SUBJECT : YUGOSLAV REFUGEES IN EGYPT RELATED TO
MILITARY PERSONNEL REPORTED TO BE IN ITALY.

1. We are submitting herewith a nominal roll of 10 female refugees claiming Yugoslav nationality, whose husbands or other close kin are reported to be with the Ex-Royal Yugoslav Forces in Italy.
2. We understand that the applications of these persons for entry permits for Italy are now under consideration by the Italian Government Representatives in Cairo. We understand, further, that all 10 persons would be able to make the trip to Italy at their own expense in case permission to enter this country is granted by Italian authorities.
3. Please advise us whether these persons would be eligible for maintenance by military authority in Italy on the basis of the claimed dependants on military personnel at the Eboli Camp.
4. The entire matter would be simplified if the displaced persons in the Middle East desired to join their kin here for repatriation to Yugoslavia.
5. We would appreciate your advice on this matter.

We regret very much the delay in answering the inquiry concerning the 10 dependents of Military Personnel of Ex-Royal Yugoslav Army Forces, now in Italy.

Please be advised that the responsibility for these Army Forces is a military one and Eboli, the camp to which you refer, is a responsibility of G-5 A.F.R.Q.

We are attaching our letter of inquiry to G-5 A.F.R.Q. regarding this matter, and we will forward their reply to you as soon as it is received.

We wish to advise you that the Italian Government has stated as policy, that displaced persons entering Italy may do so for transit purpose only. However, there may be the possibility that these displaced persons referred to may after joining their husbands, all elect to go home.

We shall do every thing possible at this end to help.

SUBJECT : Clandestine Entry of Jews - your letter 15 Nov. 46.

We are in receipt of the above-mentioned communication. We wish to point out that the American Joint Distribution Committee is not a participant in the clandestine passage of Jews across the Italian Austrian frontier, and that the vehicles alleged to have carried AJDC markings, as reported to me by Mr. Varrichione, were not vehicles operated by this organization. The drivers mentioned in the report were not at any time employees of this organization. Any documents carried by these drivers, therefore, were not authorized by this organization.

As you know, however, our policy concerning infiltrates into Italy parallels the UNRRA Italian Mission policy, that is, that we recognize is as a human responsibility on the part of your own, to provide care for these prosecutees on a humanitarian basis when they are in this country.

Dear Mr. Trobe,

This will confirm conversation which you had with Mr. Varrichione recently reference the reported clandestine passage of Jews over the Italo-Austrian frontier wherein UNRRA vehicles and AJDC personnel were stated to have been involved.

We have been given to understand that this matter has already been discussed between you and Brigadier Garr of AC.

From the UNRRA point of view we are particularly concerned that vehicles bearing UNRRA markings and vehicles bearing AJDC markings using UNRRA petrol, were referred to in the report as participating in the clandestine passage of Jewish D.Ps.

According to the report, the drivers and other personnel operating those vehicles in the above-mentioned area, were in possession of documents which would indicate that UNRRA and AJDC were officially participating in this activity.

We wish to state that UNRRA trucks and other agency vehicles using UNRRA petrol must not be used for moving illegal entrants into Italy.

We have been given to understand that you are taking steps to investigate this entire matter.

We should very much appreciate your advice and findings reference the above, particularly as to what controls may be put into effect to ensure authorized movement of vehicles for legitimate purposes only.

1. Incidents have arisen during border patrol operations by military personnel in connection with checking and searching of repatriation trains containing United Nations Displaced Persons. Reports to this Headquarters indicate that there is a lack of uniform procedure in the inspection of trains, particularly as regards personal belongings which are allowed to accompany individuals being repatriated. To establish a uniform inspection of repatriation movements, the following interim instructions are published, effective immediately. This Headquarters will amplify these instructions by a directive to be published at a future date.
2. Inspection of personnel and baggage prior to entrainment will be the responsibility of the Assembly Center Director and will be conducted in compliance with this and subsequent directives. The Assembly Center Director will deliver to the Train Commander, prior to the departure of the train, a written statement to the effect that inspection of personnel and baggage has been made.
3. Personnel included in a repatriation movement are allowed to take with them personal property excluding objects of art, radio transmitters, code books, cipher devices, fire arms, ammunition, explosives, and those items too bulky to be transported. In the absence of prima facie evidence to the contrary, it should be assumed that personal belongings in the possession of persons to be repatriated have been legally acquired; in other words, any personal property which does NOT fall within the contraband list above and which could have been legally acquired should be permitted to accompany the Displaced Persons.
4. Persons being repatriated will be allowed to take with them those items of U.S. Government issue and PX supplies as have been supplied by UNRRA or by the U.S. Army.
5. Personnel on border patrol duty will limit their inspection of repatriation trains to verifying with the Train Commander that the movement is an organized movement and that the inspection of personnel and baggage has been accomplished by the Assembly Center Director. In the event the inspection has NOT been made, the train will be allowed to pass and a report will be made to this Headquarters through channels.
6. The above instructions are written to cover primarily the inspection of repatriation trains leaving the US Zone of GERMANY. These are the main

organized movements of Displaced Persons at this time. The same principles, however, will apply to the inspection of repatriation trains entering or transiting the U.S. ZONE. In the absence of evidence to the contrary, it should be assumed that the shipping agency has inspected to assure that only authorized personnel, supplies and equipment are on the Train.

7. In case of repatriation trains of enemy and ex-enemy nationals the provisions of letter this Headquarters AG 3837 GEC-AGO, 16 October, 1946, subject: "Repatriation of enemy and ex-enemy nationals" will obtain (?). Such nationals (which include Austrians, Bulgarians, Hungarians and Rumanians) will NOT be permitted to take with them any of the prohibited items listed in paragraph 3 above. They will be permitted to take with them, subject to import Regulations of the country to which they are being repatriated, their property, excluding foreign exchange assets as defined in paragraph 11 D, Article VII, Military Government Law Number 53, provided that no reasonable doubt exists as to the bonafide ownership of the property and that no interest in such property is held directly or indirectly by any person in GERMANY. NO arbitrary limit is prescribed but transportation facilities will govern the amount of property carried by persons being repatriated.

CARRYING OF FIREARMS BY UNRRA PERSONNEL

Reference your letter No. S/0057 dated 9 October 1946.

1. Under the Agreement with the Italian Government UNRRA Class I personnel enjoy certain diplomatic immunities, but it is the firm policy of this Mission to ensure that there is no abuse in the exercising of such privileges, particularly when this may constitute a breach of Italian Law.
2. In the case mentioned in your letter, it is clear that, as the Italian Law prescribes firearms cannot be carried without special authority from the Police, no UNRRA personnel should be allowed to carry weapons unless they obtain such authority.
3. Furthermore, it is this Mission's policy not to allow any of its employees to carry arms in the performance of their duty.
4. However, should any difficulty arise in the protection of UNRRA/AFHQ supplies, we will be glad to assist you in obtaining adequate protection from the Italian Government.

SUBJECT: YUGOSLAV CHILDREN IN NGOLI CAMP.

1. Recently our Field Welfare Officer in Naples was approached by a woman describing herself as "Welfare Officer with the Obstetric Hospital, Ngoli", Mrs. Matseha Ebanova.
2. She stated that she had been sent to UNRRA by the director of the hospital to request assistance for 230 children under the age of twelve in the Camp, many of whom are unaccompanied.
3. Upon enquiry she stated that the request did not come from the British Military Commandant of the Camp because he had no authority to do so.
4. In response to an explanation that UNRRA could assist only in repatriation of this group, she stated that there was no question of repatriation, "because the British authorities promised to take care of everyone who did not want to return to Yugoslavia".
5. This is for your advice and information.

MONTHLY REPORT TO EUROPEAN REGIONAL OFFICE

AUGUST, 1946.

1. Relationships with the Government - not applicable.
2. Relationships with other Agencies:
 - (a) Military: Relations with Military organisations continue to be excellent. No difficulties have arisen which have not been satisfactorily settled.
 - (b) Other Missions: Relations with other Missions continue to be entirely satisfactory.
3. Personnel Change. On 28 August, Air Vice-Marshal R. E. SAUL left UNRRA/AFHQ on transfer to UNRRA Detachment Trieste. Charge of UNRRA/AFHQ devolved on H. R. HUNT.
4. SUPPLY and PROCUREMENT
 - (a) U.S. Surpluses: U.S. Surplus Procurement is virtually completed, and indications so far received from Headquarters are that no further purchases will be made. There still remains, however, some 3,000 ship tons of stores to be moved, and until this movement is completed and the necessary documents filed, final accounts for SURPROP cannot be drawn up. Certain pricing negotiations are still in hand with C.F.L.C., and a measure of success in negotiating downward prices has been achieved during the month in respect of a few specific deliveries where condition of stores was not up to standard.
 - (b) British Surpluses: During the month substantial declarations have been made by the British Military, and in all cases details have been notified to E.R.O., copy to Headquarters, in order that we may be instructed whether or not to purchase. This procedure is working quite smoothly, and some 12,000 ship tons of stores, mainly of engineer origin, are now awaiting shipment. The quality and prices of British stores procured have so far been most satisfactory, and the Chief Disposals Officer, Ministry of Supply, Rome, has given every co-operation. Due to lack of facilities, the f.o.b. clause in SURUK procedure has now been abandoned and we are taking delivery ex-depot and arranging depot/dockside or rail-siding movement ourselves, using the same machinery as we have always used in the movement of U.S. military stores.
 - (c) Monthly Summary: A deadweight tonnage summary of Military stores procured during August 1946 is attached as Appendix "A".
 - (d) P.O.L.: Delivery of P.O.L. programmes has proceeded satisfactorily during the month, and it is not expected there will be any further difficulties involved in completing the present programme.
 - (e) Commodity Accounting - (Finance and Supply): Records are being maintained on a current basis. Priority is now being given to a final closing of SURPROP accounts, but closing is temporarily delayed pending shipment of the balance of SURPROP stores from Italy and certain price

re-negotiations with O.F.L.C. So soon as these two matters are cleared no difficulty is envisaged in closing the records for presentation to the auditors.

5. MOVEMENTS, SHIPPING, etc.

Some 3,000 tons of SURPROP stores and 12,000 tons of SURUK stores now await shipment from Italy. The main bulk of these tonnages is destined for JUGOSLAVIA and GREECE, but stores are also on hand for delivery to Central and North European countries and China. Application has been made to E.R.O. Shipping Division for vessels to clear these tonnages, and it is hoped that loading will commence within the next four weeks.

Activities of the Rome Diversion Office have been proceeding normally during the month, and no points of specific interest have arisen.

SUBJECT: Rations for Displaced Persons Camps

TO : Headquarters
UNRRA - Italy Mission

Reference the questions raised at UNRRA/AC Conference held at your Headquarters on 28 June concerning the supply of rations for Displaced Persons in UNRRA Camps.

1. It is confirmed that the military will continue to make rations available to UNRRA Displaced Persons Camps on the same basis as to A.C. Displaced Persons Camps in Italy until the UNRRA/SACMED Agreement becomes effective.

2. It is also agreed that if UNRRA so desires, rations may be made available from military stocks on a reimbursement basis after the effective date of the Agreement, subject to the following provisions:

(a) No supply installation will be retained for feeding DPs when the military commitment has ceased. It may, therefore, be necessary to transport supplies considerable distances from the nearest supply unit.

(b) Military supplies made available after the effective date of the Agreement can only be issued subsequent to formal approval by higher authority, which must be obtained prior to delivery of the supplies.

3. If you can, therefore, estimate the commitment referred to in para 2, above, the necessary authority will be requested.

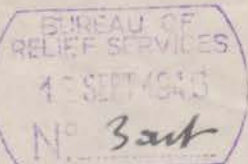

The following persons have been designated as war criminals by Deputy Representative of Yugoslavia to the Advisory Council for Italy. We are passing this information on to you for whatever action you may wish to take. All of the persons listed are being discontinued from UNRRA assistance, as a result of this representation by the Yugoslav representative.

1. Bandovic Milan, collaborator of ill-famed governor and war criminal in Monte Negro, Pirzio Biroli, who escaped in August 1945, to Italy, before the advancing Yugoslav Army.
2. Lasarevic Ivo, well known collaborator from Hercegovina and Montenegro, war criminal.
3. Kochansky Drago, is a deserter of Yugoslav Army.
4. Popovic Todor, notorious collaborator of war criminal, general Medic, who was recently handed over to Yugoslav authorities, and well known collaborator of Italian occupation forces in Yugoslavia.
5. Rakocovic Milo, Montenegrin leader and best known collaborator of war criminal, Italian governor of Montenegro during the occupation, Pirzio Biroli.
6. Zebot Ciril, war criminal.
7. Vukelic Gjuro, priest, organizer and ill-famed leader of quailing formations in Lika (Yugoslavia)
8. Vu Josevic Nikola collaborator who went to Italy 1945, flying before the advancing Yugoslav Army.

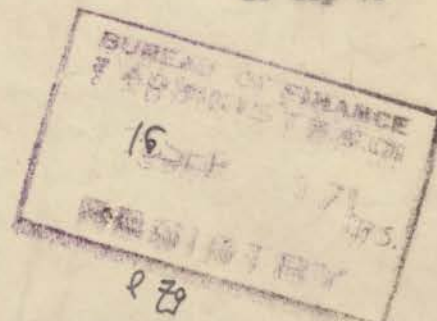

Dear Colonel Jackman,

In conformity with your conversation of last Wednesday 11 Sep with Mr Prince of this Mission, I would like to give you the following information in support of the appeal we make that A.P.O. facilities be continued to this Mission through the balance of this year.

There is at present attached to this Mission a total of 196 employees of American nationality. The great majority of these are at present eligible to repatriation by UNRRA under its regulations, in the event they wish to resign, in view of their having completed one year of service. This Mission's activities were planned to terminate at the end of this year, but shipping and other delays have necessitated a continuance into 1947. It is of the utmost urgency that we retain the services of our experienced personnel until we have discharged our responsibilities to the countries we serve.

There is a natural tendency on the part of some employees at this stage of a program to seek positions of more permanency than UNRRA has to offer, and this tendency our Headquarters at Washington is trying to offset in all ways possible. A very important consideration to a person away from home, as your people can appreciate, is the best mail services obtainable. The International Mail Service, which is our alternative to A.P.O. facilities, has been inoperative for several years, thus its service could not be expected to be at very high standards. In addition, package mail is not handled by that service. The foregoing, affecting the morale of our staff, and thus its willingness to help complete our job, is the prime reason for our extension request.

It would perhaps be well for me to draw your attention to the extent of the U.S. participation in UNRRA. Seventy-two percent of UNRRA funds are from U.S. Congressional appropriation, and the U.S. therefore has a sizeable stake in its successfully completing its task. UNRRA has, and is being of material assistance to the Allied Armies in Europe intaking over in large part the Displaced Persons problem and generally being helpful through its program in relieving distress and assisting in maintaining in that manner domestic order.

We well appreciate the difficulties you are faced with in providing postal services over absolute army needs. You have limited personnel and now reduced funds through appropriation channels. We can, and will on a basis to be agreed upon, provide civilian personnel and transport in Rome area during the Christmas season as a condition to your continuation of service to this Mission.

The volume of our mail traffic is not so heavy as might be supposed. Our U.S. staff totals 196, as mentioned, with 142 at Mission Headquarters in Rome and 54 at The Regional Offices throughout this country. Incoming A.P.O. is picked up in bags on arrival in Rome and distributed completely by our own organization. At present, all Mission official mail to Washington is dispatched through channels other than A.P.O.

Over the past three months, incoming letters have averaged 6,500 per month, and packages 450 per month. Outgoing letters mailed through Rome Headquarters is at present averaging 130 per day, the weight being 1.20 kgs. Capt. Green of APO 528 confirms these figures and reports outgoing packages being mailed at present average three to four daily.

We earnestly request that A.P.O. facilities remain available to this Mission in view of the foregoing considerations for the balance of this year, and thereafter if possible through three months of 1947. On the completion of these periods this Mission will make provision for mail despatch independent of A.P.O.

We will encourage restriction in the receipt and dispatch of parcels and insure conformance to postal regulations, particularly as to parcel mail. We will provide civilian personnel and transport at the Christmas period as previously mentioned. We will continue to distribute from a central point within this country all incoming mail.

If your office requires additional information in connection with this application, please advise me.

AMERICAN A.P.O. PRIVILEGES.

Colonel Jackman, Postal Officer AFHQ (telephone number FREEDOM 562) telephoned me this afternoon concerning the Army plans to discontinue A.P.O. privileges to UNRRA. He stated that unless he hears from the Mission to the contrary by noon tomorrow, 7 September, he will send a letter to the War Department, recommending the discontinuance of A.P.O. privileges to UNRRA, effective 1 October. The exceptions to this recommendation might be UNRRA units in out of the way places such as parts of the Balkans, where commercial facilities are not available.

Please note that Col. Jackman called me because the original message on this point had been sent by him to me through Colonel Notestein.

Attached you will find a copy of the Resolution on Displaced Persons which was adopted at the recent UNRRA Council Meeting in Geneva.

You will note that there are two points of major importance, in that, subject to certain provisions, UNRRA may continue its Displaced Persons operations until no later than June 30, 1947, and that UNRRA may, regardless of other Resolutions, extend or modify its work with Displaced Persons to cover any of the categories of persons defined in the draft constitution of the International Refugee Organization.

With respect to the latter provision, may I inform you that our London office has stated that it is now reviewing this clause and will issue instructions to the field concerning its application. You may be sure we shall inform you as soon as we receive notification.

SUBJECT: Officer Separation Criteria

TO : Commanders of all Major Commands, Separate Units and Installations,
MTOUSA

AGWAR cable WCL-39032 dated 26 August 1946 is quoted for information, guidance and necessary action.

"The following will govern demobilization of Officer personnel of the Army. Effective 1 September 1946.

I. Officers other than Medical Department Officers.

1. Except as listed in paragraphs 2 and 3 immediately following, non-volunteer Officers are eligible for separation upon completion of 24 months service, and will be separated from the Army by the last day of the month in which the 24 months of service is completed.

2. Scarce category Officers whose military occupational specialties appear in War Department Circular 321 of 1945, as amended by War Department Circular 48 of 1946, except Civil Affairs or Military Government Officers, may be retained in the service until replaced, provided they are utilized in their specialty, but in NO case longer than 6 months beyond the date on which they would be separated under instructions in paragraph 1 above.

3. Officers whose military occupational specialty denoted linguistic ability, and who are being utilized in such military occupational specialty, will be separated NOT later than upon completion of 42 months of service. Officer linguists NOT being utilized full time in their language specialty will be separated in accordance with provisions of paragraph 1 above.

4. Above instructions are applicable to Officers of the Women's Army Corps.

II. Medical Department Officers.

1. Except as indicated in paragraphs 2 and 3 immediately following, non-volunteer Medical Department Officers are eligible for separation upon completion of service indicated:

- (A) Medical Corps Officers - 24 months service.
- (B) Dental Corps Officers - 30 months service.
- (C) Veterinary Corps, Sanitary Corps and Medical Administrative Corps - 36 months service.
- (D) Medical Department dietitians and physical therapists - 24 months service.
- (E) Army Nurses Corps - 14 months service.

2. Medical Corps Officers with primary or secondary classifications (A), (B), or (C) in the following military occupational specialties, and who are assigned to duties utilizing their specialty, are eligible for separation upon completion of 36 months service:

Release of such specialties however, is subject to the right of the Surgeon General to retain by individual selection a relatively few critically needed specialists, where this is essential to the proper care of patients.

3. Eligibility for separation of Medical Corps, Dental Corps, or Veterinary Corps Officers who are graduates of Army specialized training program, is as follows:

- (A) Medical Corps - upon completion of 24 months active commissioned service.
- (B) Dental Corps - upon completion of 30 months active commissioned service.
- (C) Veterinary Corps - upon completion of 36 months active commissioned service.

4. All Medical Department Officers upon becoming eligible for relief from active duty under this policy will be separated within 60 days from date of eligibility.

5. All Medical Department Officers surplus to requirements of major Commands, or returned to Zone of Interior from overseas who are within 60 days of eligibility for release, will be separated under provisions of Section 2, War Department Circular 290, 1945.

III. General Provisions.

1. Computation of length of service will include total honorable active commissioned service and enlisted service, continuous or interrupted, since 14 September 1940. Time lost under Article of War 107 will NOT be included.

2. The term non-volunteer Officers as used herein refers to those Reserve, National Guard and Army of the United States Officers who have expressed the desire, pursuant to provisions of paragraph 4 (E) Section 4, War Department Circular 366, 1945, to be relieved from active duty at the earliest opportunity.

3. War Department message WCL-20702, dated 17 June 1946 pertaining to separation criteria for Medical Department Officers is rescinded."

FW of Baltic Nationality

1. Your letter reference 3491/A2 of August 24th, addressed to UNRRA AFHQ concerning a/m subject has been referred to this office for reply.
2. All persons formerly resident in the Baltic States who do not now possess currently valid documents of citizenship must prove eligibility for UNRRA assistance as other than United Nations nationals. Thus they are eligible for assistance only if they can prove that they were displaced because of racial or religious persecution or activity in favour of the Allies.
3. Ex-prisoners of war are eligible only for repatriation at the request of their government.
4. At the present time, most of the foreigners in Italy who are in need of assistance and ineligible for UNRRA assistance, are cared for in camps operated by A.C. D.P. & R.S.C.

SUBJECT: Status of UNRRA Personnel for Disciplinary Purposes.

TO : Principal Liaison Officer,
UNRRA, AFHQ

1. Paragraph 2(b) of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 6 is rescinded effective 1 July 1946.

2. The effect of this will be that employees of UNRRA in Italy, other than members of the Armed Forces, will cease to be subject to Military Law and will be regarded as civilians. Criminal proceedings against such persons should be taken to Italian civilian courts according to Italian Law. Where offences are committed in territory administered by the Military Government, proceedings should be taken in Military Government Courts, provided the offences are those which are dealt with by Military Government Courts. If not, proceedings should be taken in the appropriate Civilian Courts.

3. It is requested that you inform the UNRRA Mission to Italy accordingly.

1. Paragraph 2(b) of AFHQ Administrative Memorandum No. 6 is rescinded effective 1 July 1946.

2. The effect of this will be that employees of UNHRA in Italy, other than members of the Armed Forces, will cease to be subject to Military Law and will be regarded as civilians. Criminal proceedings against such persons should be taken in Italian civilian courts according to Italian Law. Where offences are committed in territory administered by the Military Government, proceedings should be taken in Military Government Courts, provided the offences are those which are dealt with by Military Government Courts. If not, proceedings should be taken in the appropriate Civilian Courts.

3. It is requested that you inform the UNHRA Mission to Italy accordingly.

(1) In discussions with the representatives of AFHQ the question has arisen whether UNRRA Italian Mission on behalf of the Italian Government would look after non-Italian displaced persons ineligible for UNRRA assistance in Italy.

(2) We have been advised by UNRRA (London) that UNRRA cannot provide personnel to assist the Italian Government in caring for non-Italian displaced persons ineligible for UNRRA assistance. However, UNRRA (London) has instructed us that the Italian Government may assist such ineligible persons with imported UNRRA supplies. In the opinion of UNRRA (London) the maintenance of such displaced persons forms part of the supply programme of the recipient country and the Italian Government may devote to that purpose the UNRRA supplies which are imported to assist it in maintaining the general population of the country.

As you will note, such action was contrary to the Austrian Mission policy and, according to their investigation, an UNRRA official who had been released from that Mission had, apparently, taken upon himself to take this unwarranted and unauthorized action.

We can only express our regrets and those of the Austrian Mission and assure you that the UNRRA Austrian Mission will continue in its adherence to the proper policies.

SUBJECT: Moving of G-5 AFHQ

Please treat this as a personal memorandum.

Col. Richardson has informed me, off the record, that the moving plans for AFHQ have been changed to the extent that probably no section of AFHQ will move to Rome. This means that G-5, including G-5 DPs, will probably go to Milan.

I am convinced that the successful prosecution of the DP program requires the closest coordination between AG, AFHQ, the Italian Government and ourselves. This is particularly so in view of the impending Peace Treaty, the increased responsibility which the Italian Government will have and the increased necessity for close and constant clearances between these four units. For these reasons I feel that G-5 DPs should be in Rome. This becomes even more acute if we have to assume responsibility for liaison in behalf of the other Missions. The very weakness of the arrangement to date has been the matter of distance.

I told Col. Richardson that I would ask you to protest this proposal on the part of AFHQ and he suggested that the proper method would be for you to send a personal letter to Col. Notestein. Such an action would be within military channels and protocol since you are completely free to write anything you wish on a personal basis to Col. Notestein.

May I urge you to consider my recommendation to do so as soon as possible.

I should be glad to write the letter if you are in accordance with this suggestion.

Deciding factor appears therefore possibility WARSAW Government fixing final date for accepting repatriates. Small but continuous stream voluntary repatriates opting here but do NOT anticipate large increases until:

(A) Elections in POLAND complete and news from there more reassuring.

1. Two incidents involving attacks on members of Yugoslav TITO Military Mission ME by 'R' Yugoslav Military and civilians occurred 13 and 14 April respectively.

Incident 13 April NOT serious, involving Dep Head of Yugoslav Mission losing his hat but suffering NO physical injury.

Incident 14 April resulted in Major IVKOVIC, Head of Yugoslav Military Mission, being taken to 63 Gen Mil Hospital with head injuries necessitating retention 1 week.

2. Allegations already made in local press by Yugoslav Legation that 'R' Yugoslavs were defacing Partisan graves in UNRRA cemetery. This being investigated and may be true. Yugoslavs will quote necessity for investigation of extent of defacement as reason for Major IVKOVIC's visit to camp and will make as much capital as possible from resulting incident.

3. Full report follows by fast air. Meanwhile following action taken:

(A) Enquiry proceeding into complicity of Military 'R' Yugoslavs as result of which those involved will be Court Martialled.

(B) CMF being requested to accept all unrepatriatable 'R' Yugoslavs in ME. Both Military and Civilian DP Camps understood shortly to be taken over by UNRRA in ITALY.

In effort economy, UNRRA here have put all remaining refugees in one camp including pro TITO. Ex Royalist Yugoslavs.

This gives Yugoslav Legation CAIRO right to visit the camp and they will inevitably come in contact with Chetnik personnel with resulting incidents.

Two incidents this nature already occurred.

UNRRA have lent us a camp site adjoining that occupied by ex-Royalist refugees to accommodate their menfolk who remain military responsibility. We can never separate Military Royalist Yugoslavs from their families nor can we move both to another camp as this would involve Military accepting responsibility for UNRRA families.

If DP Camps still under control Allied Commission grateful if you would accept all Royal Yugoslavs this command both refugees.

Ex military total numbers involved about 500. This would avoid difficulties with UNRRA over accepting ex-Military personnel in their camps later when they have taken over all DP Camps. If UNRRA have already taken over such camps in ITALY which already contain ex-Military personnel we will take the matter up through UNRRA channels from here.

SUBJECT : Displaced Persons Strength Report.

We have received your letter of 19 March in which you ask us to send you a strength report of displaced persons by nationality each month.

Owing to the amount of time involved in receiving mail from the various camps, we regret it will not be possible for us to submit a report showing displaced persons by nationality in the camps as at the first Saturday of each month, until later than the 15th of each month.

We could, however, let you have a report on that date showing the most recent figures received from the various camps, and in some instances these might be as at the first Saturday of the month, but in most cases they would probably be as at approximately the end of the previous month.

Also, as our records are based upon nationality and not upon religion it will be difficult for us to give you any accurate return showing the number of Jewish persons included in these figures.

We shall be pleased to know what action you would like us to take in this matter.

182. Clothing Coupons—British Personnel Released in CMF

1. It has been decided that British personnel released locally in CMF may be granted facilities to obtain a limited amount of civilian clothing from retailers in the UK.

2. A coupon credit in the UK may be established for these individuals, as follows:—

(a) Ninety supplementary clothing coupons will be allotted, valid for immediate use. An extra fifty-six coupons will be allotted to members of the Women's Services released locally.

(b) If a man is not entitled to a suit of civilian clothing on release from the Army, he may be allowed an additional sixty three clothing coupons. This rule will not apply, however, if he is disqualified, because:—

(i) he has received a similar outfit since 16 Oct 44, or

(ii) he has not completed one month's paid army service.

(c) In addition, half the supplement of coupons known as the "emigration rate" will be allowed. This "emigration rate" is the allowance made to civilians proceeding from the UK to their country of residence overseas.

3. The London Headquarters of the following organizations have agreed to deal with the clothing coupon credit on behalf of individuals released for employment with their organizations:—

UNRRA, 11 Portland Place, LONDON, W1.
The Foreign Office, LONDON (for Consular and Diplomatic appointments abroad).

The Ministry of Supply, Adelphi, LONDON, WC2
(for the Ministry of Supply missions overseas).

The War Office (C10) (for civilians employed with the British Allied Control Commissions overseas).

The War Office (C4d) (for civilians employed in War Office Establishments abroad).

Individuals released for employment with any of the above organizations should as soon as release is confirmed, apply for clothing coupon credit through the local headquarters, to the London Headquarters of the organization. A certificate will be attached to the application stating particulars of release and details of civilian clothes issued from Army sources. This certificate will be provided at the Assembly Centre on request.

The London Headquarters of the organization will then forward clothing coupons to civilian retailers from whom purchases are made in accordance with the wishes of the ex-service man or woman and will also keep a record of coupons spent and warn the individual when he or she is reaching the limit of the coupon credit.

Neither the proxy nor the Board of Trade will be responsible for any financial transactions involved.

4. The following instructions apply to British personnel released locally who are not employed by any of the organizations stated in para 3 above.

(a) They should forward a certificate of release to the Board of Trade, Northgate Mansions, Prince Albert Road, LONDON, NW8. This certificate, which will be provided on request at the Assembly Centre, will state:—

(i) Date of, and authority for, local release.

(ii) Country of release.

(b) They should state the name and address of the retailer from whom they propose to make their purchases or of a friend or relative who will make a purchase on their behalf.

(c) They should at the same time, advise the retailer or the friend or relative to apply to the Board of Trade at the above address for further details of the procedure for exporting goods.

5. Export of civilian clothing replacements for the maintenance of outfits purchased under the conditions of para 2 (above) are not at present allowed.

6. Individuals already released should, if they have any questions, approach the Board of Trade, Northgate Mansions, Prince Albert Road, LONDON, NW8. Those employed with the organizations stated in para 3, should make application through local headquarters to the London Headquarters of the organization concerned.

1. Applications for voluntary deferment of Release may now be submitted by:—

(a) Male Personnel (excl Medical and Dental Officers) in Age/Service Groups 41 to 55.

(c) ATS officers and auxiliaries and VAD members in Age/Service Groups 51 to 60.

1. Individuals who have voluntarily deferred Release for six months or for one year who desire to continue serving after the expiration of the these fixed periods may now extend the period of deferment to two years or until General Demobilization.

2. This concession will be subject to review and may subsequently be withdrawn. Individuals who vary their terms of deferment under this authority will not be affected by its subsequent withdrawal.

3. The starting date of deferment for individuals who extend to DV2 will remain unchanged as the two years will reckon from the date their Age/Service Group commenced release as already notified in GROs.

4. New applications should be submitted in accordance with GRO 541/45 and at para 5 the old period of deferment must be stated together with particulars of the order promulgating this deferment where this is available.

MODIFICATIONS OF REGULATIONS FOR RELEASE FROM THE ARMY, 1945

PROCEDURE FOR DISPERSAL.

"Individuals (including members of the Women's Forces) serving with units and establishments in the UK, when selected for release, will be despatched direct from their units to the Military Dispersal Unit serving the Dispersal Area in which the individual's selected domicile is located. Where unnecessary travel is involved, individuals may be sent to the most appropriate Military Dispersal unit, where they will be released. (See Appendix 'A')."

"All ranks (men) returning from overseas will be despatched from the Military Disembarkation Camp Unit to No. 7 Military Dispersal Unit, except those

arriving at No. 2 Disembarkation Group Headquarters, who will be released by the Disembarkation Group Headquarters."

Para 802 (f) (v). *Delete and substitute:—*

"ATS returning from overseas will be despatched from War Office Holding Unit, ATS, 12 Radnor Place, LONDON, W2, to No. 7 Military Dispersal Unit for release. All ATS personnel will be given facilities to purchase civilian clothing before proceeding to the Military Dispersal Unit."

NOTE.—The provisions respecting the surrender of service dress and greatcoats and the issue of civilian clothing to personnel proceeding to EIRE are referred to in Appendix "D," Section I, para 5 (b) as amended.

MILITARY COLLECTING UNITS.

PERSONNEL GOING TO EIRE.

(a) "All individuals (including members of the Women's Forces) stationed in GREAT BRITAIN or NORTHERN IRELAND, who are to return to EIRE or NORTHERN IRELAND will be despatched to No. 7 Military Dispersal Unit for Release."

(b) ATS personnel stationed in GREAT BRITAIN and NORTHERN IRELAND will be issued with cash and clothing coupons at the Western Command ATS Holding Unit, KIRBY, to enable them to purchase civilian clothes.

(c) All individuals, except ATS, returning from overseas will be despatched from the Military Disembarkation Camp Unit to No. 7 Military Dispersal Unit for Release, except those arriving at No. 2 Disembarkation Group Headquarters who will be released by the Disembarkation Group Headquarters.

(d) Men will be issued at the respective Military Dispersal Units with the clothing coupons referred to in Appendix "D," Section I, para 20 (d).

(e) ATS personnel returning from overseas will be despatched from War Office Holding Unit ATS, 12 Radnor Place, LONDON, W2, (where they will be issued with cash and clothing coupons to enable them to purchase civilian clothing) to No. 7 Military Dispersal Unit, ASHTON-UNDER-LYNE for Release.

(f) All ranks (men) proceeding to EIRE will hand in, at the respective Military Dispersal Units, their remaining service dress and greatcoat. It is essential that individuals returning to EIRE should leave the Military Dispersal Units in civilian clothes."

NOTE.—The War Office ATS Holding Unit, and Western Command ATS Holding Unit, will notify the Paymaster of cash advances, and the issue of clothing coupons will be noted on page 2 of the Release Book and the individual's signature obtained in receipt.

186. Emigration to AUSTRALIA

1. Arrangements have been made with the Commonwealth of AUSTRALIA for the assisted migration of suitable British subjects (ex-service men and women) who wish to settle in AUSTRALIA and whom the Australian Government are willing to receive.

2. Arrangements include the grant of free passages to suitable British Service men or women who were resident in the BRITISH ISLES or were in the UK Forces overseas on 1 Sep 38 and have served in a whole time capacity in the Armed Forces or the Merchant Navy of the UK during the period of the war. Their dependants are also covered in this scheme.

3. It is unlikely that the scheme will come into operation before the end of 1946 and application will not be submitted before the opening date of the scheme is announced. Even then applications can only be made *after* individuals have been released from the service.

4. It is emphasized that this is the only information available at GHQ and no enquiries will be made by units or formations until further details are published either in ACIs or GROs.

5. This scheme applies only to AUSTRALIA and not to any other country.

187. Soldiers' Pay Books—AB 64 Part II

Reference para 2 (b) (i) of GRO 1129/45.

In view of the large number of men proceeding to the UK for Release and leave, it is of utmost importance that completed and unserviceable Army Books 64 Part II be despatched to Fixed Centre Paymasters without delay.

A weekly despatch of completed books will be made and will include all books withdrawn up to the date of despatch.

The parcels should contain Pay Books only, be packed securely and be addressed clearly.

188. Currency Regulations

This GRO summarises the existing regulations regarding currency transactions. Full details will be found in the relevant GROs quoted in each section.

1. GENERAL (GRO 84/45).

All military personnel and British Nationals who are employed by or who accompany military forces and are subject to military law are warned:—

(a) that the exchange of any currency with any other currency (including the cashing of cheques) is permitted only through official Army Channels, and

(b) that they are only permitted to be in possession of authorized currency of the country in which they are situated for the time being.

2. CURRENCIES LEGAL IN CMF.

The following are the currencies which are legal tender in CMF and the present Army rates of exchange as expressed to one pound Sterling.

NOTE.—The highest denomination notes issued by British Army Cashiers are 1,000 Lire and 100 Schillings, and notes of a higher denomination will not be exchanged by Cashiers unless in exceptional circumstances authority is given by GHQ.

3. BANK OF ENGLAND NOTES (GRO 755/44).

All ranks are warned that it is offence to be in possession of Bank of England Notes of any denomination whilst in this theatre.

4. CURRENCY EXCHANGES.

(a) *Personnel leaving CMF for UK and elsewhere* (GROs 1028/45 and 1029/45). Under the Defence Regulations it is an offence for any member of the Forces to take foreign currency, including military notes, into the UK. Personnel leaving CMF will exchange their currency before embarking. The units of exchange are:—

For UK:—Officers— The unexpended balance of advance of pay not exceeding £50.

Other ranks— Savings from pay and allowance not exceeding cash drawings for the preceding two months, plus £10.

In each case a COs certificate is required.

Destinations other than UK— all ranks £10.

Personnel leaving the theatre *permanently* may have sums in excess of the above, and which have been legitimately acquired, credited to their account.

(b) *Personnel returning to CMF from UK* (GRO 159/46).

Except with the express permission of the Treasury it is forbidden to bring more than five pound sterling (or £10 sterling if final destination is NORTH AFRICA), out of the UK, and the value of any one sterling note must not exceed one pound.

Sterling must be exchanged through official Army Channels at the port of disembarkation if returning by MEDLOC land route or by sea, or at the nearest Army Cash Office immediately on arrival in CMF if returning by air.

(c) *Personnel returning to CMF from places other than UK.*

Personnel returning to CMF from other theatres will comply in all respects with the currency regulations laid down for the time being by the GROs of the theatre from which returning.

5. All ranks are warned that a very serious view will be taken of any contravention of these regulations, and that offenders will be liable to disciplinary action.

6. This GRO will be republished in all lower formations and unit orders at monthly intervals, and brought specially to the notice of all personnel travelling out of CMF.

- (iii) Experience in industrial power load surveys and large scale economic planning is highly desirable.
- (iv) First class executive ability to direct and co-ordinate the activities of the officers working for him in the fields indicated above is essential.
- (v) Personality and high standard of general ability are requirements which should count for a great deal in selecting a candidate for this post.

Pay ranges between Rs 3,000 and Rs 3,500 pm depending on ability. Contract 3 to 5 years. Contributory Provident Fund.

2. "A" GRADE PROJECT OFFICER (THERMAL POWER STATION ENGINEER SENIOR).

Qualifications.

A degree or diploma in Mechanical and/or Electrical Engineering of a recognized University or Technical College with thorough experience in steam power station performance calculations and steam pressures and temperatures up to 625 lb and 825° involving units up to 30,000 KW. Up-to-date experience of modern steam power station layout essential, but not to the extent necessary for carrying out detailed designs. Good experience of siting steam power stations and estimating their capital and operating costs. A sound knowledge of cooling tower performance is important. Great experience of power station switching is *not* essential. Provided the candidate has had certain amount to do with the accommodation of electrical equipment in power stations he could, with advantage, be a Mechanical rather than an Electrical Engineer—his ability lying in building construction, boiler plant, turbines and circulating water systems.

A Civil Engineer, graduate from a recognized University or Technical College, with at least 15 years' experience, five of which must have been a senior responsible post. His experience should cover most of the following subjects:—

(a) Determination of type and magnitude of the development possible in a river basin including determination of general location of projects and desirable amount of reservoir storage.

(b) General layout of projects requiring knowledge of the design of dams and appurtenances of various types, intake structures, pipe lines, hydro-electric power house and related work.

(c) Preparation of cost estimates.

(d) Installation of rainfall and streamflow gauging stations.

(e) Preparation of estimates of power available for various schemes.

(f) Determination of power capacity.

(g) Preparation of proposed operating schedule of projects.

(h) Ability to prepare clear and concise projects reports.

(i) Ability to direct the work of others.

(k) Good personality.

Salary.

Conditions of service the same as in post No. 2 above, except that the age limit is up to 45 years only.

4. "A" GRADE PROJECT OFFICER (ON POWER SURVEYS AND UTILIZATION WORK).

The candidate must be a qualified Electrical Engineer. It is essential that he should have wide knowledge and experience in a responsible position of load forecasting methods, sale-ability of power at varying price levels, and the estimation of prospective sales revenue, together with a thorough knowledge of competitive rates for supply and the economic problems in electric power utilization by primary industries. It is important he should be capable in directing work of others and imparting his knowledge to his assistants. He should preferably be accustomed to carrying on negotiations for the sale of power with large prospective consumers. It is essential that he should possess a high order of ability in expressing himself on paper and in the preparation of reports on power utilization from the point of view of the electric public utility. Personality, initiative and tact will be of value.

Salary.

Conditions of service as in post No. 2 above.

5. "A" GRADE PROJECT OFFICER (COMMERCIAL ENGINEER).

Qualifications.

Candidate should preferably be a qualified Engineer but, primarily, it is essential that he should have a wide knowledge of the costing of electricity supply and the formulation of bulk supply tariffs. Experience of domestic tariffs with promotional elements for the domestic uses of electricity, while

helpful, will not be of great significance. Some knowledge of electricity legislation is highly desirable, together with experience in its practical administration. Other important items in candidate's ability will be knowledge of bulk supply agreement procedure, ability to negotiate, and the estimating of financial results in the operation of a prospective electricity supply undertaking, in order to devise a proper tariff structure. A man with extensive experience in the Commercial Manager's Department of a large undertaking, giving industrial power supplies, would probably be suitable.

195. Transfer to, or Service with, RASC or RAOC (Officers)

1. 5. Although not essential, officers with knowledge of supplies, petrol or transport will find that such knowledge will be advantageous on either transferring to or serving with RASC. Similarly, a knowledge of Ordnance stores and procedure will be advantageous in the case of transfer or attachment to RAOC.

6. As far as can be seen under present circumstances opportunities may occur for accelerated promotion subject of course, to the individual officer's merits.

7. No applications will be with-held and all such applications will be submitted through normal staff channels to GHQ CMF stating:—

197. Provision of Junior Staff Officers

1. The provision of trained and qualified officers to fill Junior Staff appointments, particularly Grade III, is likely to remain a difficult problem for some time to come.

2. When the Junior Staff Courses were discontinued a scheme for attaching officers to HQs, Formations, Districts etc, as Staff Learners was introduced. It has now become necessary to revise the procedure for the attachment of officers as Staff Learners as laid down in GRO 210/45.

3. Although it is considered desirable that an officer attached to a Headquarters as a Staff Learner should do a period in "G," "A," and "Q" Branches, it has been found at the present time, due to the shortage of officers, that this procedure is impracticable and uneconomical. Therefore, in future and until the shortage in officers decreases, an officer will be attached to a HQ, Formation, District, etc, with a view to taking over a specific appointment from an officer who is to be released, pythoned, or upgraded within the next two months.

4. Officers nominated and recommended for attachment as Staff Learners will:—

- (a) have reached the age of 24 years, unless they have special qualification for the particular appointment required to be filled,
- (b) have at least eight months expected service, or
- (c) be a regular officer or candidate for a regular commission.

5. Commanders will, upon the recommendation of Unit Commander, nominate officers for attachment to a Headquarters as a Staff Learner. Nominations will be submitted through normal channels to higher formation Headquarters who will make a request by signal to GHQ CMF for the attachment of the officer nominated as a Staff Learner.

6. Officers attached to a Headquarters as a Staff Learner will be struck off the strength of their unit and posted to the X (iv) A List attached to the Headquarters concerned. Officers holding temporary rank will retain it for a period of 61 days in accordance with GRO 706/44.

7. A report in letter form will be initiated by the Commander of the Headquarters to which an officer has been attached as a Staff Learner, within a maximum of 5 weeks of the attachment, stating the suitability or otherwise of the officer for appointment on the staff. Officers found unsuitable for Staff Employment will either be returned to their unit for re-absorption into the WE or posted to ERE.

The reports will be submitted through normal channels to GHQ CMF.

Following my visit with you and Col. Findlay re supplementary rations, I discussed this subject on my return with Comdr. Southard, Mr. Office of AMPOLAD, and with Col. Henn, acting head of G-5 Section, all in an effort to determine the present status of the proposed administrative order. I told them, as I had previously, of UNRRA's interest in this order and of the conversation between Col. Findlay, yourself and myself.

I think the status of this order can best be found from endorsement No. 2 following No. 1 of Jan. 20, which Col. Findlay has, and I believe you have also. Endorsement No. 2 runs as follows:

- "(a) The supplementary feeding of United Nations nationals on the scale mentioned may well raise the political issue which you suggest, but it is not considered that this in itself would be sufficient to justify abandoning the scheme if it is regarded as essential on other grounds.
 - (b) Matters relating to the welfare of nationals are a consular responsibility, and the handling of the emergency feeding on the scale anticipated would almost certainly provide great administrative problems.
 - (c) This question can only be answered by UNRRA.
 - (d) The numbers involved will be smaller but the respective war roles of Yugoslavia and Italy must be borne in mind when considering this problem. Preferential feeding would cause more ill-feeling in Yugoslavia than in Italy with considerably greater justification.
 - (e) In our opinion a relief scheme on such a large scale would have to be referred to the two Governments.
2. Generally speaking this whole scheme appears to accumulate difficulties like a snowball the more it is considered. There is a vast difference between supplementing the rations of a few bona fide nationals, permanent residents in Italy, and the large-scale increase in feeding of 15,000 persons the majority of whom are presumably 'displaced'. This figure may well increase when the 'racket' becomes generally known. The scheme now appears to be reaching a scale when it begins to clash with the relief plans made by UNRRA and in our opinion is not suitable for publication in its present form."



Reference is made to signal 161 of 28 August (F/5717)
from British Embassy, Belgrade to AFHQ info ALCOM
which reads as follows -

"APPLICATION REQUESTING PERMIT RECEIVED FROM BERTA
BOSKOVSC Yugoslav national. BOSKOVSC IS 65 YEARS
OLD AND DESTITUTE. SHE HAS DAUGHTER YOUR COMMAND
HAIFA WHO WISHES TO LOOK AFTER HER. PALESTINE
GOVERNMENT HAS BEEN ASKED TO GRANT ENTRY PERMIT AND
THEIR REPLY IS AWAITED. UNRRA UNDERTAKES TO BE
RESPONSIBLE FOR BOSKOVSC WHILE IN ITALY THOUGH SHE
IS TECHNICALLY NOT DISPLACED PERSON. MAY WE MEET
PERMIT SO THAT BOSKOVSC CAN AWAIT DECISION OF
PALESTINE GOVERNMENT IN COMFORT IN ITALY INSTEAD
DESTITUTION HERE."

It appears from the above communication that a Yugoslav
national anxious to go to Palestine is to be transferred
to Italy for mere private convenience and without any
justification.

Berta Boskovsc is not a displaced person and we regret
therefore that we are unable to take responsibility for
her. We do not know who committed UNRRA Italy in this
connection, but it certainly was not this Mission. Our
opinion is that she should remain in Yugoslavia and
await the decision of the Palestinian Government and not
be transferred to Italy.

We should appreciate it if you would make our views
known to the section in AFHQ dealing with this case.

Subject: Take-over from G-5.

I hope you will be able to bring to London with you at least a tentative draft outline of the suggested terms for taking over from G-5. If we are to do a good job, it seems to me that there must be a meeting of minds between AFHQ, your Office, ERO and the Mission Offices - and an agreed drill.

For the Italian Mission I should like to underscore the importance of:

1. a careful estimate of the size of the job to be done
2. an orderly plan that will fit our Unrra organizational structure
3. a schedule
4. a budget
5. an estimate of personnel requirements.

Our Italian Mission is eager to do its share of the job, but is unwilling to commit itself or to be committed to a program or schedule that we cannot carry out. I hope, therefore, that we can have a session in London with the maximum number of facts before us in order that we may determine the preparation necessary.

Subject: Assistance to Displaced Persons

I am forwarding herewith a memorandum from Mr. Sorieri on the subject of assistance to Displaced Persons. Sorieri's memorandum was written after discussion with me and has my concurrence.

I take it that the memorandum to which this is a reply was submitted as suggestions for improving our services. Such suggestions are always welcome and some of those made are good. I assume that it is clear that the administrative responsibility in this matter rests with the Italian Mission, which, in turn, is responsible to E.R.O. My authority for this assumption is paragraph III (a) of the General Directive from the Director General for administration of the Italian Mission on 19th October 1944. This does not mean, of course, that we shall not be glad for suggestions and criticisms as to our operations.

Since the memorandum of 14th July has gone to the Albania, Greece and Yugoslav Missions, I am sending a copy of Sorieri's reply and my comment to you to forward to them.

Subject: Assistance to Displaced Persons - your

Some of the points made in your memorandum require clarification and I am making comments as follows:

1. Powers in granting relief in kind or in cash have not, strictly speaking, been conferred on the Chief of Mission. The Resolutions of UNRRA do make us responsible for giving care to displaced persons pending their return. This care may, of course, be given in camps, or out of camps, depending on the situation. The powers are exercised through the Displaced Persons Division, and not through the Finance Office. The plan of assistance is administered by the Displaced Persons Division, but naturally cleared and worked out with the Finance & Administration.
2. This statement is correct.
3. Applicants for assistance fall into two groups:
 - a) those not living in camps at all, and who consider themselves in need;
 - b) those in AC camps who are applying for supplementary allowance for miscellaneous items.

Supplementary allowances are not granted to displaced persons in UNRRA operated camps.

4. All applicants for assistance apply, not at the main office of the UNRRA Italian Mission, but at the District or local Assistance Offices, operated by the Displaced Persons Division. The vast majority of cases are persons not living in camps.

5. It is possible that your comment in this paragraph is somewhat true although it should not be over-emphasized.

6. This is undoubtedly true and we are anxious to have the help of camp commandants.

7. I do not agree with this proposal. I do feel that in cases of persons in AC camps, our staff members should consult and will consult with camp commandants concerning the individuals who apply for assistance. I do not agree that the applicants should be interviewed in the presence of the commandant, and most emphatically do not agree that they shall be interviewed in the presence of a Consular official or in a Consulate office. The nationality of an applicant is cleared with his country representative and all information possible obtained from that source. The representatives are kept informed of the policies of the Assistance Plan and no radical changes are made without consulting them. It would, of course, be impossible and inadvisable to follow such a pattern in the case of dissidents of a country towards whom the Consular representative would not have a particularly favorable attitude. We reserve the right, however, to determine the need of the individual applying, and to grant assistance in accordance with our established regulations, and on the basis of our carefully gathered information. The Assistance Program is a direct responsibility of this Mission, and while we are anxious to utilize all information obtainable, and to consult with proper authorities, we must reserve the right to administer the program for which we are responsible.

8. Reference is made to "attached letters" which are being addressed to the agencies concerned. We have not received any attachments. I trust that letters have not been sent to agencies other than the four UNRRA Missions, since we are not in agreement with the proposal and of course, shall not put these proposals into effect.

You are aware, of course, that responsibility for operation rests with the Mission and that instructions on operations are worked out directly between the Mission and ERO. We are always desirous of receiving information and suggestions on the program but we must maintain a direct line with ERO on all matters of operations and policies.
