DAILY SITREP FOR 22 JAN 95

1. **GEN SITUATION**. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

A. AUSMED REPORTED THAT AT RUKONDO CAMP AN RPA PL COMD APPROACHED AUST INF ELM WHO WERE PROVIDING SECURITY FOR THE MED SCREENING STATION AND ASKED THEM TO STOP THEIR PTLs WITHIN THE CAMP. HE WAS INFORMED THAT AUST INF ELM WERE UNAMIR PERS AND HAD THE RIGHT TO ASSIST IN PROVIDING SECURITY IN THE CAMP. THE PL COMD THEN ATTEMPTED TO ORDER HIS TROOPS TO ATTACK THE AUST TPS. HE WAS ADVISED AGAINST IT AND THEREAFTER HE LEFT THE LOCATION. ISSUE TAKEN UP WITH RPA SECTOR COMD.

B. IN SECTOR 3, MALICOY PTL TEAM WERE SHOWN A MASS GRAVE SUSPECTED TO CONTAIN 100 CORPSES AT GALLENGELLI GR 9558 AND 9360. SEVERAL SKULLS WERE EXPOSED. THE MASS GRAVE DATES BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. MR. BENON SEVAN, ASSISTANT SECRETARY GENERAL AND UN SECURITY COORDINATOR, ALONG WITH HIS DELEGATION, MET WITH UN AGENCY AND ICRC REPRESENTATIVES AND SECURITY OFFICERS TO DISCUSS PROGRESS AND COORDINATION REGARDING THE UNAMIR SECURITY PLAN.

B. MR. SEVAN HELD CONSULTATIONS WITH THE MINISTER OF REHABILITATION AND THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE BEFORE CONDUCTING A VISIT TO KIGALI PRISON DURING WHICH HE MET WITH LOCAL UNAMIR STAFF MEMBERS WHO ARE CURRENTLY BEING DETAINED THERE.

C. MR. SEVAN TRAVELLED TO TRAFIPRO, THE PROPOSED FUTURE SITE OF UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS, TO ASSESS THE PREPARATIONS IN PROGRESS. HE THEN RECEIVED A FULL BRIEFING ON THE OVERALL SITUATION IN RWANDA FROM THE ACTING CHIEF OF MISSION, GEN GUY TOUSIGNANT.

3. **FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. **RPA.**

(1) IN SECTOR 2 MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA ASKED SECT 2 MILOB PTLs TO REMOVE UN FLAG FROM UNAMIR VEH. THE REASON WAS THAT THE WAR WAS OVER AND THERE WAS NO NEED FOR THE FLAG.

(2) SECTOR 4C MILOB REPORTED THAT RPA SHOT AND KILLED ONE PERS WHO WAS ALLEGED TO HAVE SPENT A NIGHT ON THE IJWI ISLAND.

(3) IN SECTOR 5 TUNBATT REPORTED THAT RPA TPS ARRESTED THREE PERSONS FROM KORA GR 3821 TO BIGOGWE CAMP ON 21 JAN 95. REASONS FOR THE ARRESTS NOT YET KNOWN. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

B. **FRGF.** NTR.

C. **MILITIA.**

(1) SECTOR 4C MILOBS REPORTED THAT ON NI 21 JAN 95 AT BIREMBO GR 0748, A GP OF ARMED BANDITS SHOT AT 2 PERS AND ROBBED THEM OF THEIR HOUSEHOLD EFFECTS AND ESCAPED TOWARDS THE IJWI ISLAND IN A WAITING BOAT. ONE OF THE PERS SHOT AT WAS KILLED AND THE OTHER SERIOUSLY WOUNDED. IN A SEPARATE INCIDENT ON THE SAME NIGHT, 2 OTHER LOCALS WERE ROBBED OF THEIR CATTLE NEAR MUBUMBANO (0039). THE BANDITS LATER ESCAPED TO THE IJWI ISLAND BY BOAT.

(2) SECTOR 4C MILOBS ALSO REPORTED THAT ON NIGHT OF 22 JAN 95 AT ABOUT 2330HRS, A GP OF BANDITS ATTACKED THE HOUSE OF THE BOURGEMESTRE OF KAGANO. BANDITS USED 3 GRENADES AND ALSO THREW 2 X BOTTLES OF PETROL AT THE

ROOF BUT NO FIRE RESULTED. THEY FIRED SHOTS INTO THE AIR AND ESCAPED.

4. **OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES.**

A. **FORCE HQ.**

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) ON 22 JAN 94, THE FC WELCOMED MR BEVON SEVAN, ASG AND SECURITY COORDINATOR FOR UNNY, AND HELD DISCUSSION WITH HIM ON THE PHYSICAL SECURITY OF UNAMIR'S LOCATION. LATER IN THE DAY HE ATTENDED A MEDAL AND FAREWELL PARADE FOR THE CANADIAN CONTINGENT, WHO WILL BE DEPARTING IN THE COURSE OF THE WEEK. LATER THAT EVENING HE DINED WITH MR. SEVAN AND FURTHER DISCUSSED UNAMIR'S POSITION ON SECURITY.

(3) ON 23 JAN 95 THE FC MET WITH MR. SEVAN AND NGO REPRESENTATIVES TO DISCUSS SECURITY CONCERNS AND EVACUATION PLANS FOR NGO AGENCIES. MR. SEVAN DIRECTED UNAMIR CSO TO PREPARE A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN FOR EVACUATION OF NGO AND CIVILIAN PERSONNEL. HE ALSO MET WITH AN RPA LO, TO DISCUSS ACCOMMODATION PROBLEMS IN UNAMIR. HE LATER HELD A MEETING WITH MR PETER HORNSBY TO DISCUSS AIRPORT SECURITY MATTERS. HE ALSO GRANTED AN INTERVIEW TO REUTERS, AND MET WITH THE DELEGATION OF AUSTRALIAN MINISTERS. HE CONCLUDED THE DAY WITH A WRAP-UP MEETING WITH MR. SEVAN.

(4) **OP RETOUR.** A TOTAL OF 3,867 IDPs WERE EVACUATED FROM CYANIKA, RUKONDO AND KIBEHO TO BUTARE AND OTHER DESTINATIONS ON 23 JAN 95. CYANIKA MAY BE READY FOR CLOSURE LATER THIS WEEK OR EARLY NEXT WEEK.

TOTAL NUMBER OF DPs MOVED SINCE THE BEGINNING OF OP RETOUR IS 19,093.

B. **SECTOR 1 (NICOY).** CONDUCTED PATROLS IN AOR.

(1) PTL SENT TO NYAGAHANGA WAS BRIEFED BY COMMUNE LEADER THAT THE PRESENCE OF RPA SOLDIERS WAS TO CONTROL CRIMINAL ACTIVITIES BY MILITIA MEN WHO CROSS THE BORDER INTO THE AREA.

(2) AT NGARAMA, TWO CIVILIAN DETAINEES WERE SEEN IN A CELL AT THE COMMUNE HQ. THE PTL TEAM WAS TOLD THAT THE TWO PERSONS WERE BEING DETAINED FOR MINOR CIVIL OFFENCES. RPA SOLDIERS WERE ALSO SEEN AT THE MENTIONED LOC AND IT WAS BELIEVED THAT THEY MAY TRANSFER THE

SUSPECTS TO A SECRET HOLDING FACILITY. THIS WAS HOWEVER DENIED BY THE COMMUNE OFFICIALS.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 138 LOCALS.

C. SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(1) 40 PERSONS MADE UP OF 6 MEN, 11 WOMEN AND 23 CHILDREN FROM UGANDA JOINED IDPs AT MURUGAGI GR 5785 ON SUN 22 JAN 95.

(2) AT 1000 HRS, TPS AT NYAMATA GR 1061 HELD A MEETING WITH RPA AND SOUS PREFECT OF KIGALI TO DISCUSS THE GEN SECURITY IN THE SECTOR. IT WAS LATER AGREED THAT SUCH MEETINGS SHOULD BE HELD FORTNIGHTLY.

(3) REF PARA 1A, DAILY SITREP 22 JAN 95, GHANBATT TROOPS INTERVENED AND TENSION IN THE CAMP WAS DIFFUSED. THE RPA SOLDIER WHO WAS REPORTED MISSING WAS FOUND AT THEIR PTL BASE. THE CAMP IS NOW EMPTY AND 11 OF THE 15 DPs ARRESTED BY THE RPA HAVE BEEN RELEASED AND ARE UNDER GHANBATT PROTECTION. FOUR OF THE LOCALS WERE HOWEVER TAKEN AWAY BY THE RPA AS WITNESSES.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY)

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) ASSISTED RPA TO TRANSPORT THEIR SUPPLIES FROM BYUMBA TO BUTARE.

E. SECTOR 4A SOUTH (GHANBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) PTL BASE AT KIBEHO PROVIDED SECURITY FOR THE EVACUATION OF 521 IDPs FROM KIBEHO TO BUTARE BY IOM.

(2) FOUR TEAMS OF ZAMBATT TPS PAID A FAMILIARISATION VISIT TO GHANBATT ALPHA COY LOCATION IN PREPARATION FOR EVENTUAL RELIEF IN PLACE.

(3) THE LEADER OF GOAL (NGO) AT RURAMBA GR 474173 REPORTED TO GHANBATT TPS AT RURAMBA THAT AT 231420B JAN 95, RPA TPS BROKE INTO THE GOAL CLINIC AT MATA AREA GR 5115 AND STOLE SOME DRUGS. REMAINING DRUGS AND OTHER ITEMS EVACUATED TO GHANBATT POSN AT RURAMBA FOR SAFE-KEEPING. INVESTIGATIONS IN PROGRESS.

(4) A CAMP HAS BEEN ESTABLISHED FOR BURUNDIAN REFUGEES AT GR 464257 NEAR KIGEME. ABOUT 500 BURUNDIAN REFUGEES FROM DP CAMPS IN SECTOR 4A ARE IN THE CAMP. GHANBATT AND RPA TPS PROVIDING SECURITY.

F. SECTOR 4A NORTH (ZAMBATT). CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) PROVIDED SECURITY TO CARITAS DURING THE DISTRIBUTION OF HOES TO LOCALS AT MUSEBEYA COMMUNE AND FOR THE EVAC OF IDPS FROM CYANIKA AND RUKONDO DP CAMPS ALSO PROVIDED TWO ARMED ESCORTS EACH TO INFO CAMPAIGN TEAM DURING ITS TOUR OF CYANIKA DP CAMP AND 35 REGISTERED IDPS FROM MURAMBI DP CAMP WHO LEFT IN OWN VEHs FOR SAKE AND NGENDA COMMUNES TO ASCERTAIN SY SITUATION IN MENTIONED AREAS.

(2) A GREN AND SOME EXPLOSIVES WERE HANDED TO ZAMBATT TPS BY BOURGMESTER OF MUKO.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 93 LOCALS.

G. **SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT)**.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(2) MED STAFF TREATED 31 LOCALS.

H. **SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT)**.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) EOD TEAM DETONATED ONE HAND GREN AT KAMEMBE GR 7861 AND ONE ANTI-PERS MINE AROUND TRIBUNAL OFFICE IN CYANGUGU GR 7825.

(3) TRANSPORTED 28 REFUGEES FROM RUSIZI-1 TO TRANSIT CAMP NYAGATARE.

(4) ESCORTED UNHCR CONVOY OF 225 IDPS FROM NYAGATARE TO KITABI GR 3520.

(5) PTL SENT TO NYAMASHEKE RECEIVED INFO THAT UNKNOWN PERSONS THREW 2 HAND GRENS AND OPENED FIRE ON THE LOCAL ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICE.

(6) MEDICAL STAFF TREATED 23 LOCAL DENTAL PATIENTS.

(1) CONDUCTED PTLs AND SY DUTIES IN AOR.

(2) MED STAFF TREATED 164 RWANDESE PATIENTS.

J. **SECTOR 6 (INDBATT)**. CONDUCTED PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN AOR.

(1) 73 IDPS ARRIVED NDERA CAMP. 28 IDPS WERE EVAC FROM THE CAMP BY UNHCR TO KIGALI. 902 IDPS STILL AWAITING EVAC FROM THE CAMP.

(2) 281 DPs MOVED BY INDBATT VEHs FROM CYANIKA DP CAMP TO BUTARE.

(3) MED STAFF TREATED 486 LOCALS.

K. MILOB GP. THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) POLITICAL. IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE NATIONAL ASSEMBLY WAS WORKING OUT A DRAFT CONSTITUTION.

(2) BORDERS. FOLLOWING BORDER POSTS WERE OPENED TO TRAFFIC.

(A) GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA.

(B) RUSUMO BORDER POST (RWANDA/TANZANIA).

(C) RUSIZI BORDER POST IN SECT 4C.

(D) GISENYI BORDER POST (EXCEPT UNAMIR PERS).

(3) MILOB GP HQ. CONTINUED COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN THE SECTORS.

(4) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) MILOBS ATTENDED MEETING WITH RPA, NGOS AND PREFECTURE AUTH AT BYUMBA PREFECTURE OFFICE TO COORD MED AID IN THE PREFECTURE.

(B) PRESENCE OF MINEFIELD AT NYASELMA WAS REPORTED TO SECTOR MILOB. AUTH AT THE VILLAGE HAVE PROMISED TO SHOW EOD TEAM EXACT LOC OF THE MINEFIELD ON 25 JAN 95.

(5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) MILOBS ATTENDED A MEETING WITH GHANBATT REPS AND THE SOUS-PREFECT OF NYAMATA. MEETING WAS ON SY SIT IN THE AREA.

(B) AN IDP DELEGATION VISITED SAKE BUT WAS REJECTED BY THE BOURGEMESTRE WHO CLAIMED THAT HE HAD NOT RECEIVED ANY LETTER FROM THE PREFECT ON THE VISIT. THE DELEGATION WAS EXPECTED TO SPEND THE NI AT KIBUNGO TO AWAIT THE LETTER WHICH WAS EXPECTED LATER.

(6) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA.

(A) CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(B) MILOBS CARRIED OUT PTLs TO NTYAZA (8731) AND MET THE BOURGEMESTRE AND HIS COUNCIL AT A MEETING DURING THE PERIOD. THE BOURGEMESTRE EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT THE TPT OF IDPs DIRECT TO THEIR HOMES WITHOUT REGISTERING AND SCREENING THEM AT

THE COMMUNE OFFICE. MILOBS INFO NGOS RESPONSIBLE FOR EVAC OF IDPs TO NOTE AND ADHERE TO THE PROCEDURE.

(7) **SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO**. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) PATROL TO KIBEHO, NDAGO AND MUNINI CAMPS REPORTED THAT LARGE NUMBERS OF DPs WERE READY TO BE EVAC TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES BUT THERE WAS SHORTAGE OF VEHS.

(B) AT AKABUGA BORDER POST RPA TPS DENIED 25 BURUNDIANS ENTRY INTO RWANDA FOR NORMAL MARKETING.

(C) MILOBS INVESTIGATED AN INCIDENT IN WHICH AN RPA SOLDIER WAS ALLEGEDLY ABDUCTED BY IDPs AT MATA (514158) FOR ATTEMPTING TO COLLECT A RADIO BY FORCE FROM A DP. AN RPA PTL TEAM CORDONED THE AREA AND ARRESTED 4 DPs. ONE OF THE DPs WHO RESISTED ARREST WAS SHOT AND KILLED. INVESTIGATION IN PROGRESS.

(8) **IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE**. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(9) **IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU**. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. THE SITUATION REMAINED GENERALLY CALM DURING THE PERIOD. ONE MINE WAS LOC NEAR THE SITE OF THE TWO EXPLOSIONS AT THE KAMEMBE MARKET. ETHIOBATT DETONATED THE MINE.

(10) **IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI**. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.

(A) MILOBS INVESTIGATED CATTLE RUSTLING INCIDENT AT BYAHI (1917). ON NI 21/22 JAN 95, 15 ARMED MEN CROSSED THE BORDER FROM ZAIRE AND TOOK AWAY CATTLE FROM BYAHI. ONE CIV WAS KILLED AND ONE INJURED. ON NI 22/23 JAN, RPA AMBUSHED INFILTRATORS AT MUFUMBA (2422). IN THE EXCHANGE OF FIRE, ONE RPA SOLDIER WAS INJURED AND ONE BANDIT KILLED. RPA CAPTURED ONE AK 47 RIFLE.

(B) MILOB PTLs INVESTIGATED THE HEALTH SIT AT BISATE AREA (4539). 20 CIVS WERE REPORTED DEAD FROM DYSENTERY AND MALARIA IN THE AREA. MSF HOSP AT KINIGI AND RUHENGIERI WERE INFO. MSF WILL CONDUCT MED ASSESSMENT ON 24 JAN 95 AND WOULD BE SENDING A MOBILE CLINIC TO THE AFFECTED AREAS.

(C) 178 RETURNEES WERE TRANSPORTED BY UNHCR AND IOM FROM CAMP MUGUNGA 15 KMS WEST OF GOMA TO GISENYI.

(11) **IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI** CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR. MILOB PTLs SENT TO BUREMA (745080) AND RUBUNGO LOCATED 6 X UNEXPLODED 60MM MOR BOMBS AT THE RD SIDE GR

079794.

(3) MED SCREENING TEAM AND PROTECTIVE ELEMENT IN SPT OF OP RETOUR SCREENED 247 IDPs AT KIBEHO AND RUKONDO CAMPS.

(4) RECEIVED VIPs AND MEDIA ELM FROM AUSTRALIA WHO WERE SPENDING THE WEEK WITH AUSMED TROOPS.

N. AIR OPS. NORMAL UNAMIR AND COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS IN OPERATION AT THE AIRPORT. A TOTAL OF 15 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) PROVIDED POLICE AND SECURITY SERVICES THROUGHOUT KIGALI.

(2) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE CLOSE PROTECTION TO A RWANDESE NATIONAL ON A 24-HR/7-DAY PER WEEK BASIS.

A. AS A RESULT OF INCIDENTS REPORTED OVER THE LAST FEW WEEKS MILOBS IN SECTOR 4C EVALUATE THAT ACTS OF BANDITRY STILL CONTINUING TO CREATE APPREHENSION AND UNREST AMONG LOCALS IN THE NORTHERN PART OF THE SECTOR ESPECIALLY IN THE BIRAMBO, RUKANO AND MURAZA AREAS IN THE GATARE COMMUNE GR 1345.



1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA CONTINUES TO BE GENERALLY UNDER CONTROL.

A. MILOBS IN SECTOR 5 INTERROGATED A GROUP OF RETURNEES FROM ZAIRE. THE RETURNEES REPORTED THAT CONDITIONS AND SY SIT IN THE REFUGEE CAMPS WERE VERY BAD. THEY SAID PEOPLE WILLING TO RETURN HAD TO SNEAK OUT BECAUSE MILITIA IN THE CAMPS KILLED ANYONE WHO WAS CAUGHT ATTEMPTING TO RETURN TO RWANDA. THEY ALSO REPORTED THAT ZAIRIAN HUNDE ETHNIC GROUP WAS ATTACKING THE REFUGEES IN THE CAMPS. REASONS FOR THE ATTACKS WERE NOT GIVEN.

C. IN SECTOR 6, MILOBS REPORTED THAT 18 MASS GRAVES CONTAINING ABOUT 60,000 CORPSES WERE DISCOVERED IN KICUKIRO SUBURB OF KIGALI. THE MASS GRAVES DATE BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

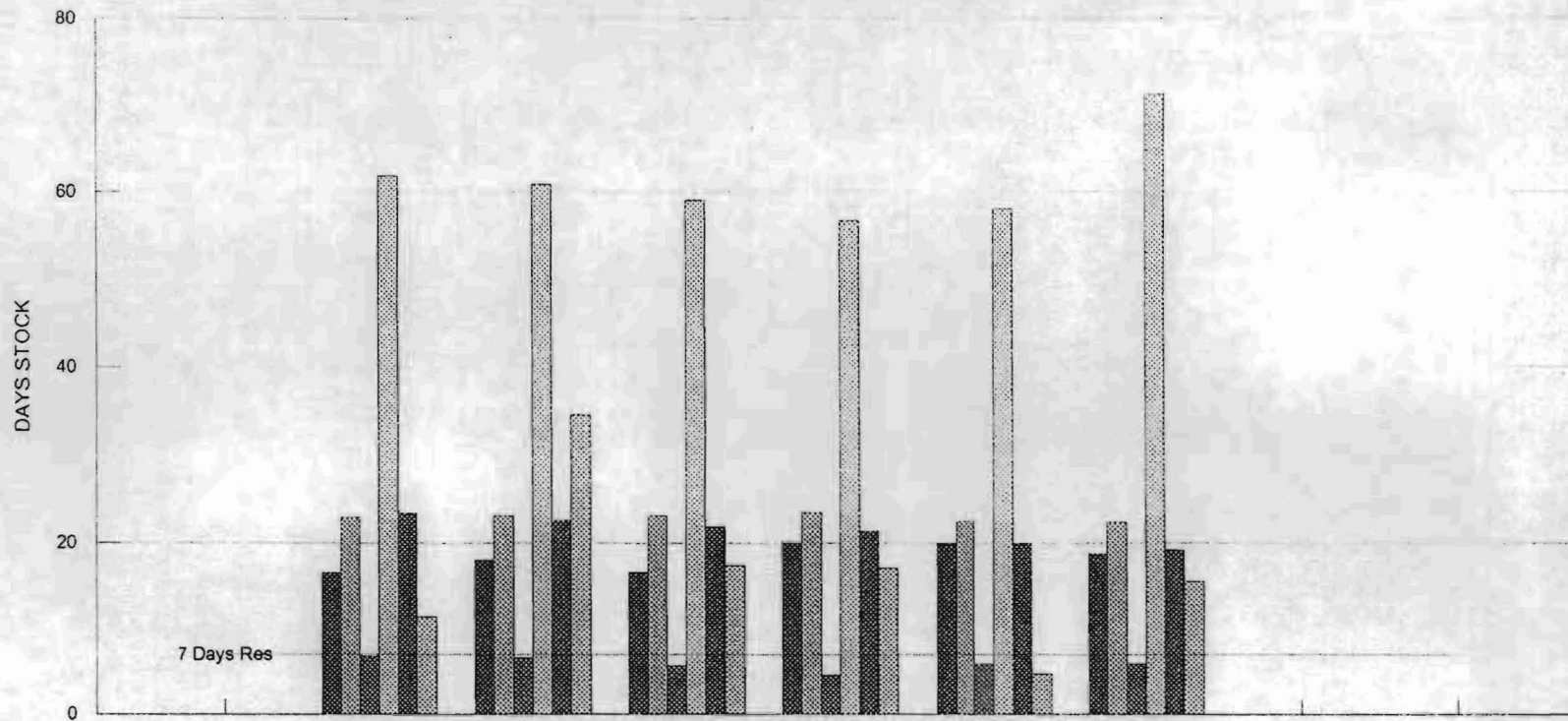



A. IN SECTOR 3 RPA GUARDS REFUSED MILOBS ON PATROL ACCESS TO SEE THE BOURGEMESTRE OF RUSATIRA COMMUNE IN BUTARE PREFECTURE. THE GUARD CLAIMED TO HAVE BEEN SPECIFICALLY ORDERED TO REFUSE ACCESS TO UNAMIR PERSONNEL.

B. ICRC OFFICIALS WERE DENIED ACCESS TO DETENTION CENTRES BY RPA TROOPS IN KIBUYE TOWN EVEN THOUGH THEY PRODUCED ALL THE DOCUMENTS ACCREDITING THEM TO THE PREFECTURE.



WEEKLY SITREP COVERING PERIOD 08 TO 14 JAN 95.

1. HIGHLIGHTS. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS GENERALLY STABLE:

A. IN KIGALI, A UNAMIR HELI AND CREW PLUS PASSENGERS WAS DETAINED FOR 2 HRS 30 MINUTES FROM 1530 HRS LOCAL TIME AT THE AIRPORT FOR FLYING TOO CLOSE TO THE PRESIDENTIAL PALACE IN KIGALI ON 08 JAN 95. THE HELI AND CREW PLUS PASSENGERS WERE HOWEVER RELEASED AT 1800 HRS.

B. IN SECTOR 6, INDBATT REPORTED THAT DURING THE SEARCHES CONDUCTED BY THE RPA IN KIGALI ON 12 JAN 95, APPROX 25 WPNS AND 30 GRENS WERE RECOVERED. IFIED NUMBER OF LOCALS WERE ALSO APPREHENDED.

C. ONE SOURCE IN BUKAVU REPORTED THAT THREE UNIDENTIFIED HELIS WERE OBSERVED FLYING IN AREA WEST AND NORTH OF BUKAVU IN LAST FEW DAYS. IT IS UNKNOWN IF INCREASE IN UNREST IN BORDER AREAS OF ZAIRE WILL HAVE EFFECT ON RWANDA.

2. **POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. **HIGHLIGHTS.** THIS WEEK, UNAMIR CONTINUED TO WORK WITH UNREO TO COORDINATE THE EFFORTS OF UNDP, THE WORLD BANK, DONOR COUNTRIES, AND U.N. AGENCIES IN THE REHABILITATION OF RWANDA THROUGH THE CHANNELS OF RENP, THE TRUST FUND, THE CONSOLIDATED APPEAL AND THE ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE, TO ENCOURAGE POLITICAL RECONCILIATION AND RE-INTEGRATION, TO WORK WITH UNREO AND OTHER AGENCIES IN SUPPORT OF OPERATION RETOUR TO ENCOURAGE AND FACILITATE THE VOLUNTARY AND SAFE RETURN OF DISPLACED PERSONS, AND TO MAKE PROGRESS TOWARDS THE LAUNCHING OF RADIO UNAMIR WHOSE BROADCASTS WILL ENCOURAGE THE RETURN AND RE-INTEGRATION OF DISPLACED PERSONS AS WELL AS PROVIDE HUMANITARIAN INFORMATION AND PROMOTE A CLIMATE OF PEACE AND RECONCILIATION IN RWANDA. IN ADDITION, THE FOLLOWING VISITS AND EVENTS WERE SIGNIFICANT:

(1) ON 11 JANUARY 1995, THE SRSG MET WITH MR. AUGUST HUMMEL, AMBASSADOR OF GERMANY, TO DISCUSS THE ROLE OF THE DONOR COUNTRIES IN THE UPCOMING ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE.

(2) ON 12 JANUARY 1995, THE SRSG MET WITH MR. BERNARD DUSSAULD, SPECIAL ENVOY OF CANADA, TO DISCUSS CANADA'S ROLE IN RWANDA'S DEVELOPMENT AND REHABILITATION. THE SRSG THEN ADDRESSED A MEETING OF NGOS TO INFORM THEM OF DEVELOPMENTS REGARDING SECURITY IN REFUGEE CAMPS, HIS MISSIONS TO ZAIRE AND TANZANIA, THE ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE AND THE GOVERNMENT'S WORKING PROCEDURES FOR NGOS. HE ALSO PRESENTED THE NGOS WITH HIS REVISED RWANDA EMERGENCY NORMALIZATION PLAN (RENP).

(3) ON 13 JANUARY 1995, THE SRSG MET WITH THE RPA LIAISON OFFICER TO DISCUSS, AMONG OTHERS, ISSUES OF SECURITY IN RWANDA. HE HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH MR. CLARENCE AND MR. ESSAIED OF THE UN CENTRE FOR HUMAN RIGHTS REGARDING THE STATUS OF THE FIELD OPERATION. HE THEN HELD CONSULTATIONS WITH MR. SAM NKUSI OF RWANDATEL TO DISCUSS THE ALLOCATION OF FREQUENCIES FOR RADIO UNAMIR AS WELL AS APPROVAL FOR RADIO UNAMIR'S USE OF GOVERNMENT SITES.

(4) ON 14 JANUARY 1995, THE SRSG ATTENDED THE CEREMONY OF THE SIGNING OF THE PROTOCOLE ON RADIO UNAMIR AT THE MINISTRY OF INFORMATION. HE THEN TRAVELLED TO GENEVA IN PREPARATION FOR THE ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE.

B. **RELIEF AND DEVELOPMENT/RENP: THE SRSGS RWANDA EMERGENCY NORMALIZATION PLAN.** THE REVISED RWANDA EMERGENCY NORMALIZATION

PLAN (RENP) WAS PRESENTED ON 12 JANUARY 1995. THE RENP IS NEITHER A COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH TO RWANDA'S SOCIO-ECONOMIC PROBLEMS NOR DOES IT PROVIDE DETAILED PROJECT DATA. IT OUTLINES THE AREAS WHERE EMERGENCY RELIEF IS NEEDED AND SERVES AS A CATALYST TO STIMULATE DONOR ASSISTANCE IN THOSE AREAS. IN THIS CONNECTION, RENP SEEKS MECHANISMS THROUGH WHICH PROJECTS CAN BE IMPLEMENTED QUICKLY AND EFFECTIVELY. THE RENP IS STRUCTURED IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER: INFRASTRUCTURE, ESSENTIAL SERVICES, AND VITAL SOCIO-ECONOMIC NEEDS. THE FOLLOWING ARE PROJECTS REQUIRING URGENT ACTION AND FUNDING:

(1) **HABITAT AND RESETTLEMENT:**

(A) **GOVERNMENT POLICY/ROUNDTABLE.** FOR THE GOVERNMENT, THE MOST URGENT PROBLEM TO RESOLVE IN CONJUNCTION WITH RETURNING REFUGEES AND DISPLACED PERSONS IS THAT OF HOUSING. HABITAT, THE NAIROBI-BASED AGENCY, HAS DEVELOPED A PROJECT WHICH WILL UNDERTAKE THE FOLLOWING:

I. THE REPAIR AND THE REHABILITATION OF GOVERNMENT BUILDINGS;

II. THE CLEANSING AND THE RE-ESTABLISHMENT OF THE WASTE COLLECTION AND WASTE DISPOSAL MECHANISMS IN KIGALI;

III. THE CONSTRUCTION OF 500 HOUSING UNITS IN KIGALI FOR THE GENERAL PUBLIC (WHICH WILL SERVE AS A PILOT PROJECT WHICH CAN THEN BE DUPLICATED IN OTHER URBAN CENTRES OF THE COUNTRY).

(B) **CURRENT ACTIVITY.** THE PROGRAMME DOCUMENT ENTITLED "EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME FOR THE REHABILITATION AND RECONSTRUCTION OF THE CITY OF KIGALI AND OTHER URBAN CENTRES" WAS SIGNED ON 14 DECEMBER 1994 BY THE MINISTER OF PLANNING, UNDP AND HABITAT. US \$1 MILLION OF THE US \$5 MILLION DUTCH CONTRIBUTION TO THE TRUST FUND HAS THUS BEEN RELEASED TO FINANCE THIS PROJECT. FURTHERMORE, SINCE AN EXPANSION OF THIS PROJECT IS ESSENTIAL (\$1 MILLION USD IS LARGELY INSUFFICIENT), THE CONCERNED PARTIES INCLUDING UNDP, UNREO, UNAMIR AND THE MINISTER OF PLANNING, HAVE AGREED THAT ADDITIONAL FUNDS FROM THE TRUST FUND WILL BE MADE AVAILABLE AS FOLLOWS:

I. \$1 MILLION FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF ADDITIONAL HOUSING UNITS FOR RETURNEES (AS AN EXPANSION OF THE HABITAT PROJECT); AND

II. \$1 MILLION FOR THE REPARATION OF PUBLIC BUILDINGS (AS AN EXPANSION OF THE HABITAT PROJECT).

(2) **GENDARMERIE AND COMMUNAL POLICE**. FOLLOWING THE BELGIAN TRADITION, RWANDA HAS A NATIONAL GENDARMERIE FORCE UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE MINISTRY OF DEFENCE. IN ADDITION, RWANDA HAS COMMUNAL POLICE WHICH HAVE LOCAL JURISDICTION AND ARE ATTACHED TO THE MINISTRY OF INTERIOR.

(A) **GENDARMERIE**

I. THE UNAMIR CIVPOL UNIT HAS BEGUN A CONDENSED AND ACCELERATED TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR THE GENDARMERIE. THE FIRST CLASS OF 102 GENDARMES, WHO WERE TRAINED BY THE UNAMIR CIVPOL UNIT AND WHO GRADUATED IN EARLY NOVEMBER, HAVE BEEN DEPLOYED IN BRIGADES THROUGHOUT RWANDA.

II. THE UNAMIR CIVPOL UNIT HAS BEGUN THE SECOND ROUND OF TRAINING AT THE ECOLE DE LA GENDARMERIE NATIONALE IN RUHENGERI. THE NEW CANDIDATES NUMBER FOUR HUNDRED, ONE HUNDRED OF WHOM WILL BE TRAINED AS INSTRUCTORS. PRELIMINARY EXAMS BEGAN ON 12 DECEMBER WITH THE OBJECTIVE OF DETERMINING THE LEVEL AND CLASS OF EACH STUDENT.

III. THE GOVERNMENT HAS REQUESTED THE TRAINING OF 6,000 GENDARMES, WHICH CORRESPONDS TO THE NUMBER MANDATED BY THE ARUSHA PEACE ACCORDS. THERE IS THUS A CRITICAL NEED TO PROVIDE THE NECESSARY HUMAN AND FINANCIAL RESOURCES IN ORDER TO TRAIN AND EQUIP THE NUMBER OF GENDARMES REQUESTED BY THE GOVERNMENT.

(B) **COMMUNAL POLICE**: IN THE CASE OF THE COMMUNAL POLICE, THE GOVERNMENT HAS REQUESTED THE TRAINING OF TEN POLICE OFFICERS PER COMMUNE. UNAMIR CIVPOL'S TRAINING PROGRAMME, WHICH HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE GOVERNMENT, WAS SCHEDULED TO BEGIN IN MID-JANUARY, HOWEVER, CIVPOL STILL LACKS THE RESOURCES REQUIRED TO ACCOMPLISH THIS TASK.

(3) **JUDICIAL SERVICES: REHABILITATION OF THE JUDICIAL SYSTEM**.

(A) **CURRENT SITUATION**. OUT OF APPROXIMATELY 800 MAGISTRATES IN RWANDA BEFORE APRIL 1994, ONLY 300 REMAIN. TO COMPOUND THIS PROBLEM, THE SLOWNESS

WITH WHICH CASES ARE PROCESSED WILL BE ACCENTUATED BY THE LARGE NUMBER OF CASES OF PERSONS ACCUSED OF GENOCIDE AND BY THE POTENTIAL DISPUTES LINKED TO THE PROBLEM OF THE OCCUPATION OF HOUSES AND LAND BY FORMER REFUGEES WHO ARE RETURNING TO THE COUNTRY. IN RESPONSE TO THIS SITUATION, THE GOVERNMENT HAS ESTABLISHED THE FOLLOWING FOUR OBJECTIVES:

I. TO REORGANIZE THE JUDICIARY BRANCH OF GOVERNMENT.

II. TO BRING TO JUSTICE THE ALLEGED PERPETRATORS OF GENOCIDE.

III. TO CONDUCT LAW REFORM.

IV. TO RESTORE THE SECURITY SYSTEM.

(B) THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS HAVE ALREADY BEEN TAKEN WITHIN THE FRAMEWORK OF THE AFOREMENTIONED OBJECTIVES:

I. THE REOPENING OF THE JUDICIAL SERVICE AND THE PROSECUTION DEPARTMENT OF THE SUPREME COURT.

II. THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A COMMISSION ON LEGISLATION.

III. THE ARREST OF 7,000 PERSONS ACCUSED OF PARTICIPATING IN THE GENOCIDE (THEIR CONDITIONS OF DETENTION ARE BEING MONITORED BY, AMONG OTHERS, THE RED CROSS AND THE WORLD FOOD PROGRAMME).

(C) **THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA**

I. ON 19 AND 20 DECEMBER 1994, THE PROSECUTOR OF THE INTERNATIONAL CRIMINAL TRIBUNAL FOR RWANDA, JUSTICE R.J. GOLDSTONE, VISITED RWANDA AND HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE SRSG AND WITH SENIOR MEMBERS OF THE GOVERNMENT INCLUDING THE PRESIDENT, THE PRIME MINISTER, THE MINISTER OF JUSTICE AND THE MINISTER OF INTERIOR. HE ALSO MET WITH REPRESENTATIVES OF OTHER UNITED NATIONS AGENCIES AND NGOS OPERATING IN RWANDA.

II. DURING HIS VISIT, JUDGE GOLDSTONE ANNOUNCED THAT HE INTENDED TO OPEN THE OFFICE OF THE PROSECUTOR IN KIGALI IN JANUARY 1995.

III. ON 12 JANUARY 1995, MR. HONORÉ RAKOTOMANANA WAS APPOINTED AS THE DEPUTY PROSECUTOR DIRECTLY RESPONSIBLE FOR RWANDA. FORMAL INVESTIGATION OF THE ACTS OF GENOCIDE AND OTHER VIOLATIONS OF INTERNATIONAL HUMANITARIAN LAW COMMITTED DURING THE CIVIL WAR SHOULD BE UNDERTAKEN AS A MATTER OF PRIORITY IN ORDER TO PREPARE INDICTMENTS FOR TRIAL BY THE TRIBUNAL.

IV. THE PROSECUTOR HAS INDICATED THAT HIS OFFICE WILL CONCENTRATE ON PROSECUTING THE LEADERS WHO PLANNED AND DIRECTED THE GENOCIDE AND OTHER WAR CRIMES IN RWANDA WITHIN THE PERIOD OF THE TRIBUNAL'S JURISDICTION, I.E., 1 JANUARY TO 31 DECEMBER 1994. ALL OTHER CRIMES WILL BE PROSECUTED BY THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA WITHIN ITS SOVEREIGN JURISDICTION. THIS DELINEATION OF RESPONSIBILITY WILL PREVENT CONFLICTS OF JURISDICTION BETWEEN THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL AND THE COURTS OF RWANDA.

V. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT IT WILL BE RELATIVELY DIFFICULT FOR THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT TO EXTRADITE SUSPECTS, EVEN IN CASES WHERE AN EXTRADITION TREATY EXISTS BETWEEN THE TWO STATES. IN CONTRAST, ALL STATES HAVE AN OBLIGATION, UNDER THE STATUTE OF THE TRIBUNAL, TO ARREST AND SURRENDER SUSPECTS FOR TRIAL BY THE TRIBUNAL ON THE ISSUANCE OF AN INDICTMENT.

VI. THE GOVERNMENT HAS EXPRESSED ITS SUPPORT FOR JUDGE GOLDSTONE'S EFFORTS AND HAS ALSO REITERATED ITS APPEAL FOR URGENT INTERNATIONAL ASSISTANCE TO REHABILITATE ITS LAW ENFORCEMENT AND JUDICIAL MACHINERY SO THAT IT WILL BE ABLE TO CARRY OUT ITS OWN INVESTIGATIONS AND TRIALS.

VII. PREPARATIONS CONTINUE FOR THE ELECTION OR APPOINTMENT OF THE JUDGES OF THE TRIBUNAL, FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF ITS HEADQUARTERS (AT A VENUE YET TO BE DECIDED), AND FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF REGISTRY AND OTHER ADMINISTRATIVE PERSONNEL. THESE PREPARATIONS SHOULD, OF COURSE, BE COMPLETED BY THE TIME THE PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE IS READY TO PRESENT THE FIRST SET OF INDICTMENTS FOR REVIEW AND TRIAL BY THE TRIBUNAL.

C. **POLITICAL RECONCILIATION/RE-INTEGRATION:** THE GOVERNMENT CONTINUES TO PERSIST IN STEPS TOWARD RECONCILIATION AND RE-INTEGRATION, AND UNAMIR HAS ENCOURAGED THE GOVERNMENT TO MAKE THEIR EFFORTS KNOWN:

(1) THE GAKO RE-TRAINING CAMP, WHICH RE-INTEGRATES EX-RGF ELEMENTS INTO THE NATIONAL ARMY, CONTINUES TO OPERATE.

(2) THE MINISTRY OF REHABILITATION HAS ALLOWED UNREO AND THE OTHER AGENCIES AND NGOS PARTICIPATING IN OPERATION RETOUR TO SET UP THE INTEGRATED OPERATIONS CENTRE (IOC) ON THE MINISTRY'S PREMISES. IN ADDITION, THE GOVERNMENT CONTINUES TO COOPERATE, THROUGH THE MINISTER OF REHABILITATION, WITH ALL ELEMENTS OF THE OPERATION.

(3) THE TRANSITIONAL NATIONAL ASSEMBLY (TNA) CONTINUES TO MEET REGULARLY IN THE CONSEIL NATIONAL POUR LE DEVELOPMENT (CND).

D. **OPERATION RETOUR** OPERATION RETOUR, THE INTER-AGENCY INITIATIVE TO ENCOURAGE THE VOLUNTARY AND SAFE RETURN AND SETTLEMENT OF INTERNALLY DISPLACED PERSONS (IDPS), WAS LAUNCHED ON 29 DECEMBER 1994. THUS FAR, 10,283 OF THE ESTIMATED 250,000 IDPS IN SECTOR 4 HAVE BEEN TRANSPORTED OUT OF THE CAMPS. THIS REPRESENTS AN AVERAGE OF APPROXIMATELY 600 PER DAY.

(1) THE 24-HOUR INTEGRATED OPERATIONS CENTRE (IOC), WHOSE FUNCTION IS TO COLLECT INFORMATION, TO PROVIDE INFORMATION TO RETURNEES AND TO PROVIDE AID RESOURCES TO RETURNEES, IS BEING MANNED BY PERSONNEL FROM UN AGENCIES AND NGOS. UNREO, ALONG WITH OTHER AGENCIES, HAS IDENTIFIED TWELVE OPEN RELIEF CENTRES (ORCS) IN SOUTH KIGALI, GITARAMA AND OTHER AREAS IN SECTOR 3.

(2) OPERATION RETOUR CONTINUES TO BE ADVERSELY AFFECTED BY RUMOURS AND INTIMIDATION WITHIN THE CAMPS AND BY APPREHENSION AND UNCERTAINTY ABOUT THE GENERAL SECURITY AND LAW AND ORDER SITUATION IN RWANDA. UNREO IS INTENSIFYING ITS INFORMATION CAMPAIGN, HOWEVER, THE GOVERNMENT MUST MAKE GREATER EFFORTS TO ENSURE SECURITY AND TO REASSURE THE POPULATION.

E. **RADIO UNAMIR:**

(1) ON SATURDAY, 14 JANUARY 1995, A CONVENTION WAS SIGNED BETWEEN UNAMIR AND THE GOVERNMENT OF RWANDA AUTHORIZING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A UNITED NATIONS RADIO STATION. ONCE FINAL TECHNICAL ARRANGEMENTS BETWEEN UNAMIR AND THE GOVERNMENT ARE COMPLETED, INCLUDING THE ISSUANCE OF FREQUENCIES, THE STATION IS EXPECTED TO BEGIN

BROADCASTING IN A MATTER OF DAYS.

(2) AT THE PRESENT TIME, CONTAINERIZED FM RADIO BROADCAST TRANSMITTERS ARE IN PLACE AT FOUR LOCATIONS IN RWANDA, KIGALI, KIBUNGO, GIKONGORO, AND BYUMBA. LICENSING MUST BE COMPLETED BEFORE THEY CAN BE TURNED ON FOR TESTING AND FINAL ADJUSTMENT. THIS IS EXPECTED TO TAKE SEVERAL DAYS PER SITE.

(3) A FIFTH TRANSMITTER IS TO BE LOCATED ON TOP OF MT. KARONGI AND WILL PROVIDE RADIO UNAMIR COVERAGE OF THE REFUGEE CAMPS IN ZAIRE. UNAMIR IS AWAITING GOVERNMENT APPROVAL TO PLACE THE TRANSMITTER AT THIS SITE.

(4) ON 12 DECEMBER 1994, PROFESSIONAL STUDIO EQUIPMENT ARRIVED FROM UN RADIO/NEW YORK AND WAS PLACED IN OPERATION THE FOLLOWING DAY. THE EQUIPMENT IS ON LOAN TO UNAMIR AND IS TO TAKE THE PLACE OF THE REMOTE BROADCAST VAN WHICH WAS TO HAVE BEEN SENT TO THE MISSION FROM THE USA IN OCTOBER BUT WHICH, BECAUSE OF ADMINISTRATIVE DELAYS, IS NOT EXPECTED TO ARRIVE IN KIGALI FOR AT LEAST TWO MORE MONTHS.

(5) ON 8 DECEMBER, 1994, UNAMIR WAS NOTIFIED BY UNOSOM THAT CERTAIN STUDIO EQUIPMENT WOULD BE AVAILABLE FOR ITS USE. ON 9 DECEMBER, UNAMIR REQUESTED THAT THE EQUIPMENT BE LISTED AS AVAILABLE. ON 16 DECEMBER 1994, UNAMIR WAS NOTIFIED THAT THE ABOVE EQUIPMENT WAS STILL IN USE AND WAS THEREFORE NOT AVAILABLE. AS RADIO UNAMIR CURRENTLY HAS ONLY ONE OPERATING STUDIO, THE ESSENTIAL ADDITIONAL EQUIPMENT HAS BEEN REQUESTED FROM UN RADIO/NY.

(6) RADIO UNAMIR CURRENTLY HAS A STAFF OF EIGHT, FOUR INTERNATIONAL AND FOUR LOCAL. IT WAS HOPED THAT SOME RECORDED PROGRAMMING IN FRENCH AND ENGLISH COULD BE OBTAINED FROM OTHER UN AGENCIES (UNESCO, WHO, UNDP, ETC.), HOWEVER, INQUIRIES THUS FAR HAVE YIELDED LITTLE RESPONSE. IT APPEARS, THEREFORE, THAT ALMOST ALL PROGRAMMING WILL HAVE TO BE GENERATED BY THE STATION STAFF. IN ORDER TO PRODUCE TWO HOURS OF INFORMATIONAL PROGRAMMING PER DAY, UNAMIR WILL REQUIRE A STAFF OF NINETEEN. RADIO UNAMIR AWAITS APPROVAL OF ITS STAFFING AND BUDGET REQUESTS.

F. **ANALYSIS.** THERE ARE SEVERAL RECENT DEVELOPMENTS/EVENTS WHICH ARE CAUSE FOR CONCERN AND/OR WHOSE SUCCESS OR FAILURE HAVE THE POTENTIAL TO PRODUCE POSITIVE OR NEGATIVE RESULTS:

(1) **RADIO UNAMIR.** IF RADIO UNAMIR IS GRANTED A FREQUENCY BY THE GOVERNMENT, IT WILL BE ABLE TO BEGIN BROADCASTING. RADIO UNAMIR COULD POTENTIALLY HAVE A VERY POSITIVE EFFECT ON EFFORTS TO FACILITATE THE RETURN OF

BOTH REFUGEES AND DISPLACED PERSONS, AS WELL AS ON QUESTIONS OF NATIONAL RECONCILIATION AND THE RESPECT OF HUMAN RIGHTS.

(2) **RE-ESTABLISHMENT OF FULL DIPLOMATIC RELATIONS WITH FRANCE.** FRANCE HAS NAMED MR. JACQUES COURBIN, THE FORMER CHEF DE L'ANTENNE DIPLOMATIQUE, AS ITS NEW AMBASSADOR TO RWANDA. THIS RAPPROCHEMENT CAN ONLY BE SEEN AS A POSITIVE SIGN, AND IT IS HOPED THAT FRANCE WILL PLAY A CONSTRUCTIVE ROLE BOTH IN RWANDA'S REHABILITATION AND IN ITS NATIONAL RECONCILIATION PROCESS.

(3) **ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE/WORLD BANK/EUROPEAN UNION ASSISTANCE.** THE ROUND TABLE CONFERENCE, SCHEDULED TO TAKE PLACE ON 18-19 JANUARY IN GENEVA, REPRESENTS AN IMPORTANT OPPORTUNITY FOR THE GOVERNMENT NOT ONLY TO PRESENT ITS \$764.1 MILLION PLAN FOR REHABILITATION, BUT ALSO TO PRESENT ITSELF AS A STABLE AND UNITED BODY DEDICATED TO THE ADVANCEMENT OF RWANDA. ACCORDING TO UNDP, OVER 250 UNILATERAL AND MULTILATERAL DONORS WILL PARTICIPATE. IT IS HOPED THAT DONORS WILL CONSIDER PROVIDING ASSISTANCE VIA THE TRUST FUND, AS THIS REPRESENTS AN EFFECTIVE AND NON-BUREAUCRATIC CHANNEL FOR LAUNCHING REHABILITATION PROJECTS. THE WORLD BANK ANNOUNCED ON RADIO RWANDA THAT IT WILL DELIVER AN EMERGENCY LOAN OF \$50 MILLION USD TO THE RWANDAN GOVERNMENT UPON RECEIPT OF PAYMENT OF RWANDA'S \$7 MILLION USD IN ARREARS TO THE BANK. SEVERAL DONORS HAVE MADE STATEMENTS INDICATING THAT THEY ARE WILLING TO PAY THE ARREARS, HOWEVER, THE PAYMENT HAS NOT YET BEEN MADE.

(4) **KIRAMBO INCIDENT.** THE KIRAMBO INCIDENT INDICATES GROWING INSECURITY AND POTENTIAL CONFLICT WITH EX-RGF ELEMENTS IN THE AREA OF IJWI ISLAND AND CYANGUGU. WHILE THERE IS NO CAUSE FOR ALARM AT THIS POINT IN TIME, THE SITUATION MUST BE MONITORED CLOSELY.

(5) **OPERATION RETOUR.** THE SUCCESS OF THIS OPERATION WILL BE AN IMPORTANT INDICATOR OF THE CONFIDENCE OF THE DISPLACED POPULATION IN THE CURRENT GOVERNMENT. THE GOVERNMENT SHOULD MAKE EVERY EFFORT TO INSTILL CONFIDENCE IN THE POPULATION, ESPECIALLY REGARDING THE RESPECT OF HUMAN RIGHTS AND THE QUESTION OF PRIVATE PROPERTY/LAND TENURE.

3. **MILITARY**

A. **FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES**

(1) **RPA.**

(A) IN SECTOR 4C, ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA

SOLDIERS SHOT AND KILLED A 42 YR OLD MAN IN RUGARAGIA GR 8239 IN HIS HOUSE WHEN HE REFUSED TO OPEN THE DOOR TO HIS ROOM FOR HIS ARREST. THE MAN WAS ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN AN AGITATOR IN A REFUGEE CAMP IN ZAIRE. IN ANOTHER INCIDENT IN KAZUNGU GR 8434, AN RPA SOLDIER ROBBED A MAN OF 2,000 RWANDESE FRANCS AND THEN KILLED HIM.

(B) IN SECTOR 4A SOUTH, GHANBATT REPORTED THAT SOME RPA SOLDIERS CAME TO THE NEW DP CAMP SITE AT RUNYOMBI GR 4792 TO QUESTION THE ERECTION OF TENTAGE FOR THE DPs. THEY ORDERED THE GHANBATT TPS TO STOP. WHEN THE OC QUESTIONED THEIR REASONS, THE RPA COMD SAID "MILLIONS OF PEOPLE HAVE DIED IN RWANDA AND SO IF ONE PERSON DIES, IT DOES NOT MEAN THAT THE HEAVENS SHOULD COME DOWN".

(C) BANDITS PERIODICALLY EXCHANGED FIRE DURING A 2 HOUR PERIOD WITH RPA TROOPS AT KIRAMBO GR 033455 IN SECTOR 4C AT 0100 HRS ON 10 JAN 95 ON THE SHORES OF LAKE KIVU. ABOUT 50 BANDITS CROSSED THE LAKE IN THREE BOATS AND TRIED TO HOLD UP 20 FISHERMEN. THE BANDITS OPENED FIRE ON THE FISHERMEN WHEN THE LATTER JUMPED INTO THE WATER; RPA TROOPS THEN EXCHANGED FIRE WITH THE BANDITS AND FORCED THEM TO WITHDRAW. THE BANDITS ABDUCTED 6 OF THE FISHERMEN WHICH WERE LATER RELEASED.

(D) RPA TROOPS IN MUTURA AND MUTOVU IN SECTOR 5 ARE REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED ONE INDIVIDUAL AND KILLED ANOTHER FOR HAVING CHANGED TOO MUCH MONEY DURING THE RECENT CURRENCY EXCHANGE EXERCISE.

(2) **FRGF** LOCALS IN SECTOR 4C IDENTIFIED SOME OF THE ARMED ELMS WHO HAVE TAKEN PART IN ACTS OF BANDITRY IN THE SECTOR, AS BELONGING TO FORMER RGF.

(3) **MILITIA** NTR.

B. **OWN ACTIVITIES**

(1) **UNAMIR**

(A) THE FC RECEIVED THE VISIT OF CANADIAN CDS ON SUNDAY 9 JAN 95 AND DISCUSSED THE CURRENT AND FUTURE PARTICIPATION OF CANADIAN TROOPS WITH UNAMIR. HE ALSO HAD THE VISIT OF MR. URASSA FROM UNHCR TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON REFUGEE REPATRIATION.

(B) THE FC MET THE SRSG AND DISCUSSED THE FC'S VISIT TO IDP CAMPS ON 12 JAN 95. HE ALSO MET THE

RPA LO IN REGARDS TO CIVILIAN ADMINISTRATIVE SUPPORT. HE LATER MET THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR TO DISCUSS CURRENT SITUATION IN RWANDA.

(C) A TOTAL OF 8,925 DPs HAVE SO FAR BEEN MOVED FROM CYANIKA CAMP TO THEIR RESPECTIVE COMMUNES SINCE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE OPERATION RETOUR.

(2) SECTOR 1 (NICOY).

(A) EVAC 338 DPs FROM KAGITUMBA GR 504822 TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

(B) PROVIDED MED ASSISTANCE TO A TOTAL OF 438 LOCALS.

(3) SECTOR 2 (GHANBATT). AS REPORTED UNDER GHANBATT.

(4) SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY).

(A) PTLs SENT TO RAMBA REPORTED THAT LOCALS FACING SHORTAGE OF FOOD. RELIEF AGENCIES OPERATING IN THE AREA INFORMED.

(B) TREATED A TOTAL OF 79 LOCAL PATIENTS.

(5) SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT

(A) LOCALS AT KABERE II GR 0351 RAN AWAY AS GHANBATT PTL TEAM APPROACHED THE TOWN DUE TO REPORTED RPA HARASSMENT. THE PTL REASSURED THE LOCALS AND INFORMED THEM THAT THERE WOULD BE REGULAR UNAMIR PTLs IN THE AREA.

(B) GHANBATT TPS AT GISHALI GR 4788 DONATED FOOD STUFF TO IDPs AT KYIKAYA GR 575894 IN KANYONZA COMMUNE. 63 IDPs HAVE LEFT SAKE ORC FOR THEIR VARIOUS HOMES.

(C) TREATED A TOTAL OF 147 LOCAL PATIENTS.

(6) SECTOR 4A NORTH (ZAMBATT).

(A) PROVIDED SECURITY DURING THE EVAC OF DPs FROM CYANIKA DP CAMP.

(B) SUB PREFECT AND BOURGMESTERS FROM THE SECTOR ADDRESSED IDPs AT CYANIKA DP CAMP URGING THEM TO RETURN HOME AND ASSURED THEM OF THEIR SY IN THEIR HOME COMMUNES.

(C) TREATED A TOTAL OF 410 LOCAL PATIENTS.

- (7) **SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT).**
- (A) CONDUCTED PTLs, ESCORTS AND GUARD DUTIES IN AOR.
- (B) TREATED A TOTAL OF 133 LOCAL PATIENTS.

- (A) REINFORCED TROOPS IN KIRAMBO, GAFUNZO AND NYAMASHEKE.
- (B) ESCORTED UNHCR CONVOYS OF 492 IDPs FROM NYAGATARE TRANSIT CAMP TO KITABI.
- (C) TRANSPORTED 131 REFUGEES FROM RUSIZI - 1 GR 7624 TO NYAGATARE DURING THE WEEK.
- (D) PROVIDED MED ASSISTANCE TO 81 LOCAL PATIENTS.
- (9) **SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT).**
- (A) PATROLS TO NYABIRENE GR 4623 AND KAREBA GR 4223, HAVE REPORTED THAT THE RETURNEES IN THE MENTIONED AREAS HAVE COMPLAINED THAT THEIR HOUSES HAD BEEN OCCUPIED BY OTHER RETURNEES WHO WERE SUPPORTED BY RPA SOLDIERS.
- (B) PROVIDED MED TREATMENT TO A TOTAL OF 1,230 LOCALS.
- (10) **SECTOR 6 (INDBATT).**
- (A) 1,847 IDPs FROM NDERA CAMP WERE EVAC TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES BY UNHCR DURING THE WEEK.
- (B) REGIMENTAL MEDICAL OFFICER TREATED A TOTAL OF 1,841 CIVIL PATIENTS AT INDBATT CLINIC.
- (11) **MILOB GP HQ.** PLANNED, COORDINATED AND MONITORED MILOBS ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS.
- (A) **POLITICAL.** A LARGE SEGMENT OF THE POPULATION IS REPORTED TO BE STILL HOLDING LARGE AMOUNTS OF OLD CURRENCY. THEY WERE UNABLE TO CHANGE THEM DURING THE CURRENCY EXCHANGE EXERCISE.

(E) IN SECTOR 3 - GITARAMA.

I. MILOBS PATROLS TO MUSHUBATI COMMUNE WERE INFORMED THAT THE PRESENT POPULATION OF THE COMMUNE WAS ESTIMATED TO ABOUT 54,000 AS OPPOSED TO 676,000 BEFORE THE WAR.

II. PTLs TO NYANZA AND MBUYE VISITED PRISONS IN THE MENTIONED LOCS AND FOUND A TOTAL OF 19 DETAINEES ALLEGED TO BE FORMER MILITIA (NYANZA 2 AND MBUYE 17). HUMAN RIGHTS AND ICRC INFO.

(F) IN SECTOR 4A - GIKONGORO. MILOBS PTL DP CAMPS AT KARAMBO, NYAMAGYINA, KIBEHO, NDAGO, RUKONDO AND CYANIKA CAMPS AS PART OF OP RETOUR AND MONITORED THE EVAC OF IDPs FROM CYANIKA AND RUKONDO TO OTHER PREFECTURES. RPA PROVIDED ESCORTS FOR IDPs CONVOYS. DPs AT KIBEHO WERE RELUCTANT TO LEAVE THE CAMP FOR SECURITY REASONS.

(G) IN SECTOR 4B - KIBUYE.

I. HOSP IN MABANZA COMMUNE IS REPORTED TO BE RUNNING OUT OF DRUGS FOR THE TREATMENT OF TUBERCULOSIS.

II. MILOBS ESCORTED HUMAN RIGHTS MONITORS TO KIBUYE, GISHYITA GR 2161, MUBUGU GR 2463, RWAMATAMU GR 1656 AND BIRAMBO GR 4763 TO GATHER INFORMATION ON PRISONS AND DETAINED PERSONS. THEY WERE HOWEVER REFUSED ACCESS INTO THE PRISON AT BIRAMBO. PRISON OFFICIALS REQUESTED THEM TO SEEK CLEARANCE FROM THE KIBUYE PREFECT.

(H) IN SECTOR 4C - CYANGUGU. CONDUCTED PTLs IN SECTOR. TWO EMPLOYEES OF CARE SUSTAINED INJURIES

WHEN SOME UNIFORMED BANDITS FIRED INDISCRIMINATELY ON THEIR HOUSE IN BUKAVO.

(I) IN SECTOR 5 - GISENYI.

I. CANADIAN CDS AND ENTOURAGE VISITED THE SECTOR HQ. THE CDS ALSO VISITED THE DP CAMPS AND REFUGEE PROCESSING CENTRES IN GISENYI.

II. SECTOR MILOBS INVESTIGATED A REPORT OF A MASS GRAVE WHICH WAS DISCOVERED BY TUNBATT AT KUKARIMA. MILOBS ASSESSED THAT THE BODIES WERE BURIED IN MAY 94.

(J) IN SECTOR 6 - KIGALI. PTLs MONITORED THE SIT IN KIGALI CITY DURING RPA CORDON AND SEARCH OPS WHICH STARTED AT DAWN AND ENDED AT ABOUT 1200 HRS ON 12 JAN 95 THE PURPOSE OF THE SEARCH WAS TO RETRIEVE WPNS AND UNIFORMS FROM RPA SOLDIERS WHO HAD DESERTED BECAUSE THEY WERE TO BE POSTED OUT OF KIGALI. SHOPS WERE CLOSED AND COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES CEASED DURING THE PERIOD OF THE OP.

(12) AUSMED THE SPT FORCE PROVIDED MEDICAL SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(A) AUS FORCE AT CHK TREATED A TOTAL OF 405 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 62 DENTAL PATIENTS DURING THE PERIOD.

(B) MED SCREENING TEAM AND PROTECTIVE ELM VISITED CYANIKA AND RUKONDO CAMPS IN SUPPORT OF RETOUR. 281 IDPs WERE SCREENED DURING THE WEEK.

(13) 1 CDHSR. LINEMEN ASSISTED FD SVC TECHS TO INSTALL V-SAT TERMINAL AT SECTOR 2 HQ KIBUNGO. INFO SECTION TP INSTALLED INMARSAT AT UNHQ KIGALI AND TAC HQ BUTARE. THE CANADIAN SIGNALS REGIMENT CONTINUED PREPARATIONS TO DEPART TO CANADA.

(14) AIR OPS.

(A) THE SITUATION AT THE AIRPORT REMAINED CALM WITH NORMAL UNAMIR COMMERCIAL FLIGHTS IN OP. RPA CONTINUES TO MAINTAIN SECURITY IN AND AROUND THE AIRPORT.

(B) A TOTAL OF 55 FLIGHTS ARRIVED AND DEPARTED KIA DURING THE PERIOD.

(15) UN MP COY. ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED IN THE KIGALI AREA AND SECURITY SITUATION WAS NORMAL.

4. **UNCIVPOL** CIVPOL OBSERVER TEAM IN SECTOR 4C HAVE INVESTIGATED A REPORT OF TUTSI HARASSMENT OF HUTUS AT NYAKAREKARE IN NYAMABUYE COMMUNE. THE TEAM HAS CONFIRMED THROUGH COUNCILLOR OF THE AREA THAT ON 10 JAN 95, SEVENTEEN PEOPLE (HUTUS) WERE ARRESTED FOR TAKING PART IN ATROCITIES COMMITTED DURING THE WAR. THE DETAINEES WERE REPORTED TO BE STARVING.

A. HAC VISITED SAKA AND GASHORA COMMUNES WITH UNREO REPS TO CONFIRM SECURITY AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE TO THE COMMUNES IN SUPPORT OF OP RETOUR.

B. CHAO ACCOMPANIED UNREO REPS TO BUTARE TO DISCUSS STRATEGIES FOR IMPROVING OP RETOUR.

6. **CIVIL AFFAIRS**. NTR.

7. **LOGISTICS**. ADCOS SP VISITED THE CONTINGENTS ON 14-15 JAN 95 TO IDENTIFY THE LOGISTIC PROBLEMS. PROMINENTS AMONG THE PROBLEMS PRESENTED ARE TRANSPORT AND SPARE PARTS. THERE IS THE NEED FOR UNHQ TO ADDRESS THE SHORTAGE OF SPARE PARTS IN THE MISSION TO ENABLE THE CONTINGENTS CARRY OUT REPAIRS OF THEIR VEHICLES.

A. **FOOD**

(1) THE RESUPPLY OF FRESH RATIONS TO FRAFATT ROAD CONTINUES. THE ROAD IS STILL DIFFICULT TO NEGOTIATE AND IS NOT RELIABLE, BUT ROAD WORKS ARE IMPROVING IT. ACCESS BY BARGE SHOULD STILL BE PURSUED.

B. **TRANSPORT**

(1) SHORTAGE OF VEHICLE CONTINUES TO BE A PROBLEM IN THE MISSION AREA, IT IS HOWEVER HOPED THAT VEHICLES DUE TO ARRIVE FROM UNOSOM WILL IMPROVE THE SITUATION.

(2) **MATERIAL HANDLING EQUIPMENT** (MHE). AS REPORTED PREVIOUSLY.

(3) **BUSES**. AS REPORTED PREVIOUSLY.

(4) **FUEL TANKERS**. UNAMIR HAS ONLY ONE BULK FUEL TANKER (VOLVO, CAPACITY 12500 LTRS). THIS FUEL TANKER IS UNSERVICEABLE SINCE 11 JAN 95 DUE TO NON AVAILABILITY OF SPARE PARTS. THE NON AVAILABILITY OF THIS VEHICLE HAS DISRUPTED THE SUPPLY OF BULK FUEL TO THE CONTINGENTS. STEPS HAVE BEEN INITIATED FOR PROVISION OF THE REQUISITE SPARE PARTS. THE POSSIBILITY OF HIRING OF A SIMILAR VEHICLE LOCALLY IS BEING EXAMINED.

C. **MAINTENANCE**. AS REPORTED PREVIOUSLY.

8. **CASUALTIES.** NTR.

9. **TRAFFIC ACCIDENTS.** A TOTAL OF 5 ACCIDENTS INVOLVING UNAMIR VEHs WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD.

10. **CONCLUSION.** THE GENERAL SITUATION IN RWANDA REMAINED UNDER CONTROL. THE MOMENTUM OF OP RETOUR CONTINUED TO BE LOW EVEN THOUGH PTLs AND SECURITY DUTIES IN THE HOME COMMUNES HAVE BEEN INTENSIFIED BY UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE BY NGOS INCREASED. MOST IDPs WERE JUST RELUCTANT TO GO BACK HOME.

A. IN SECTOR 3, MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE BOURGMESTRE OF MUYAGA COMMUNE GR 9026 INFORMED THEM OF THE PRESENCE OF 3 MASS GRAVES CONTAINING ABOUT 5,000 CORPSES IN THE COMMUNE. THE GRAVES DATE BACK TO THE PERIOD OF THE WAR.

B. TUNBATT REPORTED THAT BANDITS FROM ACROSS THE RWANDESE BORDER WITH ZAIRE, CONTINUE TO ATTEMPT TO RUSTLE CATTLE IN MUTOVU GR 2929. LAST NIGHT SOME OF THE BANDITS WERE INTERCEPTED BY RPA SOLDIERS. THEY HOWEVER FLED LEAVING BEHIND THEIR ARMS.

 - (B) TEACHERS IN NYAGAHANGA HAVE BEEN PAID.
- (5) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR . NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.
- (6) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA. CONDUCTED PTLs IN AOR.
 - (A) IN MUYIRA THE POPULATION WAS REPORTED TO BE SPARSE EVEN THOUGH MOST OF THOSE WHO FLED DURING THE WAR HAD RETURNED. THERE IS REPORTED LACK OF DRINKING WATER, FOOD, FARMING IMPLEMENTS AND

SEEDS IN THE COMMUNE.

(B) IN NTONGWE COMMUNE, RETURNEES WERE REPORTED TO BE LIVING IN SHELTERS BECAUSE THEIR HOMES WERE DESTROYED DURING THE WAR. THE RETURNEES NEED BUILDING MATERIALS, FARMING TOOLS AND SEEDS.

(C) ONE LOCAL SOUGHT THE PROTECTION OF MALICOY TROOPS IN KABUGYI AFTER BEING CHASED BY TWO RPA TROOPS WHO CLAIMED THEY HAD BEEN ORDERED TO EFFECT HIS ARREST ON ALLEGATIONS OF MURDER. THE SOLDIERS FAILED TO PRODUCE COPIES OF THEIR ORDERS ON REQUEST. SECTOR HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM HAS REQUESTED THE ASSISTANCE OF RPA 31 BN COMD TO RESOLVE THE ISSUE. MEANWHILE THE LOCAL WILL REMAIN IN THE CUSTODY OF MALICOY TROOPS UNTIL THE ISSUE IS RESOLVED WITH THE RPA BN COMD. IF NO EVIDENCE OF THE ALLEGED CRIME IS PRODUCED, THE HRFO TEAM INTENDS TO RETURN THE LOCAL TO THE COUNSELLOR OF SHYOGWE, WHERE HE LIVES, WITH A REQUEST THAT HE BE LEFT ALONE.

(7) **SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO.**

(A) MILOBS PATROLLED KIBEHO CAMP AS PART OF OP RETOUR. A PLAN TO VACCINATE THE DPS AGAINST MENINGITIS FAILED DUE TO THE LATE ARRIVAL OF MSF OFFICIALS. AN AUSMED TEAM HOWEVER ATTENDED TO THE RETURNEES.

(B) MILOBS ALSO PATROLLED CYANIKA CAMP AS PART OF OP RETOUR. MORE DPS ARE NOW WILLING TO RETURN TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES. IT WAS REPORTED THAT THE ENTHUSIASM OF THE DPS TO RETURN HAD NOT BEEN ANTICIPATED. DPS INTERVIEWED ANNOUNCED THAT THEY WERE NOW SATISFIED WITH THE SECURITY SITUATION IN THE COUNTRY. SOME DPS WERE CONVEYED TO THE BUTARE AREA TO ASSESS THE SECURITY SITUATION FOR THEMSELVES.

(C) THE PRIMARY SCHOOL AT RUKONDO WAS ALSO REPORTED OPEN. MOST OF THE PUPILS WERE REPORTED TO BE CHILDREN OF DPS.

(8) **IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE.**

(A) MILOBS CONDUCTED PATROLS TO NYAMUTURA (GR 3189). LOCAL AUTHORITIES AT RUSIRO INFORMED MILOBS THAT SECONDARY SCHOOLS IN THE AREA ARE EXPECTED TO RE-OPEN IN FEB 95. IN MURINDA, LOCAL AUTHORITIES SAID THAT REPAIRS WOULD HAVE TO BE CARRIED OUT TO MOST OF THE SCHOOL BUILDINGS BEFORE SCHOOLS COULD RE-OPEN SINCE MOST OF THEM WERE DAMAGED DURING THE WAR.

(C) PATROLS ALSO COVERED GASEKE (GR 5870). 50

PERSONS HAVE RETURNED TO THE KIVUMU COMMUNE.

(9) **IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU.**

(A) TWO INCIDENTS OF BANDITRY IN THE RWESERO SUB-SECTOR WERE REPORTED DURING THE PERIOD. IN THE FIRST INCIDENT AT RWESERO, 20 BANDITS ARMED WITH AUTOMATIC WEAPONS AND SPEARS AND DRESSED IN MIXED CIVILIAN AND MILITARY UNIFORMS ATTACKED A LOCAL HOUSEHOLD AND ROBBED IT OF HOUSEHOLD GOODS AND SEVERAL LIVESTOCK. FIVE TEENAGE SONS IN THE HOUSE WERE TIED UP BEFORE THE BANDITS MADE THEIR ESCAPE IN THE DIRECTION OF GASAYO (GR 9941). IN THE SECOND INCIDENT, ANOTHER HOUSEHOLD WAS ROBBED OF 2 COWS AND 25,000 RFR. ONE OF THE ESCAPING BANDITS WAS SHOT AND KILLED BY AN RPA SOLDIER. IT IS BELIEVED THAT BANDITS ESCAPED TO IJWI ISLAND IN BOATS.

(B) MILOBS INVESTIGATIONS REVEALED THAT SHOTS WERE FIRED AT THE SCENE OF THE ISHARA INCIDENT (SITREP OF 15 JAN 95 REFERS) AND THAT 2 PERSONS WHO WERE WAITING IN BOATS TO ASSIST THE BANDITS TO ESCAPE MADE THEIR ESCAPE BEFORE THE FIVE OTHERS COULD REACH THEM. THE FIVE BANDITS ARE STILL PRESUMED TO BE AT LARGE, IN THE AREA.

(10) **IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.** CONDUCTED PTLs IN THE AREA. NOTHING SIGNIFICANT TO REPORT.

(11) **IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.** MILOB PATROLS COVERED BUTAMWA, ARAYABA AND RUSORORRO AREAS TO MONITOR THE HUMANITARIAN SITUATION. SCHOOLS ARE REPORTED TO BE OPEN IN THE COMMUNE. HOWEVER THE ATTENDANCE IS NOT AS LARGE AS THE PRE-WAR ATTENDANCE. THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS ALSO REPORTED CALM.

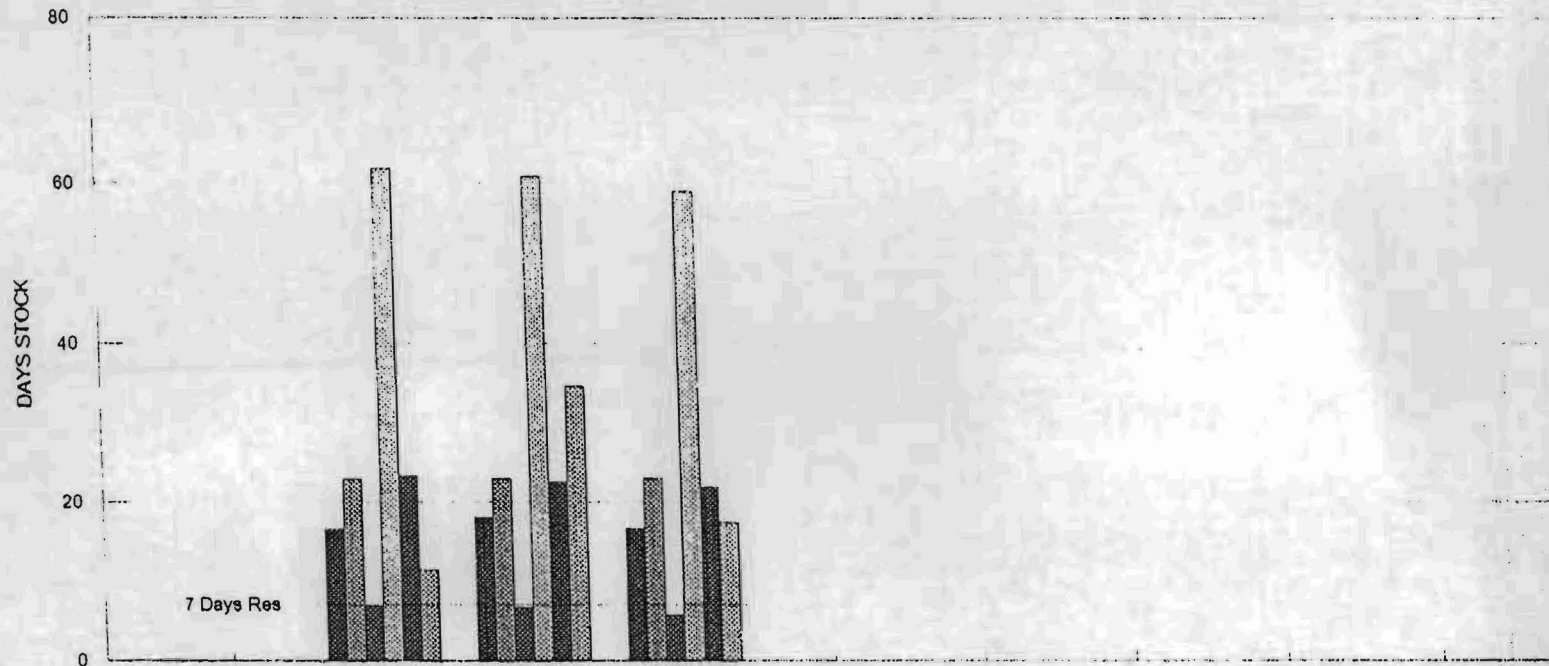



A. MILOBS IN SECTOR 2 REPORTED THAT INFO RECEIVED FROM RETURNEES FROM TANZANIA INDICATED THAT MILITIA ARE STILL HARASSING REFUGEES IN CAMPS IN TANZANIA. THE RETURNEES WHO RETURNED FROM BENACO REFUGEES CAMP IN TANZANIA SAID THAT THE MILITIA THREATENED AND SOMETIMES KILLED REFUGEES WHO INTENDED TO RETURN HOME. THE RETURNEES WHO CROSSED THE RUSUMO BORDER POST INTO RWANDA SHOWED MILOBS SCARS AND FRESH WOUNDS INFLICTED ON SOME OF THEM.

B. IN SECTOR 4C MILOBS REPORTED THAT SITUATION IN THE SECTOR WAS UNSTABLE AND THE CIVIL POPULATION LIVE IN FEAR. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT ACTS OF LOOTING AND MURDER ARE ON THE INCREASE ACROSS THE BORDER IN ZAIRE.

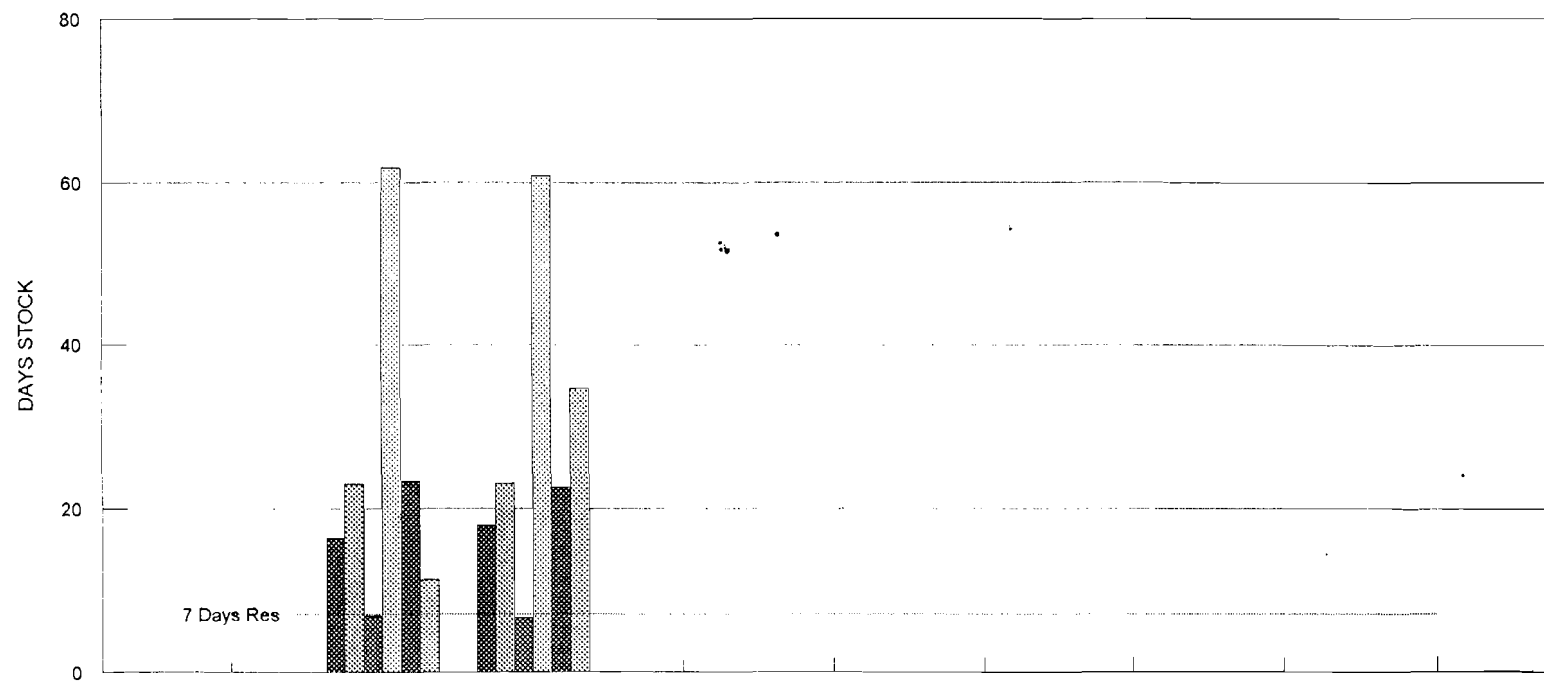



HE SUGGESTED EVAC SHOULD BE DONE A DAY AFTER FOOD DISTRIBUTION.

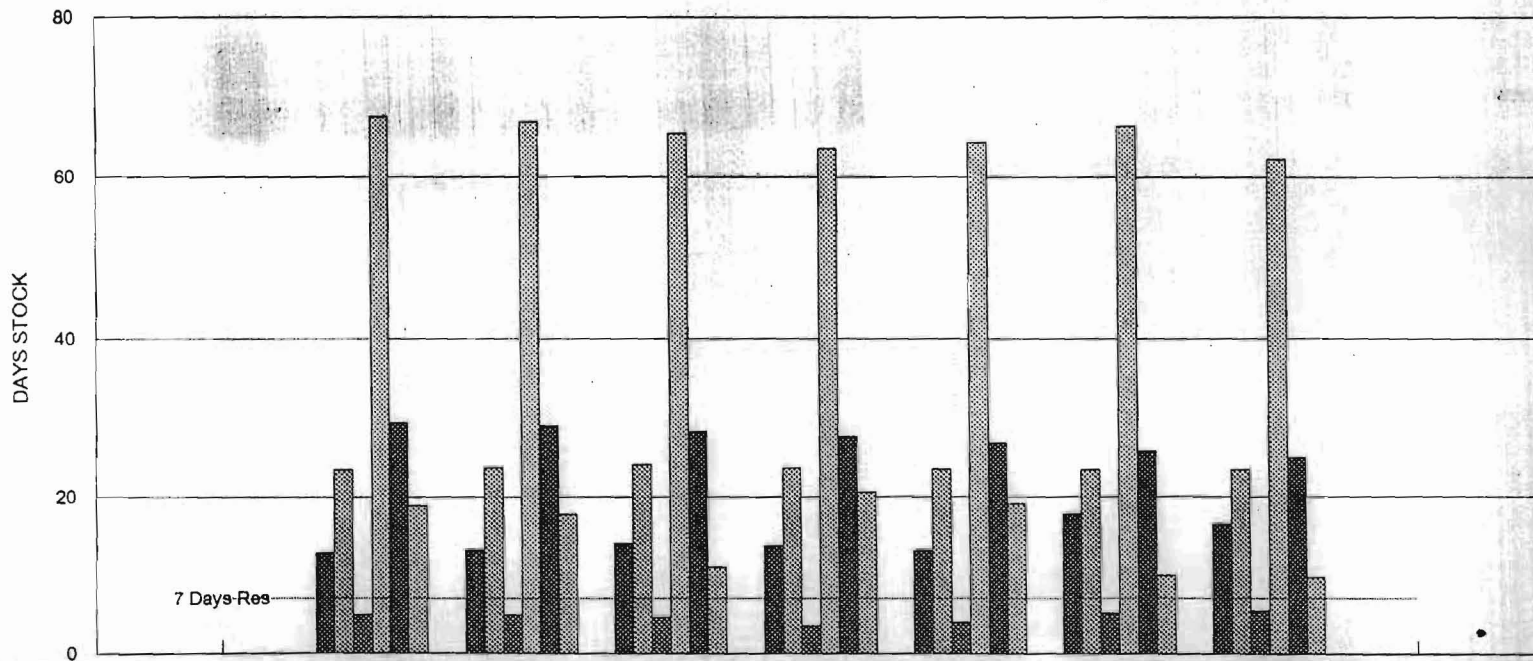
