1.B. ZAIRIAN/RWANDESE BORDER IS OPEN FOR ALL TRAFFIC EXCEPT UNAMIR PERSONNEL. NORMAL BORDER TRAFFIC BETWEEN UGANDAN / RWANDESE BORDER AT CYANIKA BORDERPOST.

1.C. THERE WAS A DEMONSTRATION AGAINST UN AGENCIES IN GOMA AT AROUND 1500H TODAY. A CROWD WENT AROUND THE TOWN TOUCHING ALL UN OFFICES AND MADE ITS WAY TOWARDS THE AIRPORT. FURTHER DETAILS BEING ASCERTAINED.

3.A. ONE TEAM PATROLLED ROUTE GISENYI - NYAMYUMBA 2006- RUGARARA 2195. THE PATROL COULD NOT PROCEED BEYOND GASHASHI 2201, DUE TO BAD ROAD CONDITIONS. THE ROAD RUNS PARALLEL TO THE LAKE KIVU AND IS ALMOST UNMOTORABLE DUE TO RAIN. THE SITUATION IS REPORTED TO BE NORMAL.

3.B. THE PREFECT OF RUHENGERI ADDRESSED IDPS IN NDUSU 6212. ONE MILOB TEAM ATTENDED. THE TEAM REPORTS A GATHERING OF ABOUT 3000 PEOPLE INCLUDING IDPS AND LOCALS. THE RALLY WAS ADDRESSED BY THE PREFECT, THE BOURGEMESTRES OF NDUSU AND GATONDE AND A RPA OFFICER. THE PREFECT IMPRESSED UPON THE IDPS TO GO BACK TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES AT THE SOONEST. IN FACT THEY HAVE BEEN GIVEN A WEEK TO GO BACK. OTHER ADMINISTRATIVE PROBLEMS OF THE LOCALS WERE ALSO DISCUSSED IN A QUESTION ANSWER SESSION. DETAILED REPORT WILL BE FORWARDED LATER. THE SITUATION IS BEING MONITORED BY MILOBS OVER THE COMING WEEK.

4. BULLDOZER TEAM FROM FORCE ENGINEERS , CONTINUES EXCAVATION OF GARBAGE PITS IN VICINITY OF THE COLLEGE RECEPTION CENTRE.

07 MAY 95


1. NDUSU COMMUNE 6213, HAS OVER THE PAST MONTH SEEN A GRADUAL CONCENTRATION OF IDPS DRIFTING IN FROM GENERAL AREA GITARAMA. THE FIGURES HAVE SWELLED marginally AFTER THE KIBAH0 INCIDENT. AS OF NOW THE FIGURE STANDS AT APPROXIMATELY 1000. IN THE PREVIOUS MONTH THERE HAD BEEN SOME ARRESTS AMONG THESE PEOPLE ON CHARGES OF GENOCIDE. THE SITUATION WAS BEING MONITORED BY THE HUMAN RIGHTS AND MILOBS. IT HAD BECOME ALLRIGHT. NOW WITH INCREASE IN THIS STRENGTH, THE AUTHORITIES HAVE SHOWN A GROWING CONCERN FOR THE LOT. THE PREFECT OF RUHENGARI PREFECTURE ALONG WITH THE MILITARY ARE ADDRESSING THE IDPS TODAY. A MILOB TEAM HAS BEEN SENT TO MONITOR THE SAME.

2. OUT OF THE 9000 OLD CASE LOADS PRESENTLY HOUSED IN THE COLLEGE RECEPTION CENTRE, 607 WERE RESETTLED IN GOVERNMENT LANDS AT MUTURA 3223 AND KANAMA 2712. LACK OF IOM TRANSPORT, WHICH HAS YET TO RETURN FROM KIBEHO/BUTARE AND THE SHORTAGE OF GOVERNMENT LAND FOR RESETTLEMENT HAS SLOWED DOWN THE RESETTLEMENT PROCESS TO A CONSIDERABLE EXTENT. THIS IS NOT DESIRABLE, CONSIDERING THE VOLATILE NATURE OF THESE PEOPLE. IN RUHENGARI PREFECTURE, THE AREAS AROUND KINIGI 5540 TO INCLUDE GIFUMBA 5243, NYARUGINA 4938 AND KABWENDE 5342 HAVE BEEN EARMARKED FOR RESETTLEMENT.

3. MEMISA AND MERLIN ARE CARRYING OUT ACTIVE INOCULATION PROGRAMME IN BOTH PREFECTURES.

4. MILOBS AND TUNBATT ASSISTED THE LOCAL GENDARMERIE TO EVACUATE A SERIOUSLY INJURED SOLDIER TO KIGALI HOSPITAL.

5. THE DIGGING OF GARBAGE PITS FOR THE COLLEGE RECEPTION CENTRE WITH FORCE ENGINEER BULLDOZER HAS COMMENCED.

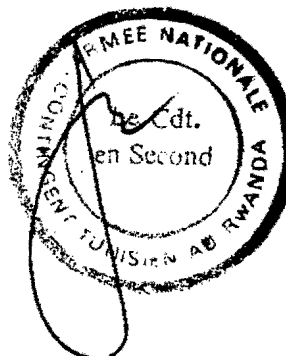

ADMITTANCE INTO A HOUSE IN THE CELLULE BIHE, SECTOR NYARUTEMA, COMMUNE MUTURA. THEY ROBBED 25 000 RF, A NEW RADIO-CASSETTES-RECORDER AND CLOTHES. IN ONE OF THE STOLEN SHIRTS WERE ANOTHER 10 000 RF. SECURITY PLAN :UNAMIR ,UN CIVILIANS AND NGOS
SECTOR 5,GISENYI

GENERAL

1. In the event of deteriorating in Sector 5 security alert measures will be activated in Sector 5. This instructions lays down the measures to be adopted under various conditions in order to ensure safety of all personnel working in Sector 5.
2. The plan denotes the following:-
 - a. Measures to counter the increased threat in the sector. This would involve the deployment of TUNBAT abinitio to protect the soft targets in Sector 5.
 - b. Individual and collective security measures to be taken to ensure security of all personnel in Sector 5.

THREAT

3. The current situation in the sector is calm. However in view of sudden spurt of rumors of likely escalated violence around the 06 April 95 in view of the anniversary of the WAR and the recent infiltrations in the border belt and in the areas around the volcanic forests, it is appreciated that this problem is likely to stay with us in this sector. Also this activity is a indication that the former RGF is in the process of regrouping and is trying to destabilise this region. This activity may be a preamble to a insurgency operation. The developing threat is unlikely to accord us the reaction time to activate the security measures which would be desirable and hence in view of the latent threat we must be alert at all times and ensure the security of personnel and the equipment entrusted in our care.
4. The threat to UN and NGO'S in Sector 5 is likely to be :
 - a. Insurgency threat aimed at the local administration, population and the RPA.
 - b. Attacks on the UN and NGO personnel /property.
5. The above mentioned threat is likely to develop as under:
 - a. Infiltration into Sector 5 assess the strength and capability of the RPA. This process is already under way as indicated by the activities over the past couple of weeks.
 - b. Ambushing of UNAMIR vehicles and property.





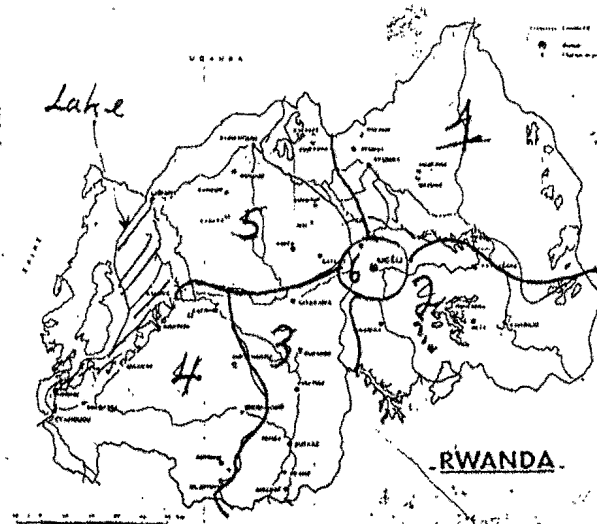

BULLETIN NO. 1

1. I am addressing all United Nations civilian, civil and military personnel in Rwanda with the objective of stressing the need to comply with Rwandese laws and regulations. It is also incumbent upon us to respect the cultural, traditional and social customs of the Rwandese People.
2. With regard to the official exchange rate for the Rwandese Franc, the Rwandese Government decreed a flexible exchange rate as of 6th March 1995. Currency must therefore be changed only through official channels. All personnel must avoid inducements to obtain local currency through private or unofficial channels.
3. I am concerned that United Nations privileges and immunities intended to assist officials in performing their official duties, are being misused. It has been brought to my attention, that some alcoholic beverages and electronic equipment have found their way into the open market. I deplore efforts to misuse the privilege for financial gain and should this trade continue, I shall not hesitate to stop duty-free imports of such items. United Nations personnel are requested to keep a meticulous check on duty-free imports and utilize them exclusively for their own use.
4. United Nations Personnel are also requested to drive with great care, to respect traffic laws and to observe speed regulations. Care must be taken not to drive following consumption of alcohol. Drivers not familiar with the rule of "priorité à droite" (priority from the right) are required to take a driving course from the Chief Transport Officer.

5. An increasing number of United Nations personnel are renting private residential accommodation. All rental agreements must be registered with UNAMIR for purposes of Security. In addition, an attestation should be obtained from the Prefecture prior to entering into any contractual arrangements.

6. Moreover, the Government's regulations must be respected in that rent should be paid to the real, approved owner of the house and not directly to a foreign bank in favour of a person with unchecked credentials. A visit to the corresponding Prefecture will ensure the correct ownership of the property.

7. Finally, all United Nations personnel are requested to respect the social and cultural customs of the Rwandese people, and United Nations Civilians are to abide by the Standards and Conduct of International Civil Servants and military personnel, by the Force Commander Directive's No.1. Conduct must always be dignified and respectful towards Rwandese citizens. Anyone who does not abide by these standards and behaves himself/herself in an unbecoming manner will be subject to disciplinary measures.

8. I am asking UNAMIR Military Police to keep a careful watch on all United Nations personnel's conduct regarding local traffic/driving regulations. UNAMIR Military Police has been empowered to take action against those drivers that are patently in breach of the law with respect to civilian staff, the Military Police have authority to detain only the vehicle of those suspected of driving under the influence of alcohol. In the event a staff member is suspected of drunken driving, the Military Police shall take custody of the vehicle, but drive the suspect to his/her residence before impounding the vehicle.

THE HOUSE DEBATED the Republicans' proposed spending cuts.

The GOP brought a \$17 billion spending-cut bill to the floor under rules that shield the Pentagon and force trade-offs for domestic programs. In an early test, Democrats were forced to join the GOP in guiding Clinton's national service program in order to protect veterans programs. The Republican leadership is using the bill to advance a conservative agenda, challenging the White House on behalf of business allies. (Article on Page A24)

Senate Republicans, confronted with a Democratic filibuster, abandoned their effort to block the president's new striker-protection policy.

Liberals and women's groups appealed to Clinton to resist political pressure to retreat on affirmative action. Senate Majority Leader Dole, meanwhile, said he would introduce legislation to ban the federal government from favoring minorities or women in any program.

The U.S. government has seized about \$9 million that authorities say belongs to Mexico's former top drug prosecutor, Mario Ruiz Massieu, officials said in Houston. Separately, Mexico's attorney general dropped charges against a man who was once accused of masterminding the assassination of Massieu's brother.

Agriculture subsidies benefit many suburban and city dwellers, as well as corporations and partnerships, computerized USDA data show. A Washington-based watchdog group has traced the flow of hundreds of millions of tax dollars to the off-the-farm farmers. (Article on Page A24)

Sinn Féin's leader was asked by the U.S. to take a new step toward peace in Northern Ireland by pushing the Irish Republican Army to scrap its weapons. But Gerry Adams said the next move was up to British leader Major. Meanwhile, Ireland's prime minister urged Clinton to intervene once more in the peace process.

The National Football League owners voted to reject the proposed move of the Los Angeles Rams to St. Louis, ending three days of debate on the issue. Only three of 29 owners backed the Rams, with six abstaining and 20 finding that the club failed to meet league criteria for approval. (Article on Page B14)

A definition of disabled was issued by the government, along with explanations of other terms, to help employers figure out their responsibilities under the Americans With Disabilities Act. The act, which went into effect in 1992, prohibits employers from discriminating against the disabled. (Article on Page B10)

Haiti said it asked the U.S. to extradite two militia leaders accused of killing and maiming hundreds of Haitians. Extradition requests for Emmanuel Constant and Louis Jodel Chamblain were sent to the Justice Department, Haitian officials said.

Using local blood banks is less costly than the increasingly popular practice of banking one's own blood for possible transfusion during surgery, according to a new study. Self-donated blood strains medical resources and offers society little benefit, the study concludes. (Article on Page B6)

Croatian leader Tudjman left for the U.S. to discuss details of his weekend decision to allow U.N. peacekeepers to remain in Croatia. Meanwhile, aid officials in Bosnia said hunger and malnutrition are rampant in the northwest Bihać pocket, where Serbs and their allies have blocked U.N. convoys.

Clinton aides Christopher and Lake want to ease sanctions against Cuba in exchange for reforms, but White House political strategists oppose such a move. Cuba's Castro, on a visit to France, rejected charges that his regime is repressive. He invited a French rights group to investigate conditions for political prisoners. (Article on Page A18)

Italy's Prime Minister Dini called a confidence vote in Parliament today to try to save his \$12 billion budget package, which includes a series of tax increases. If the ex-central banker loses the vote, his government will have to resign.

The Mandela government offered its first budget proposal, hoping to deliver on its promise to ease poverty. The plan raises taxes on the rich, sells oil reserves and shifts spending from defense to help pay for education and development programs.

THE HUMAN RIGHTS HAVE BEEN INFORMED AND THE CASES OF THE ARRESTS WILL BE INVESTIGATED IN DETAIL. THE TEAM WAS ACCOMPANIED BY A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS.

3.B. ONE MILOB TEAM PATROLLED THE AREAS OF GISENYI, BIGOGWE (3520), KINIGI (5440), NDUBI (4739), NYABIREHE (4629), KAREBA (4023) AND KORA (3821).
