Dear Robert,

Many thanks for your kind letter of 28 February. I greatly appreciate your sympathetic consideration of our problem.

As to the question you pose concerning John I must tell you that I have come to appreciate his integrity, honesty and devotion. I feel he would be effective in dealing with the Central Government officials and maintaining liaison with provincial civil servants. He gets on well with other members of our group. If other individuals with his type of education and background have been appointed to posts such as mine, I would recommend him. He is not very dynamic, but I do not believe that the programme in Elisabethville calls for that quality. Moreover his acceptance by the Congolese, old and new, would give him a decided advantage and will ensure our organization having a fine source of information.

Perhaps at this point it would be useful to discuss the staffing problems of this office. I feel that Heinrich Pichler who has done indefatigable work here should be transferred back to Leo, as the important task he has been entrusted with there is rapidly falling behind. If John takes over from me, he will require a food administrator. Mr Cross who came down here for that purpose apparently cannot come. He suggested that a Mr. Cunningham who is here should be able to do a satisfactory job for us. You might wish to discuss it with him.

As Mr. Tooby has kindly consented to take this letter to you it will enable us to plan my departure for next week in the event that you were to concur with it. You should know that the Office of Personnel would like me to do some recruitment of Africans from countries that have not had any representation so far in the Secretariat. Therefore if you were to decide on a date, would you be kind enough to cable Michelmores for instructions. If convenient I could depart here on the 6 or 7 March and spend a night at your place before continuing on my trip. Incidentally many thanks for your kind invitation. Concerning Pichler I would suggest that he could overlap with John for a week before returning.

Again many thanks for your kind understanding.
