Настоящим имею честь подтвердить получение Вашего письма от 12 февраля 1965 г. (TR 140 Pac. 1965), в котором Вы в своем качестве председателя Совета по опеке информировали делегацию СССР в Совете о том, что из-за непредвиденных обстоятельств представитель Франции г-н Жак Тине, избранный решением Совета по опеке на его XXXI сессии (резолюция 2142/XXXI) председателем выездной миссии Совета 1965 года в подопечные территории Науру и Новая Гвинея, не сможет отправиться с миссией в указанные территории и что правительство Франции назначило на его место г-на Андре Ноди, заместителя директора отдела ООН и международных организаций МИД Франции.

В том же письме Вы, г-н Посол, выразили то мнение, что в настоящих условиях, когда Совет по опеке не заседает, наиболее подходящей процедурой для выборов нового председателя выездной миссии является опрос членов Совета по опеке в индивидуальном порядке в отношении того, согласны ли они с тем, чтобы новое лицо заняло пост председателя выездной миссии.

В связи с этим я хотел бы обратить Ваше внимание на то, что предлагаемая Вами, г-н Посол, процедура выборов нового председателя выездной миссии Совета по опеке 1965 года в Науру и Новую Гвинею расходится с нормальной процедурой и практикой, которым Совет по опеке следовал в прошлом при избрании председателя и членов выездных миссий, направлявшихся от имени Совета

в подопечные территории. Эта процедура, как известно, определяется соответствующими статьями Устава ООН и действующими Правилами процедуры Совета, в соответствии с которыми Совет принимает решение о составе (председателе и членах) миссии на своих заседаниях. Известно далее, что в состав выездных миссий назначаются лица, а не представители стран и что необходимо специальное решение Совета для автоматического утверждения последним отдельных кандидатов в члены миссий, которые не были выдвинуты в период заседаний соответствующей сессии Совета, что само по себе является процедурой для ситуаций чрезвычайного порядка. Именно к такой процедуре, как это видно из ссылки к резолюции 2142(XXXI) (док. T/I627, стр. I) прибег Совет по опеке на 1243 заседании в ходе его XXXI сессии, когда принял решение об автоматическом утверждении кандидатов в члены выездной миссии 1965 года, которые должны были быть выдвинуты Либерией и Соединенными Штатами Америки.

Учитывая изложенное выше, делегация СССР не видит необходимости в отходе в настоящих условиях от нормальной процедуры избрания нового председателя выездной миссии Совета по опеке 1965 года в Науру и Новую Гвинею. Такой отход был бы тем более неоправдан, что на XXXI сессии Совета по опеке было принято решение (резолюция 2142) о составе выездной миссии, в том числе и ее председателе, и поэтому любая мера, включая избрание нового председателя миссии, предполагающая полное или частичное изменение указанного решения, требует утверждения его Советом по опеке в соответствии с нормальной процедурой Совета.

Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 12 February 1965 (TR 140 Pac 1965), in which, in your capacity as President of the Trusteeship Council, you informed the USSR delegation to the Council that due to unforeseen circumstances the representative of France, Mr. Jacques Tiné, who was appointed by decision of the Trusteeship Council at its thirty-first session (resolution 2142/XXXI) as Chairman of the 1965 Visiting Mission of the Council to the Trust Territories of Nauru and New Guinea, would not be able to proceed with the Mission to the above Territories, and that the French Government had appointed in his stead Mr. André Naudy, Deputy Director for the United Nations and International Organizations at the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs.

In the same letter, Mr. President, you expressed the view that in the present circumstances, when the Trusteeship Council is not in session, the most appropriate procedure to follow for the choice of a new Chairman for the Visiting Mission would be to ask the members of the Trusteeship Council individually whether they agree to having the new person assume the Chairmanship of the Visiting Mission.

In this connexion, I should like to draw your attention to the fact that the procedure suggested by you, Mr. President, for the choice of a new Chairman of the 1965 Visiting Mission of the Trusteeship Council to Nauru and New Guinea is at variance with the normal procedure and practice followed by the Trusteeship Council in the past in choosing the Chairman and members of visiting missions going to Trust Territories on its behalf. This procedure, as you know, is established by the relevant Articles of the United Nations Charter and the Council's rules of procedure now in force, under which the Council decides on the composition (chairman and members) of missions at its meetings. As you also know, it is individuals and not the representatives of countries who are appointed to serve on visiting missions, and a special decision of the Council is required before it can give automatic approval to individual candidates for membership of missions not nominated during the meetings of the appropriate session of the Council, this in fact being the procedure for exceptional situations. As can be seen from a reference to resolution 2142 (XXXI) (T/1627, p.1), the Trusteeship Council had recourse to this very procedure at the 1243rd meeting, during its thirty-first session, when it decided on the automatic approval of the nominations for membership of the 1965 Visiting Mission to be submitted by Liberia and the United States of America.

Taking the above into account, the USSR delegation does not see the need in the present circumstances to depart from the normal procedure for the selection of a new Chairman of the 1965 Visiting Mission of the Trusteeship Council to Nauru and New Guinea. Such a departure would be all the more

unjustified since the Trusteeship Council took a decision at its thirty-first session (resolution 2142) on the membership of the Visiting Mission, including the Chairman, and therefore any measure which includes the selection of a new Chairman of the Mission and presupposes the complete or partial amendment of that decision requires approval by the Trusteeship Council in accordance with its normal procedure.



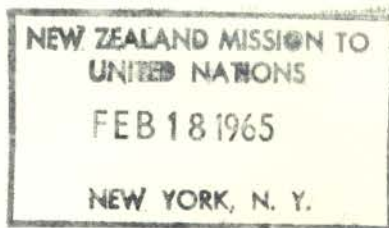

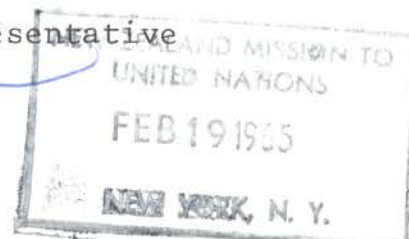
