DSG would be grateful if SOSG could follow-up on this latest development. Please let us know if you need anything further. Thanks for your understanding.

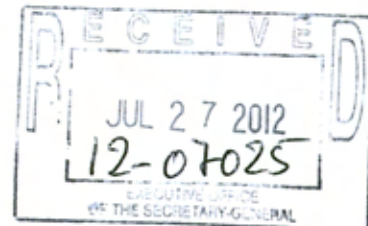

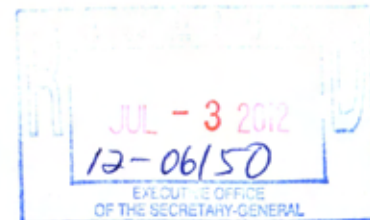

Commemoration of the tenth anniversary of the entry into force of the Rome Statute

In 2012, the International Criminal Court, hereafter “the Court”, is commemorating the tenth anniversary of the entry into force of the Rome Statute. Over this past decade the Court has developed into an important institution, which, with its current 121 States Parties, plays an indispensable role in the field of international criminal justice.

After 60 States had ratified the Rome Statute, on 1 July 2002, the Court started its activities marking a historic milestone towards ending impunity. Governed by the Rome Statute, the ICC is the first permanent, treaty based, organization established to help end impunity for the perpetrators of the most serious crimes of concern to the international community. The Court is a fully functional institution, which has undertaken seven investigations, 15 cases and issued 20 arrest warrants.

The Assembly of States Parties to the Rome Statute of the ICC, hereafter “the Assembly”, which meets once per year, shall hold its eleventh session from 14 to 22 November 2012 at the World Forum Convention Center (WFCC) in The Hague. To commemorate the tenth anniversary of the entry into force of the Statute in the presence of representatives of all 121 States Parties, plus several non-States Parties (observer States and invited States), inter-governmental organizations, academia and non-governmental organizations, the opening of the Assembly would be linked to the commemoration of the tenth anniversary and would be observed with following main events:

1. Commemorative event of the tenth anniversary on 13 November at the Atrium in The Hague City Hall. Focus on a broader commemoration including media and NGOs.
2. Solemn commemoration of the tenth anniversary of the entry into force of the Rome Statute at the historic Knight's Hall (Ridderzaal) in the morning of 14 November 2012. Formal solemn opening by the Dutch authorities, followed by a lunch at the Sociëteit De Witte.
