SUBJECT: Security Council's Mission to Burundi and Rwanda

1. Please be informed that a seven-member mission of the Security Council will leave for Burundi and Rwanda on Wednesday, 8 February. The mission, which will be headed by Ambassador Ibrahim Gambari (Nigeria) will be composed of the following Council members: China (Li Zhaoxing), Czech Republic (Karel Kovanda), Germany (Gerhard Henze), Honduras (Julio Rendon Barnica), Indonesia (Makarim Wibisono), Nigeria (Ibrahim A. Gambari) and the United States (Karl Inderfurth). Please find attached the press communiqué which was issued today, as well as the terms of reference of the mission.

2. The mission will arrive in Bujumbura in the morning of 10 February via Nairobi or Brussels (we will let you know tomorrow morning). It plans to stay in Bujumbura on 10 and 11 February and will leave for Kigali in the morning of 12 February.

3. In Bujumbura, the mission would like to hold a series of meetings, similar to the ones which were arranged during its August 1994 visit. The mission would appreciate it very much if Mr. Ould Abdallah could provide it with a tentative programme by tomorrow noon. Any addition or deletion on the programme which he had arranged for the Gambari/Inderfurth mission in August is left at his discretion and judgement. The mission would

appreciate <sup>it</sup> if a working luncheon with NGOs could still be arranged.

4. We trust that Mr. Ould Abdallah will make the necessary reservations at the Hotel Sources du Nil. The mission will be accompanied by Mrs. Florence Barrillon-Pomés, Senior Political Affairs Officer of DPA, and by an interpreter.

5. The mission plans to leave Bujumbura on 12 February by Ethiopian Airlines flight 874, which arrives in Kigali at 7:05 a.m. Again, the mission would appreciate it very much if Ambassador Khan could kindly provide it with a tentative programme for its two-day stay in Kigali. The mission expressed special interest in meeting, if possible, with their respective contingents/police serving with UNAMIR. Ambassador Gerhard Wenz from Germany also expressed the wish to have a meeting with Mrs. Alison Des Forges of Africa Watch. Mrs. Barrillon-Pomés explained to the mission that Ambassador Khan might not be in Kigali at the time of its visit.

6. We trust that Ambassador Khan will make the necessary reservations in the Belgian compound for the members of the mission. The mission will be accompanied by Mrs. Florence Barrillon-Pomés and by an interpreter. We understand the mission will submit two separate reports, on Burundi and Rwanda, to the Security Council. Mrs. Barrillon-Pomés, while in Kigali, will work on the first report of the mission. It is therefore ~~expected~~ <sup>requested</sup> that Ambassador Khan ~~will~~ make available the services of a Senior Political Affairs Officer of UNAMIR to assist the mission during its stay in Kigali and help prepare its report on its visit to Rwanda. Mrs. Barrillon-Pomés will leave Kigali on 14 February to accompany Mr. Lansana Kouyaté to Bujumbura where he will represent the Secretary-General at the Regional OAU/ECR Conference on Refugees.

## SEVEN MEMBER SECURITY COUNCIL MISSION LEAVES FOR BURUNDI AND RWANDA

ON WEDNESDAY

The following statement was made today by the Spokesman for Secretary-General Boutros Boutros-Ghali:

A seven-member mission of the Security Council will leave for Burundi and Rwanda on Wednesday, 8 February. Following consultations of the Council, the Council's President for the month of February, Legwaila Joseph Legwaila (Botswana), announced that the mission would be composed of the following Council members: China (Li Zhaoxing), Czech Republic (Karel Kovanda), Germany (Gerhard Henze), Honduras (Julio Rendon Bernice), Indonesia (Makarim Mursini), Nigeria (Thablis A. Gambia) and the United States (Karl Inderfurth). The Chairman of the mission will be Mr. Gambia.

The mission will stay in Bujumbura on 10 and 11 February and will leave for Kigali on 12 February. It will stay in Kigali on 12 and 13 February and expects to return to New York on 14 February.



3.40 p.m.TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE PROPOSED SECURITY COUNCIL  
MISSION TO BURUNDI AND A STOP-OVER IN RWANDA

## 1. BURUNDI

- (a) Hold consultations with the Special Representative of the Secretary-General on the situation regarding the political and security developments in Burundi and his efforts in this regard, and additional ways in which the United Nations might further underpin his efforts;
- (b) Hold talks with the President, the Prime Minister, the leadership of the security forces and the leaders of the opposition parties as well as United Nations agencies, members of the diplomatic corps, NGOs, the OAU Office and other interested parties and convey to them the serious concerns of the Security Council over the recent political developments in Burundi;
- (c) Stress to all the parties the strong support of the Security Council for the Convention of Government of 10 September 1994 and the Government constituted on the basis of it and for the process of national reconciliation, and the Council's rejection of all attempts to undermine them or to destabilize the region;
- (d) Submit a report to the Security Council.

## 2. RWANDA

- (a) Hold consultations with the Rwandese Government regarding its efforts towards national reconciliation and reconstruction and the problem of the return of refugees;
- (b) Hold consultations with the Special Representative of the Secretary-General, United Nations agencies, UNAMIR personnel, members of the diplomatic corps and NGOs in Kigali;
- (c) Submit a report to the Security Council.
