DAILY SITREP FOR 21 DEC 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5B ALSO REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 164. ALL OF THEM CAME FROM ZAIRE. IN ADDITION TO THE CROSSINGS REPORTED EARLIER, 881 CROSSED FROM BURUNDI ON 19 DEC 95 AND 27 FROM TANZANIA ON 20 DEC 95. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 3213. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE OPENING OF ARDEC HOUSING PROJECT INAUGURATED BY PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU IN THE PRESENCE OF OTHER DIGNITARIES INCLUDING THE VICE PREMIER AND CABINET MINISTERS. VARIOUS HEADS OF UN AGENCIES AND MEMBERS OF THE DIPLOMATIC CORPS ALSO PARTICIPATED IN THE CEREMONY. THE PRESIDENT APPLAUDED THE ROLE OF UNAMIR, WFP AND UNICEF IN DEVELOPING THE HOUSING PROJECT. LATER, THE FIRST EVER RESIDENT BRITISH AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA CALLED ON THE SRSG AND HELD WIDE RANGING DISCUSSIONS CONCERNING THE SUB-REGION AND RWANDA IN PARTICULAR. IN THE AFTERNOON THE SRSG MET WITH THE VISITING WFP REPRESENTATIVE MR RONALD C.S SIBANDA AND DISCUSSED MATTERS IN REGARD TO THE RETURN OF REFUGEES AND THE EQUIPMENT ISSUE.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA /GENDARMERIE. IN SECTOR 3A (GIKINGORO), IN KIRAMBO COMMUNE, TWO RPA SOLDIERS WITH TWO WOMEN VISITED A BAR IN MURANDI SECTOR (GR 3538) ON 19 DEC 95. AFTER CONSUMING LIQUOR, THEY DEMANDED A ROOM FROM THE LADY RUNNING THE BAR. WHEN THE LADY REFUSED, THE RPA SOLDIERS STARTED MANHANDLING THE LADY. THE HUSBAND, BROTHER AND MOTHER OF THE LADY RUSHED TO HER ASSISTANCE AND IN THE ENSUING SCUFFLE, ONE OF THE RPA SOLDIERS WHO WAS ARMED, SHOT THE HUSBAND OF THE LADY. SUBSEQUENTLY THE SOLDIERS WERE ARRESTED. WHILE THE UNARMED SOLDIER WAS PUT IN DETENTION, THE ARMED ONE WAS TAKEN TO THE BAR AND SHOT DEAD BY RPA SOLDIERS.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 21 RETURNEES ARRIVED NDERA CAMP FROM KIBUNGO. 152 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIBUNGO, BYUMBA, KIBUYE, GITARAMA, KANZENZE, KIGALI RURAL AND KIGALI TOWN. A TOTAL OF 138 RETURNEES ARE STILL AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. GHANCOY TRANSPORTED 136 AND 100 PRISONERS FROM MUHAZI (GR 4890) AND RWAMAGANA (GR 4883) CACHOTS RESPECTIVELY TO KIBUNGO PRISON.

C. MALAWICOY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO IRC FOR TRANSPORTING GRAVEL.

D. NICOY PROVIDED TWO TRUCKS TO "FOOD FOR HUNGRY INTERNATIONAL" FOR TRANSPORTING CONSTRUCTION MATERIAL.

E. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED A DOZER IN GITARAMA PRISON FOR CREATING SANITARY FACILITIES AND PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING FUEL WOOD.

F. FORCE SIGNAL COY CONTINUED ASSISTING RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES AND PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING FUEL WOOD.

G. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 229 MEDICAL AND 25 DENTAL PATIENTS.

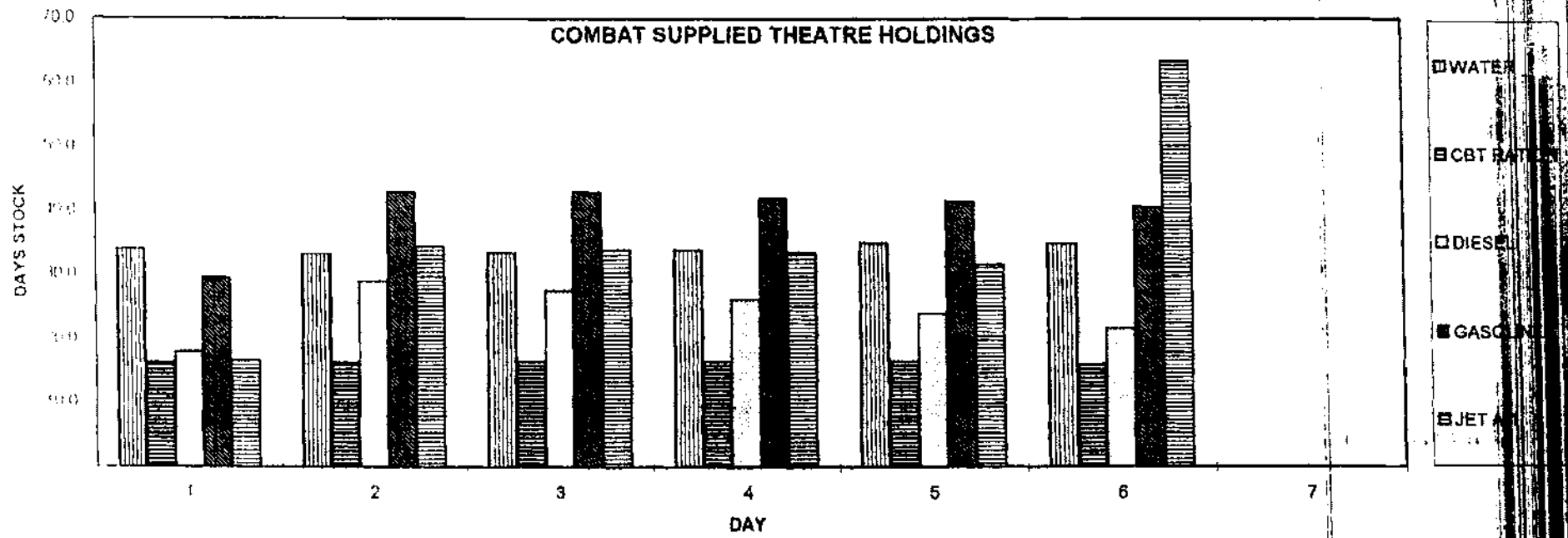

DAILY SITREP FOR 20 DEC 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5B ALSO REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 265. ALL OF THEM CAME FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 3141. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING AT THE UNDP CONFERENCE ROOM AND DISCUSSED THE CONTINGENCY PLANS AFTER THE DEPARTURE OF UNAMIR, THE AGENCY PLAN FOR REFUGEE RETURN AND THE NGOs ISSUE.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE THIRD JOINT RWANDA-BURUNDI COMMISSION BEGAN ITS WORK ON 19 DEC 95 AND DELIBERATED UPON THE POSSIBILITY OF COOPERATION IN THE FIELD OF POLITICS, ECONOMY, SOCIAL WELFARE, SCIENCE, CULTURE AND SECURITY, PARTICULARLY AT THE BORDER AND IN THE SUB-REGION.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA /GENDARMERIE.

(1) SECTOR 5A- RUHENGIERI. MILOB PATROL TO NYAMUTERA COMMUNE (5719), WAS INFORMED THAT MOST OF THE EX-FRGF WHO WERE RECRUITED INTO THE RPA, HAVE DESERTED AFTER SEEING THE CONDITIONS THERE. THE RPA THEN LAUNCHED A SEARCH OP AND ARRESTED MOST OF THEM. HOWEVER THE WHEREABOUTS OF THE DESERTERS IS PRESENTLY NOT KNOWN.

(2) IN SECTOR 3B (BUTARE), IN MUGUSA COMMUNE GR 8425, IT WAS LEARNT THAT A LOCAL WHO WAS ARRESTED BY THE RPA FOR BEING IN POSSESSION OF UNIFORMS, WAS SHOT DEAD ON 20 DEC 95. THE RPA CLAIM THAT THE DECEASED WAS KILLED WHILE TRYING TO ESCAPE. HR INFORMED AND INVESTIGATIONS ARE IN PROGRESS.

(3) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), IN MUGINA COMMUNE, RPA SOLDIERS SHOT DEAD A LOCAL ON 19 DEC 95 FOR ALLEGEDLY

SUPPLYING WEAPONS TO THE INTERHAMWE DURING THE GENOCIDE. INVESTIGATIONS BY THE IPJ AND THE BOURGEMESTRE ARE IN PROGRESS. HR INFORMED.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI), MILOBS REPORTED THAT THERE WAS A CIRCULATION OF LEAFLETS ABOUT THE RETURN OF FRGF ABOUT THREE WEEKS AGO. SENIOR RPA OFFICERS AND THE PREFECT OF RUHENGARI WENT AROUND AND TOOK SOME OF THE LEAFLETS AWAY. IN THE SAME SECTOR, ARMED BANDITS WHO CALL THEMSELVES "ABAZIMBABWE" HAVE INCREASED THEIR ACTIVITIES IN NYAMUTERA COMMUNE. SO FAR ONLY TWO OF THEM HAVE BEEN ARRESTED. IT WAS LEARNT THAT SOME RPA SOLDIERS HAVE BEEN COLLABORATING WITH THE BANDITS BY SUPPLYING THEM WEAPONS.

(2) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), A MILOBS TEAM TO BIBUNGO SECTOR GR 8968 REPORTED THAT ONE LOCAL WAS KILLED IN KAMWILLI CELLULE ON 12 DEC 95 BY TWO CIVILIANS AND ONE MAN IN UNIFORM. THE MOTIVE FOR THE KILLING IS NOT KNOWN BUT BANDITS ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE CARRIED OUT THE KILLING. HR INFORMED.

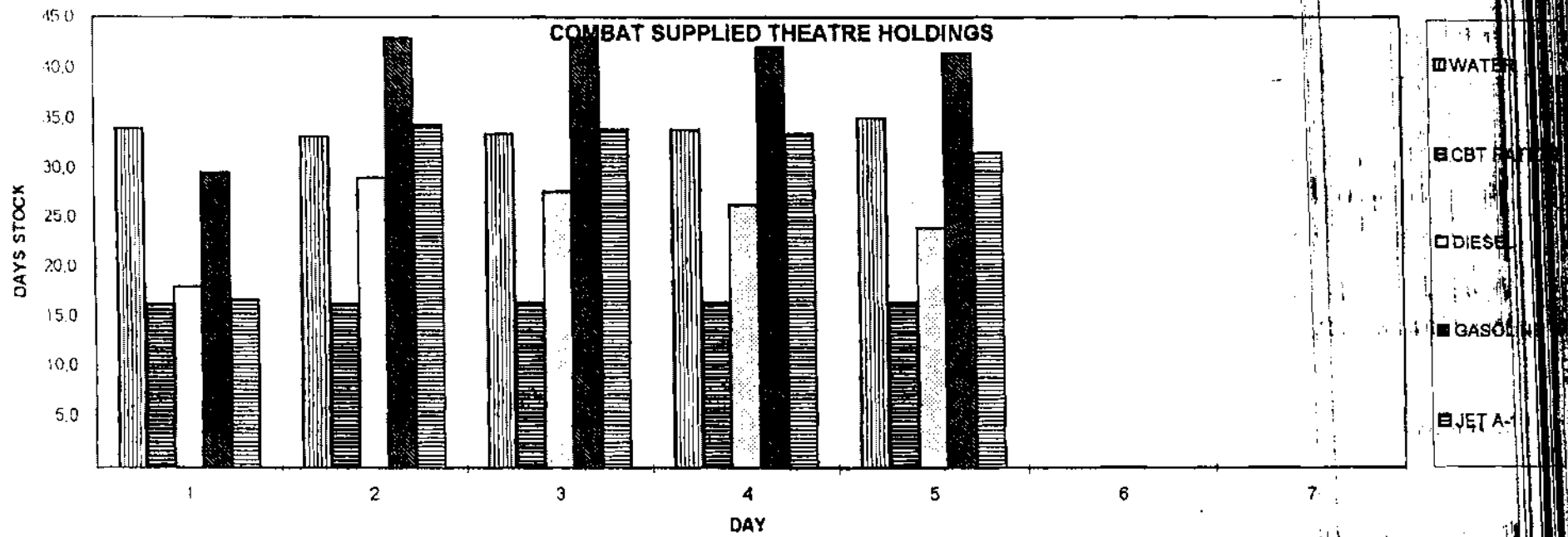



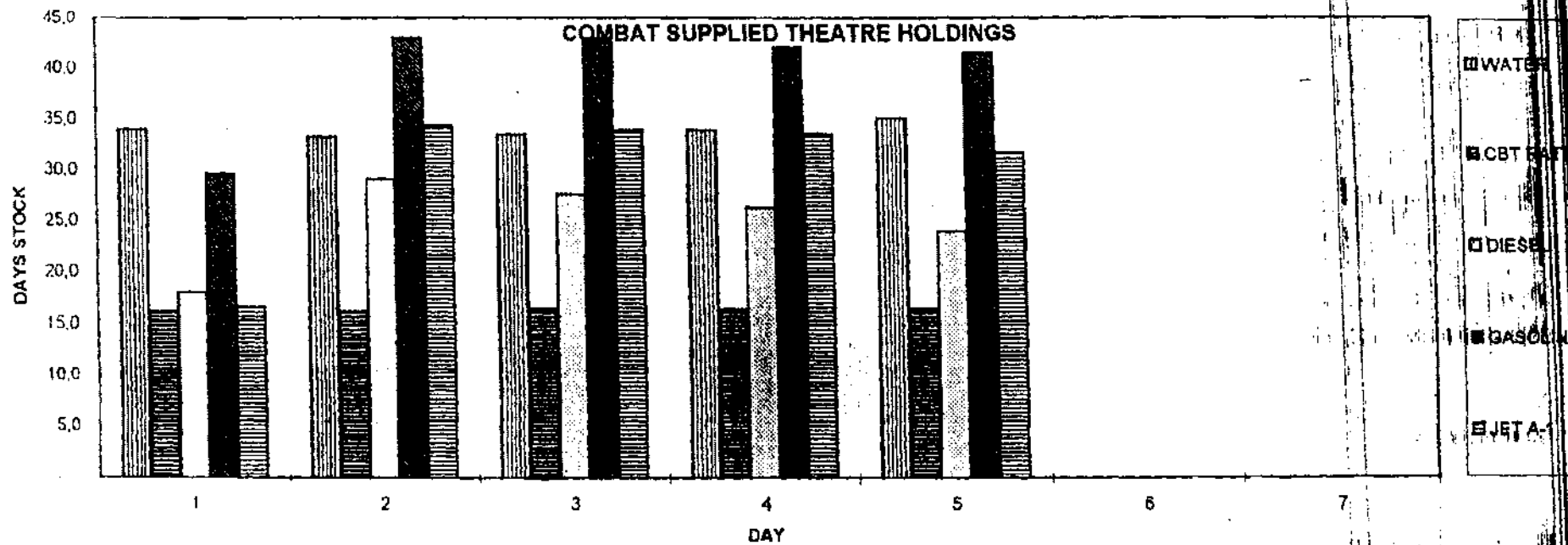

DAILY SITREP FOR 19 DEC 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REOPENED ON 19 DEC 95 TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5B REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 230. ALL OF THEM CAME FROM ZAIRE. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 2876. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING OF SENIOR STAFF MEMBERS OF UNAMIR TO DISCUSS MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE NEW MANDATE. HE THEN HELD HIS WEEKLY MEETING WITH RWANDAN GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS ON THE UNAMIR MANDATE. LATER HE ATTENDED A MEETING AT THE ARDEC PROJECT SITE AND WAS GIVEN AN OVERVIEW OF THE HOUSING PROJECT BEING DEVELOPED BY THAT ORGANISATION. FINALLY, THE SRSG MET WITH THE CHIEF OF STAFF OF THE NATIONAL GENDARMERIE, MR NDIBWAMI DEOGRATIAS, WITH WHOM HE HAD A USEFUL EXCHANGE OF VIEWS.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA INFORMED THE VISITING INDIAN AMBASSADOR FOR UGANDA, RWANDA AND BURUNDI, MR SS GILL, THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA WAS DETERMINED TO REPATRIATE ALL REFUGEES FROM ZAIRE, TANZANIA AND BURUNDI TO ENSURE LASTING STABILITY IN THE COUNTRY. RADIO RWANDA ALSO ANNOUNCED THE START OF THE RWANDA - BURUNDI BILATERAL COMMISSION MEETING IN KIGALI ON 19 DEC 95, TO DISCUSS JOINT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES DESPITE TENSION BETWEEN THE TWO NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES DUE TO INTERNAL POLITICAL STRAINS.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA /GENDARMERIE. MILOBS SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) REPORTED THAT TWO TANZANIAN ARMY OFFICERS WERE NOTICED TALKING TO RPA OFFICERS AT BUKOBA BORDER POST ON THE RWANDAN SIDE. THE EXACT SUBJECT OF DISCUSSION COULD NOT BE ASCERTAINED BUT IT IS BELIEVED TO BE CENTRED ON RECENT FORCED REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CLAIMED TO HAVE COMMITTED CRIMES IN TANZANIA.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT ONE PRISON INMATE IN NYAKABANDA COMMUNE DIED OF MALARIA AT GITEGA HOSPITAL ON 18 DEC 95. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED 13 LOCALS, REPORTEDLY FRGF SOLDIERS IN THE COMMUNE.

(2) SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) - ON 18 DEC 95, FIVE MEN INCLUDING A 12 YEAR OLD BOY WERE KILLED IN MUHAZA SECTOR (GR 6825) OF CYABINGO COMMUNE WHILST DRINKING IN A BAR BY TWO UNIDENTIFIED ARMED MEN. TWO OTHERS SUSTAINED SERIOUS INJURIES AND HAVE BEEN ADMITTED TO RUHENGARI HOSPITAL. ALL THE VICTIMS ARE FARMERS AND INHABITANTS OF THE SAME AREA. CAUSE OF KILLINGS UNKNOWN. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(3) SECTOR 3B (BUTARE) - MILOBS PATROL TO NYABISINDU COMMUNE GR 7138 REPORTED THAT A SYNDICATE OF HUTUS, MOSTLY WOMEN, WERE ARRESTED ON 14 DEC 95 FOR ALLEGEDLY ATTEMPTING TO KILL A SELECTED NUMBER OF TUTSI WOMEN USING POISONED MILK. THE LOCAL SECURITY AGENTS ARRESTED THE CHILDREN BEING USED TO SELL THE POISONED MILK.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 71 RETURNEES ARRIVED NDERA CAMP FROM GISENYI. 46 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO GITARAMA, KIGALI VILLAGE, BUTARE AND GASHORA. A TOTAL OF 194 ARE AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED A DOZER EACH TO THE REHABILITATION PROJECT SPONSORED BY MRS KAGAME AND FOR IMPROVING THE APPROACH TO THE NEW IOM LOC. ALSO DEPLOYED A EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER FOR CREATING SANITARY FACILITIES IN GITARAMA PRISON AND PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD.

C. FORCE SIGNAL COY CONTINUED ASSISTING RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES AND ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD.

D. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 198 MEDICAL AND 11 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO), MILOBS COLLECTED 1325 GIFT PACKETS FROM SAMARITAN PURSE OF KIGALI FOR PRESENTATION TO ORPHANS IN KIBUNGO PREFECTURE.

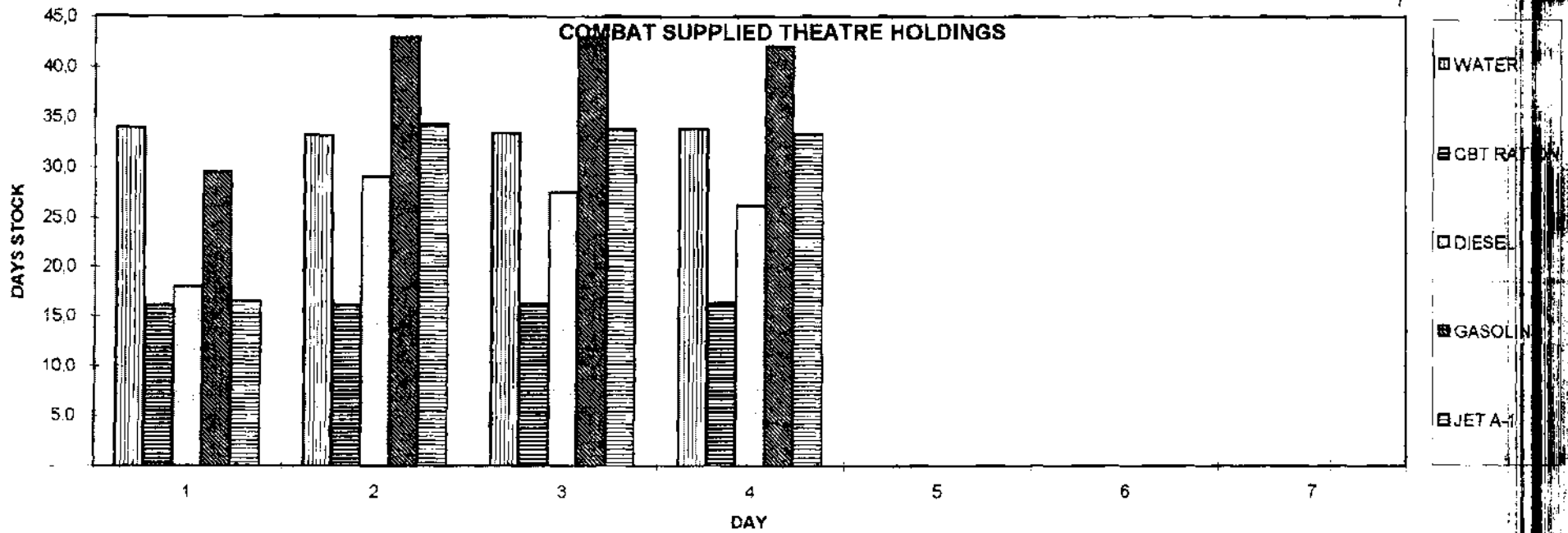

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 2876. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG HELD A MEETING OF SENIOR STAFF MEMBERS OF UNAMIR TO DISCUSS MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE NEW MANDATE. HE THEN HELD HIS WEEKLY MEETING WITH RWANDAN GOVERNMENT OFFICIALS ON THE UNAMIR MANDATE. LATER HE ATTENDED A MEETING AT THE ARDEC PROJECT SITE AND WAS GIVEN AN OVERVIEW OF THE HOUSING PROJECT BEING DEVELOPED BY THAT ORGANISATION. FINALLY, THE SRSG MET WITH THE CHIEF OF STAFF OF THE NATIONAL GENDARMERIE, MR NDIWAMI DEOGRATIAS, WITH WHOM HE HAD A USEFUL EXCHANGE OF VIEWS.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA INFORMED THE VISITING INDIAN AMBASSADOR FOR UGANDA, RWANDA AND BURUNDI, MR SS GILL, THAT THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA WAS DETERMINED TO REPATRIATE ALL REFUGEES FROM ZAIRE, TANZANIA AND BURUNDI TO ENSURE LASTING STABILITY IN THE COUNTRY. RADIO RWANDA ALSO ANNOUNCED THE START OF THE RWANDA - BURUNDI BILATERAL COMMISSION MEETING IN KIGALI ON 19 DEC 95, TO DISCUSS JOINT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES DESPITE TENSION BETWEEN THE TWO NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES DUE TO INTERNAL POLITICAL STRAINS.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA /GENDARMERIE. MILOBS SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) REPORTED THAT TWO TANZANIAN ARMY OFFICERS WERE NOTICED TALKING TO RPA OFFICERS AT BUKOBA BORDER POST ON THE RWANDAN SIDE. THE EXACT SUBJECT OF DISCUSSION COULD NOT BE ASCERTAINED BUT IT IS BELIEVED TO BE CENTRED ON RECENT FORCED REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CLAIMED TO HAVE COMMITTED CRIMES IN TANZANIA.

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) - MILOBS REPORTED THAT ONE PRISON INMATE IN NYAKABANDA COMMUNE DIED OF MALARIA AT GITEGA HOSPITAL ON 18 DEC 95. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT RPA ARRESTED 13 LOCALS, REPORTEDLY FRGF SOLDIERS IN THE COMMUNE.

(2) SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) - ON 18 DEC 95, FIVE MEN INCLUDING A 12 YEAR OLD BOY WERE KILLED IN MUHAZA SECTOR (GR 6825) OF CYABINGO COMMUNE WHILST DRINKING IN A BAR BY TWO UNIDENTIFIED ARMED MEN. TWO OTHERS SUSTAINED SERIOUS INJURIES AND HAVE BEEN ADMITTED TO RUHENGARI HOSPITAL. ALL THE VICTIMS ARE FARMERS AND INHABITANTS OF THE SAME AREA. CAUSE OF KILLINGS UNKNOWN. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(3) SECTOR 3B (BUTARE) - MILOBS PATROL TO NYABISINDU COMMUNE GR 7138 REPORTED THAT A SYNDICATE OF HUTUS, MOSTLY WOMEN, WERE ARRESTED ON 14 DEC 95 FOR ALLEGEDLY ATTEMPTING TO KILL A SELECTED NUMBER OF TUTSI WOMEN USING POISONED MILK. THE LOCAL SECURITY AGENTS ARRESTED THE CHILDREN BEING USED TO SELL THE POISONED MILK.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. NSTR.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 71 RETURNEES ARRIVED NDERA CAMP FROM GISENYI. 46 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO GITARAMA, KIGALI VILLAGE, BUTARE AND GASHORA. A TOTAL OF 194 ARE AWAITING EVACUATION.

B. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED A DOZER EACH TO THE REHABILITATION PROJECT SPONSORED BY MRS KAGAME AND FOR IMPROVING THE APPROACH TO THE NEW IOM LOC. ALSO DEPLOYED A EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER FOR CREATING SANITARY FACILITIES IN GITARAMA PRISON AND PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD.

C. FORCE SIGNAL COY CONTINUED ASSISTING RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES AND ALSO PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF WOOD.

D. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 198 MEDICAL AND 11 DENTAL PATIENTS.

6. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS. IN SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO), MILOBS COLLECTED 1325 GIFT PACKETS FROM SAMARITAN PURSE OF KIGALI FOR PRESENTATION TO ORPHANS IN KIBUNGO PREFECTURE.

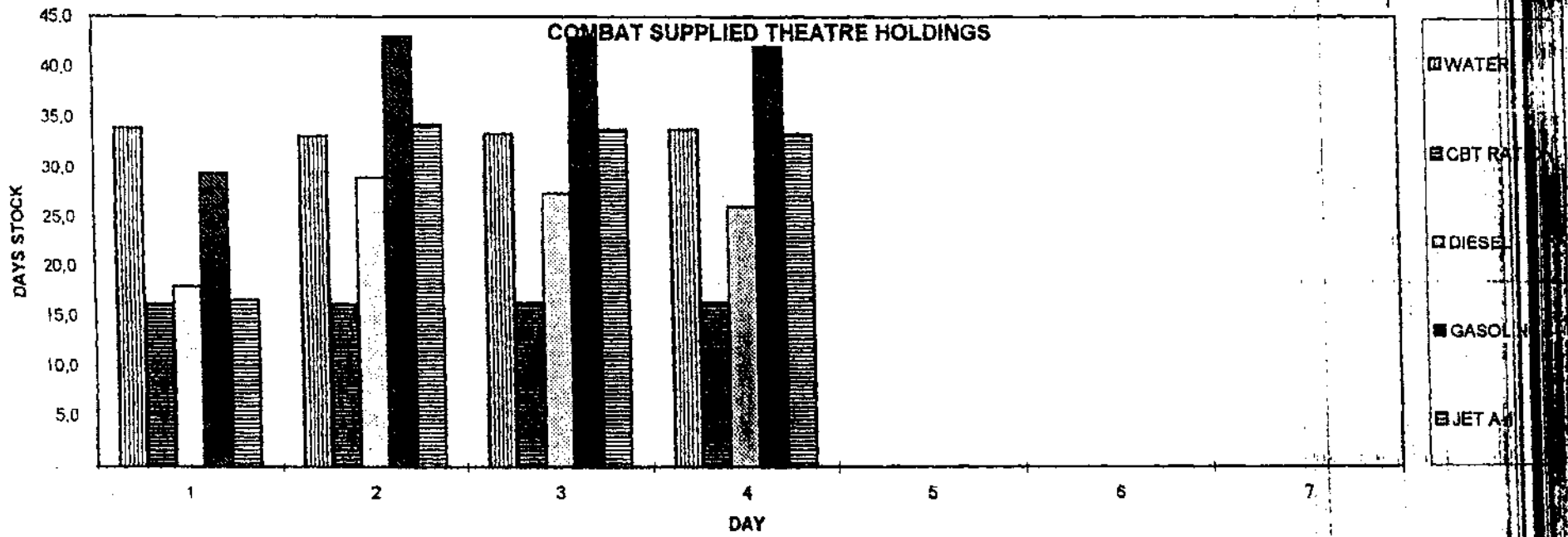

WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 12 DEC TO 18 DEC 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS.

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REOPENED ON 17 DEC 95 TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5B, REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. DETAILS OF BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE WEEK 1347. TOTAL OUTFLOW NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG VISITED THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE ON 11 DECEMBER AND HELD A MEETING WITH MR. CLAUDE DUSAIDI, VICE-PRESIDENT'S ADVISOR ON POLITICAL AFFAIRS, ON THE ISSUE OF UNAMIR'S MANDATE. THEREAFTER, THE SRSG MET WITH AMBASSADORS OF THE COUNTRIES REPRESENTED IN THE SECURITY COUNCIL AND DISCUSSED LATEST POSITION IN THIS REGARD.

B. ON 13 DEC 95, THE SRSG ATTENDED THE HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING AT THE UNDP PREMISES AND DISCUSSED MATTERS RELATING TO WHITE HELMETS INITIATIVES, THE JUSTICE SYSTEM AND UNAMIR'S MANDATE. LATER, HE HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE AND SPOKE ABOUT THE NEW THE MANDATE AND UNAMIR'S ACTIVITIES THEREIN. HE EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT ALL MEMBER STATES INCLUDING KENYA WOULD COOPERATE WITH THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL. THE SRSG EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE SUSPENSION OF ACTIVITIES OF 38 NGOS AND SAID THAT HE HOPED THAT THE APPEALS BY THE AFFECTED NGOS WOULD BE GIVEN DUE CONSIDERATION BY THE GOVERNMENT. THE SRSG ALSO EXPRESSED CONCERN AT THE ARREST OF MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE BARAMBIRWA, PRESIDENT OF CLADHO, AFTER HE HAD MADE A SPEECH ON SUNDAY 10 DEC 95 AND HOPED THAT HE WOULD BE TREATED WITH TRANSPARENT JUSTICE.

C. ON 13 DEC 95, THE VICE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA AND VARIOUS MINISTERS VISITED BUTARE PREFECTURE AND ADDRESSED THE UNIVERSITY STUDENTS AND STAFF. THE CONTENTS OF ADDRESS NOT KNOWN.

D. ON 15 DEC 95, THE SRSG MET WITH THE DUTCH CHARGÉ D'AFFAIRES, MR. VAN DE VEN, ALONG WITH MR. IAN MARTIN, CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATIONS IN RWANDA, AND DISCUSSED THE KIBEHO INCIDENT AND HUMAN RIGHTS VOTING ISSUE IN THE 3RD COMMITTEE OF THE UN.

E. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE TANZANIAN DELEGATION LED BY PRESIDENT BENJAMIN MKAPA MET WITH RWANDAN PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU IN MWANZA TOWN ON 14 DEC 95 AND AGREED TO RESUME REGULAR VISITS TO RWANDAN REFUGEES CAMPS IN TANZANIA BY RWANDAN LEADERS, TO COUNTERACT RUMOURS IN THOSE CAMPS. THEY ALSO EXPRESSED THEIR WISH THAT THE FACILITATORS OF THE CAIRO SUMMIT MEET IN THE NEAR FUTURE TO ANALYZE HOW FAR THE RESOLUTIONS HAVE BEEN IMPLEMENTED, AND TO PREPARE ANOTHER MEETING OF HEADS OF STATES OF THE GREAT LAKES REGION.

F. ON 18 DEC 95, THE SRSG MET WITH THE RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER, DR. ANASTASE GASANA AND CONVEYED TO HIM HIS CONCERN OVER THE EXPULSION OF THIRTY EIGHT NGO'S. THEY ALSO DISCUSSED THE TANZANIAN PRESIDENT'S STATEMENT REGARDING THE MEASURES TO EXPEDITE THE VOLUNTARY RETURN OF REFUGEES. THEY FURTHER DISCUSSED FOLLOW-UP ACTION CONCERNING UNAMIR'S NEW MANDATE.

G. THE INDIAN HIGH COMMISSIONER TO UGANDA, AMBASSADOR S.S.GILL CALLED ON THE SRSG AND DISCUSSED THE EXISTING REGIONAL SITUATION. IN THE AFTERNOON, THE SRSG ATTENDED THE RWANDAN LOCAL OPERATIONS SUPPORT GROUP MEETING AND DISCUSSED ISSUES PERTAINING TO THE GOVERNMENT'S DECISION AND MEASURES IN REGARD TO THE INTERNATIONAL NGO'S, THE REHABILITATION MODALITIES OF THE JUSTICE SYSTEM AND DETENTION CENTRES, THE ROLE OF UNAMIR AND OTHER ORGANISATIONS IN ENSURING PREPAREDNESS FOR THE RETURN OF THE REFUGEES AND FINALLY THE DISPOSAL OF VEHICLES AND OTHER EQUIPMENT UPON COMPLETION OF THE UNREO AND UNAMIR MANDATES.

3. MILITARY

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA), 323 INMATES OUT OF 341 IN THE COMMUNE CACHOT OF MUGINA COMMUNE GR 9267, ARE ACCUSED OF HAVING PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE. THE IPJ OF THE COMMUNE EXPLAINED THAT THE SPATE OF ARRESTS WAS DUE TO THE FACT THAT THE PEOPLE WERE BEING FORCED TO RETURN AND REGISTER IN THEIR HOME COMMUNES WHERE THEY ARE SCREENED AND ARRESTED.

(2) MILOB TEAM SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) REPORTED THAT 15 MEN WERE ARRESTED BY RPA FOR THEIR ILLEGAL ASSOCIATION UNDER THE PRETEXT OF WORSHIPPING AT NIGHT ON 11 DEC 95 IN THE RUTARE COMMUNE. IN MUKARE COMMUNE 18 RETURNEES WERE ARRESTED FOR TRYING TO FLEE BACK TO ZAIRE.

(3) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) RPA LO AGREED TO INFO THE SECT CDR JUST BEFORE THE SEARCH OF GITARAMA PRISON BEGINS SO THAT THE LATTER COULD BE PRESENT. THE PURPOSE OF THE SEARCH IS NOT KNOWN.

(4) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) ONE RPA SOLDIER STEPPED ON A MINE ON 12 DEC 95 IN RANGIRO SECTOR (GR 0733) OF KAMATSIRA CELL. THE SOLDIER LOST HIS RIGHT LEG.

(5) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED FEW CASES OF CATTLE THEFTS IN RAMBA COMMUNE (GR 4893). THEY ALSO REPORTED THE ARREST OF 32 PERSONS OUT OF WHICH 12 HAD REFUSED TO ASSIST RPA IN NIGHT PATROLLING . THE REST ARE SUSPECTED OF HAVING PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE.

(6) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED FREQUENT HARRASMENT OF LOCALS OF INNGANZO (GR 2202) AND GAHUMBA (GR 2292) BY RPA.

(7) MILOBS SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) REPORTED THE ARREST OF MR. MALACHIE IYAMULEMYE, IPJ OF KAGANO COMMUNE, IN KIGALI WHILE ON A TRAINING COURSE. THE ALLEGED REASON FOR HIS ARREST IS THE RELEASE OF INDIVIDUALS ARRESTED FOR GENOCIDE WHO HAVE NOW FLED TO ZAIRE.

(8) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) WERE INFORMED BY THE LOCALS OF THE ARREST OF AN INFILTRATOR BY RPA ON 13 DEC 95. THE ARRESTED PERSON CAME FROM ZAIRE AND WAS IN POSSESSION OF A GRENADE.

(9) MILOBS SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS OF RUSTIRO COMMUNE (GR 4185) THAT SOME LOCALS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS AND WERE TAKEN TO MILITARY CACHOT IN MUHIRA (GR 4185).

(10) MILOBS SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) REPORTED THAT SINCE OCT 95, LOCALS WERE BEING FORCEFULLY EVICTED FROM THEIR HOUSES IN AREA ALONG THE RUSIZI RIVER (GR 7422) AND CYIMBOGO COMMUNE WITH THE AIM OF CREATING A BUFFER ZONE TO RESTRICT THE INFILTRATION. THE LOCALS ARE GIVEN THREE HOURS TO LEAVE THEIR HOUSES AND OCCUPY HOUSES FURTHER INLAND VACATED BY THOSE WHO HAD FLED TO ZAIRE. THESE EXPULSIONS ARE GENERALLY SOUTH OF RUSIZI II ALONG THE BORDER AREA UPTO 1-2 KM INLAND FROM THE RUSIZI RIVER.

(11) MILOBS TEAM IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) PATROLLING GATENZI SECTOR (GR 7374), WAS INFORMED BY THE COUNCILLOR OF THE ARBITRARY ARREST OF ONE PERSON ON 14 DEC 95 FOR HAVING TAKEN PART IN GENOCIDE. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT ONE PERSON WAS ARRESTED BY RPA IN MARCH 95 AND HIS HOUSE CONFISCATED. ALL ATTEMPTS BY THE WIFE OF THE ARRESTED

PERSON TO GET BACK THE HOUSE WHICH IS PRESENTLY OCCUPIED BY RPA, HAVE FAILED.

(12) MILOBS SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) REPORTED THAT RPA CONDUCTED CORDON AND SEARCH OF RUHENGARI TOWN ON NIGHT 17/18 DEC 95 WITH THE AIM OF ARRESTING INFILTRATORS WHO ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE TAKEN SHELTER IN THE TOWN. THE IPJ OF KIGOME COMMUNE (IN RUHENGARI TOWN) CONFIRMED THAT 04 PERSONS WERE DETAINED AS THEY WERE NOT FROM THIS COMMUNE AND NEITHER HAD THEY REGISTERED THEMSELVES WITH THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

B. MILITIA/FRGF

(1) IN SECT 5A RUHENGARI, MILOB PATROL TO KIGOME COMMUNE REPORTED THAT IN KABAYA SECT, GR 5833, UNKNOWN PEOPLE TRIED TO SABOTAGE ELECTROGAS SUB-STATION ON 102000 DEC 95. AN ANTI TANK ROCKET WAS FIRED AT THE SUB-STATION AND DAMAGED THE TRANSFORMER. FURTHER DETAILS BEING OBTAINED.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) REPORTED THAT ON 06 DEC 95 TWAGIRAYAZU (ASST. COUNCILLOR) AND MR PIERRE CELESTIN (A PRIEST) WERE SHOT DEAD BY FRGF ELEMENTS (REF SITREP OF 07 DEC 95). ON 10 DEC 03 MEMBERS OF FRGF WERE ARRESTED BY RPA FROM KABERE 1 SECTOR ON SUSPICION OF INVOLVEMENT IN THE MURDERS. THE IPJ INFORMED THE PATROL ABOUT THE ARREST OF ONE MR. BIRIMWABAGOBO FOR ILLEGAL POSSESSION OF HAND GRENADE.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED KILLING OF TWO LOCALS NAMED MR. BUNEGEYA AND MRS. MUKAGIHANA JOSEPHINE IN KARAGO COMMUNE (GR 4416) ON 16 DEC 95.

(4) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) ON 12 DEC 95 ONE MR. CLAUDE HARELIMANA OF RUGANO SECTOR (GR 1344) WAS SEVERELY BEATEN UP BY FOUR BANDITS AND AN UNSPECIFIED AMOUNT OF MONEY WAS ROBBED FROM HIM.

(5) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED INCREASED INFILTRATION OF INSURGENTS FROM THE PARC DES VOLCANS INTO THE AREA OF KABATWA (GR 3228). ON 13 DEC 95, THE RPA MADE CONTACT WITH ONE OF THESE GROUPS. HOWEVER THE INSURGENTS MANAGED TO ESCAPE LEAVING BEHIND SOME GRENADES AND ANTI PERSONNEL MINES.

(6) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) THE ICRC OFFICE IN CYANGUGU WAS ROBBED OF US \$4,500, RWF 700,000 AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS ON 14 DEC 95. THE ROBBERY WAS CARRIED OUT BY THREE ARMED MEN. NO ONE WAS INJURED DURING THE ROBBERY. THE RPA HAS ARRESTED SOME INDIVIDUALS IN THIS CONNECTION BUT NO RECOVERIES HAVE BEEN MADE SO FAR.

(7) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI), A HUTU COUPLE WAS KILLED BY SUSPECTED FRGF BANDITS ON 14 DEC 95 AT ABOUT 2030 HRS IN KABAYE SECTOR (GR 5833). THE MAN WAS A TEACHER AT THE SECONDARY SCHOOL IN RUHENGARI AND HIS WIFE WAS A STUDENT OF THE SAME SCHOOL.

(8) MILOBS SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) REPORTED THAT THE COUNCILLOR OF KAVUMU SECTOR (GR 6224) WAS KILLED BY UNKNOWN PERSONS ON NIGHT 15/16 DEC 95. MOTIVE BEHIND THE KILLING COULD NOT BE ESTABLISHED.

(9) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT TWO PERSONS WERE ARRESTED FROM BUNYONI CELLULE (GR 2206) OF BUDAHA SECTOR (GR 2206) ON 13 DEC 95 FOR THEIR ALLEGED LINKS WITH THE INTERAHAMWE.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) ON 12 DEC 95, THE FC PAID A FAREWELL VISIT TO THE PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA. THE FC ALSO HELD A MEETING WITH MR MARTIN OF HUMAN RIGHTS.

(2) THE FORCE COMMANDER MAJ GEN TOUSIGNANT ENDED HIS TOUR OF DUTY AND DEPARTED THE MISSION AREA ON 15 DEC 95 AFTER HAVING HANDED OVER CHARGE TO THE DFC BRIG SIVAKUMAR. A FAREWELL CEREMONY WAS HELD AT UNAMIR HQ WHICH WAS ATTENDED BY ALL MILITARY AND CIVILIAN STAFF.

D. OTHER SECTORS NTR.

4. HUMANITARIAN

A. A TOTAL OF 23 VEHS WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

B. A TOTAL OF 169 IDPs ARE AWAITING EVAC FROM NDERA CAMP.

C. A TOTAL OF 1534 MEDICAL AND 163 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY MEDICAL STAFF IN RWANDA DURING THE WEEK.

D. FORCE ENGR COY EMPLOYED A DIGGER CUM EXCAVATOR FOR CREATING SANITARY FACILITIES IN GITARAMA PRISON AND ALSO COMMENCED CONSTRUCTION OF BRIDGE AT GASHORA ON 18 DEC 95.

E. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED ONE EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER IN KANOMBE COMMUNE FOR DIGGING PITS IN A SCHOOL. FORCE SIG COY CONTINUED ASSISTING RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES

5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

A. MILOBS SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) REPORTED THAT HEAD OF UNHCR

MR. KOFI VISITED MILOB SECTOR HQ ON 12 DEC 95 AND APPRISED THE SECTOR COMD OF FOLLOWING:

(1) ABOUT 400,000 RETURNEES ARE EXPECTED TO ARRIVE FROM TANZANIA AROUND CHRISTMAS TIME. THE INTIMIDATORS ARE BEING TRANSFERRED TO SEPARATE CAMPS BY TANZANIAN AUTHORITIES. THE WEAPONS SEEN IN THE CAMP IN THE PAST HAVE DISAPPEARED AND ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN BROUGHT TO RWANDA AND HIDDEN SOMEWHERE EAST OF KIBUNGO.

(2) IN THE FIRST WEEK, 3000 RETURNEES PER DAY WOULD BE HANDLED OUT OF WHICH, 2000 WOULD BE FROM KIBUNGO PREFECTURE AND REST FROM BYUMBA PREFECTURE. IN THE SECOND WEEK, FIVE TIMES THIS NUMBER ARE EXPECTED TO BE HANDLED AND DESPATCHED TO HOME COMMUNES. THE RETURNEES WILL BE TAKEN FROM BUKOBA BORDER POST GR 8737 TO RUSOMO COMMUNE OFFICE FOR SECURITY CHECK AND THEN ON TO NYAKARAMBI TRANSIT CAMP FOR MEDICAL AND OTHER ADMINSTRATIVE FORMALITIES. IT IS FROM THIS CAMP THAT THE RETURNEES WILL BE DESPATCHED TO HOME COMMUNES.

(3) ALL TRANSPORT FOR THIS OPERATION IS BEING PROVIDED BY UNHCR AND IOM. DURING THIS OP, UNHCR WILL CEASE ALL ACTIVITIES FOR RETURNEES COMING FROM ZAIRE.

B. IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE), THE SENIOR MSF ADMINISTRATOR EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT THE SECURITY OF LOCAL STAFF. THE RPA LO WAS CONTACTED WHO ASSURED SECURITY OF THE MSF HOUSE. MILOBS APPRISED THE PREFECT OF KIBUYE OF THE APPREHENSIONS EXPRESSED BY THE MSF ADMINISTRATOR.

C. THE ICRC OFFICIALS IN THE AREA OF ISHARA PENINSULA ARE REGISTERING THE RELATIVES OF THE FAMILIES WHO ARE PRESENTLY IN ZAIRE REFUGEES CAMPS IN ORDER TO HELP THEM KEEP IN TOUCH WITH EACH OTHER. IT WAS LEARNT THAT REFUGEES ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE WANT TO COME BACK BUT ARE BEING PREVENTED BY THE FRGF AND INTERHAMWE.

D. MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT Ms CARR ROSE OF MUTURA (GR 3123) HAS BEEN INSTRUCTED BY THE RPA NOT TO TALK TO MILOBS REGARDING HER PROBLEMS. THE LOCALS OF THE SAME AREA COMPLAINED ABOUT THE HARDSHIPS THEY ARE FACING DUE TO LONG HOURS OF CURFEW FROM 1800-0600 HRS.

E. IN SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA), THE GITI COMMUNE REFUGEES TRUST HAS COMMENCED SUPPORTING THE RWESERO HEALTH CENTRE AS THERE IS NO NGO TO SUPPLY THE MEDICINES OF WHICH THERE IS AN ACUTE SHORTAGE.

F. MILOBS SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO) REPORTED THAT THE CLINIC IN KIVU COMMUNE (GR 4210) SO FAR BEING RUN BY MSF, HAS BEEN TAKEN

OVER BY CARITAS. THE BOURGMESTRE COMPLAINED THAT THE FOOD DISTRIBUTION DONE BY CARITAS WAS NOT FAIR AND HENCE SHOULD CEASE.

G. MILOBS SECTOR 3B (BUTARE) WERE INFORMED BY THE CIVILIANS IN THE MUYIRA COMMUNE (GR 8639), THAT THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT AND THE IPJ WERE VERY SLOW IN PROCESSING THE DOSSIERS OF THE DETAINEES AND THAT THE FAMILIES OF DETAINEES WERE FINDING IT DIFFICULT TO FEED THEIR MEMBERS IN THE COMMUNE CACHOTS.

9. COMMENTS

A. THE SECURITY SITUATION IN RWANDA SOMEWHAT DETERIORATED DURING THE WEEK WITH INCIDENTS OF INFILTRATIONS, KILLINGS AND ACTS OF SABOTAGE BEING REPORTED IN SECTORS 1B, 4 AND 5. RPA CONTINUE TO CONDUCT CORDON AND SEARCH OPS IN THE COUNTRY TO TRY AND ARREST CRIMINALS AND INFILTRATORS.

B. THE PROPOSED EXERCISE TO TRY AND SETTLE APPROX 400,000 RWANDAN REFUGEES IN TANZANIA, BACK INTO THEIR HOME COMMUNES IS THE FIRST MAJOR STEP TOWARDS THE PEACEFUL RETURN OF REFUGEES. IF THIS OP IS SUCCESSFUL, IT WOULD GO A LONG WAY IN CONVINCING THE OTHER REFUGEES IN ZAIRE AND BURUNDI TO RETURN TO RWANDA PROVIDED, THE GOVT ENSURES THEIR SAFE RETURN AND REFRAINS FROM ARBITRARY ARRESTS AND PROSECUTION.

D. ON 15 DEC 95, THE SRSG MET WITH THE DUTCH CHARGÉ D'AFFAIRES, MR. VAN DE VEN, ALONG WITH MR. IAN MARTIN, CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATIONS IN RWANDA, AND DISCUSSED THE KIBEHO INCIDENT AND HUMAN RIGHTS VOTING ISSUE IN THE 3RD COMMITTEE OF THE UN.

E. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE TANZANIAN DELEGATION LED BY PRESIDENT BENJAMIN MKAPA MET WITH RWANDAN PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU IN MWANZA TOWN ON 14 DEC 95 AND AGREED TO RESUME REGULAR VISITS TO RWANDAN REFUGEES CAMPS IN TANZANIA BY RWANDAN LEADERS, TO COUNTERACT RUMOURS IN THOSE CAMPS. (2) MILOB TEAM SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA) REPORTED THAT 15 MEN WERE ARRESTED BY RPA FOR THEIR ILLEGAL ASSOCIATION UNDER THE PRETEXT OF WORSHIPPING AT NIGHT ON 11 DEC 95 IN THE RUTARE COMMUNE. IN MUKARE COMMUNE 18 RETURNEES WERE ARRESTED FOR TRYING TO FLEE BACK TO ZAIRE.

(3) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) RPA LO AGREED TO INFO THE SECT CDR JUST BEFORE THE SEARCH OF GITARAMA PRISON BEGINS SO THAT THE LATTER COULD BE PRESENT. THE PURPOSE OF THE SEARCH IS NOT KNOWN.

(4) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) ONE RPA SOLDIER STEPPED ON A MINE ON 12 DEC 95 IN RANGIRO SECTOR (GR 0733) OF KAMATSIRA CELL. THE SOLDIER LOST HIS RIGHT LEG.

(5) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED FEW CASES OF CATTLE THEFTS IN RAMBA COMMUNE (GR 4893). THEY ALSO REPORTED THE ARREST OF 32 PERSONS OUT OF WHICH 12 HAD REFUSED TO ASSIST RPA IN NIGHT PATROLLING. THE REST ARE SUSPECTED OF HAVING PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE.

(6) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED FREQUENT HARRASMENT OF LOCALS OF INNGANZO (GR 2202) AND GAHUMBA (GR 2292) BY RPA.

(7) MILOBS SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) REPORTED THE ARREST OF MR. MALACHIE IYAMULEMYE, IPJ OF KAGANO COMMUNE, IN KIGALI WHILE ON A TRAINING COURSE. THE ALLEGED REASON FOR HIS ARREST IS THE RELEASE OF INDIVIDUALS ARRESTED FOR GENOCIDE WHO HAVE NOW FLED TO ZAIRE.

(8) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) WERE INFORMED BY THE LOCALS OF THE ARREST OF AN INFILTRATOR BY RPA ON 13 DEC 95. THE ARRESTED PERSON CAME FROM ZAIRE AND WAS IN POSSESSION OF A GRENADE.

(9) MILOBS SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS OF RUSTIRO COMMUNE (GR 4185) THAT SOME LOCALS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS AND WERE TAKEN TO MILITARY CACHOT IN MUHIRA (GR 4185).

(10) MILOBS SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) REPORTED THAT SINCE OCT 95, LOCALS WERE BEING FORCEFULLY EVICTED FROM THEIR HOUSES IN AREA ALONG THE RUSIZI RIVER (GR 7422) AND CYIMBOGO COMMUNE WITH THE AIM OF CREATING A BUFFER ZONE TO RESTRICT THE INFILTRATION. THE LOCALS ARE GIVEN THREE HOURS TO LEAVE THEIR HOUSES AND OCCUPY HOUSES FURTHER INLAND VACATED BY THOSE WHO HAD FLED TO ZAIRE. THESE EXPULSIONS ARE GENERALLY SOUTH OF RUSIZI II ALONG THE BORDER AREA UPTO 1-2 KM INLAND FROM THE RUSIZI RIVER.

(11) MILOBS TEAM IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) PATROLLING GATENZI SECTOR (GR 7374), WAS INFORMED BY THE COUNCILLOR OF THE ARBITRARY ARREST OF ONE PERSON ON 14 DEC 95 FOR HAVING TAKEN PART IN GENOCIDE. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT ONE PERSON WAS ARRESTED BY RPA IN MARCH 95 AND HIS HOUSE CONFISCATED. ALL ATTEMPTS BY THE WIFE OF THE ARRESTED

PERSON TO GET BACK THE HOUSE WHICH IS PRESENTLY OCCUPIED BY RPA, HAVE FAILED.

(12) MILOBS SECTOR 5A (RUHENGRI) REPORTED THAT RPA CONDUCTED CORDON AND SEARCH OF RUHENGRI TOWN ON NIGHT 17/18 DEC 95 WITH THE AIM OF ARRESTING INFILTRATORS WHO ARE SUSPECTED TO HAVE TAKEN SHELTER IN THE TOWN. THE IPJ OF KIGOME COMMUNE (IN RUHENGRI TOWN) CONFIRMED THAT 04 PERSONS WERE DETAINED AS THEY WERE NOT FROM THIS COMMUNE AND NEITHER HAD THEY REGISTERED THEMSELVES WITH THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES.

B. MILITIA/FRGF

(1) IN SECT 5A RUHENGRI, MILOB PATROL TO KIGOME COMMUNE REPORTED THAT IN KABAYA SECT, GR 5833, UNKNOWN PEOPLE TRIED TO SABOTAGE ELECTROGAS SUB-STATION ON 102000 DEC 95. AN ANTI TANK ROCKET WAS FIRED AT THE SUB-STATION AND DAMAGED THE TRANSFORMER. FURTHER DETAILS BEING OBTAINED.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5A (RUHENGRI) REPORTED THAT ON 06 DEC 95 TWAGIRAYAZU (ASST. COUNCILLOR) AND MR PIERRE CELESTIN (A PRIEST) WERE SHOT DEAD BY FRGF ELEMENTS (REF SITREP OF 07 DEC 95). ON 10 DEC 03 MEMBERS OF FRGF WERE ARRESTED BY RPA FROM KABERE 1 SECTOR ON SUSPICION OF INVOLVEMENT IN THE MURDERS. THE IPJ INFORMED THE PATROL ABOUT THE ARREST OF ONE MR. BIRIMWABAGOBO FOR ILLEGAL POSSESSION OF HAND GRENADE.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED KILLING OF TWO LOCALS NAMED MR. BUNEGEYA AND MRS. MUKAGIHANA JOSEPHINE IN KARAGO COMMUNE (GR 4416) ON 16 DEC 95.

(4) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) ON 12 DEC 95 ONE MR. CLAUDE HARELIMANA OF RUGANO SECTOR (GR 1344) WAS SEVERELY BEATEN UP BY FOUR BANDITS AND AN UNSPECIFIED AMOUNT OF MONEY WAS ROBBED FROM HIM.

(5) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED INCREASED INFILTRATION OF INSURGENTS FROM THE PARC DES VOLCANS INTO THE AREA OF KABATWA (GR 3228). ON 13 DEC 95, THE RPA MADE CONTACT WITH ONE OF THESE GROUPS. HOWEVER THE INSURGENTS MANAGED TO ESCAPE LEAVING BEHIND SOME GRENADES AND ANTI PERSONNEL MINES.

(6) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) THE ICRC OFFICE IN CYANGUGU WAS ROBBED OF US \$4,500, RWF 700,000 AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS ON 14 DEC 95. THE ROBBERY WAS CARRIED OUT BY THREE ARMED MEN. NO ONE WAS INJURED DURING THE ROBBERY. THE RPA HAS ARRESTED SOME INDIVIDUALS IN THIS CONNECTION BUT NO RECOVERIES HAVE BEEN MADE SO FAR.

(7) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI), A HUTU COUPLE WAS KILLED BY SUSPECTED FRGF BANDITS ON 14 DEC 95 AT ABOUT 2030 HRS IN KABAYE SECTOR (GR 5833). THE MAN WAS A TEACHER AT THE SECONDARY SCHOOL IN RUHENGARI AND HIS WIFE WAS A STUDENT OF THE SAME SCHOOL.

(8) MILOBS SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) REPORTED THAT THE COUNCILLOR OF KAVUMU SECTOR (GR 6224) WAS KILLED BY UNKNOWN PERSONS ON NIGHT 15/16 DEC 95. MOTIVE BEHIND THE KILLING COULD NOT BE ESTABLISHED.

(9) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT TWO PERSONS WERE ARRESTED FROM BUNYONI CELLULE (GR 2206) OF BUDAHA SECTOR (GR 2206) ON 13 DEC 95 FOR THEIR ALLEGED LINKS WITH THE INTERAHAMWE.

C. OWN ACTIVITIES

(1) ON 12 DEC 95, THE FC PAID A FAREWELL VISIT TO THE PRESIDENT AND VICE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA. THE FC ALSO HELD A MEETING WITH MR MARTIN OF HUMAN RIGHTS.

(2) THE FORCE COMMANDER MAJ GEN TOUSIGNANT ENDED HIS TOUR OF DUTY AND DEPARTED THE MISSION AREA ON 15 DEC 95 AFTER HAVING HANDED OVER CHARGE TO THE DFC BRIG SIVAKUMAR. A FAREWELL CEREMONY WAS HELD AT UNAMIR HQ WHICH WAS ATTENDED BY ALL MILITARY AND CIVILIAN STAFF.

A. A TOTAL OF 23 VEHS WERE PROVIDED BY CONTINGENTS FOR HUMANITARIAN TASKS DURING THE WEEK.

C. A TOTAL OF 1534 MEDICAL AND 163 DENTAL PATIENTS WERE TREATED BY MEDICAL STAFF IN RWANDA DURING THE WEEK.

D. FORCE ENGR COY EMPLOYED A DIGGER CUM EXCAVATOR FOR CREATING SANITARY FACILITIES IN GITARAMA PRISON AND ALSO COMMENCED CONSTRUCTION OF BRIDGE AT GASHORA ON 18 DEC 95.

E. FORCE ENGR COY DEPLOYED ONE EXCAVATOR CUM DIGGER IN KANOMBE COMMUNE FOR DIGGING PITS IN A SCHOOL. FORCE SIG COY CONTINUED ASSISTING RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES

A. MILOBS SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) REPORTED THAT HEAD OF UNHCR

MR. KOFI VISITED MILOB SECTOR HQ ON 12 DEC 95 AND APPRISED THE SECTOR COMD OF FOLLOWING:

(1) ABOUT 400,000 RETURNEES ARE EXPECTED TO ARRIVE FROM TANZANIA AROUND CHRISTMAS TIME. THE INTIMIDATORS ARE BEING TRANSFERRED TO SEPARATE CAMPS BY TANZANIAN AUTHORITIES. THE WEAPONS SEEN IN THE CAMP IN THE PAST HAVE DISAPPEARED AND ARE BELIEVED TO HAVE BEEN BROUGHT TO RWANDA AND HIDDEN SOMEWHERE EAST OF KIBUNGO.

(2) IN THE FIRST WEEK, 3000 RETURNEES PER DAY WOULD BE HANDLED OUT OF WHICH, 2000 WOULD BE FROM KIBUNGO PREFECTURE AND REST FROM BYUMBA PREFECTURE. IN THE SECOND WEEK, FIVE TIMES THIS NUMBER ARE EXPECTED TO BE HANDLED AND DESPATCHED TO HOME COMMUNES. THE RETURNEES WILL BE TAKEN FROM BUKOBA BORDER POST GR 8737 TO RUSOMO COMMUNE OFFICE FOR SECURITY CHECK AND THEN ON TO NYAKARAMBI TRANSIT CAMP FOR MEDICAL AND OTHER ADMINSTRATIVE FORMALITIES. IT IS FROM THIS CAMP THAT THE RETURNEES WILL BE DESPATCHED TO HOME COMMUNES.

(3) ALL TRANSPORT FOR THIS OPERATION IS BEING PROVIDED BY UNHCR AND IOM. DURING THIS OP, UNHCR WILL CEASE ALL ACTIVITIES FOR RETURNEES COMING FROM ZAIRE.

B. IN SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE), THE SENIOR MSF ADMINISTRATOR EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT THE SECURITY OF LOCAL STAFF. THE RPA LO WAS CONTACTED WHO ASSURED SECURITY OF THE MSF HOUSE. MILOBS APPRISED THE PREFECT OF KIBUYE OF THE APPREHENSIONS EXPRESSED BY THE MSF ADMINISTRATOR.

C. THE ICRC OFFICIALS IN THE AREA OF ISHARA PENINSULA ARE REGISTERING THE RELATIVES OF THE FAMILIES WHO ARE PRESENTLY IN ZAIRE REFUGEES CAMPS IN ORDER TO HELP THEM KEEP IN TOUCH WITH EACH OTHER. IT WAS LEARNT THAT REFUGEES ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE WANT TO COME BACK BUT ARE BEING PREVENTED BY THE FRGF AND INTERHAMWE.

D. MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT Ms CARR ROSE OF MUTURA (GR 3123) HAS BEEN INSTRUCTED BY THE RPA NOT TO TALK TO MILOBS REGARDING HER PROBLEMS. THE LOCALS OF THE SAME AREA COMPLAINED ABOUT THE HARDSHIPS THEY ARE FACING DUE TO LONG HOURS OF CURFEW FROM 1800-0600 HRS.

E. IN SECTOR 2A (BYUMBA), THE GITI COMMUNE REFUGEES TRUST HAS COMMENCED SUPPORTING THE RWESERO HEALTH CENTRE AS THERE IS NO NGO TO SUPPLY THE MEDICINES OF WHICH THERE IS AN ACUTE SHORTAGE.

F. MILOBS SECTOR 3A (GIKONGORO) REPORTED THAT THE CLINIC IN KIVU COMMUNE (GR 4210) SO FAR BEING RUN BY MSF, HAS BEEN TAKEN

OVER BY CARITAS. THE BOURGMESTRE COMPLAINED THAT THE FOOD DISTRIBUTION DONE BY CARITAS WAS NOT FAIR AND HENCE SHOULD CEASE.

G. MILOBS SECTOR 3B (BUTARE) WERE INFORMED BY THE CIVILIANS IN THE MUYIRA COMMUNE (GR 8639), THAT THE JUSTICE DEPARTMENT AND THE IPJ WERE VERY SLOW IN PROCESSING THE DOSSIERS OF THE DETAINEES AND THAT THE FAMILIES OF DETAINEES WERE FINDING IT DIFFICULT TO FEED THEIR MEMBERS IN THE COMMUNE CACHOTS.

B. THE PROPOSED EXERCISE TO TRY AND SETTLE APPROX 400,000 RWANDAN REFUGEES IN TANZANIA, BACK INTO THEIR HOME COMMUNES IS THE FIRST MAJOR STEP TOWARDS THE PEACEFUL RETURN OF REFUGEES. IF THIS OP IS SUCCESSFUL, IT WOULD GO A LONG WAY IN CONVINCING THE OTHER REFUGEES IN ZAIRE AND BURUNDI TO RETURN TO RWANDA PROVIDED, THE GOVT ENSURES THEIR SAFE RETURN AND REFRAINS FROM ARBITRARY ARRESTS AND PROSECUTION.

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST WHICH HAD REOPENED ON 17 DEC 95 TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC, WAS AGAIN CLOSED ON 18 DEC 95 TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5B, REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 165. 163 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 02 FROM TANZANIA. 04 REFUGEES CAME FROM UGANDA ON 17 DEC 95. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 2646. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG MET WITH THE RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER, DR. ANASTASE GASANA AND CONVEYED TO HIM HIS CONCERN OVER THE EXPULSION OF THIRTY EIGHT NGO'S. THEY ALSO DISCUSSED THE TANZANIAN PRESIDENT'S STATEMENT REGARDING THE MEASURES TO EXPEDITE THE VOLUNTARY RETURN OF REFUGEES. THEY FURTHER DISCUSSED FOLLOW-UP ACTION CONCERNING UNAMIR'S NEW MANDATE.

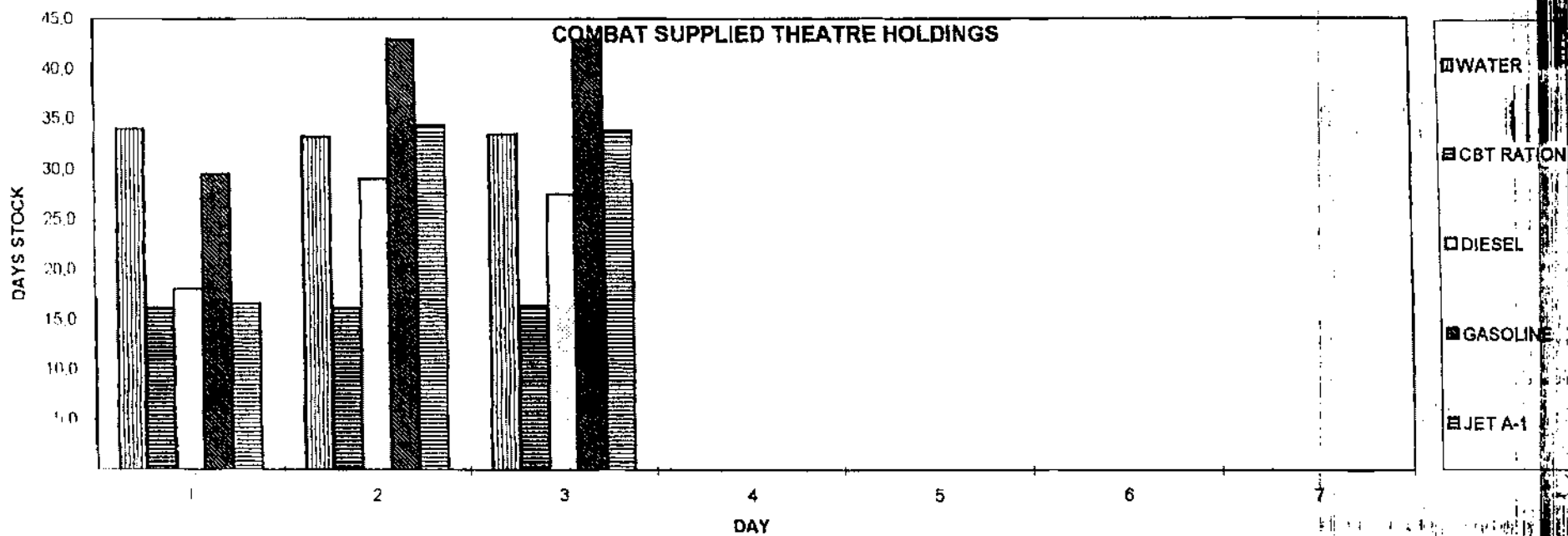

COMBAT SUPPLIES USAGE AND STOCK CHARTS

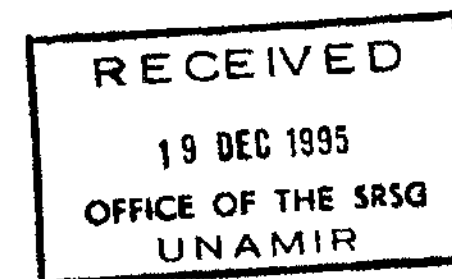

DAILY SITREP FOR 18 DEC 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST WHICH HAD REOPENED ON 17 DEC 95 TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC, WAS AGAIN CLOSED ON 18 DEC 95 TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. THE ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IN SECTOR 5B, REMAINS CLOSED TO RWANDAN NATIONALS AND UNAMIR ON THE ZAIRIAN SIDE. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 165. 163 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 02 FROM TANZANIA. 04 REFUGEES CAME FROM UGANDA ON 17 DEC 95. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 2646. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG MET WITH THE RWANDAN FOREIGN MINISTER, DR. ANASTASE GASANA AND CONVEYED TO HIM HIS CONCERN OVER THE EXPULSION OF THIRTY EIGHT NGO'S. THEY ALSO DISCUSSED THE TANZANIAN PRESIDENT'S STATEMENT REGARDING THE MEASURES TO EXPEDITE THE VOLUNTARY RETURN OF REFUGEES. THEY FURTHER DISCUSSED FOLLOW-UP ACTION CONCERNING UNAMIR'S NEW MANDATE.

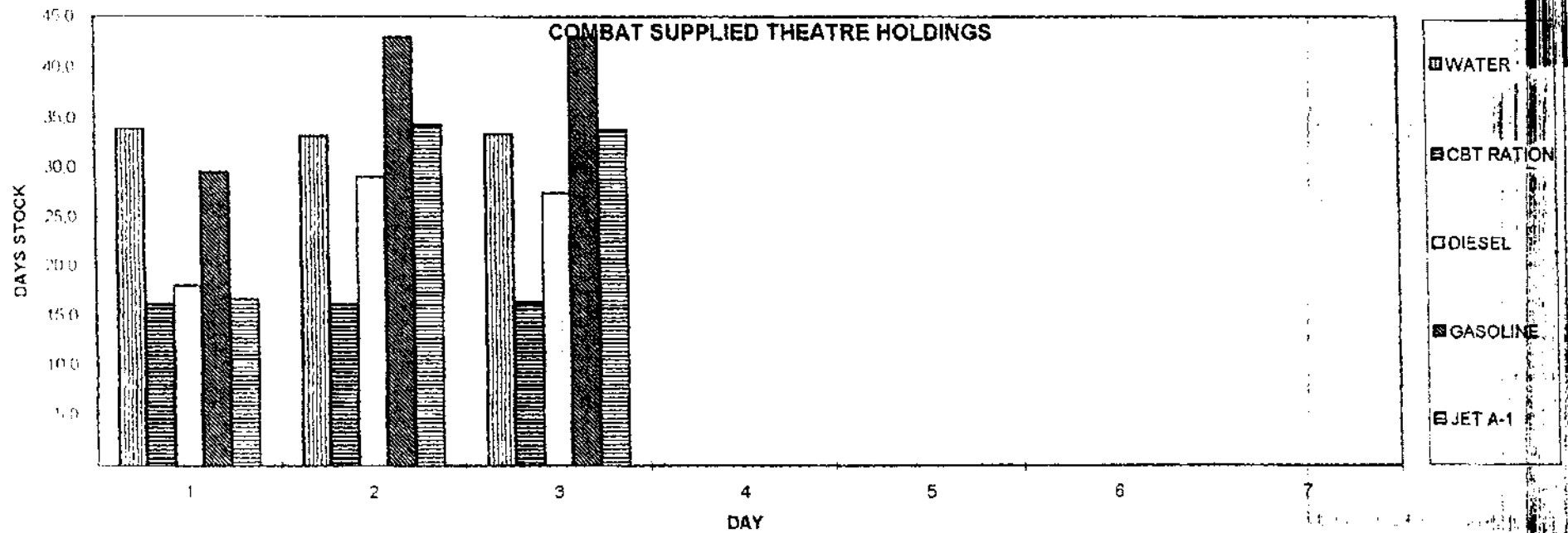

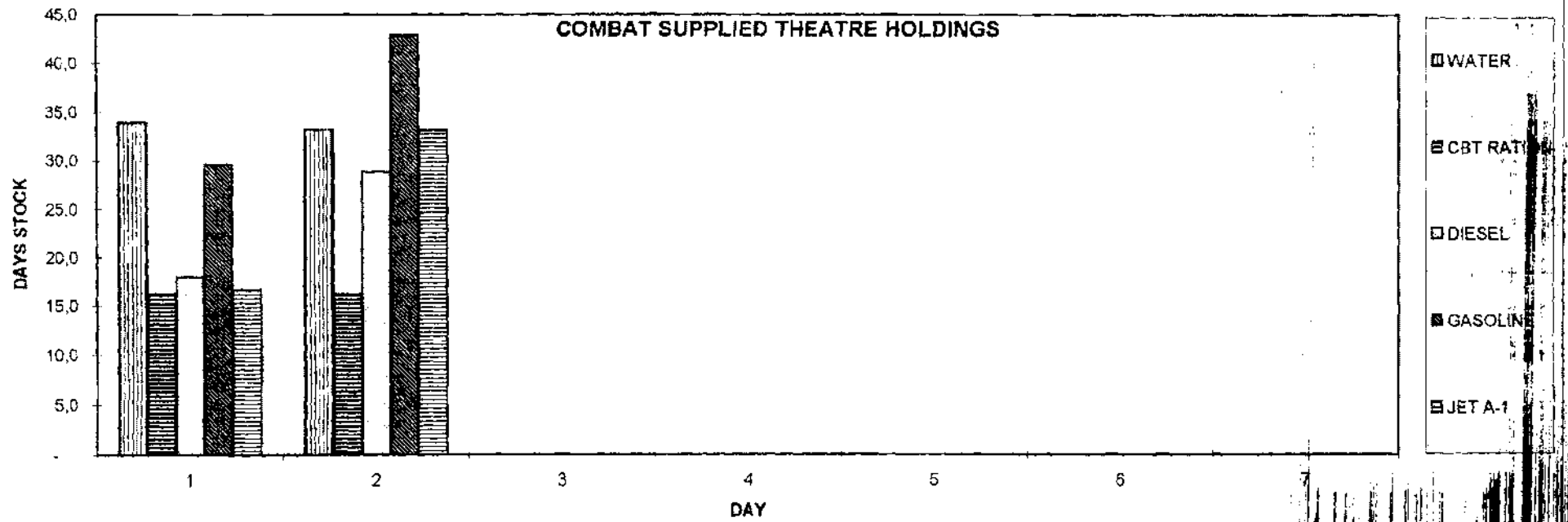

THE LOCALS ARE GIVEN THREE HOURS TO LEAVE THEIR HOUSES AND OCCUPY HOUSES FURTHER INLAND VACATED BY THOSE WHO HAD FLED TO ZAIRE. THESE EXPULSIONS ARE GENERALLY SOUTH OF RUSIZI II ALONG THE BORDER AREA UPTO 1-2 KM INLAND FROM THE RUSIZI RIVER.

(1) REFERENCE TO THE ROBBERY INCIDENT AT THE ICRC OFFICE IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) ON 15 DEC 95. MILOBS FURTHER REPORTED THAT THE RPA AND GENDARMERES ARE CONDUCTING EXTENSIVE INTERROGATION OF THE ICRC SECURITY GUARD AND THEIR OWN SOLDIERS /GENDARMERES BUT NO RESULTS HAVE BEEN OBTAINED SO FAR. INVESTIGATION CONTINUES.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5A (RUHENGARI) REPORTED THAT THE COUNCILLOR OF KAVUMU SECTOR (GR 6224) WAS KILLED BY UNKNOWN PERSONS ON NIGHT 15/16 DEC 95. MOTIVE BEHIND THE KILLING COULD NOT BE ESTABLISHED.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED THAT TWO PERSONS WERE ARRESTED FROM BUNYONI CELLULE (GR 2206) OF BUDAHA SECTOR (GR 2206) ON 13 DEC 95 FOR THEIR ALLEGED LINKS WITH THE INTERAHAMWE.

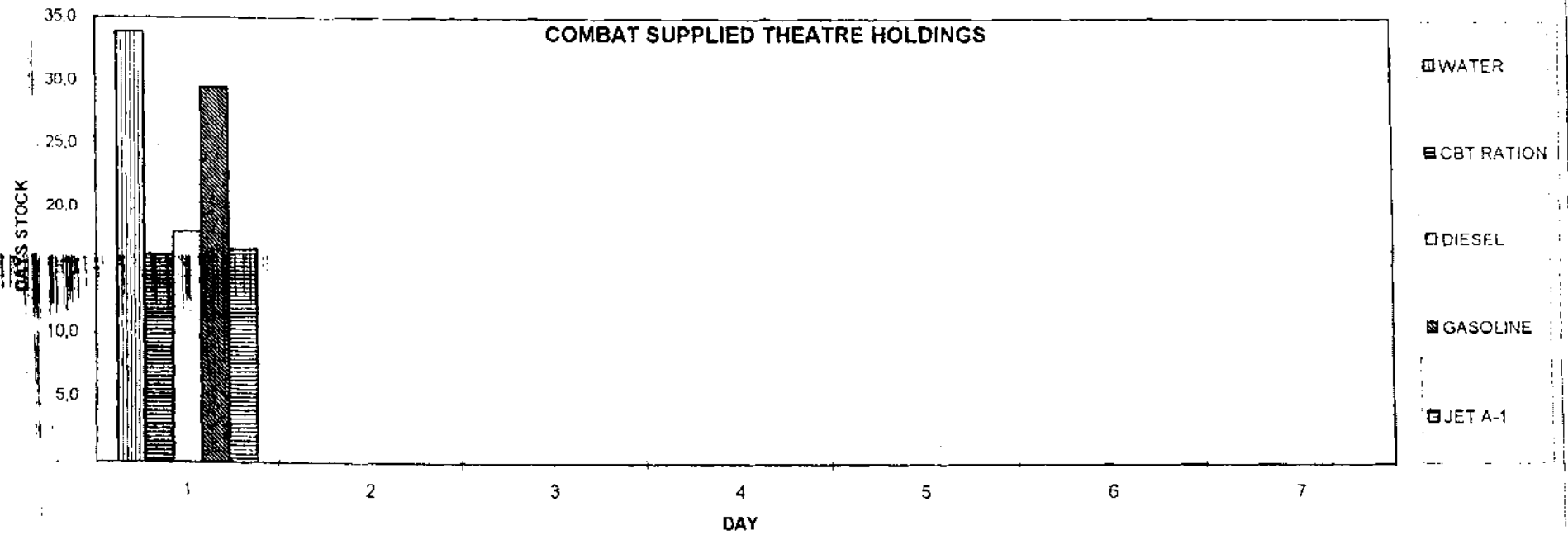

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 681. 93 CAME FROM ZAIRE. 353 CAME FROM UGANDA AND 235 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 2338. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG MET WITH THE DUTCH CHARGÉ D'AFFAIRES, MR. VAN DE VEN, ALONG WITH MR. IAN MARTIN, CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATIONS IN RWANDA, AND DISCUSSED THE KIBEHO INCIDENT AND HUMAN RIGHTS VOTING ISSUE IN THE 3RD COMMITTEE OF THE UN.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE TANZANIAN DELEGATION LED BY PRESIDENT BENJAMIN MKAPA MET WITH RWANDAN PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU IN MWANZA TOWN ON 14 DEC 95 AND AGREED TO RESUME REGULAR VISITS TO RWANDAN REFUGEES CAMPS IN TANZANIA BY RWANDAN LEADERS, TO COUNTERACT RUMOURS IN THOSE CAMPS. THEY ALSO EXPRESSED THEIR WISH THAT THE FACILITATORS OF THE CAIRO SUMMIT MEET IN THE NEAR FUTURE TO ANALYZE HOW FAR THE RESOLUTIONS HAVE BEEN IMPLEMENTED, AND TO PREPARE ANOTHER MEETING OF HEADS OF STATES OF THE GREAT LAKES REGION.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) REPORTED THE ARREST OF MR. MALACHIE IYAMULEMYE, IPJ OF KAGANO COMMUNE, IN KIGALI WHILE ON A TRAINING COURSE. THE ALLEGED REASON FOR HIS ARREST IS THE RELEASE OF INDIVIDUALS ARRESTED FOR GENOCIDE WHO HAVE NOW FLED TO ZAIRE.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) WERE INFORMED BY THE LOCALS OF THE ARREST OF AN INFILTRATOR BY RPA ON 13 DEC 95. THE ARRESTED PERSON CAME FROM ZAIRE AND WAS IN POSSESSION OF A GRENADE.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5C (KIBUYE) WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS OF RUSTIRO COMMUNE (GR 4185) THAT SOME LOCALS HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY RPA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS AND WERE TAKEN TO MILITARY CACHOT IN MUHIRA (GR 4185).

B. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

(1) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) THE ICRC OFFICE IN CYANGUGU WAS ROBBED OF US \$4,500, RWF 700,000 AND PERSONAL BELONGINGS ON 14 DEC 95. THE ROBBERY WAS CARRIED OUT BY THREE ARMED MEN. NO ONE WAS INJURED DURING THE ROBBERY. THE RPA HAS ARRESTED SOME INDIVIDUALS IN THIS CONNECTION BUT NO RECOVERIES HAVE BEEN MADE SO FAR.

(2) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGURI), A HUTU COUPLE WAS KILLED BY SUSPECTED FRGF BANDITS ON 14 DEC 95 AT ABOUT 2030 HRS IN KABAYE SECTOR (GR 5833). THE MAN WAS A TEACHER AT THE SECONDARY SCHOOL IN RUHENGURI AND HIS WIFE WAS A STUDENT OF THE SAME SCHOOL.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. THE FORCE COMMANDER MAJ GEN TOUSIGNANT ENDED HIS TOUR OF DUTY AND DEPARTED THE MISSION AREA ON 15 DEC 95. A FAREWELL CEREMONY WAS HELD AT UNAMIR HQ ATTENDED BY ALL MILITARY AND CIVILIAN STAFF.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 75 RETURNEES ARRIVED NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE AND BIKAMIRA. 88 RETURNEES WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR ON 15 DEC 95 TO KIBUNGO, GISENYI, GITARAMA, BYUMBA, NYAGATARE, KIGALI TOWN AND KIGALI RURAL. A TOTAL OF 154 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVACUATION FROM NDERA CAMP.

B. MALAWICOY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO GISUMA COMMUNE FOR TRANSPORTATION OF GRAVEL.

C. NICOY TRANSPORTED 5 TONS OF STATIONERY FROM GISENYI TO RAMBA COMMUNE (GR 4893).

D. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD.

E. FORCE SIGNAL COY CONTINUED ASSISTING RWANDATEL IN ACTIVATION OF LOCAL LINES AND PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC.

H. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 254 MEDICAL AND 30 DENTAL PATIENTS.

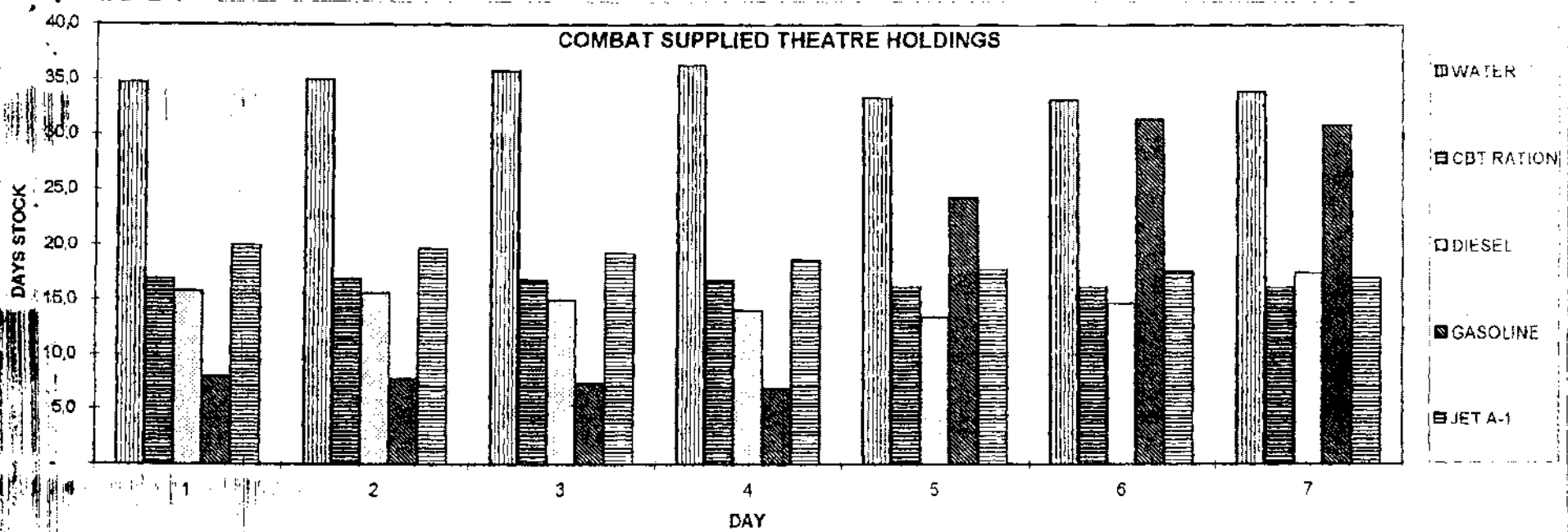

DAILY SITREP FOR 15 DEC 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UYIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 681. 93 CAME FROM ZAIRE. 353 CAME FROM UGANDA AND 235 FROM BURUNDI. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 2338. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG MET WITH THE DUTCH CHARGÉ D'AFFAIRES, MR. VAN DE VEN, ALONG WITH MR. IAN MARTIN, CHIEF OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS FIELD OPERATIONS IN RWANDA, AND DISCUSSED THE KIBEHO INCIDENT AND HUMAN RIGHTS VOTING ISSUE IN THE 3RD COMMITTEE OF THE UN.

B. RADIO RWANDA REPORTED THAT THE TANZANIAN DELEGATION LED BY PRESIDENT BENJAMIN MKAPA MET WITH RWANDAN PRESIDENT PASTEUR BIZIMUNGU IN MWANZA TOWN ON 14 DEC 95 AND AGREED TO RESUME REGULAR VISITS TO RWANDAN REFUGEES CAMPS IN TANZANIA BY RWANDAN LEADERS, TO COUNTERACT RUMOURS IN THOSE CAMPS. THEY ALSO EXPRESSED THEIR WISH THAT THE FACILITATORS OF THE CAIRO SUMMIT MEET IN THE NEAR FUTURE TO ANALYZE HOW FAR THE RESOLUTIONS HAVE BEEN IMPLEMENTED, AND TO PREPARE ANOTHER MEETING OF HEADS OF STATES OF THE GREAT LAKES REGION.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE.

(1) MILOBS SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) REPORTED THE ARREST OF MR. MALACHIE IYAMULEMYE, IPJ OF KAGANO COMMUNE, IN KIGALI WHILE ON A TRAINING COURSE. THE ALLEGED REASON FOR HIS ARREST IS THE RELEASE OF INDIVIDUALS ARRESTED FOR GENOCIDE WHO HAVE NOW FLED TO ZAIRE.

(2) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) WERE INFORMED BY THE LOCALS OF THE ARREST OF AN INFILTRATOR BY RPA ON 13 DEC 95. THE ARRESTED PERSON CAME FROM ZAIRE AND WAS IN POSSESSION OF A GRENADE.

1. MILITARY SECTOR 50. RESUME. WERE INFORMED BY LOCALS OF
RUSTIRO COMMUNE GR 4188 THAT SOME LOCALS HAVE BEEN
ARRESTED BY RPA FOR UNKNOWN REASONS AND WERE TAKEN TO
MILITARY CATCH IN NTHIRA GR 4188.

3. FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.

1. IN SECTOR 4. NYANGUGU. THE ICRC OFFICE IN NYANGUGU
WAS ROBBED OF US \$4,200, RWF 700,000 AND PERSONAL
BELONGINGS ON 14 DEC 95. THE ROBBERY WAS CARRIED OUT BY
THREE ARMED MEN. NO ONE WAS INJURED DURING THE ROBBERY.
THE RPA HAS ARRESTED SOME INDIVIDUALS IN THIS CONNECTION
BUT NO RECOVERIES HAVE BEEN MADE SO FAR.

(2) IN SECTOR 5A (RUHENGURI), A HUTU COUPLE WAS KILLED
BY SUSPECTED FRGF BANDITS ON 14 DEC 95 AT ABOUT 2030 HRS
IN KABAYE SECTOR (GR 5833). THE MAN WAS A TEACHER AT THE
SECONDARY SCHOOL IN RUHENGURI AND HIS WIFE WAS A STUDENT
OF THE SAME SCHOOL.

4. OWN ACTIVITIES. THE FORCE COMMANDER MAJ GEN TOUSIGNANT
ENDED HIS TOUR OF DUTY AND DEPARTED THE MISSION AREA ON 15 DEC 95.
A FAREWELL CEREMONY WAS HELD AT UNAMIR HQ ATTENDED BY ALL MILITARY
AND CIVILIAN STAFF.

5. HUMANITARIAN

A. 75 RETURNEES ARRIVED NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE AND BIKAMIRA.

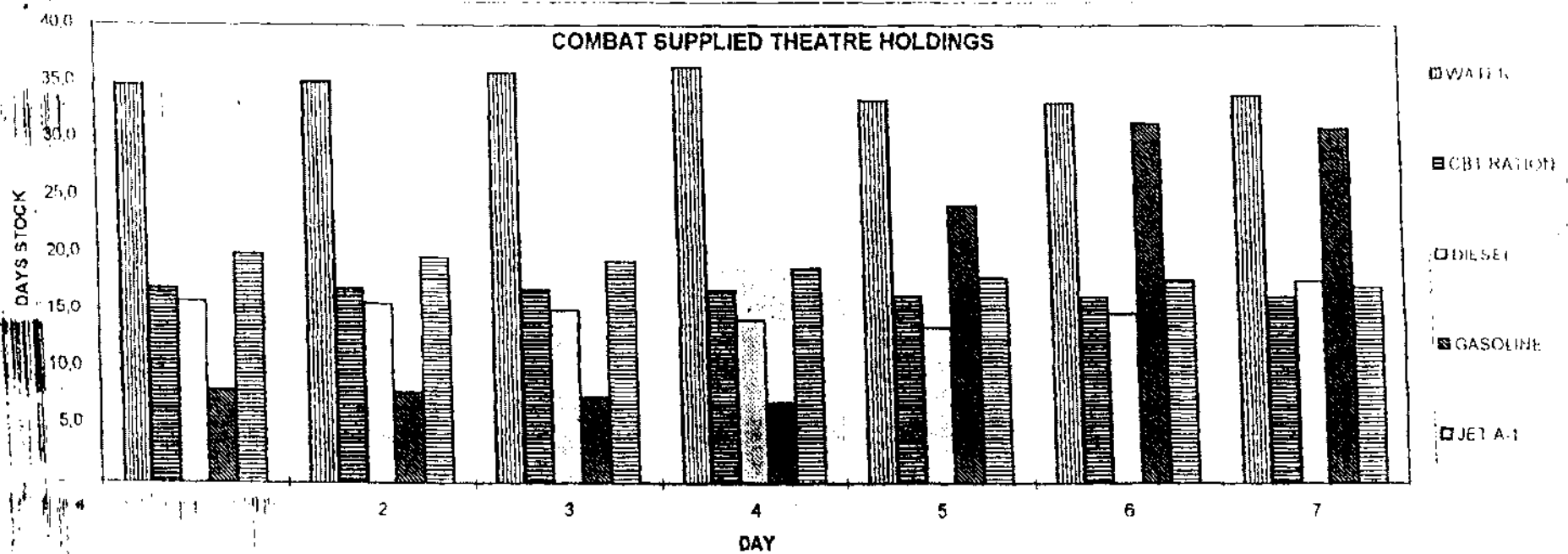

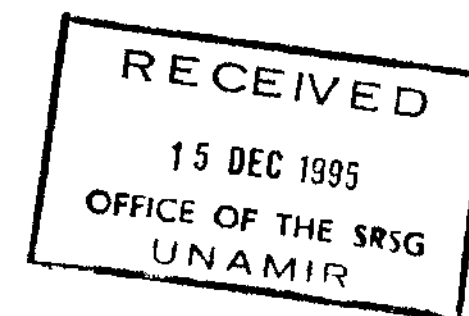



A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 89. 86 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 03 FROM UGANDA. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

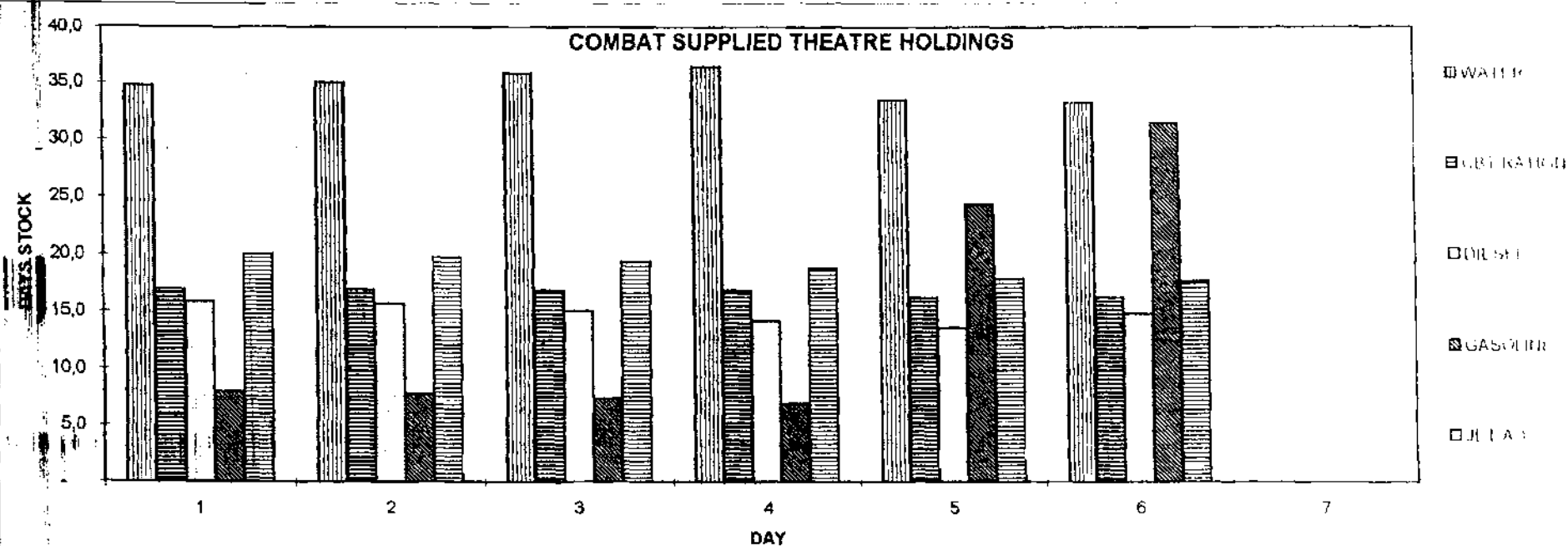

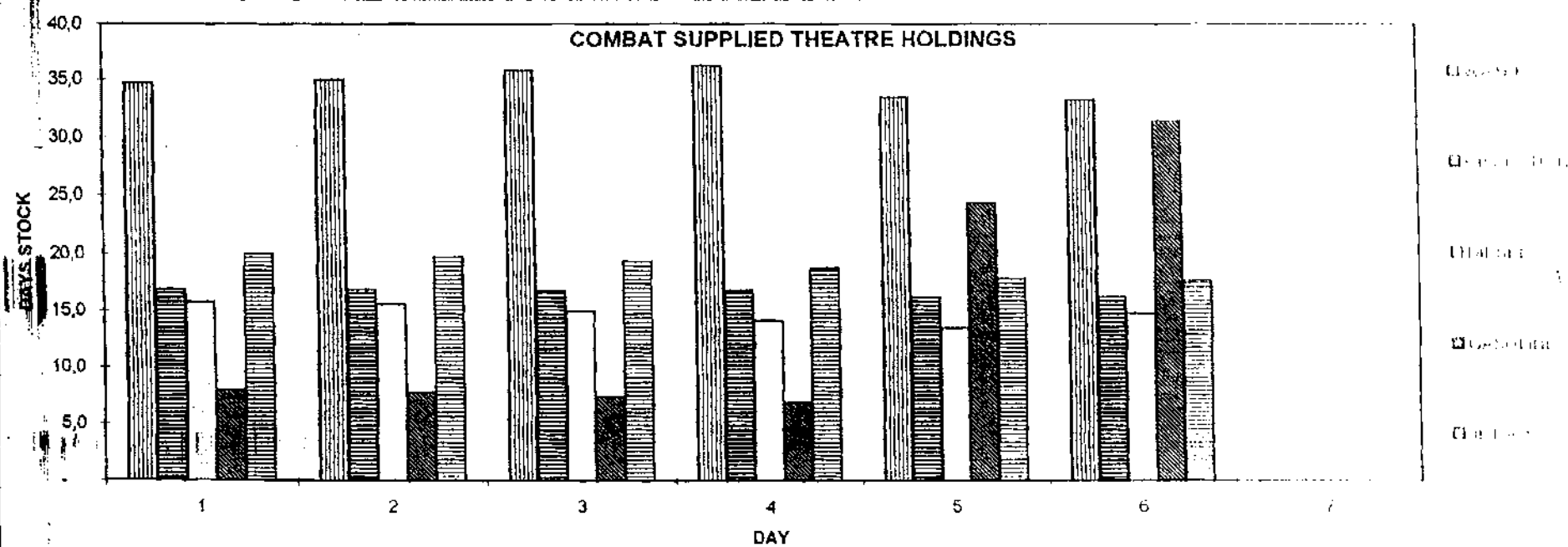

1. - HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 224. 110 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 114 FROM TANZANIA. 20 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 03 FROM UGANDA ON 12 DEC 95 (IN ADDITION TO THE INFLOW REFLECTED IN THE SITREP OF 12 DEC 95). OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 1566. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING AT THE UNDP PREMISES AND DISCUSSED MATTERS RELATING TO WHITE HELMETS INITIATIVES, THE JUSTICE SYSTEM AND UNAMIR'S MANDATE. LATER, HE HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE AND SPOKE ABOUT THE SECURITY COUNCIL'S DECISION TO RENEW THE MANDATE FOR A PERIOD OF THREE MONTHS DURING WHICH UNAMIR'S ACTIVITIES WOULD BE RELATED TO ENCOURAGING THE VOLUNTARY RETURN OF REFUGEES. AMBASSADOR KHAN NOTED THAT H.E. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU HAD PAID TRIBUTE TO UNAMIR II'S ROLE.

B. THE SRSG REFERRED TO THE INDICTMENTS ISSUED ON 12TH DECEMBER BY THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL IN ARUSHA AND EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT ALL MEMBER STATES INCLUDING KENYA WOULD COOPERATE WITH THE TRIBUNAL.

C. THE SRSG EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE SUSPENSION OF ACTIVITIES OF 38 NGOS AND ADDED THAT, WHILE IT WAS RWANDA'S SOVEREIGN RIGHT TO DECIDE SO, DO HOPE THAT THE APPEALS BY THE AFFECTED NGOS WOULD BE GIVEN DUE CONSIDERATION BY THE GOVERNMENT. THE SRSG FIRMLY DENIED THE STATEMENT ATTRIBUTED TO HIM REGARDING THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE GOVERNMENTS OF ZAIRE AND TANZANIA WHILE REFERRING TO THE RADIO RWANDA REPORT OF 10 DECEMBER. HE HAD STATED THAT BOTH COUNTRIES ACKNOWLEDGED THE PRESENCE OF INTIMIDATORS WHO NEED TO BE SEPARATED FROM THE REST OF REFUGEES AND ALSO ACCEPTED TO PREVENT MILITARY TRAINING ON THEIR TERRITORY.

D. THE SRSG ALSO EXPRESSED CONCERN AT THE ARREST OF MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE BARAMBIRWA, PRESIDENT OF CLADHO, AFTER HE

HAD MADE A SPEECH ON SUNDAY AND HOPED THAT HE WOULD BE TREATED WITH TRANSPARENT JUSTICE.

E. THE VICE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA AND VARIOUS MINISTERS VISITED BUTARE PREFECTURE AND ADDRESSED THE UNIVERSITY STUDENTS AND STAFF. THE CONTENTS OF ADDRESS NOT KNOWN.

3. MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. RPA/GENDARMERIE

(1) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) RPA LO AGREED TO INFO THE SECT CDR JUST BEFORE THE SEARCH OF GITARAMA PRISON BEGINS SO THAT THE LATTER COULD BE PRESENT. THE PURPOSE OF THE SEARCH IS NOT KNOWN.

(2) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) ONE RPA SOLDIER STEPPED ON A MINE ON 12 DEC 95 IN RANGIRO SECTOR (GR 0733), KAMATSIRA CELL. THE SOLDIER LOST HIS RIGHT LEG.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED FEW CASES OF CATTLE THEFTS IN RAMBA COMMUNE (GR 4893). THEY ALSO REPORTED ARREST OF 32 PERSONS OUT OF WHICH 12 HAD REFUSED TO ASSIST RPA IN NIGHT PATROLLING. THE REST ARE SUSPECTED OF HAVING PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE.

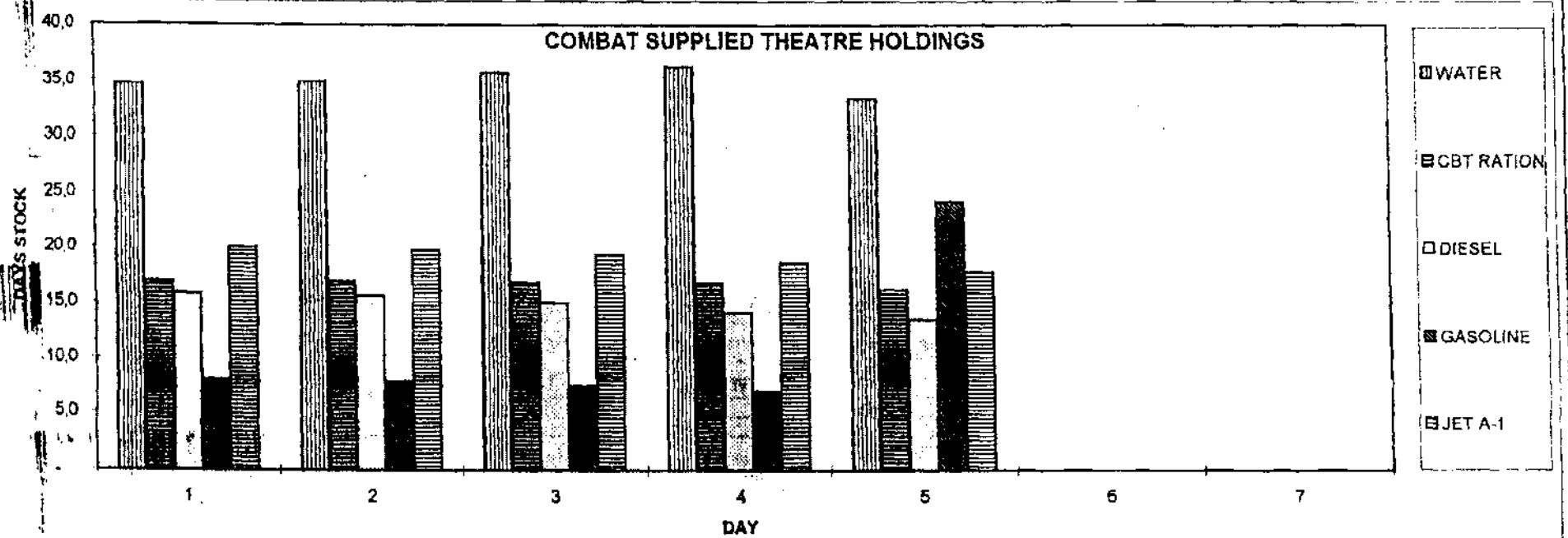

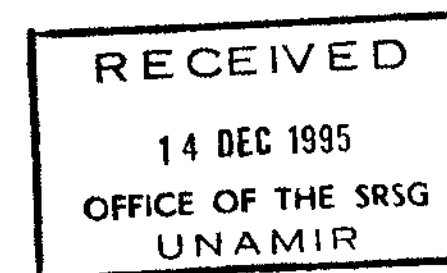

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 224. 110 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 114 FROM TANZANIA. 20 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 03 FROM UGANDA ON 12 DEC 95 (IN ADDITION TO THE INFLOW REFLECTED IN THE SITREP OF 12 DEC 95). OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 1566. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING AT THE UNDP PREMISES AND DISCUSSED MATTERS RELATING TO WHITE HELMETS INITIATIVES, THE JUSTICE SYSTEM AND UNAMIR'S MANDATE. LATER, HE HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE AND SPOKE ABOUT THE SECURITY COUNCIL'S DECISION TO RENEW THE MANDATE FOR A PERIOD OF THREE MONTHS DURING WHICH UNAMIR'S ACTIVITIES WOULD BE RELATED TO ENCOURAGING THE VOLUNTARY RETURN OF REFUGEES. AMBASSADOR KHAN NOTED THAT H.E. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU HAD PAID TRIBUTE TO UNAMIR II'S ROLE.

B. THE SRSG REFERRED TO THE INDICTMENTS ISSUED ON 12TH DECEMBER BY THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL IN ARUSHA AND EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT ALL MEMBER STATES INCLUDING KENYA WOULD COOPERATE WITH THE TRIBUNAL.

THE SRSG FIRMLY DENIED THE STATEMENT ATTRIBUTED TO HIM REGARDING THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE GOVERNMENTS OF ZAIRE AND TANZANIA WHILE REFERRING TO THE RADIO RWANDA REPORT OF 10 DECEMBER. HE HAD STATED THAT BOTH COUNTRIES ACKNOWLEDGED THE PRESENCE OF INTIMIDATORS WHO NEED TO BE SEPARATED FROM THE REST OF REFUGEES AND ALSO ACCEPTED TO PREVENT MILITARY TRAINING ON THEIR TERRITORY.

D. THE SRSG ALSO EXPRESSED CONCERN AT THE ARREST OF MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE BARAMBIRWA, PRESIDENT OF CLADHO, AFTER HE

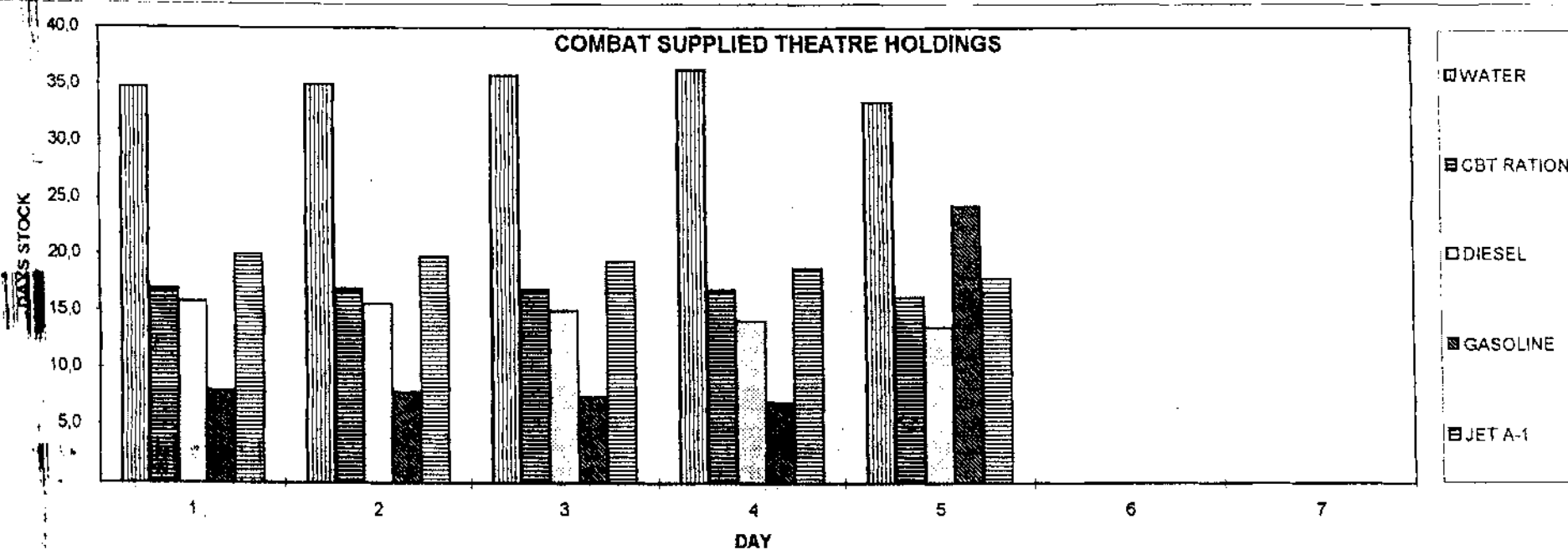

DAILY SITREP FOR 13 DEC 95

1. HIGHLIGHTS

A. THE OVERALL MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS STABLE AND CONTINUES TO IMPROVE THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY. SECURITY ALONG THE BORDER AREAS REMAINS TENSE. RUSIZI BORDER POSTS AND UVIRA BORDER POST REMAINED CLOSED TO COMMERCIAL TRAFFIC AND REFUGEES ON FOOT WITHOUT UNHCR ESCORT. REPATRIATION OF REFUGEES CONTINUES.

B. BORDER CROSSING:

(1) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE DAY IS 224. 110 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 114 FROM TANZANIA. 20 CAME FROM ZAIRE AND 03 FROM UGANDA ON 12 DEC 95 (IN ADDITION TO THE INFLOW REFLECTED IN THE SITREP OF 12 DEC 95). OUTFLOW IS NIL.

(2) TOTAL INFLOW FOR THE MONTH IS 1566. OUTFLOW IS NIL.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

A. THE SRSG ATTENDED THE HEADS OF AGENCIES MEETING AT THE UNDP PREMISES AND DISCUSSED MATTERS RELATING TO WHITE HELMETS INITIATIVES, THE JUSTICE SYSTEM AND UNAMIR'S MANDATE. LATER, HE HELD A PRESS CONFERENCE AND SPOKE ABOUT THE SECURITY COUNCIL'S DECISION TO RENEW THE MANDATE FOR A PERIOD OF THREE MONTHS DURING WHICH UNAMIR'S ACTIVITIES WOULD BE RELATED TO ENCOURAGING THE VOLUNTARY RETURN OF REFUGEES. AMBASSADOR KHAN NOTED THAT H.E. PRESIDENT BIZIMUNGU HAD PAID TRIBUTE TO UNAMIR II'S ROLE.

B. THE SRSG REFERRED TO THE INDICTMENTS ISSUED ON 12TH DECEMBER BY THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL IN ARUSHA AND EXPRESSED THE HOPE THAT ALL MEMBER STATES INCLUDING KENYA WOULD COOPERATE WITH THE TRIBUNAL.

C. THE SRSG EXPRESSED CONCERN OVER THE SUSPENSION OF ACTIVITIES OF 38 NGOS AND ADDED THAT, WHILE IT WAS RWANDA'S SOVEREIGN RIGHT TO DECIDE SO, DO HOPE THAT THE APPEALS BY THE AFFECTED NGOS WOULD BE GIVEN DUE CONSIDERATION BY THE GOVERNMENT. THE SRSG FIRMLY DENIED THE STATEMENT ATTRIBUTED TO HIM REGARDING THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE GOVERNMENTS OF ZAIRE AND TANZANIA WHILE REFERRING TO THE RADIO RWANDA REPORT OF 10 DECEMBER. HE HAD STATED THAT BOTH COUNTRIES ACKNOWLEDGED THE PRESENCE OF INTIMIDATORS WHO NEED TO BE SEPARATED FROM THE REST OF REFUGEES AND ALSO ACCEPTED TO PREVENT MILITARY TRAINING ON THEIR TERRITORY.

D. THE SRSG ALSO EXPRESSED CONCERN AT THE ARREST OF MR. JEAN-BAPTISTE BARAMBIRWA, PRESIDENT OF CLADHO, AFTER HE

HAD MADE A SPEECH ON SUNDAY AND HOPED THAT HE WOULD BE TREATED WITH TRANSPARENT JUSTICE.

E. THE VICE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA AND VARIOUS MINISTERS VISITED BUTARE PREFECTURE AND ADDRESSED THE UNIVERSITY STUDENTS AND STAFF. THE CONTENTS OF ADDRESS NOT KNOWN.

3. **MILITARY ACTIVITIES**

A. **RPA/GENDARMERIE**

(1) IN SECTOR 1B (GITARAMA) RPA LO AGREED TO INFO THE SECT CDR JUST BEFORE THE SEARCH OF GITARAMA PRISON BEGINS SO THAT THE LATTER COULD BE PRESENT. THE PURPOSE OF THE SEARCH IS NOT KNOWN.

(2) IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) ONE RPA SOLDIER STEPPED ON A MINE ON 12 DEC 95 IN RANGIRO SECTOR (GR 0733), KAMATSIRA CELL. THE SOLDIER LOST HIS RIGHT LEG.

(3) MILOBS SECTOR 5B (GISENYI) REPORTED FEW CASES OF CATTLE THEFTS IN RAMBA COMMUNE (GR 4893). THEY ALSO REPORTED ARREST OF 32 PERSONS OUT OF WHICH 12 HAD REFUSED TO ASSIST RPA IN NIGHT PATROLLING. THE REST ARE SUSPECTED OF HAVING PARTICIPATED IN THE GENOCIDE.

B. **FRGF/MILITIA/BANDITRY.** IN SECTOR 4 (CYANGUGU) ON 12 DEC 95 ONE MR. CLAUDE HARELIMANA OF RUGANO SECTOR (GR 1344) WAS SEVERELY BEATEN UP BY FOUR BANDITS. THE VICTIM REMAINS UNCONSCIOUS IN KIBOGORA HOSPITAL WHERE HE WAS HOSPITALISED. AN UNSPECIFIED AMOUNT OF MONEY WAS ROBBED FROM HIM.

A. 33 RETURNEES ARRIVED NDERA CAMP FROM BUTARE. 34 WERE DESPATCHED BY UNHCR TO KIGALI RURAL AND KIGALI TOWN. A TOTAL OF 143 RETURNEES STILL AWAITING EVACUATION FROM NDERA CAMP.

C. MALAWICOY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO IRC FOR TRANSPORTATION OF GRAVEL.

D. NICOY TRANSPORTED 05 TONS OF FOOD STUFF FROM KIBUYE TO BUZA KURE (GR 4591) FOR CARITAS.

E. FORCE ENGR COY PROVIDED A TRUCK TO ARDEC FOR TRANSPORTING WOOD.

F. MILOBS SECTOR 2A DELIVERED 13 CARTONS OF ORS TO KIBALI COMMUNE.

G. MILOBS SECTOR 2B (KIBUNGO) PRESENTED ONE BOX OF PENICILLIN INJECTABLE DRUGS, FOUR BOXES OF PENICILLIN TABLETS AND SIX BOXES OF ORS TO THE RWAMAGANA HOSPITAL.

H. UNAMIR MEDICAL STAFF TREATED A TOTAL OF 216 MEDICAL AND 32 DENTAL PATIENTS.
