I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in the country continues to be generally calm.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

1. GNU, OTHER LOCAL AUTHORITIES:

PMT-KIGALI PREFECTURE

Reported that the visiting President of UGANDA addressed a rally which was held at AMAHORO Stadium. The rally was attended by the Rwandese President, Vice-President, Prime Minister, Diplomats and other top Government officials. About 20,000 locals from all walks of life attended the rally. The rally was hitch free. RPA and Gendarmerie provided security.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and has facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible growth in retail businesses of consumer's goods in the prefectures.

III. OWN ACTIVITIES:

1. CIVPOL HEADQUARTERS:

- a. *Orientation course for the 22 newly arrived CIVPOL Personnel from DJIBOUTI, GERMANY, MALI, NIGER and SWITZERLAND is in progress at CIVPOL HQ/ITRAFIPRO*
- b. *UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.*

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

a. PMT- GITARAMA PREFECTURE

The team visited MASANGO Commune prison and found 150 inmates made up of 143 men, 6 women and 1 child. The inmates are being fed by their relations. The officer in-charge of the prison disclosed that 1 prisoner died of Malaria on 12/8/95.

b. PMT- BUTARE PREFECTURE

The team patrolled RUHASHYA Commune and met the Bourgmestre who disclosed to the team that there are 130 inmates in the commune prison, some of whom have to be transferred to NYABIJIMU prison in order to de- congest the prison. The Bourgmestre expressed his dis-appointment at the failure of UN agencies to provide transport to move the prisoners to Nyabijimu prison.

The Bourgmestre also informed the team that there are 40 houses for returnees in the commune which have to be re-habilitated. He appealed to the NGO's for assistance in terms of building materials and household items.

In another development the team visited RUHASHYA Clinic within the commune and found one local who was badly beaten up by unknown people after he was suspected of being INTERAHAMWE. The team evacuated the local to BUTARE Hospital for further treatment. Investigation in progress.

- a. *The orientation-course for 22 newly arrived CIVPOL-Observers from Germany, Switzerland, Mali, Niger and Djibouti ended on 18. Aug. 95.*

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:a. PMT -RUHENGARI PREFECTURE

Patrolled Cyeru Commune and met the Bourgemestre who informed the team that a number of locals in the area are involved in illegal trafficking of wolfram to Uganda. The Bourgemestre also reported the release of a local Councillor who was arrested for aiding the traffickers. He further revealed that 18 locals have been arrested for different crimes and efforts are being made to transfer to Ruhengeri prison.

b. PMT- BUTARE PREFECTURE

The team patrolled Mbazi Commune and met the Assistant Bourgemestre who informed the team that the security situation in the area is calm. He also disclosed that there are 100 inmates in the commune prison and 40 out of this number would be transferred to Butare prison.

The team visited Mbazi Clinic within the commune and met the nurse in-charge who disclosed that the Clinic has no sufficient drugs for the patients. She further disclosed that the Clinic is now attending to the health needs of prisoners in the commune and appealed to the Red Cross for assistance.

PMT-GISENYI PREFECTURE

A combined team of CIVPOL/Human Rights Monitors visited the scene of the murder of 3 persons in GISENYI township on 18/8/95. Eye witness to the incident disclosed that armed soldiers numbering between 15 and 20 came to the house in the early hours of 18/8/95 and ordered the deceased to open the gate. The armed soldiers entered the house and shot the 3 persons killing them instantly. After the incident the soldiers stole 3,400,000 FRW from the deceased's house. Investigations in progress.

Reported that the President of UGANDA arrived in RWANDA on 14 August 1995 on 3 days official visit.

5.1 PMT-KIBUNGO PREFECTURE

The team reported that UNHCR Representative in KIBUNGO Prefecture informed them that 450 registered refugees are expected to arrive in KIBUNGO on 14/8/95 from TANZANIA. He further stated that there is information from their office in TANZANIA that some Rwandese are fleeing the country into TANZANIA from RUKIRA Commune. Meanwhile, 20 returnees from TANZANIA and ZAIRE have arrived in the commune and are awaiting to be re-settled

The team also visited RUKIRA Commune and met the Bourgmestre who informed the team that the commune has 111 orphans who are in dire need of assistance. He also informed the team that assistance is required to repair the commune's office which was destroyed during the war.

The team patrolled Ntyazo Commune and met the in-charge of the orphanage at CYOTAMAKARA who informed the team that on 12/8/95 the orphanage was robbed of 2 generators by bandits. The matter has since been reported to the Gendarmerie and they are investigating.

In another development, the team observed the new Prefect of the commune addressing locals near the commune building. He was on a familiarization tour of the commune.

b. PMT-KIGALI PREFECTURE

Reported that on 13/8/95 at about 21:00 hrs two armed bandits dressed in civilian clothes attacked two guards at ICRC warehouse and stole 95 cartons of vegetable cooking oil. The two bandits used an unregistered TOYOTA PICKUP to convey the items. Investigations in progress.

c. PMT-CYANGUGU PREFECTURE

Reported that the former magistrate of CYANGUGU who is seeking for security assistance is still under the care of CIVPOL CYANGUGU pending the outcome of HR report to Rwandan GVT authorities about this HUMAN RIGHTS violation case.

Visited Cyumba Commune and visited the Asst. Bourgmestre who disclosed that 586 returnees from UGANDA have arrived in the commune from December 94 to July 95 and are staying with relatives as the Govt has not yet allocated them land to resettle. He disclosed further that the population in the Commune at the moment is 30,437 as against 42,125 before the war.

d. PMT - BUTARE PREFECTURE

Conducted joint patrols with MILOBS and visited MUYAGA Commune. I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in the country continues to be generally calm.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

1. PMT RUHENGARI PREFECTURE

Patrolled NYARUTOVU Commune on 22 July 95 and was informed that a local in-charge of the tentage has been arrested by RPA and detained at RUHENGARI prison for no apparent reason. HR informed. Investigation in progress.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and has facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible growth in retail businesses of consumer goods in the prefectures.

4. ECONOMIC:

The domestic economic situation is making subsistence living very hard and out of reach of many in the prefectures.

5. HUMANITARIAN:

A. PMT - GIKONGORO PREFECTURE

A joint CIVPOL/MILOBS Team visited MUDASOMWA Commune on 22/7/95 and reported that there is no health center in the Commune and as such patients have to travel long distances to seek medical treatment.

B. PMT - BYUMBA PREFECTURE

Visited BYUMBA prison on 22/7/95 and met the Director of the prison who informed the team that there were 310 inmates in the prison. 240 out of this number are suspected to have participated in last year's genocide. The Director also complained of lack of transport and food for the prisoners.

In another development the team also visited Gatuna border post and was informed that 35 refugees from UGANDA have returned to BYUMBA Prefecture and have been re-settled in their respective home communes.

C. PMT - KIGALI PREFECTURE

Visited NDERA IDPs camp on 22/7/95 and was informed that there were 195 IDPs in the camp awaiting evacuation to their respective home communes. 47 out of this number are awaiting the decision of the Ministry of Rehabilitation to allocate them land to resettle.

D. PMT - RUHENGARI PREFECTURE

Visited the MSF clinic on 22/7/95. The Medical Officer in-charge disclosed that the clinic is in dire need of mattresses and beds. The prevailing sickness in the area is malaria.

The same team visited African Humanitarian Action clinic and was informed that the situation in the area is under control.

III. OWN ACTIVITIES:

1. CIVPOL HEADQUARTERS:

UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

PMT - KIBUYE PREFECTURE

Reported that 2 Brown and Root local workers at Malawi Coy premises broke into the food storage room of Malawi Coy on 22 July 95 and stole some quantity of combat rations. They have since been apprehended and handed-over to Communal Police for further investigation.

IV. TRAINING

The Director of the Ruhengeri National Gendarmerie Training School held a meeting with 18 CIVPOL Observers redeployed to the school as instructors on 22 July 95. The Director disclosed that the formal opening of the course would not commence on 24 July 95 as earlier on planned in view of the fact that the school is face with the problem of insufficient seating accomodation for the students. He disclosed further that 510 students have reported as at 22 July 95 instead of the 500 students. He further empasised the need for a vehicle for the school as well as partitioning of the existing living accomodation for the 18 CIVPOL instructors.

V. CRIME WAVE

UNAMIR CIVPOL Monitoring Teams in the prefectures have reported that criminal activities have reduced to some extent.

Patrolled AOR on 20/7/95 and reported that the Chief Military Adviser to the SRSG visited the Sector in order to identify areas which mark the border between Rwanda and Zaire and also to verify points of possible infiltration into RWANDA by FRGF.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and have facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

PMT-BUTARE PREFECTURE

A joint CIVPOL/MILOBS visited Runyinya Commune on 21/7/95 and met Assistant Bourgmestre who informed the team that the remains of the 1994 genocide victims would be exhumed on 22/7/95 for re-burial in the Commune.

The team was also informed by Assistant Bourgmestre that refugees from neighbouring countries coming to the commune go straight to their respective homes to re-settle. He also complained of lack of relief supplies of food in the commune.

In another development, the team visited KABILIZI refugee camp in RUNYINYA Commune and was informed that there were 450 refugees awaiting evacuation to their respective home communes.

PMT-GIKONGORO PREFECTURE

Visited MUSEBEYA Commune on 20/7/95 and was informed that RPA are suspected to have been threatening locals with arbitrary arrests. The team was also informed that a week ago one local is suspected to have been arrested by RPA and detained in the Commune cells. Reasons unknown. Investigation in progress.

The team also visited NYAMAGABE Commune and met the Bourgmestre who informed the team that the crime wave in the area was on the increase. He also complained of bandits who are suspected to be coming from other communes to steal cattle from locals. Investigation in progress.

PMT- KIGALI PREFECTURE

Visited KIGALI prison on 21/7/95 and observed that many locals had gathered at the prison to visit their relatives.

UN RESTRICTED

prison. The locals expressed their concern about the deteriorating living conditions in prison. Human Rights informed.

PMT- CYANGUGU PREFECTURE

Patrolled AOR on 20/7/95 and reported that locals were anxious to know when the programme of the communal police would commence.

IV. TRAINING

The graduated UNAMIR trained gendarmes at Ruhengeri National Gendarmerie Training School have been deployed in the various Prefectures. Meanwhile, the school is preparing grounds for the opening programme. In view of this, all the expected 500 students from various prefectures have arrived at the school to commence training.

The Commandant of the training school when contacted disclosed that 300 desks are so far available. Efforts to get the remaining 200 desks is being made in order to enable the formal opening of the school to commence.

Eighteen (18) French speaking CIVPOL observers have been re-deployed at the training school to serve as instructors.

PMT- RUHENGARI PREFECTURE

- a. The team reported that on 19/7/95 the Government of National Unity celebrated its first Anniversary of Independence in the prefecture. The RUHENGARI Battalion Commander delivered the President's speech on behalf of the Bde Commander. CIVPOL/MILOBS were among the invited guests at the ceremony.
- b. The team also visited Gendarmerie Bde on 20/7/95 and met the representative of the Gendarmerie who informed the team that the Gendarmerie in the prefecture would co-operate with UNAMIR with particular attention to CIVPOL in as far as its tasks are concerned.

- c. In another development, the Gendarmerie representative informed the team that the prison in the area is over crowded and inmates are living under poor sanitary conditions. Human Rights informed.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and have facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible growth in retail businesses of consumer's goods in the prefectures.

A joint CIVPOL/MILOBS visited KIBUYE Hospital on 19/7/95 and was informed that the hospital has no transport and no sufficient drugs to cater for the patients. The team was also informed that the hospital has no sufficient manpower.

UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring activities of CIVPOL observers in the Prefectures.

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

PMT- BYUMBA PREFECTURE

- a. Visited Cyungo Commune on 19/7/95 and met the Assistant Bourgmestre who informed the team that land mines are suspected to have been planted in one of the bush areas within the commune. Investigation in progress.
- b. In an other development the team reported that EAFOC Secondary School within CYUNGO Commune which was closed in April 1994 during the war has not been re-opened. All teachers are reported to have fled to neighbouring countries.

PMT- BUTARE PREFECTURE

The team patrolled NYAKIZU and MBAZI Communes on 19/7/95 and reported that a re-burial Ceremony of 1994 genocide victims is being planed for 15/8/95. It was alleged that 20,000 locals were killed in CYAHINDA Catholic church in NYAKIZU Commune. The remains of the victims will be exhumed and re-buried as a sign of honour for the departed ones.

d. PMT-GITARAMA PREFECTURE

Reported that on 17/7/95 a joint CIVPOL/MILOB/HR team patrolled Mugina Commune and met the Bourgmestre who informed the team that the crime wave in the area was on the increase. He further disclosed that on 9/7/95 a local was shot and killed by RPA soldier. The deceased is alleged to have fought the RPA soldier who used his rifle allegedly in self defence.

Object:

I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in the country continues to be generally calm.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

1. GNU, OTHER LOCAL AUTHORITIES:

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Patrolled Kigali and its environs and reported that the Govt. of Rwanda has declared 1 - 4 July 95 public holidays in commemoration of independence and liberation days. The team also disclosed that a number of activities will take place on the 4 July 95 at Nyamirambo Stadium where the President and his Vice and other top Govt. officials are expected to attend.

2. RPA:

PMT - GIKONGORO Prefecture:

A. Reported that on 25/6/95 a local worker employed by Human Rights as a day watchman was arrested by RPA soldiers and taken for detention to unknown destination. Reason for the arrest unknown. Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

B. The team further reported that information has it that locals employed by UNAMIR and NGOs are suspected by RPA soldiers as spies. These local staff are often picked by RPA operatives and subjected to thorough interrogation on activities and other information concerning UNAMIR. Investigation in progress.

PMT - KIBUYE Prefecture:

A. Joint CIVPOL/MILOBS patrolled Ngoma and Gitwa Sectors in Mabanga Commune on 30/6/95 and reported that 8 locals suspected to have participated in last year's genocide were arrested and detained by RPA soldiers. Human Rights informed.

B. The team further reported that bandits suspected to be RPA soldiers robbed locals of 30 cows. Investigation in progress.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and has facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible growth in retail businesses of consumer's goods in the prefectures.

4. ECONOMIC:

The domestic economic situation is making subsistence living very hard and out of reach of many in the prefectures.

5. HUMANITARIAN: NTR.

III. OWN ACTIVITIES:

1. CIVPOL HEADQUARTERS:

A. The CIVPOL Commissioner on 29/6/95 at CIVPOL HQ hosted the delegation of Canadian International Development Agency who are preparing a training programme for judicial police officers in Rwanda. The meeting was centered on more information on the ongoing training of Gendarmerie.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Commissioner in company of a delegation of UNDP representatives, UND Security Officer and a representative from the office of the Director of Training Gendarmerie HQ visited Ruhengeri National Gendarmerie Training School on 1 July 95 to access the renovation work in the school.

C. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

PMT - CYANGUGU Prefecture:

Reported that between 25/6/95 and 28/95 there were series of banditry activities in the prefecture. The perpetrators were dressed in military uniform and armed with automatic weapons. A local woman was reported shot and killed during one of the incidents. The act of banditry is on the increase in the prefecture. Investigation in progress.

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Patrolled Kanombe Airport on 1/7/95 and reported that a new Govt. fiscal/decision came into effect today where a toll of 150 FRW is being paid for entry and parking at the airport exit gate. The PMT however observed that the policy to UN-Observers will have far-reaching consequences on monitoring functions at the airport as observers cannot continue to bear this cost indefinitely.

PMT - BUTARE Prefecture:

Reported that in the night of 29/6/95 2 locals suspected to be RPA soldiers armed with an AK 47 rifle robbed a World Food Programme personnel of 1000 USD at gun point at his residence. Investigation in progress.

PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

Reported that in the night of 1 July 95 two local night watchmen of Electrogaz Gisenyi were killed by bandits. No arrest made. Investigation in progress. The team also disclosed that a bomb explosion was heard near Gisenyi power station. No Casualty was reported.

3. TRAINING:

The graduated UNAMIR trained gendarmes at Ruhengeri National Training School are now awaiting deployment. Also preparation of handout in English lessons is in progress. In the same vein the teaching documents for the take off of the Communal Police is in the pipeline.

IV. CRIME WAVE

UNAMIR CIVPOL Monitoring Teams in the prefectures reported that criminal activities have reduced to some extent.

V. Investigation:

CIVPOL Monitoring Teams in the prefectures are assisting Human Rights Monitors in the investigation of Human Rights violation cases. The teams are also assisting UNAMIR Military Police in motor accident cases throughout the prefectures.
