2. NIGHT FLYING DOES NOT TAKE PLACE BECAUSE OF THE RESTRICTIONS OF THE CIVILIAN FLIGHT REGULATIONS UNDER WHICH THE CANADIAN HELICOPTER CORPORATION PILOTS MUST OPERATE.
3. FOR NIGHT FLYING OPERATION THE FOLLOWING RULES ARE APPLICABLE:
 - A. NAVIGATIONAL AIDS LIKE NDB AND/OR VOR-DME SHOULD BE AVAILABLE ON HELIPADS FOR TAKE OFF AND LANDING.
 - GPS ONLY IS NOT CERTIFIED (I.E. NOT LEGAL) FOR NIGHT FLYING UNDER CIVILIAN REGULATIONS.
 - I WILL REQUEST PORTABLE NDB EQUIPMENT FROM UN NY.
 - B. HELIPADS AND FIELD HELIPADS MUST BE LIT FOR TAKE OFF AND LANDING. I WILL FIND OUT WHICH THE SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS ARE FOR LIGHTING OF THE HELIPAD AND REQUEST THE APPROPRIATE EQUIPMENT FROM UN NY.
 - C. ROUTES FOR NIGHT FLIGHTS MUST BE APPROVED IN DAYLIGHT HOURS TO ESTABLISH HEIGHTS ETC.
 - D. REQUIREMENT AS ALTITUDE IS CONCERNED: 1000 FT ABOVE THE HIGHEST OBSTACLE 5 MILES EACH SIDE OF THE ROUTE.

WITH REFERENCE TO OUR CONVERSATION REGARDING THE REQUEST FOR HELICOPTER FLIGHTS INTO RWANDA. I HAVE BEEN ADVISED BY CANADIAN HELICOPTERS IN CANADA THAT THE SITUATION REMAINS UNCHANGED. THE INSURANCE COMPANY POLICY WILL ALLOW FLIGHTS INTO THE KIGALI AIRPORT ONLY, THE AIRCRAFT MAY REMAIN ON THE GROUND AT KIGALI FOR 5 HOURS ONLY. THIS MAY BE EXTENDED TO A MAXIMUM OF 12 HOURS AT A HIGHER INSURANCE PREMIUM. NO OTHER LANDING SITES IN RWANDA ARE APPROVED BY THE INSURANCE. ALSO BEFORE ANY FLIGHT INTO KIGALI, CANADIAN HELICOPTERS IN CANADA MUST BE NOTIFIED.

THIS IS THE SITUATION AS OF THE DATE BUT IT MAY BE REVISED DEPENDING UPON THE STATUS OF THE CONFLICT IN RWANDA. I REMAIN.

1. During the reference, this Headquarters was made aware by the Chief Finance Officer that the UNMO Personnel returns from MILOB Group have been submitted in a totally unacceptable manner. The accusation from the CFinO is that these reports, which are critical for MSA payment, have been consistently late in arriving at the Finance Office, have been consistently incomplete and are extremely suspect (i.e. they never record that any UNMO has ever left the Mission Area).

2. This accusation, if true, is extremely serious due to the fact that faulty personnel accounting records can be viewed as criminal fraud involving MSA payment.

3. You are accordingly directed to have your headquarters staff investigate this matter immediately.

4. Meanwhile, I would like the following data to be provided:

a. A nominal roll of all UNMOs in UNAMIR to include their rank, name, initials, country, ID number, arrival date, repatriation date and their complete attendance since their arrival in theatre by day. This nominal roll will show the dates that every UNMO has been outside the mission area.

b. The monthly report for March 1994 showing complete attendance in-theatre of the UNMOs in UNAMIR.


c. What action you have taken to ensure that this accusation is investigated and, if accurate, what action has been taken to ensure it does not occur again in the future.

d. Recommendations, if warranted, for disciplinary action against the responsible officers.

5. These reports, that you will submit and verify, will be submitted for audit. Your staff, if necessary, will work the

next 30 hours to ensure this report is completed in an accurate manner and on time.

6. This is a serious allegation and matter which could result in severe disciplinary action. It, therefore, merits your personal, urgent attention.


Subject: Reassignment

Remarks:

1. There is no need for agreement or disagreement in a staff section. The assistant should try to work in the spirit of his chief instead of trying to force through his own ideas.
2. More specifically, Maj PAZIK refuses to work on a UNAMIR-plan, based on RGF-proposals, for the simple reason that he personally disagrees with them. This is not professional.
3. I believe that a lack of loyalty causes the problem. An illustration of this is following incident. Maj PAZIK left the office on Friday 25/2 at 1130 hours, telling that it was for "POLISH business". I saw him back on Monday 28/2 at 0800 hours. He never gave any explanation of what he has been doing during that period.
4. I support the request of Maj PAZIK.



1. This is to acknowledge receipt of reference B, which lists out the routine duties of MILOBS as requested by reference A.
2. It is noted with concern that, though the number of MILOBS required to carry out assigned duties as stipulated by the Mandate is below our expectation, the shift system in operation, vide reference B, allows 24 hours off-duty and in certain cases, more. These off-duty days taken in conjunction with CTO most likely reduces the effectiveness of UNAMIR to have its presence adequately felt since the observers form our first line of contact with the local population.
3. You are to review the current shift system, being run with a view to maximizing personnel availability. If this is not implemented, CTO granted to those running the shift system can no longer be justified.
4. Your full support in this direction is anticipated.

This is forwarded to register an official protest concerning the following incidents:


On 25 February 1994, the Commanding Officer of the Third Battalion, located at the CND, refused to allow our Military Observers and armed escorts entry into the CND building to carry out their legitimate duties. He even threatened to drive out those already deployed on duty inside the CND building. This behaviour is a flagrant show of disrespect by the Commanding Officer to UNAMIR and the United Nations. It is also a violation of the Peace Agreement.

Reports reaching this Headquarters also indicate that RPA troops are deploying in the following locations in the Demilitarized Zone (DMZ). The DMZ Sector Commander raised these violations with the RPF Liaison Officer in charge of these areas without any success. We discussed this subject yesterday at your Headquarters.

I strongly count on your full support to the DMZ Sector Commander in implementing the immediate withdrawal of the RPA troops from these locations.





1. I arrived at Giesenyi and met Team G-601 at their hotel where they are temporarily residing and had made a makeshift office at one end of the Verandah of the hotel, quite cleverly selected and secured.
2. I received a very detail and informative brief from their Team leader Maj Rynckovski from Russia.
3. The content of that brief is enclosed for your perusal.
4. The next morning of the 16th Feb 94 I went early near the border to monitor movement of population. All that was informed in the attached was totally true. Zairian locals move in freely with their market produce into Giesenyi market which is a walking distance away from the border.
5. At 0830 hrs we proceeded to the Southern part of Giesenyi to observe the movement by water if any but we were turned back by Gendarmerie as they do not recognise or given any instruction of UNAMIR mission in Giesenyi from their superiors.
6. We immediately left for the Gendarmerie HQ to discuss this matter with the Commander. The guards brought a paper stating that only the MILOB team in Giesenyi is authorised to enter and no one else. I tasked the team leader to drive the vehicle and to liaise with the Gendarmerie Commander to allow us in. It took them forty minutes to decide for us to enter.

7. I met the Maj Bizimana Gendarmerie Commander who is soft spoken but confused. I deliver a long lecture of this mission and the observer task and cooperation between MILOBs and the Govt machineries in their respective area of operation more importantly the working relationship of MILOBs, Gendarmerie and the RGF. At the end of the one hour discussion the Gendarmerie Commander was very thankful and assured us that he will immediately contact his subordinate to allow the UNAMIR's free movement in his domain. He added that he would provide also all assistance and security to the MILOB team at Giesenyi. The Gendarmerie Commander requested all necessary paper work for UNAMIR to support him in his operation. I assured him that we will provide the 'SOMA' paper and other relevant communication we did with the Govt in respect to UNAMIR operation in Rwanda. ✓

8. At 1030 hrs we met with the Sector Commander Giesenyi, Lt Col Nsengiyumva who is the overall commander of the RGF component in the Giesenyi prefecture. After the introductory remarks I again went through the something with the RGF Sector Commander in which at the end he gave us his assurance of the maximum possible support they can provide to also including provision of security for the UNAMIR pers in Giesenyi. The Sector Commander revealed that he has two Battalion of about 600 men each which are deployed in Giesenyi prefecture. The Second Battalion includes the Para commander's centre in Bigogue which falls in his area of responsibility. The deployment of his forces is attached at annex 'A'. x

9. I have tasked the team to conduct mobile patrol wef 170800 Feb along the border from Goma boarder to the volcano hills. Gisenyi RGF Sector Commander was requested to provide escort to the team so they could identify on the ground all access points from Ziare to Gisenyi and also to assist us in marking the minefields if any. The team was temporarily loaned 2 x vehicles for this week to enable them to gather as much information as possible. ✓

10. Although it was reported that Gesenyi is calm but the situation is really tense. RGF activities in the area is a cause // x

of concern which should be addressed immediately. I have tasked the RGF/MILOB Sector Commander to immediately conduct investigation on the two incidence reported in para (1) of the attached Team Leader report. It is also requested that a team from UNOMUR to monitor the border of Rwanda/Zaire and Uganda, north of the volcanos as it is believed that a lot of uncontrolled activities is being conducted at this point. The RGF/MILOB Sector Commander has been task to make necessary arrangement to visit that boarder both from Gisenyi and Ruhengeri side.

11. I strongly believe that in Kibuye west of Kigali and between Gisenyi and Cyangugu would be the most active and strategically located town for RGF to traffic man and warlike materials into Kigali. There is a good unsealed road from Kibuye to Gitarama then in to Kigali almost a straight line and is mostly populated with MRND supporters. I had requested an helicopter flight for tomorrow (18 Feb 94) from Kigali, Kibuye. Cyangugu, Butare and return. My intention is to deploy immediately a team to Kibuye but only with the issue of two vehicles and communication.

12. The security situation at Giesenyi is very tense and cannot be overemphasised. The regrouping of the two major ethnic groups and provocations are increasing each day and all it needs is a spark to ignite an armed clash between the two factions.

13. This tense situation is also emerging on the other parts of Rwanda mainly in Rwamagana, Kibingo, Refugees areas in the Butare region, the RPF area and recently at areas in Cyangugu and Butare town where increase demonstration and political activities have been reported.

14. I strongly recommend some priorities be given on logistic support to MILOB team already operating in these areas so they can perform effectively in trying to calm the population down in their area of operation.

15. I will submit a detail assessment on these areas in due course.

SUBJECT: GEN SITUATION IN GIESENYI

1. The situation in Giesenyi is calm. The local population family support the President of Rwanda. He is from Giesenyi, has a house over here and frequently comes here. Many local people can contact him directly by telephone, but despite the fact that he is strongly supported by the population, people here after the offensive last year of RPF strongly criticise him for supporting the Arusha Peace Agreement. Many people said here; we want to kill tutsi, we can solve this problem quickly. Local population consider, that RPF purpose is to provoke mass clashes in Gisenyi and after that to demand inclusion of Gisenyi in DMZ and in this way to spread the influence of RPF. We have information that on 13.2.94. RGF arrested a bus, full of RPF soldiers, coming from Kigali to Giesenyi for hidden enforcement of Tutsi in Gisenyi.

We were informed also, that 250-300 military men of the Army of Uganda came to RPF zone to reinforce RPF.

2. On the 20/21st Jan 94 of the meeting of Tutsi from Rwanda, Gabon, Zaire took place in Goma People of Gisenyi had seen participants of this meeting, who live in Gisenyi, My team was informed, that tutsi in Gisenyi are afraid of nothing because they have enough weapon.

3. The laxity of custom control in Gisenyi - Goma permits us to conclude, that delivery of weapon from Zaire is possible. The inspection is conducted insufficiently. More over, control of the water area is very weak. Lake is checked by five (5) boats "Zodiak" which are all grounded for repair. Commander from the Army, responsible for boundary on the lake, have only one route of patrolling, as I was informed, people involve in the banana trade are going freely to the other side of lake in Zaire, take

their cheap bananas by boat. There is no control at all on this trading when it is delivered to Gisenyi. The same route could be used for delivery of weapon, because there is no guarding or monitoring conducted on the costal line in Gisenyi. The only reason this mode of travelling by water is not used often is that there are more then five other entry points from Zaire to Gisenyi by road which are almost unmanned. I was promised to be shown a place 70 km away, where delivery is conducted freely and actively. This point is located over the volcano, where boundary of Zaire, Rwanda and Uganda meet.

Conclusion

4. Population in Gisenyi does not want Arusha agreement and UN wants to force Rwandese to adopt it, Gisenyi population want Tutsi to be pushed out after election. Aggressiveness to Tutsi is increasing, mistrust also is increasing. There is possibility of armed provocations and clashes in Gisenyi; there are a number of channels of possible supply of armament to Gisenyi. This information is not confirmed official. One specific character of Gisenyi, expressed dislike to Belgiums. This is important for UNAMIR, because promised evaluation of massacre of December last year is not still declared and it's explained by local population by the fact, that UNAMIR is allegedly ruled by Belgiums and provide hidden support to RPF. The suspicious attitude to team members is ex pressed openly.

5. Gendarmerie force in Gisenyi:

Law and order situation is stable. There are small bands of thieves which have weapons. Rarely they have shooting with gendarmeries (4-5 times a month). Two weeks before 3 of 5 bandits of one group were arrested, Occasionally gendarmeries find hidden weapon in beans or bananas, taken from Zaire to Rwanda.

6. In a day approximately 60-100 people from Gisenyi are going out and coming back from Zaire to Rwanda, and 120 people from Zaire and other countries are coming in to Rwanda. Number and quantity of goods are not subject to control. In prefecture of Gisenyi there are two camps of refugees: approx 400 in NYUNDO, and approx, 300 in NYOROLERO.

G-601 team conducts everyday foot patrols; 2 to custom post and 1 along a shore or in the town. Monitoring is conducted irregularly on the custom post.

7. Team has 6 men in strength, but no vehicles, no radio set's. Foot patrol is inefficient. The area of possible delivery of weapon could not be controlled without vehicles and radio on foot. It's impossible to check over cross - boundary activities. Request also instructions to local gendarmerie, Army and prefecture from superior Rwanda authorities. My team has difficult free movement most of the time and curfew restriction are still imposed in Gisenyi, every 2100 hrs. Local authorities do not know international agreements on UNAMIR MILOBs rights and they only recognise the Government of Rwanda.

1. UNAMIR MILOB Teams have the traditional task of monitoring, and reporting incidence which are affecting or are likely to affect UNAMIR mission in any way. MILOB Team 207 being responsible for monitoring the airport have some specific duties/tasks relating to monitoring of the movement of aircraft, cargo, passengers and the overall security of the airfield area.

2. Pending issuance of the SOP for MILOBs, it is felt necessary to give following specific mission/task to MILOB Team 207 :-

- Monitor arrival and departure of all aircraft at KIGALI airport.
- Find out the last port of take off and the next port of landing of all aircraft that arrives at KIGALI.
- Monitor the passengers. Special attention be given to verify and identify the arrival and departure of VIPs, whether Rwandese or foreigners.
- Monitor and find out the details about the arrival of cargo by cargo aircraft, special flights and normal passenger liner.
- Monitor the security arrangements of the Rwandese Govt as well as the UNAMIR at the airport area. Look for changes in the troops deployment of the RGF (army or Gendarmerie) in the vicinity of the airport.

3. Airport being a sensitive area, I would like to emphasize on sending correct and timely written report of all the incidence and observations by MILOB Team 207 in the form of daily SITREP to KIGALI Sector HQ with an intimation to MILOB GP HQ. In case an incidence needs to be attended to on a priority basis, special SITREP should be forwarded. Emphasise must be given to include following in the daily SITREP :-

- Number and type of arriving and departing aircraft.
- Arrival and departure of VIPs with name, designation,
