The Office of the Custodian, in the above respect, further has the honour to inform that a programme to place permanent markers on British Commonwealth and Netherlands' graves is presently in progress at the Cemetery and that the Governments of Norway and France have recently agreed to permanent markers, of a similar design to those of the British Commonwealth, being placed on the graves of their dead.

With a view to the accomplishment of the programme for permanent markers at one and the same time, the Office of Custodian requests the Ministry of Foreign Affairs to appraise the Ministry of National Defence of the above and suggests that it may now be possible for permanent markers, of the design stipulated by the Republic of Korea authorities, to be placed on the graves of Korean nationals buried in the United Nations Memorial Cemetery. The Office of the Custodian will be pleased to provide all assistance in this respect. It is understood, however, that all costs incurred in the replacement of temporary markers by permanent markers will be borne by the Government of the Republic of Korea.



Dear General Kim,

I regret the delay in reply to your letter dated 5 June 1963.

With regard to the steel plant, plans of which were forwarded with your letter under reply, my predecessor wrote on this subject on 5 April 1963 to Mr. Baek, Jin Ki, Chief, National Construction Bureau, Pusan, requesting that certain observations should be taken into account when approval for the plant construction was given.

In effect, my predecessor's observations were that as the plant was scheduled for erection outside the United Nations Cemetery "Protected Area", we could not object to the site. Prevailing winds tend to blow from the Cemetery area toward the site; therefore the possibility of fumes being blown toward the Cemetery and causing damage to plant life appeared a minimum hazard. However, with regard to preserving the view from the Cemetery, it was suggested that the architect design an appropriate natural barrier, such as tall trees, which would hide the plant and yet afford a good view of the sea. Also, it might be suggested that the main chimney-stack is erected near the centre of the plant, where the generator house will be, or toward the southern sector of the site. It would then mean that this main projection would be partially concealed from sight by a hill which lays at the foot of the Cemetery.

I am very grateful to you for your thoughtfulness in affording us an opportunity to comment on the construction and also for your many kind expressions of interest in the past.
