DAILY SITREP FOR 04 NOV 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. RPA BN COMD IN KIBUNGO FAILED TO TURN UP FOR A MEETING WITH SECTOR 2 COMD TO DISCUSS THE ISSUE OF HIJACKED NGO FUEL TANKER WHICH WAS LOCATED IN RPA CAMP AT KIBUNGO.

B. MR. O'MAHONEY WHO WAS ARRESTED BY GENDARMERIE ON 02 NOV 94 HAS BEEN RELEASED FROM CUSTODY.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES.

(A) A NEW PREFECT OF GISENYI (DR CHARLES ZIRIMWABASABO) HAS BEEN APPOINTED. HE WAS PREFECT BEFORE THE OUTBREAK OF THE WAR. NEW PREFECT FOR RUHENGERI (MR KARUHJE IGNACE) HAS ALSO BEEN APPOINTED. HE ALSO HELD THIS POSITION IN THE 70s. NEITHER APPOINTEE HAS ANY POLITICAL PARTY AFFILIATION.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA THE RPA CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS AND MOUNT ROAD BLOCKS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY.

(1) RPA MAINTAINED STRONG PRESENCE ALONG ROAD KIBUYE - RWAMATAMU. THEY ALSO ESTABLISHED A NEW CHECK POINT AT GASEKE GR 5870.

(2) RECRUIT TRG CONTINUING IN KIBUYE. TROOPS DEPLOYMENT ALONG LAKE SHORES IN SECTOR ALSO OBSERVED.

(3) RPA IN GITARAMA ARRESTED 3 CARITAS DRIVERS AND 2 OTHERS WHO ARE FRIENDS OF THE MENTIONED DRIVERS ON THE NIGHT 3 NOV 94. FATHER VIERO OF CARITAS REPORTED THAT THE 3 DRIVERS ON ROUTINE FOOD TRANSPORT MISSION FROM BUJUMBURA TO KIGALI STOPPED TO SEE THEIR FRIENDS IN GITARAMA. RPA ARRESTED THEM ON ALLEGATION THAT, THEY HAD FIRED SOME SHOTS WHILST THEY HAD NO WEAPONS. THEIR TRUCK WITH 20 TONS OF FOOD AID WAS CONFISCATED AND CURRENTLY BEING HELD BY RPA.

(4) RPA CONDUCTED CORDON AND SEARCH OPS AT GIKOMDAVURA GR 9309 AND ARRESTED 21 MEN (ALL BURUNDI NATIONALS). THEY WERE ACCUSED OF ILLEGAL ENTRY INTO RWANDA. RPA LATER CLAIMED THEY HAD RELEASED ALL THE ARRESTED PERS.

(5) RPA HAS PROVIDED GUARDS FOR ONE MRS CARR AT RUHENGERI BECAUSE OF INCREASED ROBBERY OF WEALTHY PEOPLE IN THE AREA.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED. FC HELD BRIEF AT 0800 HRS.

(2) FC AND DFC ATTENDED MEDALS PARADE AT GHANBATT LOCATION.

(3) TAC HQ BUTARE REPORTED THAT OXFAM IS MISSING A 2 X MAN PATROL FROM KAMANA GR 8197 WHO HAVE NOT RETURNED

FROM THEIR TASK.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). SITUATION IN AOR CALM. PTLS CONDUCTED IN AREA OF KIVUYE, RUGARAMA AND KUREUYEIGAKUBI. GAKUBO DISPENSERY CONDUCTED VACCINATION OF LOCALS WITH ASSISTANCE FROM AMREF. VICE PRESIDENT OF RWANDA VISITED KIBUNGO. NICOY TPS IN KIBUNGO PROVIDED TRUCKS AND ESCORT TO UN WORLD FOOD PROGRAMME FOR DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD TO TEACHERS AT MUSEGERA GR 472646. ONE PTL TEAM WENT TO NIAUGAHANGA GR 225198. AT GITUZA TEAM FOUND 810 RDS OF AMMUNITION. THE AMMO WAS BROUGHT TO BASE AT BYUMBA. PRIMARY SCHOOLS HAVE REOPENED. CHILDREN WERE FOUND SITTING ON THE FLOOR DUE TO LACK OF SEATS. THEY ALSO LACK CHALK AND BOOKS. 2500 REFUGEES RETURNED TO GITUZA. FOOD, CLOTHING AND ACCOMMODATION IS URGENTLY NEEDED FOR THE RETURNING REFUGEES. 86 LOCALS WERE TREATED AT OUR MEDICAL FACILITIES.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBATT AND ONE PL NICOY). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY). NTR.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT). CONTINUED DAY AND NIGHT, FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS IN AOR IN BOTH SE AND SW RWANDA. PTLS JOINTLY CONDUCTED WITH ZAMBATT IN NORTHERN PART OF AO, IN SW RWANDA. CONTINUED PROVIDING GUARDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE AND AICF WAREHOUSE AT CYANIKA GR 5530. MAINTAINED DEPLOYMENT OF 1 X MECH SECTION EACH AT MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES. CONTINUED MANNING CHECK PTS AT GIKONGORO, BYUMBA, RWAMIKO AND KITABI. 18 LOCALS WERE GIVEN MED TREATMENT AT RUNYOMBYI GR 4893. HELD MEDALS PARADE AT MURAMBI CAMP GR 5108. FC AND DFC PERS WERE PRESENT. ICRC REPLENISHED SAFE DRINKING WATER FOR THE LOCALS AT RWAMIKO GR 3913.

F. SECTOR 4A NORTH ZAMBATT. CONTINUED JOINT DAY AND NIGHT PTL IN AOR WITH TCHAD AND GHANBATT TROOPS. TROOPS DEPLOYED IN KADUHA GR 4742, MUSANGE GR 5247, MURO GR 3840, KARAMA GR 5631, RUKONDO GR 5538 AND MUSEBEYA GR 3933. CURRENTLY CONTINGENT HQ IS LOCATED AT KARAMA. CO ZAMBATT WILL VISIT CO FRAFBATT 051000B NOV 94 TO COMPLETE DETAILS OF TAKING OVER TCHAD'S LOCATIONS.

G. SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT). CONTINUED FOOT PATROLS AND MANNED CHECK PTS. CONTROLLED CROSSING PTS AT MUGONERO AND MUFEMBESI. ONE FRAFBATT PL IS NOW OCCUPYING MOUNT KARONGE. ASSISTED IN THE DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD AND SEEDS AT MUSANGE AND MUKO. DISTRIBUTION OF UTENSILS WAS DONE AT KADUHA.

H. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT MOBILE AND FOOT PTLS IN THE FOLLOWING AREAS CYANGUGU/UVIRA GR 8901, KABINGO GR 9146, KILIMBI GR 1049, NYARUSHISHI GR 8522, NYAGATARE GR 8024, SHARA GR 9011, COMBANIRO GR 9398, GISKAURA GR 9829 AND KITABI GR 3620.

(2) MANNED PERMANENT CHECK PTS AT PINDURA GR 1426, GISHOMA GR 8211, KIBINGO GR 9038 MURURU DPs CAMP GR 7621 AND NYAGATARE GR 8024.

(3) ESCORTED A UNHCR CONVOY OF 278 DPs PROCEEDING TO BUTARE FROM NYARUSHISHI GR 8522 TO KITABI GR 3520. CO ATTENDED MEDALS PARADE CEREMONY FOR GHANBATT TROOPS, AT GIKONGORO.

(4) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE GUARDS AND SECURITY TO DIFFERENT NGOS AND FIVE DP CAMPS IN OUR AREA.

I. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CONTINUED TO PTL AND MAN CHECK PTS IN AOR. TUNBATT COMD VISITED AMERICARE GR 2621.

J. MILOB GP. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN ALL SECTORS AND OBSERVED THAT THE GENERAL SITUATION WAS CALM.

(1) BORDERS NTR.

(2) MILOB GP HQ PLANNING, COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOB SECTORS ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT DURING THE PERIOD. ASSISTANCE WAS ALSO GIVEN TO UNREO AND NGOS.

(3) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. MILOB TEAMS PATROLLED RUSHAKI, RUGARAMA AND KIVUYE GAKUBO. PATROLS DISCOVERED THAT REFUGEE CAMPS IN THESE AREAS WERE VACATED.

(4) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. THE SECTOR WAS CALM DURING THE PERIOD. MILOBS PATROLLED AND MONITORED ACTIVITIES ALONG THE RWANDA - TANZANIA AND RWANDA - BURUNDI BORDERS AND REPORTED SIT CALM. ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT TO BIRENGA, ROKIRA, NYARUBUYE RILIMA, BASHORA, RUTETE, RUKUMBERE, SASA, KIBERE AND NYANGE. MILOBS ALSO PATROLLED RUSUMO AND SAKA AREAS. THE SITUATION IN THESE AREAS WAS FOUND TO BE CALM.

(5) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA. THE SIT IN THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM. MILOBS PATROLLED SAVE GR 7419, GITARAMA, MUREMURE GR 5760 AND MASANGO GR 6254. MILOBS WERE INFO AT MASANGO AND MURAMURE THAT LOCALS WERE AFRAID OF RPA BECAUSE OF THE ALLEGATIONS THAT, RPA HAD KILLED 2 PERS IN THE AREA LATE OCT.

(6) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. MILOBS ESCORTED THE MANAGEMENT TEAM OF TEA FACTORY TO CYANGUGU. MILOBS CONDUCTED BORDER PATROLS AND INVESTIGATED REPORTS OF CATTLE STEALING AT NYANGE GR 5307.

(7) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM. HEAVY RAINS RENDERING ROADS IN SECTOR UNMOTORABLE. MILOBS CARRIED OUT PATROLS IN THE KIBUYE, GISHITA GR 2161, MUBUGA GR 2463, RWAMATAMU GR 1673, MABANZA GR 3373, NDABA GR 4173, KIVBUMU GR 5573 AND

GASEKE 5870. SIT IN THESE AREAS WAS CALM.

(8) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. THE SECTOR WAS CALM DURING THE PERIOD. ROUTINE PATROLS CONDUCTED IN SECTOR.

(9) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI.

(A) THERE IS TENSION DUE TO MASSACRE AND RECENT ROBBERY CASES IN SOME AREAS WITHIN THE SECTOR.

(B) MILOBS PATROLLED GISENYI AND BORDER POSTS, NYUNDO GR 248117, RUHENGIRI, CYANIKA GR 7153, KINIGI GR 5540, BISOKE GR 449393 AND KARESOKE RESEARCH CENTRE. AREA REPORTED CALM AFTER ESCALATION OF ROBBERY AND MURDERS.

(C) SECTOR MILOBS VISITED RUTAGATA MASSACRE SITE AND CARRIED OUT INVESTIGATION. INVESTIGATION TO BE CONTINUED AND DETAILED REPORT SUBMITTED LATER.

(D) MILOBS ESCORTED MSF TEAM FROM NYUNDO GR 2511 TO KAREBA GR 4225.

(10) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI.

(A) THE SITUATION IN KIGALI AND ITS SUBURBS REMAINED CALM. RPA CONTINUED THEIR ROUTINE FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS AND MOUNTED SNAP ROAD BLOCKS IN THE CAPITAL ESPECIALLY AT NIGHT.

(B) SECTOR MILOBS ESCORTED UNCHR TRUCKS WITH A TOTAL OF 252 DPs FROM KIGALI TO NYAMATA AND NGENDA AND ESCORTED 81 DPs TO KIGALI. 35 OTHER DPs WERE ALSO ESCORTED TO KIBUNGO WHILST 86 DPs WERE EVACUATED TO KIGALI.

K. AUSMED. THE AUSMED SPT FORCE PROVIDED MED SPT TO UNAMIR AND HUMANITARIAN MED SPT TO THE PEOPLE OF RWANDA.

(1) AUST FORCE AT CHK TREATED 26 PATIENTS AND 5 DENTAL PATIENTS. CURRENTLY HOLDING 11 IN PATIENTS. TROOPS OF THE TSG AT BUTARE TREATED 180 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 02 DENTAL PATIENTS. CLINICS WERE CONDUCTED AT KIBEHO AND SAVE. WARD ROUNDS OF BUTARE HOSPITAL CONDUCTED. THE DUMP TRUCK WAS RECOVERED TO THIS LOC. PREV MED ELM RETURNED TO THIS LOC FROM TUNBATT.

(2) RIFLE COY ELM CONDUCTED SECURITY OPS AT THE MIL BKS AND BELGIAN VILLAGE. RIFLE COY ELM ALSO PROV RRF.

(3) AN INCIDENT OCCURED AT BUTARE TODAY WHEN AUSMED TROOPS PHOTOGRAPHED APPROX 100 RPA FROM THE BACK OF THEIR MOVING ROVER. THE RPA BROKE RANKS AND MOTIONED FOR THE VEH TO STOP. THE VEH DID NOT STOP AND

PROCEEDED TO UN TAC HQ. A MTD RPA SECTION FOLLOWED THEM TO UN TAC HQ AND DEMANDED THAT THE SOLDIER AND CAMERA INVOLVED BE HANDED OVER. CAPT. MCINTYRE HELD DISCUSSIONS WITH THE RPA AND HANDED OVER THE CAMERA. THE RPA REFUSED TO BELIEVE IT WAS THE CORRECT CAMERA AND FINALLY DEPARTED AFTER DEMANDING THAT THE DEVELOPED FILM AND PRINTS BE HANDED TO THEM. THIS WAS NOT AGREED TO AND IT IS BELIEVED THE INCIDENT WILL BLOW OVER.

(1) 63 AB CS SQN RLC. THE BRITCON INVOLVEMENT WITH OP HOMEWARD HAS CEASED. THE COMMAND AND CONTROL FUNCTION PERFORMED BY BRITCON IS TO BE TAKEN OVER BY OTHER ELEMENTS WITHIN UNAMIR.

(A) 1 TP - BYUMBA. THE WATER PIPE AT THE MUKONO CLINIC HAS FINALLY DELIVERED WATER TO THE CLINICS HEADER TANK, THE WATER PROBLEMS AT THE CLINIC ARE THEREFORE RESOLVED UNLESS THE LOCALS VANDALIZE THE PIPE AGAIN. THE TASKS AT THE AMREF CLINIC AT BYUMBA ARE NOW COMPLETE. THE NEW, MORE SUBSTANTIAL BRIDGE AT GATUNA IS TO BE STARTED ON 07 NOV 94.

(B) 2 TP - KIGALI. ELECTRICAL WORK CONTINUED TO FINISH OFF THE RUB SHELTER BUILT FOR MALICOY.

(C) 3 TP - KITABI. GENERAL ENGINEER TASKS PERFORMED AT THE NGO TROCAIRE'S CLINIC IN GIKONGORO AND MERLIN CLINIC IN CYANIKA. HEAVY RAIN FALLS IN SECTOR 4A HAS AFFECTED THE QUALITY OF THE ROADS AND FUTURE PRIORITIES WILL INCLUDE MORE ROUTE MAINTENANCE.

(D) SP TP - KIGALI. THE WORK ON THE ROAD LEADING TO THE MILOB HQ WAS STARTED TODAY WITH SOIL BEING INLOADED TO INFILL THE DEEP RUTS ON IT. ONCE THIS IS DONE, THE SOIL WILL BE COMPACTED AND THEN GRADED.

(5) 23 PFA. CAMPS VISITED INCLUDED MEDICAL TREATMENT AT CAMPS 4A/11, WITH EH ADVICE BEING GIVEN AT CAMPS 4A/21 AND 25. SURGICAL PROCEDURES TODAY INCLUDED 2 AT THE MSF HOSPITAL IN KIGALI AND 2 AT THE HOSPITAL AT KIGEME.

(5) 10 AB WKSP REME. THE HANDOVER/TAKEOVER PROGRAMME WITH BROWN AND ROOT (B&R) IS PROGRESSING WELL. THE CTO

ARE DUE TO MOVE OUT OF THE WKSP LOCATION BY 12 NOV 94. ALL CIVILIAN PATTERN UNAMIR VEHICLES WILL BE TAKEN BY THE CTO, ALL SCRAP VEHICLES WILL BE CENTRALISED AT 3 CSG. ALL UNAMIR B VEHICLES WILL BE TAKEN BY B&R TO THE IVECO FACTORY. THE ES ADVISORY VISITS STARTED TODAY WITH FRAFBATT AND MALAWICOY BEING VISITED FIRST. 07 JOBS COMPLETED IN LAST 24 HRS, 53 JOBS IN HAND AND 11 VEH AWAITING SPARES.

B. THE TWO JOURNALISTS, WHO WERE ARRESTED BY RPA ON 27 OCT 94 HAVE BEEN SUBSEQUENTLY RELEASED AND LEFT URMULI HOTEL, GISENYI AT ABOUT 1730 HRS ON 02 NOV 94 FOR KIGALI.

IN A SUBSEQUENT MEETING WITH THE PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA, MR. YAGAREMBWE, THE SRSG DISCUSSED THE RETURN OF REFUGEES, ECONOMIC AID AND THE INTERNATIONAL TRIBUNAL. 1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA IS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. THE TWO JOURNALISTS WHO WERE ARRESTED BY RPA ON 27 OCT 94 ARE STILL BEING HELD AT URMULI HOTEL, RUHENGERI.

B. COMMENCING FRI 04 NOV 94 AND SUBSEQUENTLY ON EVERY MONDAY, WED AND FRI, 400 REFUGEES WILL BE UPLIFTED BY UNHCR FROM BURUNDI TO KIBUNGO (SECTOR 2B). THESE ARE TUTSI REFUGEES DISPLACED BEFORE THE RECENT WAR.

C. UNHCR REP IN BUTARE REPORTED TO TAC HQ THAT THE LOCAL BURGERMESTER AND 10 RPA SOLDIERS HAD GONE TO MUKO CAMP, IN THE MORNING ON 01 NOV 94. INFORMATION GATHERED INDICATED THAT THEY WANTED SOME DPS FROM KIBUYE, WHO HAD JUST ARRIVED, TO LEAVE THE CAMP.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SRSG SPENT MOST OF THE DAY VISITING REFUGEE CAMPS IN NGARA, TANZANIA. HE SPOKE WITH OFFICIALS FROM VARIOUS UN AGENCIES AND NGOS OPERATING IN THE CAMPS IN AN EFFORT TO EVALUATE THE SITUATION. UPON HIS RETURN TO KIGALI, HE MET WITH MR. URASA, MR. VAN HOVELL AND MR. MCCALLIN FROM UNHCR TO EXCHANGE VIEWS ON THE CURRENT REFUGEE SITUATION.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA THE RPA CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS AND MOUNT ROAD BLOCKS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY.

(1) LOCALS OF NDAGO GR 5201 COMPLAINED OF CONSTANT HARASSMENT BY RPA. THEY REPORTED ON SIX PEOPLE KILLED AT RUKO GR 5200. UPON INVESTIGATION BY A PTL FROM MALAWI COY, IT WAS CONFIRMED 4 PEOPLE WERE KILLED, ONE MAN WAS SEVERELY BEATEN WHILST HIS HANDS WERE TIED AND ONE 10 YEAR OLD BOY WAS SHOT IN THE ARM. THE INJURED BOY WAS TAKEN TO BRITCON CLINIC. IT WAS ALSO REPORTED THAT TWO RPA SOLDIERS IN UNIFORM ATTEMPTED TO ABDUCT THE WIFE OF ONE OF THE DECEASED AND TWO CHILDREN BUT FLED INTO THE HILLS AFTER AN ANGRY CROWD FROM THE DPs CAMP TRIED TO ATTACK THEM. LOCALS IN THE CAMP VOWED NEVER TO RETURN TO THEIR VILLAGES AS LONG AS RPA REMAIN IN POWER AND THAT THEY WILL DEAL WITH ANY TUTSIS THEY SEE IN THE AREA.

(2) ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAD HELD A MEETING WITH LOCALS AT NORTH OF AIRPORT GR 7828 IN CYANGUGU ON 31 OCT 94 WHERE THEY WERE URGING THE PEOPLE NOT TO BE AFRAID OF THE RPA.

(3) NICOY REPORTED THAT RPA HAVE INCREASED IN STRENGTH AT ROAD BLOCKS.

(4) MILOBS REPORTED THAT AN RPA OFFICER CUT OFF POWER LINES WITHIN BUTARE AT GR 6913 FOR UNKNOWN REASONS.

(5) A PATROL FROM MALAWI COY ESCORTING ELECTROGAZ WORKERS REPAIRING POWER LINES WITHIN BUTARE WAS STOPPED AT GR 6913 BY AN RPA OFFICER, HE TOLD THE PATROL NOT TO ESCORT NGO'S CLOSE TO RPA LOCATIONS, THEY SHOULD TRAVEL ON THEIR OWN.

COMMENT: UNAMIR TROOPS WILL CONTINUE TO ESCORT UN AGENCIES AND NGOS AS REQUIRED.

2. POLITICAL ACTIVITIES. THE SRSG ATTENDED A SECTION HEADS MEETING AT UNAMIR HEADQUARTERS WITH MR. MEDILLI, DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF ADMINISTRATION, TO DISCUSS VARIOUS ADMINISTRATIVE ISSUES. HE THEN MET H.E. MRS. LUCY EDWARDS, SENIOR COMMISSIONER TO KENYA, TO DISCUSS THE POLITICAL SITUATION.

RWANDA AND THE RETURN OF REFUGEES FROM NEIGHBOURING COUNTRIES. DURING A SUBSEQUENT MEETING BETWEEN THE SRSG AND MR. MEDILLI, A ROUND-UP OF ADMINISTRATIVE ISSUES TOOK PLACE. LATER IN THE DAY, THE SRSG MET MR. DIALLO, THE UNDP RESIDENT REPRESENTATIVE IN ZAIRE, AND THEY DISCUSSED A FOLLOW-UP OF THE JOINT UN/ZAIRE TECHNICAL TEAM.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA THE RPA CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS AND MOUNT ROAD BLOCKS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY.

(1) ON 301100B OCT 94 MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE RPA AT NYAMBISAZI (GR 5649) SHOT AND KILLED AN UNKNOWN FEMALE WHEN SHE DROVE THROUGH A CHECKPOINT. A HAND GRENADE WAS FOUND IN THE VICTIMS LUGGAGE.

(2) ON 291850B OCT 94 THE RPA SHOT AND KILLED A MAN IN MASANGO (GR 6253). MILOBS REPORTED THAT THE MAN WAS SHOT WHILE TRYING TO ESCAPE.

(3) PRAFBAIT REPORTED THAT THE RPA BURNED SOME TENTS DOWN IN THE BIRAMBO DF CAMP BECAUSE SOME PEOPLE HAD REMAINED IN THE CAMP WHICH WAS OFFICIALLY CLOSED ON 29 OCT 94.

B. RGF NTR.

C. MILITIA

(1) MILOBS REPORTED THAT 3 FAMILIES WERE KILLED ON THE NIGHT OF 30 OCT 94. THE ATTACK HAPPENED IN THE VILLAGE OF RUTAGARA (GR 1920). A TOTAL OF 36 PEOPLE WERE KILLED BY PEOPLE WHO CAME FROM THE ZAIRIAN SIDE OF THE BORDER.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

A. FORCE HQ.

(1) NORMAL MILITARY ACTIVITIES WERE CONDUCTED.

(2) FC WAS VISITED BY THE CANADIAN HIGH COMMISSIONER TO KENYA. HER EXCELLENCY MRS. LUCY EDWARDS. SHE WAS BRIEFED ON THE CURRENT STATUS OF UNAMIR, VISITED SECTOR 5 AND TOURED THE CANADIAN INSTALLATIONS AT THE AMAHORO STADIUM.

(3) FC HELD A MEETING WITH UNIT/SECTOR COMDS. EACH SECTOR CMD PRESENTED THEIR ASSESMENT OF THE SITUATION IN THEIR RESPECTIVE AREAS. THEY HAVE ALL REPORTED INCREASED TENSION BETWEEN THEMSELVES, THE RPA AND THE POPULATION.

(4) FC HAD A WORKING LUNCHEON WITH
DISCUSS CURRENT STATUS OF H

RECOMMENDATIONS HE WILL BE MAKING TO CAO STAFF.

(5) FINALLY, FC HELD A MEETING WITH THE COMMISSION OF EXPERT ON HUMAN RIGHTS AND DID PRELIMINARY WORK ON UPCOMING MEETING WITH THE MINISTER OF DEFENCE.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). OWN PTL WENT TO MANYAGIRO AND KIVUYE GR 674317 AND GR 263355. AT MANYAGIRO'S CLINIC, PATIENTS WERE LYING ON THE FLOOR. THE DOCTOR CONFIRMED NON AVAILABILITY OF DRUGS AND BEDS. HE MENTIONED THAT THE MOST COMMON DISEASES IN THE AREA ARE MENINGITIS, CHOLERA, DIARRHEA, MALARIA AND SKIN DISEASES. AT KIVUYE, THE PTL MET WITH THE CHAIRMAN WHO CONFIRMED THAT APPROX TEN THOUSANDS RETURNEES ARE IN THIS AREA AND DUE TO THE NUMBER THEY HAVE MET WITH PROBLEMS OF ACCOMODATION AS MOST OF THE BUILDINGS WERE DESTROYED DURING THE WAR. THERE IS ALSO A SHORTAGE OF FOOD SINCE RELIEF MATERIALS HAVE NOT BEEN DISTRIBUTED THIS MONTH. THE CHAIRMAN ALSO CONFIRMED THAT ONLY ONE SCHOOL OUT OF FOUR WAS OPEN. MO DID AN EMERGENCY SURGERY ON A WOMAN WITH A RUPTURED UTERUS AT THE AMREF CLINIC. 162 LOCALS WERE GIVEN MEDICAL ASSISTANCE.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBATT AND ONE PL NICOY). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PTLs AND ASSURING SECURITY OF THE AREA OF OPERATION.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT). CONTINUED DAY AND NIGHT FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS IN AO IN BOTH SE AND SW RWANDA. A STANDING PTL DETAILED AT REMERA BORDER GR 4192. CONTINUED TO PROVIDE SECURITY AT CENTRE DE SANTE AND AICF WAREHOUSE AT CYANIKA GR 5530. MAINTAINED DEPLOYMENT OF 1 X MECH SECTION EACH AT THE MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES. CONTINUED MANNING CP AT GIKONGORO, BURAMHA, RWAMIRO AND KITABI. PROVIDED SECURITY FOR ICRC RELIEF DISTRIBUTION AT MUNINI GR 4800, ALSO FOR AICF AND FEED THE CHILDREN AT CYANIKA GR 5530 AND GATOVU GR 4033.

F. SECTOR 4B (FRAFBATT). CONTINUED FOOT PTL AND MANNED CHECK PTS. MSF CARRIED OUT VACCINATION CLINIC AT NUBUGA. MEDICAL STAFF ASSISTED A PREGNANT WOMAN. AFTER X-RAY AND FIRST AID SHE WAS TRANSPORTED TO GISEYNI HOSPITAL.

G. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT). CONTINUED DAY AND NIGHT MOBILE AND FOOT PTLs IN AOR. MANNED CHECK PTS AT PINDURA GR 1426, GISHUMO GR 8211 AND ICIBINGO GR 9638. ALSO MANNED NEW CHK PTS AT MURURU DPs CAMP GR 7521 AND NYAGATARE GR 8124. CO ATTENDED FC CONFERENCE IN KIGALI. TRANSPORTED 267 FROM BUGARAMA GR 9007 TO NYAGATARE GR 8024 WITH UNIT TRUCKS. ESCORTED UNHCR CONVOY OF 197 DPs FOR BUTARE, FROM NYAGATARA GR 8024 TO KITABI GR 3520. THREE DPs DIED IN MURURU CAMP. DEPLOYED 1 X MECH PL AT MURURU DP CAMP GR 7521. MOTORIZED PL AT NYAGATARA CAMP GR 8024. KIRAMBO DP CAMP GR 0444.

CAMP GR 7619 AND COY HQ. TWO MOTORIZED PL AT NYARUSHISHI DP CAMP GR 8522. CONTINUED PROVISION OF GUARDS FOR UNREO GR 7724, CLOSE OBSERVATION OF HSF, MSF AND UNHCR OFFICES AND RESIDENCES.

II. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PTL AND PROVIDE SECURITY IN AOR.

I. MILOB GP. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN ALL SECTORS. SIT WAS GENERALLY CALM. HOWEVER, AUTOMATIC AND SINGLE RDS SMALL ARMS FIRE WERE HEARD IN CERTAIN SUBURBS OF KIGALI DURING NIGHT HOURS.

(1) BORDERS ALL BORDERS WERE OPEN TO TRAFFIC DURING THE PERIOD. THREE FAMILIES RESIDING IN RUTAGARA GR 1920 AND GR 1913 NEAR ZAIRE BORDER WERE MASSACRED ON NI 30/31 OCT 94 BY ARMED PERS FROM ZAIRE SIDE OF THE BORDER. 4 MEN, 6 WOMEN AND 26 CHILDREN WERE KILLED IN THE ATTACK PRESUMABLY BY THE MILITIA.

(2) MILOB GP HQ PLANNING, COORDINATING AND MONITORING OF ACTIVITIES OF MILOBS SECTORS CARRIED OUT.

(3) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. MILOB PATROLLED THE SECTOR AND REPORTED NORMAL ACTIVITIES IN THE VARIOUS COMMUNES.

(4) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. PTLs WERE CARRIED OUT TO RUSUMO BORDER POST. GASHORA, RUBAYA, RURENGE, SAKI AND KIBUNGO. SIT IS REPORTED CALM.

(5) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA. MILOB PATROLS COVERED MASANGO GR 6254 MUKINGI GR 7181 AND MUGUSA. MILOBS VISITED GITARAMA PRISONS AND OBSERVED THAT THE NUMBERS OF PRISONERS HAS INCREASED FROM 1155 TO 1238. MILOBS MONITORED CONDITION OF ORPHANS IN MUGUSA AND REPORTED THAT 39 ORPHANS IN THE AREA NEED FOOD AND CLOTHING.

(6) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. MILOBS CONDUCTED BORDER PTLs AND ROAD RECCE IN RUNYOMBI GR 4892 AND OTHER PARTS OF THE SECTOR. MONITORED OP HOMEWARD AT KADUHA WHERE 9 TRUCKS WERE PROVIDED BUT ONLY 8 PERS WERE EVAC DUE TO RUMOURS THAT RPA ARE KILLING RETURNEES.

(7) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. SECTOR WAS CALM DURING THE PERIOD. MILOBS PATROLLED GISOVU AREA AND REPORTED THAT SCHOOLS IN AREA WERE OPENED. LOCAL WERE APPREHENSIVE ABOUT THE RPA.

(8) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. MILOB PATROLLED AREA OF GIKUNDAMBURA GR 9309 AND REPORTED THE PRESENCE APPROX 3000 REFUGEES FROM CIBITOKE PROVINCE, BURUNDI. THEY HAVE FLED THE FIGHTING IN FUEFUE, RWANDA. THEY ARE HOWEVER IN DESPERATE NEED OF TENTAGE.

(9) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. PTLS WERE CARRIED OUT IN THE SECTOR. ONE TEAM INVESTIGATED AN AP MINE INCIDENT IN WHICH A 15 YEARS OLD BOY WAS SERIOUSLY INJURED ON BOTH LEGS. THIS INCIDENT HAPPENED 10 KM NORTH OF MUKAKA GR 7522. POSSIBILITY OF MORE MINES IN AREA.

(10) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. CITY WAS RELATIVELY CALM. ALTHOUGH AUTOMATIC AND SINGLE RDS SA FIRE WERE HEARD IN SOME SUBURBS DURING THE NIGHT. SECT MILOBS ESCORTED 2 X UNHCR TRUCKS WITH 78 DPs TO KIBUNGO AND EVACUATED 4 AND 37 DPs FROM THE KIBONGO AREA TO RUSORORO. TWO OTHER MILOB TEAMS ESCORTED UNHCR TRUCKS WITH 8 AND 39 DPs TO NYAMATA AND GASHORA RESPECTIVELY. THE NYAMATA TEAM ESCORTED 15 DPs FROM NYAMATA AREA TO KIGALI.

J. AUSMED.

(1) AUST FORCE AT CHK TREATED 30 PATIENTS AND 8 DENTAL. CURRENTLY HOLDING 8 IN PATIENTS. TSG AT BUTARE TREATED 208 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 1 DENTAL PATIENT. CLINIC WERE CONDUCTED AT KIBEHO AND SAVE. WARD ROUNDS AT BUTARE HOSP AND VACCINATION FOR MENINGITES AT CARE ORPHANAGE WERE ALSO CONDUCTED.

(2) COL WALLACE AND TEAM FROM TSG BUTARE WILL VISIT SOUTH AND WEST RWANDA TOMORROW. AN RPA OFFR WAS DENIED ACCESS TO OUR BKS YESTERDAY. HE WAS UPSET ABOUT THIS AND STATED HE COULD MAKE AN INCIDENT OF IT. SIT WAS DEFUSED AND HE DEPARTED WITHOUT GAINING ACCESS. ON THREE OCCASIONS RPA SOLDIERS EITHER POINTED OR COCKED THEIR WPN AT AND NEAR TROOPS.

(3) THE RRF WAS DEPLOYED TO AN INCIDENT IN KICUKIRO AREA REPORTED BY A MILOB. AFTER BEING STOP AND DELAYED AT A ROAD BLOCK, THE RRF DROVE THROUGH IT TO GAIN ACCESS TO THE AREA OF THE INCIDENT. THE RRF WAS NOT ABLE TO LOCATE THE MILOB AND BECAME SURROUNDED BY THREE RPA VEH AND APPROX 30 TROOPS WITH TWO RPG. SIT WAS TENSE AND THE RPA REFUSED THE VEHICLE TO MOVE UNTIL RPA LO ARRIVED.

K. BRITCON. THE MASS GRAVE AT CYANICA CONTINUE TO CAUSE CONSIDERABLE CONCERN AND A SIGNIFICANT HEALTH RISK. 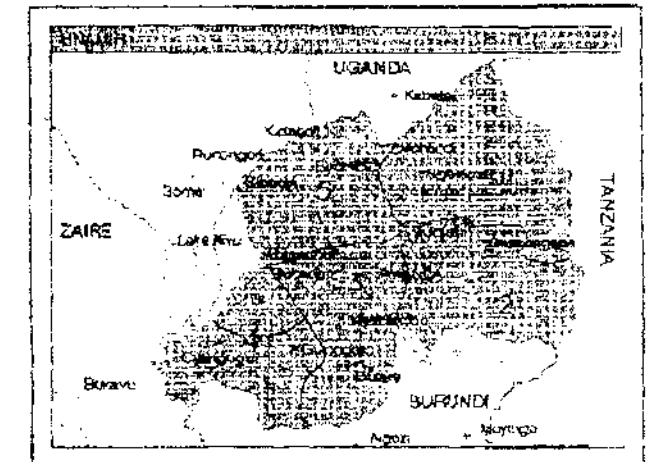

UNAMIR - RWANDATime: 0800 Hours NYT 31 October 1994
(Covering period from 28 to 31 October 1994)

HIGHLIGHTS

- The SRSG discussed the status of human rights operations in Rwanda.
- The RPA attitude towards UNAMIR was again reported to be unfriendly and non-cooperative.

POLITICAL

On 28 October, the SRSG met with the Acting UNDP Resident Representative, Mr. Rhazaoui in order to discuss the upcoming round table conference. The SRSG convened three separate Rwanda Emergency Normalization Plan (RENP) meetings where the restoration of electricity and water, the rehabilitation of the telecommunications network and the status of UN demining plans for Rwanda were discussed. On 29 October, the SRSG held consultations with a Commission of Experts, led by Mr. Koffi-Amega in order to discuss the status of human rights operations in Rwanda.



MILITARY

On 28-30 October, the RPA continued to conduct patrols and mount roadblocks throughout the country. UNAMIR conducted normal military activities. On 29 October, the situation in and around KIGALI was described as becoming more volatile. Automatic small arms fire was heard in some suburbs of the city during the night. The RPA continued to conduct patrols, cordon and search operations and arrests of the local population. A significant number of murders and attacks by bandits on the local population was reported in Sectors 3 and 4. In one of the displaced persons camps (Sector 4a), bandits, were attacked by the camp's inhabitants resulting in one of the bandits being killed and two others severely beaten. On 29-30 October, two villages in Ruhengeri area were attacked by unidentified persons dressed in military uniform and equipped with machetes. Fifty persons were arrested in Sector 4c while attempting to cross lake KIVE to enter Zaire. The attitude of the RPA towards UNAMIR in Sector 2 was becoming unfriendly and non cooperative. Frequent mine incidents involving farmers and children were reported in Sector 1.

RESTRICTIONS ON MOVEMENT

On 29 October, the UN Headquarters Team visiting Rwanda were denied entry into Zaire when attempting to visit GOMA. UNAMIR Military Observers were not allowed to visit the Gashora area by the RPA.

HUMANITARIAN

On 29 October, the RPA closed down the RUGABANO (Sector 4) displaced persons camp.

SECURITY AND SAFETY OF PERSONNEL

On 29 October, the vehicle of a UNAMIR military observer was taken away at gunpoint by RPA soldiers in KIGALI. On 29-30 October, two NGO residents in KIGALI were robbed at gunpoint in their residence. Due to growing insecurity, NGO MSF personnel had been evacuated from their residencies to King Faisal Hospital.

CASUALTIES

On 30 October, a UNAMIR military driver sustained facial and neck cuts due to the deliberate action of an RPA soldier.

THREE BANDITS HAD BEEN IDENTIFIED AND WERE BEING ATTACKED BY THE DPs WITHIN THE CAMP. THERE WAS NOTHING THAT THE SOLDIERS COULD DO EXCEPT WITHDRAW AND REPORT THE INCIDENT TO GHANBATT. A. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE RPA WILL PUT ON A SHOW OF STRENGTH THIS WEEKEND TO EMPHASISE THE FACT THAT THEY HAVE NOT BEEN PAID. THIS DISPLAY MAY ALSO ACT AS A REMINDER TO THE GOVERNMENT THAT THEY CANNOT CONTROL THE COUNTRY WITHOUT THE RPA. B. THE 2 JOURNALISTS WHO WERE REPORTED MISSING ON 27 OCT 94 HAVE BEEN LOCATED. THEY ARE UNDER OPEN ARREST AT THE URMULI HOTEL IN RUHENGARI. THEY WERE ARRESTED WHILE MAKING AN UNAUTHORISED DOCUMENTARY ON THE TWAS. THE SECTOR COMD AND HAC TEAM MET WITH THE RPA BDE COMD TO TRY TO SECURE THEIR RELEASE.

(3) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA BORDER REMAINED OPENED FOR ALL TRAFFIC. PTLS WERE CARRIED OUT AT MULINDI, KYOMBE, TALANGUE AND MYAGATORE AND FOUND SECURITY SITUATION NORMAL. AUSTRALIA RELIEF PROGRAMME STARTED DISTRIBUTING FOOD AT TALANGUE. THEY ALSO ESTB A CLINIC IN THAT AREA.

(4) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. MILOBS CARRIED OUT ROUTINE PATROLS IN THE AREAS OF KANZENZE, GAKO AND RUSUMO. HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM WAS CONTINUING WITH THE INVESTIGATION IN THE MASSACRE SITE AT NYARUBUYE. MILOB TEAM ESCORTED HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM TO RUSUMO AND NYARUBUYE.

(5) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA. SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. MILOBS TEAMS CARRIED OUT PTLS AT NYAMABYE GR 7471, MASKA GR 9679, MUSSAMBIRA GR 82 '74, MUGINA GR 93680, NTONGWE GR 89570 AND RUANGO GR 7654. THE BOURGMESTER OF MUSAMBIRA REPORTED ABOUT AN UNEXPLODED MINE IN HIS AREA. ONE RPA SECURITY OFFICER INFORMED THE HUMANITARIAN TEAM THAT AT GISHAMVU GR 6404, TWO PERSONS NAMED KIYANGE JOSHEP AND BONNE WERE KILLED BY A GROUP OF PEOPLE NAMED KUBNIMANA ALPHONSE, SEKIMONYO FAUSTIN, KARISA BOSCO AND KARINANGA INNOCENT ON 26 OCT 94. HE ALSO ADDED THAT ON 27 OCT 94, AT MUBUMBANO GR 6806 FOUR PERSONS WERE KILLED BY MR BUGINGO WHO MANAGED TO ESCAPE AFTER THE INCIDENT. THE RPA OFFICER STATED THAT AT SEKE GR 6303, THREE PERSONS WERE KILLED ON 27 OCT 94. MILOBS TEAMS ARE INVESTIGATING THE MATTERS.

(6) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN AND AROUND THE SECTOR, AND FOUND THE

SECURITY SITUATION TO BE NORMAL. MILOBS TEAM ESCORTED BROWN AND ROOTS CONVOY FROM THE SECTOR TO CYANGUGU.

(7) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. MILOBS CARRIED OUT PTLs AT RUGABANO GR 4266, NDABA GR 4173 AND KIVUMU GR 5573 AND SITUATION WAS NORMAL. PRIMARY SCHOOLS WERE OPENED AT KAGUNGA GR 3859 AND RUTONDE GR 5880 BUT ACUTE SHORTAGE OF TEACHERS AND BOOKS WERE OBSERVED.

(8) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM. MILOBS PATROLLED RWANDA BORDERS WITH ZAIRE AND BURUNDI. ROUTINE PTLs WERE ALSO CONDUCTED IN OTHER AREAS OF THE SECTOR. MILOBS TEAM ESCORTED BROWN AND ROOTS CONVOY FROM KITABI TO CYANGUGU AND BACK. AT KARENGERA GR 9321, THE RPA SEARCHED ONE HOUSE AND FOUND A MACHINE GUN. THEY TOOK THE GUN AND RELEASED THE MAN. ON INQUIRY IT WAS LEARNED THAT MR BISMANA RUDHONYORE, THE OWNER OF THE MACHINE GUN HAD BOUGHT THE GUN FROM INTERAHAMWE DURING THE WAR.

(9) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT IN THE AREA OF BORDER POSTS, RUHENGERI, CYANIKA GR 7152, KINIGI GR 5440, GATONDE GR 6117 AND BISOKE GR 449393. SECTOR COMD AND HAC TEAM HAD MEETING WITH RPA BDE COMD ON THE ISSUE OF RELEASING THE TWO JOURNALISTS OF ASSOCIATED PRESS, MR JARROD HARLOW AND MR GRAHAM WALSH. THEY WERE ARRESTED ON 27 OCT 94 BY RPA FROM 10 KM SOUTH OF RUHENGERI. THEY WERE MAKING DOCUMENTARY FILMS WITHOUT AUTHORITY AND ALSO WERE INQUIRING ABOUT RPA DEPLOYMENT. PRESENTLY THEY WERE PUT IN HOTEL URMULI UNDER OPEN ARREST. THE JOURNALIST STATED THAT THEY WERE TREATED NICELY. 17 OUT 20 SUSPECTED PERSONS HELD AT GATONDE COMMUNE FOR VARIOUS OFFENCES WERE RELEASED AFTER PRELIMINARY INVESTIGATIONS WERE CONDUCTED LOCALLY.

(10) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. SITUATION IN KIGALI REMAINED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. ONE MILOB TEAM ESCORTED 418 DPs FROM KIGALI TO NGENDA AND ESCORTED BACK TO KIGALI ANOTHER 100 DPs. 392 DPs WERE ESCORTED FROM KIGALI TO KIBUNGO BY THE MILOBS WHILE 209 DPs WERE BROUGHT BACK TO KIGALI.

DAILY SITREP FOR 27 OCT 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. GHANBATT REPORTED THAT APPROX 200 PEOPLE HAVE ARRIVED AT THE RUKONDO CAMP (GR 5538) FROM 2 COMMUNES IN THE GITARAMA PREFECTURE. THEY REPORTED ALLEGED KILLINGS AND HARASSMENT ON THE PART OF THE RPA. 12 PEOPLE ARE REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN KILLED BY THE RPA ON 4 OCT 94 AND BURIED IN A MASS GRAVE IN KIGOMA.

B. 10 LOCALS FROM NSHILI (GR 3946) WERE INJURED IN A GRENADE EXPLOSION IN RUSEKE (GR 5100). THEY WERE TAKEN TO THE BRITISH MEDICAL CENTRE IN KIBEHO (GR 5007). ALL OF THE WOUNDED WERE ATTACKED BY A GROUP OF MEN WITH HAND GRENADES WHO ATTEMPTED TO STEAL THE BEER THAT THEY WERE CARRYING. 3 MEN WERE LATER ARRESTED BY GHANBATT.

C. IN SECTOR 1, IT WAS REPORTED THAT A PATROL VISITED NGARAMA (GR 269301) AND NYAGATARE (GR 372572). THE DEPUTY CHAIRMAN OF NGARAMA CLAIMED THAT ABOUT 25,000 OF THE PEOPLE WHO HAD FLED THE AREA DURING THE WAR HAD RETURNED. IN NYAGATARE THE PATROL REPORTED A VERY HOSTILE ATTITUDE ON THE PART OF THE RPA. THE RPA STATED THAT UNAMIR TROOPS WOULD NOT BE ALLOWED TO PATROL THE AREA IN FUTURE UNLESS AN OFFICIAL LETTER AUTHORISING SUCH A PATROL IS PRESENTED.

D. MILOB COMMANDER IN SECTOR 5 ATTEMPTED TO LOCATE 2 JOURNALISTS WHO WERE REPORTED MISSING ON THE EVENING OF 27 OCT 94. THE TWO JOURNALISTS WERE LAST SEEN BY WFP STAFF NEAR RUHENGARI PREFECTURE ON 26 OCT 94 WHEN THEY CLAIMED THAT THEY WERE IN TROUBLE AND APPEARED TO BE "UNDER CONTROL" OF THE RPA. RPA IN THE AREA KNEW NOTHING OF THE CLAIMS AND THE JOURNALISTS COULD NOT BE FOUND IN THE RPA HQ OR THE LOCAL PRISON. IT IS COMMENTED THAT THE JOURNALISTS MAY BE UNDER HOUSE ARREST OR MAY HAVE BEEN RELEASED AND RETURNED TO KIGALI.

E. MILOBS VISITED THE COMMUNE OF TAMBWE (GR 7653) TO INVESTIGATE REPORTS OF ARRESTS BY THE RPA. THE COMMUNE LEADER TOLD THEM THAT THOSE ARRESTED WERE HELD IN THE COMMUNE PRISON OR TRANSFERRED TO ANOTHER DESIGNATED PRISON. HE CLAIMED THAT PROPER RECORDS OF TRANSFERS WERE KEPT. RECORDS SHOWED THAT 81 PEOPLE HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BY THE RPA SINCE 19 OCT 94. MILOBS COULD NOT FIND ANY OF THE NAMES THAT THEY HAD BEEN GIVEN OF PEOPLE WHOM LOCALS CLAIM TO HAVE BEEN ARRESTED BUT WILL CONTINUE TO INVESTIGATE.

F. ABOUT 500 PEOPLE SURROUNDED FRAFATT HQ ON 27 OCT 94. THE PEOPLE CAME FROM VILLAGES IN THE KIRUYE AREA AND THEY CLAIMED THAT THE RPA WERE GOING TO CARRY OUT MASSACRES.

FRAFBATT SENT OUT PATROLS INTO THE AREA AND NOTHING WAS FOUND TO INDICATE ANYTHING OUT OF THE ORDINARY.

MILOBS FROM SECTOR 4B REPORTED THAT THEY FOUND 19 BODIES IN THE AREA AND THAT THERE COULD BE MORE. A FULL REPORT ON THE INCIDENT WILL BE SENT LATER. THE RPA ARE REPORTED TO HAVE INCREASED THEIR STRENGTH IN THE AREA TO ABOUT A COY PLUS DRESSED IN CIVILIAN CLOTHES. RPA PREVENTED THE MILOBS FROM ENTERING THE AREA TO INVESTIGATE KILLINGS.

(4) ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT THE RPA KILLED 5 PEOPLE NEAR TO KAMEMBE COMMUNAL OFFICE (GR 8131). THE RPA CLAIMED THAT ALL OF THOSE KILLED HAD PREVIOUSLY WOUNDED AN RPA SOLDIER.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBATT AND ONE PL NICOY). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS WITHIN AO.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT).

(1) CONTINUED DAY AND NIGHT, FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS WITHIN AOR. DETAILED STANDING PATROL DET AT THE REMERA BORDER POST GR 4192 AND OBSERVED 6 MEN, 11 WOMEN AND CHILDREN CROSS INTO RWANDA ON FOOT.

(4) CONTINUED TO MAN PERMANENT CHECK POINTS AT GIKONGORO, RURAMBA, RWAMIKO AND KITABI. 118 DPs WERE GIVEN MED TREATMENT BY OWN MED STAFF AT MURAMBI GR 5128. PROVIDED SECURITY AT MUSEBEYA GR 3933 FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF BLANKETS BY THE BOURGMESTER OF THE COMMUNE.

DAILY SITREP FOR 26 OCT 94

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS GENERALLY CALM ALTHOUGH:

A. MILOBS REPORTED THAT RPA WERE STILL PURSUING THEIR AIM OF GETTING DPs OUT OF NDABA CAMPS IN SECTOR 4B.

B. IN SECTOR 4B, FRAFBATT REPORTED THAT THERE HAD BEEN KILLINGS AT GR 2656. ACCORDING TO THE RPA 11 ELMS OF INTERAHAMWE AMBUSHED AN RPA PATROL OF 4 SOLDIERS IN THAT LOC. INVESTIGATIONS ARE GOING ON FOR MORE DETAILS. 4 PEOPLE WERE KILLED AT THE SAME LOCATION ON TUESDAY 18 OCT 94.

C. IN SECTOR 4A, GHANBATT REPORTED THAT FIVE LOCALS WERE KILLED AND ABOUT 30 OTHERS ABDUCTED AT CYAFURWE GR 5317. REPORTS FROM LOCALS INDICATED THAT RPA WERE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE KILLINGS.

D. MILOBS IN SECTOR 5 REPORTED AN RPA HOUSE LOCATED AT KINGORO GR 2726 GOT BURNED DOWN ON 23 OCT 94 DUE FIRE STARTED THROUGH CARELESSNESS OF ONE OF THEIR SOLDIERS. CONSIDERABLE AMMO STORED IN THE HOUSE MADE A RATHER SPECTACULAR FIRE. THE FIRE WAS REPORTED OBSERVED BY MANY PEOPLE IN KUIMBA CAMP, ZAIRE. FALSE RUMOURS CIRCULATING IN THE AREA INDICATE THAT RPA WAS BURNING HOMES AND KILLING CIVILIANS.

E. IN SECTOR 4B, RPA INTENSIFIED THEIR SEARCHES IN ROAD BLOCKS IN THE AREA. GENERAL POPULATION IN KIBUYE WERE STILL APPREHENSIVE BECAUSE OF RPA ACTIVITIES. TENSION BETWEEN RPA AND LOCALS WERE REPORTED AT GISOVU GR 2952 WITH THE WITHDRAWAL OF FRAFBATT PL FROM THE AREA. SITUATION BEING MONITORED BY MILOBS.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

(4) STAFF OF TAC HQ BUTARE AND UNHCR REP FLEW BY HELI TO RECCE AREA OF BRIDGE AT GR 9647. THE PURPOSE WAS TO ACCESS SUITABILITY OF AREA FOR ESTB OF WAY STN WHEN MOVING DPs FROM SECTOR 4 TO SOUTHERN PART OF SECTOR 2. RECCE WAS SUCCESSFUL.

B. SECTOR 1 (NICOY). BN CO, RPA AND PREFECTURE MET TO DECIDE ON AN ALTERNATIVE LOC FOR HQ. A RECOMMENDED LOC WILL BE COMMUNICATED TO NICOY AS SOON AS POSSIBLE. CONDUCTED PTLS IN AREA OF GATUNA. ANOTHER PTL WENT ALONG RWANDA/TANZANIA BORDER AND DISCOVERED A FEMALE DEAD BODY FLOATING IN AKAGARE RIVER GR 870386. PRESSMEN WERE ALSO PRESENT.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBATT AND ONE PL NICOY). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS WITHIN AO.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT). THE DEFENCE MINISTER PAID UNANOUNCED VISIT TO GIKONGORO.

(1) CONTINUED DAY AND NIGHT, FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS WITHIN AOR. DETAILED STANDING PATROL DET AT THE REMERA BORDER POST GR 4192 AND OBSERVED 45 MEN, 17 WOMEN AND 23 CHILDREN CROSSED INTO BURUNDI TO PURCHASE COMMODITIES AND BACK WHILE 15 OTHER MEN AND 4 WOMAN ALSO CROSSED INTO RWANDA TO SELL FARM PRODUCTS.

(2) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE GUARDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE AND AICF WAREHOUSE AT CYANIKA GR 5530. CONTINUED TO MAN PERMANENT CHECK POINTS AT GIKONGORO, RURAMBA, RWAMIKO AND KITABI. CO PAID ROUTINE VISIT TO SOUTHERN PART OF AO. OWN MED STAFF TREATED 98 LOCALS AT MURAMBI GR 5128.

(3) DEPLOYMENT OF 1 X MECH SECTION EACH AT MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES CONTINUED. PROVIDED SECURITY FOR ICRC DISTRIBUTE FOOD TO LOCALS AT RUNYOMBYI GR 4893 AND BUSANZE GR 4491 CAMPS.

(3) PROVIDED GUARD FOR UNREO AND CLOSE OBSERVATION FOR HSF, MSF UNHCR OFFICES AND RESIDENCES. 256 REFUGEES WERE REPATRIATED TO RWANDA FROM ZAIRE VIA RUSIZI AND BUGARAMA WHILE A TOTAL OF 66 WERE ALSO REPATRIATED FROM BURUNDI TO RWANDA VIA BUGARAMA.

H. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). TROOPS CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS WITHIN AO. FC VISITED BN HQ AND RECEIVED BRIEFING ABOUT THE GEN SITUATION IN THE AREA.

I. MILOB GP. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN ALL SECTORS AND SITUATION WAS GENERALLY CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) MILOB GP HQ CARRIED OUT PLANNING, COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOB SECTORS' ACTIVITIES CARRIED

THE CUSTOM OFFICER ALSO INFORMED THE TEAM THAT ONE MILLION CATTLE ALSO ENTERED RWANDA FROM UGANDA DURING THE SAME PERIOD. THE GEN SECURITY SITUATION WAS CALM. MILOBS TEAM MONITORED THE DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD BY ADRA (NGO) AT MUVUMBA GR 2747 COMMUNE.

(4) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. MILOBS PATROLLED THE AREA OF RUSUMO AND NYARUBUYE, SECURITY SITUATION WAS NORMAL. THE PREFECT OF KIBUNGO INFORMED MILOBS THAT BANDITS FROM TANZANIA WERE ENTERING RWANDA, IN THE GENERAL AREA OF LAKE NASHO AND WERE HARASSING LOCALS. A GOOD NUMBER OF LOCALS WERE ALSO EVACUATED FROM THAT AREA AS RPA STARTED SECURING THAT PLACE. 282 DPs WERE ESCORTED BY MILOBS TO GASHORA AND KIBUNGO COMMUNE.

(5) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA. SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(6) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS IN AND AROUND THE SECTOR, AND FOUND SECURITY SITUATION TO BE NORMAL. PRIME MINISTER OF RWANDA ARRIVED AT GIKONGORO FOR A VISIT.

1. GEN SITUATION. THE MILITARY SITUATION IN RWANDA WAS GENERALLY CALM, THE LEVEL OF FEAR AMONG THE LOCAL POPULATION HAS INCREASED AS A RESULT OF INCREASED BANDITRY AND SUSPECTED INTERAHAMWE ACTIVITIES IN SECTORS 4A, 4B AND 4C.

A. IN SECTOR 4B, THE SOUS PREFECT OF BIRAMBO ADDRESSED A MEETING OF DPs AND RE-EMPHASIZED RPA ULTIMATUM THAT THEY MUST VACATE THE CAMP BEFORE 29 OCT 94.

B. ETHIOBATT REPORTED THAT RPA HAS RELEASED ONE OF THEIR INTERPRETERS WHOM THEY ARRESTED IN BUGARAMA GR 8907 ON 20 OCT 94.

C. IN SECTOR 4A, BETWEEN 250300B - 250500B OCT 94 FOUR ARMED ELMS DRESSED IN MILITARY UNIFORM ATTACKED KANYINYA GR 5621. 4 LOCALS REPORTED KILLED AND 2 OTHERS SERIOUSLY WOUNDED. GHANBATT PTL TEAM DETAILED TO MENTIONED LOCATION FOUND 22 X 5.56MM EMPTY CASES. REPORTS FROM LOCALS INDICATE THAT RPA SUSPECTED TO BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE ACT.

D. IN SECTOR 4B, FRAFBATT REPORTED THAT INFORMATION RECEIVED FROM LOCALS INDICATE THAT A NUMBER OF PEOPLE HAD BEEN KILLED IN THE AREA OF GR 2756. INVESTIGATIONS UNDERWAY.

E. IN SECTOR 4C, AT ABOUT MIDNIGHT 24/25 OCT, BANDITS SHOT AND KILLED ONE MR MONTAKASI AND HIS WIFE AT RUVUNGURA GR 8713. THE MAN, A SHOP OWNER AT BUGARAMA WAS ORDERED TO SURRENDER CASH BUT HE REFUSED. THE SAME GROUP OF BANDITS WERE REPORTED TO HAVE ROBBED ANOTHER PERSONS OF CASH AND PROPERTY IN THE SAME TOWN.

F. TWO UNHCR OFFICIALS AND THE ASSISTANT PREFECT OF GISENYI HELD A MEETING WITH THE ASSISTANT PREFECT OF KIBUYE TO COORDINATE THE RESETTLEMENT OF RETURNEES AND DPs IN KIBUYE PREFECTURE.

B. HE THEN MET WITH MR. MEDILI, DIRECTOR OF THE DIVISION OF ADMINISTRATION, FOD' TO DISCUSS ADMINISTRATIVE MATTERS.

C. THE SRSG HELD CONSULTATIONS WITH PRIME MINISTER TWAGIRAMUNGU TO DISCUSS THE OVERALL SITUATION IN RWANDA.

3. FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.

A. RPA THE RPA CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS AND MOUNT ROAD BLOCKS THROUGHOUT THE COUNTRY.

(1) ON 24 OCT 94, A HIGH RANKING OFFICERS OF RPA ADDRESSED THE PEOPLE GIKUNDAHURA GR 9309 AND EXPLAINED REASONS FOR CORDON AND SEARCH OPERATIONS IN THAT AREA. 5 RPA SOLDIERS WERE CANNED IN FRONT OF THE CROWD FOR MISCONDUCT DURING THE OPERATION.

(2) RPA CARRIED OUT RELIEF IN PLACE AND TO REDUCED STR OF TROOPS AT REMERA GR 415916 TO PLATOON MINUS.

(3) IN SECTOR 3, RPA WAS REPORTED TO HAVE ARRESTED ONE MR KANEZA JEAN BAPTISTE ON 23 OCT 94 AT KIBUYE AND TAKEN TO GITARAMA ON 24 OCT 94.

(4) IN SECTOR 4B, RPA TROOPS WERE SEEN DEPLOYING

ALONG THE LAKE BETWEEN GISHYITA GR 2162 AND NYABINAGA GR 1350.

(5) IN SECTOR 4C, IT WAS REPORTED THAT RPA SOLDIERS KILLED A CIVILIAN NAMED DONATGATABORIA ANDRA AROUND MWITO AT GR 8634 IN THE MORNING. THE RPA SOLDIERS CONFIRMED OF KILLING THE MAN BUT ALLEGED THAT THE MAN WAS A CRIMINAL, AND HAD PREVIOUSLY KILLED AN RPA SOLDIER.

(6) IN SECTOR 5, IOM REPORTED THAT ONE OF ITS EMPLOYEES WAS DELIBERATELY HIT BY AN RPA VEH WHILE DRIVING A MOTORCYCLE IN CYANGUGU.

(7) AN RPA COY MINUS WERE OBSERVED FROM RUHENGIRI HEADING TOWARDS GISENYI IN A SINGLE FILE ON 251600B OCT 94 WITH ARMS AND EQUIPMENT.

B. RGF NTR.

C. MILITIA LOCALS OF NYABUYONE GR 517512 REPORTED THAT BANDITS SUSPECTED TO BE INTERAHAMWE ATTACKED A HOME AT THE VILLAGE WITH A GREN. THE GREN HIT A WALL AND EXPLODED AND THE BANDITS FLED LEAVING BEHIND ONE GREN WHICH WAS TAKEN BY RPA SOLDIERS.

4. OWN MILITARY ACTIVITIES

THE GEN SIT IS CALM AND THE MAJOR COFFEE FACTORY IN THE AREA IS FUNCTIONING. THE SECTOR HQ WAS STILL CLOSED AND DESERTED. MED ASSISTANCE WERE RENDERED TO 78 LOCALS IN OWN LOC BY RMO. IN KIBUNGO UNHCR DISTRIBUTED RELIEF MATERIALS TO DPs IN THE TOWN.

C. SECTOR 2 (ONE PL GHANBATT AND ONE PL NICOY). REPORTED UNDER RESPECTIVE CONTINGENTS.

D. SECTOR 3 (MALAWICOY AND MALICOY). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS WITHIN AO.

E. SECTOR 4A (GHANBATT).

(1) CONTINUED DAY AND NIGHT, FOOT AND MOBILE PATROLS WITHIN AOR. DETAILED STANDING PATROL AT THE REMERA BORDER POST GR 4192 AND OBSERVED 32 MEN, 15 WOMEN AND 10 CHILDREN CROSSED INTO BURUNDI TO PURCHASE COMMODITIES AND BACK. 4 OTHER CHILDREN AND 2 MEN ALSO CROSSED FROM BURUNDI TO THEIR FARMS IN RWANDA AND BACK.

(2) CONTINUED TO PROVIDE GUARDS AT CENTRE DE SANTE AND AICF WAREHOUSE AT CYANIKA GR 5530. CONTINUED TO MAN PERMANENT CHECK POINTS AT GIKONGORO, RURAMBA, RWAMUKO AND KITABI. PROVIDED SECURITY FOR 500 DPs TO BE EVACUATED FROM RUNYINYA GR 4921 TO KIGALI.

(3) DEPLOYMENT OF 1 X MECH SECTION EACH AT MATA AND KITABI TEA FACTORIES CONTINUED. PROVIDED SECURITY FOR ICRC DISTRIBUTE FOOD TO LOCALS AT MUNINI, RUNYOMBYI GR 4893 WHILST TROCARE ALSO DISTRIBUTED MAIZE, BEANS, CABBAGE SEEDS AND HOES TO THE LOCALS AT SAME LOCATION. SOLIDARITE ALSO CONTINUED DISTRIBUTING BLANKETS TO DPs AT MUSEBEYA GR 3933.

(4) DISTRIBUTION OF FOOD, BLANKETS AND SOAP TO LOCALS WERE ALSO CARRIED OUT BY SAVE THE CHILDREN FUND AT RWAMIKO GR 4913 WHILST AICF DISTRIBUTED BLANKETS AND WINNEMIX AT KIBEHO GR 5007.

(5) DFC PAID A WORKING VISIT TO TROOPS AT KARAMA GR 5531.

F. SECTOR 4B (FRAFATT). CONTINUED TO CONDUCT CHECK POINT DUTIES WITHIN AO. CARRIED OUT PTLs TO MUBUGA 2364, KADUHA GR 4743, MUKO GR 3840 AND GISOVU GR 2750. MOVEMENT OF ABOUT 300 DPs WERE OBSERVED FROM THE AREA OF GISOVU GR 2750 TOWARDS MUKO GR 3840 ON FOOT. DPs CLAIM TO BE AFRAID OF RPA REPRISALS.

G. SECTOR 4C (ETHIOBATT).

(1) CONDUCTED DAY AND NIGHT, MOBILE AND FOOT PATROLS WITHIN AOR. BN 2IC VISITED BUGARAMA AND GOMBANER TO SECURITY SITUATION IN THE AREA. PROVIDED A PLACE FOR ICRC TO INSTALL THEIR REPEATER STN.

(2) DEPLOYED 1 X MECH SQUAD AT ICRC STOCK GR 7826, 2 X MECH SQUADS AT STADIUM STOCK GR 7224, 2 X MECH SQUADS FOR MDM HOSPITAL IN KAMEMBE GR 7826, 1 X MECH SQUAD FOR KAMEMBE AIRPORT GR 7827. MED TEAM TREATED 23 LOCAL DENTAL PATIENTS.

(3) PROVIDED GUARD FOR UNREO AND CLOSE OBSERVATION FOR HSF, MSF UNHCR OFFICES AND RESIDENCES. ESCORTED UNHCR CONVOY OF 389 REFUGEES, 238 OUT OF THEM PROCEEDING TO BUTARE AND THE REST TO KIBUYE FROM NYAGATARE GR 8024 TO KITABI GR 3520 AND KILIMBI GR 1049 RESPECTIVELY. 44 REFUGEES WERE REPATRIATED TO

RWANDA FROM ZAIRE TO RWANDA.

H. SECTOR 5 (TUNBATT). TROOPS CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS WITHIN AO. 1 X MECH PL ALSO CONDUCTED PTLs IN THE AREA OF SHINGIRO GR 4936. A TRAFFIC ACCIDENT OCCURRED ON THE 25 OCT AT 1100 HRS, WHEN A TUNBATT WATER TANKER BOTHERED BY A CIVILIAN TRUCK GOT OUT OF CONTROL AND HIT A HILL CLIFF. OWN MED STAFF ASSISTED AN INJURED MAN WITH FIRST AID AND LATER TRANSFERRED HIM TO RUHENGIRI HOSP.

I. MILOB GP. CONTINUED TO CONDUCT PATROLS IN ALL SECTORS AND SITUATION WAS GENERALLY CALM DURING THE PERIOD.

(1) MILOB GP HQ PLANNING, COORDINATION AND MONITORING OF MILOB SECTORS' ACTIVITIES CARRIED OUT OVER THE PERIOD. ASSISTANCE WAS ALSO GIVEN TO UNREO AND NGOS.

(3) IN SECTOR 1-BYUMBA. THE SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM AND MILOBS TEAMS PATROLLED BYUMBA, NGARAMA, NYAGATARE AND KAGITUMBA AREAS. MILOBS MONITORED GATUNA AND KAGITUMBA BORDER AND REPORTED NORMAL TRAFFIC WITH ABOUT 50 RETURNEES FROM UGANDA ENTERING RWANDA DAILY.

(4) IN SECTOR 2-KIBUNGO. MILOBS PATROLLED AND MONITORED ACTIVITIES ALONG THE RWANDA - TANZANIA BORDER AND REPORTED INFLOW OF RETURNEES AT RUSUMO BORDER THE PERIOD. SECURITY SITUATION FOUND TO BE NORMAL WITHIN SECTOR. MILOBS LIAISED WITH UNREO AND DISCUSSED THE HUMANITARIAN SITUATION IN THE SECTOR.

(5) IN SECTOR 3-GITARAMA. SECTOR WAS REPORTED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. ONE MILOB TEAM WENT TO KADABO TO INVESTIGATE MURDER OF TWO PERSONS ON 23/24 OCT 94. ANOTHER MILOB TEAM ALSO WENT TO THE BORDER POST AT NGOZI GR 7089 TO MONITOR MOVEMENT OF RETURNEES. A MILOB TEAM ESCORTED HUMNA RIGHTS TEAM TO SAVE GR 7419 TO INVESTIGATE MASSACRE DONE BY FORMER RGF SOLDIERS. WHILE THE TEAM WAS RETURNING TO BASE, FOUND A WOUNDED MAN NAMED GASPARD AT MBAZI GR 7216 AND ASSISTED TO BE EVACUATED TO BUTARE FOR MEDICAL ATTENTION. IT WAS LATER LEARNT THAT MR. GASPARD WAS ASSAULTED BY A GROUP OF PEOPLE LED BY ONE BUEYANA GODEFROID. INVESTIGATION UNDERWAY BY CIVPOL AND MILOBS.

(6) SECTOR 4A-GIKONGORO. MILOBS CONDUCTED ROUTINE PATROLS AND CARRIED OUT MONITORING DUTIES AT THE BORDERS IN AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY AND REPORTED LOW VEHICULAR AND PEDESTRIAN TRAFFIC IN AND OUT OF RWANDA. SECURITY SITUATION IN SECTOR WAS CALM.

(7) IN SECTOR 4B-KIBUYE. AREA OF OPERATION WAS REPORTED CALM. MILOB CARRIED OUT PATROLS IN THE KIBUYE - BIRAMBO AREA TO ASSESS THE SITUATION IN THE DPs CAMPS AFTER THE RPA ULTIMATUM.

(8) IN SECTOR 4C-CYANGUGU. THE SECTOR WAS CALM DURING THE PERIOD EXCEPT FOR RAMPANT BANDITRY IN CERTAIN PART OF THE SECTOR. ROUTINE PATROLS WERE CARRIED OUT AT IN THE GEN AREA OF RUSIZI GR 7624, MUGERERO GR 8625, KAKABAGA GR 8932, MURAMBI GR 8425 AND BASMANGA GR 8625, MILOBS ESCORTED A CONVOY OF BROWN AND ROOTS TRUCKS TO KIBUYE.

(9) IN SECTOR 5-GISENYI. ONE MILOB TEAM PATROLLED THE AREA OF GISENYI AND BORDER POST. TEAM LIAISED WITH 4TH COY OF TUNBATT LOC AT NAVAL ACADEMY AND VISITED CATHEDRAL AT NYUNDO GR 248117. ANOTHER TEAM PATROLLED THE AREA OF RUHengeri AND CYANIKA GR 7152 AND LIAISED WITH IMMIGRATION OFFICIALS AT THE BORDER POST AND TUNBATT BN HQ. TWO OTHER TEAMS PATROLLED AREA OF KINIGI GR 5440, BISCOKE GR 449393 AND KARISOKE RESEARCH CENTRE GR 428360. ONE PTL ESCORTED MSF MEDICAL TEAM TO KAREBA HEALTH POST GR 417253.

(10) IN SECTOR 6-KIGALI. THE SITUATION IN KIGALI AND ITS SUBURBS REMAINED CALM DURING THE PERIOD. SECTOR MILOBS ESCORTED UNHCR TRUCKS WITH A TOTAL OF 44 DPs FROM KIGALI TO NYAMATA AND BYUMBA. 13 OF THOSE PEOPLE SENT TO BYUMBA WERE RETURNED TO KIGALI SINCE THE AUTHORITIES CLAIMED THEY HAD NO FACILITIES TO RESETTLE THEM THERE.

(2) TROOPS OF THE TSG AT BUTARE TREATED 166 MEDICAL PATIENTS AND 13 DENTAL PATIENTS. CLINICS WERE CONDUCTED AT KIBEHO.
