Dear Secretary-General,

I am pleased to let you know that the book I am co-editing on global health will be published in May 2015 and will include 96 short essays from eminent persons such as Michelle Bachelet, Joyce Banda, Michael Bloomberg, Gro Harlem Brundtland, Felipe Calderón, Margaret Chan, Bill Clinton, Paul Farmer, Melinda Gates, Jim Yong Kim, Anthony Lake, Graça Machel, and Michel Sidibé.

Last June I invited you to contribute an essay, but I know that you could not participate given the involvement of UN agency heads and others at different levels. Instead, I thought you may be able to write the book's Forward – the most distinguished part of the book. It would be an honor if you would agree to author it.

I would simultaneously like to ask whether you would be willing to participate in a book launch event that is intended to draw attention to health issues in the post-2015 development agenda. I know you were recently at Harvard University. We could launch the book here or at the UN in New York, which I assume would be most convenient for you. Your involvement would be invaluable to all the book's contributors and would go a long way in supporting the post-2015 global health efforts. Thank you in advance for considering this request.

If you were willing to write the book's Forward, it can be any length up to 600 words and it will be due to Oxford University Press by the end of January 2015. I would be pleased to send you any material that might be helpful, especially the book's introduction that my co-editor Steven Hoffman and I drafted (which would follow immediately your Forward), as well as any or all book essays that you would like to read. I am attaching the book's table of contents. If the level of your commitments precludes you from writing a Forward, you could alternatively offer a "blurb" for the back cover that can be as short as 1-2 sentences. We would be delighted to plan a book launch event anytime in May or June 2015 that works around your busy schedule.

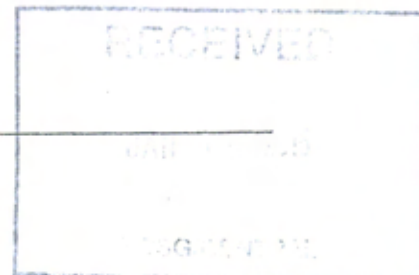

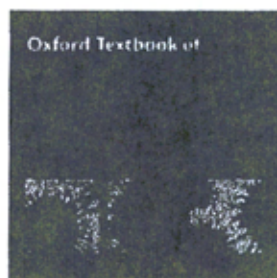

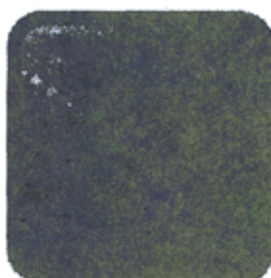
