1. GENERAL SITUATION. Generally calm.
2. FACTIONAL ACTIVITY
 - a. Political. The Prefect had apolitical rally at the market place at GIKONGORO to explain the reason of the cordona and search carried out the previuos day to the populace.
 - b. Military. The Mr MURABARUKA THARCISSE arrested from MODASUWA on the 17 Sep by the RPA was released today. Contact has not been made with him to find where and why he was arrested.
3. OWN ACTIVITY.
 - a. Sector HQ. The Sector comd and the officer for HAC attended a conference with the NGOs at GIKONGORO today.
 - b. Team 1. The team visited the refugee camps to the South they visited camp as KIBEHO NDAGO MUNINI GASHINGE and MUGANSE. It was observed that most of the displaced people at MUGANSE and GASHINGE have further displaced to MUNINI because of food and medicen which was available. It was
 - c. Team 2. Teams went to MUSANGE to assist in the evacuation of displaced persons from the camp latter visited camps at KADUHA and MBUGO. At MUSANGE it was reported that about 272 people arrived over the week from KIRUYE area as a result of the RPA threat to burn their shelters.
 - d. Team 3. The Team assisted in the evacuation of displaced person at MUSANGE and later went to visit the displaced persons camp at RUKONDO to see the registration of people ready to be evacuated .
 - e. Team 4. The Team supervised the handing over of 7 suspects to the local RPA authority at GIKONGORO by GHANBATT. .
4. HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS. Today 7 British trucks assisted in the evacuation of about 170 displaced person from MUSANGE camp to various destinations.

In view of the above, all UNAMIR units/cells are advised to educate their troops/personnel about the serious potential implications to UNAMIR and the stability of this country, of selling or giving away items such as UN insignia, head gear and contingent uniforms etc which associate individuals with the UN to unauthorised persons as souvenirs.

1. GENERAL SITUATION. Generally calm with the days cordon and search most of the people have expressed fear about their security.
2. FACTIONAL ACTIVITY
 - a. Political. The Prefect visited the Sector HQ today in the morning and after that attended a conference at Tac HQ.
 - b. Military. There was RPA cordon and search operation today at GIKONGORO town. Movement was restricted from 0330 till 1000hrs. RPA was reported to have arrested one medical doctor HIGIKO CELESTIN today. The Prefect nor the Battalion comd was not available to answer any questions.
 - c. The RPA continue to increase their strength in the sector, 135 RPA soldiers entered the sector yesterday.
3. OWN ACTIVITY.
 - a. Sector HQ. The responsible officer for HAC attended a conference at Tac HQ today.
 - b. Team 1. Assisted UNHCR in the registration of displaced persons desirous to return home. They also conducted foot patrols to some of the areas of GIKONGORO.
 - c. Team 2,3,4. Teams went to MUSANGE to assist in the evacuation of displaced persons from the camp.
4. HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS. Today 9 British trucks assisted in the evacuation of about 150 displaced person from MUSANGE camp to various destinations including KIGALI and GASHORA.
5. CIVILIAN AFFAIRS The civil populace have expressed fear about their security after the RPA cordon and search operation in the GIKONGORO township. The RPA arrested some people during the cordon and search operation including 2 young men for possessing military boots.

FC DIRECTIVE FOR THE DISPOSAL OF CRIMINALS

1. General. In the conduct of their duties, UNAMIR personnel may be required to apprehend suspected criminals, prior to their being returned to Civil authorities.

2. Aim. The aim of this Directive is to outline the procedure for disposal of suspected criminals within UNAMIR AOR.

3. Definition. For the purpose of this Directive a suspected criminal will be defined as a person who is suspected of an act of sabotage, subversive activity, assassination or banditry. The Directive also applies to infiltrators who try to jeopardize the peace keeping mission.

4. Disposal Procedure. All suspected criminals will be disposed of as follows:

- They are to be searched, disarmed and segregated. They are then to be identified and their personal details noted under the supervision of UNMO and ICRC or UNHCR.
- A safe and secure place is to be arranged as a temporary place of custody.
- A preliminary investigation is to be made. This is to include details of alleged perpetrators, with a full incident report.
- Transport is to be arranged in order to evacuate suspects to the appropriate regional authority or to Kigali, whichever is appropriate.
- Suspects are to be escorted by military police and MILOB.
- A clearance certificate is to be carried to allow access through RPA checkpoints.

MASS GRAVES

1. On 15 Sep 94 SO3 G2 conducted a recce of a mass grave site in conjunction with elements of AUSCON. During the course of the recce another 2 sites were identified and contact established with a local civilian source.
2. The primary site recce'd was the church in NTARAMA (Sector 2, GR 064666). An estimated 300-400 bodies are in the church or the immediate area surrounding it. To date the bodies have not been buried and are in an advanced state of decay, most consisting solely of skeletons. The size of some of the skeletons clearly indicates that children were killed. Walking sticks indicate that old people were also murdered. Source claims that the massacre was carried out by soldiers of the former RGF on 15 Apr 94. Source states that 3 truck loads of troops were sent down from KIGALI to kill Tutsis in the area.
3. One of the other mass graves was behind the Shell petrol station at the western end of KAYUMBA (Approx GR 096635). Source claims that "hundreds" of bodies are buried there. The area is covered with piles of earth and it was not possible to verify this claim at the time.
4. Source was able to guide elements of the recce party to the other site which is a feature to the North of KAYUMBA (GR 094648). Fleeing Tutsis from KAYUMBA hid in the forest which covers the hill and were reported to have been hunted and killed by INTERAHAMWE over a period of days from 11 Apr 94 onwards. Source claims that about 400 bodies are scattered all over the hill. The recce party was able to verify 22 and believes that 100 is a more reasonable estimate.
5. A list of all mass graves is to be drawn up and updated on a regular basis. The list will be distributed by this HO. Addressees are asked to contribute all details of mass graves in their possession to G2. HQ UNAMIR as a matter of urgency in order that the scale of the problem can be assessed and all information collated centrally. Details should include whether or not the site has been confirmed as a grave, approximate numbers of bodies (if possible), grid reference and a brief description of the site ie. above or below ground.

OFFICE PROCEDURES - FORCE STANDARD DISTRIBUTION LISTS

1. New Standard Distribution Lists for use within the military component of HQ UNAMIR are attached. Staff officers are encouraged to make the maximum use of these Lists as they help ensure that no one is omitted from the distribution of any document and remove the chore of typing long distributions on each document produced.

2. The Lists must, however, be used sensibly. While they act as an aide-memoire for staff officers, they do not remove from them the responsibility of considering carefully who needs the information contained in the document under consideration. There is a balance to be struck if we are to ensure efficient and effective passage of information within the Force - those who need to know must receive the necessary information while those who do not have any interest in the subject do not want to be swamped with masses of paper which they have to read to decide whether or not they need the information it contains. We need, too, to remember that distribution of large documents on wide distributions is expensive in terms of paper, photocopying and the time of our too few clerks.

3. Standard Distribution Lists are flexible in their use, as the following examples demonstrate. If the appropriate Distribution List contains addressees who do not need a particular document, the Distribution on the document might read, for example, 'Lists A and B (less Serials 17 and 21)'. Similarly, the Lists can be used to cover a part of the total distribution of a document thus:

4. It is also possible to differentiate between Action and Information addressees using distribution lists, for example, if it is required to notify the military staff of HQ UNAMIR of some administrative point, but it is intended that senior officers





2. Specific. UNAMIR remains committed to assisting in the relocation of refugees and displaced persons throughout the AOR. The occupants of some camps in Sector 4A have demonstrated a clear desire to return home to the BUTARE and GITARAMA Prefectures. UNAMIR currently has considerable transport assets available to support such an operation. Op HOMEWARD coordinates UNAMIR support for a movement plan scheduled to begin before the wet season.





1. SUMMARY The situation throughout the country remains stable. Refugees continue to return and the re-building of the country continues.
2. REFUGEE AND DP ACTIVITIES
 - a. Refugees from ZAIRE are returning through Sectors 4 and 5. Approximately 1500 returned through Sector 5 yesterday. Sector 4 reports that 524 were repatriated through RUSUZI 1 and 2.
 - b. In addition to those DPs already located 40 have been found in NYANGE (GR 5573) and another 100 in BWAKIRA (GR 5061).
3. RGF/INTERAHAMWE ACTIVITIES
 - a. The level of reported RGF/INTERAHAMWE activity was very slight during the reporting period with only 1 small arm, 30 rounds of ammunition and a dummy pistol handed in to ETHIOBATT.
4. MASS GRAVES
 - a. The MILOB team from BUTARE patrolled the route to SAVE (GR 7411) in order to verify reports of a mass grave in the area. They managed to locate 2 bodies dumped on the edge of a field but were refused passage by the RPA when they tried to investigate further.
5. ASSESSMENT
 - a. Extended exposure to the poor conditions in the camps around GOMA and the deteriorating security situation in the area are undoubtedly playing their part in persuading some refugees to return, however, their return indicates that they consider RWANDA to be safer than the area around GOMA. The fact that refugees are returning may well indicate to the RGF that their policy of trying to destabilise the region is not working. This may well encourage them to step up their attempts to discourage the return of refugees by increasing the number of armed incidents in RWANDA.



SUBJECT: PROCEDURES FOR TASKING AND OPERATION OF SECOND LINE ROAD TRANSPORT

Introduction

1. Second line road transport within UNIMAR II is a scarce resource, as it is in all operations. To enable the most effective and economical use of Second Line road transport it must be managed intensively. The result of this intensive management will be prioritisation and consolidation of tasks, improved lift capacity, more timely satisfaction of transport requests, and an overall improved service from the second line vehicle fleet.

Aim

2. The aim of this instruction is to describe the procedures for requesting and tasking UNAMIR II second line road transport resources.

General

3. First Line road transport is organic unit transport, available for tasking by units as they see fit. Second line road transport is controlled by the SO Tpt HQ UNAMIR II and provides the capability to lift bulk loads and formed bodies of troops within the UNAMIR II area of operations. Second Line transport support is allocated in accordance with priorities set by HQ UNAMIR II G3 Ops staff. Third Line road transport will not be discussed in this instruction.

4. The following forms will be used to enable management of the Second Line road transport asset:


- a. Transport Task Request. Transport Task Requests are to be submitted, direct to the SO Tpt, by UNAMIR II military or civilian staff requiring transport support beyond the capability of their own First Line road transport. Effective immediately, requests for Second Line road transport support will only be accepted on a Transport Task Request form. An example Transport Task Request form is at Annex A. The example Transport Task Request should be photocopied as there will not be a bulk issue of forms. Requests should be submitted not less than 48 hours in advance of the task. The SO Tpt will prioritise the Transport Task Requests and consolidate tasks. Requests should include, in the remarks column, a point of contact at both the pick up point and delivery point where possible. Advice will be provided, within 24 hours, as to whether the Transport Task Request has been approved. If the

request cannot be approved (for example, due to a lack of transport resources) an attempt will be made to make alternative arrangements. Alternatives may include providing transport on another day, or exploring other sources of transport support (for example, air transport).

- b. Task Vehicle Availability. Units providing Second Line road transport are to submit Task Vehicle Availability forms, not later than 0900 hours daily, direct to the SO Tpt. Units required to submit Task Vehicle Availability forms will be advised by the SO Tpt. An example Task Vehicle Availability form is at Annex B. The example Task Vehicle Availability should be photocopied as there will not be a bulk issue of forms. By consolidating the Task Vehicle Availability Forms the SO Tpt will be able to determine how much transport resource is available daily to satisfy Transport Task Requests, submitted in accordance with sub-paragraph a. above.
- c. Transport Task Orders. On the basis of Task Requests, as advised in sub-paragraph a. above and, vehicle availability, as advised in sub-paragraph b. above, the SO Tpt will consolidate and assign tasks to Second Line road transport. Transport Task Orders are the sole authority to task UNAMIR II Second Line road transport. An example Transport Task Order is at Annex C. Transport Task Orders can only be authorised by staff of the HQ UNAMIR II Log Coord Cell. Copies of Task orders will be provided to both the unit assigned the task and to HQ UNAMIR II G3 Ops.

Conclusion

5. The Second Line road transport management system described will come into effect upon receipt of this instruction. As a result, it is anticipated that over the coming months the ability of the UNAMIR Second Line road transport organisation to respond to force requirements will be greatly enhanced. The cooperation of UNAMIR civilian and military staff in this endeavour will serve to accelerate this process of improvement.

1. In order to simplify and clarify the UNAMIR Rules of Engagement, effective forthwith paragraphs 7, 24 and 26 are to be amended as follows:

A. AMEND PARA 7 TO READ:

"AUTHORIZATION LEVELS FOR THE USE OF FORCE

7. The use of deadly force for the different types of weapons systems will be authorised as follows:

a. Force Commander or His Delegate:

(1) heavy support weapons (i.e. rocket launchers, artillery pieces, light mortars, etc.); and

(1) heavy machine guns or cannons (.50 cal, 20 mm etc.).

b. In situations which are life threatening to UNAMIR troops, members of their unit or those they are ordered to protect, soldiers may use the following weapons:

(1) medium machine guns (i.e. FN MAG, M60, etc.)

- (2) light machine guns; and
 - (3) all personal weapons on automatic or single shot fire.
- c. In situations which are not life threatening to soldiers, members of their unit or those they are ordered to protect, the use of deadly force for the different types of weapons will be authorised as follows:
- (1) Sector Commanders:
 - (a) medium machine guns (i.e. FN MAG, M 60, etc.),
 - (b) light machine guns; and
 - (c) all personal weapons on automatic fire.
 - (2) Battalion Commander down to NCO level at the scene of a threat:
 - (a) personal weapons for single shot fire.

NOTE: Commanders should be aware when using weapons of the principles of military necessity and proportionality."

B. AMEND PARA 24 AS FOLLOWS:

"Rule No. 5 Intervention and Warning Shots

- a. State A: Intervention between warring factions is prohibited.
- b. State B: Intervention with deadly force against positively identified and designated targets only after warning shots have been fired as part of the warning process."

C. AMEND PARA 26 AS FOLLOWS:

"26. There are three ROE states that may apply in any given sector in Rwanda. These states are GREEN, YELLOW and RED and are described on UNAMIR Levels of Readiness/Alert pages in the directive subsequent to Annex A. In normal circumstances, the ROE status shall be GREEN.



NOTE: Changes in the normal status of the ROE for UNAMIR Forces as a whole will be ordered by the Force Commander or his delegate. Sector Commanders may order changes in normal status of the ROE for their sectors, if authorised by the Force Commander or his delegate. Contingent Commanders will inform or, if necessary, seek approval from national authority for the change in status."

2. Contingent Commanders of all contributing nations are also directed to obtain the appropriate national authority and concurrence for these amendments in order to achieve uniformity among all UNAMIR personnel.

3. Furthermore, Contingent Commanders are directed to ensure that all subordinate personnel are properly briefed and that ROE aide-mémoires are amended accordingly.

AUTHORIZATION LEVELS FOR THE USE OF FORCE

7. The use of deadly force for the different types of weapons systems will be authorized as follows:

- a. Force Commander or his Delegate:
 - (1) heavy support weapons (ie rocket launchers, artillery pieces, light mortars, etc); and
 - (2) heavy machine guns or cannons (.50 cal, 20 mm, etc).
- b. in situations which are life threatening to UNAMIR troops, members of their unit or those they are ordered to protect, soldiers may use the following weapons:
 - (1) medium machine guns (ie FN MAG, M60, etc)
 - (2) light machine guns; and
 - (3) all personal weapons on automatic or single shot fire.
- c. in situations which are not life threatening to soldiers, members of their unit or those they are ordered to protect, the use of deadly force for the different types of weapons will be authorized as follows:
 - (1) Sector Commanders:
 - (a) medium machine guns (ie FN MAG, M60, etc),
 - (b) light machine guns; and
 - (c) all personal weapons on automatic fire.
 - (2) Battalion Commander down to nco level at scene of a threat:
 - (a) personal weapons for single shot fire.

Note: Commanders should be aware when using weapons of the principles of military necessity and proportionality.

PRINCIPLES FOR THE USE OF FORCE

8. When an incident occurs that requires the use of force, the following principles will be adhered to:

- a. if possible, negotiation and warnings must be exhausted before any use of force is initiated;
- b. only the minimum non-deadly and deadly force consistent with achieving the immediate aim shall be employed;
- c. except where authorized under paragraph 11, the escalation of force procedures pursuant to paragraph 16 must be exhausted before the use of any deadly force is initiated;
- d. deadly force is justified only under conditions of extreme necessity and as a last resort when all other lesser means have failed or cannot reasonably be employed;
- e. escalation of the level of violence is to be minimized;
- f. collateral damage is to be minimized;

26. There are three ROE states that may apply in any given sector in Rwanda. These states are GREEN, YELLOW and RED and are described on UNAMIR Levels of Readiness/Alert pages in the directive subsequent to Annex A. In normal circumstances, the ROE status shall be GREEN.

NOTE: Changes in the normal status of the ROE for UNAMIR Forces as a whole will be ordered by the Force Commander or his delegate. Sector Commanders may order changes in normal status of the ROE for their sectors, if authorized by the Force Commander or his delegate. Contingent Commanders will inform or, if necessary, seek approval from national authority for the change in status.

PART V

CONCLUSION

27. The aim of this directive is to provide guidance to commanders and soldiers at all levels in the use of force. However, no definitive direction can be created that can detail every possible course of action for every possible situation. It is critical and mandatory that all members of UNAMIR understand these ROE and apply them to any and all situations that develop requiring the use of force.

28. Amendments to this directive will be issued as required and as approved by the UN.

29. This directive will be classified UN RESTRICTED.

UNAMIR explained that they have only 3 helicopters in Rwanda with civilian staff and they can not land during the night.

If you need emergent helicopter transport you shall contact UNAMIR Headquarter in Butare and they will see what they can do.

1. THANKYOU FOR YOUR BRIEF TO ME ON WEDNESDAY. I NOW HAVE A FIRST HAND PICTURE OF YOUR OPERATION.

2. TO CLARIFY THE ISSUE OF ACCESS, UNAMIR HAS THE RIGHT OF ACCESS THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE OF RWANDA. THE RPA SHOULD NOT DETAIN UNAMIR PERSONNEL AT ANY CHECKPOINT, AND YOU MUST ATTEMPT TO RESOLVE ANY INCIDENT AT A LOCAL LEVEL, BY USE OF RPA LOS, KEEPING MY HEADQUARTERS INFORMED. THIS RIGHT OF ACCESS DOES NOT APPLY, HOWEVER, TO KEY CIVIL AND MILITARY LOCATIONS, SUCH AS PRISONS AND BARRACKS. IT IS ONLY REASONABLE THAT THEY SHOULD REMAIN THE PROVINCE OF THE CIVIL GOVERNMENT.

OUTBREAK OF MALARIA IN SECTOR 4

1. The rate at which troops are contracting malaria in the mission area especially in Sector 4 is alarming and it is becoming a source of worry to Command. At this rate, it can only be adduced that tps are not taking the necessary preventive measures. It must be remembered that before the civil war, we lost two of our civilian colleagues through malaria attack.
2. Again the tendency of tps carelessly littering the area with empty canned food containers (a source of mosquito breeding) can not be ruled out. And with the onset of the rainy season, the situation will become worse if this practice is not checked.
3. Units are therefore advised to caution troops to dispose off these empty cans at the appropriate dumps and also to be advised to take the necessary preventive measures to avert the outbreak of malaria in the mission area.
