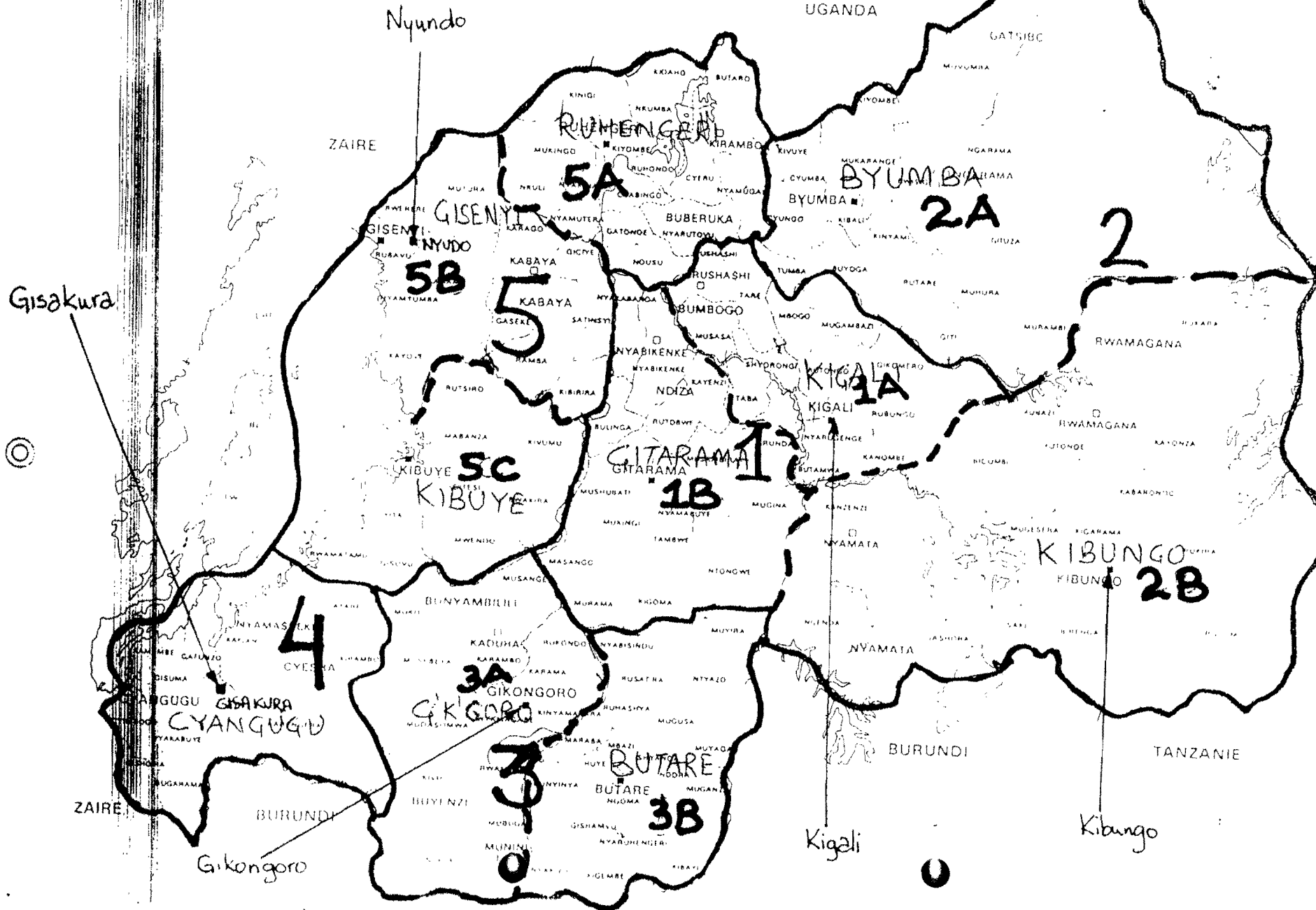
1. Reference our letter dated 22 June 95 regarding Sect Cdrs conf on 30 Jun 95.

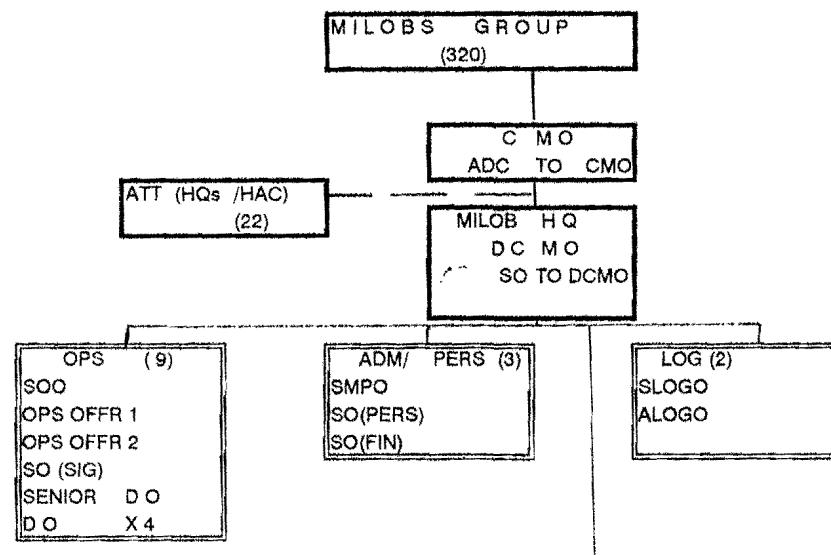

SUBJECT: REDEPLOYMENT OF MILOBS

Reference.

A. MILOBS/POST/6443.13 dated 15 JUN 95.

1. Approval has been given to implement the new organisation of MILOBS GP as per the attached with effect from 1 JUL 95. Consequently, the redeployment exercise scheduled for the end of this month has been cancelled in order to avoid disruption of sector organisation and the movement of several MILOBS at a particular time.

2. However it has been approved that a total of twenty-four (24) MILOBS should be posted out of sectors as stated below in conformity with the new organisation.

- a. Sector 1A (Kigali) - 6 MILOBS.
- b. Sector 2A (Byumba) - 6 MILOBS.
- c. Sector 2B (Kibungo) - 7 MILOBS.
- d. Sector 3B (Butare) - 5 MILOBS.

3. The twenty-four (24) MILOBS will be redeployed to the following priority areas.

- a. Sector 1B (Gitarama) - 3 MILOBS.
- b. Sector 4 (Cyangugu) - 4 MILOBS.
- c. Sector 5A (Ruhengeri) - 11 MILOBS.
- d. Sector 5C (Kibuye) - 6 MILOBS.

4. Sect Comds of Sectors 1A (Kigali), 2A (Byumba), 2B (Kibungo) and 3B (Butare) are to nominate the number of MILOBS stated against them at Paragraph 2 for redeployment. The following factors should guide you in your selection.

- a. MILOBS due for repatriation in July and August 1995 may not be nominated unless the MILOB opts for it.
- b. Maintain rational balance in your Sector.

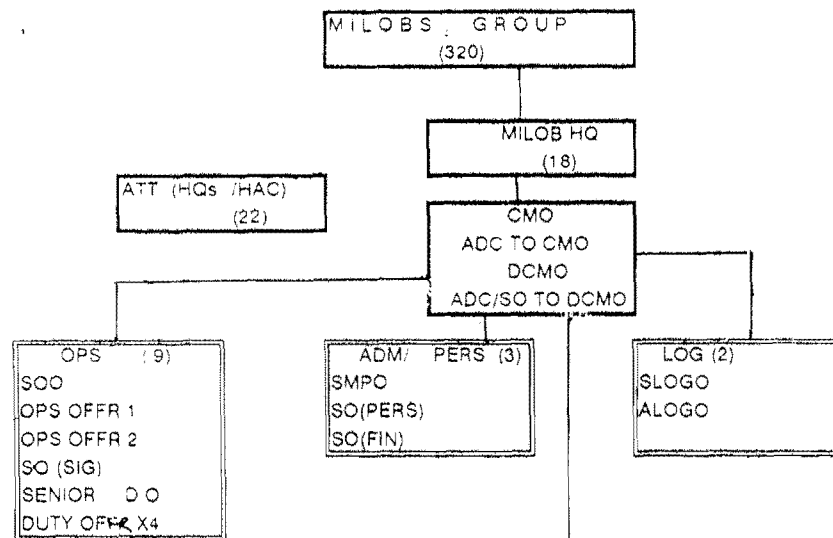

DURING THE MORNING BRIEFING OF TODAY (21 JUNE 1995) THE CPMT WAS INFORMED BY THE M.S.F. NYUNDO, THAT YESTERDAY EVENING (20 JUNE 1995) A MEMBER OF MERLIN GISENYI HAS OBSERVED HOW THE ARRESTED M.S.F. TOYOTA WAS USED BY SOME MILITARIES IN GISENYI. M.S.F. REQUESTED THE CPMT TO CHECK THIS INFORMATION.

AFTER THE BRIEFING THE CPMT WENT TO THE GENDARMERIE BRIGADE AND REQUESTED THE COMMANDER TO INFORM HIM. THE GENDARMERIE COMMANDER CONFIRMED, THAT THE M.S.F. VEHICLE WAS USED YESTERDAY EVENING BY THE GENDARMERIE. WITH THESE CAR THEY BROUGHT SOME ARRESTED PERSONS TO THE CENTRAL PRISON. AFTER LT. KARARA WAS THERE NO OTHER POSSIBILITY TO CARRY OUT THIS TASK. THE CPMT COULD CHECK ON THE MILEAGE INDICATOR, THAT AFTER THE ARRESTATION THE CAR WAS MOVED ONE KILOMETER. AFTER THAT THE CPMT STATED, THAT THIS BEHAVIOR COULD NOT BE ACCEPTABLE. HE OFFERED LT.

KARARA THE ASSISTANCE OF CIVPOL IN SUCH A CASE. LT. KARARA ACCEPTED THESE STATEMENT AND PROMISED NEXT TIME TO CONTACT CIVPOL.

AFTER THE METING AT THE GENDARMERIE THE CPMT INFORMED M.S.F. NYUNDO. THE M.S.F. INFORMED THE CPMT, THAT THE DOCUMENTS ARE STILL IN KIGALI.

DAILY REPORT ON RADIO RWANDA PROGRAMMES

Kigali, June 23, 1995 - Speaking on Thursday at the 72th OAU ministerial conference in Addis Abeba, the Rwandese Foreign Minister, Mr. Anastase Gasana explained that the ethnic problem in Rwanda was not a century-old problem as written in the report submitted to the conference but was a problem inherited from colonisation with the colonial politics of divide-and rule.

- The Rwandese Vice-President and Minister for Defence, Major-General Paul Kagame on Thursday officiated at the closing ceremony of the seminar for the training of Rwandese journalists on matters of human rights. Speaking on the occasion, Paul Kagame deplored the negative role played by the Rwandan media in the past, and especially the RTLM radio station, during the genocide of 1994, and urged the Rwandese journalists to participate in the rebuilding of the country and to respect all the time the professional standards of conduct.

In their recommendations, the journalists asked for freedom of speech but asked that the breach of the professional standards of conduct be punished.

- The Rwandese Minister for Planning, Mr. Jean Berchmans Birara on Thursday signed two agreements with the Resident Representative of UNDP in Rwanda whereby UNDP will disburse Rwf 667 million to train the justice officers, to buy office equipments and to bring foreign magistrates to Rwanda, as well as Rwf 2.3 billion to be used in the public finance management projects.

- The Rwandese Ministry of Rehabilitation and Social Integration and UNICEF on Thursday inaugurated at Remera in Kigali a trauma recovery center. UNICEF signed an agreement with the Ministry whereby UNICEF will pay the personnel working for the center and the rental for the center buildings.

- In Ruhengeri prefecture, and especially in the communes of Nyamugari, Butaro and Cyeru, heavy rains have these last days destroyed bridges, homes, roads and crops, causing serious concerns over an imminent famine in the region among the local population who are calling for food assistance. 4 people were killed in

Nyamugari commune by landslide. The danger of epidemics is also posed by lack of latrines, which were destroyed by rains, causing the spread of excrements all over the hills.

The problem of security was also reported in Butaro commune where 2 people were killed in a handgrenade attack and a businessman was macheted.

DAILY REPORT ON RADIO RWANDA PROGRAMMES

Kigali, June 22, 1995 - President Pasteur Bizimungu of Rwanda on Tuesday visited the banana processing factory known as OVIBAR, in Kigali, that produces among other things banana wine. The President found that the factory had been destroyed and plundered and Rwf 130 million were needed for its rehabilitation work.

- The RPA Lieutenant-Colonel Patrick MUGABO on Tuesday appeared in the Military Court in Kigali on charges of stealing two vehicles after the end of the war in 1994. The court's verdict will be known next Friday, at 14.30 PM.

- A Measles epidemic was on Tuesday reported in Rutsiro commune, in Kibuye prefecture where the health officials launched a campaign of immunisation against the disease.

- The workshop for the training of Rwandese journalists on matters of human rights issues that started on Monday, continued on Tuesday in Hotel des Diplomates in Kigali. In his exposé, the representative of the Rwandese human rights group, CLADHO, said that the Rwandese media rarely addressed human rights issues and that that was the reason why CLADHO intended to establish a radio station in Rwanda with the objective to sensitise the population over human rights issues.

- Gihira hydraulic power plant in Gisenyi was on Tuesday invaded by heavy waters as a result of the rains. The local population was asked to help evacuate the water and sand that hampered the running of the machines.

DAILY REPORT ON RADIO RWANDA PROGRAMMES

Kigali, June 21, 1995 - A cabinet meeting was held on Tuesday in Kigali under the chairmanship of President Pasteur Bizimungu of Rwanda. In a communique issued after the meeting and read on Radio Rwanda by the Government's Spokesman and Minister for Information, Mr. Jean Baptiste Nkuriyingoma, the cabinet renewed its commitment to the repatriation of Rwandese refugees. It decided that as the wish was expressed by some Rwandese refugees to hold negotiations with the Rwandese Government prior to their return home, those negotiations were possible on condition that those refugees be not involved in acts of genocide. The cabinet also took the decision to abolish the permits of residence for the residents of Kigali town, and banned the issuing out of the permits of residence on the whole Rwandese territory. The cabinet decided that the residence permits be replaced with a new identity card for all Rwandese nationals that would be issued out in less than one month period, in conformity with the Rwandese constitution.

The cabinet also supported the idea that Rwandese refugee delegates visit Rwanda to assess the conditions for their return home and go back to the refugee camps to report to the other refugees on the situation in the country.

- The former Tanzanian President, Mr. Julius Nyerere on Tuesday ended his 5-day visit in Rwanda. Mr. Nyerere on Tuesday held a press conference in Hotel des Mille Collines in Kigali. Asked about the question of refugees in the region, Mr. Nyerere said that the leaders of the home countries of refugees must examine all possibilities likely to urge the refugees to return home. He also indicated that refugees should not be forced to go home if they did not wish to do so.

Mr. Nyerere also urged the Rwandese youth to guard against tribalism and fight against any form of discriminations in order to prepare a better political future for the country.

- A Rwandese Roman Catholic priest, Mr. Wenceslas Munyeshyaka who is accused of being involved in genocide found refuge in a parish in France, where he continues to practise his profession. He is

accused of having conducted church services with a gun on himself and of having given to Interahamwe militia lists of people to be killed at Saint Family Church in Kigali where people had found refuge during the genocide of 1994. The Rwandese priest fled to France with the help of French priests who claim that he is innocent and he had held contacts with Interahamwe militia men in order to dissuade them from killing the refugees who were at Saint Family Church during the genocide of 1994.

- Speaking at the seminar for the training of Rwandese journalists on matters of human rights, on Tuesday, at Hotel des Diplomates, in Kigali, the Rwandese Minister for Justice, Mr. Alphonse-Marie Nkubito agreed that the Rwandese laws on the media were faulty and hampered the freedom of speech, and needed therefore to be amended.

In his exposé at the seminar, the head of Radio UNAMIR, Mr. Zouaoui Benamadi said that in the present era it was no longer possible to impose restrictions on the spread of information because of satellite technology. He also indicated that sometimes newsmen tended to focus on details and failed to report major events, citing as an example the coverage of the Persian Gulf War, when the world media focused on the commander of Desert Storm Operation, Norman Swatzkorp and failed to report on the Iraqi civilian victims.

GENERAL SITUATION

1. The general situation in the sect remains calm. The College reception centre was closed on 22 Jun 95. Some 4,600 people were moved from the camp and resettled in Kibungo, Kibuye and Kigali Bugasuro communes. To date there remain some 100 people. It is expected that they will be clear of the College within the next two days or so. Coopi moved into the College yesterday to start the tear down of the temporary shelters.

2. Discussions with the UNCHR staff in this sector indicate that they will attempt to restart the repatriation of refugees in the Goma area in July. At present they are looking at where to establish the required transit camp. They have got indications from the government that the transit camp should not be located in the Gisenyi area. It is their intent to try and get up to 600 people a day from the Goma area. The transit camp would be designed to a 2000 person capacity with the intent being to move them out of the transit facility within two to three days after they arrive.

3. The septic disposal truck finally arrived in Gisenyi 20 June 95. The prison system was drained. An attempt to get the septic tank to perform three tasks in Ruhengeri the next day failed due to administrative difficulties. As mentioned in the previous Sector 5 SITREPS due to the absence of a permanent Brown and Root representative it is very difficult to process the work orders. Perhaps you can suggest a procedure to overcome this difficulty. As mentioned the three tasks in the Ruhengeri area in priority are: hospital, prefecture and the ICRC house.

OWN HAC ACTIVITIES

4. The MILOBS will be assisting with the logistic support of the Human Rights seminar on "Procedures on Arrest and Detention". This will take the form of provision of transport to the bourgmistres in outlying areas. The seminar will run from 23-25 Jun 95. I have prepared a commune information sheet and translated it into the native language. After consultation with the Prefect of Gisenyi I obtained his support with the project and have distributed the

information sheets to the bourgmeisters. Those that are not returned to me by the end of the seminar will be picked up next week via MILOB patrol. I have attached the information sheet for your records.

5. On 20 Jun I attended a ceremony in the CARE compound to mark African Refugee Day.

GENERAL LIVING CONDITIONS

6. The cost of living has risen dramatically since Jan 95. For example, during the President's last visit he was asked by the townspeople if he could arrange that electricity be free for the next two years. All aspects of living for UNIMIR personnel has been affected as well.

10. Old caseloads. In my view the predominant problems associated with the resettlement of old caseloads in this area is that it is taking an inordinate amount of time for them to have land allocated to them. In one location GR 272976 approx 300 people have been put there from the college, some 45 days later they are still there awaiting the allocation of land. Given the possibility of the start of repatriation in July it could result in another large College like transit camp, that will be difficult to persuade people to leave if they have little hope of getting any land.

13. UNHCR. Anticipated that they will commence a shelter program in late July early August. Some 7,500 shelters allocated for the Gisenyi/Ruhengeri area. It is also reported that the UNHCR seed program may be halted due to budget constraints.

Local Authorities.

14. Relations with the local authorities remain cordial. It is my impression that should we be able to obtain some basic administrative kits ie typewriters, paper and general office supplies our efforts to win their confidence would increase dramatically.

ADMINISTRATIVE POINTS

15. The lack of serviceable vehicles has make it extremely difficult to get out into the sector to visit the NGO's, communes etc to gather information and coord activities. Should the repatriation program start in July with the numbers anticipated it will be essential to mount a highly visible patrol program and as the humanitarian officer, get out to the field to observe. Unless the vehicle situation improves considerably this will not be possible.

GENERAL SITUATION

1. The general situation is conducive in the Sector, there is no fear for any harassment from any part of the Ethnic group. Locals are seen moving even late at night. This indicate to us that the relationship between the Ethnic grouping is improving drastically. Arrest and detention was reported at MUSANGE with 15 people in one room. A team reported that the Bourgermestre is claimed to be in charge of the cell.

AIM

2. The aim of this report is to appraise the UNAMIR MILOBS GP HQ Hac cell, of the humanitarian activities in the Sector for the week ending 23 June 1995. To respond to HAC letters file: 5000.1 (HAC)/A/1 Dated 15 June 1995 and make recommendation.

OWN ACTIVITIES

3. The humanitarian information is coordinated with other NGOs and Agencies in the Sector. The humanitarian officer also conduct surveys in the nearest area accessible by foot to find out the needs of the general people in the Nyamagina commune which is next to Sector MILOBS HQ. The team attended a reburial of the genocide victims at Musange (5347) on 23 June 1995.

GENERAL LIVING CONDITIONS

4. As at this week the general living condition has changed drastically and most of the communes which had not received food for sometime has been distributed with food. This shows that NGOs are still committed to work and help the people of Rwanda.

PEOPLE WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

5. In general people with special needs are increasing due to the registration of widows and orphans in all communes. The information is taking too long to be completed therefore it may not be possible to provide the 100% figure on how many widows, orphans and elders in the sector.

a. REFUGEES. The Kigeme Burundi Refugee Camp (4725) is still operational and has 2125 orphans. This is a reduction in number from the previous figure of 2533.

b. An IDP camp at Murambi (3538) also has a reduced number to 1273 previously it has 1500.

RECOMMENDATIONS

9. The sector recommends that the commune details information be made quarterly since the information involved is many that it could be difficult to make it on monthly basis.

CONCLUSION

10. The health problems reported in our weekly report of 02 - 09 June and 09 - 16 June 1995 were not followed up because of shortages of vehicles. The sector has sent a team to monitor the situation and will report in the next report.

5. **OP RETOUR** The only people to return were IDPs from the two communes of Kivuye and Murambi , max have returned. The no of returnees in the rest of the Prefecture is negligible.

7. **Major Incidents.** The only major incident in the Sector within the period mentioned was as under :-

- a. **Loc** Byumba Camp.
- b. **Date** 05 Mar 95.
- c. **Time** 2245hrs.
- d. **Incident** Three grenades were thrown by unknown persons near the sentry post at the Nibatt camp . Two Nibatt soldiers sustained superficial shrapnel injuries of the kind produced by fragmentation grenades. One of the more seriously wounded soldiers was evacuated to Kigali , his condition is reportedly stable.
- e. **Own Action.** Reporting of incident within 02 mins of occurrence with follow up report within 80 mins. Joint investigation with RPA , Nibatt EOD Team and Offrs. Investigation still on .

8. **Security Appreciation.** In the wake of the Grenade attack incident cited above , some underlying tensions have come to the surface . There is an uneasy calm prevailing within the Sector with underlying currents of ethnic mistrust surfacing from time to time. The majority is that of Hutus with most of the B/Masters being Hutus . The Hutus mistrust the RPA and the hardliners within the govt administration , whereas the Tutsi minority feel insecure and are apprehensive of the future. The Prefect is a Tutsi moderate but the Sub prefect and the RPA Bn Cdr are perceived to be Tutsi hardliners . Incidents of high handedness and certain other complaints against them are heard from time to time . A case came to light where some Hutu returnees were retransported to Kibongo by the authorities on grounds of the returnees themselves choosing to reside there. However on questioning the returnees before their transportation nothing came to light. The majority of prisoners in the sector are Hutus , but this also proves nothing as the ethnic population balance is also the same. Many houses and land of Hutus are now occupied by the Tutsis, the local Hutus feel that these will never be restored to their rightful owners . As perceived by the Hutu locals in the guise of revamping the security in and around the Byumba Camp , the RPA seems to have now embarked on a campaign of preventing interaction between the Nibatt and the locals . The daily sick report has dropped dramatically from an average daily figure of 80 to 01 for 06,07 and 08 Mar , it is however picking up as it was 32 and 35 on 09 and 10 Mar respectively . Three local Barmen have also been threatened and instructed to reduce interaction with the UNAMIR .

9. With the Passage of time the rift between the moderate and hardliner Tutsis in the govt administration is likely to come to the fore. With the nearing of the date of 06 April , the Anniversary of the war more and more symbolic , demonstrative acts of violence may be perpetrated. The situation is likely to continue being tense for sometime from now onwards .



6. OP RETOUR. 678 IDPs returned in Feb into the Kibungo area. Most of them are settled in the northern areas ie, Muhazi and Rukara. A large number of unofficial returnees have arrived; their number is approximately double those arrived officially.

7. DPCs. None.

8. Major Incidents:-

(a) 10 Feb 95. Armed bandits raided a village RWAMANYONI 535138 at 2300h, killed a 36 year old woman and wounded a 8 year old girl. They made away with household goods but were ambushed in the Akagera Park by the RPA and killed. The stolen items were recovered.

(b) 11 Feb 95. Three persons were tortured in Mugesera 4764. These persons were later transferred to Kibungo prison. Human Rights and ICRC were informed. Clandestine prisons were identified in Mugesera and Birenga 5958.

(c) 13 Feb 95. Milobs identified the existence of a clandestine prison in SAKE. Approx 10 people were known to be imprisoned there at that time. On the same day, two women were killed at MUGATARE 4466 in Mugesera.

(d) 15 Feb 95. Two persons noticed providing information to UNAMIR and Human Rights in Mugesera were imprisoned and sent to Kibungo prison on the accusation that they had participated in the genocide. The locals in the area had been apparently warned by the bourgmestre against giving any info to milobs.

(e) 15 Feb 95. A mass grave was located at MBUYE 4548. Locals informed that approximately 50 persons were killed in a house during the war. Their remains had been buried. Human Rights teams did not succeed in opening up the mass grave.

(f) 16 Feb 95. Milob and Ghanbatt patrols were stopped by grenade wielding civilians at RUNDU in KABORONDO. Movement remained restricted in the area for a few days. The Sector Cdr had a meeting with the bourgmestre and the RPA cdr and the movement was restored.

(g) 21 Feb 95. 10 people were arrested in KIGERAMA. the authorities claimed that they had been moved to Kibungo prison. Investigations revealed that they were not in the Kibungo prison. Their present whereabouts are not known. Meanwhile, milob teams patrolling the area are being followed by militia and people are therefore not coming out with any information. Human Rights are following up the case.

(h) 25 Feb 95. A 15 year old girl sought refuge with formed tps at GISHALI after reporting that her father had arrested by the RPA. The whereabouts of this man are not known. Reports were also received of more arrests in Muhazi commune. Meanwhile, RPA soldiers continued to obstruct movement of milobs in the area.


(j) 28 Feb 95. 14 persons were arrested in RUBONA 6566 and transferred to Kibungo prison. Cause of arrest not known.

(k) 06 Mar 95. A local aged 26 years reported to Ghanbatt tps at Gishali. He was badly wounded. He reported that he was imprisoned by the RPA and repeatedly tortured to force him to admit that he had taken part in the genocide. He is presently lodged in Rwamagana hospital and is in a serious condition with gunshot wounds on his back. Human Rights have been informed.

(l) 08 Mar 95. Three locals reported that the RPA assaulted locals at KAJESI 811664 for allegedly interacting with UNAMIR without their permission. Matter is being investigated.

9. Security Appreciation. The situation is stable. No major incidents have come to notice. The incidents of arrests are fairly large and we suspect many more arrests which may have gone

unreported. There are some reports of disappearances and tortures at the hands of the RPA. Some clandestine prisons have been located but authorities are known to have moved the inmates to unknown locations when their locations were revealed to UNAMIR. Locals are being warned against divulging any kind of information to us. This suggests that the local authorities may be in collusion with the RPA in perpetrating the terror. Our impressions are that the authorities are involved in repression and acts of revenge to a very significant extent and the minority is terrorised. This cycle of revenge and counter revenge must stop and people must learn to live with one another if peace is to return.

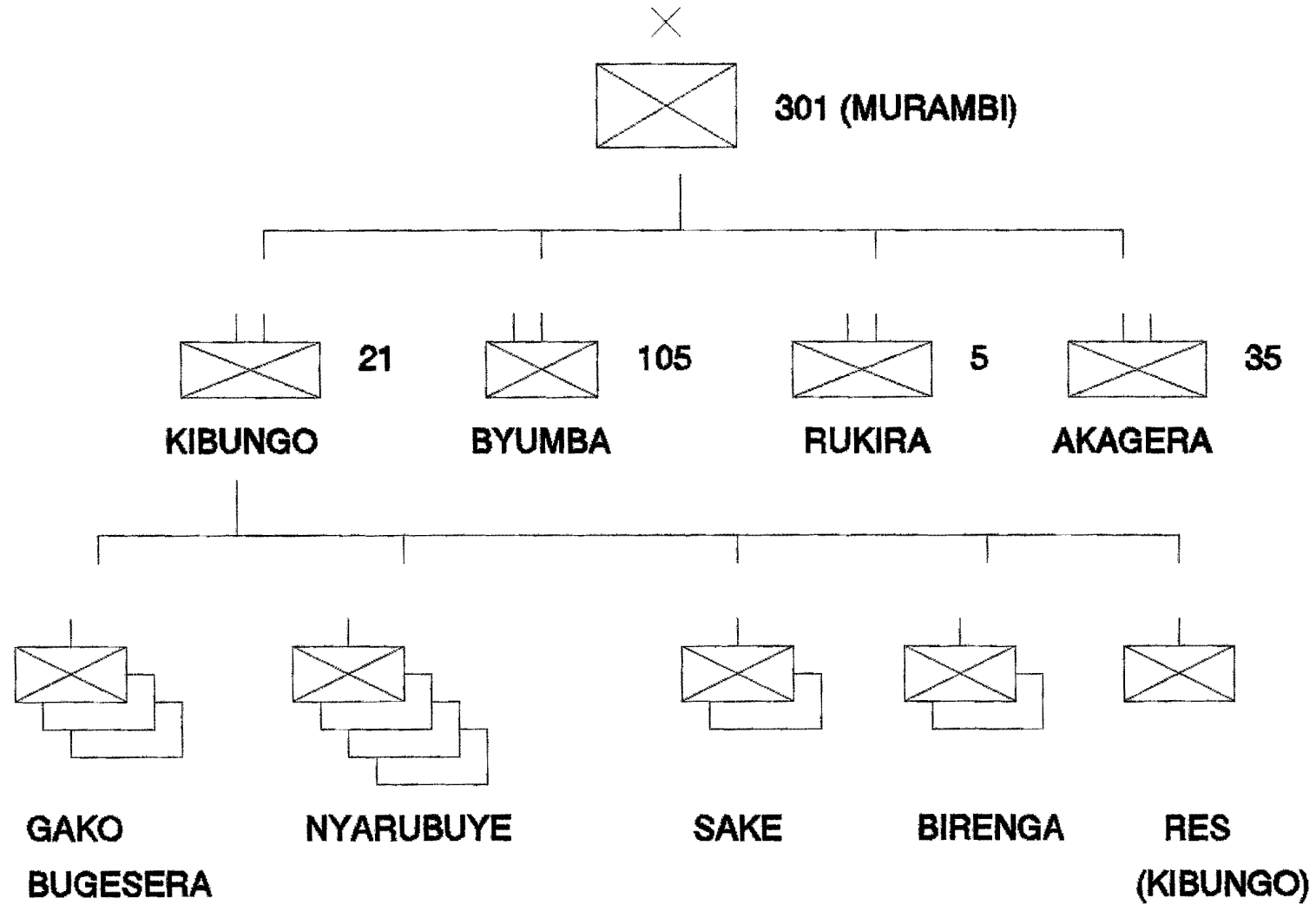



MAJOR INCIDENTS

- A. 09 JAN 95 - 1 RPA SOLDIER AND SIX OTHER MEN WENT TO THE VILLAGE OF KISOGO (2562) AND STARTED BEATING THE PEOPLE WITH STICKS. THEY ARRESTED FOUR PEOPLE WHICH WERE PLACED IN THE RILIMA TRANSIT HOUSE. THE REMAINING 28 PEOPLE OF THE VILLAGE SOUGHT ASYLUM WITH THE GHANCOY AT RILIMA COLLEGE. THE ARRESTED PERS WERE SUSPECTED INTERAMWE.
- B. 11 JAN 95 - TWO WOMEN REPORTED TO OUR LOCATION THAT THEIR HUSBANDS HAD BEEN ARRESTED AROUND 1330 HRS IN RILIMA (2561). HR WERE INFORMED.
- C. 14 JAN 95 - TWO PEOPLE WERE ARRESTED BY LOCAL MILITIA AT KASUGA (0354) AND TAKEN TO MUSEYIN (0459).
- D. 19 JAN 95 - AN UNSIGNED LETTER WAS RECEIVED FROM SOME HUTU'S IN KANZENZE THAT WAS COMPLAINING OF INSECURITY IN THE AREA OF NYAGI HUNIKA WHERE SOME OF THEM WERE BEING HARASSED AND PICKED UP. THEY CLAIMED THAT THEY SLEPT IN THE BUSH AT NIGHT. THE LETTER WAS GIVEN TO ICRC AND HUMAN RIGHTS, GHANBATT INTENSIFIED THEIR PATROLS IN THE AREA.
- E. 20 JAN 95 - ON 18 JAN 95 AROUND 1400 HRS RILIMA LOCAL AUTHORITIES WENT TO KIDOGO (2562) TO ARREST TWO CIVILIANS. IN THE COURSE OF THE ARREST ONE MAN RESISTED AND WAS BEATEN UNTIL HE COLLAPSED AND LATER DIED. THE OTHER MAN WAS TAKEN TO RILIMA PRISON. ICRC AND HUMAN RIGHTS WERE INFORMED.
- F. 29 JAN 95 - ONE DP WAS ARRESTED IN NGENDA ON CHARGES OF COMMITTING ATROCITIES DURING THE WAR. HUMAN RIGHT WERE INFORMED.
- G. 22 FEB 95 - ON MAN FROM RWINUME (2463) WAS SHOT IN THE SHOULDER AND WAS HOSPITALIZED IN KIGALI.
- H. 01 MAR 95 - ONE DP BEATEN AND ARRESTED IN NGENDA FOR WAR ATROCITIES. WHEN MILOB AND UNHCR ASKED WHY MAN WAS BEING BEATEN THEY WERE TOLD TO GO AWAY. MILOBS WENT BACK THE NEXT DAY AND THE BOURGERMEISTER WAS MORE COOPERATIVE. HUMAN RIGHTS WERE INFORMED.
- I. 01 MAR 95 - RECEIVED LETTER FROM THE INTERPRETER FOR GHAN PL IN NYMATA STATING THAT HE WAS INTERROGATED BY THREE RPA INT OFFICERS ABOUT HIS WORK WITH UNAMIR TROOPS. GHANCOY IS INVESTIGATING.
