The team patrolled RUKONDO Commune and was informed that 3 refugees from Zaire arrived in the Commune on 24.08.1995. The team was also informed that 1 refugee has been hidden by his relations for fear of being arrested by RPA as he has been suspected to have participated in last year's genocide. Human Rights informed.

b: PMT - KIBUYE PREFECTURE

The team conducted patrols at RWAMATAMU Commune and was informed that the security Situation in the area is calm.

The team also visited BINOGO School within the Commune and met the Headmaster who informed the team that the School has 300 pupils and 6 teachers. He complained to the team that the school is in dire need of teaching materials such as books and pencils. He further disclosed that 40 % of the pupils do not report for classes because of lack of school uniforms.

c: PMT - KIGALI PREFECTURE

Visited NBERA IDPs transit camp and was informed that there are 256 IDPs in the camp awaiting evacuation to their respective home Communes. Investigation in progress.

b: PMT - KIBUYE PREFECTURE

The team conducted patrols at RWAMATAMU Commune and was informed that some returnees and a former judge have been arrested by RPA for unknown reasons. Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

c: PMT - GITARAMA PREFECTURE

The team reported that on 31.08.1995 at 1440 hrs 1 local was kidnapped at KABGAYI Hospital by unknown persons. His where about and reasons for the kidnapping are unknown. Human Rights informed. Investigation in progress.

d: PMT - GISENYI PREFECTURE

The team reported that in the night of the 27th August 1995 a local and his wife were killed at their house by unknown persons armed with a gun and a knife at RAMBA Commune. The local man was shot with a gun whilst his wife was stabbed to death with a knife. Reasons for the killing unknown. Investigation in progress.

The team visited Kigali prison and found 9,786 inmates living under poor Sanitary Conditions. The director of the Prison disclosed that 2 prisoners have died after an illness. Human Rights informed.

The team was also informed that the Government of Rwanda has embarked on a program of de-congesting prisons in Kigali and Gitarama in which prisoners would be moved to other prisons in Rwanda. The program is expected to begin next week.

b: PMT - BUTARE PREFECTURE

Reported that on 29.08.1995 between 1900 hrs and 2000 hrs 1 local was shot dead outside his house at NSYANDA Commune by unknown persons. Reason for the killing unknown. Investigation in progress.

c: PMT - RUHENGARI PREFECTURE

The team conducted Patrols at KINIGI Commune and was informed that 4 armed men dressed in Military uniforms suspected to be RPA soldiers have been harassing the doctor and patients at the Commune Hospital. Reasons for the harassment unknown. Investigation in progress.

The team also visited the Commune prison and found 2 inmates who have been accused of committing minor offences detained. The prison has good sanitary conditions. Human Rights informed.

d: PMT - GIKONGORO PREFECTURE

The team patrolled NSHILI and KANYAMAKARA Communes and reported that Security situation in both areas is calm. In NSHILI Commune a total of 31 refugees from Burundi and Zaire arrived in the Commune and 151 refugees from Zaire arrived in KANYAMAKARA Commune. All have been re-settled in their home Communes respectively.

The team also visited NDERA IDP's Camp and was informed that there are 209 IDPs in the Camp awaiting evacuation to their respective home Communes. The in-charge also disclosed that 305 IDPs have been evacuated to their respective home Communes for re-settlement.

## b: PMT - KIBUYE PREFECTURE

The team visited URUNDO Hospital in RUTSIRO Commune and was informed that the Hospital has no Support in terms of medicines since the NGO UEMISA which used to render assistance to the hospital was evacuated from the area on 20. August 1995.

The team reported that in the night of the 25th August at 0300 hrs 4 bandits dressed in Civilian clothes and armed with a rifle and a knife robbed MWIYANIKE M.S.F. 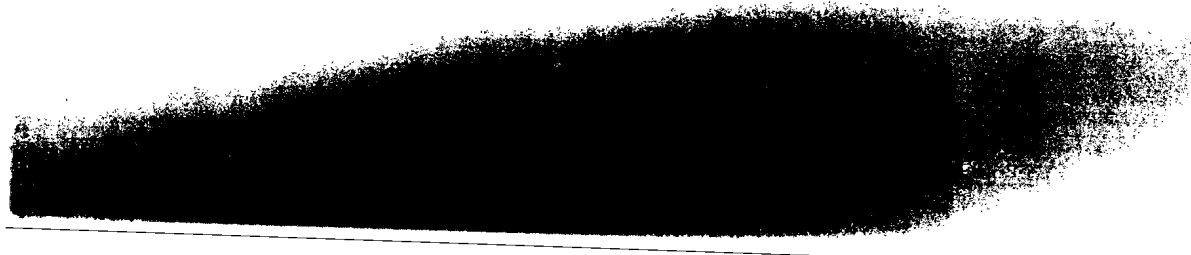



Reported that on 9/8/95 41 refugees from ZAIRE crossed into RWANDA through BUGARAMA border post and have gone to their respective home communes for re-settlement.

c. PMT- GIKONGORO PREFECTURE

Reported that on 9/8/95 C.R.S. in conjunction with CARITAS distributed large consignment of oil, beans and sorghum to orphans, old men and women in GIKONGORO.

PMT- BUTARE PREFECTURE

Reported that on 8/8/95 UNHCR brought 128 returnees from BURUNDI whilst 6 were brought on 9/8/95. The returnees are awaiting re-settlements in their home areas.

In another development the team also visited Gatuna border post and was informed that 35 refugees from UGANDA have returned to BYUMBA Prefecture and have been re-settled in their respective home communes.

C. PMT - KIGALI PREFECTURE

Visited NDERA IDPs camp on 22/7/95 and was informed that there were 195 IDPs in the camp awaiting evacuation to their respective home communes. 47 out of this number are awaiting the decision of the Ministry of Rehabilitation to allocate them land to resettle.

D. PMT - RUHENGERI PREFECTURE

Visited the MSF clinic on 22/7/95. The Medical Officer in-charge disclosed that the clinic is in dire need of mattresses and beds. The prevailing sickness in the area is malaria.

The same team visited African Humanitarian Action clinic and was informed that the situation in the area is under control.

##### PMT-GIKONGORO PREFECTURE

Visited MUSEBEYA Commune on 20/7/95 and was informed that RPA are suspected to have been threatening locals with arbitrary arrests. The team was also informed that a week ago one local is suspected to have been arrested by RPA and detained in the Commune cells. Reasons unknown. Investigation in progress.

The team also visited NYAMAGABE Commune and met the Bourgmestre who informed the team that the crime wave in the area was on the increase. He also complained of bandits who are suspected to be coming from other communes to steal cattle from locals. Investigation in progress.

##### PMT- KIGALI PREFECTURE

Visited KIGALI prison on 21/7/95 and observed that a lot of locals had gathered at the prison to visit their relations in
