In the meantime we have informed our Regional Director in Chios that the whole matter has been passed over to the Middle East Office and we are awaiting to hear whether or not there is any chance of anything being done to get the baggage transported to Greece.

Gentlemen:

Subject: Payment in Respect of Sea Passages for D.P.'s
from Famagusta to Port Said.

The Repatriation Service of the Ministry of Welfare has received the enclosed bills from the Base Command Pay Office M.E.F. In respect of individuals sent from Cyprus to Egypt, the Repatriation Service have approached us in that they feel confident these individuals must have been displaced persons and, if that is so, then they feel that the cost of movement should be borne by the Middle East office.

You will notice that on the vouchers from the Base Command Pay Office, the words "Greek Government" have been written in ink. This presumably is why these bills were passed to the Greek Embassy in London for payment. The bills, it would appear, were then passed from the Embassy to the Greek Ministry of War and from there to the repatriation service of the Ministry of Repatriation.

We would appreciate it if you would clear this matter, if as we suppose, the charge refers to the movement of refugees.

Reference is made to our cable no. 202 dated April 11 and our letter confirming the cable of April 11, ref. DP/456/2330.

The shipping agency of S.S. Cairo in Piraeus claims not to have received any message from their agency in Alexandria (Messrs. Paramithiotis and Boyyouklis P.O.B. 1948) about the payment of the ticket of the D.P. Aspasia Kapayanides. Since we have not received a reply from you to our cable and letter, will you confirm that this ticket has not been paid for in Egypt as requested in our above-mentioned letter.

Please note that the D.P. in question has been sent to Alexandria by S.S. Cairo on May 3, at the expense of the Greek Government. Consequently if the agency has been paid in Egypt, the fare should be refunded or utilized for another passenger.

Dear Brigadier Waddington

In reply to your letter, reference CM/8/46, of 9 May, the following are the facts.

As soon as final arrangements had been completed to send the party of refugees on the S.S. Cairo a signal was sent to your office. The signal number was 2343 and was originated in our Repatriation Section during the late afternoon of 30 April. Owing to the 1 May being a general holiday in Greece the signal was not actually sent, unfortunately, until early on 2 May. S.S. Cairo was due to leave Piraeus on 3 May and to arrive in Alexandria on 4 May. We are sorry if this was not sufficient notice for you, but as you will appreciate these shipping arrangements have sometimes to be completed at a late date and two or three days advance warning is all that we can then hope to give you.

As to your flight personnel not knowing about these refugees the reason is almost certainly that they did not visit our Repatriation Section while they were in Athens. They almost certainly checked in at our Transportation Office; but the latter, of course, would not know about refugees. I would like to suggest that such people from your office who come to Athens in connection with refugee movements should call on the head of the Repatriation section, not only in order to check such matters, but also because there are in addition small routine questions and problems which it would be useful for us to refer to them.

With reference to M.E.O. letter of 9 May, here are the facts as far as I can ascertain.

1. A signal was sent to M.E.O. as soon as final arrangements had been made to send D.P.'s on the S.S. Cairo.
2. Signal number is 2343; ~~was~~ initiated by this office on 1630 on 30 April. It left the Mission on 2 May.
3. The ship was due to leave on 3 May and its E.T.A. Alexandria was 4 May.
4. It seems certain that the two UNRRA people on the ship, Mr. Bahari and Miss Rauch were not advised that D.P.'s were travelling on the Cairo. The reason for this is that these two people did not report to the D.P. division, certainly not to Mr. Wright-Harvey who was looking after movements at the time ^{when} they came in from Egypt.
5. It is more than probable that on arrival here they more or less went along to Mrs. Winter's office in order to arrange their own transportation back to the Middle East.
6. It is impossible, I am afraid to say, whether they came into the Repatriation Office but it might be worthwhile suggesting to M.E.O. that when their personnel accompany flights to Greece, they should in all cases report to the Chief of the Repatriation Section on arrival and also ~~to~~ a day or two before their return so that they can ascertain whether or not there is any work for them to do on the return trip.

Dear Sir,

A letter has been received from our Representative in Samos, which would indicate that certain information is being sent by Italian P.O.W.s to their wives in Samos.

I quote the relevant paragraph from a Report, and would be most grateful if you would take this matter up with G.H.Q., M.E.F., and ask for further information.

"With reference to the status of invitations to Italy, there have recently been statements from P.O.W.s in Egypt, contained in letters to their wives in Samos, which seem to indicate that some arrangement may be made by the British authorities for these men to come to Samos to collect their wives before being repatriated to Italy. At first this seemed to us to be highly improbable, but approximately 20 letters of this nature have now been received, and we feel that some investigation of the position should be made. In case that this is a mistaken idea, please try to arrange for its contradiction in the M.E., P.O.W. camps. The importance of this is that such letters cannot be construed into an invitation to Italy for our purposes, but they are often all that are received in reply to requests by the wives for a proper invitation.

We would further suggest that as such a solution would be so completely ideal for our problems, the investigation of this situation should be pursued with some vigour. It would seem to be a fairly practicable solution of the problem, as it would only involve an extra call for a ship engaged on repatriation of P.O.W.s."

From our point of view the suggestion that British Authorities allow these men to come to Samos to collect their wives is a very bad one and one which neither we nor the Greek Government would wish to see put into effect.

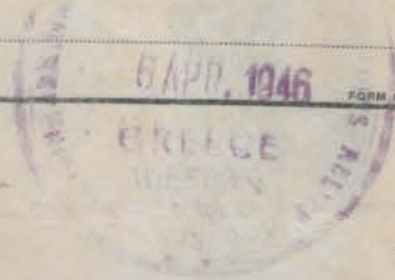

Subject: Relations on D.P. matters with Caserta and Cairo
Offices.

Dear Mr. Joseph,

You asked me yesterday to prepare a brief note on the course of our relations with the two offices mentioned above. As far as the Middle East Office is concerned, there has been and will be frequent communication on the repatriation of Greek refugees, and M.E.O. has always shown a sympathetic understanding of our problems as a receiving area. From time to time representatives from Athens have been to Cairo on specific issues, such as when we had to ask for repatriation to the Aegean Islands to be suspended for a period three months ago owing to grave local shortage of food and transport.

The present position, as we understand it, is that there are still between 5,000 ~~to~~ 6,000 Greeks to be sent to us by M.E.O., the majority for the Aegean Islands. It is our understanding that, among the despatching areas, Cyprus will be cleared first and Africa second. We are also concerned here with the reception of demobilized internees, ex members of the Greek Forces in the Middle East, of whom we understand there are still about 2,000 to return. The despatching responsibility is believed to rest with the Military Authorities and not with M.E.O. Facilities for reception have now improved to such an extent that if M.E.O. wish to speed up the rate of repatriation of the remainder, even up to double the present rate, this Mission would have no objection.

With the Caserta Office there have been less transactions than with M.E.O. The chief reason for this is that whereas in the "Military Period" the various formations concerned with D.P. Movements reported to and were controlled by G-5 Displaced Persons, A.F.H.Q., in the civilian period of UNRRA our first responsibility in reporting and as regards ~~co-ordination~~ of Policy is to E.R.O. To take an example, before we can embark any D.P.s on ships which require

payment in foreign currency, prior approval has to be granted by E.R.O.

This is not to deny that UNRRA Caserta has not performed real service on our behalf. When we place bids for shipping of D.P.s within the Mediterranean area we place them with A.F.H.Q. (G-5. Displaced Persons) through Caserta, working on our behalf, who support the bid.

The question how far Caserta Office might engage in active co-ordination of refugee movements between countries in the Mediterranean Theatre was discussed with Vice-Marshal Saul when I was in Caserta last August. Representatives were there at the same time from the Yugoslav Mission, from the Italian Mission (Mr. Sorieri) and from E.R.O. (Mons. Francois Morin). We agreed that on all Policy matters our reference should be direct to E.R.O., and that all we should have to ask of the Caserta Office was that they should act as a shipping and travel agency on our behalf in the placing and supporting of shipping bids for Displaced Persons.



We are enclosing, for such disposition as you may wish to make of it, DP I card for the above named person about whom there has been some correspondence prior to the receipt of your cable No. 672 which was received on January 1st.

Arrangements had been made for Thucydide Zervos, Paul Danalis and Constantine Katsicouyannis to be sent to Ethiopia. Arrangements for Danalis and Katsicouyannis were completed and they have departed for Ethiopia.

Mr. Zervos did not report with the others to go to Camp El Shatt pending the departure of the ship, and refused to go for his inoculation for yellow fever. When explained to him that having the inoculations was one of the conditions on which UNRRA could make arrangements for his transportation, he stated that rather than have the inoculation, he would make his own plans.

In considering your cable indicating, that since he left Greece on the basis of his own plans, he is not an UNRRA responsibility, we are taking no further action and are returning the DP I card to you.

Dear Sir,

With reference to correspondence which has passed between you and this Division, concerning Greek Jews at El Shatt, the following information is quoted from a letter dated January 14, 1946, received from the Repatriation Division of the Middle East Office:

- "1. The Greek Government has not ordered the cessation of repatriation nor has UNRRA advised Greek refugees at El Shatt of any cessation.
2. All of the 32 Greek Jewish people are in possession of Spanish passports correctly visaed for Greece.
3. UNRRA has informed all refugees in El Shatt that repatriation is being delayed solely on account of non-availability of shipping.
4. In El Shatt camp there are 291 non-Jewish Greek refugees, 49 of these are to be repatriated to the Mainland and remainder to the Aegean Islands.
5. It will be seen that with the 32 Jewish Greeks, refugees in El Shatt for the Mainland total 81. We have no part capacity shipping available for this small number. After arrival at El Shatt of Greek refugees from East Africa (first flight of 1000 arrive January 13), we are hoping to have a vessel made available for a flight to the Mainland".

As will be seen from the above, there does not seem to be any impediment to the return of the thirty-two Jewish persons, as their passports have apparently been examined and entry into Greece authorized.

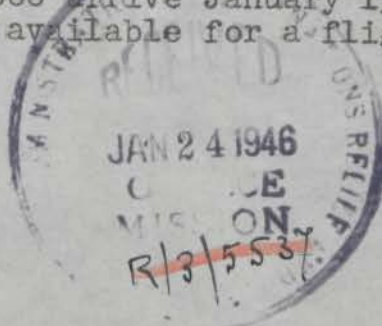

Mr. Linney has presented correspondence addressed to Miss Geldard-Brown, Displaced Persons Division, Athens, concerning the above to this Division and we herewith supply the following information:

1. The Greek Government has not ordered the cessation of repatriation nor has UNRRA advised Greek refugees at El Shatt of any cessation.
2. All of the 32 Greek Jewish people are in possession of Spanish passports correctly visaed for Greece.
3. UNRRA has informed all refugees in El Shatt that repatriation is being delayed solely on account of non-availability of shipping.
4. In El Shatt camp there are 291 non-Jewish Greek refugees, 49 of these are to be repatriated to the Mainland, and remainder to the Aegean Islands.
5. It will be seen that with the 32 Jewish Greeks, refugees in El Shatt for the Mainland total 81. We have no part capacity shipping available for this small number. After arrival at El Shatt of Greek refugees from East Africa (first flight of 1000 arrive January 13), we are hoping to have a vessel made available for a flight to the Mainland.

We wish to present for your information a situation which has caused considerable difficulty to the Middle East Office and which may come to your attention in your negotiations with Greek Government authorities.

Among the registrations in Ethiopia were 50-military personnel who were discharged from the army, registered as refugees, and included in the group transported to El Shatt. The registration was without the approval of UNRRA and entirely outside our authorization. The Ministry of National Welfare was notified immediately that these men might not remain in an UNRRA camp nor be repatriated at UNRRA expense.

Since they were discharged, the Greek Army authorities refused to accept them and the Greek Ministry for National Welfare had no facilities for their care, maintenance or repatriation.

We have therefore agreed that these ex-military may remain at El Shatt Camp on the understanding that maintenance and repatriation will be at the expense of the Greek Government. Copies of the correspondence confirming this agreement are enclosed.

You are aware of the fact that the Middle East Office has continually had the problem of Greek military being discharged in this area and referred to UNRRA for care and repatriation, despite repeated conferences with statements and communications to all Greek authorities concerned. Ex-military are clearly not UNRRA responsibility. We would appreciate your explaining this situation as necessity indicates.

- c. Expenses chargeable to the Greek Government and railway and ship indents later will be submitted by the authorities concerned to the Greek Government.
- d. When these men are repatriated, they will be carried on a separate nominal roll and a Movement Order issued by G.H.Q., Cairo. Instructions regarding the details of arranging for this Movement Order are forwarded in a separate letter.

Instructions in accordance with this agreement have been issued to UNRRA Headquarters and camp staff, and copies of this correspondence have been sent to UNRRA Greece for presentation to Government Authorities.

Reference the last paragraph in your letter of 22 November, we agree that UNRRA has been authorized to spend a considerable amount of money for relief in Greece, but UNRRA is not authorized to spend any of this money for maintenance or repatriation of military personnel.

We have several times discussed and frequently stated UNRRA's position as regards services to military or ex-military personnel. The question of UNRRA repatriation for the military group at El Shatt Camp, not only has been given careful consideration by MEO staff, but has also been submitted as a particular case to London officials. In accordance with the opinion you are supporting, there are among them 50 to 60 persons who, accordingly to the existing regulations, are classified as ex-military personnel and cannot therefore be considered as refugees, for whom only UNRRA has assumed the responsibility for care, maintenance and repatriation.

It would be much appreciated if you could confirm our verbal agreement upon this matter, reached during our meeting held on the 14.11.45 in presence of Miss S. Gifford, Miss M. Flynn and our interpreter Mr. Mordoh.

Our agreement on this subject consists in two points which are as follows:

a) The persons considered by your services as ex-military personnel will remain in Camp El Shatt together with their family. Their living expenses will be charged to the Greek Treasury in case it would be at last decided by UNRRA that, in accordance with her regulations, she may not assume these expenses.

b) The persons in question will be repatriated together with the other refugees and the cost of their travel tickets plus other possible expenses will be reimbursed by the Greek Treasury in case it would be finally decided by UNRRA that, accordingly to her regulations, she may not assume the expenses in question.

We do not omit to remind you the statement we made during the same conversation : It is impossible to us to ever believe that, after having taken the decision to spend \$250.000.000 for the relief of suffering Greece, UNRRA is going to condescend and submit to the Greek Government a bill covering the expenses made in favour of refugees, who, for a matter of form only, are considered by your services as ex-military personnel.

The question of whether or not UNRRA Displaced Persons' Division should accept ex-military personnel for maintenance care and repatriation has come up for discussion on more than one occasion.

At the present time, as I understand it, the arrangement is that UNRRA does register and arrange repatriation for men discharged from the army. Recently many residents of the Dodecanese have been registered and repatriated through Displaced Persons' Division. In some instances also, ex-service men have been repatriated to Egypt and applications of this nature are constantly being received. Only recently an airman who left Egypt for Greece on December 5, in order to be discharged, applied to UNRRA for repatriation to Egypt and was indignant when refused, as he considered that, as an ex-service man he was "entitled" to repatriation. This particular ex-serviceman was refused on the basis of his recent arrival in Greece.

As it will be seen from the attached correspondence, the Middle East have taken a strong stand and have definitely refused to accept responsibility for the repatriation of ex-military personnel.

As there is every indication that the number of men discharged from the Greek Military Forces will increase, might I suggest that this question be reopened and discussed with the Ministry of Repatriation and the Ministry of War on the basis of the correspondence? Personally it would seem that the repatriation of military personnel is not UNRRA's responsibility and we might go on indefinitely repatriating ex-Greek Military personnel, particularly as no marginal date has been set after which an individual, whose status has been changed, cannot be considered as a Displaced Person.

Your Excellency,

I have the honour to refer to the matter of Greek Internees being repatriated from the Middle East. I understand from the British Military Mission in Athens that they and the Service Ministries concerned accept responsibility for these internees until their demobilisation. After demobilisation, however, it is presumed that they will continue to be the responsibility of the Ministry of Repatriation and UNRRA Displaced Persons Division for shelter, feeding and onward movement to their homes.

In order that these responsibilities after demobilisation can be efficiently carried out, I feel it is necessary that Your Excellency and ourselves should have adequate notice of times when parties of such internees are going to be landed and demobilized. Would Your Excellency please be good enough to make an arrangement with the Ministry of War for them to notify you in advance of all such arrivals. I would suggest that Your Excellency might then pass on through the UNRRA Liaison Office to your Ministry requests for whatever UNRRA co-operation or assistance may be desired.

Referring to the information received from B.M.W. advising Repatriation of internees from Eritrea, we informed B.M.W. Athens that UNRRA would accept responsibility for these internees after they were demobilised. It is understood from B.M.W. that in future they would accept responsibility entirely without reference to UNRRA, and it would be necessary for the Ministry of Repatriation to advise us of expected arrivals should they wish us to have any responsibility for their care immediately after demobilisation, which may occur either on board the vessel on arrival at port of disembarkation or immediately after debarkation.

Will the Liaison Office please advise the Ministry of Repatriation of the necessity that they will keep us informed of such expected arrivals, since we do not anticipate advice from any other source.

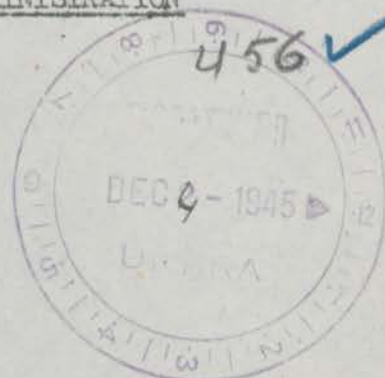

The 'Tripolitania' embarked a total of 285 refugees at Port Said on the 23rd. 55 for the Dodecanese and 230 for Samos. The contingent for Samos was one of our famous last minute rush jobs. GHQ notified us on the 22nd of November that the 'Tripolitania' could take 230 refugees to Samos only, giving us exactly 48 hours to prepare nominal rolls, check immunizations, give final physical examinations, collect baggage and refugees, and transfer both to Port Said. This is the first group to return to the Aegean since the ban on repatriation to the Greek Islands was lifted. The 'Tripolitania' continues to be our only ship.

In the group of refugees that moved from Jerusalem last week there was a Czech medical team of 23 members. The end of July we were asked to assist this team in securing air transportation to Czechoslovakia where their professional services are urgently needed. They were originally assembled in Jerusalem. As only a few at a time could be sent by air the local Czech authorities and Movements GHQ decided that a sea passage for the whole group was preferable. There has been great delay in securing the necessary transit clearance from A.C.C. Austria (Russian Zone) - the clearance for Italy having been made dependent on this. Several members of this group were former UNRRA employees in camps.

The Director of the Division went to Nairobi, Kenya Colony, to discuss with the East African Refugee Administration, a branch of the East African Governors' Conference, the questions involved in the proposed takeover by UNRRA of the Polish refugees in East Africa. Mr. Holcomb has returned and is preparing his report which will recommend close and continued collaboration with the East African Refugee Administration.

Elizabeth Brown is spending a week in Cairo trying to clarify the Czech, Austrian and Ex-military questions. The Jerusalem Office devotes much of its time to inquiries from these three groups.

Our Ref. No. 19532, dated 16.8.45.

We have the honour to communicate to you hereunder a cable from the Royal Embassy in Teheran for your information.

"My suggestion for sending from here unemployed persons to Palestine was made in our cable No. 261 dated 30.5.45. Your 94 (one word or two missing). The delay of four months upset the conditions upon which my intimations were based because in the meantime the British Military Attache (one word missing) who was managing the relative arrangements has been transferred from here two months ago. The UNRRA Office here has been dissolved and the British Army with the lorries (one word missing) with which the transport would have been done left Teheran some days ago. Meanwhile I asked the new British Military Attache to inform me if he can facilitate the transport. He stated that, as the British Army has gone from Teheran, transport with Army trucks is impossible and he added that he could cable to the British Military H.Q., suggesting facilitating the transport of these unemployed to Palestine by rail. Before doing that he wishes to know if the Greek Government would agree to pay the expenses involved which would be at least £10 for each person. As there are 60 unemployed and some of them have no family, expenses must be calculated for nearly 100 persons, that is £1,000. The Ministry should see if an arrangement with UNRRA could settle this question."

Dear Brigadier Waddington,

I am writing to enquire further about the case of certain unemployed Greeks in Teheran who have applied for repatriation. This matter was originally raised with Mr. Holcomb of your office during his visit in August last, and he has a copy of the original note on the subject received by the Displaced Persons Division of this Mission.

A further signal has now been received by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs here from the Minister of the Royal Hellenic Government in Teheran and has ^{been} passed to this Mission through the Ministry of Repatriation. It states that there are some 60 unemployed Greeks in Teheran awaiting repatriation, many of them with dependents, so that the total of persons awaiting movement to Greece is approximately 100. The signal states that, since the UNRRA Office there has been dissolved and British Army Units have left the area, transport by trucks appears now to be impossible. It is suggested that movement should be by rail to Palestine, but the expense involved would be at least 210 sterling per person. The signal concludes with the request that the Foreign Affairs Ministry approach UNRRA with a view to reaching an arrangement.

I suggest that, even if the UNRRA Office has been withdrawn from Teheran, this area might be regarded as within the sphere of influence of your Mission, and you might be willing to accept the responsibility for the collection and despatch of these Greeks. My comment on the signal referred to above would be that, if road transport is in fact impossible, the rail fares should be borne as a local currency cost by the Iranian Government who, as a member Government, presumably have certain obligations to displaced persons of United Nations nationality.

I should be very glad to learn if you concur with the

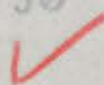

Mr. Holcomb left Wednesday morning, 14th November, for Nairobi, Kenya, to consult with officials of the East African colonies: Kenya, Tanganyika, Northern and Southern Rhodesia, Urundi and Uganda, in order to secure information and recommendations for a detailed plan of operations by which the Polish refugees may be repatriated. No official decision will be made about UNRRA's responsibility to this group until a plan of take over has been submitted to E.R.O.

The 'Tripolitania' was delayed for several days this week because she was magnetized. After being demagnetized at Port Said she embarked 105 refugees from El Shatt on the 14th, picked up 48 refugees at Cyprus, all to be disembarked at Castellorizo and Rhodes.

The 'Empire Mist' is a converted freighter originally designated for repatriating troops. Several weeks ago we were notified that it might be available for the repatriation of 600 male refugees. Accommodations are not suitable for women and children. We immediately consulted with the Yugoslav Central Committee at El Shatt and prepared 600 male refugees for embarkation on the 'Empire Mist'. This embarkation has been held up waiting decision from the War Office in London on the use of the 'Empire Mist' for refugees in lieu of troops.

122 refugees were assembled by the Jerusalem Office for admittance to El Shatt. 98 arrived at El Shatt on schedule November 15th. 24 were unable to leave Tel-Aviv because of the curfew necessitating duplicate arrangements for transport. They will go forward Monday November 19th.

There is a steadily increasing volume of military personnel, former refugees from both United Nations and ex-enemy countries, appealing to UNRRA. They either have been or are about to be discharged in the Middle East areas where they were enlisted. There is at present no opportunity through any agency for their care, maintenance, or repatriation.
