.. funeral

1. A standard drill for ceremonial ~~parades~~ for ONUC military persons killed or died in the CONGO is laid down in the following paragraphs.

2. The parade will normally be held on the day the coffin has to be flown out to the home country of the individual. Time and date will be specified along with other instructions by this HQ.

3. The parade will be held at the Football ground opposite the Commissary (Ave Josephine Charlotte) unless otherwise ordered.

4. Following persons / detachments will normally take part :

(a) Force Comdr or his representative (Deputy Force Comdr, Chief of Staff, etc)

(b) Comdr Sector 'L'

(c) Chief of Military Personnel

(d) Chaplain, Imam or other religious executive arranged by the respective LOs.

(e) One or more orderlies to carry the wreaths as required.

(f) Bearer party of one officer or NCO and 6 soldier from the Contingent to which the deceased belongs to be arranged by the LO concerned. (In the case of inability to provide the same, this HQ will be informed).

(g) Squads of one officer and six soldiers, in normal working dress (with ONUC ~~green~~ uniforms), from the following contingents / units :-

(i) Squad A - with rifles 2 QONR

(ii) " B - with rifles 2 IRISH ARMED
CAR SQN

(iii) " C - without rifles - 57 CANADIAN SIG UNIT

(iv) " D - " - DANISH Contingent

(v) " E - " - INDIAN "

(vi) " F - " --PAKISTAN "

(vii) "G and H- " from other contingents if available.

(h) Parade Comdr - Senior Captain to be detailed from 2 QONR or 2 IRISH Armed Car Sqn as ordered by this HQ.

(j) Corps of Drums - 2 QONR

5. A diagrammatic layout of the parade ground is attached as Annexure A, along with some explanatory notes.

6. Following preparation will be carried out under the supervision of the Parade Comdr at least 2 hrs before the parade:-

(a) Marking the ground with small flags/coloured pegs
(as indicated in Annex A) - 2 QONR

(b) Tidying up the parade ground - 2 QONR

(c) Providing chairs for spectator stand - 2 QONR

(d) Organising car parks - ONUC Provost Coy

(i) VIP and spectators

(ii) Light vehicles



7. The corps of drums and the squads A to H will report to the parade commander 45 minutes before the parade time at the parade ground. He will carry out a rehearsal without the carriage and the bearer party.

8. The complete drill for the parade is given at Annexure B attached. Units will ensure that their squads are properly briefed about the drill to be carried out. The LO concerned will be responsible to brief the bearer party, the driver of the carriage vehicle and the military police escort (jeeps with flags).

9. Spectators from HQ ONUC and respective embassy may attend the parade.



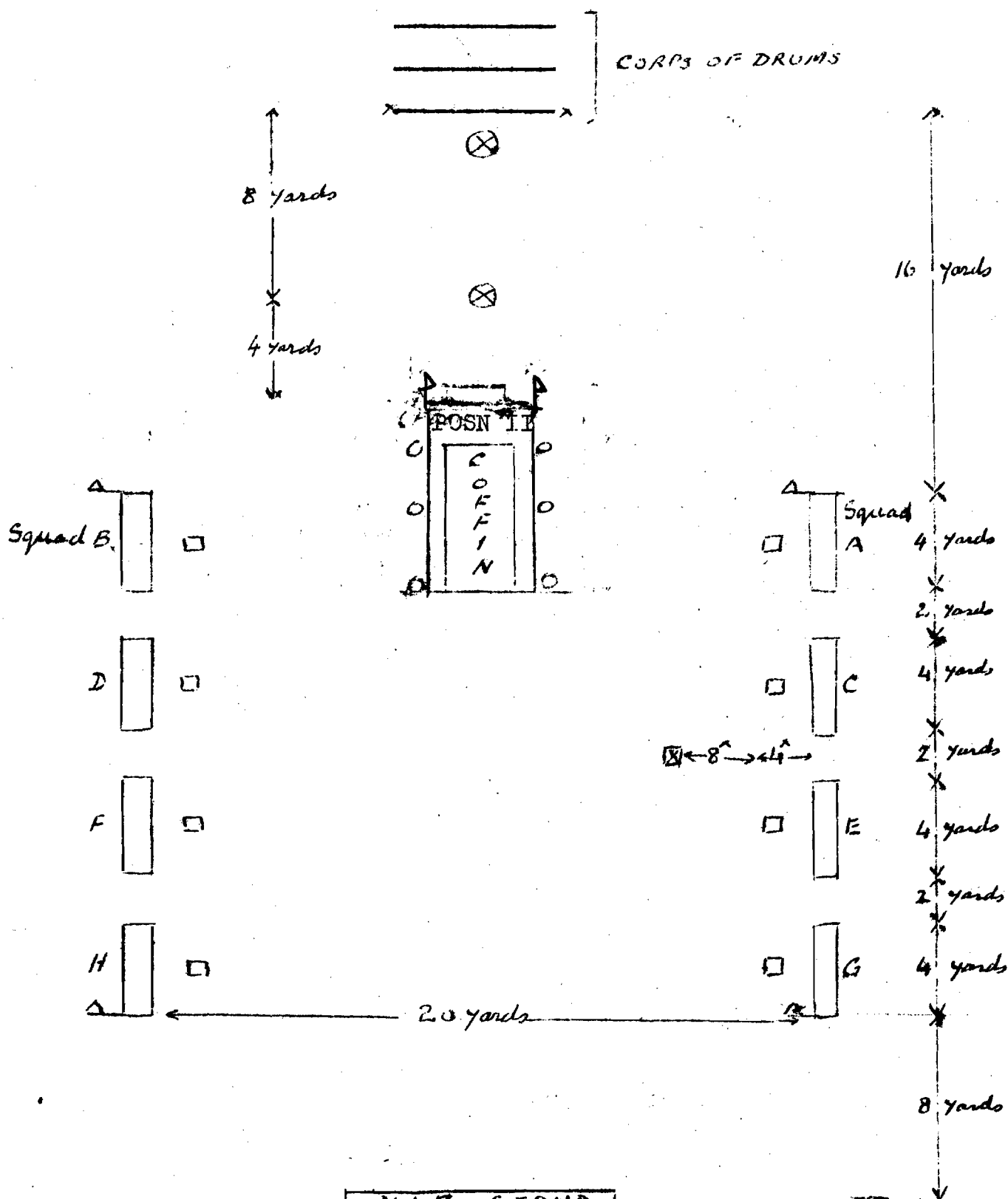

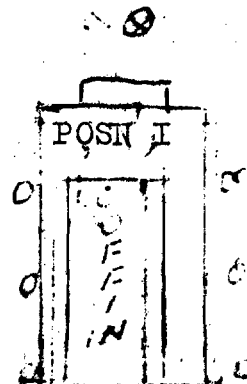

Explanatory notes

4. VIP stand will have the following personnel standing in the order shown here-in. Wreath bearers will be arranged by IO concerned as required (one for Force Comd's wreath and one, if so desired, by the Contingent Comdr)

OBJET: Disposal of ONUC personnel who die in Congo

Deceased

Disposal of dead bodies of our personnel serving in Congo has been quite a problem. Some national governments have asked for their dead to be returned to their countries and this has been done though I feel this is a heavy expenditure on the UNO as the dead bodies have to be sent to the respective countries by specially chartered planes. Such dead bodies which are not asked for by their national governments are disposed of in Congo. For their disposal the local civil authorities have to be approached and they create a lot of unnecessary fuss and delay. There have been instances where dead bodies have not been disposed of for two or three days and with the lack of facilities for keeping these dead bodies in cold rooms, invariably the decomposition has set in and by the time these bodies have been disposed of they have been smelling badly.

I feel that considering a long term policy we should acquire a piece of land and convert it into a graveyard for ONUC personnel. At the moment we have been burying and cremating our dead all over Congo, and no trace as to where they have been buried or cremated will be left after some time. If it is decided that we should have a graveyard for the ONUC personnel, ONU could manage this graveyard and within this area make arrangements for the burial of dead by their various denominations. Even cremation could be carried out within the same area and symbolic tombs erected for those who are cremated.

A graveyard for those who are laying their lives in this country is the minimum that we can do for them. This graveyard would be a remembrance for years to come in memory of those who lost their lives for this country. Also if we made arrangements for disposing of the dead in a befitting manner maybe the different national governments may not demand their dead being sent back to their countries and this would save a lot of expenditure to the UNO.

1. Reference is made to informal request by Colonel W. T. Gleason 28 April 1961, for information regarding the establishment of a United Nations Cemetery based on experience in Korea.

2. Several considerations were involved in the decision to establish a United Nations Cemetery in Korea. High among these considerations was the fact that the line of contact between the opposing forces had moved up and down the peninsula to such an extent that some cemeteries in the northern area had from time-to-time been overrun. The following is quoted from the History of American Graves Registration Service Group, Headquarters U. S. Army Forces, Far East and Eighth U. S. Army:

"The precipitant entry into Korea of a vast horde of Chinese troops to reinforce the disintegrating North Korean armies, halted the forward movement of United Nations Forces and made urgent their withdrawal to locations where strong defensive positions could be established. All temporary cemeteries in the area of withdrawal fell under communist control including the cemetery at Hungnam located in the outskirts of that city. The withdrawal of the Eighth Army to positions south of the 38th parallel resulted in the loss of control of the cemeteries at Pyongyang and Sukchon. It was during the Eighth Army withdrawal southward that a decision of major importance was arrived at with respect to cemeteries still under control of United Nations Forces. Acting upon the recommendation of the Quartermaster, Far East Command, the Supreme Commander United Nations Forces, directed the evacuation of all United Nations temporary military cemeteries; the remains of all United States deceased to be prepared for shipment to Japan and deceased of allied nations to be concentrated in a centralized United Nations Military Cemetery. Plans were promptly formulated by the Graves Registration Division Quartermaster Section, Eighth United States Army Korea, for an immediate evacuation of Inchon Cemetery, which was in the direct path of advancing communist forces.

A site, of approximately 72 acres in the town of Tanggok was selected for the establishment of the central United Nations Military Cemetery. This town, a suburb of Pusan, possesses the rail and road facilities required for efficient cemetery operations. Since the acquired land was in hilly terrain, terracing and grading the area became a major engineering project. Work started on 19 January 1951 to meet a completion date tentatively set for 1 April 1951. Hundreds of men were recruited in Pusan and surrounding towns and villages to supply the labor personnel required. Rock needed to build supporting walls for terraced sections of the cemetery was brought in by small

vessels from distant quarries and trucked for several miles from a beach landing area to the cemetery site. While construction of the United Nations Military Cemetery at Tanggok was in progress, plans were completed for the evacuation of all other temporary cemeteries from that part of Korea under the control of United Nations forces. Remains of United States dead, with the exception of those disinterred from the cemeteries at Miryang and Pusan, were evacuated direct to the American Graves Registration Installation established in Kokura, Japan. The remains of United States dead evacuated from Miryang and Kunsan were temporarily interred in the new cemetery at Tanggok pending their removal at a later date to Japan. All Allied dead evacuated from these cemeteries were interred at Tanggok."

3. Department of the Army Field Manual 10-63, July 1959 (in revision status at the time of the Korean conflict) has been furnished to the overseas command in draft form soon after the conflict began. That manual was used by the command in its Graves Registration activities including the establishment of cemeteries. Section II of the manual contains general guidance regarding reconnaissance and site selection of cemeteries. Paragraph 17b of the manual provides guidance as to the use of cemeteries for allied, enemy and other dead. Section III, covers information pertaining to the layout of a cemetery, plats, rows, numbering of graves etc.

4. For purposes of acquisition of land selected for cemetery purposes for U. S. Army use, the Quartermaster normally coordinates with the Engineer Officer of the command whose responsibility it is to effect acquisition and disposal of real estate (FM 100-5).

5. To the maximum extent possible and feasible, burial customs of allied nations are observed in effecting interments. For this purpose, it is highly desirable that liaison personnel representing each national force represented be requested by the national force commander whose troops will operate the cemetery. A book titled "Funeral Customs the World Over" was published by Bulfin Printers, Inc., Milwaukee, Wisconsin in 1960. Whereas this book contains much information, it pertains primarily to civil (non-military, non-battlefield) conditions. It does serve to show the variety of burial customs of the nations in the UN. Since combat conditions dictate variations in burial customs, the employment of liaison personnel is considered the most feasible solution toward the operation of a United Nations Force cemetery.

6. This reply serves only to answer the questions given orally to representatives of this Office by Colonel Gleason and as later discussed with Colonels Gleason and Lederman, Plans Division, DCSLOJ. It can be developed in detail if desired. Basically all that is required for the establishment of a military field cemetery is to be found in the inclosed Field Manual or an adaptation of

that guidance. The Quartermaster Corps is prepared to carry out any requirements in this area from the establishment of procedures (as specific as possible, in view of the invulnerable situations that may obtain) to the establishment of another UN cemetery in any situation wherein the U. S. has participating forces.





1. A ceremonial funeral parade will be held on 12 March 1964 in honour of No 96816 L/Nk K JAGAN NATH RAO who was killed in MT accident on 7 March 1964.
2. The Ceremony will be in four phases as follows :--
 - a. Phase I Removal of remains from DANISH RED CROSS Hospital at 1400 hrs on 12 March 1964.
 - b. Phase II Arrival of remains at the main gate of the cremation ground.
 - c. Phase III Move of procession in slow time from the main gate to the cremation area, religious and military ceremony.
 - d. Phase IV Vigil guard takes up position and troops taking part disperse.

DIAGRAMMATIC LAYOUT FOR MILITARY FUNERAL PARADE

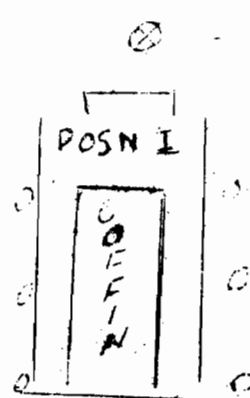

CEREMONIAL FUNERAL PARADE IN HONOUR OF THE 23 ETHIOPIAN OFFICERS AND
MEN WHO DIED DURING THE MILITARY OPERATIONS IN THE CONGO

There took place this morning, on the grounds of the Athénée Royal, a ceremonial funeral parade in honour of the 23 Officers and men of the ONUC Ethiopian contingent who have died in the Congo since 1960.

Present at the ceremony were: Mr. Cyrille Adoula, Prime Minister, Mr. R. Gardiner, Officer-in-charge of ONUC, General Kebede Guebre, Force Commander of ONUC, General Mobutu, Commander in Chief of the Congolese National Army, His Excellency G.L. Jacob, Ethiopian Ambassador to the Congo, as well as numerous civilian and military personalities.

General Kebede Guebre placed a wreath on the coffins of each of the Ethiopian soldiers. The Prime Minister, the Officer-in-Charge of ONUC, the Commander in Chief of the Congolese National Army, and the Commander of the Ethiopian Contingent also deposited wreaths.

After the religious service which was conducted by an Ethiopian priest, Mr. R. Gardiner recited the following prayer in English:

Teach us good Lord to serve Thee as Thou deservest:
To give and not to count the cost;
To labour and not to seek for rest;
To fight and not to heed the wounds;
To toil and not to ask for any reward
Save that of knowing that we do Thy will.

After the Last Post, a two minutes silence was observed.

An address was then delivered by the Prime Minister, Mr. Cyrille Adoula, the text of which follows:

"When in July 1960 the appeal of the Government and people of the Congo to the United Nations was favourably received, Ethiopia was one of the first countries to volunteer to send troops to the Congo.

In Equateur and Orientale provinces and North Katanga, and now in South Katanga, they have given not only aid to the Congo, but an inspiration to all African countries.

The first group of mercenaries was captured by Ethiopians. The beginnings of maintenance of law and order in North Katanga formed an important part of the task and contribution of Ethiopia.

These men whom we honour today have performed their duty in obedience to His Imperial Majesty. It is not surprising that His Majesty should take the lead in halting the forces of the continent together in defence of national sovereignty and territorial integrity.

His Imperial Majesty, one of the few African heads of state at the

time, had the foresight and the courage to plead, alone, the lost cause of collective security before the League of Nations.

At this moment at which you are about to leave this land of the Congo, I address to you, glorious martyrs of the cause of Africa, the last homage of my country and its people.

I feel sure that all Africa is present at this modest but so moving ceremony to bow with us before its most faithful and devoted sons. You personify, by the sacrifice of your blood and your life, the struggle of Africans to liberate Africa from all its chains. You personify, too, the solidarity and steadfast determination of the African peoples to bring about the unity of Africa.

We would have wished to see you return to your country where your families await you, but alas, fate has decided otherwise.

You have replied to the call of a duty which you have performed without fail, up to the supreme sacrifice. The example which you have given will remain for ever in the minds and hearts of the present generation of Congolese and the generations to come. Rest assured that we will prove ourselves worthy of your sacrifice."

Next, Mr. Gardiner delivered the following address:

"From all corners of the world we came--abandoning our normal tasks and our homes in order to lend a helping hand to a neighbour in distress. We thought in terms of days, weeks, or at most, months and then we would be back home with our children and dear ones.

We knew there might be some risks and dangers, but we never realized that some of us were embarking on our last journey.

In the flower of their youth and in the midst of active life everything has come to an abrupt end.

Is this sacrifice necessary? Only history and our deepest convictions can answer this question fully. The believer can only say "God is His own interpreter and He will make it plain."

Farewell. Rest in peace."

Finally, His Excellency, the Ethiopian Ambassador spoke:

"On behalf of His Imperial Majesty and Government and people of Ethiopia, I wish, first of all, to express the appreciation of my country to you, Mr. Prime Minister, and your colleagues, as well as the United Nations representatives, for the honour being done to the Imperial Ethiopian Armed Forces today.

As it is well known, His Imperial Majesty has never hesitated to support the United Nations in its endeavour to give meaning to collective security and also to help maintain peace in different parts of the world. The Imperial Armed Forces took part in the Korean campaign. Here, in the Congo, not only the ground forces but the Air Force of Ethiopia has also made its contribution and suffered losses. Today, even though we have not come to the conclusion of the ONUC mission in the Congo, we pause to remember our comrades who have had to make the supreme sacrifice. We mourn them and I know their families will miss them even more. But in our grief we do not recriminate because we believe that in supporting an organisation like the United Nations, we are helping to build a better world for those who come after us.

On occasions like this, when we remember how dearly mankind has paid for conflict and unnecessary misunderstanding and how longingly they look forward to a life of peace and prosperity, perhaps we begin to believe that peace on earth, good will towards men are not just empty phrases. These

their duty, we hope have brought us nearer to an answer to the cry of mankind throughout the ages - "How long, Oh Lord, how long?" We do not know how close we are to the answer to this question. We in Ethiopia, under the indomitable leadership of His Imperial Majesty, believe that the future of mankind depends almost exclusively on the realization of the fact that the world is now one and that peace is indivisible. In other words to be able to answer now positively to the question "Am I my brother's keeper?" Hence this sacrifice. It is not in vain. These men have made their contribution. We wish them rest in peace."

At the conclusion of the ceremony, the coffins of the Ethiopian soldiers were taken to N'Djili airport and transported from there to their homeland where they will be buried.

PRISE D'ARMES EN L'HONNEUR DES 23 OFFICIERS ET SOLDATS ETHIOPiens
TOMBES AU COURS DES OPERATIONS MILITAIRES AU CONGO

Ce matin, sur le terrain de l'Athénée Royal a eu lieu une prise d'armes en l'honneur des 23 officiers et soldats du contingent éthiopien de l'ONUC qui sont tombés, depuis 1960, au Congo.

Etaient présents à la cérémonie: M. Cyrille Adoula, Premier Ministre, M. R. Gardiner, Chargé de la mission de l'ONUC, le général Kebbede Guebre, Commandant en chef des Forces de l'ONUC, le général Mobutu, Commandant en chef de l'Armée Nationale Congolaise, son Excellence G.L. Jacob, Ambassadeur d'Ethiopie au Congo, ainsi que de nombreuses personnalités civiles et militaires.

Le général Kebbede Guebre a déposé une couronne sur chacun des cercueils des soldats éthiopiens. D'autres couronnes ont été également déposées par le Premier Ministre, le Chargé de la mission de l'ONUC, le Commandant en chef de l'Armée Nationale Congolaise et le Commandant du contingent éthiopien.

Après le service religieux officié par un prêtre éthiopien, M. R. Gardiner a **récité en anglais** la prière suivante:

Teach us good Lord to serve Thee as Thou deservest:
To give and not to count the cost;
To labour and not to seek for rest;
To fight and not to heed the wounds;
To toil and not to ask for any reward
Save that of knowing that we do Thy will.

Après la sonnerie aux morts, deux minutes de silence furent observées.

Une allocution fut alors prononcée par le Premier Ministre, M. Cyrille Adoula, dont voici le texte:

"Lorsque, en juillet 1960, les Nations Unies ont répondu favorablement à l'appel du Gouvernement et du peuple du Congo, l'Ethiopie a été parmi les premiers pays à envoyer volontairement des troupes au Congo.

"Dans la province Orientale comme dans celles de l'Equateur et du Nord-Katanga, puis dans celle du Sud-Katanga, ces troupes ont donné non seulement une aide au Congo mais une inspiration à tous les pays africains.

"Le premier groupe de mercenaires a été capturé par des troupes éthiopiennes. Les débuts du maintien de l'ordre public au Nord-Katanga ont constitué une partie importante de la tâche et de la contribution de l'Ethiopie.

"Ces hommes que nous honorons aujourd'hui ont accompli leur
" devoir conformément aux ordres de Sa Majesté Impériale. Il n'est
" pas surprenant que Sa Majesté prenne l'initiative de rallier les
" forces du continent pour la défense de la sécurité nationale et
" de l'intégrité territoriale.

"En effet Sa Majesté, un des rares chefs d'Etat africain de l'é-
"poque, eut la clairvoyance et le courage de plaider, seule, la cause
" perdue de la sécurité collective devant la Société des Nations.

"A vous, glorieux martyrs de la cause africaine, je voudrais
" adresser le dernier hommage de mon Pays et de ses populations, au
" moment où vous quittez cette terre du Congo. Je suis persuadé que
" l'Afrique entière est présente à cette modeste mais combien émou-
"vante cérémonie, pour s'incliner avec nous devant ses fils les plus
" fidèles et les plus dévoués. Vous personnifiez, par le sacrifice de
" votre sang et de votre vie, la lutte que mènent les Africains en
" vue de libérer l'Afrique de toutes chaînes. Vous personnifiez aussi
" la solidarité et l'irréductible détermination des peuples africains
" de réaliser l'unité africaine.

"Nous aurions voulu vous voir tous retourner dans votre pays où
" vous attendent vos familles. Mais hélas! le Destin en a décidé
" autrement.

"Vous avez obéi à l'appel du devoir que vous avez accompli sans
" défaillance, jusqu'au sacrifice suprême. L'exemple que vous avez
" donné demeurera toujours dans l'esprit et le coeur des Congolais
" de la génération présente et des générations à venir. Soyez assurés
" que nous nous montrerons dignes de vos sacrifices !

A son tour, M. Gardiner a prononcé l'allocution suivante:

" Nous sommes venus de toutes les parties du monde --
" abandonnant nos tâches ordinaires et nos foyers afin de tendre
" une main secourable à un voisin en détresse. Nous avons prévu des
" jours, des semaines ou au plus des mois d'absence, et notre retour
" ensuite parmi nos enfants et ceux qui nous sont chers.

" Nous savions qu'il pourrait y avoir certains risques et cer-
" tains dangers, mais nous ne pensions jamais que plusieurs d'entre
" nous s'embarqueraient pour leur dernier voyage.

" Dans la fleur de leur âge et au milieu d'une vie active,
" tout a fini brusquement.

" Ce sacrifice est-il nécessaire? Seules l'histoire et nos convic-
" tions les plus profondes peuvent répondre pleinement à cette ques-
" tion. Le croyant ne peut que dire: " Dieu est Son propre interprète
" et il l'expliquera clairement".

" Adieux. Reposez en paix.

Enfin, son Excellence , l'Ambassadeur d'Ethiopie prit la parole:

" Au nom de Sa Majesté Impériale, du Gouvernement et du peuple
" d'Ethiopie, je tiens tout d'abord, Monsieur le Premier Ministre,
" à vous exprimer la gratitude de mon pays, ainsi qu'à vos collègues
" et aux représentants des Nations Unies, pour l'honneur qui est fait
" aujourd'hui aux forces armées impériales éthiopiennes.

" Comme on le sait bien, Sa Majesté Impériale n'a jamais hésité
" à soutenir les Nations Unies dans leurs efforts visant à donner un
" sens à la sécurité collective et aussi à aider à maintenir la paix
" dans différentes régions du monde. Les forces armées impériales ont
" pris part à la campagne de Corée. Ici également au Congo, non seule-
" ment l'armée mais aussi l'aviation éthiopienne ont apporté leur con-
" tribution et subi des pertes.

" Aujourd'hui, bien que nous n'ayons pas terminé la mission de
" l'ONUC, nous faisons une pause pour nous souvenir de nos camarades
" qui ont dû faire le sacrifice suprême. Nous les pleurons et je sais
" que leurs familles les pleureront encore plus. Mais notre chagrin ne
" s'accompagne pas de récriminations, parce que nous sommes convaincus
" qu'en soutenant une organisation telle que les Nations Unies, nous
" aidons à édifier un monde meilleur pour ceux qui viendront après nous.

" Dans des occasions comme celle-ci, quand nous nous rappelons
" quel prix l'humanité a payé pour des conflits et des malentendus inu-
" tiles et à quel point elle espère en une vie de paix et de prospérité,
" peut-être commençons-nous à croire que les mots " paix sur terre,
" bonne volonté parmi les hommes" ne sont pas des expressions creuses.
" Nous espérons que ces hommes, en accomplissant leur devoir, nous ont
" rapprochés de la réponse au cri de l'humanité à travers les âges:
" Combien de temps encore, Seigneur, combien de temps?" Nous ne savons
" pas dans quelle mesure nous sommes proches de cette réponse.

" Nous en Ethiopie, sous l'égide indomptable de Sa Majesté Impé-
" riale, sommes convaincus que l'avenir de l'humanité dépend presque
" exclusivement de la reconnaissance du fait que le monde est mainte-
" nant un et que la paix est indivisible. En d'autres termes, nous

" le gardien de mon frère?" Ce sacrifice en découle. Il ne sera pas
" vain. Ces hommes ont apporté leur contribution. Puissent-ils reposer

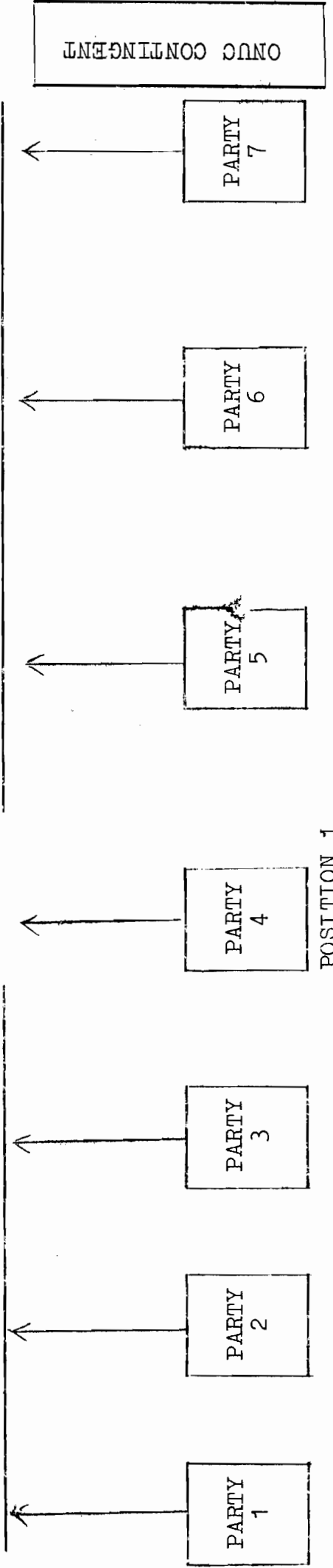

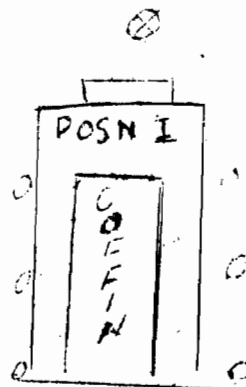
DIAGRAMMATIC LAYOUT FOR MILITARY FUNERAL PARADE





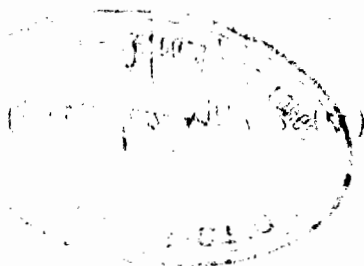
"CEMETERY

The progress on the United Nations Cemetery is now at a complete standstill. We need more action on this programme, as this cemetery should have been completed one month ago. We have authorisation from the Premier Bourgeois to select, as a donation from the Congolese Government, all the necessary shrubbery and trees for this cemetery, but the sodding and the main concrete Monument blocks must be installed before we do any landscaping. In a short period of time the heavy rains will be constant, and if immediate action is not taken for the completion of the cemetery, I will then have doubt that it will ever be completed. This is an important project and it will take constant cooperation so that this ground can be made ready for proper and dignified interments. There is too much valuable time being lost and it is putting the entire exhumation programme off the schedule. I do not want to keep dead bodies in storage here at this hospital just waiting for the cemetery to be completed. With proper cooperation, the exhumation programme and the work at the cemetery should be going on at the same time. Accommodation section has completed the drawings of the monument area, but these plans now must be given to the Public Works section, which means additional delay. Photographs of the work that has been completed at the cemetery are enclosed. "

Dear Col. Mattimoe,

A few lines to clarify and amplify my Radio Phone call to you of today from ELI. This info is genuine and comes from De Bruyn the Prosecutor General here in ELI. I knew him in AVILLE when with the 33rd and had many dealings with him. A native of the village of TUNDULA. Someone in Niemba told him that the body of a UN soldier from the Kamanda Bridge Ambush was located about 100 yds from the village. He said the soldier who was badly wounded was hiding near the village and killed by the Jeunesse, his hiding place having been given away by a woman who was working in the fields nearby. I interviewed De Bruyn today and I am satisfied that the body can only be that of Browne. No whites were missing in that area at the time. De Bruyn got the info in April 61, three months after we left for home. He reported it to Major Haughton, Nigerian Bde in AVILLE who did nothing and later to Messrs. BEJACIA and JACKOWITCH, both UN ^{CIVIL} administrators in AVILLE. He thinks one of them reported the matter to UN at LEO. By now only the bones can be left. Even these may be covered by dust or clay due to the rains. ~~The case~~



1 General

A ceremonial military funeral will be given to the following members of the Swedish Contingent prior to repatriation of their remains to Sweden:

WO/3 SOLVESTAD PER-OLOV GUNNAR - died 20 Sept 62.

WO/3 COLMGREN RAOUL CH GOSTA - died 21 Sept 62.

Their remains will be removed from the ONUC Hospital, Leopoldville at 0700 hours on Wednesday, 26th Sept, to the N'Djili airport.

2 Ceremonial

The ceremony will mainly be in three phases as follows:

Phase I

Removal of the remains from the ONUC Hospital, Leopoldville to N'Djili airport at 0700 hours on Wednesday, 26th Sept 62.

Phase II

Brief religious ceremony; sounding of the last post; and reveille within the premises of the American Hangar, N'Djili airport at 0830 hours on Wednesday, 26th Sept 62.

Phase III

Dispersal of troops and loading of the coffins.

3 Details - Phase I

The following will report to the Swedish Liaison Officer at 0630 hours on 26th Sept at the ONUC Hospital:

- a. Two Military Police pilot jeeps.
- b. Bearer party of 12 OR from the Nigerian Contingent.
- c. Two 3-ton vehicles from PAKISTAN GT Coy as carriage for caskets.
- d. One officer and six OR from each Contingent in Leopoldville will form part of the funeral ceremony. They will report to the Adjutant of 4 QONR at 0800 hours on Wednesday, 26th Sept within the premises of the American Hangar, N'Djili airport. 4 QONR will provide one officer, ten OR and their Corps of Drums for this ceremony. Senior-most officer present will be OC-in-charge of the ceremony.

4 Details - Phase II

The ceremony will take place within the premises of the American Hangar, N'Djili airport, under the arrangements of the Swedish Liaison Officer and the Adjutant of 4 QONR. It will consist of the following:

- i) Short prayers by the Chaplain.
- ii) Paying of homage.
- iii) Sounding of the last post.

5 Details - Phase III

STANDING ORDERS
MILITARY DEATHS IN THE CONGO - U.N. PERSONNEL

ACTION WHEN A MILITARY PERSON DIES

Action by

1. (a) Immediately a death occurs, the Unit Commander will make arrangements to have the remains seen and certified by a doctor if possible prior to removal to the nearest Military Hospital if one has been established in the area. If none has been established, then to the nearest Civilian Hospital.

(b) Six copies of the Death Certificate for each person will be obtained from a qualified doctor either Civil or Military, who has first seen the dead body. Their disposal is given in para (5) below. A copy of death certificate is attached as Appendix 'A'.

REPORTING THE DEATH

2. (a) As soon as possible and by the fastest means signal will be sent to the Chief of Military Personnel, HQ ONUC, Leopoldville, with copies to the Contingent Commander or Liaison Officer, giving the following particulars:-

- i) Number, Rank, Nationality and UN identity Card No. of the deceased.
- ii) Location, date and time of death.
- iii) Cause of death with a short description of how it occurred.

(b) Cause of death

The cause of death will be notified under the following categories:-

- i) Death by Natural cause
- ii) Death by accident
- iii) Death by violence / Death in action
- iv) Death by infectious diseases, eg, plague, cholera, smallpox.

3. Disposal of bodies

(a) Bodies of dead personnel can be disposed of as follows:-

- i) Buried or cremated locally.
- ii) Bodies embalmed and despatched to home country.
- iii) Ashes of those cremated locally may be sent to home country.
- iv) Buried in the UN Cemetery in Leopoldville.
- v) Remains of those buried locally to be exhumed and despatched to home country - this can only be done after a lapse of one year.

(b) The Contingent Commander/National Liaison Officer will inform the Military Personnel Branch, HQ ONUC, Leopoldville, how the body is to be disposed of.

Note: Remains of those who die under para 2(b) (iv) above (infectious diseases) will be buried or cremated locally.

Suitable permanent identification marks will be attached to the body before placing in and sealing of coffins.

Delete entries against sub para (a) and insert the following:-

"If the body is to be moved on a long journey within or out of the Congo, it must be embalmed by a Mortician. Timing is very important for succesful embalming. The Chief of Mortuary Operations is available to go anywhere in the Congo at short notice. Local ONUC Medical Officer will be responsible for embalming in an emergency only when the Mortician is not available. Attention of ONUC Medical Officers is drawn to HQ ONUC letter No 4042/19/Med-3 dated 9 Oct 62."

INFORMING NEW YORK AND HOME GOVERNMENTS

4. (a) The Military Personnel Branch, HQ ONUC, will immediately inform UN, New York, of the No., Rank, Name and cause of death of the deceased.

(a) If the body is to be **buried** locally and the remains are not to be exhumed before the lapse of one year, a wooden coffin will normally be used.

(c) If the body is to be moved for final disposal within the Congo, it will be embalmed and placed inside two coffins, viz.,

- i) Zinc/Aluminium Coffin.
- ii) Wooden coffin.

(d) If the body is to be moved for final disposal outside the Congo, it will be embalmed and placed inside two coffins, viz.,

- i) A zinc/Aluminium Coffin
- ii) A wooden coffin

10. Burial in the CONGO

For final disposal or temporary burial pending transshipment out of the Congo, the body will be brought to Leopoldville for interment in UN Cemetery. In case of infectious diseases or reasons when the local Commanders deem it necessary to inter the body locally the following procedure will be followed:-

(a) Body will be placed in a wooden coffin.

(b) Obtain permission for burial from local commune officer/burgomaster. He will give a number to the coffin and plaque for the tomb on production of death certificate. Date, time and place will be arranged with him.

(c) i) Inform Mil Pers Branch HQ ONUC, and the Contingent Commander of the exact location of burial.

ii) Where possible, give the grave No. if in an established Cemetery.

iii) If buried outside an established Cemetery, the exact location with the help of map reference, magnetic bearings from prominent buildings, land marks to the grave should be given. (This is essential in the event of the body being required to be exhumed at a later date for removal to home country).

(d) Marking of Grave

Temporary burial place will be marked in a permanent manner whether located in an established cemetery or an area outside the commune. A marker 2x5 feet (2½ feet driven into the ground) made of wood will be put on the head side of the grave.



1 General

A ceremonial military funeral will be given to the late Cpl GABRIEL EBEDIKE of the Nigerian Contingent who died on 7 Sep 62 prior to repatriation of his remains to NIGERIA. His remains will be removed from the ONUC Hospital, LEOPOLDVILLE at 1400 hours on Thursday 20th Sep, to the N'Djili airport.

2 Ceremonial

The ceremony will mainly be in three phases as follows :

Phase I

Removal of the remains from the ONUC Hospital to N ' Djili airport at 1400 hours on 20 Sep.

Phase II

Brief religious ceremony; sounding of the last post ; and reveille within the premises of the American Hangar, N'Djili airport at 1600 hours on 20th Sep.

Phase III

Dispersal of troops and loading of the coffin.

3 Details - Phase I

The following will report to the Nigerian Liaison Officer at 1330 hours on 20 Sep at the ONUC Hospital :

- a. Two Military Police pilot jeeps.
- b. Bearer party of 12 OR from the Nigerian Contingent.
- c. One 3-ton vehicle from PAKISTAN GT Coy as carriage for casket.

- d. One officer and six OR from each Contingent in LEO will form part of the funeral ceremony. They will report to the Adjutant 4 QONR at 1500 hours on 20 Sep within the premises of the American Hanger, N'Djili airport. 4 QONR will provide one officer, ten OR and their Corps of Drums for this ceremony. Senior-most officer present will be OC-in-charge of the ceremony.

4 Details - Phase II

The ceremony will take place within the premises of the American Hangar , N' Djili airport, under the arrangements of the Nigerian LO and the Adjutant of 4 QONR. It will consist of the following :

- (1) Short prayers by the Chaplain.
- (2) Paying of homage.
- (3) Sounding of the last post.
- (4) Reveille.

5 Details - Phase III

On completion of the ceremony, the troops and Corps of Drums will disperse and the coffin will be loaded in the aircraft in accordance with arrangements made by the Nigerian LO and Movement Control Office, N'Djili.

6 Ceremonial Instructions

- a. Traffic duties from the ONUC Hospital to N' Djili airport will be the responsibility of the Military Police. They will make arrangements for vehicle parking at a convenient place at the N'Djili airport.
- b. The Chief Procurement Officer will please procure a wreath for the Force Commander and hand over the same to the Nigerian LO at 1130 hours on 20 Sep.

7 Dress

Normal working dress will be worn except for the Corps of Drums who will be in their review order.

8 Chaplain

The Nigerian LO will arrange for the services of the Chaplain.

- 7 The Brass Band of 4 RAJ RIF (Indian Contingent) and 12 buglers from 4 QONR will participate in the parade. The Band Master 4 RAJ RIF will report to HQ Sector "L" on 7 Sept and obtain details regarding the Congolese National Anthem.

National Flags

- 8 Each Contingent is responsible to provide its National flag. 

2 Ceremonial

The ceremony will mainly be in three phases as follows:

Phase I

Removal of the remains from the ONUC Hospital to N'Djili airport at 1500 hours on 12th August.

Phase II

Brief religious ceremony; sounding of the last post; and reveille within the premises of the American Hangar, N'Djili airport at 1700 hours on 12th August.

Phase III

Dispersal of troops and loading of the coffin.

3 Details - Phase I

The following will report to the Nigerian Liaison Officer at 1430 hours on 12th August at the ONUC Hospital:

- d. One officer and six OR from each Contingent in LEO will form part of the funeral ceremony. They will report to the Adjutant 5 QONR at 1600 hours on 12th August within the premises of the American Hangar, N'Djili airport. 5 QONR will provide one officer, ten OR and their Corps of Drums for this ceremony. Senior-most officer present will be OC-in-charge of the ceremony.

4 Details - Phase II

The ceremony will take place within the premises of the American Hangar, N'Djili airport, under the arrangements of the Nigerian LO and the Adjutant of 5 QONR. It will consist of the following:

- (1) Short prayers by the Chaplain.
- (2) Paying of homage.
- (3) Sounding of the last post.
- (4) Reveille.

5 Details - Phase III

On completion of the ceremony, the troops and Corps of Drums will disperse and the coffin will be loaded in the aircraft in accordance with arrangements made by the Nigerian LO and Movement Control Office, N'Djili.


