Meeting with Mr. Nicholson and Mr. Krakow of the American Red Cross
28 FEB 1957

Mr. Nicholson stressed that there was very great danger with regard to relief within Hungary if there were no inter-governmental action. He believes that the American Red Cross is about the end of its ability to raise funds for this purpose. According to Mr. Nicholson, the American Red Cross has donated about one million dollars of supplies for relief within Hungary.

With regard to the plan of working through the CICR, Mr. Nicholson pointed out that the CICR employs only Swiss nationals. He felt this would cause some difficulty if the programme became larger and he hoped that a way would be found through the cooperation of the Hungarian Red Cross (which is a member of the League of Red Cross Societies) to persuade the CICR to employ trained relief staff even if they were not Swiss nationals.

Meeting at the Department of State

Was chaired by Otis Mulliken, attended by ^{Jin} ~~Gen~~ Colbert of the Eastern European Section, Messrs. Bray and Maconey of the Economic Section (ITR) of the Department of State and Mr. Frechtling, Liaison for State with ICA.

The meeting offered an opportunity for me to explain to those present the UN conception of the relief job in Hungary. The principal points covered have already been mentioned in my memorandum to the Secretary-General of January 4 and my cablegram to de Seynes of January 7. In addition, a number of small technical points were mentioned. I was told that supplies turned over by the US Government to the ICRC carried a statement indicating that they were "a gift of the American people". The ICRC has been trying to get the US authorities to add that these supplies had been given "through the ICRC" but the US did not agree.

I was asked whether the ICRC wished to handle this programme through the UN. I inferred from this question that the ICRC had not indicated this in the course of its negotiations of the pending agreement with the US on supplies.

(Summary)

Sender is disturbed at the absence of concrete action by the United Nations to assist the Hungarian refugees in Austria, and proposes the following scheme: All the refugees, including those who have been in Austria for some years, should be removed to the French Riviera and housed in the big hotels (and any surplus numbers in tents), the holiday-makers at present occupying the hotels to be sent back to their homes to make way for them. From the Riviera, the refugees would be taken by plane and boat to a sub-tropical part of the USA, such as Florida, where they would be similarly housed. Meanwhile, an agricultural region in Canada or Australia, say, would be made available for the establishment of "New Hungary", where the refugees would be settled so as to avoid their dispersal throughout the world.

The financing would be done through the International Bank, which would open a "Hungary account" with contributions from Member States. If the yield is insufficient, additional taxes could be levied in the countries concerned. Help would be given from the special account (a) to refugees; (b), to Austria, which has had the burden of looking after them; (c), to the Red Cross; and (d) to the "New Hungary" in Canada for a ten-year period. The initial rail transport would be provided by the French, Belgian and Netherlands Railways and the transatlantic transport by the USA and Canada, other countries to make aircraft and shipping available if necessary. The Austrian, Swiss, German and Netherlands Red Cross would look after the refugees as long as they remain in Austria and the other European countries would take care of them in France. The refugees themselves would handle the internal administration of the funds.

If the free nations cannot help these refugees, sender concludes, the General Assembly might just as well break up, and this would mark the twilight of western Europe.



Sir,

I have the honour to refer to the recent vote of the Parliament of Canada of the sum of \$1,000,000 to provide for assistance for the victims of the recent tragic events in Hungary. In accordance with that vote, the allocation of the money is to be determined by the Canadian Government.

The information so far available has not yet permitted the Government to determine the most effective allocation of the total amount of \$1,000,000. Taking account inter alia of your urgent requirements, however, the Government has decided to transfer now to the United Nations Refugees Fund the sum of \$250,000 to be charged to this vote. At the same time \$250,000 from this vote is being assigned to the Canadian Red Cross Society. These allocations include the contributions of \$100,000 each which the Government earlier announced its intention of assigning to you and to the Canadian Red Cross Society. The decision to allocate these two contributions of \$250,000 now is without prejudice to the distribution, to be determined as soon as possible, of the remaining \$500,000 voted by the Parliament of Canada for Hungarian Relief.

In accordance with the decision mentioned, I attach herewith a cheque for \$250,000. In transmitting this money, it is my Government's intention that it be used for the provision of relief either within Hungary or among refugees who have left that country as a result of the tragic events which have recently taken place there. It is assumed that the aid financed by this money will be provided impartially on the basis of need. Accordingly it is expected that this relief will be distributed only under effective international supervision to ensure that this criterion is observed.

Dear Myer,

As promised, I am sending you herewith the material which I received from the CICR and from the League of Red Cross Societies concerning resources offered to them. You may not find this extremely helpful inasmuch as the material in many cases does not contain an estimate of the value. This is, however, the best that Mr. Pate and myself could obtain from them. I don't think it should be too difficult however to make an analysis of this material, to check duplication between the two sets of documents, and to estimate the total value. You will note that the Committee information is as at 25th November, whereas that of the Red Cross is as at 24th November.

I should also point out that the material given by the League of Red Cross Societies is certainly more complete as it is a set of country sheets showing gifts actually announced and despatched by the various National Red Cross Societies plus a list of non-Red Cross gifts.


In both documents there is no indication as to which part of the resources have been earmarked for refugees in Austria as against relief in Hungary. As I have already indicated to you, the decision on earmarking for both purposes is taken in Vienna in mutual agreement between the International Committee and the League.

The League of Red Cross Societies will give me as and when issued, revised lists of resources offered to them which, from now on, will be periodically produced in mimeographed form.

I hope the information will be of some help to you.
