He denied ~~was~~ that his manners towards the women members of the team were not correct (complaint by Miss Thuraine, Nurse) but the rest of it he admitted saying he did not care. I recommend that Mr. Denis' services be terminated and that he be removed from Team 6 as soon as possible.

My criticism about the above said was rather against his character than against his capabilities. When he arrived in our team he asked Mr. White whether he could live outside the Officer's Mess. In spite of the refusal I was told later by Dr. Imbert, who is the senior Officer in the house, where Mr.Denis is accomodated, - our team has two small houses as it is impossible to find a larger house- that for several nights he was not staying in the huse and that he lives in the town with a German girl who came to Paderborn from another place where Mr.Denis was with his previous Team. I ordered him to sleep in the UNRRA house which he did till his departure on home leave. During the holidays he was absent from the house , from Dec. 25th morning till December 27th 1945 morning, and did not appear in the Camp until 10.30 on Dec. 27th 1945.

His manners towards UNRRA women members are not correct and his approval of black market may have bad effects on the morale of the team.

I was told before Christmas by Mr.Ledeboer, that Mr.Denis would be taken away from my team immediately after his return from leave and that he would be replaced by Mr.May. As the rooms in our houses are rather limited I beg to ask you for the removal of either of them.

1. I have joined UNRRA on April 12th 45, and have been employed as Messing Officer in the Team No 6, with a salary of L 400.-- per anum and due to the fact that I am married, I have had dependents allowance 7/6 daily. I have received once L 5.-- (Reicksmark 200) in advance only. When the Finance Officer from UNRRA HQ took all particulars at my Unit, I begged to have sent my salary to the following address: Mr. HINKO B.BRANDAJS, 10, Mortimer Court, London N.W.8. Neither I nor my uncle Mr.BRANDAJS,LONDON, have received up to date the balance of my credit i.e.

I therefore beg you to take the necessary steps that this amount be sent without delay to the a/m address of my uncle Mr.BRANDAJS, LONDON.

2. I was four years long POW in Germany and after having been liberated by the British Army, I worked during six months with UNRRA as a/m/ and got a compassionate leave from 24 Sept to 22 Oct 45 to visit my wife in Italy whom I have not seen more than 4½ years.

3. I have informed you with my letters of 19 Oct and 6 Nov 45, that I was ill and therefore not able to proceed to my Unit. At the same time I have begged you to be kind enough to take the necessary steps for my transfer to the UNRRA, Italian Mission, but no answer has reached me up to date. In the meantime I submitted personally my application in writing for my transfer at UNRRA HQ Italian Mission, ROM. I was told by the Director of the Personnel Division of this HQ that there is no objection to get the transfer applied for, but formerly informations must be received from the Team Director where I worked about my behaving during my employment.

4. I have lost my whole family and was lucky to see again my wife after more than 4½ years. It was for me impossible to leave her once more completely alone inasmuch as she leaves here as refugee without any help, and therefore I decided to remain with her as she could not return with me to Germany.

5. I would be much obliged if I could get a certificate for the time of my employment.

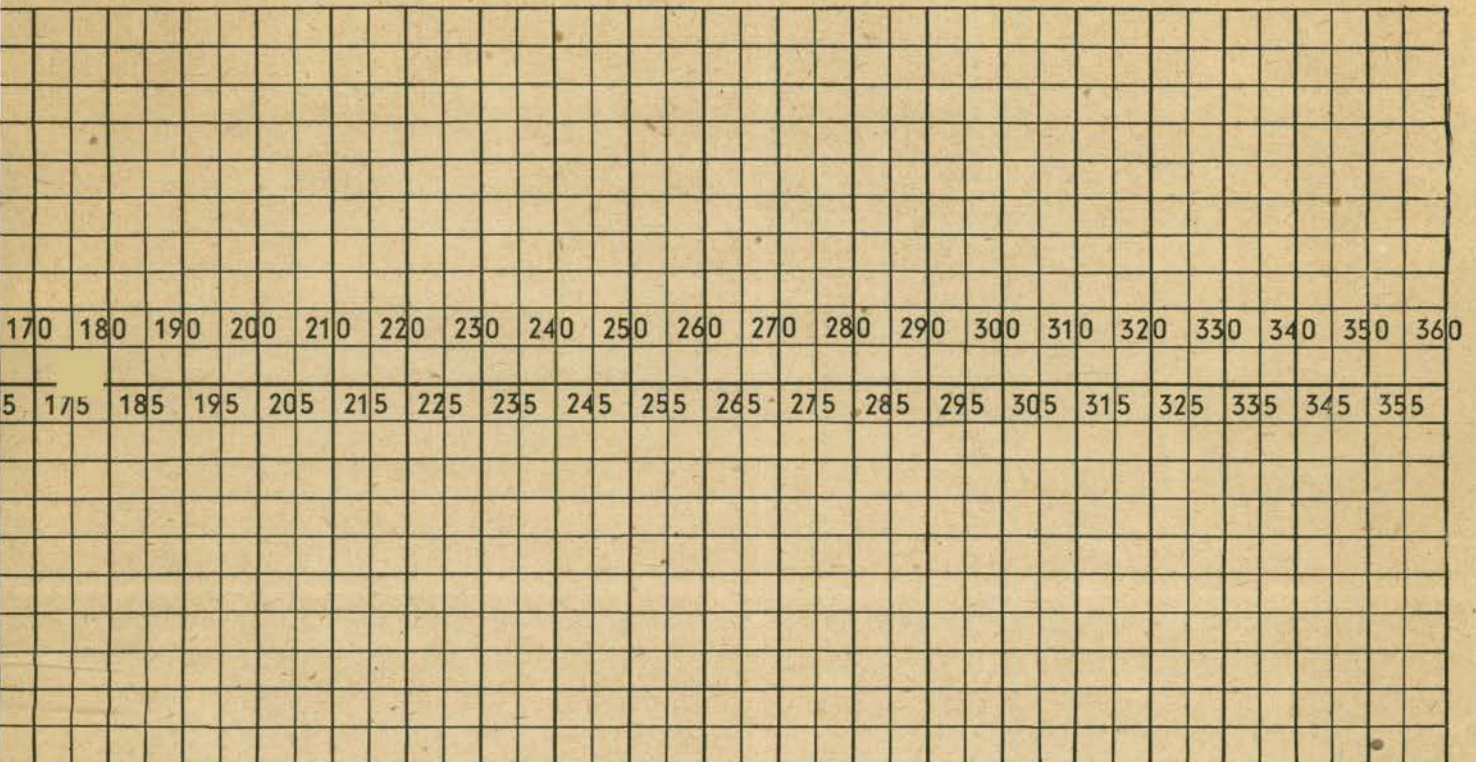

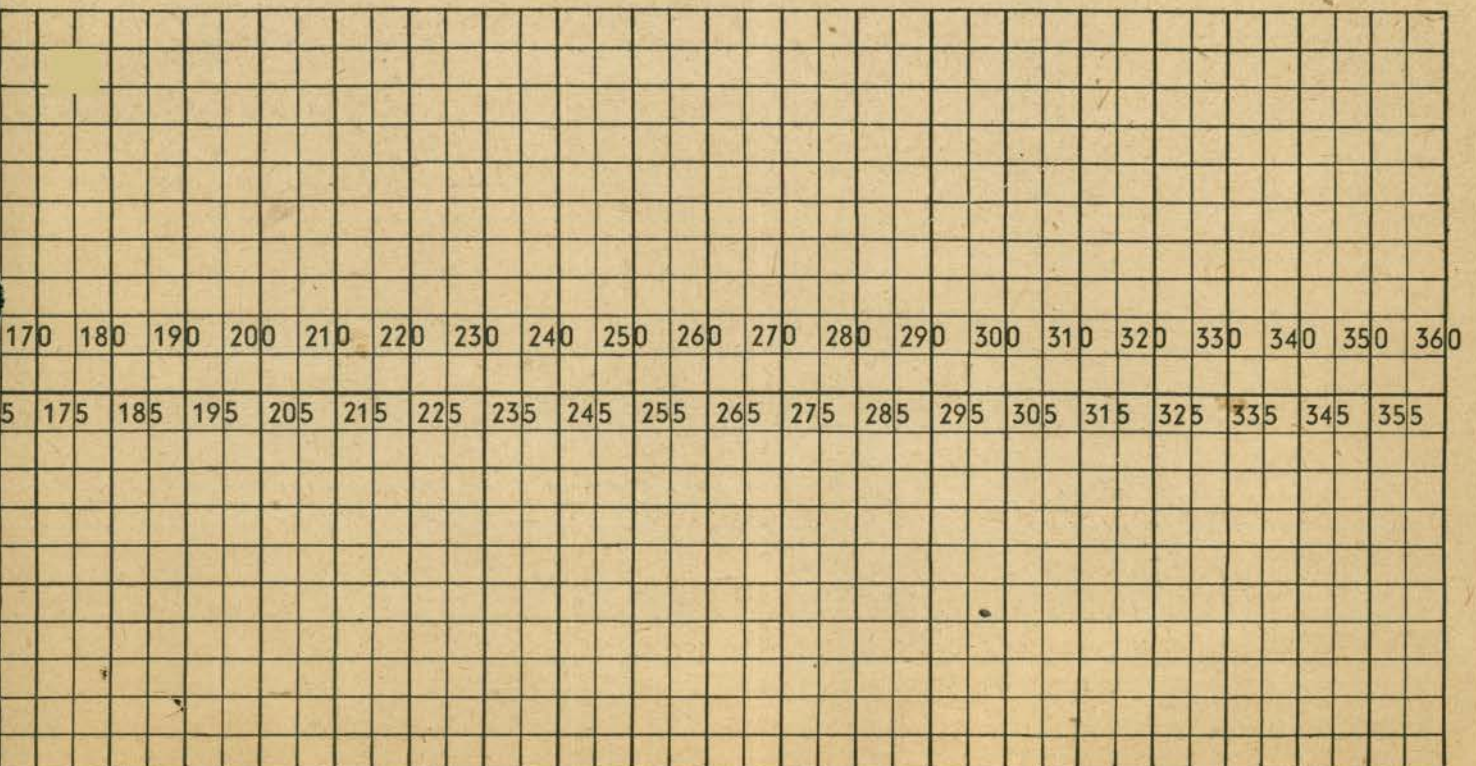

I attach a letter from the Deputy Director, Team 6, to the Director of the same team, regarding Mr. May, Missing Officer, in which you will see that this officer failed to report for duty with the team on Dec. 24th and was absent until the morning of Dec. 28th.

I interviewed Mr. May yesterday in the presence of the Director and Deputy Director and showed him the attached report which he signed. He admitted being absent without leave but refused to tell me where he went, he added that on account of his hard work he regarded it as his right to go away for Christmas. He said he was going to take this case to London as he was tired of being kicked around, but I was unable to get out of him in what way he considered he had been kicked around.

I agree with the Director that he seems to be a pathological case and as such is unfit for services in UNRRA. I recommend that his services be terminated and that he be removed from Team 6 as soon as possible.



A. CONDITIONS AT PANZER VIKING & BUNDELAGER.

The Corps Commander paid a visit to Panzer Viking on 21st November and has made the following decisions:-

1. The rooms will be partitioned to provide privacy for families.
2. A certain loss of accommodation will be experienced but the loss will be smaller by virtue of the fact that the attics which were formerly not to be used will be used as dormitories for young women and young men.
3. To enable preparations to be made, the rate of reception of Poles from other camps will be slowed down and particulars of the DPs who are to be moved there, namely, the number of families, single men, women etc. will be forwarded to CRA, Brig. Benson, in advance of the move and he will state when he can take them.
4. The coke ration is to be issued on the basis of accommodation not on the numbers.
5. (a) Brig. A. is to try and obtain a cinema from AKS.
(b) UNRRA District Director is to enquire from 53 Div. as to the possibility of obtaining a German cinema unit.

B. GENERAL MATTERS AFFECTING DPs.

1. DE. Mil. Gov to arrange an increase in the soap ration.
2. Mil. Gov. are to endeavour to get supplies of children's shoes and ~~miscellaneous~~ ^{men's} footwear or alternatively leather for their manufacture and repair.
3. The overcoats and clothing generally are now being sorted and baled in H.Q. Depots and the issue is to begin next week.
4. UNRRA District Director to undertake the issue of an instruction to ensure that where any Assembly Centre has a surplus of clothing, it is re-distributed to Centres which are deficient.

"With reference to the application for leave for Mr. G. Brandjas, Missing Officer in your Team, I have received from 21 A.G. a communication which confirms my opinion that leave for attached DP's is not provided for.

The only alternative is therefore for Mr. Brandjas to take compassionate leave without pay.

As, however, Mr. Brandjas desires to go to Italy and this will take some considerable time, perhaps he would not be desirous of availing himself of the opportunity. However, he may be prepared to wait until his period of six months has expired when the circumstances will be such that he may proceed on normal leave in accordance with regulations."

4. Mr. Brandjas proceeded on leave without pay on 30th August and was granted three weeks compassionate leave without pay. He has not returned.

5. Attached is an application from him for transfer to UNRA in Italy. In view of the fact that he is a DP it is not considered that this is possible but the matter is submitted to you for opinion, please.

PADERBORN on 30. Oct 45.

Inspection of the above premises revealed that either block 5 or block 7 (if repaired) would be suitable for a sick-bay.

Block 7 at present cannot be used as it requires repairs; therefore block 5 must be used as the sick-bay.

Owing to the great difficulty in finding suitable administrative rooms which was pointed out to me by Col. Bradburn I have agreed as a temporary measure that five rooms in block 5 should be assigned for general administrative purposes.

In the meantime I would recommend that block 7 should be placed on high priority for repairs. As soon as this is repaired, block 7 in its entirety could be taken over as a sick-bay; I think if anything block 7 is the preferable of the two and would make an excellent sick bay for the Panzer-viking barracks.
