Subject: MEETING WITH GEN PAUL KAGAME ON 19 MAY 95

1. I along with Mr Shaharyar M Khan had a meeting with the Vice-President Gen Paul Kagame today to discuss the future of UNAMIR Mandate and other current issues.The following emerged during the discussion:

A. The current Mandate expires on 09 Jun 95,and is no longer required to perform similar tasks thereafter.What is required is to work out a deinduction plan for remainder elements to pull out.

B. Provision of security and confidence to Rwandese by deployment of UN troops in the Country is not acceptable and is the sole responsibility of The Govt of Rwanda.

C. UNAMIR will not involve itself in any security related tasks other than providing protection and security to its own HQ, installations including the International Tribunal and its personnel and the UN Human Rights Field Operations HQ,its field offices throughout Rwanda and their personnel.The approximate strength the Govt visualizes for this task is likely to around 1000 to 1200.Specific details of numbers were not discussed.

D.As regards the deinduction of remainder elements of UNAMIR II, it was conveyed to the Vice-President that it could take any time up to Nov-Dec 95(Till the end of the next Mandate) depending on the rotation schedule and the resources that would be made available by UN HQ.This issue was also not discussed in detail.

E.The Vice-President when asked confirmed that he would communicate his views on the future Mandate and Force Level of UNAMIR in writing to your HQ for consideration.

2. In addition to the discussion on Mandate,the issue of Vice-President's visit to Butare and Burundi Border on 13 Apr 95, as testified to the International Investigation Commission on Kibeho and reported UNAMIR's involvement in the transportation of two IDP's with suspected FRGF connection from Rwamiko in Gikongoro Prefecture to Kigali for appearing before the Commission and

their further movement to Mutura(Sector 5) were also discussed and own position clarified.

3.As the current discussions on the Mandate with the Govt have come to an end, the Govt to progress further deliberations with your HQ or Security Council through its Permanent Representative on similar lines.
