

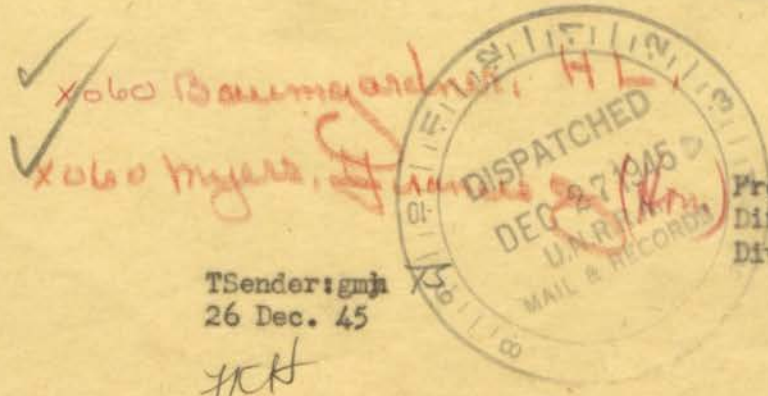
Dear Senator Myers:

This acknowledges receipt of your letter of 17 December. Thank you very much for the additional information that you have given us by sending Mr. Baumgardner's letter with the data on the persons whom he would like to locate.

According to this data, the persons concerned are all of German birth, and apparently citizens of Germany. This makes it impossible, to our sincere regret, to give Mr. Baumgardner assistance.

As you are aware, UNRRA is only authorized to take care of D.P.'s who are citizens of one of the United Nations, or who by reason of race, religion, or for activities in favor of the United Nations have been persecuted and who are in assembly centers in Germany. UNRRA is not authorized to take care of German citizens in general, and therefore has no machinery enabling it to assist in contacting German relatives of U. S. citizens.

This is in reply to your letter of 25 March with enclosure
for Mr. Leo G. Griffith of Pittsburgh.

Since the persons described in Mr. Griffith's letter are
apparently German nationals, they are not within the category
of persons whom UNRRA is authorized to assist under the
resolutions by which we are governed.

Our assistance in Germany is limited to United Nations Displaced
Persons or persons of ex-enemy nationality who have assimilated
United Nations Displaced Persons status because of persecution
for racial or religious reasons or for activities on behalf of
the United Nations.

The question of the reunion of these persons in Munich would be
a matter for determination by the military occupational authori-
ties in this instance, the U.S. Army, since Munich is in the U.S.
Zone of Occupation. The matter of migration to Munich from
Czechoslovakia would need to be decided upon by the Czechoslovakian
Government and the American military authorities.

Concerning the immigration to the United States from Germany of
these persons, the Department of State would be the authoritative
source of information.

We are enclosing a recent statement issued by the Secretary of
State concerning immigration to this country from Germany. It is
suggested that you may wish to communicate with the Department of
State concerning the immigration aspects of Mr. Griffith's letter
and with the Civilian Affairs Section of the War Department,
regarding the movement, from Czechoslovakia to Germany, of these
people.

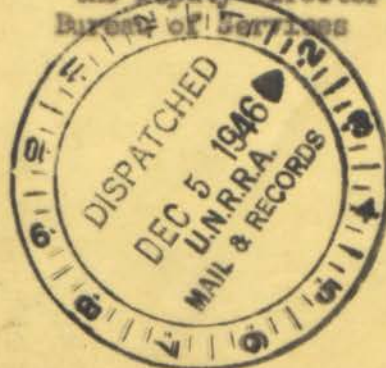

The matter of granting visas to the United States is entirely in the hands of the U. S. Consuls and Mr. George J. Haering, Chief of the Visa Division, State Department, is in charge of such matters. In addition, the U.S. Immigration and Naturalization Service, Franklin Trust Building, Philadelphia, may be of some assistance.

My dear Senator:

In the absence overseas of General Hooks, I am replying to your letter of 1 April 1947.

All funds available to UNRRA are derived from voluntary contributions of non-invaded member nations of the World War II United Nations. These contributions have been approximately 2% of individual national income based on the fiscal year ending 30 June 1943, and are in accordance with the resolution of the UNRRA Council, the 48-nation body which governs this Administration. As a result of the adoption of this base, the United States, the world's wealthiest nation and the least affected by the ravages of war, has actually contributed some 72% of total UNRRA resources.

All financial resources of UNRRA have been converted to goods to meet relief requirements except for necessary administrative moneys. By definition, only "territories liberated by the United Nations" have received relief shipments from the various contributing countries. Relief has been distributed in accordance with bases approved by the UNRRA Council which sought to furnish equitably amongst the recipient nations "aid and relief from their sufferings, food, clothing and shelter, aid in the prevention of pestilence and in the recovery of the health of the people.....preparation and arrangements.....for the return of prisoners and exiles to their homes..... assistance in the resumption of urgently needed agricultural and industrial production and the restoration of essential services." I am transmitting with this letter several copies of our publication "50 Facts about UNRRA" which adds details to my statements above.

As I have indicated supplies and not funds are furnished all receiving countries including of course Yugoslavia. UNRRA has a Mission in Yugoslavia as well as all other receiving countries for the purpose of coordination of relief distribution. The sixteen Senior officials of this International Mission are of the following national derivation:

Despite the fact that Mission reports have never indicated abuse of relief on political or other grounds, UNRRA has had occasion to make several investigations because of charges of misuse of UNRRA supplies. The investigations indicated that such charges were unsupported. You may be interested in a press release of 31 October 1946 (several copies of which I am enclosing) reporting the results of an investigation made last Fall by a special UNRRA Commission of which I was Chairman. As indicated therein this Commission was not only concerned with obtaining a general view of UNRRA operations in Yugoslavia but also inquiring into the validity of many specific allegations.

As indicated in the report the Commission reached the conclusion that "there could be no doubt but that the great bulk of the two million tons of UNRRA supplies thus far sent to Yugoslavia has been distributed to the people for whom it was intended, and without question saved millions of lives."

I hope this information will be useful to you and I would appreciate your advising me if we can be of further service.

I am referring to your attention a letter I received recently from a Pennsylvania constituent raising some questions about UNRRA. I had intended answering the letter on the basis of my own information, but after holding it for some time, have finally decided to submit it to you for an official statement.

It seems to me that the writer of this letter is under the misapprehension that in some way or other receipts of the United States from income tax sources are held separately, administered separately, and spent separately from other funds. But that is not the relevant case here; he and his American Legion Post are concerned over the fear that UNRRA supplies to Yugoslavia, largely paid for by the United States, have been used "by the Russians".

Undoubtedly, you have facts on hand, perhaps publications, explaining how funds were spent in Yugoslavia and what safe-guards were exercised. I would appreciate your sending me this information so that I can relay it to Mr. Ritter.

Your letters of 27 and 30 January requesting UNRRA assistance in the immigration of Bernet and Elias Rothbart and of Klara Winter have been received. I am sorry that it is not possible for UNRRA to give you assistance in expediting the granting of visas to displaced persons. This is entirely the responsibility of the Department of State representatives in Germany. Personal data forms are made available to the displaced persons in the UNRRA camps and assistance in filing applications is given to the displaced persons by voluntary agency personnel working under UNRRA direction. After the visa is granted, UNRRA arranges for the transport of the immigrants to the embarkation camp but the actual expediting of the visa is the responsibility of the Consul.

My dear Senator Myers,

Thank you for your letter of 20th February requesting information concerning the procedure employed by UNRRA in procuring frozen fish for shipment overseas.

I regret to inform you that we are not now in a position to handle frozen fish. It is not only difficult to obtain refrigerated shipping space but it is also impossible to handle frozen foods after arrival in the country of destination. We, therefore, regret that we are unable to take advantage of low priced food items which would add substantially to the meagre food supplies in the various countries for which UNRRA has financial responsibility.

I am, however, happy to be able to inform you that our Food Division recently agreed in principle to procure some ten million pounds of canned ground fish reclaimed from by-products of the frozen fillets of fish prepared on the Atlantic seaboard. These by-products are normally diverted into non-food uses or discarded as waste.
