION IN RWANDA, THE AUSTRALIAN

MEDICAL CONTRIBUTION, PERSONNEL POLICY AND TRAINING. THE FC MADE SPECIAL NOTE DURING HIS VISIT, OF THE EFFECTIVE AND PRODUCTIVE WORK THE LEGAL OFFICER HAD COMPLETED FOR GOVERNMENT AUTHORITIES, AND THE EXTENT OF PROFESSIONAL AND COORDINATED MED SUPPORT TO UNAMIR AND CITIZENS OF RWANDA.

(G) FC MET WITH THE GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER DURING HIS STATE VISIT TO RWANDA. RWANDA'S SITUATION, RPA, GOVERNMENT, FRGF STATUS AND UNAMIR MANDATE WERE SOME OF THE ISSUES DISCUSSED.

(H) AIR VICE MARSHALL COX (AUSTRALIA) PAID THE FC A COURTESY CALL ON HIS DEPARTURE. THEY REVIEWED HIS VISIT TO UNAMIR.

(I) FC ATTENDED ZAMBATT II MEDAL PARADE IN GIKONGORO. ZAMBATT II WOULD DEPART THE MISSION ON 3-4 AUGUST AFTER ASSUMING CONTROL OF THEIR SECTOR AMIDST THE KIBEHO CAMP SITUATION. THE FC HIGHLIGHTED THE STERLING CONTRIBUTION OF HUMANITARIAN AID AND LOGISTIC SUPPORT GIVEN DURING THEIR TENURE IN SOUTHERN RWANDA. OVER 20,000 RWANDESE RECEIVED MEDICAL TREATMENT AT ZAMBIAN AID STATIONS WHILE THEIR VEHICLES CARRIED MORE THAN 46,000 IDPs TO VARIOUS COMMUNES THROUGHOUT RWANDA. THE PREFECT, THE RPA BN COMD AND SENIOR UNAMIR STAFF ATTENDED THE PARADE. THE ZAMBIAN ARMY COMD AND HIS SENIOR STAFF ARRIVED FROM ZAMBIA IN TIME FOR THE LATER FESTIVITIES.

(J) ON 28 JUL 95 THE FC VISITED THE PROJECT SITE OF THE RWANDESE AGENCY FOR DEVELOPMENT AND COOPERATION CHIHARA COMMUNE WITH THE RESIDENT ENGINEER. MUCH OF THE PROJECT WAS BEING FUNDED BY WFP AS PART OF FOOD FOR WORK PROGRAM. THE PROJECT COORDINATOR NEEDED MORE TRANSPORTATION ABILITY TO HAUL WOOD AND BRICKS FROM THE BRICK SITE TO HOME BUILDING SITES. TO DATE, ONLY UNAMIR MILITARY PROVIDED TRANSPORT AND OTHER ASSISTANCE TO THIS PROJECT COORDINATED BY MR. CARBONARA AND HEADED BY MRS. KAGAME. IT WAS UNCERTAIN BUT OPTIONS TO INCREASE UNAMIR VEHICLES TO THE PROJECT WERE BEING CONSIDERED AMONGST OTHER NEEDS IN UNAMIR'S LIMITED TRANSPORT RESOURCES.

(K) THE FC AND ED MET ON 28 JUL 95 WITH THE VISITING ZAMBIAN DELEGATION HEADED BY LT GEN N SIMBEYE, COMMANDER ZAMBIAN ARMY. DURING THE MEETING THE FC HIGHLIGHTED THE OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION OF THE ZAMBIAN TROOPS TO UNAMIR'S EFFORTS. FC RECEIVED A COURTESY VISIT FROM LT GEN SIMBEYE ON HIS DEPARTURE 29 JUL 95. THE FC ALSO GAVE A SHORT INTERVIEW TO VISITING ZAMBIAN JOURNALISTS AFTERWARD.

(L) FC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO INDBATT HQ ON 28 JUL 95 AND WAS BRIEFED DURING THE VISIT ON INDBATT CURRENT OPS IN THE THEATRE. HE LATER VISITED 95 CMSG (COMPOSITE MISSION SUPPORT GROUP) TO ASSESS THE PROGRESS OF WORK BEING UNDERTAKEN TO ACCOMMODATE UNIT TROOPS IN THE COMPOUND. HE OBSERVED THE PROGRESS OF ERECTION OF WEATHER HAVEN SHELTERS AND GENERAL LAYOUT OF THE PLANNED ACCOMMODATION OF THE CMSG SOLDIERS, AND ALSO THE LOCATIONS FOR MEDICAL TEAMS AND UN CIVILIAN OFFICE SPACE. MOST FACILITIES WERE PLANNED FOR READINESS BY 15 AUGUST 95.

(M) FC ATTENDED A FORMAL DINING OUT RECEPTION ON 29 JUL 95 WITH OFFICERS OF THE AUSTRALIAN CONTINGENT WHO WILL BE DEPARTING MISSION AREA ABOUT 23 AUGUST.

(2) SECTOR 1 INDBATT/MALICOY.

(A) 555 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP AND 366 IDPs WERE EVAC BY UNHCR TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOME COMMUNES DURING THE WEEK.

(B) MALICOY PROVIDED TRANSPORTATION FOR BRIDGE LOGS, DRUGS, BUILDING MATERIALS AND FOODSTUFFS.

(5) SECTOR 4 (MALAWICOY).

(A) ON 25 JUL 95, AT 1130 HRS, A BN 2-ISLANDER WAS OBSERVED FLYING NORTH TO SOUTH ALONG THE RUSIZI BORDER AREA IN THE GISAGARA SECTOR (GR 7912). A RED, WHITE AND GREEN RECTANGULAR INSIGNIA WAS SEEN ON THE TAIL OF THE AIRCRAFT, ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE.

(B) OC MALAWI COY MET WITH HEAD OF UNHCR CYANGUGU AND CO RPA ON 29 JUL 95. CO RPA INFORMED HIM THAT THE PRESENCE OF RPA SOLDIERS AT NYAGATARE REFUGEE TRANSIT CAMP WAS DUE TO THE PULL OUT OF ETHIOBATT. IT HAD BEEN OBSERVED THAT

(7) MILOB GP. CONTINUED CO-ORDINATION AND MONITORING MILOB ACTIVITIES.

(1) REPS FROM "NONCE APOSTOLIQUE" WERE DENIED PERMISSION TO VISIT TWO PRIESTS DETAINED IN GITARAMA PRISON BY THE PRISON DIRECTOR.

(2) SECTOR 1B MILOBS CONFIRMED INFO EARLIER RECEIVED THAT THE SOUS PREFECT OF RUHANGO (GR 7653) HAD BEEN RELEASED FROM CUSTODY AND RESUMED HIS DUTIES ON 20 JUL 95. THE SOUS PREFECT HAD BEEN ACCUSED OF TAKING PART IN THE GENOCIDE BUT CHARGES WERE DROPPED WHEN FOUND NOT TRUE. HE REQUESTED THAT THE MALICOY PLATOON IN RUHANGO SHOULD REMAIN THERE FOR SECURITY REASONS. MILOBS ASSESS THAT THERE WAS A CONSIDERABLE MEASURE OF INSECURITY IN THE RUHANGO AREA.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 1B REPORTED THAT ON 27 JUL AT ABOUT 2230HRS, A LOUD SCREAM WAS HEARD AND AFTER A SHORT TIME THE HOUSE OF THE SOUS PREFECT OF RUHANGO GR 7723 EXPLODED IN FLAMES. THE NEXT DAY THE RPA BRIGADE COMMNDER CONFIRMED THE KILLING OF THE SOUS PREFECT, MR KOLONI PLACIDE, HIS WIFE AND THREE OTHER MEMBERS OF HIS FAMILY, BECAUSE THEY WERE HATED BY LOCALS. THEY ALLEGED THAT HE KILLED A LOT OF PEOPLE DURING THE GENOCIDE PERIOD. IT IS STRONGLY BELIEVED THAT HIS RELEASE AND REINSTATEMENT INFURIATED THE RPA AND THE LOCALS, HENCE THE ACT OF ARSON AND MULTIPLE MURDER. IT IS CONFIRMED THAT THE DEATH TOLL IS FIVE.

(4) SECTOR 3B MILOBS REPORTED THAT MINISTER OF REHABILITATION WITH SOME MEMBERS OF PARLIAMENT AND BUTARE AUTHORITIES ATTENDED A REBURIAL CEREMONY OF THE 1994 GENOCIDE VICTIMS AT RUNYINYA COMMUNE (GR 6012).

(5) THE PRIME MINISTER, ACCOMPANIED BY THE GITARAMA PREFECT AND A CONVOY OF EIGHT VEHICLES, VISITED THE RUHANGO SOUS-PREFECTURE ON THE 29 JUL 95 AT 1235 HRS TO SEE THE MURDER SCENE. THE MINISTER OF

INTERIOR REQUESTED TO SPEAK TO THE MALI CONTINGENT AT THE GITARAMA PREFECTURE. THE CONTINGENT COMMANDER EXPLAINED TO THE MINISTER THAT IT HAD NOT BEEN POSSIBLE FOR HIS TROOPS TO INTERVENE DURING THE MURDER BECAUSE WHEN IT WAS REALIZED THAT A MURDER MIGHT HAVE BEEN IN PROGRESS IT WAS TOO LATE TO PREVENT IT DUE TO THE INTENSITY OF THE FIRE. THE PRESENCE OF AN RPA SOLDIER AT THE DOOR OF THE SOUS-PREFECT'S HOUSE FURTHER CONTRIBUTED TO THE MALIAN TROOPS DECISION TO SIMPLY MONITOR THE SITUATION.

(B) BORDERS. THE FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED TO TRAFFIC DURING THE PERIOD:

I. MILOB PTL TO KAYENZI COMMUNE (GR 8389) HANDED OVER SOME PLASTIC SHEETS AND GLOVES TO LOCALS AND ATTENDED A RE-BURIAL CEREMONY IN BUTARE SECTOR (GR 8384). THE CEREMONY WHICH WAS ATTENDED BY ABOUT 300 LOCALS WAS SUPPORTED BY THE CATHOLIC CHURCH. THE REMAINS OF 10 PERSONS OF THE SAME FAMILY WERE PUT IN THREE CASKETS AND REBURIED. THE OFFICIATING PRIEST STRESSED THE NEED FOR RECONCILIATION.

II. MILOB CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN TARE AND TO THE BURUNDIAN BORDER POST AT RUTETE. PATROL TO THE BORDER OBSERVED UNHCR-ORGANISED RETURN OF 33 RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI. THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS NORMAL IN ALL AREAS PATROLLED.

III. MILOB CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN GIKORO, RUBONGO AND KANOMBE COMMUNES. IN GIKORO COMMUNE THE PATROL GATHERED THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

(I) INVESTIGATION INTO THE MURDER OF THE SOUS PREFECT OF RUHANGO AND HIS FAMILY IS BEING CARRIED OUT BY THE GENDARMERIE WHICH FOUND OUT THAT A MALI SOLDIER HAD BEEN IN THE HOUSE OF THE SOUS PREFECT "A FEW MOMENTS" BEFORE THE MURDER. THE MALI CONTINGENT CDR INSTRUCTED TO MAKE THE MALI WITNESS SOLDIER AVAILABLE TO THE GENDARMERIE IN RUHANGO.

(II) DISCUSSIONS ARE GOING ON BETWEEN THE SECTOR CDR AND THE RPA BRIGADE CDR REGARDING THE EXTREME OVERCROWDING OF THE GITARAMA PRISON. THE BRIGADE CDR EXPRESSED WILLINGNESS TO TPT THE PRISONERS AS SOON AS HE IS TOLD WHERE HE CAN TAKE THEM TO. 2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. SOUTH AFRICAN ARCHBISHOP DESMOND TUTU ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 29 JUL 95 FOR A THREE-DAY VISIT TO RWANDA. ON SUNDAY, HE CONDUCTED A CHURCH SERVICE AT A STADIUM IN KIGALI DURING WHICH HE REPORTEDLY URGED FORGIVENESS AND RECONCILIATION ON THE PART OF THE POPULATION. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT, SPEAKING ON THIS OCCASION, RWANDESE PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU STATED THAT "WE CANNOT RECONCILE WITH CRIMINALS BECAUSE GOD HIMSELF CANNOT RECONCILE WITH THE DEVIL".

B. THE BRITISH MINISTER OF COOPERATION, BARONESS LYNDAL CHALKER, ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON SUNDAY FOR A ONE-DAY VISIT. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, SHE ANNOUNCED THAT THE UNITED KINGDOM WAS OBSERVING CLOSELY THE POLITICAL SITUATION IN RWANDA, AND WAS CONCERNED ABOUT THE INCREASING INSECURITY IN THE GREAT LAKES REGION. SHE ALSO REPORTEDLY STATED THAT HER COUNTRY SUPPORTED THE IDEA OF CONVENING A REGIONAL CONFERENCE TO DISCUS THE PROBLEMS OF THE SUB-REGION.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) SECTOR 5B GISENYI REPORTED THAT THE RPA LIAISON OFFICER WAS REPLACED TODAY BY A NEW LO. HE IS A PLATOON COMMANDER WITH THE GISENYI RPA BN. THE OLD LO IS BEING POSTED AS THE BN COMMISSAR AT MUKAMIRA (SQ 4521) RPA BN.

(2) SECTOR 1B REPORTED THAT THE RPA BN AT KAYENZI COMMUNE (GR 8389) HAS BEEN REPLACED BY THE 11 BN COMMANDED BY MAJOR KAZUNGO WILSON. THIS CHANGE TOOK PLACE ON 30 JULY 95 WITHOUT PREVIOUS INTIMATION.

(3) SECTOR 1B FURTHER REPORTED A NEW RPA CHECKPOINT AT RUHONGO SOUS PREFECTURE.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(A) PTL TO MUSANGE COMMUNE GR 5347 IN SECTOR 3A REPORTED THAT:

(I) ON 23 JULY 95, A LOCAL MAN AGED 37 WAS REPORTEDLY SHOT AND KILLED BY AN RPA SOLDIER AT CYABASANA SECTOR (GR 5350). INVESTIGATION REVEALED THAT THE RPA SOLDIER BELONGS TO A UNIT STATIONED AT GITARAMA. INVESTIGATION ONGOING.

(B) DISCUSSIONS ARE GOING ON BETWEEN THE SECTOR COMMANDER AND RPA BRIGADE COMMANDER CONCERNING THE EXTREME OVERCROWDING IN THE GITARAMA PRISON. THE BRIGADE COMMANDER EXPRESSED WILLINGNESS TO TPT THE PRISONERS AS SOON AS HE IS TOLD WHERE HE CAN TAKE THEM TO. HE AUTHORIZED THE ICRC TO TAKE VIDEO FOOTAGE SO THAT THE URGENCY OF THE SITUATION COULD BE CONVEYED TO THE AUTHORITIES.

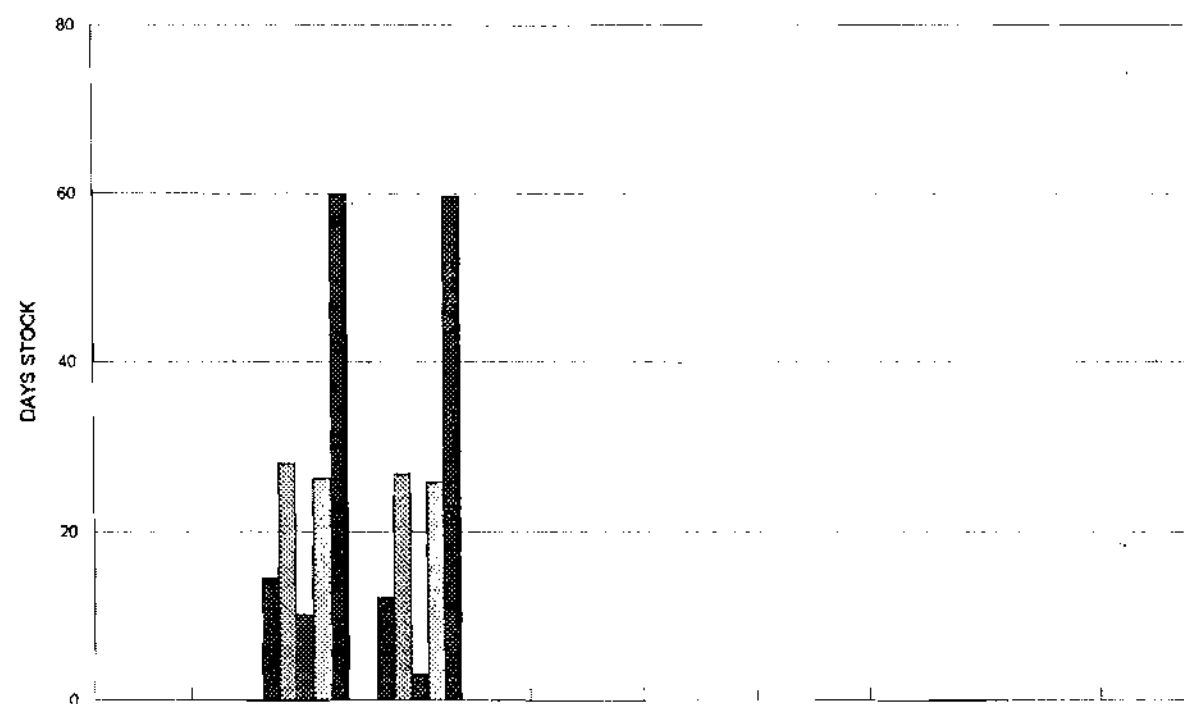

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) A CONVOY OF AMPHIBIOUS ARMoured VEHICLES, ONE OF WHICH HAD A HEAVY-CALIBRE GUN MOUNTED, MOVED FROM THE DIRECTION OF THE AIRPORT TOWARDS KIGALI TOWN. THE CONVOY WAS BEING LED BY A PICK-UP VAN DRIVEN BY A LIEUTENANT. ANOTHER VAN LOADED WITH ARMED MEN ESCORTED THE CONVOY. FURTHER DETAILS BEING VERIFIED.

(2) A GROUP OF 10 RPA SOLDIERS WERE FOUND IN KAMEMBE SECTOR 4 WEARING ETHIOBATT UNIFORMS. IN ADDITION ONE WAS FOUND WEARING A LIGHT BLUE BERET. RPA COMD BEING INFORMED.

(3) RPA BRIGADE COMD, LT COL KAYONGA SENT A LETTER EXPRESSING HIS REGRETS TO SECTOR 3B COMD FOR NOT ATTENDING A FUNCTION HE WAS INVITED TO ATTEND. HE ALSO REQUESTED AN AUDIENCE WITH THE SECTOR COMD TO "IRON OUT SOME ISSUES" ON 30 JUL 95 AT 0900 HRS.

(4) RPA MOUNTED A ROAD BLOCK 200M AWAY FROM GHANBATT COY HQ LOCATION IN RUKIRA IN A DILAPIDATED BANK BUILDING (GR 6565). THEIR INTENTION IS NOT KNOWN.

(5) ROTATION OF RPA IN SUB-SECTOR ALPHA STILL IN PROGRESS.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. REPORTED THAT AT KAVUNE CELLULE (GR 9740), IN NYAMASHEKE SUB SECTOR, AT ABOUT 2300 HRS ON 27 JUL 95, A GROUP OF BANDITS ARMED WITH RIFLES AND MACHETES BROKE INTO THE HOUSE OF A MAN AND SHOT THE SON IN THE ARM. THE BANDITS WERE FORCED TO FLEE BY LOCALS NEARBY WHO WENT TO THEIR NEIGHBOUR'S AID. THE RPA WHO ARRIVED ON THE SCENE SHORTLY AFTER RECOVERED A MACHETTE, SOME EMPTY CARTRIDGES AND ONE LIVE CARTRIDGE FOR A BELGIAN "CEFRONI" WEAPON.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) ON 28 JUL 95 THE FC VISITED THE PROJECT SITE OF THE RWANDESE AGENCY FOR DEVELOPMENT AND COOPERATION CHIHARA COMMUNE WITH THE RESIDENT ENGINEER. MUCH OF THE PROJECT IS BEING FUNDED BY WFP AS PART OF A FOOD FOR WORK PROGRAM. THE PROJECT COORDINATOR REQUIRES MORE TRANSPORTATION ABILITY TO HAUL WOOD AND BRICKS FROM THE BRICK SITE TO HOME BUILDING SITES. TO DATE ONLY UNAMIR MILITARY HAVE PROVIDED TRANSPORT AND OTHER ASSISTANCE TO THIS PROJECT COORDINATED BY MR CARBONARA AND HEADED BY MRS KAGAME. IT IS UNCERTAIN BUT OPTIONS TO INCREASE

UNAMIR VEHICLES TO THE PROJECT ARE BEING CONSIDERED AMONGST OTHER NEEDS IN UNAMIR'S LIMITED TRANSPORT RESOURCES.

(2) THE FC AND ED MET ON 28 JUL 95 WITH THE VISITING ZAMBIAN DELEGATION HEADED BY LT GEN N SIMBEYE, COMMANDER ZAMBIAN ARMY. DURING THE MEETING THE FC HIGHLIGHTED THE OUTSTANDING CONTRIBUTION OF THE ZAMBIAN TROOPS TO UNAMIR'S EFFORTS. FC RECEIVED A COURTESY VISIT FROM LT GEN SIMBEYE ON HIS DEPARTURE 29 JUL 95. THE FC ALSO GAVE A SHORT INTERVIEW TO VISITING ZAMBIAN JOURNALISTS AFTERWARD.

(3) FC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO INDBATT HQ ON 28 JUL AND WAS BRIEFED DURING THE VISIT ON INDBATT CURRENT OPS IN THE THEATRE. HE LATER VISITED 95 CMSG (COMPOSITE MISSION SUPPORT GROUP) TO ASSESS THE PROGRESS OF WORK BEING UNDER TAKEN TO ACCOMMODATE UNIT TROOPS IN THE COMPOUND. HE OBSERVED THE PROGRESS OF ERECTION OF WEATHER HAVEN SHELTERS AND GENERAL LAYOUT OF THE PLANNED ACCOMMODATION OF THE CMSG SOLDIERS, AND ALSO THE LOCATIONS FOR MEDICAL TEAMS AND UN CIVILIAN OFFICE SPACE. MOST FACILITIES ARE PLANNED FOR READINESS BY 15 AUGUST 95.

(4) FC ATTENDED A FORMAL DINING OUT RECEPTION ON 29 JUL 95 WITH OFFICERS OF THE AUSTRALIAN CONTINGENT WHO WILL BE DEPARTING APPROX 23 AUGUST.

(B) THE PRIME MINISTER, ACCOMPANIED BY THE GITARAMA PREFECT AND A LARGE DELEGATION OF EIGHT VEHICLES, VISITED THE RUHANGO SOUS-PREFECTURE ON THE 29 JUL 95 AT 1235 HRS TO SEE THE MURDER SCENE. THE MINISTER OF INTERIOR REQUESTED TO SPEAK TO THE MALI CONTINGENT AT THE GITARAMA PREFECTURE. THE CONTINGENT COMMANDER EXPLAINED TO THE MINISTER THAT IT HAD NOT BEEN POSSIBLE FOR HIS TROOPS TO INTERVENE DURING THE MURDER BECAUSE BY THE TIME IT WAS REALIZED THAT A MURDER MIGHT HAVE BEEN IN PROGRESS. 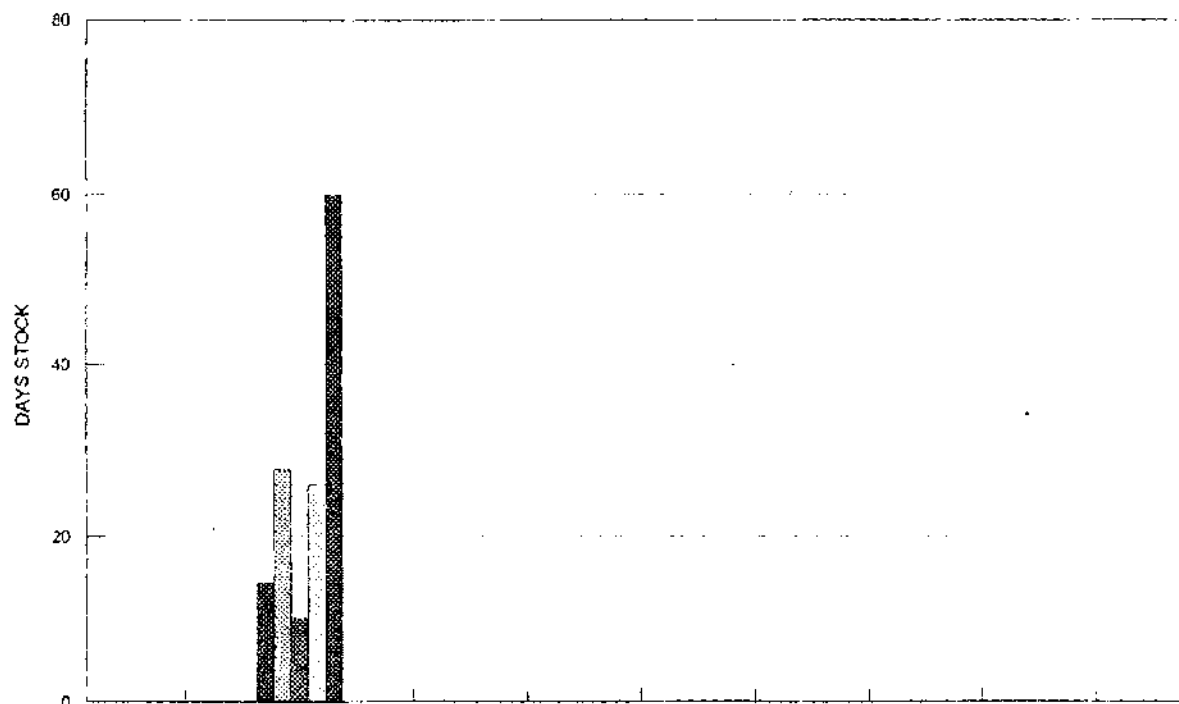

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. KLAUS KINKEL, ENDED HIS FOUR-DAY OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA YESTERDAY. THE GERMAN EMBASSY ANNOUNCED IN A COMMUNIQUE DATED 27 JUL 95 THAT MR. KINKEL SIGNED AN AGREEMENT WITH THE RWANDESE FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, TO PROVIDE RWANDA WITH DM 50 MILLION OF ASSISTANCE TO BE USED IN THE AREAS OF HEALTH, EDUCATION AND JUSTICE, AS WELL AS THE PRIVATE SECTOR.

B. IN A PRESS CONFERENCE GIVEN PRIOR TO HIS DEPARTURE FROM KIGALI, MR. KINKEL STATED THAT THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT SHOULD MAKE VISIBLE EFFORTS ABROAD TO DEMONSTRATE ITS FIRM COMMITMENT TO THE RETURN OF RWANDESE REFUGEES. REGARDING THE DEPLORABLE CONDITIONS IN RWANDESE PRISONS, MR. KINKEL STATED THAT IT IS NOW NECESSARY TO DO EVERYTHING POSSIBLE TO ENSURE THAT NEW INJUSTICES ARE NOT ADDED TO THOSE OF THE PAST IN RWANDA. HE ALSO CITED THE IMPERATIVE AND URGENT NEED OF CONVENING A CONFERENCE TO ADDRESS THE PROBLEMS OF THE SUB-REGION.

C. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED TODAY THAT UNAMIR TROOPS LEFT RUHENGERI PREFECTURE IN NORTHWESTERN RWANDA WITHOUT PAYING COMPENSATION TO THE LOCAL POPULATION FOR CROP DAMAGE CAUSED BY UNAMIR TROOPS IN FIELD USED AS ENCAMPMENT SITES DESPITE PREVIOUSLY AGREEING TO DO SO. COMMENT: THIS REFERS TO THE ARMED ATTACK ON TUNBATT AT MUSOGU WHICH RESULTED IN APC MOVEMENT CAUSING CROP DAMAGE. INVESTIGATIONS ARE COMPLETE AND UNAMIR CFO IS STAFFING COMPENSATION CLAIM.

B. FRGE/MILITIA/BANDITRY. MILOB IN SECTOR 1B REPORTED THAT RPA BRIGADE COMD IN THE SECTOR CONFIRMED THE KILLING OF MR. KOLONI PLACIDE, HIS SPOUSE AND THREE OTHER MEMBERS OF HIS FAMILY BECAUSE THEY WERE HATED BY THE LOCALS. THEY ALLEGED

THAT HE KILLED A LOT OF PEOPLE DURING THE GENOCIDE PERIOD. HE WAS RELEASED FROM DETENTION AND HAD RESUMED HIS DUTIES AS SOUS PREFECT. IT IS STRONGLY BELIEVED THAT HIS RELEASE AND REINSTATEMENT INFURIATED THE RPA AND THE LOCALS, HENCE THE ACT OF ARSON AND MULTIPLE MURDER. IT IS NOW CONFIRMED THAT THE DEATH TOLL IS FIVE. (THIS IS AN UPDATE OF YESTERDAY'S SITREP, REF MILOB SFCT 1B REPORT PARA 5D).

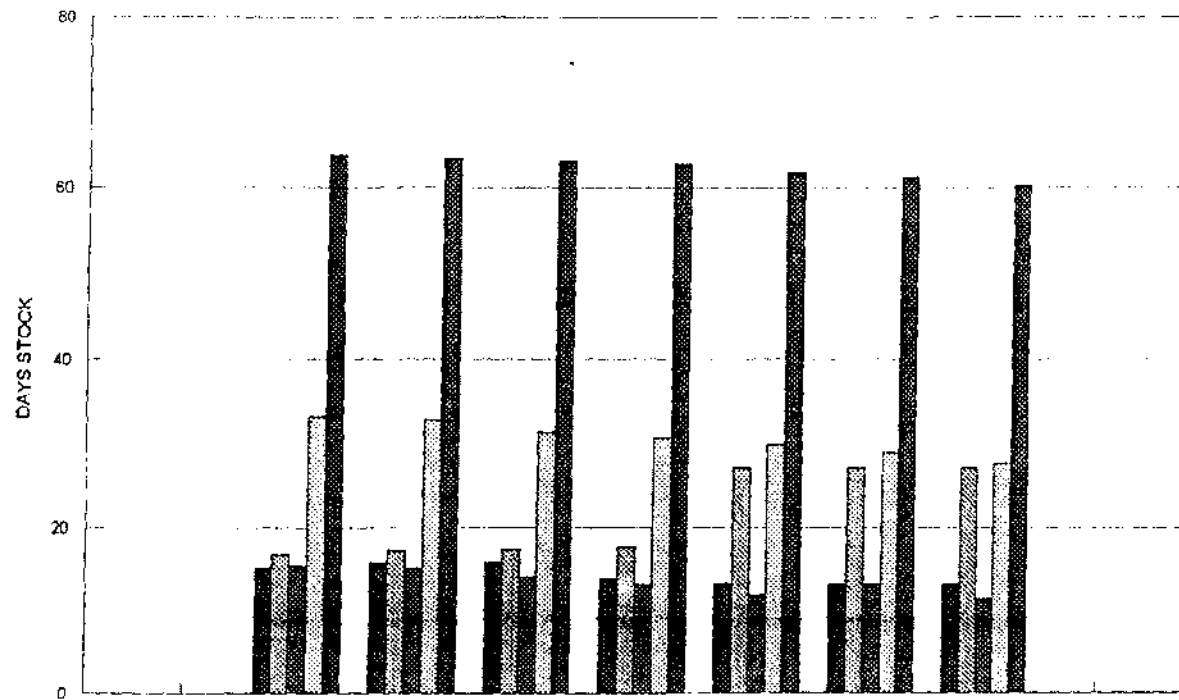

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIREAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

A. THE GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. KLAUS KINKEL, ATTENDED AN OFFICIAL DINNER LAST NIGHT GIVEN BY THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME. AT THE RECEPTION, MR. KINKEL STATED THAT GERMAN AID TO RWANDA WOULD BE CONTINGENT UPON THE ACHIEVEMENT OF GREATER PROGRESS BY RWANDA IN THE AREAS OF REFUGEE RETURN, PRISON CONDITIONS AND THE REHABILITATION OF THEIR JUSTICE SYSTEM.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT AT A MEETING HELD BY THE PREFECT OF KIGALI RURAL PREFECTURE TO DISCUSS THE GENERAL SECURITY SITUATION, THE PARTICIPANTS STATED THAT THE GENERAL SECURITY SITUATION WAS GOOD DESPITE ACTS OF BANDITRY IN THE COMMUNES NEIGHBOURING KIGALI. THEY ALSO EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF PROPERTY DISPUTES AMONG THE LOCAL POPULATION.

(2) AIR VICE MARSHALL COX (AUSTRALIA) PAID THE FC A COURTESY CALL ON HIS DEPARTURE. THEY REVIEWED HIS VISIT TO UNAMIR.

(2) FC ATTENDED ZAMBATT II MEDAL PARADE IN GIKONGORO. ZAMBATT II IS EXPECTED TO DEPART THE MISSION ON 3-4 AUGUST AFTER ASSUMING CONTROL OF THEIR SECTOR AMIDST THE KIBEHO CAMP SITUATION. THE FC HIGHLIGHTED THE STERLING CONTRIBUTION OF HUMANITARIAN AID AND LOGISTIC SUPPORT GIVEN DURING THEIR TENURE IN SOUTHERN RWANDA. OVER 20,000 RWANDESE RECEIVED MEDICAL TREATMENT AT ZAMBIAN AID STATIONS WHILE THEIR VEHICLES CARRIED MORE THEN 46,000 IDPs TO VARIOUS COMMUNES THROUGHOUT RWANDA. THE PREFECT, THE RPA BN COMD AND SENIOR UNAMIR STAFF ATTENDED THE PARADE. THE ZAMBIAN ARMY COMD AND HIS SENIOR STAFF ARRIVED FROM ZAMBIA IN TIME FOR THE LATER FESTIVITIES.

MEMBERS IN THE GENOCIDE. PRISON CONDITIONS WERE  
REPORTED TO BE BAD. THE TEAM ALSO VISITED SHYIRA  
SECTEUR (GR 9151) AND RECEIVED COMPLAINTS FROM  
LOCALS ABOUT SHORTAGE OF FOOD AND AGRICULTURAL  
MATERIALS.

(B) ANOTHER MILOB PATROL ASSISTED THE LOCAL  
AUTHORITIES TO CONVEY STATIONERY FROM THE  
PREFECTURE TO NYABIKENKE COMMUNE (GR 7292).

(C) CIVPOL PATROLS TO MASANGO COMMUNE (GR 6254)

REPORTED RUMOURS AMONG LOCALS OF ATROCITIES TO BE COMMITTED AGAINST THEM ONCE THE ARMED UN TROOPS LEAVE THE AREA. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED OF ALLEGED TORTURE OF PRISONERS IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT. ALL AREAS PATROLLED WERE FOUND CALM. MILOBS TO INVESTIGATE REPORT.

(D) MILOBS REPORTED THAT AT 2200 HRS ON 27 JUL 95 A SOLDIER FROM THE MALI PLATOON LOCATED AT RUHANGO (GR 7723) NOTICED AN ARMED RPA SOLDIER AT THE FRONT ENTRANCE OF THE SOUS PREFECT'S HOUSE. AT ABOUT 2230 HRS, A LOUD SCREAM WAS HEARD AND AFTER A SHORT TIME THE HOUSE EXPLODED IN FLAMES. NO NEIGHBOURS CAME TO THE SCENE TO HELP. SINCE THE HOUSE WAS SURROUNDED BY A FENCE THE MALI PLATOON COULD ONLY WATCH THE HOUSE BURN. AT 2320 HRS TWO RPA SOLDIERS REPORTEDLY WENT INSIDE THE HOUSE PERIMETER AND PICKED UP A 20-LITRE PLASTIC JERRYCAN WHICH WAS LEFT THERE. THEY ASKED THE MALIAN TROOPS WHETHER THEY KNEW IF ANYONE LIVED IN THE HOUSE. THE RPA SOLDIERS DECIDED TO GO AND SEEK INFO ELSEWHERE WHEN THEY RECEIVED A NEGATIVE ANSWER. MILOBS DO NOT YET KNOW WHETHER ANYONE WAS IN THE HOUSE PRIOR TO THE FIRE. HOWEVER, ARSON AND A POSSIBLE MURDER OF THE SOUS-PREFECT OF GITARAMA IS SUSPECTED. A JOINT MILOB/CIVPOL TEAM WILL VISIT SITE FIRST LIGHT 28 JUL 95 FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS.

(6) IN SECTOR 2A BYUMBA. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

(7) IN SECTOR 2B KIBUNGO. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

(B) MILOBS PATROL TO RWAMIKO COMMUNE (GR 4914) REPORTED THAT ALL IDPs WHO HAVE SINCE RETURNED TO THE VARIOUS SECTORS HAVE BEEN WELL SETTLED WITH THEIR RELATIVES. THE TEAM WAS ALSO INFORMED BY THE INSPECTOR OF SCHOOLS THAT SCHOOL ATTENDANCE HAS BEEN INCREASING DAILY DUE TO THE RETURN OF IDPs.

(C) THE PATROL TEAM TO KARAMA COMMUNE (GR 6327) WAS ACCOMPANIED BY THE DCMO. THE DCMO INTERACTED WITH LOCALS AND ADVISED THEM TO BE SELF-RELIANT BY LEARNING TO MANUFACTURE SIMPLE FARMING TOOLS FOR THEMSELVES. THE TEAM WAS INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT IDPs WHO RETURNED FROM KIBEHO IDP CAMP WERE LIVING IN VERY DEPLORABLE CONDITIONS DUE TO LACK OF FOOD AND FARMING IMPLEMENTS.

(9) IN SECTOR 3B - BUTARE. CONDUCTED PTL IN AOR. NSTR.

(10) IN SECTOR 4 - CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROL TO KAGANO COMMUNE WERE INFORMED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT LATE IN THE EVENING OF 25 JUL 95 (EXACT TIME UNKNOWN) A BOAT WITH AT LEAST TWO BANDITS FROM IJWI ISLAND CAME TO ISHARA PENINSULA (EXACT LOCATION UNKNOWN). THERE WAS AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN RPA TROOPS AND THE BANDITS RESULTING IN THE DEATH OF ONE BANDIT WHILST AN RPA SOLDIER WAS INJURED IN THE ANKLE. THE INJURED SOLDIER WAS TREATED AT THE GIHUNDWE HOSPITAL IN CYANGUGU ON 26 JUL 95 AND DISCHARGED. A STAFF AT NYAMASHEKE HOSPITAL CONFIRMED INCIDENT TO MILOBS.

(C) MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN THE AOR. PATROL TEAM TO RUSIZI I REPORTED THAT AN EX-MEMBER OF THE FRGF WAS AMONG RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE WHO ARRIVED AT THE BORDER. HE WAS IDENTIFIED BY THE LOCAL CHIEF OF GENDARMERIE TO MILOBS AND UNHCR REPS. HE WAS ESCORTED TO THE LOCAL GENDARMERIE OFFICE FOR AN INQUIRY INTO HIS INVOLVEMENT OR OTHERWISE IN GENOCIDE. THE MAN WISHES TO SERVE WITH THE PRESENT GENDARMERIE AT GITARAMA. UNHCR WILL FOLLOW CASE. SITUATION WAS NORMAL IN ALL AREAS PATROLLED.

(11) IN SECTOR 5A - RUHENGERI.

(A) MILOB TEAMS PATROLLED HONDO (GR 6829), BUTARO (GR 8144), KIDAHU (GR 7147) AND CYERU (GR 8035). MILOBS WERE INFORMED THAT A GROUP OF PEOPLE FROM UGANDA BORDER HAD STOLEN A MINERAL CALLED WOLFRANG FROM A MINE AT RWERERE (GR 8534) IN COMMUNE CYERU. COUNSELLOR OF SECTEUR RWERERE HAS BEEN ARRESTED ON SUSPICION FOR COLLABORATING WITH THE THIEVES.

(12) IN SECTOR 5B-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO RWERERE COMMUNE (GR 2722) REPORTED SEVERAL INCIDENTS OF THEFT OF PERSONAL EFFECTS AND LIVESTOCK. IN MUHANDA (GR 2419), LOCALS REPORTED THAT THE THIEVES WHO ALWAYS CAME ARMED DID NOT OFFER VIOLENCE UNLESS WHEN PROVOKED. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED THAT ONE OF THE THIEVES USUALLY CAME WEARING A PAIR OF MILITARY TROUSERS AND A T-SHIRT WITH MNRD WRITTEN ON IT. A LETTER PURPORTED TO HAVE

BEEN WRITTEN BY A LT OF THE FRGF, NOW KNOWN TO BE IN GOMA, WAS FOUND AT THE SCENE OF A RECENT THEFT.

(C) MILOB TEAM DESPATCHED TO THE UNHCR CAMP AT KABAKI (GR 3018) TO INVESTIGATE CASES OF STEALING OF UNHCR ITEMS HAD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE RPA COY COMD AT THE LOCATION. RPA COMD RESOLVED TO ADDRESS THE SITUATION. THE SITUATION WAS NORMAL IN ALL AREAS PATROLLED.

(13) IN SECTOR 5C-KIBUYE. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN KIBUYE TOWN (GR 2772) IN GITESI COMMUNE AND MURUNDI (GR 5573) AND NYAMINAMBE (GR 4968) IN BWAKIRA COMMUNE. AT THE KIBUYE HOSPITAL WHERE A WARD HAS RECENTLY OPENED FOR INMATES OF THE KIBUYE PRISON MILOBS MET TWO MEN WITH WOUNDS RESULTING FROM BEATING. ONE WAS BEING TREATED FOR A FLAYED CHEST ALLEGEDLY CAUSED BY A RIFLE BUTT. 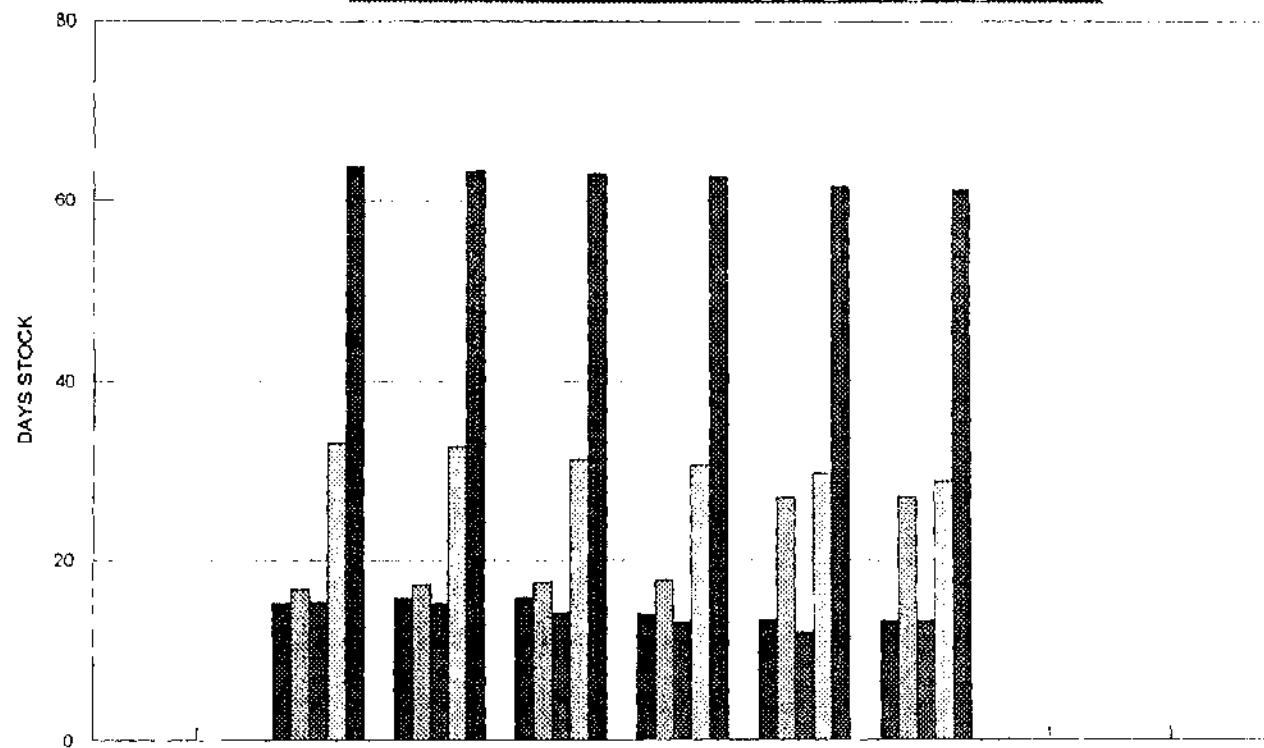



A. THE GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. KLAUS KINKEL, ATTENDED AN OFFICIAL DINNER LAST NIGHT GIVEN BY THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME. AT THE RECEPTION, MR. KINKEL STATED THAT GERMAN AID TO RWANDA WOULD BE CONTINGENT UPON THE ACHIEVEMENT OF GREATER PROGRESS BY RWANDA IN THE AREAS OF REFUGEE RETURN, PRISON CONDITIONS AND THE REHABILITATION OF THEIR JUSTICE SYSTEM.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT AT A MEETING HELD BY THE PREFECT OF KIGALI RURAL PREFECTURE TO DISCUSS THE GENERAL SECURITY SITUATION, THE PARTICIPANTS STATED THAT THE GENERAL SECURITY SITUATION WAS GOOD DESPITE ACTS OF BANDITRY IN THE COMMUNES NEIGHBOURING KIGALI. THEY ALSO EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF PROPERTY DISPUTES AMONG THE LOCAL POPULATION.

(2) AIR VICE MARSHALL COX (AUSTRALIA) PAID THE FC A COURTESY CALL ON HIS DEPARTURE. THEY REVIEWED HIS VISIT TO UNAMIR.

(2) FC ATTENDED ZAMBATT II MEDAL PARADE IN GIKONGORO. ZAMBATT II IS EXPECTED TO DEPART THE MISSION ON 3-4 AUGUST AFTER ASSUMING CONTROL OF THEIR SECTOR AMIDST THE KIBEHO CAMP SITUATION. THE FC HIGHLIGHTED THE STERLING CONTRIBUTION OF HUMANITARIAN AID AND LOGISTIC SUPPORT GIVEN DURING THEIR TENURE IN SOUTHERN RWANDA. OVER 20,000 RWANDESE RECEIVED MEDICAL TREATMENT AT ZAMBIAN AID STATIONS WHILE THEIR VEHICLES CARRIED MORE THEN 46,000 IDPs TO VARIOUS COMMUNES THROUGHOUT RWANDA. THE PREFECT, THE RPA BN COMD AND SENIOR UNAMIR STAFF ATTENDED THE PARADE. THE ZAMBIAN ARMY COMD AND HIS SENIOR STAFF ARRIVED FROM ZAMBIA IN TIME FOR THE LATER FESTIVITIES.

(1) MALICOY PROVIDED TWO BEDFORD TRUCKS TO TRANSPORT FOUR TONS OF FOODSTUFFS FROM GITARAMA TO KAYENZI COMMUNE (GR 8389) AND COOKING WOOD FOR KABGAYI ORPHANAGE.

(3) ABOUT 20 CHILDREN FROM CYEZA ORPHANAGE WERE TREATED ON 27 JUL 95 BY MALICOY IN ITS CLINIC FACILITY.

(4) INDBATT GUARDS AT PRESIDENTIAL HANGAR SUSPECTED A RPA SGT HAVING PICKED UP BATTERIES WHILE WALKING PAST AT 270015 HRS. WHEN THE GUARDS ASKED FOR A SEARCH THE SGT COOPERATED AND THE BATTERIES WERE RECOVERED.

(5) 110 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA CAMP FROM GISENYI AND GASHORA. 119 IDPs WERE DISPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO, KIGALI AND GASHORA. A TOTAL OF 249 IDPs STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

(6) ONE TRUCK WAS PROVIDED TO ARDEC (AGENCE RWANDAISE POUR LE DEVELOPPEMENT ET LA COOP) FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FOR COOKING BRICKS IN RUNDA PARISH. THE TRUCK CARRIED WOOD FROM KIBAYA TO RUNDA, SHELI TO YAMAHARO AND BISENYI.

(7) MEDICAL STAFF PROVIDED FIRST AID TO A 10-YR-OLD BOY WHO WAS BROUGHT BY MPs TO INDBATT RAP AT SOALTEE AT NOON. HE WAS IN A CRITICAL CONDITION AFTER BEING HIT BY THE ZAMBIAN ARMY COMMANDER'S ESCORT VEHICLE. HE WAS RESUSCITATED AND TRANSFERRED TO CIVIL HOSPITAL IN INDBATT AMBULANCE. HE REMAINS IN CRITICAL CONDITION.

(8) MED STAFF TREATED 24 MEDICAL AND 01 DENTAL PATIENT IN AOR.

(B) GISENYI AND RUSIZI I AND II BORDER POSTS WERE CLOSED TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE.

(3) MILOB GP HQ. NORMAL ACTIVITIES WERE PERFORMED.

(4) IN SECTOR 1A - KIGALI.

(A) MILOBS PATROLS IN MUSASA AND MBOGO COMMUNES AND MET WITH THE BOURGEMESTRES OF THE TWO COMMUNES. THEY FOUND THE TWO COMMUNES TO BE AGRICULTURALLY RICH. THE SIT WAS CALM IN ALL AREAS PATROLLED.

(5) IN SECTOR 1B GITARAMA.

(A) ONE MILOB TEAM PATROLLED NTONGWE COMMUNE (GR 9057) AND MET WITH THE BOURGEMESTRE. THE TEAM ALSO VISITED THE COMMUNE CACHOT AND NOTICED AN INCREASE IN THE NUMBER OF PRISONERS THERE FROM THE PREVIOUS TOTAL OF 175 IN JUNE TO THE PRESENT TOTAL OF 237. MILOBS BELIEVED RECENT INCREASE DUE PARTLY TO TOUGH STAND OF BOURGEMESTRE AGAINST GENOCIDE SUSPECTS. BOURGEMESTRE IS SAID TO HAVE LOST ALL HIS FAMILY MEMBERS IN THE GENOCIDE. PRISON CONDITIONS WERE REPORTED TO BE BAD. THE TEAM ALSO VISITED SHYIRA SECTEUR (GR 9151) AND RECEIVED COMPLAINTS FROM LOCALS ABOUT SHORTAGE OF FOOD AND AGRICULTURAL MATERIALS.

(B) ANOTHER MILOB PATROL ASSISTED THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES TO CONVEY STATIONERY FROM THE PREFECTURE TO NYABIKENKE COMMUNE (GR 7292).

(C) CIVPOL PATROLS TO MASANGO COMMUNE (GR 6254)

REPORTED RUMOURS AMONG LOCALS OF ATROCITIES TO BE COMMITTED AGAINST THEM ONCE THE ARMED UN TROOPS LEAVE THE AREA. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED OF ALLEGED TORTURE OF PRISONERS IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT. ALL AREAS PATROLLED WERE FOUND CALM. MILOBS TO INVESTIGATE REPORT.

(D) MILOBS REPORTED THAT AT 2200 HRS ON 27 JUL 95 A SOLDIER FROM THE MALI PLATOON LOCATED AT RUHANGO (GR 7723) NOTICED AN ARMED RPA SOLDIER AT THE FRONT ENTRANCE OF THE SOUS PREFECT'S HOUSE. AT ABOUT 2230 HRS, A LOUD SCREAM WAS HEARD AND AFTER A SHORT TIME THE HOUSE EXPLODED IN FLAMES. NO NEIGHBOURS CAME TO THE SCENE TO HELP. SINCE THE HOUSE WAS SURROUNDED BY A FENCE THE MALI PLATOON COULD ONLY WATCH THE HOUSE BURN. AT 2320 HRS TWO RPA SOLDIERS REPORTEDLY WENT INSIDE THE HOUSE PERIMETER AND PICKED UP A 20-LITRE PLASTIC JERRYCAN WHICH WAS LEFT THERE. THEY ASKED THE MALIAN TROOPS WHETHER THEY KNEW IF ANYONE LIVED IN THE HOUSE. THE RPA SOLDIERS DECIDED TO GO AND SEEK INFO ELSEWHERE WHEN THEY RECEIVED A NEGATIVE ANSWER. MILOBS DO NOT YET KNOW WHETHER ANYONE WAS IN THE HOUSE PRIOR TO THE FIRE. HOWEVER, ARSON AND A POSSIBLE MURDER OF THE SOUS-PREFECT OF GITARAMA IS SUSPECTED. A JOINT MILOB/CIVPOL TEAM WILL VISIT SITE FIRST LIGHT 28 JUL 95 FOR FURTHER INVESTIGATIONS.

(B) MILOBS PATROL TO RWAMIKO COMMUNE (GR 4914) REPORTED THAT ALL IDPs WHO HAVE SINCE RETURNED TO THE VARIOUS SECTORS HAVE BEEN WELL SETTLED WITH THEIR RELATIVES. THE TEAM WAS ALSO INFORMED BY THE INSPECTOR OF SCHOOLS THAT SCHOOL ATTENDANCE HAS BEEN INCREASING DAILY DUE TO THE RETURN OF IDPs.

(C) THE PATROL TEAM TO KARAMA COMMUNE (GR 6327) WAS ACCOMPANIED BY THE DCMO. THE DCMO INTERACTED WITH LOCALS AND ADVISED THEM TO BE SELF-RELIANT BY LEARNING TO MANUFACTURE SIMPLE FARMING TOOLS FOR THEMSELVES. THE TEAM WAS INFORMED BY LOCALS THAT IDPs WHO RETURNED FROM KIBEHO IDP CAMP WERE LIVING IN VERY DEPLORABLE CONDITIONS DUE TO LACK OF FOOD AND FARMING IMPLEMENTS.

(9) IN SECTOR 3B - BUTARE. CONDUCTED PTL IN AOR. NSTR.

(10) IN SECTOR 4 - CYANGUGU.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROL TO KAGANO COMMUNE WERE INFORMED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE THAT LATE IN THE EVENING OF 25 JUL 95 (EXACT TIME UNKNOWN) A BOAT WITH AT LEAST TWO BANDITS FROM IJWI ISLAND CAME TO ISHARA PENINSULA (EXACT LOCATION UNKNOWN). THERE WAS AN EXCHANGE OF FIRE BETWEEN RPA TROOPS AND THE BANDITS RESULTING IN THE DEATH OF ONE BANDIT WHILST AN RPA SOLDIER WAS INJURED IN THE ANKLE. THE INJURED SOLDIER WAS TREATED AT THE GIHUNDWE HOSPITAL IN CYANGUGU ON 26 JUL 95 AND DISCHARGED. A STAFF AT NYAMASHEKE HOSPITAL CONFIRMED INCIDENT TO MILOBS.

(C) MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN THE AOR. PATROL TEAM TO RUSIZI I REPORTED THAT AN EX- MEMBER OF THE FRGF WAS AMONG RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE WHO ARRIVED AT THE BORDER. HE WAS IDENTIFIED BY THE LOCAL CHIEF OF GENDARMERIE TO MILOBS AND UNHCR REPS. HE WAS ESCORTED TO THE LOCAL GENDARMERIE OFFICE FOR AN INQUIRY INTO HIS INVOLVEMENT OR OTHERWISE IN GENOCIDE. THE MAN WISHES TO SERVE WITH THE PRESENT GENDARMERIE AT GITARAMA. UNHCR WILL FOLLOW CASE. SITUATION WAS NORMAL IN ALL AREAS PATROLLED.

(11) IN SECTOR 5A - RUHENGARI.

(A) MILOB TEAMS PATROLLED HONDO (GR 6829), BUTARO (GR 8144), KIDAHU (GR 7147) AND CYERU (GR 8035). MILOBS WERE INFORMED THAT A GROUP OF PEOPLE FROM UGANDA BORDER HAD STOLEN A MINERAL CALLED WOLFRANG FROM A MINE AT RWERERE (GR 8534) IN COMMUNE CYERU. COUNSELLOR OF SECTEUR RWERERE HAS BEEN ARRESTED ON SUSPICION FOR COLLABORATING WITH THE THIEVES.

(12) IN SECTOR 5B-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLS TO RWERERE COMMUNE (GR 2722) REPORTED SEVERAL INCIDENTS OF THEFT OF PERSONAL EFFECTS AND LIVESTOCK. IN MUHANDA (GR 2419), LOCALS REPORTED THAT THE THIEVES WHO ALWAYS CAME ARMED DID NOT OFFER VIOLENCE UNLESS WHEN PROVOKED. LOCALS ALSO REPORTED THAT ONE OF THE THIEVES USUALLY CAME WEARING A PAIR OF MILITARY TROUSERS AND A T-SHIRT WITH MNRD WRITTEN ON IT. A LETTER PURPORTED TO HAVE

BEEN WRITTEN BY A LT OF THE FRGF, NOW KNOWN TO BE IN GOMA, WAS FOUND AT THE SCENE OF A RECENT THEFT.

(C) MILOB TEAM DESPATCHED TO THE UNHCR CAMP AT KABAKI (GR 3018) TO INVESTIGATE CASES OF STEALING OF UNHCR ITEMS HAD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE RPA COY COMD AT THE LOCATION. RPA COMD RESOLVED TO ADDRESS THE SITUATION. THE SITUATION WAS NORMAL IN ALL AREAS PATROLLED.

(13) IN SECTOR 5C-KIBUYE. MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN KIBUYE TOWN (GR 2772) IN GITESI COMMUNE AND MURUNDI (GR 5573) AND NYAMINAMBE (GR 4968) IN BWAKIRA COMMUNE. AT THE KIBUYE HOSPITAL WHERE A WARD HAS RECENTLY OPENED FOR INMATES OF THE KIBUYE PRISON MILOBS MET TWO MEN WITH WOUNDS RESULTING FROM BEATING. ONE WAS BEING TREATED FOR A FLAYED CHEST ALLEGEDLY CAUSED BY A RIFLE BUTT. BOURGEMESTRE INFORMED MILOBS THAT THE INJURIES WERE CAUSED BY POLICEMEN WHO HAVE SINCE BEEN ADVISED AGAINST FUTURE ASSAULTS OF INMATES.

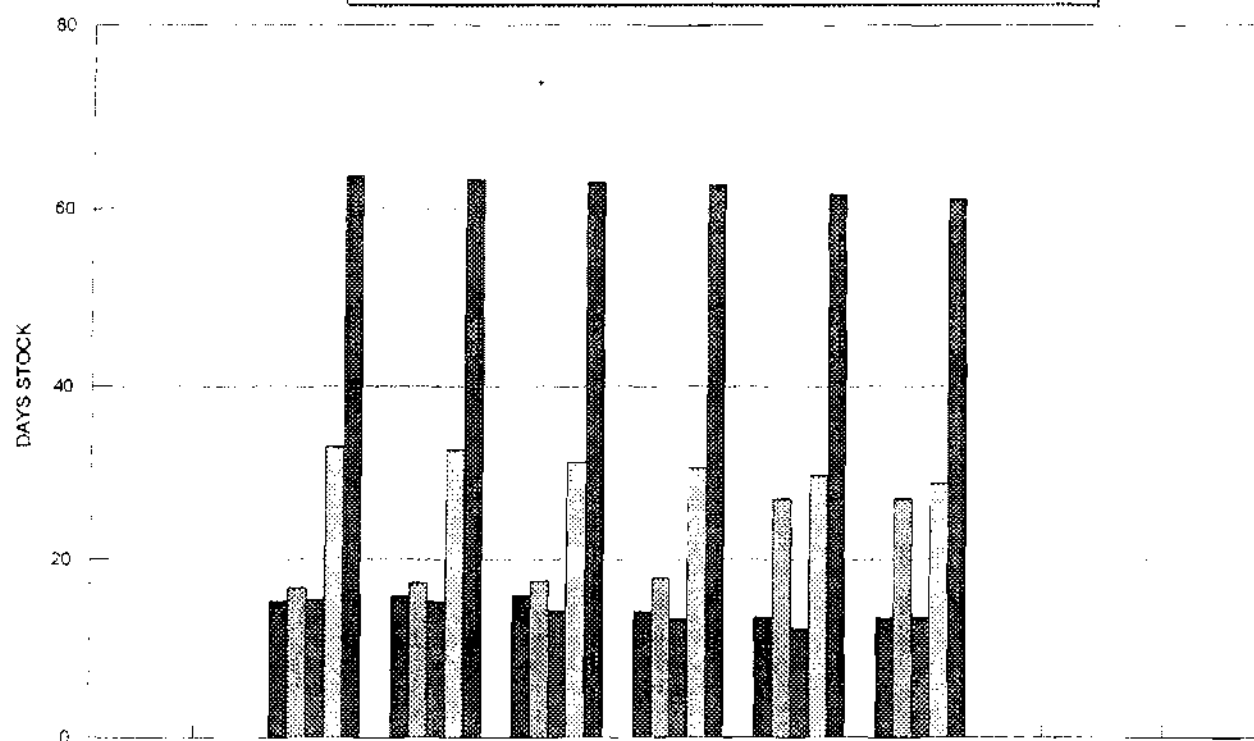

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

B. CIVPOL IN GITARAMA PREFECTURE PATROLLED KAYENZI COMMUNE AND REPORTED THAT A LOCAL JUDGE WHO WAS ARRESTED AND DETAINED IN NYAMABUYE PRISON ON 01 JUL 95 FOR ALLEGEDLY INCITING LOCALS IN THE COMMUNE TO INSIST ON THEIR RIGHTS WAS KILLED BY RPA WHEN HE ALLEGEDLY ATTEMPTED TO ESCAPE FROM PRISON CUSTODY. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER AND VICE CHANCELLOR, MR. KLAUS KINKEL, ARRIVED IN KIGALI YESTERDAY AND WAS GREETED AT THE AIRPORT BY THE RWANDESE VICE-PRESIDENT AND MINISTER OF DEFENCE, MAJOR GENERAL PAUL KAGAME. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED TODAY THAT HE IS EXPECTED TO DISCUSS THE ISSUE OF REFUGEES, AS WELL AS OTHER POLITICAL ISSUES WITH RWANDESE OFFICIALS. MR. KINKEL HAS REPORTEDLY STATED THAT GERMANY WAS SATISFIED WITH THE RETURN OF NORMALCY TO RWANDA, AND THAT IT WOULD ASSIST RWANDA IN EFFORTS TO STRENGTHEN PEACE IN THE COUNTRY AND CONTINUED ECONOMIC COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES.

B. THE FORCE COMMANDER HELD A MEETING WITH MR. KINKEL TODAY AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS DURING WHICH THEY DISCUSSED, AMONG OTHER THINGS, THE PROSPECTS FOR THE RETURN OF RWANDAN REFUGEES, THE DYNAMICS OF THE PRESENT RWANDESE GOVERNMENT AND THE UN ARMS EMBARGO ON RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) MILOBS FROM SECTOR 3 REPORTED THAT AT NYARUHENGGERI RPA ARE CONDUCTING INTENSIVE TRAINING IN DRILL AND FIRING PRACTICE.

(2) SECTOR 1 MILOB REPORTED THAT IN MUSAMBIRA SQ 8274 AND RUNDA SQ 9882 COMMUNES RPA SOLDIERS WERE NO LONGER CONDUCTING NIGHT PATROLS TO FIGHT BANDITRY. THEY HAVE DELEGATED THE TASK TO THE LOCALS WHO FORMED PATROL GROUPS AT THE CELLULE LEVEL.

(3) MILOBS FROM SECTOR 4 REPORTED THAT THE RPA LIAISON OFFICER ACCOMPANIED THE SECTOR COMMANDER TO INVESTIGATE THE BRUTAL KILLING OF A LOCAL BUSINESSMAN FROM KAMUHOZA (SQ 8127) IN KAMEMBE COMMUNE.

(4) THE LOCAL RPA COMD IN.....(PLACE/CITY) COMMUNE ENSURED THE SAFE RETURN OF THE REFUGEES FROM ZAIRE. AS OF NOW NO RETURNEES HAVE BEEN DETAINED BY THE RPA.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. SECTOR 4 MILOBS REPORTED THAT REFUGEES REPORTED THAT FRGF AND INTERHAMWE PATROL THE EASTERN SHORE OF IJWI ISLAND BOTH DAY AND NIGHT. THESE FORCES HAVE INTENSIFIED THEIR EFFORTS TO PREVENT THE REFUGEES FROM RETURNING TO RWANDA. MANY REFUGEES WERE ARRESTED AND SOME KILLED.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) FC VISITED AIRPORT TO BID FAREWELL TO CANADIANS FROM 95 FLGS WHO WERE RETURNING TO CANADA AFTER 6 MONTHS WITH UNAMIR. FC MET BRIEFLY WITH THE CO, DCO AND ALL DEPARTING MEN AND WOMEN OF THE UNIT BEFORE THEY BOARDED THEIR FLIGHT.

(3) FC VISITED AUSMED BARRACKS AND THE HOSPITAL. HE BRIEFLY ATTENDED A NURSING CONFERENCE AND A PADRES CONFERENCE DURING HIS VISIT TO THE UNIT. HE ALSO OBSERVED PATIENTS UNDER CARE IN THE INTENSIVE CARE UNIT WHICH INCLUDED AN EXPATRIATE FROM BELGIUM, AND A RWANDAN CHILD WHO WAS SERIOUSLY MAIMED BY AN ACCIDENTAL GRENADE EXPLOSION. DURING HIS VISIT HE ALSO MET WITH AIR VICE MARSHALL COX, CHIEF OF PERSONNEL OF THE AUSTRALIAN DEFENCE FORCE. THEY DISCUSSED THE CURRENT SITUATION IN RWANDA, THE AUSTRALIAN MEDICAL CONTRIBUTION, PERSONNEL POLICY AND TRAINING. THE FC MADE SPECIAL NOTE DURING HIS VISIT OF THE EFFECTIVE AND PRODUCTIVE WORK THE LEGAL OFFICER HAS COMPLETED FOR GOVERNMENT AUTHORITIES, AND THE EXTENT OF PROFESSIONAL AND COORDINATED MED SUPPORT TO UNAMIR AND CITIZENS OF RWANDA.

(4) FC MET WITH THE GERMAN FOREIGN MINISTER DURING HIS STATE VISIT TO RWANDA. RWANDA'S SITUATION, RPA GOVERNMENT, FRGF STATUS AND UNAMIR MANDATE WERE SOME OF THE ISSUES DISCUSSED.

(11) IN SECTOR 5A - RUHENGERI. MILOBS PATROL IN VARIOUS AREAS WITHIN THE SECTOR REPORTED THAT THE ROAD CONDITIONS ARE NOT GOOD BUT MOTORABLE. THE OVERALL SITUATION WAS REPORTED TO BE CALM.

(12) IN SECTOR 5B-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLS IN AOR.

(B) ONE TEAM CONDUCTED PATROL ALONG THE COAST OF LAKE KAYOVE AND REPORTED THAT ON THE EVENING OF 12/13 JUL 95 AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF SUSPECTED INTERAHAMWE FIRED AT THE RPA POSITION AT VUMBI (GR 2294). NO CASUALTIES REPORTED. THE RPA STRONGLY SUSPECT THAT THE LOCALS ASSISTED THE INSURGENTS. A SWEEP WAS CONDUCTED BY THE RPA ON 13 JULY WITH NO RESULT.

(C) ANOTHER TEAM ASSISTED THE RPA AND GENDARMERIE

IN THEIR PROJECT TO EFFECT ARBITRATION OF LOST AND STOLEN CATTLE IN BUTIMBA (GR 3093) BY PROVIDING TRANSPORT TO THE TEAM. THERE WERE TWELVE SETTLED CASES WITH THE PROJECT CONTINUING ON FRIDAY IN MUTURA (GR 3124).

(D) 76 IDPs WERE REPATRIATED ON 24 JULY 95 FROM GISENYI TO KIGALI AND RUHENGERI.

(13) IN SECTOR 5C-KIBUYE.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) ONE MILOB TEAM CONDUCTED PATROL AT KIVUMU SECTOR (GR 5573) AND REPORTED THAT THERE ARE 255 REFUGEES AT NYANGE GR 5572 WHO ARRIVED ON 22 JUN 95 AND AWAITING RESETTLEMENT. THEY ARE RUNNING SHORT OF FOOD AND COMMODITIES. THE TEAM ALSO VISITED THE NYANGE HOSPITAL AND LEARNED THAT A PRISONER WAS ADMITTED TO THE HOSPITAL FROM KIVUMU PRISON ON 16 JUL 95. IT WAS FURTHER REPORTED THAT THE PERSON WAS ARRESTED ON 10 JUL 95 AND WAS TAKEN TO THE PRISON WHERE HE WAS BEATEN BY THE COMMUNE POLICE. REASON FOR THE ARREST UNKNOWN. HOSPITAL AUTHORITIES HAVE RECOMMENDED THAT HE BE TRANSFERRED TO GITARAMA HOSPITAL BUT THE BOUGERMESTER HAS STOPPED THE TRANSFER. ANOTHER VICTIM OF THE BEATINGS BY THE SAME COMMUNE POLICE FROM THE NSANZA SECTOR IS ALLEGED TO HAVE FAILED TO MEET THE DEMAND OF PAYING 10,000 RFR TO COMMUNE POLICE FOR UNKNOWN CAUSE. HE IS NURSING HEAD INJURIES.

(C) PTL TO RUSHISHI (GR 2558) IN THE GISOVU COMMUNE REPORTED THAT THE LOCALS HAD INFORMED THE TEAM THAT THOSE WHO TALKED TO UNAMIR ON 07 JULY 95 WERE BEING SOUGHT BY RPA INCLUDING A TEACHER FROM NYARUBUYE (GR 2353) PRIMARY SCHOOL. THE NUMBER OF REFUGEES HAS REDUCED FROM 132 TO 95. MOST OF THEM WENT TO RESETTLE ON THEIR OWN IN MABANZA COMMUNE. THE REFUGEES WHO ARE STILL AT THAT LOCATION REQUIRE FOOD, BLANKETS AND COOKING UTENSILS. THE TEAM FURTHER VISITED GISOVU HEALTH CENTRE (GR 2952) AND REPORTED THE HOSPITAL HAD RUN OUT OF KEROSENE FOR THE REFRIGERATOR, CREATING A STORAGE PROBLEM FOR VACCINES. THE SAME TEAM WAS DENIED PASSAGE TO THE GISOVU COMMUNE CENTRE AT AN RPA CHECK POINT AT (GR 2859). THE RPA DEMANDED FOR A LETTER FROM THE RPA BN COMD.

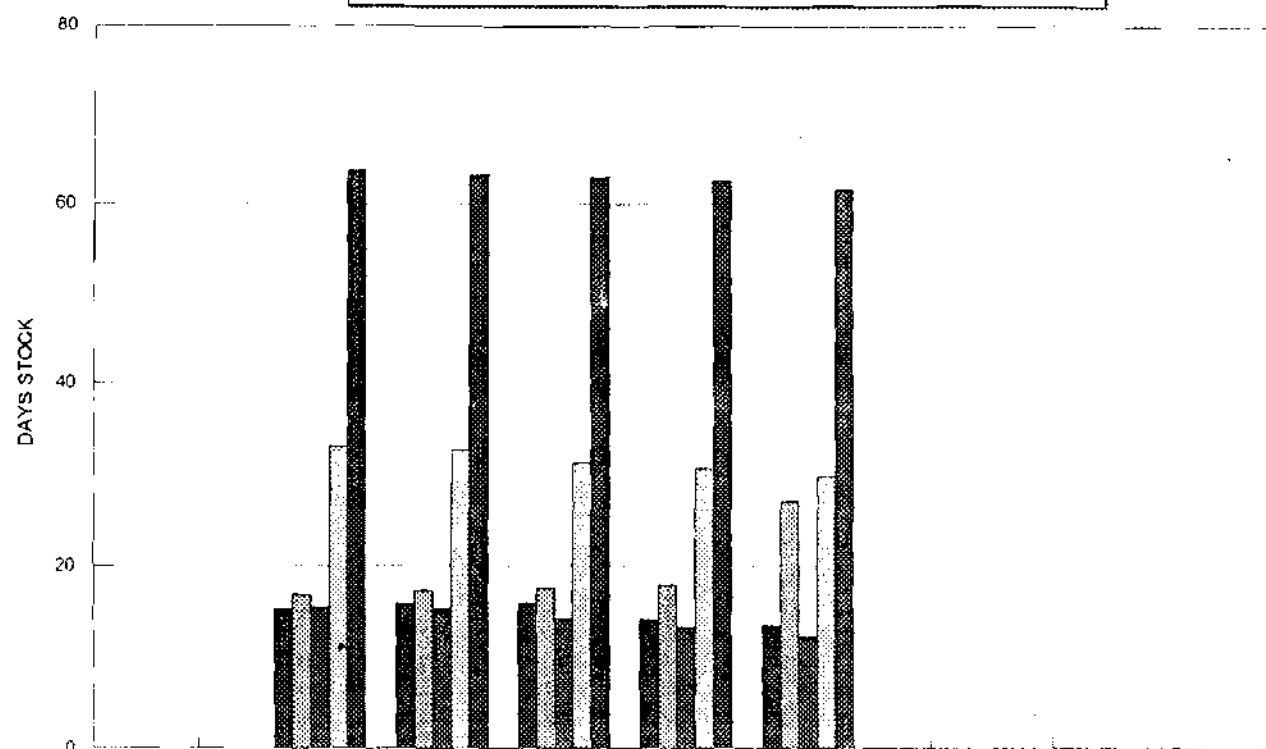

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE FOREIGN MINISTER OF GERMANY, MR KLAUS KINKEL, ARRIVED IN KIGALI ON 25 JUL 95 FOR AN OFFICIAL VISIT TO RWANDA DURING WHICH HE IS EXPECTED TO HOLD TALKS WITH SENIOR GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS, REPRESENTATIVES OF UNAMIR AND THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA. HE IS ALSO EXPECTED TO VISIT THE BENACO CAMPS HOUSING RWANDESE REFUGEES IN TANZANIA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE. A COMPANY PLUS HAS OCCUPIED THE POSITION LEFT BY TUNBATT AT NEMBA GR 7619.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. MILOBS SECTOR 4 REPORTED SIX SEPARATE ACTS ARMED ROBBERY PRESUMABLY BY UNIFORMED MEN IN GISAGARA (GR 8907), MUHEHWE (GR 8609), AND CYETE (GR 7618). ALL THESE INCIDENTS OCCURRED FROM 14 TO 23 JUL 95 AND RESULTED IN GUNSHOT OR MACHETE WOUNDS TO FIVE VICTIMS. THE BANDITS ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE COME ACROSS THE BORDER FROM ZAIRE. THE SPATE OF ARMED ROBBERY IS REPORTED TO BE CREATING CONSIDERABLE TENSION IN THE CONCERNED AREAS. MILOBS CONTINUE TO MONITOR THE SITUATION.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) FC GRANTED AUDIENCE TO LT COL RJ POWELL ON THE DEPARTURE OF 95 FLSG SCHEDULED FOR THE 26 JULY 95. THE FC COMMENDED THE CO FOR THE EFFORTS AND SUCCESSES OF THE FLSG AND OF THE POSITIVE REPUTATION THEY GAINED WITHIN UNAMIR. THE MAIN BODY OF 95 CMSG, ITS REPLACEMENT, ARRIVED THIS MORNING FROM CANADA.

(3) FC AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE. HE EXPLAINED THE NEW DEPLOYMENT OF UNAMIR IN THE NEW SECTORS AND EMPHASIZED THE NEW LIMITATIONS TO PROVIDING HUMANITARIAN RESOURCES TO RWANDA, ESPECIALLY DURING THE SCALE-DOWN PERIOD. THERE ARE MANY AREAS IN THE COUNTRY THAT WILL NO LONGER HAVE FORMED TROOPS FROM UNAMIR TO CARRY ON ASSISTANCE AND SECURITY TO THOSE IN NEED. EQUIPMENT AND OTHER UNAMIR RESOURCES ARE CURRENTLY AT A PRIORITY TO UNAMIR CONTINGENTS AND MILOBS, AND IS EXTREMELY LIMITED. NOTWITHSTANDING THESE LIMITED RESOURCES, UNAMIR WILL CONTINUE TO PROVIDE ASSISTANCE, WHERE POSSIBLE. IT WILL ALSO CONTINUE TO TRAIN THE GENDARMERIE AND ASSIST IN DEMINING OPERATIONS.

(4) AT THE PRESS GATHERING, THE FC MENTIONED THE IMPROVEMENT IN THE LOCAL SECURITY SITUATION IN THE KIGALI AREA AND CONGRATULATED THE RPA AND GENDARMERIE FOR THEIR

EFFORT IN CURBING ACTS OF BANDITRY AND MURDER. THE FC ANNOUNCED THE LIFTING OF THE CURFEW IMPOSED ON UNAMIR PERSONNEL FROM 2130 TO 2300 HRS.

B. SECTOR 1.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) OWN GUARDS AT TRANSIT CAMP ANNEX APPREHENDED A SUSPECT AT 251000 HRS TRYING TO ENTER BY CUTTING THE BARBED WIRE. THE SUSPECT WAS HANDED OVER TO THE MILITARY POLICE.

(3) 61 IDPs ARRIVED AT NDERA TRANSIT CAMP FROM GITARAMA, KIGALI, KANZENZE, GASHORA, RUHENGERI, KIBUNGO AND BUTARE. 36 IDPs DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO AND KIGALI. A TOTAL OF 210 IDPs AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

(4) ONE TRUCK WAS PROVIDED TO ARDEC (AGENCE RWANDAISE POUR DE DEVELOPPEMENT ET LA COOP) FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD FOR MAKING BRICKS IN RUNDA PARISH. THE TRUCK CARRIED WOOD TO VARIOUS LOCATIONS WITHIN THE SECTOR.

(5) MALICOY'S PREPARATIONS FOR THE MOVE TO ITS NEW LOCATION IN GIKONGORO ARE ALMOST COMPLETED. THE ONLY RECCE LEFT IS OF MED NATURE WHICH WILL BE COMPLETED BY THE UNIT MED OFFR ON FRI 28 JUL 95.

(6) MALICOY PROVIDED THREE BEDFORD TRUCKS TO TRANSPORT BUILDING MATERIALS AND FOODSTUFFS FROM GITARAMA TO SOME COMMUNES WITHIN THE SECTOR FOR THE USE OF LOCALS.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) SERIES OF SMALL ARMS FIRE WAS HEARD FROM SOUTHERN OUTSKIRTS OF KIBUNGO BETWEEN 1130-1345 HRS. INFO REVEALED THE RPA WERE TRG.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 65 LOCALS IN AOR.

D. SECTOR 3.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) SENBATT MED STAFF TREATED 10 LOCALS IN AOR.

E. SECTOR 4.

(1) POLITICAL. SECTOR 1B MILOBs CONFIRMED INFO EARLIER RECEIVED THAT THE SOUS PREFECT OF RUHANGO (GR 7653) HAD BEEN RELEASED FROM CUSTODY AND RESUMED HIS DUTIES ON 20 JUL 95. THE SOUS PREFECT HAD BEEN ACCUSED OF TAKING PART IN THE GENOCIDE BUT CHARGES WERE DROPPED WHEN FOUND NOT TRUE. HE REQUESTED THAT THE MALICOY PLATOON IN RUHANGO SHOULD REMAIN THERE FOR SECURITY REASONS. MILOBs ASSESS THAT THERE IS A CONSIDERABLE MEASURE OF INSECURITY IN THE RUHANGO AREA.

(2) BORDERS.

(A) THE FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC:

I. GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

(4) IN SECTOR 1A - KIGALI. MILOBs CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN TARE AND TO THE BURUNDI BORDER POST AT RUTETE. PATROL TO THE BORDER OBSERVED UNHCR-ORGANISED RETURN OF 33 RETURNEES FROM BURUNDI. THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS NORMAL IN ALL AREAS PATROLLED.

(B) MILOB PATROLS TO THE NYAKABANDA COMMUNE (GR 6595) HANDED OVER A REPAIRED GENERATOR AND SOME PLASTIC TENTS TO THE DIRECTOR OF THE TEACHER TRAINING SCHOOL FOR THE USE OF THE STUDENTS. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT 159 OF THE 177 HOUSES IN THE COMMUNE HAD BEEN REPAIRED WITH ASSISTANCE PROVIDED BY CARITAS, CRS AND THE SALVATION ARMY.

(C) MILOB PATROLS TO RUHANGO (GR 7653) VISITED THE COMMUNE PRISON AND REPORTED THE PRESENCE OF 123 PRISONERS IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT. 111 OF THE PRISONERS WERE ACCUSED OF TAKING PART IN GENOCIDE. THE PATROLS ALSO CONFIRMED THE ARREST OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE LABORATORY SCHOOL ON 14 JUL 95 FOR UNKNOWN CHARGES. IT IS SUSPECTED THAT HE MAY HAVE BEEN TRANSFERRED TO KIGALI. SECTOR HR MONITORS FOLLOWING THE CASE.

(7) IN SECTOR 2B KIBUNGO. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NSTR.

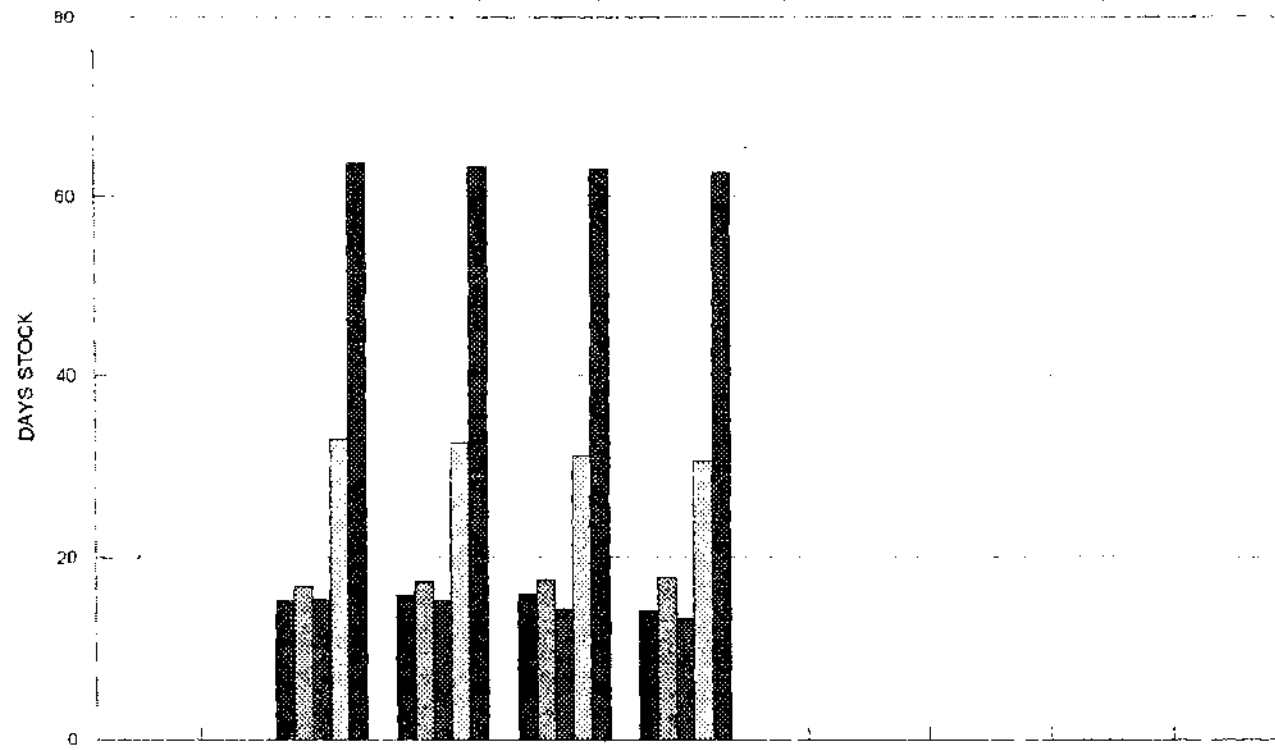

1. GEN SITUATION.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY, ALTHOUGH THE SECURITY SITUATION ALONG THE ZAIRIAN BORDER REMAINS TENSE.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE NEWLY-APPOINTED BURUNDIAN FOREIGN MINISTER, MR. PAUL MUNUEMBARI, ENDED HIS THREE DAY VISIT TO RWANDA ON SUNDAY. HE REPORTEDLY STATED IN A RADIO INTERVIEW THAT HE HAD REACHED POSITIVE CONCLUSIONS IN HIS DISCUSSIONS WITH HIS RWANDESE COUNTERPART, MR. ANASTASE GASANA, WHICH HAD CENTRED ON POLITICAL ISSUES OF COMMON INTEREST AND COOPERATION BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES.

B. ACCORDING TO RADIO RWANDA, THE RWANDESE GOVERNMENT HAS DENIED REPORTS MADE BY A RADIO STATION BASED IN GOMA, ZAIRE ON 19 JUL 95 ALLEGING THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA HAD SENT MILITARY COMMANDOS TO THE ZAIRIAN PROVINCE OF KIVU TO KILL RWANDESE REFUGEES. IN A COMMUNIQUE ISSUED BY THE RWANDESE MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION AND SOCIAL INTEGRATION, THE GOVERNMENT REPORTEDLY CRITICISED THE ZAIRIAN PRESS FOR CONDUCTING A CAMPAIGN TO PREVENT REFUGEES FROM RETURNING HOME, AND THE FORMER RWANDESE GOVERNMENT LEADERS OF CONNIVING WITH THEIR ZAIRIAN ACCOMPLICES IN ATTEMPTING TO HALT THE REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES.

3. **FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. **RPA/GENDARMERIE.** IN SECTOR 1B, THE RPA BRIGADE COMD ALLEGED TO THE SECTOR COMD THAT UN HELICOPTER LANDED AT KIBUYE AND UNAMIR PERSONNEL DISEMBARKED AND ENCOURAGED LOCALS TO COOPERATE WITH INTERHAMWE. ONCE CONFRONTED, THE COMD COULD NOT PROVIDE ANY DETAILS. FACTS TO BE SUBMITTED ONCE VERIFIED.

B. **FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.**

(1) IN SEC 4, MILOB REPORTED THAT MILITIA CARRIED OUT OPERATIONS ACROSS THE BORDER ON 21 AND 22 JULY 95 IN BUGARAMA SUB-SECTOR. BOURGUMESTRE OF GISHOMA COMMUNE CONFIRMED MILITIA OPERATION IN RUHOKO (GR 8304), NYENJI (7907), GISAGARA (7912) AND KIRANGA (8008) WHICH WAS REPULSED BY RPA AND NO CASUALTIES WERE REPORTED ON BOTH SIDES. WILL INVESTIGATE DETAILS.

(2) IN SECTOR 4, MILOB REPORTED THAT ONE MAN LOST HIS RIGHT LEG AND SUFFERED SEVERAL SPLINTER INJURIES AND TWO COWS WERE KILLED BY A MINE EXPLOSION WHICH OCCURRED ON 22 JULY 95 IN RUHOKO SECTOR.

4. **OWN ACTIVITIES.**

A. **FORCE HQ.**

(1) NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) THE FC MET WITH MR CISSE OF UNDP, WHO IS CURRENTLY ACTING IN CHARGE OF UNDP OFFICE IN KIGALI. THEY DISCUSSED ISSUES RELATED TO PROJECTS AND THEIR FUNDING AND THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN UNDP, UNAMIR AND THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA. IT WAS DISCUSSED HOW THE GOVERNMENT'S REQUESTS ARE RECEIVED BY THE HAC OF UNAMIR, BUT CANNOT BE ACTIONED DUE NOT ONLY TO NO DIRECT FUNDS, BUT TO EQUIPMENT SHORTAGES AND INAPPROPRIATE TYPES OF RESOURCES IN THE NEW MANDATE. THIS IS ESPECIALLY APPARENT DURING THE REDUCTION AND ROTATION OF UNAMIR TROOPS IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE MANDATE IMPOSED BY RWANDA. THE HAC CAN ONLY COPE WITH MATTERS THAT THE CURRENT MILITARY RESOURCES CAN PROVIDE.

(3) THE FC AND ACTING HEAD OF MISSION MET WITH SENIOR UNAMIR STAFF TO DISCUSS AND BETTER COORDINATE THE NUMEROUS GOVERNMENT AND PRIVATE REQUESTS FOR HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE FROM UNAMIR. THE ACTING HEAD OF MISSION EXPRESSED HIS CONCERN AT THE INCREASED RATE OF THE HUMANITARIAN REQUESTS AND FURTHER ADVISED THAT IF THESE REQUESTS ARE NOT HONOURED DUE TO LACK OF RESOURCES UNAMIR SHOULD PROVIDE SOME EXPLANATION TO THE GOVERNMENT BEFORE HOSTILE REACTIONS AND CRITICISMS AGAINST UNAMIR BECOME APPARENT. ALSO DISCUSSED WERE IDEAS TO MORE SMOOTHLY ACCOMMODATE CIVILIAN AND MILITARY VIP VISITS IN VIEW OF UPCOMING REDUCTIONS IN UNAMIR STAFF AT THE HEADQUARTERS.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) SOUNDS OF 4 SINGLE SHOTS WERE HEARD FROM THE GEN DIRECTION OF AMAHORO STADIUM AT 1900 HRS ON 23 JUL 95.

(3) INDBATT GUARDS AT IVECO APPREHENDED A THIEF TRYING TO STEAL RADIATOR AND OTHER VEHICLES ACCESSORIES AT 2015 HRS 23 JUL 95. MILITARY POLICE WAS INFORMED IMMEDIATELY AND THE THIEF WAS HANDED OVER TO THEM.

THE TEAM MET THE BOURGMESTRE WHO REPORTED THAT 75 REFUGEES ENTERED THE COMMUNE FROM UGANDA AND TANZANIA ON 23 JUL 95 AND HAVE BEEN RESETTLED.



E. CIVPOL IN RUHENGARI REPORTED THAT THE RUHENGARI NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL, THE SCHOOL AUTHORITIES ARE MAKING EFFORTS TO SOLVE THE PROBLEM OF DESK SHORTAGE SO THAT THE NEXT TRAINING SESSION CAN COMMENCE.

(E) PATROL TO THE RUTABO SECTOR (GR 9356) RECEIVED REPORTS OF SHORTAGES OF SEEDS AND AGRICULTURAL MATERIALS. THE RECENT RETURN OF 20 RETURNEES FROM GIKONGORO TO THEIR OWN PREVIOUSLY EVACUATED HOMES WAS ALSO REPORTED. 10 FAMILIES RECENTLY RETURNED FROM BURUNDI AND UGANDA WERE REPORTED TO BE LIVING IN VACATED HOUSES.

(6) IN SECTOR 2A BYUMBA.

(A) PATROLS TO THE MUKARANGE COMMUNE (GR 0831) REPORTED AN OUTBREAK OF TUBERCULOSIS AND MALARIA IN THE COMMUNE. LOCAL AUTHORITIES, WITH THE HELP OF TEACHERS AND THE NGO GOAL IRELAND ARE CURRENTLY UNDERTAKING A PROGRAMME TO EDUCATE LOCALS ON PREVENTIVE MEASURES FOR SEVERAL TROPICAL DISEASES..

(7) IN SECTOR 2B KIBUNGO.

(A) THE BOURGEMESTRE OF BIRENGA COMMUNE (GR 5959) REPORTED PROBLEMS OF LITIGATION OVER THE OWNERSHIP OF HOUSES BETWEEN RETURNEES AND RESIDENT POPULATION. THE USUAL SOLUTION IS TO EJECT THE ILLEGAL OCCUPANTS. HE HOWEVER INFORMED MILOBS THAT A 12,000 HECTARE AREA HAD BEEN EARMARKED FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF HOUSES FOR THOSE WITHOUT HOMES. THE COMMUNE WAS ALSO REPORTED TO BE FACING WATER PROBLEMS DUE TO A BREAKDOWN OF WATER PUMPS AT THE PUMPING STATION.

(8) IN SECTOR 3A - GIKONGORO.

(A) PATROL TO THE KIVU COMMUNE (GR 4210) REPORTED THAT THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES WERE PREPARING A LIST OF FORMER RESIDENTS OF THE COMMUNE WHO HAD STILL NOT RETURNED SINCE THE WAR. HE ADDED THAT THE RETURNEES IN THE SECTOR WERE RECLAIMING THEIR PROPERTY FROM THE LOCALS.

(B) PATROLS WERE ALSO CONDUCTED TO THE MUSANGE COMMUNE (GR 5347) TO MONITOR THE SITUATION AFTER THE RECENT DEMONSTRATION AGAINST THE BOURGEMESTRE.



THE SITUATION WAS CALM. IT WAS REPORTED THAT OUT OF THE 32 DETAINEES, 12 HAVE HAD THEIR CASES INVESTIGATED AND FORMALLY ACCUSED OF THE COMMITTING VARIOUS CRIMES.

(9) IN SECTOR 3B - BUTARE.

(A) PATROLS TO THE KABILIZI TRANSIT CAMP REPORTED THE PRESENCE OF ABOUT 450 PERSONS INCLUDING CHILDREN IN THE CAMP. THE RETURNEES ARE REPORTED TO BE WITHOUT FOOD AND WATER. MILOBS ASSESS THAT AN IMMEDIATE SUPPLY OF FOOD AND WATER IS REQUIRED TO PREVENT STARVATION ESPECIALLY AMONG THE CHILDREN. MILOBS FURTHER RECOMMENDED THAT THE EXPEDITE TO MOVE THE RETURNEES TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

(10) IN SECTOR 4 - CYANGUGU.

(A) A CONFERENCE FOR SECTOR COMMANDERS WAS HELD AT THE SECTOR HQ DURING THE PERIOD. ALL RELEVANT MATTERS PERTAINING TO CURRENT OPS WERE DISCUSSED.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS IN THE AOR. A TOTAL OF 110 RETURNEES ARRIVED AT THE NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP FROM 19 TO 20 JUL 95.

(11) IN SECTOR 5A - RUHENGURI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOB TEAMS PATROLLED BUTARO (GR 8140) AND CYERU (GR 8035) AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES AND NGOS IN BOTH AREAS. GENERAL SITUATION WAS NORMAL.

(12) IN SECTOR 5B-GISENYI.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS CONDUCTED HELI PATROLS TO THE MEMISA CLINIC AT MURUNDA (GR 6489) ON THE BDRY BETWEEN SECTORS 5B AND 5C. THERE WAS REPORTED TO BE SOME ETHNIC TENSION IN THE AREA. MILOBS CONTINUE TO CONDUCT INTENSIVE PATROLS IN THE AREA. THE FLIGHT OVER SHORES OF THE LAKE REVEALED NO OTHER CORPSES.

(C) PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED TO THE EDGE OF THE GWISHATE FOREST. THERE WAS A NEW SETTLEMENT INHABITED BY ABOUT 40-50 FAMILIES AT GR 3707. THE SITUATION WAS HOWEVER NORMAL IN ALL AREAS PATROLLED.

(13) IN SECTOR 5C-KIBUYE.

(A) CONDUCTED PATROLS IN MUFOMBEZI (GR 3773) IN THE MABANZA COMMUNE. LOCALS INFORMED THE PATROL THAT PEOPLE FROM ZAIRE OFTEN CAME ACROSS THE BORDER TO VISIT THEIR RELATIVES AND TO ASK FOR FOOD.

C. A TEAM VISITED KABILIZI REFUGEE CAMP IN RUNYINYA COMMUNE AND WAS INFORMED THAT THERE WERE 450 REFUGEES AWAITING EVACUATION TO THEIR RESPECTIVE HOME COMMUNES.

D. CIVPOL IN GIKONGORO PREFECTURE VISITED MUSEBEYA COMMUNE ON 20 JUL 95 AND WAS INFORMED THAT RPA ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE BEEN THREATENING LOCALS WITH ARBITRARY ARRESTS. E. THE TEAM ALSO VISITED NYAMAGABE COMMUNE AND MET THE BOURGMESTRE WHO INFORMED THE TEAM THAT THE CRIME WAVE IN THE AREA WAS ON THE INCREASE. HE ALSO COMPLAINED OF BANDITS WHO ARE SUSPECTED TO BE COMING FROM OTHER COMMUNES TO STEAL CATTLE FROM LOCALS. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

F. CIVPOL IN KIGALI PRISON ON 21 JUL 95 AND OBSERVED THAT A LOT OF LOCALS HAD GATHERED AT THE PRISON TO VISIT THEIR RELATIONS IN PRISON. THE LOCALS EXPRESSED THEIR CONCERN ABOUT THE DETERIORATING LIVING CONDITIONS IN PRISON. HUMAN RIGHTS INFORMED.

G. CIVPOL IN KIBUYE PREFECTURE PATROLLED AOR ON 20 JUL 95 AND REPORTED THAT A POLITICAL ADVISER TO THE SRSG VISITED THE SECTOR IN ORDER TO IDENTIFY AREAS WHICH MARK THE BORDER BETWEEN RWANDA AND ZAIRE AND ALSO TO VERIFY POINTS OF POSSIBLE INFILTRATION INTO RWANDA BY FRGF.

H. CIVPOL IN CYANGUGU PREFECTURE PATROLLED AOR ON 20 JUL 95 AND REPORTED THAT LOCALS WERE ANXIOUS TO KNOW WHEN THE PROGRAMME OF THE COMMUNAL POLICE WOULD COMMENCE.

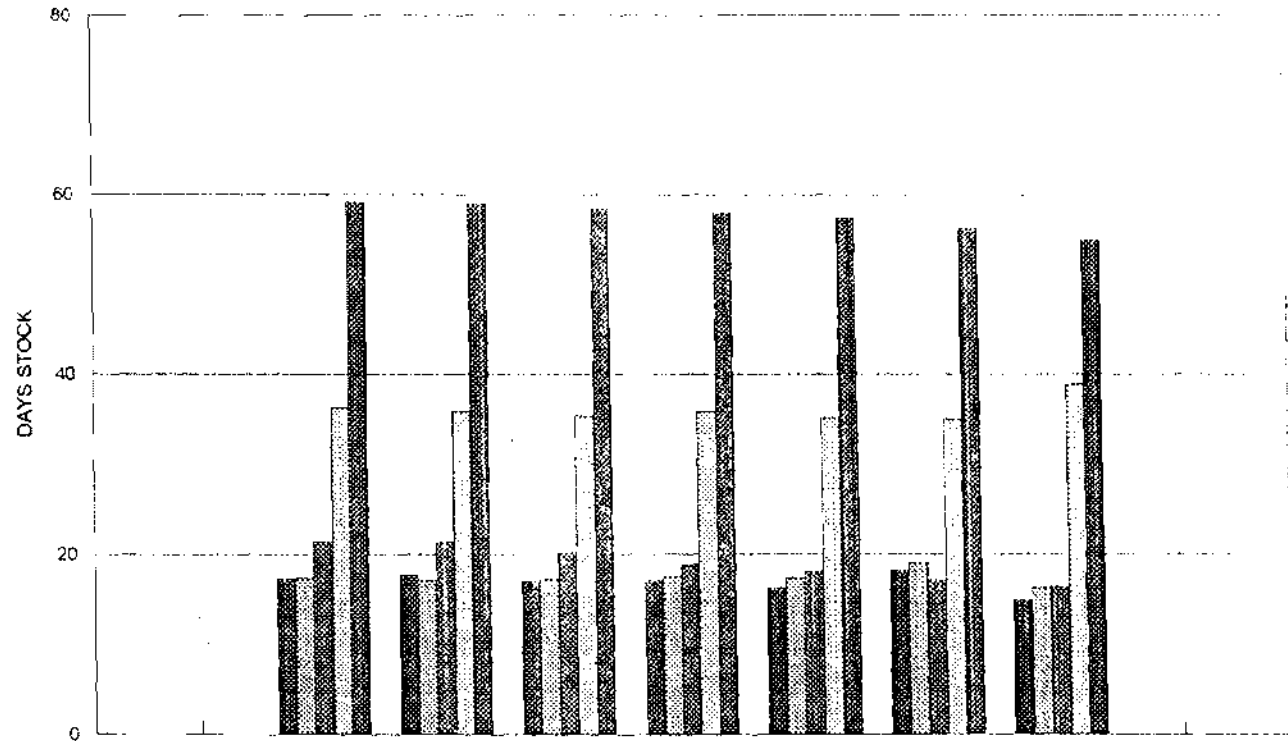

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT A TWO-DAY TRIPARTITE MEETING OF REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE RWANDESE AND TANZANIAN GOVERNMENTS AND UNHCR ENDED YESTERDAY IN KIGALI. THE PARTICIPANTS REPORTEDLY DISCUSSED MODALITIES FOR THE REPATRIATION OF RWANDESE REFUGEES FROM TANZANIA AND SIGNED AN AGREEMENT TO CREATE A COMMISSION ON SECURITY AND THE RESETTLEMENT OF RETURNEES.

B. IN AN INTERVIEW WITH RADIO RWANDA ON THE OCCASION OF THE FIRST ANNIVERSARY OF THE FORMATION OF THE NEW GOVERNMENT IN RWANDA, THE RWANDESE PRESIDENT, MR. PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU, STATED THAT POLITICAL PARTIES AND FREEDOM OF EXPRESSION WERE NOT BANNED IN RWANDA, BUT THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAD BANNED "POLITICAL COMPETITION, MUTUAL ACCUSATIONS AMONG POLITICAL PARTIES WHICH CAUSE INSTABILITY AND DIVISIONS".

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) SECTOR 1 MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA PLATOON IS CONDUCTING PLATOON LEVEL TRAINING IN THE AREA OF MASANGO (GR 6254). THE SECTOR COMMANDER MAY BE INVITED TO WITNESS TRAINING AT A LATER DATE.

(2) AN UNKNOWN NUMBER OF RPA SOLDIERS VISITED NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP IN SECTOR 4 ON 17, 18, AND 19 JUL. THEY PATROLLED THE CAMP MANY TIMES. THERE WAS NO ARREST AND THEIR PRECISE INTENTIONS WERE UNKNOWN.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY. IN SECTOR 1 MILOB PTL TO GITINDA (GR 5958) REPORTED THAT ON 16 JUL UNKNOWN PEOPLE BURNT A HOUSE. 15 PEOPLE BELIEVED TO BE INTERHAMWE FROM KIBUYE PREFECTURE WERE ARRESTED BY RPA SOLDIERS AND SENT TO PRISON. LOCAL AUTHORITIES INVESTIGATING THE INCIDENT.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES.

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY DUTIES WERE PERFORMED.

(2) FC ATTENDED A GARDEN RECEPTION HOSTED BY THE

GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA ON OCCASION OF THEIR FIRST YEAR ANNIVERSARY AS A GOVERNMENT. SECURITY WAS VERY TIGHT WITH MANY MINISTERS, SOME RPA COMMANDERS AND STAFF, THE PRESIDENT, VICE-PRESIDENT AND PRIME MINISTER IN ATTENDANCE. THE PRIME MINISTER, MR FAUSTIN TWAGIRMUNGU, GAVE A BRIEF WELCOME TO ALL OFFICIALS ATTENDING WHICH WAS THE ONLY PUBLIC ADDRESS DURING THE FUNCTION.

(3) FC HELD A WORKING MEETING WITH RPA COS. RPA COS AGREED TO CONCEPT OF FORMING A WORKING COMMITTEE TO INVESTIGATE THE OPTIONS IN THE COSTING AND USAGE OF THE PRESIDENTIAL HANGAR WHICH IS CURRENTLY OCCUPIED BY UNAMIR'S HELICOPTER FLEET. RPA COS ALSO AGREED TO EXPEDITE THE LONGSTANDING ISSUE OF THE CONTAINERS FROM INDIA FOR THE SIGNAL COMPANY BEING HELD AT CUSTOMS. RPA COS INQUIRED INTO THE POSSIBILITY OF UNAMIR TROOPS PROVIDING TRAINING TO RPA. THE DISCUSSION CONCLUDED THAT INDIVIDUAL COUNTRIES WOULD DECIDE THROUGH A BILATERAL AGREEMENT IF APPROACHED BY RWANDA. UNAMIR PEACEKEEPING SOLDIERS ARE NOT IN A POSITION THAT WOULD ALLOW THEM TO BE INVOLVED IN SUCH TRAINING.

(4) FC AND OTHER UNAMIR HQ MILITARY OFFICERS ATTENDED A RECEPTION AT THE AMERICAN EMBASSADOR'S RESIDENCE FOR THE PURPOSE OF MEETING THE US DEMINING TEAM WHO WILL SHORTLY COMMENCE TRAINING THE RPA IN DEMINING OPERATIONS AND MINEAWARENES IN RWANDA.

G. CIVPOL IN BUTARE PREFECTURE PATROLLED NYAKIZU AND MBAZI COMMUNE ON 19 JUL 95 AND REPORTED THAT A RE-BURIAL CEREMONY OF 1994 GENOCIDE VICTIMS IS BEING PLANNED FOR 15 AUG 95. IT WAS ALLEGED THAT 20,000 LOCALS WERE KILLED IN CYNAHINDA CATHOLIC CHURCH IN NYAKIZU COMMUNE. THE REMAINS OF THE VICTIMS WILL BE EXHUMED AND RE-BURIED AS A SIGN OF HONOUR OF THE DEPARTED ONES.

H. CIVPOL IN GIKONGORO PREFECTURE PATROLLED AOR ON 19 JUL 95 AND REPORTED THAT CARE INTERNATIONAL IS ASSISTING WIDOWS WITH FOOD WHILST CARITAS IS HELPING LOCALS TO RE-BUILD HOUSES WHICH WERE DEMOLISHED DURING THE WAR.

I. IN KIBUYE PREFECTURE A JOINT CIVPOL/MILOBS VISITED KIBUYE HOSPITAL ON 19 JUL 95 AND WAS INFORMED THAT THE HOSPITAL HAS NO TRANSPORT AND INSUFFICIENT DRUGS TO CATER FOR THE PATIENTS. THE TEAM WAS ALSO INFORMED THAT THE HOSPITAL HAS INSUFFICIENT MANPOWER.

J. 250 STUDENTS FROM VARIOUS PREFECTURES HAVE ARRIVED AT THE RUHENGARI NATIONAL GENDARMERIE TRAINING SCHOOL TO COMMENCE TRAINING.

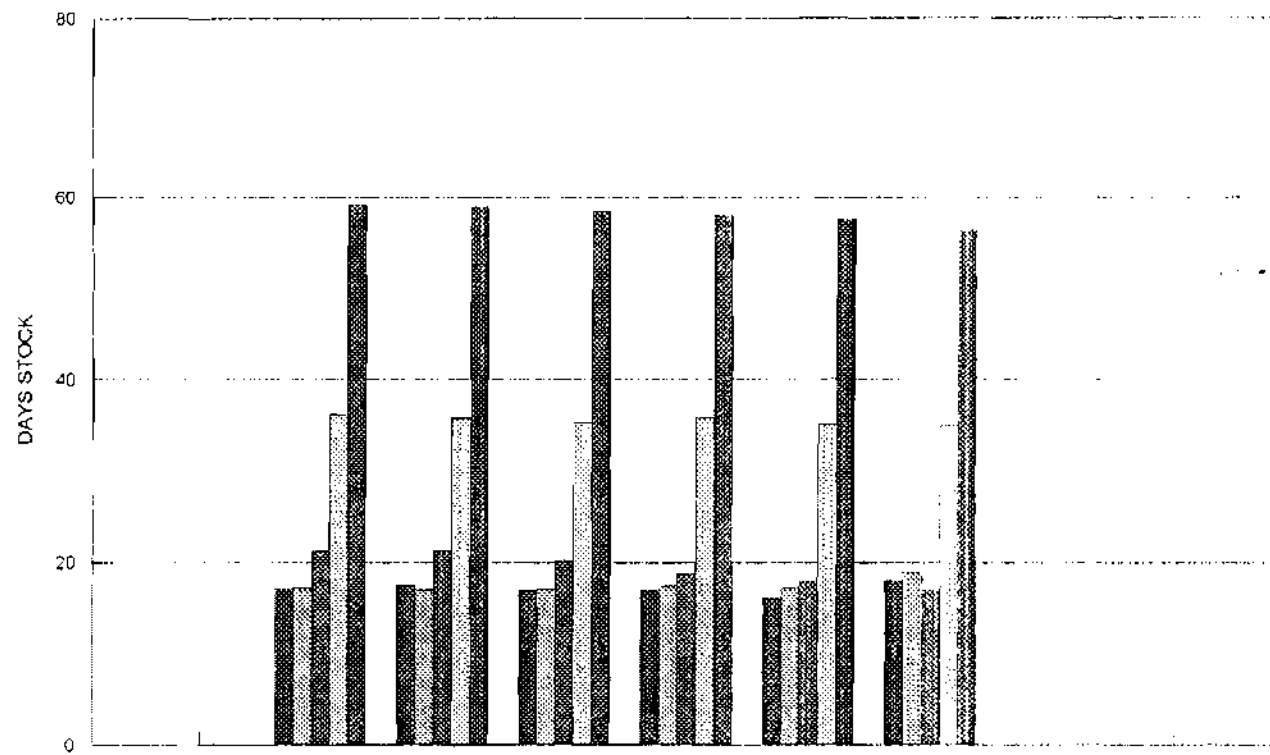
