ACTION FOR SUBMISSION TO GENERAL ASSEMBLY. REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON NEGOTIATIONS SHOULD INCLUDE DRAFT AGREEMENTS WITH FUND BANK AND PICAQ. SUGGEST THAT COMMITTEE MEET AUGUST TWENTYEIGHTH TO NEGOTIATE AGREEMENTS. ITEMS FOUR TO TEN WERE DEFERRED TO THIRD SESSION OF COUNCIL AND POSITIVE ACTION SHOULD BE TAKEN THEREON. ITEMS ELEVEN AND FOURTEEN LEAST URGENT. NGO COMMITTEE SHOULD REPORT AT THIRD SESSION TO REGULARIZE POSITION OF VARIOUS ORGANIZATIONS. PROPOSE THAT COMMITTEE MEET AUGUST TWENTYSEVENTH. IT WOULD BE DESIRABLE TO HAVE COUNCIL RECOMMENDATION ON ITEM THIRTEEN FOR CONSIDERATION BY GENERAL ASSEMBLY COMMITTEE ON BUDGET.

Subject: Agenda of the next session of the Economic and  
Social Council

1. In relation to the work of this Division, the Economic and Social Council will probably have to consider and to take action on two questions:

a. Draft agreements with the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, the International Monetary Fund, and the Provisional International Civil Aviation Organization.

b. Arrangements for consultation with non-governmental organizations.

2. These matters should be brought up in the Council during the first part of the session so that the General Assembly may take action, in turn, on these <sup>question</sup> during its forthcoming session.

3. In order to make this timing possible, both the Committee on Negotiations with Specialized Agencies and the Standing Committee on Arrangements for Consultation with Non-Governmental Organizations should meet a couple of days before the beginning of the Council session.

FOLLOWING IS FROM SIR RAMASWAMI MUDALIAR IN REPLY TO YOUR TELEGRAM OF JULY 5TH: APPROVE PROPOSED AGENDA WITH FOLLOWING MODIFICATIONS. ITEMS 5, 6 AND 7 MAY READ REPORT OF COMMITTEE OF COUNCIL ON FISCAL COMMISSION, DEMOGRAPHIC COMMISSION, COORDINATION COMMISSION. SUGGEST 6 AND 7 SEPTEMBER FOR NEGOTIATIONS WITH FUND BANK AND PICAO. Subject: Date of the next Session of the Council.

We have a serious problem concerning the date of the next session of the Council in relation to the business which must be taken up at that time and the physical arrangements. Mr. Pelt has informed me that it would be impossible from the standpoint of the technical staff to hold meetings of the Council during the General Assembly. Although it might be possible to make one or two exceptions, to this principle, it would be impossible to hold a number of meetings.

We are now putting off to the next session of the Council a number of items. Only a few of these require action before the General Assembly meets. Among those items the following might be listed:

1. The preliminary report of the Sub-commission on Reconstruction of Devastated Areas. This Sub-commission has not yet been considered but there is a strong feeling that the Council should show some activity on this subject before the meeting of the General Assembly. This item should, therefore, receive the attention of the Council before the meeting of the General Assembly.

2. Refugees.

We do not know exactly where we stand now on the subject of refugees. If the Committee on Finance is to work this summer and report to the Council it will be necessary for the Council to study this report before the General Assembly. If, however, the Committee is appointed and reports directly to the Assembly, the Council would not need to be further concerned with this matter. The United States Resolution provides that the Council review at its third session the comments of Members of the United Nations on the draft constitution and on the report of the Committee on Finance. I do not see any particular advantage in such a review, except that the constitution and the report of the Committee on Finance might be amended by the Council before being referred to the Assembly.

In order to give adequate consideration to these two items, I feel that the Council should meet a week before the Assembly, say August 26th.

The other item on the Agenda which should be cleared up as soon as possible so that the Commissions may start functioning, is the question of composition. Postponement of this question to the next session may still make it difficult to bring the full Commissions into being at the next session unless members of the Council are prepared with their slates for each of the Commissions. There is also the question of the establishment of the Fiscal, Demographic and Co-ordination Commissions. I feel that consideration of these questions will take at least a week. That would mean that the Council would have to meet for a week after the General Assembly. I see no other adequate alternative for getting the work of the Council done, even though it does involve an extended stay for a number of members of the Council.

SOCIAL COUNCIL

Urgent Matters Requiring Consideration by the Council before the  
Next Session of the General Assembly

1. International Refugee Organization.
  - a. Review of comments of members of the United Nations on the Draft Constitution.
  - b. Consideration of the Report of the Committee on Finances.
  - c. Preliminary Report of the Secretary General on Interim Measures.
2. Consideration of the Preliminary Report of the Temporary Sub-Commission on Economic Reconstruction of Devastated Areas.

The Sub-Commission was requested to submit its Report not later than September 2nd in order that it might be considered by the Council before the meeting of the General Assembly.

3. Report of the Committee on Negotiations with Specialized Agencies.

It is anticipated that this Committee will negotiate draft agreements with the International Monetary Fund, the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, and the Provisional International Civil Aviation Organization, before the Third Session of the Council, in order that these draft agreements may be considered by the Council and submitted to the General Assembly.

Matters Deferred to the Third Session of the Council

4. Election of members of the Economic and Employment Commission, Transport and Communications Commission, Statistical Commission, Human Rights Commission, Commission on the Status of Women, and the Social Commission.
5. Colombian proposal for the establishment of a Fiscal Commission (Document E/54).
6. United States proposal for the establishment of a Population Committee (Document E/93).
7. United States proposal for the establishment of Committees on Coordination (Document E/62).
8. United Kingdom proposal concerning the assumption by the United Nations of the functions and powers



connected with public loans issued with the assistance of the League of Nations (Document E/49).

9. Belgian proposal concerning the League of Red Cross Societies (Document E/47).
10. Consideration of arrangements for conferring respectively with representatives of the Security and Trusteeship Councils concerning the methods of cooperation with each of these bodies in dealing with matters of common concern.

Other Matters Arising from the Second Session of the Council

11. United Kingdom proposal regarding the composition of Sub-Commissions of the Economic and Employment Commission (Document E/JC/W/1).
12. Report of the Standing Committee on Non-Governmental Organizations.

It is anticipated that the Standing Committee will meet shortly before the Third Session of the Council to consider the applications of various organizations and to place them in the categories laid down by the Council. The Council decided that the first item of business of the Standing Committee will be the consideration of the United States proposal that the International Chamber of Commerce be placed in Category (a). (See Document E/43/Rev. 1).

13. Payment of expenses of members of commissions.

During the discussion on the composition of the commissions, the question was raised whether or not the United Nations should pay the expenses of members of commissions when they are representatives of governments. No decision was reached on this question. It is suggested that the Council give further consideration to this matter with a view to submitting a recommendation to the General Assembly.

14. Terms of reference of the sub-commissions of the Economic and Employment Commission.

The Drafting Committee on Economic Commissions did not complete its examination of the terms of reference of the sub-commissions of the Economic and Employment Commission. Accordingly, the terms of reference for the sub-commissions as set forth in the Resolution of 16 February (Document E/28) were retained and incorporated in the Resolution of 21 June (Document E/82/Rev.1). It is for the Council to determine whether it wishes to reconsider these terms of reference.

15. Other Important Matters.
