1. **GENERAL SITUATION.** The general sit remains calm. Everything was closed today for the reason that the RPA ordered everybody to stay home in order to do a search of all houses.

2. **FACTIONAL ACTIVITIES.**

A. **RPA.** RPA from other communes arrived in Cyangugu yesterday night in order to help the local RPA Units in today's search in Kamembe village and Kamembe Commune. The systematic search houses to houses started at 02:00 hrs this morning with no known results in wpns or munitions finding as of now. We will report the results as they become available. They also segregated hundreds of people in three different locations ie the former Bank, the Stadium and a local School in order to check their identity, their place of residence, etc. Some of them were finally transported by busses to an unknown location. This HQ will keep us advised of futur developments.







SUBJECT: MASS GRAVE REPORT

1. ATTACHED IS THE MASS GRAVE REPORT REQUESTED ON 16 JAN. AN ATTEMPT HAS BEEN MADE TO BRING IT UP TO DATE AND TO CAPTURE ALL THE INFO AVAILABLE. MUCH OF THE INFORMATION REQUESTED COULD NOT BE GATHERED WITHOUT SPECIAL EXPERTISE AND/OR MUCH MORE TIME. ALL TEAMS WILL BE TASKED TO UPDATE THEIR FINDINGS ON A WEEKLY BASIS.

2. DISCUSSIONS WITH THE HUMAN RIGHTS TEAM MEMBERS IN THIS AREA INDICATE THAT THEY ARE OVERWHELMED WITH THE SIZE OF THIS TASK AND NEED AS MUCH MILOB HELP AS THEY CAN GET. IT WOULD BE HELPFUL IF SOME INSTRUCTION IN DETERMINING APPROXIMATE NUMBERS FROM THE PHYSICAL EVIDENCE COULD BE GIVEN.

3. WHERE A FOUR FIGURE GRID APPEARS, THE GRAVES ARE IN CLUSTERS SCATTERED OVER A FAIRLY LARGE AREA.







REPORT ON A.P.E.E.D.U.C. ORPHANAGE, KAMEMBE GR 7828, 03 JAN 95

REPORT DATE: 5 JAN 95

1. AT APPROX 032330H JAN 95 APPROX FIVE UNKNOWN PERSONS ATTACKED THE ORPHANAGE ADMINISTERED BY MEDCINS DE MONDE (MDM). IT IS HOME TO APPROX 250 CHILDREN WHO WERE INITIALLY ACCOMODATED AT NYARUSHUSHI CAMP BEFORE ITS CLOSURE IN LATE NOV 94.

2. THE ATTACK OCCURRED IN COMPLETE DARKNESS AND LASTED ONLY A FEW MINUTES. THE ATTACKERS APPROACHED FROM THE AIRPORT PAVED ROAD THAT RUNS ABOVE AND DIRECTLY PAST THE ORPHANAGE. THE ROOFTOPS OF THE FACILITY CAN BE SEEN FROM THE ROAD. A TOTAL OF FOUR HAND GRENADES WERE THROWN AT THE BUILDINGS BELOW AND SEVERAL BURSTS WERE FIRED INTO THE ROOMS OF THE ORPHANAGE. THREE OF THE HAND GRENADES EXPLODED FAR ENOUGH AWAY TO CAUSE LITTLE DAMAGE. ONE GRENADE DETONATED APPROX 1.5 METRES ABOVE THE PEAK OF THE TIN ROOF OF ONE BEDROOM WITH THE FRAGMENTS PENETRATING THE THIN SHEETING AND INJURING FIVE CHILDREN IN THE ROOM. ALL BEDROOMS WERE TARGETED BY AUTOMATIC FIRE. ALL WINDOWS THAT HAD BEEN COVERED WITH PLASTIC SHEETS, SHOWED OBVIOUS SIGNS OF BULLET DAMAGE.

3. ONE CHILD WAS KILLED BY A BULLET, THREE CHILDREN WERE CRITICALLY WOUNDED BY FRAGMENTATION, 21 CHILDREN SUSTAINED LIGHT INJURIES BY FRAG AND BULLET RICHOCHET. A SECOND CHILD IS IN CRITICAL CONDITION WITH POOR PROGNOSIS.

4. APPROX 10-15 MINUTES BEFORE THE ATTACK, AN RPA PATROL OF ABOUT 10 SOLDIERS PASSED THE FACILITY ON THE AIRPORT ROAD. MR. FELICIEN BAHIZI, THE PERSON IN CHARGE OF THE FACILITY, STATED THAT ALL OCCUPANTS WERE TAKEN TOTALLY BY SURPRISE. GUARDS HAD NOT NOTICED ANYTHING UNTIL THE EXPLOSION OF THE GRENADES. HE BELIEVES THE ATTACKERS CAME BY BOAT FROM ZAIRE AND LEFT TOWARD THE SAME DIRECTION. HE ALSO THINKS THAT ATTACKERS WERE MILITIAMEN OF THE FORMER GOVT TO DEMONSTRATE HOW DANGEROUS LIFE IN RWANDA IS UNDER RPA CONTROL.

5. AN EMPLOYEE OF THE PREFECTURE RESPONSIBLE FOR SIMIALR FACILITIES IN SECTOR 4C INDICATED THAT HE THINKS THE ATTACKERS DID NOT COME AND LEAVE BY BOAT, BUT THAT THEY ARE HIDING IN THE WOODLANDS IN THE VICINITY. A SEARCH ORGANIZED BY RPA WAS CONDUCTED WITH NO SUCCESS. IT HAS BEEN LEARNED THAT ON THE MORNING OF 03 JAN 95 THAT 15 EMPLOYEES OF THE FACILITY WERE FIRED FOR VARIOUS

REPORT ON ARREST/KILLING OF MSF STAFF AT MURURU GR 7723 31 DEC 94

REPORT DATE: 04 JAN 95.

1. AT APPROX 2000 HRS 31 DEC, TWO LOCAL EMPLOYEES OF MEDCINS SANS FRONTIERS (MSF) AT MURURU DISPENSAIRE, MR. NARCISSE NGENDAHIMANA AND PASCAL NYAMISHABA, DEPARTED THE CAMP VIA ITS NORTHERN EXIT TO GO PURCHASE SOME BEER.

2. AT THE MOMENT OF THEIR DEPARTURE FROM THE CAMP GATE, THEY WERE ARRESTED BY TWO RPA SOLDIERS ON PATROL. THEY WERE ACCUSED OF VIOLATING THE CURFEW AND TAKEN TO A NEARBY HOUSE EVIDENTLY BELONGING TO AN RPA OFFICER. (THIS IS EVIDENCE FROM THE SURVIVING PRISONER, NO OFFICER HOME IS KNOWN TO BE ANYWHERE NEAR MURURU) ONLY MANY SOLDIERS AT THE HOME WERE PRESENT. BOTH MEN WERE TIED UP AND BEATEN WITH GUN BUTTS AND STONES AND KICKED OVER A PERIOD LASTING FOR APPROX 30 MINUTES. EVIDENCE OF ROPE MARKS AND WOUNDS WERE EVIDENT ON PASCAL NYAMISHABA (THE SURVIVOR).


3. AFTER THE BEATING BOTH MEN WERE TAKEN TOWARD A NEARBY RPA ENCAMPMENT. AFTER ONLY WALKING A FEW METRES, NGENDAHIMANA REPEATEDLY FELL TO THE GROUND, POSSIBLY AS A RESULT OF THE BEATING. NYAMISHABA WAS DRAGGED FORWARD AND A FEW MINUTES LATER HE HEARD THE FIRING OF FOUR SHOTS. HE SPENT THE NIGHT IN A SMALL ROOM IN THE RPA CAMP APPROX 500 METRES FROM THE DISPENSAIRE. HE WAS LEFT TIED UP THROUGHOUT. AT APPROX 1300 HRS HE WAS VISITED BY AN RPA COMMANDER (NO RANK/NAME KNOWN) AND SUBSEQUENTLY UNTIED. THIS SAME RPA COMD RETURNED ABOUT 1600 HRS AND ON HIS ORDERS WAS SET FREE. MR NYAMISHABA OVERHEARD THIS COMD ASKING WHY THE SOLDIERS HAD KILLED THE OTHER PRISONER. THE SOLDIERS ANSWERED THAT NGENDAHIMANA HAD RESISTED ARREST AND THAT HE WAS ARMED.

4. NYAMISHABA RETURNED TO MURURU DISPENSAIRE APPROX 1700 HRS 01 JAN 95 AND RESUMED WORK AS KITCHEN HELP. PARENTS OF NGENDAHIMANA WERE INFORMED BY RPA THAT THEIR SON HAD RESISTED ARREST AND HAD BEEN KILLED. HE HAD BEEN EMPLOYED AS A NIGHT GUARD OF MSF DISPENSAIRE. RPA HAVE SINCE ADMITTED THAT THE SOLDIERS HAD ACTED IN AN INAPPROPRIATE MANNER, HOWEVER, ASIDE FROM THE LOC COMD BEING VISIBLY ANNOYED WHILE SPEAKING WITH THE SOLDIERS, NO DISCIPLINARY ACTION OR FURTHER INVESTIGATION IS KNOWN.

POST OPERATION REPORT - OP HOPE

Introduction

1. On 13 Dec 94 I was asked by DCOS OPS to present myself, on the morning of 14 Dec 94, at the OP Hope HQ in Kibeho. My orders were to provide the DFC with legal advice during the operation.
2. On arrival at Kibeho, it was agreed that I would be of most assistance if I located myself with the MP Coy at the detention centre (DC).

Aim

3. The aim of this report is to examine the conduct of OP Hope from a legal perspective with particular emphasis being placed on the handling of detainees.

OP Hope-The Orders

4. The aim of OP Hope was to clear the criminal elements from Kibeho and Ndago displaced person (DP) camps in order to establish a secure environment which would encourage DP repatriation. My involvement was limited to Kibeho camp.
5. The orders given to the individual Bns involved in this operation stated, amongst other things, that UNAMIR soldiers were to "arrest criminals" in the camps and clear the camps of "unauthorised weapons, equipment and stores". From a legal perspective these orders were unclear as they failed to specify what a criminal was and what were unauthorised weapons, equipment and stores. A further point, is that UNAMIR troops do not have the power to arrest, only to detain.
6. The ROE state for the OP was YELLOW.

Processing the Detainees

7. Once a suspected criminal had been detained he/she was taken over to the DC. At the DC they were handcuffed and personally searched. Items in the possession of the detainee were then

taken, with the detainee, to two MP in the DC whose job it was to question and photograph the detainee. The MP had orders to process detainees only (ie question them as to their personal details) which meant that none of the alleged offenders were screened (ie no questions were asked regarding the offence). All evidence was then bagged and tagged and the detainee was made to wait till he/she was spoken to by the ICRC. Once questioning was completed by the ICRC it was anticipated that the accused would be taken to a Rwandan Prosecutor for further questioning.

8. In practice, however, this last stage was not completed on the day as the MP were unable to find a Prosecutor in Gikongoro and were told by the RPA that they were no Prosecutors available in Sector 4. This statement by the RPA was later proved to be wrong.

The Detainees

9. A total of 48 persons were detained by UNAMIR troops during the operation. The following reasons were given for detaining a person:

- a. being in possession of a photograph of a RGF soldier,
- b. being accused by the RPA of committing murder(s) during the April 94 war,
- c. being in possession of a weapon (eg a spear or sword);
- d. being in possession of a machete,
- e. being in association with another detainee, and
- f. molesting people.

10. Of these 48 detainees, three were released before being processed through to the local authorities. The evidence provided by the detaining soldiers against two of the three detainees was that they had photographs of former RGF soldiers. In my legal opinion this was not a sufficient reason for UNAMIR troops to make the detentions as both these Rwandans had not committed a serious crime. The third detainee had been detained on the basis that he had been talking to a group of people. Again, this was not a sufficient reason to detain him as no serious offence had been committed. It seemed that in the majority of cases UNAMIR soldiers did not have probable cause to detain most of the Rwandan nationals who were processed as the only evidence against them was, what appeared to be, unsubstantiated allegations by the RPA that the person had been involved in mass murder. After investigating the reason for detaining a person, I found only eight cases where there was a prima facie case. This opinion was based on the fact that either the accused was in possession of a weapon (spear or sword) or there were local witnesses who could provide evidence that the person had been involved in committing a serious crime.

11. Having completed the processing, detainees were held in custody till they could be handed over to the Office of the Prosecutor in Gikongoro. After considerable endeavour on the part of the MP, they were unable to locate a Prosecutor to take custody of the detainees. This meant that the detainees remained in the care of the MP overnight. The next day (15 Dec 94) these detainees were handed over temporarily to the local Gendarmerie in Butare. This hand over was conducted contrary to UNAMIR policy as stipulated in the 'FC Directive on the Legal Jurisdiction Applicable

to UNAMIR and Rwandan Authorities' and consequently the Fce Provost Marshall was quite correct in reclaiming them from the Gendarmerie.

The Hand Over

12. A total of 44 detainees were handed over to the Prosecutor in Gikongoro on 16 Dec 94. This hand over was conducted in the presence of the ICRC, UNHRFOR, UNHCR, an RPA LO, members of the Gikongoro Jail, Prosecutor, Fce Provost Marshall and myself.

13. As UNAMIR troops had made the detentions there was an onus on UNAMIR to ensure that there was a prima facie case against the accused. If there was no prima facie case then the accused was to be released prior to being handed over to the Prosecutor. Unfortunately, because there had already been one attempted hand over on 15 Dec 94 the RPA or Gendarmerie had recorded all the names of the detainees. Consequently, it made it practically difficult not to hand over the same number of detainees on 16 Dec 94.

14. UNAMIR was now in the difficult position of having to hand over people against whom there was no prima facie case. To try and salvage this problem it was decided that I would make a recommendation to the Prosecutor, as each of the detainees was brought before him, as to whether there was a prima facie case against that person. My recommendations did not lead to any detainee being released that day.

15. Of the 48 Rwandan's detained on 14 Dec 94, three were released at the DC. A further 8 detainees had a prima facie case against them and a total of 37 should not have been handed over to the local authorities by UNAMIR. However during the hand over process only 36 were handed to the Prosecutor. The fate of one person is unknown to me.

16. During the hand over procedure all the evidence found with the accused was also handed over to the Prosecutor. The MP also, quite correctly, handed to the Prosecutor all the 'weapons' found or confiscated during the OP.

Weapons

17. An emotional issue during this OP was the question 'what constitutes a weapon?'. It was argued that machetes, axes and sickles should be confiscated because these items had been used during the war as weapons and appeared to be the favoured instrument for killing people. While this argument holds merit I respectfully submit that a better view is that a machete or sickle should only be defined as a weapon if someone sees it being used by a person in a way that is likely to cause death or serious injury. Such an approach is consistent with the legal view that an everyday tool, like a kitchen knife or a pair of scissors, is only a weapon if used in an assault or to commit murder. If it were otherwise something as mundane as a stone would also have to be confiscated because it may be used as a weapon.

ROE

18. As stated earlier, the ROE for this OP was state Yellow. The circumstances of the deployment with its inherent threat did allow for a more aggressive ROE state. It is noted that Rule 5 of the ROE for state Yellow as covered in the OPORD for OP Hope differed to Rule 5 as stated in Section 9: Operational Directive No.2, Rules of Engagement. In the OPORD UNAMIR troops were

allowed to disarm civilians and paramilitary persons. Operational Directive 2 did not allow for this disarmament. However, there was nothing unlawful in changing this rule.

Conclusion


19. Many of the legal problems that arose during OP Hope stemmed from the handling of detainees. Rwandan nationals were detained by UNAMIR troops solely, in many cases, on a few words uttered by a RPA member. This problem was then compounded by the fact that the orders given to the MP did not allow them to screen the accused. Hand over procedures also need to be streamlined so that UNAMIR is confident that it has complied with humanitarian law principles.

Recommendations

20. The following recommendations need to be put in place if any further operations similar to OP Hope are actioned in future:

- a. There needs to be a brief, preferably oral, provided to commanders at Bn level explaining to them what legal rights and responsibilities their soldiers have during such an OP. The brief should cover such concepts as who is a criminal and what is an unauthorised weapon, equipment and store. Furthermore, such issues as reasonable cause to detain and what are serious offences also need to be covered.
- b. A legal officer, preferably a military one, must be a part of the screening process so that a legal assessment may be made that there is a prima facie case against the accused. The legal officer can also be used as the point of contact for organisations such as the ICRC who need to speak to detainees.
- c. Orders given to the MP should include a component which authorises them to assist the legal officer in the screening the detainees.
- d. A prosecutor must be contacted prior to the OP so that he is prepared to handle detainees as soon as the MP release the detainee. This will ensure that UNAMIR only holds a detainee for the minimum period of time possible. It is suggested that the prosecutor be located as close as possible to the DC so that the hand over is done as quickly as possible.
- e. There needs to be at least two dedicated interpreters working in the DC. One interpreter to stay with the legal officer and the other to assist the MP in their screening process.

- f. Liaison with civilian authorities should be kept to a minimum during the screening, and hand over process. There are two reasons for this. The first is that because the detention was made by UNAMIR troops, it is for UNAMIR to screen the accused. If the civilian authority involvement is not limited there is a real danger that there may be a conflict in interest between the mission attainment and the agenda of the civilian authority. Secondly, a legal argument may be made that the accused is entitled to have his identity protected till a legitimate authority in Rwanda is ready to try him for an offence. The more people involved in the process the less likely that his identity will be protected. The long experience of the ICRC in this environment makes them ideally suited to monitor the handling of the detainee

General

1. The situation in the Sector remained calm except that flaring up of Burundi problem resulted in drastic drop in the flow of traffic across the border.

2. The DFC visited the Sector to wish all UNAMIR personnel a merry Christmas.

3. The Sector was also visited by reps from FHQ to discuss the modalities involving OP RETOUR.

RPA Activities

3. RPA continues to actively patrol built up areas with foot and vehicle mounted patrols. Six pls have been deployed in Kigembe commune to check banditry.

4. There was a meeting between the Sect Cdr and RPA Bde Cdr located at Gitarama regarding various issues. Minutes have been forwarded seperately.

RGF/Militia Activities

5. Two persons were injured in a bandit attack at Buhoro on 23 Dec 94, allegedly from Kibeho DPC.

Locals

6. There was a meeting of Butare businessmen with the Prefect and the RPA Bde Cdr on 19 Dec, at the Butare stadium, urging the locals to unite to face the oncoming hardships. A similar rally was organised at Gitarama on 23 Dec but was later postponed.

MILOB Activities

7. Most MILOB teams were involved in gathering information regarding SRSG's report and recce for OP RETOUR.

8. A team went to MBUYE Hospital, Nyamabuye commune, at the request from UNICEF to inform them that UNICEF is not in a position to deliver the required amount of water due to technical and practical difficulties. However it is suggested by this HQ that a

preliminary study by the FHQ Engr Team might enable to establish a cost effective solution. The hospital is well geared up and is being manned by the Medicos en Catastrophe.

Mali Coy

9. Confidence and information gathering patrols were conducted in AOR. Recce and planning for OP RETOUR was carried out. An average of 35 - 40 patients have been treated in their clinics daily during the past week.

10. On an average, it provided two trucks daily for humanitarian assistance to the NGOs in various communes in its AOR.

Malawi Coy

11. Besides, providing protection to TAC HQ, BUTARE, it carried out confidence patrols in its AOR and also monitored and transported returning refugees from the BURUNDI border. Recce and planning for OP RETOUR was carried out.

12. On an average, it provided two trucks daily for humanitarian assistance to the NGOs in various communes in its AOR.

13. An average of 40 - 50 patients per day have been treated in their clinics during the past week.

14. There was a visit by the Malawi Army Cdr to Butare from 20 - 21 Dec.

Other Humanitarian Activities

15. An outbreak of measles was reported at Rugogwe, Mugina commune. The Sector got in touch with the MSF and with the help of the medical personnel of Mali coy have launched a Vaccination programme in the Rugogwe school. The programme is still on.

Border Crossings

16. Persons crossed into RWANDA from BURUNDI:-


(a) 10 - 17 Dec - 632.

(b) 18 - 25 Dec - 980.

Assessment

17. The situation in the Sector appears to be calm and the incident reported above may be considered isolated and without any definite pattern. The presence of Formed Troops in various parts of the sector is greatly assisting in instilling a sense of confidence in the local population. The locals appear to be more encouraged in approaching UNAMIR elements to report their problems. Constant liaison with local officials of the administration and RPA has

succeeded in bringing about a fair level of cooperation from them. Liaison with NGOs and humanitarian agencies is being stepped up in order to bring to notice the problems of the populace and effect better cooperation. The exodus of people coming in from Burundi has increased remarkably, which possibly indicate that DPs are gradually gaining confidence in the security measures being taken.

It came to my attention that some dependents of UNAMIR military and civilian personnel are joining their spouse at the duty station in Kigali or elsewhere within Rwanda. Although I am aware that they are travelling at their own expense, I wish to remind the individuals concerned that dependents who travel to the mission area do so at their own risk, and the United Nations will not be held responsible for their welfare, living conditions or security.

In as much as one is aware of the argument that staff members take full responsibility for the safety of their dependents this will not apply at the time of any evacuation. In other words, one cannot see a situation when the United Nations will bear responsibility for the evacuation of a staff member but not of his/her dependents. As you may be aware this situation in actual fact happened during the relocation of members of UNAMIR personnel to Nairobi following the outbreak of the war in April 1994.


You were all fully informed prior to your departure to the duty station of the special status of UNAMIR being a non-family mission. This was also confirmed in the briefing note that you might then have received. Similarly, the guidelines for Governments contributing military and police observers state clearly that observers may not be accompanied by dependents during their tour of duty with UNAMIR.

In this connection, UNAMIR neither authorizes travel for such dependents on its transportation assets nor makes any other arrangements such as securing visas to facilitate their presence in the area. It will not allow security instructions to be circumvented. Therefore, I seek your utmost cooperation in this regard by requesting those concerned to kindly make arrangements to have their dependents leave the mission area of Rwanda immediately, failing which, this office may be obliged to inform FOD/DPKO accordingly.



Reference: DFC/COS/CMO's letter 1000.8 (DFC)/G/5 dated 2 December 1994.

1. Sir, it was on Tuesday 29 November 1994 at about 1745 hrs, when the Duty Officer Captain Maulu, came to me in my office and informed me that the helicopter crew and part of the entourage which accompanied the DFC to Gitarama was stranded due to bad weather.

2. He informed me that he had talked to the CTO, so that a bus could be raised to go and pick up the stranded crew plus the rest of the entourage of which the CTO vehemently refused, citing the bad Security situation in the country as a reason for not providing a bus and a driver at that time.

3. I personally raised the CTO on the telephone so that I could convince him to raise a vehicle for the impending task. He (CTO) refused citing the same reason of security. I told him that I was going to provide an armed escort from INDBATT for security, but he could not be convinced.

4. Immediately after my conversation with the CTO, Lt Col G Borglah, who had travelled with the DFC from Gitarama to UNAMIR HQ, came and told me that, he had been directed by the DFC to come and make arrangements for transport to go and pick up the stranded crew in Gitarama. I told him that, I had been speaking to the CTO over the same task but he had refused to raise a vehicle for the same task. The senior officer told me to go along with him to the CTO's office. He presented the problem to the CTO who insolently replied that "there was need for common sense to prevail over a situation like this one". He advised that, either the crew with everybody spends a night in Gitarama or transport be provided from there, to transport everybody to Kigali.

5. The Col told him that the only two vehicles that were available were used to transport the Deputy Force Commander and part of his entourage back to Kigali. He was still not convinced. The Senior Officer told me that we could leave and he was going to brief the DFC/COS about the outcome.

6. When I came back to the Ops room I briefed the Duty Officer and advised him to report back to the DFC about the stance the CTO had taken. This is what happened sir.

1. On Tuesday 29 November 1994, the CIVPOL Commissioner, some staff officers and I visited MALICOY location in the Gitarama prefecture. Our onward journey was by helicopter which dropped us off at 1330 hours and left for another task whilst we awaited a lift at 1600 hours.

2. It so happened that a heavy downpour of rain started at about 1500 hours and continued for the rest of the afternoon. This rain was accompanied by a very thick low fog making it impossible for a heli to penetrate. As 1600 hours approached, our party wondered whether it was going to be possible for the heli to come over to lift us. Surprisingly, we heard the sound of a helicopter around 1600 hours. We, therefore, started driving to the heli pad. No sooner had we started than we met one of the heli crew who stopped us and informed me that his team had to make an emergency landing at Gitarama on their way from the south-west because visibility was so poor. He added that they had seven passengers on board.

3. I then made a quick appreciation of the situation and decided to proceed to Kigali by road. Whilst on the way to Kigali we made contact with MILOB GP HQ and asked the duty officer to arrange for a bus to pick up the helicopter crew and passengers from Gitarama as it was obvious that a heli flight was impossible owing to the thick fog. Meanwhile, the Sector 3 Commander had made security arrangements for the heli to remain overnight at the heli pad. On my arrival at Force HQ at about 1730 hours, I went straight to the Ops room to re-iterate the need for those stranded in Gitarama to be picked up since the only vehicles at the Sector Headquarters were those that brought us back.

4. To my total astonishment and disappointment, I was informed the following day by Canadian Helicopters that no one went to their aid. Indeed, after many hours waiting, their own colleagues had to drive from the Kigali Airport to pick them up from Gitarama. This non-action is totally unacceptable to me as we are in an operational area and expected to act promptly on matters of urgency. Why these lapses?

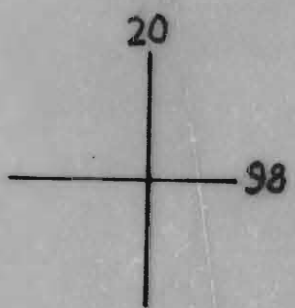
