

As you are aware, a joint communiqué was issued in Luanda on 12 July 1978 by the representatives of Canada, France, the Federal Republic of Germany, the United Kingdom and the United States of America on the one hand, and by the representatives of the South West Africa People's Organization (SWAPO) on the other. The communiqué, which was published at United Nations Headquarters on 14 July 1978 as Security Council document 12775, states:

"The two delegations accordingly agreed to proceed to the United Nations Security Council thus opening the way to an early internationally acceptable settlement of the question of Namibia".

As I have also been informed that the Security Council will in fact meet shortly to discuss the question of Namibia, it appears appropriate that further consideration related to the organization of the missions of consultation await the result of discussions in the Security Council.

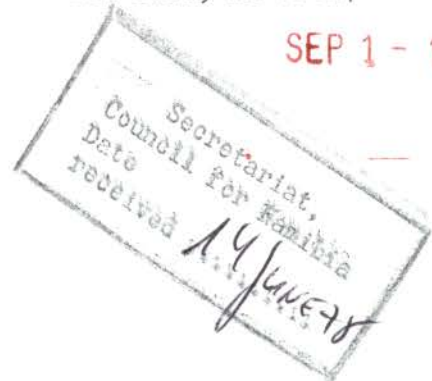

Excellency,

I have the honour to inform you that the United Nations Council for Namibia has decided to accept the invitation of the Governments of Indonesia, Malaysia, Pakistan, Singapore and the Philippines for a mission of consultation of the Council to visit those countries and hold talks on the implementation of the United Nations resolutions on Namibia.

While the Council for Namibia is aware that the Government of Japan has abstained in the voting on the resolutions on Namibia of the ninth special session of the General Assembly, the Council believes that an indepth review of the situation regarding Namibia may contribute to a more effective role for the international community in assisting the Namibian people to obtain national independence in a united Namibia.

The Council for Namibia wishes therefore to exchange views with interested Governments on ways and means to implement the recommendations of the ninth special session of the General Assembly related to the withdrawal of the illegal South African administration from Namibia and to the intensification of assistance to the Namibian people.

The Government of Pakistan has consistently supported the position of the United Nations on the question of Namibia. The ninth special session of the General Assembly on Namibia approved resolution A/REG/S-9/2 of 3 May 1978 containing a Declaration on Namibia and a Programme of Action in Support of Self-Determination and National Independence for Namibia. The Declaration reaffirms that the illegal occupation of Namibia by South Africa constitutes a threat to international peace and security.

The Council for Namibia wishes therefore to exchange views with interested Governments on ways and means to implement the recommendations of the ninth special session of the General Assembly related to the withdrawal of the illegal South African administration from Namibia and to the intensification of assistance to the Namibian people.

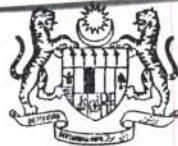


