The area remained generally quiet although ANC conducted checks on many roads in the CITE INDIGENE.

2. A-B. N I L

- C. (1) At 1552 an order was received by the Brigade Comd for a guard to be produced as an escort to take Mr LUMUMBA to the CERCLE ROYALE. The Sudanese and Tunisians were alerted and they produced one sec each. At 1630 these orders were rescinded and instead a force of 3 pls and 4 sections was produced at very short notice. Their mission was to cordon the CERCLE ROYALE and to patrol the route along which the visiting diplomats would pass. At 1705 Mr LUMUMBA's route to the CERCLE ROYALE was ordered to be included in the patrol area. At 1756 Mr LUMUMBA stated he would leave for the reception only with an escort. This was unacceptable and Mr LUMUMBA chose not to go to the party.
- (2) At 1737 2 ANC alleged they had escaped from a house near the President's Residence, where they had been detained by the ANC. They were handed over to the UN.
- (3) At 1500 B in TSHIKAPA the ANC forced FORMINIERE to provide 10 vehs to collect first part 1800 BALUBAS to LULUABOURG. The BALUBAS were to be collected from the village of MAI - MUNENE. Tension increased when a crowd of LULUAS gathered and 3 pls of our tps stood by but the LULUAS dispersed.

The situation has been confused in LEO. It is believed that one Policeman was killed and three civilians wounded on Saturday in fighting between BAYAKA tribesmen. As a result there was a good deal of activity in the CITE INDIGERE with ANC rd blocks on the rds leading into the area. As far as can be determined Radio Brazzaville & AP reports of chaos and violence were grossly exaggerated. Patrols from Sudanese and 1 Ghana R reported that all was orderly.

- C. (1) 231525. Mr OKITO's house was entered by ANC who took away his children. Mr OKITO himself had evaded the searchers, and returned to his house at 1750. The children were returned 240700, 241100.
- (2) 231555. Col KOKOLO arrived to see Mr KASAVUBU and left at 1725.
- (3) 231720. A query was received from Mr DAYAL's office as to where were the joint Ghana/Congolese patrols. As no orders have been received to perform these patrols, we were unable to satisfy the enquirer.
- (4) 240830. Reported - originator Provincial Governor of Leo - that ANC looting at TEM garage AVE KINGABWA. Investigation showed this to be false.
- (5) 241000. A flag march was made at bn str along the AVE DE LA VICTOIRE, after UN Parade at STADE BAUDOUN.

(2) 211030. Flag march at Bn str made up Ave Prince BAUDOUIN broadcasting.

(3) 211411. Approx 60 ANC took up position round studio, refusing entry to the Pl Comd whose section was inside. However, all is now normal there.

(4) 211600. Info received concerning possible attack on Mr LUMUMBA's house. Troops were alerted, but nothing happened.

1. General Situation

Increasing activity was noticeable in town, resulting in stepping up of Ghana Bde patrolling and gds; from 2300 hrs all troops put at 30 mins notice and gd at Mr LUMUMBA's house str by 50 Morroccans, up to 0430 hrs.

2. A. All 3 Ghana R less 200 now mov to TSHIKAPA.

B. N I L

C. (1) ANC river patrol seen at Ferry at 201330.

(2) 201600. Patrol visited Mr KASONGO's house in time to stop Gendarmerie patrol from causing trouble there. At 1735 a gd of 2 men was placed on duty at the house, increased to sec str at 1905.

(3) 201800. Interpreter at LUMUMBA's house beaten up by ANC "because he's always going in and out". Sudanese instructed to escort him in future to avoid repetition of this further example of ANC disregard for the UNO insignia and card.

(4) 201457. Patrol sent to Mr OKITA's house Promenade de la RAQUETTE.

(5) 202230. Rumour that bomb explosion expected at the house occupied by Mr LUMUMBA caused a general stand-to within the Bde. Gds at house substantially reinforced, as was the guard at Broadcasting Studio. At 0345 3 x 3 ton ANC plus some Gendarmerie arr at studio reported to be led by Col Mobutu, and demanded entry. This was refused, and they left. At 0835 similar demand made by 2 veh loads ANC, also rejected. When the Prevote Militaire guard was brought up to pl str, mutual arrangements were made to reduce both Congolese and Ghana gds to the original sec str.

(6) 211032. Police entered offices L'Independance and prohibited distribution of newspaper. ANC entered Courriere l'Afrique with same purpose.

There has been a good deal of unrest and violence in the city.

2. A. 2 DC 4 loads 3 119 loads of 3 Gh R have moved to LULUA for onward transportation to TSHIKAPA.
- B. N I L
- C. (1) 191315. Reported that congolese civilian was stabbed to death in the area of the Zoo. Also that police beat up assailant and took him into custody.
- (2) 191400. Approx. Mr BOSOKUA - Commissioner General of Finance under Mr NDELE - is alleged to have wounded with a pistol shot a congolese civilian who is now in hosp. The weapon was reputedly given to him by Mr NDELE, who is reported to have distributed numerous firearms to his supporters for the elimination of his opponents.
- (3) 191915. A yellow ANGLIA, with UNC markings painted on body, containing Mr SENDWE, a civilian, and two persons - probably congolese - in UN uniform with leather belt and pistol stopped at MEMLING HOTEL. Mr SENDWE entered with a briefcase and returned 15 mins later without it. A Ghana patrol questioned the two men in uniform who said in broken English "Ghana Congo one: UN go home: Ghana remain. All four drove off. A Gendarmerie jeep drove up, was misdirected by a hotel servant and drove away. ANC and later Congolese police then arrived, searched cars parked nearby and eventually went away.
- (4) 192200. An ANC jeep seen by a Ghana patrol. The driver was wearing a UNO beret less badge it drove off when observed.
- (5) 192305. Instructed by UNO to prevent any plane taking off after 200400 hrs, without checking the manifest and ensuring to political deportees aboard. Also to restrict ANC presence in NDJILI to 1 NCO & 6 men unarmed. To carry out this task in view of run down of 3 Gh R due to mov TSHIKAPA, one pl 1 Gh R, 1 pl Fd Sqn 2 pls Gh Police moved to airport; in position by 0345. At 0640 ANC escort plus deportees arrived at gate and were told that they would not be admitted. They went off for further instr; threatened to return shooting. At 1226 msg received from UNO instructing the deportees to be allowed on to ac.







C. (1) At 1820 3 GHANA R at NDJILI airport reported that the ANC were trying to arrest one of two Belgian employees of SEDEC who had arrived from COQUILAHATVILLE. It appears that the papers of the Belgian LAMBERT by name contained information that he had at one time performed military service in CONGO. 1 GHANA R protected LAMBERT until the matter reported to HQ UNOC who informed Col MOBOTU. MOBOTU said that he would order the release of LAMBERT. Later the ANC at NDJILI agreed to release. It is not known whether this was as a result of a message from MOBOTU or not. The NCO in ANC party was fairly amenable but was overruled by one of his soldiers 406511/A Soldat 1st class MBUGI BERNARD. HQ UNO have been informed of his name for report to Col MOBOTU.

(2) At approx 0415 GIZENGA, MPOLO, PAKASA and MULUNGI arrived at NDJILI airport under an escort of Gendamerie, without prior warning. It is understood that they were escorted from jail and were to take off in a chartered aircraft for an unknown destination. The Moroccan Officer in charge of a Moroccan loading party phoned senior Moroccan Officer who arrived shortly afterwards with some Moroccans did not report to 3 GHANA R. The jeep carrying their men was followed by the Gendamerie. At 0545 the Officer accompanied by MPOLO and GIZENGA arrived at LUMUMBAS house, they left with the MOROCCAN Officer at 0615. At 1555 this Col MOBOTU accompanied by MOROCCAN Lt SALAH HADA and an escort of 11 ANC arrived at LUMUMBAS house. He told newspaper reporters that he had released MPOLO and GIZENGA. He then had an interview with LUMUMBA at which the Commander was present. It appears that MOBOTU told LUMUMBA that he had already today seen KASAVUBU and had now come to get LUMUMBAS point of view. Various recriminations took place LUMUMBA complaining of his threatened arrest MOBOTU complaining of his attempted assassinations. During one halfhour outburst by LUMUMBA MOBOTU read a newspaper. MOBOTU left at 1630. There are now 8 to 10 people in the house with LUMUMBA including PAKASA and MULUNGI.

(3) It is reported by 1 GHANA R that at approx 2030 a Father in area of 05 reported that an ANC soldier was in his house and that on the previous night he had fired through the fathers window. A Guard of 1 & 3 was posted on the house for the night.







He also stated that when the Bangala tribe found out there would be tribal trouble aimed mainly at Lumumba and his supporters from the Bakongo tribe. This information was confirmed by an African employee at NDOLO Airport. He had been warned by friends within the Bangala tribe to keep his wife and family out of sight as they planned to start trouble after dark. He also reported that the trouble would most probably start at the P.U.N.A. party HQ on the AVE GENERAL ERMENS. The Bangala tribe also paint their bodies when they are out to cause trouble. The ORBAT would appear to be BANGALA, BALUBA and that part of BAKONGO which does not support Lumumba against BALULUWA and the BAKONGO supporters of Lumumba.

At approx 1700 hrs the ANC dispersed a large crowd armed with knives, spears and sticks, outside the PUNA Party HQ. Several shots were fired over the heads of the crowd. Information was also received that 17 people with painted bodies had been arrested in Leopoldville.

Nothing further appears to have happened. It is rumoured that Lumumba will bring BOLIKANGO to Leopoldville. If this happens further trouble may be expected.
