SHORT REPORT OF THE GENERAL COORDINATION MEETING WITH HUMANITARIAN ASSISTANCE AGENCIES SATURDAY 11 JUNE AT UNOMUR HQ

1. THE MEETING WAS ATTENDED BY 35 PEOPLE FROM VARIOUS AGENCIES. ALSO MAJ RACINE AND MR. FLETCHER FROM THE HUMANITARIAN CELL OF UNAMIR, KIGALI. THE MEETING WAS PRESIDED BY MRS. MARSHA FEENEY OF UNREO.

2. THE MATTERS ON THE AGENDA WERE:

- SITREPS/MINUTES PREVIOUS MEETING
- TIMES OF VARIOUS MEETINGS
- CONSOLIDATED APPEAL
- WEEKLY ASSESSMENT
- NEEDS ASSESSMENT IN RPF TERRITORY
- INCENTIVES
- REPORTS/INCIDENTS REGARDING ACCESS AND SECURITY PROBLEMS
- ANY OTHER BUSINESS

3. DECIDED WAS THAT SECTORAL MEETINGS ARE TO BE HELD CLOSE TO THE GENERAL MEETING. SECTORAL MEETINGS WILL TAKE PLACE EVERY SATURDAY AT 18.30 HOURS AN THE GENERAL MEETING AT 19.30 HOURS. LOCATION: UNOMUR HQ. UNREO IS STILL LOOKING FOR OWN ACCOMMODATION.

4. CONSOLIDATED APPEAL:

ALTHOUGH THE DEADLINE FOR THE CONSOLIDATED APPEAL IS PASSED, APPLICATIONS FOR THE APPEAL ARE STILL POSSIBLE. UNREO WILL INTEGRATE THEM IN THE OVERALL APPEAL TO THE DONORS.

5. WEEKLY REPORT OF ASSESSMENTS AND NEEDS:

IF THE ACTIVITIES ARE NOT CENTRALISED IN CAMPS UT MORE IN AREA'S ALSO TO FORWARD THESE DATA.

6. NEEDS ASSESSMENT IN RPF TERRITORY:

MR. FLETCHER OF HUMANITARIAN CELL UNAMIR ADDRESSED THE AGENCIES TO VOLUNTEER FOR A GENERAL NEEDS ASSESSMENT THAT WILL BE DONE IN THE RPF TERRITORY. AIM IS TO PREPARE SOME INTERDISCIPLINARY ASSESSMENT TEAMS THAT COVER THE AREA IN A SHORT TIME. PARTICULARLY THE AREA'S OUTSIDE THE CAMPS AND THE CAMPS WHICH ARE NOT YET COVERED BY AGENCIES. VOLUNTARY AGENCIES ARE ASKED TO JOIN A MORE DETAILED MEETING ON 12 JUNE AT 09.00 HOURS.

7. INCENTIVES.

A SPECIFIC MEETING ON INCENTIVES DRAFTED A PROPOSAL FOR LEVELLING THE INCENTIVES GIVEN TO LOCAL WORKERS WHO DO WORK FOR AGENCIES IN RWANDA. SOME POINTS NEED TO BE WORKED OUT MORE DETAILED, E.G. THE MATTER OF FIRING PEOPLE IF THEY ARE NOT ABLE. FORMAL CONTRACTS ARE NOT TO BE MADE WITH THE WORKERS. THEY WILL NOT BE PAID THEY WILL RECEIVE SOME NECESSARY GOODS. THE PROPOSAL CONSISTS OF TWO PARTS: THE FIRST PART IS EASY TO HANDLE SMALL ITEMS AN THE SECOND PART ARE BULKY FOODSTUFF. DECIDED IS THAT FOR A START ALL AGENCIES WILL GIVE

SMALL ITEMS LIKE SUGAR, SALT AND SOAP TO THE WORKERS. IN A SECOND STAGE THEY WILL ALSO GIVE MAIZE, BEANS AND OIL. WITH THE SMALL ITEMS THE AGENCIES CAN START AFTER ONE WEEK, THE MATTER HAS TO BE DISCUSSED WITH RPF BY UNREO. THE BULKY FOOD WILL FOLLOW LATER SINCE THE LOGISTICAL PROBLEMS ARE TO BE SOLVED. WFP AND ATLAS ARE WILLING TO PROVIDE REQUIRED LOGISTICAL SUPPORT. NGO'S HAVE TO FORWARD REQUIRED DATA LIKE NO. OF WORKERS AND AMOUNTS OF FOOD TO BE REALIZED.

8. SECURITY AND ACCESS.

IT IS REQUIRED THAT AGENCIES CAN GET BASIC SECURITY INFORMATION BEFORE THEY ACTUALLY ENTER THE AREA IN WHICH THEY WORK. TO IMPROVE THE SITUATION AN INFOSYSTEM HAS TO BE ESTABLISHED AT THE BORDER. 4. LET US TREAT THIS INCIDENT AS AN EXCELLENT LEARNING EXPERIENCE AND NOT HAVE ANY FURTHER REPETITION IN THE FUTURE.

DURING THE REPORTING PERIOD OUR PATROLS WERE GOING ON AS SCHEDULED. WE HAVE CONDUCTED FIFTY NINE (59) PATROLS AS FOLLOWS: FORTY FIVE (45) DAY PATROLS,

INCLUDING TWO BOAT PATROLS AT LAKE BUYONYI WHICH WERE CARRIED OUT WITHOUT ANY PROBLEM; FOURTEEN (14) NIGHT PATROLS. IN THE EAST AREA ALL THE NIGHT PATROLS WERE SENT TO THE LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE AREA.

GENERALLY IT SEEMS THAT THE FLOW OF THE REFUGEES FROM UGANDA TO RWANDA IS DECREASING. THIS FACT CAN BE A RESULT OF THE MEETING BETWEEN THE CMO AND 2ND DIVISION COMMANDER AT MBARARA. HOWEVER, WE CONTINUE TO MONITOR ACTIVITIES IN THOSE SPECIFIC AREAS.

ROTATION

THE ZIMBABWE CONTINGENT WILL ROTATE SHORTLY. AT THE END OF FEBRUARY (22ND) THE NEW CONTINGENT

WILL PROBABLY ARRIVE. IN THE BEGINNING OF MARCH (3RD), THE OLD CONTINGENT WILL DEPART.

THE NETHERLANDS CONTINGENT WILL ALSO ROTATE SHORTLY. THE NEW CONTINGENT WILL ARRIVE IN THE BEGINNING OF MARCH (2ND AND 7TH PROBABLY) AND THE OLD CONTINGENT WILL DEPART ON THE 10TH OF MARCH.

ORGANIZATION

A NEW PLAN FOR THE ORGANIZATION OF UNOMUR HAS BEEN MADE. IN THIS NEW ORGANIZATION, HQ AREA EAST NO LONGER EXISTS, HQ AREA WEST IS SMALLER AND A TENTH TEAM HAS BEEN CREATED. BECAUSE OF THE ROTATIONS OF TWO CONTINGENTS THIS ORGANIZATION WILL BE IN EFFECT IMMEDIATELY AFTER THE DEPARTURE OF THE OLD NETHERLANDS CONTINGENT.

VISITS

RECENTLY UNOMUR WAS VISITED BY THE DFC OF UNAMIR, A THREE MAN DELEGATION FROM THE NETHERLANDS ARMY HQ AND A GROUP OF MILITARY ATTACHÉS. FROM 2 TO 8 MARCH UNOMUR WILL BE VISITED BY THE DEPUTY COMMANDER OF THE BOTSWANA DEFENCE FORCE.

(3) MEDICAL SITUATION

ALL OUR MILITARY AND CIVIL PERSONNEL ARE HEALTHY. THE REPAIR OF THE VOLKSWAGEN AMBULANCE IS GOING TO BE FINISHED ONLY SMALL ACHIEVEMENTS ARE MISSING.

3. VIOLATIONS, INCIDENTS AND COMPLAINTS

IN THE 17 FEBRUARY 1994 THE NRA SOLDIERS AT NKURUNGURA (WEST AREA) FIRED THREE (3) ROUND AT THE SMUGGLERS WHO WERE SMUGGLING CLOTHES AND ARRESTED ONE (1) SMUGGLER.

4. POLITICAL

VICIOUS CA CAMPAIGNS STILL IN PROGRESS, IN KABALE 3 OUT 15 CANDIDATES ARE STILL EFFECTIVE. KAMPALA BASED INTELLECTUALS ARE STILL UNHAPPY WITH NRM CLAMP DOWN ON POLITICAL PARTIES. REVIVAL OF CHEAP POLITICKING GAINING MOMENTUM, AS THE RACE DRAWS TO AN END. AT PRESENT UNCLEAR IF NRM WILL HAVE AN OVERWHELMING MAJORITY. AN ULTIMATUM BY PRESIDENT MUSEVENI FOR THE REBELS (KARIMAJONG) TO SURRENDER THEIR WEAPONS WAS COMPLETELY IGNORED.

5. ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

COMMAND POST CONSTRUCTION OF COMMAND POST HAS BEEN COMPLETED IN AREA WEST. AREA WEST WILL REQUIRE NEW FURNITURE, OFFICE EQUIPMENTS ETC. FOR THE OFFICE. REQUISITION FOR THESE THINGS HAS ALREADY BEEN PLACED.

CONSTRUCTION AT LUBIRIZI IS MOVING AT A SNAILS' PACE. CONTRACTOR UNABLE TO MEET THE AGREED DEADLINE AND AS A RESULT OPERATIONS ADVERSELY AFFECTED NEW SAO ACTIVELY PURSUING THE ISSUE. MANNING OF LUBIRIZI HIGH PRIORITY TO ENSURE CONFIDENCE IS GENERATED IN THE INTEREST OF PEACE.

VHF COMMUNICATIONS STILL UNSATISFACTORY EVEN AFTER THE INSTALLATION OF THE FIRST REPEATER STATION, RECCE FOR A SUITABLE POSITION ON HIGH GROUND TO INSTAL THE 2ND REPEATER STATION CONCLUDED BUT HELICOPTER TO LIFT REPEATER STATION TO HILL TOP, UNAVAILABLE, AS RESULT NO PROGRESS HAS SO FAR BEEN MADE. THE AREAS WHICH ARE AFFECTED ARE KAMWEZI/LUBIRIZI/KASHEKYE/MBALE. NIGHT PATROLS VERY DIFFICULT IF NOT IMPOSSIBLE, AS THIS ENTAILS CLIMBING STEEP HILLS WITH DANGEROUS. CARNIVOROUS ANIMALS FOR COMMUNICATIONS PURPOSES, DESPITE, HARSHIPS PATROLS SOLDIERING ON WITH HIGH MORAL.

6. LIAISON, CONTACTS AND MEDIA

THE DFC'S PLANE FROM KIGALI TOUCHED THE RUNAWAY AT EXACTLY 1235 HRS ON 11 FEBRUARY 1994 AND THE SENIOR OFFICER EMERGED OUT OF THE SMALL RWANDESE AIRCRAFT FLANKED BY TWO UNAMIR OFFICERS. HE WAS MET AT THE VIP LOUNGE BY THE A/CMD UNOMUR, AFTER THE AIRPORT CLEARANCE PROCEDURES WERE CONCLUDED WAS DRIVEN STRAIGHT TO KAMPALA'S SHERATON HOTEL WHERE HE CHECKED IN.

AT 1500 HRS THE SAME DAY, THE DFC MET THE RES REP. AT THE UNDP OFFICES AND LATER THE DFC MET THE RWANDESE AMBASSADOR AT THEIR EMBASSY AND THE ITINERARY FOR THE DAY ENDED UP WITH A MEETING WITH THE NIGERIAN HIGH COMMISSIONER. ALL THE MEETINGS WERE HELD IN AN UNBELIEVABLY PLEASANT AND ENCOURAGING ATMOSPHERE.

THE NEXT DAY 12 FEBRUARY 1994, AT 0630 HRS, THE DFC LEFT KAMPALA FOR KABALE AND ON THE WAY VISITED LUBIRIZI CP1/KAMWEZI/KASHEKYE AND ON ARRIVAL AT KABALE MISSION HQ, THE 2ND DIVISION (NRA) COMMANDER WAS PRESENT TO MEET THE SENIOR OFFICER ACCOMPANIED BY THE 309 BRIGADE COMMANDER. THE DA KABALE DID THE SAME IN AT THE HOTEL LATER IN THE EVENING. THE DFC WAS BRIEFED AT THE UNOMUR HQ AND LATER IN THE AFTERNOON, HE VISITED KATUNA BUT WAS UNABLE TO GET TO BIGAGA BECAUSE OF THE BAD WEATHER. DFC SPENT A NIGHT IN THE KABALE WHITE HORSE INN, IN THE MORNING 0530 HRS 13 FEBRUARY 1994 LEFT KABALE FOR KISORO/KYANIKA RETURNING TO KABALE ABOUT MID DAY. AND DEPARTED KABALE FOR KAMPALA ON THE WAY BRANCHED OFF TO NAKIVALE REFUGEE CAMP EAST OF MBARARA,

THE DFC DELIBERATED USEFUL INFORMATION ABOUT THE REFUGEES WITH THE COMMANDANT OF THE REFUGEE CAMP. AFTER AN HOUR IN THE REFUGEE CAMP, THE DFC CONTINUED HIS TRIP TO KAMPALA SHERATON HOTEL WHERE HAD A REST FOR THE NIGH.

THE DFC FIRST MEETING WAS WITH THE FRENCH AMBASSADOR AT 1000 HRS FOLLOWED BY BRITISH HIGH COMMISSIONER. AT 1500 HRS THE DFC MET THE AMERICAN EMBASSY. AT 1700 HRS THE DFC MET THE ARMY COMD. NRA. THE DFC'S PROGRAMME FOR THE 14 FEBRUARY WAS CONCLUDED BY A FORMAL DINER HOSTED BY THE NIGERIAN AMBASSADOR. A/CMO DELIBERATELY LEFT OUT THE COMMENTS ON THE SENIOR OFFICER'S VISIT ASSUMING THAT EVERYTHING WILL BE HIGHLIGHTED IN HIS (DFC'S) REPORT.

7. OBSERVATIONS

THERE IS DRASTIC DECREASE OF REFUGEES CROSSING FROM UGANDA TO RWANDA.

THE HQ OPS STAFF HAVE AUGMENTED THE PATROL EFFORT BY CONDUCTING DEPTH PATROLS UP TO MIRAMA HILLS (BORDER POST WITH RWANDA).

IN AREA WEST RANDOM DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS HAVE ALSO BEEN CONDUCTED, AS WELL AS DEPTH PATROLS TO THE ZAIRIAN

BORDER. OUR PATROLS COULD NOT GET ANY INFORMATION ABOUT REFUGEES CROSSING INTO UGANDA AS REPORTED BY THE MEDIA.

THE AMBULANCE HAS BEEN REPAIRED BUT A RED CROSS STILL HAS TO BE PAINTED ON IT. THE MEDICAL OFFICER TOOK A TOUR OF THE OPERATIONAL TO ASSESS THE ACCESSIBILITY OF THE ROUTES BY THE NON-4X4 AMBULANCE. HE DISCOVERED THAT THE ROUTES WOULD BE VERY DIFFICULT, PARTICULARLY DURING RAINY PERIODS.

FLYING ALONG THE BORDER. A FORMAL COMPLAINT BY UNOMUR HQ HAS BEEN MADE THROUGH THE NRA CHIEF LIAISON OFFICER, SUGGESTING THAT HE BE REMOVED FROM THE POST.

3. VIOLATIONS, INCIDENTS AND COMPLAINTS

THE SHIPMENT OF COW HORNS BY RPF HAS CONTINUED UNABATED DURING THE REPORTING PERIOD. THE INCIDENT OF AN EARTH TREMOUR OCCURRED AT APPROXIMATELY 060300C LT, THE BBC LATER REPORTED THAT THE TREMOR HAD AFFECTED, ZAIRE AND RWANDA AS WELL AND MEASURED 6,4 ON THE RICHTER SCALE. TWO PEOPLE ARE REPORTED TO HAVE DIED IN NORTH WESTERN UGANDA, AS WELL AS A LOT OF DAMAGE TO PROPERTY.

4. POLITICAL

THE CA CAMPAIGNS ARE STILL IN PROGRESS BUT WITHOUT ANY REPORTED INCIDENTS. RECENTLY, THE OPPOSITION WEEKLY (THE MONITOR) REPORTED THE POLITICAL WRANGLE BETWEEN THE RULING NATIONAL RESISTANCE MOVEMENT (NRM) AND OTHER POLITICAL PARTIES, WHERE THE NRM ORDERED THE BAN OF OLD POLITICAL PARTIES. THERE IS NO CLEAR OUTCOME YET.

5. ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

THE SECOND REPEATER STATION IS NOT YET INSTALLED. OTHER LOG PROBLEMS ARE AS REFLECTED IN OUR LAST WEEKS SITREP.

6. LIAISON, CONTACTS AND MEDIA

ON 01 FEBRUARY 1994, THE A/CMO HAD A LIAISON MEETING WITH THE NRA 2ND DIVISION COMD BASED IN MBARARA. THE MEETING VERY FRUITFUL. FOR MORE DETAILS, SEE OUR WEEKLY INFORMATION SUMMARY NO.7 DATED 6 FEBRUARY 1994.

7. OBSERVATIONS

THE NON ARRIVAL OF HELICOPTERS IS PULLING OUR OPERATIONS BACK, AS DEPLOYMENT OF MY PATROLS BY HELIS WOULD BE GREATLY COMPLIMENT, OUR AILING TRANSPORT FLEET. PERIOD IN QUESTION ACTIVITY PACKED, IT IS MY INTENTION TO LEAVE NO STONE UNTURNED, EVEN WITH INADEQUATE RESOURCES BUT WOULD BE MUCH HAPPIER IF THIS ISSUE IS URGENTLY SOLVED.

WITH RAMADAN CLOSE, MY MOSLEM OFFICERS ALREADY LOOKING FORWARD TO IT, AND WHERE POSSIBLE WILL EXERCISE FLEXIBILITY BUT NOT AT THE DETRIMENT OF OPERATIONS.

IN THE EAST AREA SIX (6) MOBILE PATROLS WERE CONVERTED INTO FOOT PATROLS. THE WHOLE LAST WEEK WE MANAGED TO COVER LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE AREA CONTINUOUSLY EMPLOYING FOUR TEAMS. DUE TO THE VEHICLE PROBLEM, THREE (3) BORDER PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED BY THE KATUNA CP TO KAFUNZO CP4 AND BIGAGA CP2.

GENERALLY, IT SEEMS THAT LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE AREA IS CONFIRMED AS A CROSSING POINT FOR REFUGEES. SO FAR, APPROXIMATELY ONE HUNDRED (100) REFUGEES CROSSED THE BORDER TO RWANDA IN THIS PARTICULAR AREA. SOME OF THEM CAME WITH OFFICIAL CERTIFICATES ISSUED BY THE UGANDAN AUTHORITIES IN MBARARA. OFFICIAL STATEMENT WAS ISSUED THROUGH THE UGANDAN RADIO AND NEWS PAPERS, SAYING THAT, THE RWANDESE REFUGEES SHOULD BE ALLOWED TO RETURN TO THEIR COUNTRY, UGANDA IS NOT A DUMPING GROUND.

IT HAS BEEN OBSERVED THAT AN NRA SENIOR NCO IS INTERFERING WITH OUR UNMOS ACTIVITIES AT KATUNA. THE MATTER IS HOWEVER BEING LOOKED INTO THROUGH THE NRA LIAISON OFFICERS, ANY DEVELOPMENTS WILL BE COMMUNICATED TO YOU.

3. VIOLATIONS, INCIDENTS AND COMPLAINTS

THE SHIPMENT BY THE RPF OF LARGE QUANTITIES OF COW HORNS REFLECTED IN ONE OF OUR PREVIOUS SITREPS IS STILL A CAUSE FOR CONCERN, THE FACT THAT THEY ARE MOVED IN LARGE QUANTITIES INDICATES THAT THEY COULD BE USED FOR SOMETHING CARRIERS OR TRANSPORTERS OF COW HORNS, NOT WILLING TO DISCLOSE REASON. MOVEMENT OF 64 MALE AND 5 FEMALE PERSONS FROM TRAINING SCHOOL IN MBARARA HAS RAISED A LOT OF EYE BROWS. ALTHOUGH, NO TANGIBLE PROOF WAS FOUND, IT IS STRONGLY SUSPECTED THAT THEY ARE REINFORCEMENTS FOR THE RPF.

4. POLITICAL

CA ELECTIONS ARE STILL GOING ON. ON 26 JANUARY THE LIBERATION DAY WAS CELEBRATED, THE A/CMO AND THE AVAILABLE UNMOS WERE PRESENT IN KABALE FOOTBALL STADIUM FOR THIS CELEBRATION. THE SECOND GROUP OF 170 NRA SOLDIERS DEPARTED ON 25 JANUARY FOR LIBERIA AS PART OF THE ECOMOG FORCES IN THAT COUNTRY.

5. ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

REPEATER STATION. INTENSIVE RECCE PATROLS WERE CONDUCTED TO FIND THE MOST SUITABLE LOCATION OF THE SECOND REPEATER STATION HAVING AN ALMOST DIRECT LINE OF SIGHT BETWEEN THE MISSION HQ AND THE LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE AREA. THE OPTIMUM PLACE WAS FOUND TO BE AN UNKNOWN HILL GRID RJ 130633 CLOSE TO KINYINYA VILLAGE. FROM THAT POINT WE HAD A VERY STRONG SIGNAL COVERING THE WHOLE AREA WEST AND EAST WITHOUT ANY PROBLEM. AFTER SOME SERIOUS

CONSIDERATIONS AND ACCORDING TO THE RADIO TECHNICIAN AND OUR SIGNALS QUALIFIED OFFICERS, THE OPTION WAS TO CONDUCT THE RECCE BY HELICOPTER SUPPORT.

CAMERAS. OUR REQUEST FOR CAMERAS HAS NOT YET BEEN MET. THESE ARE VERY ESSENTIAL FOR VERY OBVIOUS REASONS.

AGEING VEHICLE FLEET CONSTANTLY BREAKING DOWN, AS A RESULT BADLY AFFECTING OUR OPERATIONS, HOWEVER RESPONSE BY FOD ON THE SUBJECT GIVES HOPE.

FLAK JACKETS AND COMBAT HELMETS PATIENTLY AWAITED.

6. LIAISON, CONTACTS AND MEDIA

THE A/CMO ATTENDED HIS ROUTINE MEETING WITH THE DA OF KABALE AND THE NRA BRIGADE COMMANDER AS WELL. DETAILS IN HIS SPECIAL REPORT.

A/CMO, CONTINUING WITH HIS LIAISON MEETINGS, WILL BE TRAVELLING TO MEET THE NRA DIV COMD, AT HIS DIV HQ IN MBARARA ON THE 01 FEBRUARY 1994.

A SOCIAL SOCCER GAME WAS PLAYED BETWEEN A LOCAL POLICE TEAM AND OUR UNMOS' TEAM. THE RESULT WAS A PLEASING 3-2 IN FAVOUR OF OUR TEAM. MORE GAMES WILL CONTINUE TO BE ARRANGED IN FUTURE.

7. OBSERVATIONS

THE NON ARRIVAL OF HELICOPTERS IS PULLING OUR OPERATIONS BACK, AS DEPLOYMENT OF MY PATROLS BY HELIS WOULD BE GREATLY COMPLIMENT, OUR AILING TRANSPORT FLEET. PERIOD IN QUESTION ACTIVITY PACKED, IT IS MY INTENTION TO LEAVE NO STONE UNTURNED, EVEN INADEQUATE RESOURCES BUT WOULD BE MUCH HAPPIER IF THIS ISSUE IS URGENTLY SOLVED.

WITH RAMADAN CLOSE, MY MOSLEM OFFICERS ALREADY LOOKING FORWARD TO IT, AND WHERE POSSIBLE WILL EXERCISE FLEXIBILITY BUT NOT AT THE DETRIMENT OF OPERATIONS.

THE RUMOUR IS THAT THERE ARE SOME YOUTHS WHO HAVE BEEN TASKED TO PRICK CERTAIN PEOPLE WITH POISONOUS NEEDLES. THE VICTIMS ONCE ADMINISTERED, DIE AFTER COUPLE HOURS. THE AFFECTED AREAS ARE SAID TO BE MBARARA AND KABALE BUT THE RUMOUR IS ALL OVER THE COUNTRY. FROM OTHER SOURCES, THIS RUMOUR SEEM TO HAVE SOME POLITICAL OVERTONES, AS THE RACE TOWARDS THE CA ELECTIONS DRAWS TOWARDS THE END. ONE PERSON

(KATUNA) WILL BE REINFORCED WITH AN EXTRA 4X4 VEHICLE, SO THAT THE KATUNA TEAM WILL BE ABLE TO CARRY OUT DAILY PATROL^S_A IN SUBZONE E-3 (FOCUSING BIGAGA), SUBZONE E2 (REAR PATROL) AND F2 SUBZONE (UP TO KAFUNZO). INTERVIEWS CONDUCTED ON THE ISSUE TO THE LOCAL MEDICAL DOCTORS INDICATE THAT THE RUMOUR IS LIVE BUT CONFIRMATION OF THE SICK AND DEAD IS A PROBLEM. THE NATIONAL PAPERS CARRIED ARTICLES ON THE SUBJECT BUT NO CONCLUSIVE INFORMATION HAS COME TO LIGHT.

5. ADMINISTRATIVE AND LOGISTICAL SUPPORT

REPEATER STATION. EXTENSIVE GROUND RECCE IS BEING CARRIED OUT IN THE GENERAL AREA OF KAMWEZI AND LUBIRIZI TO INSTALL A SECOND REPEATER STATION. THIS HILLY AREA IS GIVING GREAT PROBLEMS TO COVER THE WHOLE AREA, AND ALSO THE DEAD GROUND.

FROM ANGOLA TOO OLD AND SPARES A PROBLEM TO FIND IN KABALE LET ALONE IN UGANDA AS A WHOLE. STRONGLY REQUEST YOU TREAT THIS ISSUE AS URGENT.

KYANIKA AND KATUNA CONTINUE TO BE MANNED ON 24/7 BASE. THE LOGISTIC ON BOTH POSTS IS GETTING MORE AND MORE SATISFACTORY; ONLY SOME MINOR REPAIRS HAVE TO BE DONE. AT LUBIRIZI, CONSTRUCTIONS HAS EARNESTLY STARTED BUT AT A SLOW PACE. THE CONSTRUCTOR HAS HOWEVER, PROMISED THAT THE CONSTRUCTION WILL BE READY BY THE 10 FEBRUARY.

(3) PATROLS

WHEN WE INVESTIGATED THE SITUATION THE WIFE OF THE BOAT OWNER SAID THAT HER HUSBAND HAD GONE TO KAMPALA FROM WHERE HE WOULD GO OUTSIDE UGANDA. FURTHERMORE, ONE OF OUR AREA EAST PATROLS FOUND A 5 TON LORRY AT KAMWEZI MARKET AT 10:30 HRS. THE LORRY WAS STUCK IN MUD DUE TO BAD ROAD CONDITIONS. THE PATROL ENQUIRED FROM THE DRIVER THE NATURE OF HIS CONSIGNMENT AND WHERE HE WAS GOING TO. THE DRIVER REPLIED THAT HE WAS CARRYING MAIZE AND HE WAS GOING TO RWANDA. WHEN THE PATROL ASKED HIM WHY HE WAS USING SUCH BAD ROADS, HE REPLIED THAT HE KNEW BETTER HOW AND WHERE TO GO. REALIZING THE SITUATION THE PATROL IMMEDIATELY WENT TO THE NRA BATTALION AND MET THE COMMANDING OFFICER MAJOR KAMORIRI. HE ORGANIZED SOME SOLDIERS AND TRIED TO GO NEAR TO THE 5 TONNER BUT BY THEN THE LORRY STARTED MOVING TOWARDS THE BORDER. THE

CO (MAJOR KAMORIR) STOPPED THE VEHICLE AND CHECKED IT LIGHTLY AND OPENING A PART OF THE OUTER COVER, HE THEN SAID TO US THE VEHICLE WAS CARRYING MAIZE. THE PATROL TRIED TO LET THE NRA CHECK THE VEHICLE AGAIN AT KASHEKYE POST. THEY DID NOT SUCCEED BECAUSE THE DRIVER TOLD THE NRA GUARD THAT IT WAS A RED CROSS VEHICLE CARRYING FOOD, SO THE GUARDS DID NOT CHECK IT. THE VEHICLE THEN CROSSED THE BORDER HURRIEDLY INTO RWANDA. THE DRIVER WAS FRENCH SPEAKING, THE TRUCK NUMBER WAS UPB 737 THE COLOR OF THE TRUCK IS ORANGE. SINCE THE TRUCK CROSSED THE BORDER HURRIEDLY AND THE NRA DID NOT CHECKED THE TRUCK FULLY, SO THERE IS A POSSIBILITY THAT THE TRUCK WAS CARRYING UNAUTHORIZED EQUIPMENT. ON WEDNESDAY 15 JANUARY 1994 AT LUBIRIZI AREA THE RGF AND RPF EXCHANGED SOME MORTAR ROUNDS. THE NRA TROOPS IN THE AREA REMAINED CALM.

CA ELECTIONS ARE IN PROGRESS. VICIOUS CAMPAIGNS ARE GOING ON WITHOUT ANY INCIDENTS. A NUMBER OF OBSERVERS FROM THE EMBASSIES ARE NOW IN THE AREA.

(3) PATROL

OUR AREA EAST PATROLS ARE GOING ON AS SCHEDULED. ANOTHER BOAT PATROL IN LAKE BUNYONYI WAS CARRIED OUT ON 5 JANUARY 1994 BUT NOTHING SIGNIFICANT WAS DETECTED. THE NRA CHIEF LIAISON OFFICER'S ARGUMENTS ON THE MATTER WERE DISCUSSED AND THE ISSUE WAS AMICABLY SOLVED - OUR LAST WEEK'S SITREP REFERS. ALSO OUR DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS IN THE LUBIRIZI-KASHEKYE AREAS HAVE CONTINUED TO OBSERVE VEHICLES AND FRESH TRACKS LEADING TO RWANDA BUT THE NRA AT KASHEKYE HAVE BEEN REFUSING THE FACT THAT THESE VEHICLES WERE CROSSING THROUGH THEIR POST. THIS COMPLAINT HAS BEEN TAKEN UP WITH THE NRA CHIEF LIAISON OFFICER, WHO PROMISED TO SOLVE THE ISSUE WITH THE NRA COMMANDERS OF THE GROUND. THERE HAS NOT BEEN ANY SERIOUS INCREASE IN MOVEMENT IN THE BIGAGA AREA BUT WE ARE KEEPING AN EAGLE'S EYE IN THE AREA. RECENTLY, OUR AREA WEST FOOT PATROL - OBSERVING FROM THE VUGAMBA RANGE APPROXIMATELY AREA OF GRID SQUARE RJ 1050 - MANAGED TO IDENTIFY ANOTHER RPF CAMP INSIDE RWANDA AT KAGOGO. ELSEWHERE IN AREA WEST IS VERY QUITE. THE LONG PROMISED HELICOPTERS, HAVE NOT YET ARRIVED. IT IS OUR WISH TO SEE OUR PATROLS HAVING MORE TEETH. WE STILL REMAIN OPTIMISTIC THAT THE HELICOPTERS WILL ARRIVE SOME DAY.



THE STATIC OP/CP AT CYANIKA AND KATUNA CONTINUE TO BE MANNED ON A 24/7 BASIS. NOTHING IMPORTANT HAS BEEN FOUND AFTER OUR THOROUGH SEARCHES OF VEHICLES THAT CROSS INTO RWANDA AT KATUNA. THE OP/CP AT LUBIRIZI IS STILL UNDER CONSTRUCTION AND FROM THE LOOK OF THINGS, IT MIGHT BE READY FOR PERMANENT OCCUPATION BY THE END OF THIS MONTH OR MAYBE EARLY NEXT MONTH.

(3) PATROLS

THE DCMO, COO, AND AREA EAST OPERATIONS OFFICER CONDUCTED THE VERY FIRST BOAT PATROL ON LAKE BUNYONYI ON 31 DEC 93, HOWEVER, THE NRA CHIEF LO SEEMED A LITTLE APPREHENSIVE, ARGUING THAT THE LAKE WAS NOT ON THE COMMON BORDER WITH RWANDA. AREA EAST PATROLS HAVE CONTINUOUSLY FOUND FRESH TRACKS COMING FROM A NRA CAMP IN THE LUBIRIZI - KASHEKYE AREA GOING ACROSS INTO RWANDA THROUGH MBALE. THE NRA HAVE BEEN INTERVIEWED BY OUR MILOBS IN CONNECTION WITH THE MATTER, BUT THEY HAVE REFUSED THE FACT. OUR DAY AND NIGHT PATROLS CONTINUE TO BE CONCENTRATED IN THE AREA, AND ALSO IN THE BIGAGA AREA.

AREA WEST PATROLS HAVE BEEN MAINLY CONCENTRATED IN THE BORDER AREAS OF LAKE CHAHAFY, NKURUNGURU AND LUGENDABARE BUT NOTHING SIGNIFICANT HAS BEEN DISCOVERED. OUR HELICOPTER PATROLS HAVE NOT TAKEN OFF THE GROUND SINCE WE ARE STILL AWAITING THE ARRIVAL OF THE HELICOPTER(S) ON 07 JAN 94 AS EARLIER PROMISED.

C. RELATIONS WITH NRA

OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH NRA IS GOOD. THE BIGGEST PROBLEM STILL REMAINS THAT THEY DON'T HAVE THE LOGISTICS TO SUSTAIN OUR OPERATIONS - AND AS SUCH - WE HAVE HAD TO CONTINUE CARRYING THEM ON UN CARS WHEN GOING OUT ON PATROL.

4. POLITICAL

IN THE REPORTING PERIOD, A HIGH POWERED BURUNDI DELEGATION VISITED UGANDA AT THE INVITATION OF PRESIDENT MUSEVENI. THE DELEGATION IS REPORTED TO HAVE BEEN EXCHANGING VIEWS ON THE POLITICAL AND SECURITY SITUATION IN BURUNDI. SEE UNOMUR INTSUM FOR PERIOD 26 DEC 93 TO 02 JAN 94.

5. ADMIN AND LOG SUPPORT

THE COMMS REPEATER STATION RECENTLY INSTALLED, IS NOT SUFFICIENTLY COVERING THE WHOLE OPERATIONAL AREA. THERE IS A NEED FOR A SECOND REPEATER STATION. ONCE INSTALLED, YOUR HQ WILL BE INFORMED ACCORDINGLY. LAST WEEK WE COULD NOT COMMUNICATE UNAMIR HQ BY TELEPHONE, MAYBE DUE TO BAD TELEPHONE LINES. ALSO, RADIOS INSTALLED IN OUR 4X4 CARS HAVE TO BE RE-PROGRAMED IN ORDER TO ACHIEVE PROPER COMMUNICATIONS THROUGH THE REPEATER/RELAY STATION. THE NECESSARY TOOLS FOR

THE RE-PROGRAMMING SHOULD BE SENT TO US AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

6. LIAISON, CONTACTS AND MEDIA

UNOMUR STAFF (BOTH THE MILITARY AND THE CIVILIANS) ORGANISED A SUCCESSFUL NEW YEAR'S EVE PARTY AT WHICH THE IMPORTANT LOCAL AUTHORITIES WERE INVITED. THE OCCASION HAPPENED IN A VERY RELAXED ATMOSPHERE AND WOUND UP WITHOUT ANY INCIDENT.

7. OBSERVATIONS

SINCE WEEKLY SITREP No 06 FROM UNAMIR HQ, WE HAVE NOT GOT ANY FURTHER INFORMATION ABOUT THE DEVELOPING AND/OR OVERALL SITUATION IN RWANDA. WE WISH TO BE KEPT ABREAST OF THE SITUATION BECAUSE OF ITS INFLUENCE ON OUR OPERATIONS. WE WOULD BE MOST GRATEFUL TO RECEIVE THE INFORMATION REGULARLY.
