Subject: Supplies for Experts in the Provinces

With reference to your memorandum of 27 August 1962, I discussed your proposals with Mr. Dupuy (FAO), the assistant of Mr. Costa (ICAO), Mr. Hajman (UNESCO) and Dr. Falkland (WHO).

Your proposals met with the full understanding and approval of the missions concerned.

For the time being, only WHO need be taken into consideration, as the other missions have no experts operating outside the ONUC Civilian Mission centres.

Dr. Falkland has advised me, however, that WHO is not in a position to absorb the cost of transport by commercial aircraft, as no provision has been made for such expenses in their budget. He has asked ONUC's assistance in this respect.

Otherwise, I am in complete agreement with your proposals.

Subject: Secretarial Requirements of Civilian Operations

1. Attached please find a table showing the secretarial requirements of Civilian Operations as estimated by the Chiefs of Sector from now until 31 December 1962.
 2. Mr. Costa (Civil Aviation) would be prepared to relinquish the posts at present held by Mr. CHADWICK, Gabriel and Mr. R.F. KIMBLE, in exchange for a bilingual secretary, or if none were forthcoming, he would try and make do with a French language secretary. This explains the two minus posts shown on the table.
 3. The Meteorology Sector asks for one more secretary (French), which seems reasonable since the number of their experts is steadily increasing, and will have doubled by 1965.
 4. Radio Broadcasting is now developing into a larger project and the addition of a French secretary will make a real difference to the effectiveness of this combined UN/UNESCO project.
 5. Education is the field in which the largest number of new projects has recently been approved. The breakdown of the seven secretaries asked for is as follows:
 - Project 20-01 : One secretary will be required full time to deal with matters relating to the 500 teachers now in process of recruitment.
 - Project 20-02 : After initial recruitment delays, we are now receiving the advisory experts in the different fields covered by this project.
 - Project 20-03 : The expansion of the National Pedagogical Institute will make it necessary for another secretary to be appointed, mainly to type the course material.

- Project 20-07 : The in-service training of primary education personnel is due to begin almost immediately.
- Project 20-10 : This project relating to secondary school inspection, is also just beginning.
- Project 70-02 : For this project, the School of Mines, we understand that UNESCO has a prospective candidate for the post of secretary who has been found by their Paris Headquarters. Appointment, but not recruitment action will therefore be necessary in this case.
- Project 80-02 : The National Institute of Building and Public Works is just about to get off the ground.

Of the seven posts mentioned above, three are urgently required for projects 20-07, 20-09 and 20-07. The remainder could be filled a little later on.

6. As you know, we are currently engaged in negotiations with Mr. Adoula concerning the creation of a Bureau for Economic and Foreign Aid Coordination. A group of people under Professor Sadre will be assigned here, and for general economic studies in the Royal. In addition to Sadre himself they will include Laurence, Lefie and some economists; Tocky and Lukina in the Office d'Approvisionnement in the Ministry of Economic Affairs, and one or two others. Tocky's present secretarial staff could be borne in mind and transferred with him, but it would be prudent to anticipate at least one additional secretarial post when Sadre gets his team complete.

7. WHO has previously provided for its own secretarial staff from Geneva and hitherto this staff has looked after the experts. Recently the number of experts has increased so much that the WHO-recruited girls can no longer cope with the work. In particular three experts have recently arrived: Dr. Anell, Administrative Adviser to the Ministry of Public Health, Mr. Duran, in charge of training for Hospital Administration, and Mr. Turner and other Public Health nursing advisers. Mr. Duran alone needs to turn out some 2,000 stenoids for his training course. Two reinforcements of the secretarial staff are requested at the earliest possible moment.

8. Hitherto Mr. Kelly, our Mining Expert, has done his own typing, but between now and the end of the year the other posts in this sector are expected to be filled and a secretary will be required.

9. The Public Administration sector used to have a secretary and did not use her fully, so she was withdrawn. The situation has now changed with the arrival of additional Public Administration experts, and also with developments in the field of Police Training, and a request has been received for one secretary.

10. The Social Affairs sector is supposed to have two secretaries but since May, has in fact had only one. The second one shown as being in post has been promised by Mrs. Marajko by the end of August. An additional secretary will be needed to cover the absence of Mr. Lesmi, who will be on leave from mid-September to mid-November, to service two new experts, one in Health and the other in the training of social workers, who are due to arrive by the end of September. In addition, two provincial liaison officers for Social Affairs are expected to be recruited during the autumn.

11. Mr. Francis needs a secretary in his office at Ndola.

12. Many of the sectors specified draw attention to the difficulty which their experts have in getting material typed in the provinces. Much of it now comes in hand-written, which is perhaps no bad thing as it may restrain unnecessary loquacity. But bearing in mind the expansion of Civilian Operations, particularly in the Education sector, and the requests received for help in the provinces from other sectors such as Health, we suggest that provision be made for one additional secretary in each of the five provinces outside Leopoldville (Oquihaville, Stanleyville, Lubumbashi, Makena and Albertville), who would be a member of the Field Office Pool but principally available for typing experts' reports.

Minutes of the Chief Administrative Officer's Meeting
27 February 1962

Accommodation

1. The Acting Chief Accommodation Officer reported that the arrangements for mortuary facilities had been formalized. The arrangements for the ONUC cemetery were also reported to be in operation, and the question of disinterment would have to be dealt with.
2. A survey of accommodation facilities in the vicinity of the airport had revealed a definite shortage of space, taking into account that accommodation would have to be arranged for the 97 US airlift personnel now housed in Lovanium University premises which would have to be released by October 1962, and also for 32 additional Norwegian air personnel who were expected shortly. Furthermore, the existing accommodation arrangements for the air personnel could not be considered satisfactory since they were scattered over a wide area; the Base Commander at N'Djili had requested the concentration of these personnel in National groups for reasons of convenience and to facilitate transport and other work arrangements. In the view of the Acting Chief Accommodation Officer, the best solution would be prefabricated construction of suitable quarters in the N'Djili area. The Chairman requested a full report on the N'Djili survey for further consideration of this proposal.
3. The release of part of Camp Chanic was reported to be under consideration.

Transport

4. The Executive Officer of the Congo Fund stated that the requisitioning of the vehicle requirements for Civilian Operations projects was in process. In this connection it was agreed that the Chief of General Services could adjust the requisition to obtain more service vehicles in lieu of passenger cars, on the understanding that after procurement, any further adjustments found necessary might be made by mutually agreed exchanges of vehicles between Civilian Operations and ONUC.

5. The establishment of criteria for the allocation of vehicles was discussed, and it was noted that the report of the Chief of General Services on the ONUC transport situation contained proposals to this end which had been referred to the Force Commander and Chief of Civilian Operations for review and comment. These proposals had been formulated in the light of the long-term requirements and included the possibility of a more extensive ONUC bus service, which would reduce the need for passenger cars.

6. The Executive Officer of the Congo Fund questioned the statement in the report that the present allocation of vehicles to Civilian Operations was in the proportion of one vehicle to 3.3 personnel, which did not appear to be supported by the facts in his possession. It was agreed that the Chief of General Services would check the figures in order to determine the correct proportion.

PX and Commissary

7. The Chief PX Officer reported that the move of the PX Depot into new premises would be completed by 10 March 1962, and he requested the Acting Chief Accommodation Officer to arrange for the release of the premises at the end of March, so that the PX would not be called upon to pay rent for subsequent months.

8. The walk-in refrigerator for the Commissary was reported to be ready and arrangements would again be made for the import of fresh fruits and vegetables from Kivu Province which had been temporarily suspended due to lack of refrigeration facilities.

9. The Chief Procurement Officer reported that orders had been cabled for various canned items and chicken for the Commissary to supplement supplies from the Supply Depot. Departing from the standard practice the orders had been placed with the second lowest bidder, which was Frigo Damseaux, since their offer had included cold storage facilities in Leo, so that the actual cost to the PX would be lower.

Personnel

10. The Chief Personnel Officer reported that the manning tables in the various sections were being reexamined in consultation with the Section Chief concerned. The Procurement manning table had been completed, and job descriptions for vacant posts had been communicated to New York. It had been agreed that drivers and messengers would be retained in the manning table of the General Services Section, even though they might actually be assigned in other Sections. At the same time, arrangements would be put into effect for the general supervision of all drivers and messengers by the General Services Section which would have overall administrative responsibility for the control and testing of staff and disciplinary measures. It was believed that this centralized arrangement would facilitate replacement of staff on leave and the coordination and standardization of personnel policy (including promotion opportunities) for these staff members.

11. The review of the salary scales for locally-recruited staff was reported to be still in process. It was noted that the situation concerning locally-recruited non-Congolese staff was becoming critical, particularly in the PX where there were six vacant posts and several resignations pending. It was agreed that a further follow-up cable should be sent to New York to obtain agreement to the proposed special allowances to compensate for the devaluation of the Congolese franc. Apart from this, however, the Chief Personnel Officer recommended that consideration should be given to providing certain additional fringe benefits to such staff corresponding to those available to them in local firms, such as home leave travel every two years, social security coverage for accidents, sickness and death, free housing, free transportation, etc.

12. Pending the recruitment of the personnel required for the PX it was agreed that consideration might be given to the employment of dependents of staff members on a temporary basis under Special Service Agreements as an emergency measure. }

Audit and Inspection Service

13. The Chief of the Audit and Inspection Service reported that the External Auditors had arrived at ONUC Headquarters, and trips to the field offices were planned by them. Most of their Report had been completed in draft, and would be discussed with the CAO and the Section Chiefs concerned. It was expected that the Directing External Auditor would proceed to New York after approximately three weeks in the Congo, to be followed a few weeks later by the remaining two members of the team. }

Small Pox Vaccination Campaign

14. The Chief of General Services described the arrangements for assistance to the Government on the Small Pox vaccination campaign which was being carried out in the city of Leopoldville on the advice of the WHO consultants. Twenty-seven teams consisting of 7 persons each were being widely deployed throughout the city, utilizing transport facilities made available by ONUC. The campaign was expected to be completed in approximately six weeks, although it might finish sooner in view of the excellent response from the public.

Subject: APPOINTMENT OF MR. GODFREY K.J. AMACHREE

The Secretary-General has announced the appointment of Mr. Godfrey K.J. Amachree as Under-Secretary in charge of Congo Civilian Operations.

Mr. Amachree, who has been Solicitor-General of the Federation of Nigeria, attended Government College, Umuahia. He went to the United Kingdom for advanced studies at the University of London and Pembroke College, Cambridge, and holds the Bachelor of Laws degree and the Diploma of Commerce. He continued his study of law at Gray's Inn, London, becoming a barrister and, later, Queen's Counsel.

Mr. Amachree's first appointment was in February 1949 as temporary Crown Counsel in the Nigerian Legal Department. He subsequently was promoted to Senior Crown Counsel in February 1955.

He was appointed Acting Legal Secretary in the Southern Cameroons and for four months in 1955 was an ex officio member of the Southern Cameroons Executive Council and the Southern Cameroons House of Assembly.

In 1957, Mr. Amachree was appointed Acting Solicitor-General of the Federation of Nigeria and in February 1958 he became Solicitor-General. He has acted as Attorney-General on several occasions. As Solicitor-General, Mr. Amachree has been the principal legal adviser to the Government of Nigeria and represented the Crown in all civil litigation. He also held the post of Permanent Secretary, Ministry of Justice and was responsible for administrative matters pertaining to the Ministry.

This is to acknowledge your memorandum of 23 October in which you expressed surprise to note that I am proposing an extension for Mr. Salducci until 31 December 1961.

It is my remembrance that we had discussed this case in detail and had agreed that if the month's probation were satisfactory, Mr. Salducci would be given, then, a three-month contract in order to ensure that his work would be maintained at the standard which we require. In a note which you sent me, undated, you had indicated: "I would be perfectly prepared to take him on at his present grade, if absolutely necessary, on a temporary basis for three months and then send you an honest report with adequate recommendations." This note was sent before my verbal agreement with you concerning Mr. Salducci.

I am aware that Mr. Salducci has not had a special leave between assignments but he has expressed the willingness to forego this until such time as we could recommend to and obtain from New York a contract extension making him eligible for such leave. However, there will be no objection to his taking annual leave in December, should he wish.

If Mr. Salducci's services have proved satisfactory up to 31 December 1961, then, this office would be willing to recommend him for a further nine-month period so that he would be eligible to go on special leave early in 1962, i.e., he would be authorized round trip air travel to any destination provided the cost to the UN does not exceed the cost of the return fare to his home country or last duty station.
