I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in the country continues to be generally calm.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

1. GNU, OTHER LOCAL AUTHORITIES:

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Visited the Ministry of Information on 6/7/95 and was informed that the Rwandan Govt. has decided to hold negotiations with Rwandan Refugees in neighbouring countries concerning their safe return home. The spokesman further disclosed that the Govt. would send representatives if the neighbouring countries would provide security for the delegation. The team was also informed that some Rwandans refugees from Burundi have arrived in Kibungo to access the security situation in the area. Investigation in progress.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and has facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible growth in retail businesses of consumer's goods in the prefectures.



I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in the country continues to be generally calm.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

1. GNU, OTHER LOCAL AUTHORITIES:

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Patrolled Kigali and its environs and reported that the Govt. of Rwanda has declared 1 - 4 July 95 public holidays in commemoration of independence and liberation days. The team also disclosed that a number of activities will take place on the 4 July 95 at Nyamirambo Stadium where the President and his Vice and other top Govt. officials are expected to attend.

2. RPA:

PMT - GIKONGORO Prefecture:

A. Reported that on 25/6/95 a local worker employed by Human Rights as a day watchman was arrested by RPA soldiers and taken for detention to unknown destination. Reason for the arrest unknown. Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

- B. The team further reported that information has it that locals employed by UNAMIR and NGOs are suspected by RPA soldiers as spies. These local staff are often picked by RPA operatives and subjected to thorough interrogation on activities and other information concerning UNAMIR. Investigation in progress.

PMT - KIBUYE Prefecture:

A. Joint CIVPOL/MILOBS patrolled Ngoma and Gitwa Sectors in Mabanga Commune on 30/6/95 and reported that 8 locals suspected to have participated in last year's genocide were arrested and detained by RPA soldiers. Human Rights informed.

B. The team further reported that bandits suspected to be RPA soldiers robbed locals of 30 cows. Investigation in progress.

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and has facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

1. CIVPOL HEADQUARTERS:

A. The CIVPOL Commissioner on 29/6/95 at CIVPOL HQ hosted the delegation of Canadian International Development Agency who are preparing a training programme for judicial police officers in Rwanda. The meeting was centered on more information on the ongoing training of Gendarmerie.

B. UNAMIR CIVPOL Commissioner in company of a delegation of UNDP representatives, UND Security Officer and a representative from the office of the Director of Training Gendarmerie HQ visited Ruhengeri National Gendarmerie Training School on 1 July 95 to access the renovation work in the school.

C. UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

PMT - CYANGUGU Prefecture:

Reported that between 25/6/95 and 28/95 there were series of banditry activities in the prefecture. The perpetrators were dressed in military uniform and armed with automatic weapons. A local woman was reported shot and killed during one of the incidents. The act of banditry is on the increase in the prefecture. Investigation in progress.

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Patrolled Kanombe Airport on 1/7/95 and reported that a new Govt. fiscal/decision came into effect today where a toll of 150 FRW is being paid for entry and parking at the airport exit gate. The PMT however observed that the policy to UN-Observers will have far-reaching consequences on monitoring functions at the airport as observers cannot continue to bear this cost indefinitely.

PMT - BUTARE Prefecture:

Reported that in the night of 29/6/95 2 locals suspected to be RPA soldiers armed with an AK 47 rifle robbed a World Food Programme personnel of 1000 USD at gun point at his residence. Investigation in progress.

PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

Reported that in the night of 1 July 95 two local night watchmen of Electrogaz Gisenyi were killed by bandits. No arrest made. Investigation in progress. The team also disclosed that a bomb explosion was heard near Gisenyi power station. No Casualty was reported.

Object:

I. GENERAL SITUATION:

The security situation in the country continues to be generally calm.

II. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES:

1. GNU, OTHER LOCAL AUTHORITIES:

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

A. Visited IOM office on 28/6/95 and met the Chief of Mission in Rwanda who disclosed that there have been Military training in Zairian refugee camp but were conducted without Military hardware and incendiary. The chief also confirmed that flights were often seen in eastern Zaire with consignment but the nature and contents unknown.

B. The team also visited the Ministry of Rehabilitation on 29/6/95 and met the Director who expressed high appreciation to UNAMIR for its co-operation and assistance during the incident at the closed Kibeho Camp despite the differences that were encountered. The Director further disclosed that the Ministry has got all the Govt. needed to facilitate the resettlement of IDPs in their respective home communes. He also appealed to UNAMIR for assistance to repair access roads leading to resettlement areas.

2. RPA:

PMT - GIKONGORO Prefecture:

The team was informed that 1 refugee was arrested by RPA soldiers in March 1995 whilst he was attending church service and detained in Gikongoro prison. Reason for the arrest unknown. Human Rights informed.

PMT - GITARAMA Prefecture:

Visited Gitarama prison on 29/6/95 and reported that there was a shooting incident by RPA soldiers during the night at about 01.00 hrs which left 4 prisoners dead and 3 others seriously injured. The injured have been evacuated to Kabgayi Hospital. The RPA guards at the prison claimed that the prisoners attempted to escape when they were shot. Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and has facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible growth in retail businesses of consumer's goods in the prefectures.

4. ECONOMIC:

The domestic economic situation is making subsistence living very hard and out of reach of many in the prefectures.

5. HUMANITARIAN:

PMT - GIKONGORO Prefecture:

Visited Burundi refugee camp at Kigeme Commune on 28/6/95 and met the Deputy President of the camp who disclosed that the number of refugees has now reduced to 2,147. The Deputy President also complained of inadequate supply of food to the refugees in the camp. He appealed to UNAMIR for assistance.

PMT - BUTARE Prefecture:

Visited Way station on 28/6/95 and reported that there were 204 IDPs from neighbouring countries awaiting evacuation to their respective home communes. 113 out of this number were evacuated to their various home communes. A. A joint CIVPOL/Human Rights team visited Rutobwe Commune on 27/6/95 and met the Bourgmestre who disclosed that the security situation in the area has been calm.

B. The team also reported that the FC visited the Sector and was briefed on the general situation in the Prefecture.

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Reported that there was an armed robbery incident on 27/6/95 at Kimihurura area involving UNAMIR personnel. A lot of valuables were stolen during the robbery. Military Police are already investigating the case.

PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

Reported that the MSF (Medecins Sans Frontieres) in Gisenyi Prefecture had on 27/6/95 written a letter to Gendarmerie brigade of Gisenyi threatening to stop their activities over the impounding of their vehicle since 15/6/95. The team on 28/6/95 through its efforts has collected the said vehicle and handed it over to MSF.

The refugees were said to have crossed into Rwanda from Zaire since May 95. The refugees complained of lack of food and farm implements. The security situation was reported calm.

PMT - BUTARE Prefecture:

Visited Rusatera Commune prison on 26/6/95 and reported that the prison is overcrowded with 165 inmates and with poor sanitary conditions. Human Rights informed.

III. OWN ACTIVITIES:

1. CIVPOL HEADQUARTERS:

UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

PMT - GIKONGORO Prefecture:

A. Patrolled Kinyamakara Commune on 25/6/95 and met the Bourgmestre who disclosed that out of 649 locals from the commune who took refuge at Kibeho Camp after the war, only 448 have so returned. The whereabouts of 201 is unknown. The Bourgmestre further revealed that 24 of the returnees were found to have taken part in last year's genocide and were arrested and detained in the commune cell by RPA. The team visited the detention centre and discovered that the suspects are detained in a small room with poor sanitary conditions. The Bourgmestre however attributes their continued detention in the cachot to lack of transport to transfer them to Gikongoro main prison. Human Rights informed.

B. The same team was informed that a grenade was found few meters away from the main gate of the Human Rights office and later picked by RPA soldiers. Investigation conducted revealed that an unidentified RPA soldier during a drinking spree got himself drunk and started indiscriminate firing. He was being pursued by fellow RPA soldiers when the hand grenade fell from his pocket. The BN. Commander has been contacted on the conduct of his soldier.

PMT - GITARAMA Prefecture:

Patrolled Nyabinkenke Commune on 21 June 95 and visited the commune cell. During their interview with the inmates, the RPA in charge of the cachot arrived and ordered the team to stop further discussions and hand over their notes to him. The team did not oblige but after an hour and half deliberations, the team was allowed to leave the area. The RPA officer accused UNAMIR of spreading falsehood about the commune to his superiors. The attitude of the RPA soldiers is uncalled for as the team went to the cachot with a written permission from the Prefect of Kiyumbe. The matter has since been reported to BN. Commander.

PMT - CYANGUGU Prefecture:

Reported that on 24 June 95, between 20.30 hrs and 22.00 hrs, a group of bandits armed with automatic weapons robbed 2 locals of Mubumbano Sector of Kagano Commune of some unspecified amount of money and personal effects. In both incidents, the daughters of the victims who were present were forced by the bandits to carry the items robbed to their waiting boat on the shore of the lake. The bandits are suspected to have come from Zaire. Investigation in progress.

3. TRAINING:

The team also was informed that some of the detainees were fed by their relations while those without relations rarely have food to eat. Human Rights informed.

4. It is necessary to request that you kindly cure the mistake of allocating offices meant for CIVPOL Monitoring team made up of eight officers in KIGALI as CIVPOL HQ with a staff strength of twenty CIVPOL Officers and seven civilian staff, please.

A. Patrolled Mutuntu Commune and was informed that a local was arrested by RPA on 30/5/95 in place of his brother who was wanted for genocide. Human Rights informed.

B. The team further reported that on 20/5/95, a local was robbed by RPA soldiers of reasonable cash yet unknown at the same commune. Investigation in progress.

C. The team also disclosed that RPA had vacated a primary school which was being used as barracks.

2. SOCIAL:

Social advancement centers are on the increase in the country and has facilitated social gatherings amongst the local population in all spectrum of life, even though there are fears of moving in the night.

3. COMMERCIAL:

There are visible growth in retail businesses of small goods in the prefectures.

4. ECONOMIC:

The domestic economic situation is making subsistence living very hard and out of reach of many in the prefectures.

5. HUMANITARIAN:

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Visited the Ministry of information on 01 June 95 and was briefed by the spokesman, Mr. Bereit Ndjirikiye that the government's action to suspend arrests of genocide suspects until further notice following a request made by the Interior Ministry that the prisons are overcrowded and are in deplorable living conditions.

III. OWN ACTIVITIES:

UNAMIR CIVPOL HQ continued coordination and monitoring of activities of CIVPOL Observers in the Prefectures.

2. CIVPOL MONITORING TEAMS:

PMT - KIGALI Prefecture:

Visited the Ministry of information on 01 June 95 and was briefed by the spokesman, Mr. Bereit Ndjirikiye that the Rwandan Tribunal on genocide and war crimes may not resume trials of suspects until more time is allowed for prosecutors and defence counsels to study all relevant dossiers/exhibits.

PMT - GISENYI Prefecture:

A. Reported that on 29/5/95 at about 12.00 hrs, there was a grenade explosion in Ndoranyi Sector in Mutara Commune resulting in the death of an RPA soldier and the councilor for Nyaruteme Sector. One local was also injured during the incident. Investigation in progress.

B. In another development the team held a meeting on 31 May 95 with the Prefecture RPA Liaison Officer at the CIVPOL office. The LO had assured the team of all assistance required and unimpeded cooperation in matters relating to security in the area.

PMT - BUTARE Prefecture:

A. Visited Kigoma Commune cell and met 19 suspects in detention. 16 of the number have been suspected of participating in last year's genocide. Human Rights informed.

B. The team also reported that a house to house search for arms and ammunition was conducted by RPA at Masango Commune on 30/5/95. Details yet unknown. Investigation in progress.

3. TRAINING:

Students of the Ruhengeri National Gendarmerie Training School are now awaiting graduation ceremony.

Reported that a trailer loaded with about 500 RPA soldiers were seen driven out of Kigali through Gitarama road on 30/5/95. Information had it that the troops are to beef up those at the Zairian border following the international media report on FRGF infiltration into the country.

PMT - BUTARE Prefecture:

Visited Nyanza prisons and reported that the Director of the prisons has issued a directive that on no account should UNAMIR personnel with the exception of the Human Rights and Red Cross be allowed access to the prison for any reason. The reason advanced was because of UN's complicity in the alleged escape of some inmates from Butare prisons.

The team was also informed that 1,200 refugees from Burundi who are about to resettle in Ntyazo have been threatened by the local Authority to leave the area due to housing problem being caused by the returnees. Human Rights to be informed.


