CASEVAC COVER FOR BRITCON WITHDRAWAL

1. Elements of BRITCON are withdrawing from RWANDA by convoy to the railhead at KAMPALA from 19 - 22 November 94. UNAMIR Air Ops will provide CASEVAC cover for the convoy move using the Bell 212 standby helicopter based in the mission area. The convoy will route up the MSR via MBARARA and MASAKA to KAMPALA. In addition the standby will be available to cover the KITABI detachment on its road move back to KIGALI on 17 November. This convoy will route via GIKONGORO, BUTARE and GITARAMA
2. In the event of the convoy requiring a helicopter Casevac a message will be passed from the convoy by HF radio to either the KIGALI or KAMPALA BRITCON ops dets. A request for a helicopter Casevac will then be relayed by telephone to HQ UNAMIR Ops Room. Ops officers are to forward that request to G3 Air Ops (93H on channel 7), or Civilian Air Ops (WZ1 on channel 11), as soon as possible using the procedure for a Casevac callout.
3. As a backup the convoy may call Canada Heliops on HF radio, frequency 6208 USB, callsign Canada Helicopters. This means may not always be manned but it will be operating whenever helicopters are flying. It is also the only means that the convoy will have to speak to the helicopter inbound to an incident, using the callsign Canada Helicopter.
4. Any casualties will be recovered to AUSMED KIGALI if an incident occurs south of MBARARA (00 deg 33'S and 30 deg 38'E), north of MBARARA the helicopter will recover casualties to KAMPALA. If an uplift of fuel is required to return to KIGALI it will be funded by UK national means. Delays may be unavoidable in obtaining clearance for UNAMIR aircraft to enter the UGANDA FIR, Air ops will signal KAMPALA requesting a blanket clearance for the duration of this standby.
5. The convoy will follow the MSR towards KAMPALA, there will be MP posts enroute, any incident should be on or next to the road and therefore easy to spot from the air. Troops should mark a suitable HLS with smoke or a dayglo marker. It is most unlikely that a Casevac would be able to be carried out in the dark. Note that the flying time to MBARARA from KIGALI is approximately one hour and

from MBARARA to KAMPALA it is one hour 15 mins. Thus a Casevac from beyond MBARARA to KAMPALA will be at the maximum range of the Bell 212, for that reason the pickup site must be expediently located by the helicopter.

6. Once the convoy has arrived in KAMPALA the BRITCON signals det is to inform HQ UNAMIR that the Casevac requirement in Uganda is no longer necessary.



1. BRITCON troops are scheduled to leave the UNAMIR AOR on 19 Nov 94. Three BRITCON convoys have been planned and will be departing KIGALI for GATUNA at one hour intervals commencing at 191100B Nov 94.
2. BRITCON have packed away their weapons and have therefore requested armed escorts for the three convoys as stated below from KIGALI to GATUNA.
3. NICOY is therefore requested to provide armed escorts of a section strength in two vehicles for each convoy.
4. The RV with BRITCON troops is AMAHORO Stadium. The estimated time of departures are as follows:
 - a. First convoy - ETD 1100hrs.
 - b. Second convoy - ETD 1200hrs.
 - c. Third convoy - ETD 1300hrs.
5. You are requested to liaise with BRITCON CO for the necessary details.

Subject: REINFORCEMENT OF FC's
GUIDANCE TO SECTOR COMDS

1. In view of recent incidents in MUSANGE and MUSEBEYA, FC is concerned about UNAMIR's ability to provide protection to DPs and NGOs.
2. It is critical that we protect DPs from forcible ejection, protect NGOs to prevent their withdrawal, prevent clashes where and when ever possible between RPA and DPs, as well as avert confrontation between RPA and UNAMIR. Accordingly, Sector Commanders should review their contingency plans and conduct rehearsals to ensure quick dispatch of Rapid Reaction Force/Reinforcements to trouble spots throughout the sector. The response must be speedy and forceful.
3. Additionally, Sector Commanders should ensure that they are aware of all NGOs operating within their sectors and are to ensure that they have a dedicated, reliable means of communication with NGOs which may imply exchange of frequencies, or co-location as well as ensuring that there is a clear chain of command with the camps for security which, is known to the NGOs.
4. It is also suggested that frequent meetings between UNAMIR and NGOs within camps and sectors be undertaken to co-ordinate security/protection within the camps. As well, it is also imperative that meetings between UNAMIR and RPA Commanders within the sectors be conducted frequently to diffuse situations before they occur and to co-ordinate RPA security concerns with our activities.
5. If possible, fore warning should be obtained from the RPA if they are contemplating and continuing the forceful removal of DPs within the camps so that security for DPs, UNAMIR personnel and NGOs can be planned.

Sir,

I'd like through the present letter report to you about a robbery we have been subject to in our Pharmaciens Sans Frontières warehouse just behind the Ministry of Rehabilitation (Muhima quarter, parcelle n°3932 cadastre de Kigali) during the 5th-6th november week end.

A warehouse window has been broken out, and the total value of the robbed material can be evaluated to about 3900 US \$.

The robbery is constituted for the major part of drugs as well as small office material.


Please find below the list of the products that have been stolen:

Acide Acétylsalicyclique 500 mg	14 000 Pills
Amoxicilline 250 mg	18 000 Pills
Doxycycline 100 mg	9 000 Pills
Quinine 300 mg	9 000 Pills
Tetracycline 250 mg	63 000 Pills
Ampicilline 500 mg	2 250 injections
Ergométrine	200 injections

Drugs that have been stolen are for the major part essential drugs and this will surely affect our supplying to the health centers we are providing all over the country.






SUBJECT: REQUEST FOR PROTECTION CYANGUGU HSF

3. Considering the events of Sunday 30 Oct in the Gisenyi, she is greatly concerned for her patients and staff.

5. SEC 3 HQ PROPOSES INSTEAD THAT ESCORT TASKS FOR BROWN AND ROOT CONVOYS SHOULD BE COORDINATED WELL IN ADVANCE TO PREVENT ANY DELAYS IN THE MOVEMENT OF SUCH CONVOYS DUE TO OTHER COMMITMENTS IN THE SECTOR.





SUBJECT: PROTECTION OF DISPLACED PERSONS CAMPS - ROE

Ref: A. FRAGO No. 02 to OPORD 20 dated 22 oct 94
B. UN Security Council Resolution 925 dated 8 June 94
C. OPDIR No. 2 - ROE dated 6 Oct 94

1. Reference A directs all commanders to increase UN presence in refugee camps within RWANDA. Contingency plans have been developed to reinforce certain sectors in the event that displaced persons (DPs) are forcibly removed from their camps.
2. Clearly, if this situation arises, the potential for confrontation will emerge. Under these circumstances, a sound understanding of the applicable Rules of Engagement is fundamental.
3. Reference B mandates UNAMIR to "contribute to the security and protection of displaced persons, refugees and civilians at risk in RWANDA" and "Recognizes that UNAMIR may be required to take action in self-defence against persons or groups who threaten protected sites and populations, United Nations and other humanitarian personnel or the means of delivery and distribution of humanitarian relief".
4. Reference C provides clear guidance for the application of Resolution 925. The following provisions should be specifically noted:
 - a. Authority to use force. The use of force is authorized to protect the above designated individuals against forcible removal from the camps which they occupy (Ref C, para 8).
 - b. The principles for the use of force must be adhered to (Ref C, para 7).
 - c. Challenge and escalation procedures are to be followed (Ref C, paras 14 and 15).

- d. Units involved in the protection of DP camps are to remain on State GREEN (Annex A to Ref C) until ordered otherwise.



GENERAL

1. UNAMIR and NGO installations in KIGALI are vulnerable to trespass by armed or unarmed unauthorised personnel; there have been attempted encroachments in the past. The Rapid Reaction Force (RRF) has been constituted to provide a direct response to this threat. On order, INDBATT will assume RRF responsibilities from GHANBATT, AUSMED and CANCON.

MISSION

2. To protect UNAMIR and NGO installations in Kigali against unauthorised encroachments.

EXECUTION

3. General Outline. The RRF is a motorised platoon. It is capable of responding to an immediate threat at section level, and to augment that force as required, up to platoon level. INDBATT will assume full Sector 6 RRF responsibilities on order.




DISCIPLINE - CAR PARKING OUTSIDE SECURE LOCATIONS

1. There have been a number of instances of attempted and actual taking and driving away of UNAMIR vehicles. In most cases, the vehicles have been removed, late at night, from car parks associated with premises where it is known that trouble is likely to occur; this fact gives particular cause for concern.
2. DCOS (Ops)'s staff will, I understand, shortly be issuing policy guidance on personal security for members of UNAMIR, both off and on duty; it is not the purpose of this letter to pre-empt that advice but, rather, to express the considerable concern felt within the Headquarters that valuable assets are being lost through thoughtlessness or, at worst, wanton lack of responsibility.
3. It is a well known fact that the UNAMIR vehicle fleet is woefully below the size that it should be and we cannot afford to lose vehicles by theft or, for that matter, traffic accidents, poor maintenance or any other reason than fair wear and tear. Personnel who are allocated vehicles, permanently or temporarily for some particular purpose, will be held responsible for the safety and security of those vehicles, in accordance with standard practice in most armies.
4. If vehicles are used, particularly after dark, and have to be parked, great care must be given to ensuring their security. This extends beyond simply locking the vehicle as it is well known that almost all vehicles can be entered in a few moments. It may, perhaps, be appropriate to immobilize the vehicle in some way.
5. But the single most important factor is consideration of where the vehicle will be left. Ideally, cars will not be left outside a guarded compound but this is not always practicable; in these cases thought must be given to the matter. Experience demonstrates that the car parks of the night clubs now opening around Kigali are not safe places to leave a car - and, in the light of that experience, no one can be surprised, or expect a sympathetic reception from this Headquarters, if his car disappears from one. It is necessary to consider the risks most carefully before parking

a car anywhere and all personnel should remember that they may be called upon to explain why they decided to leave a car where they did.

6. Looking to wider issues, it may then be pertinent to ask oneself 'if my car is not going to be safe here, am I?'

7. Contingent commanders, branch heads etc are to disseminate the contents of this letter to all personnel who hold a United Nations driving permit.

SUBJECT: Security at UN premises

1. While a number of premises used by UNAMIR have their own "built-in" security, in that they are occupied full-time by military troops, a number of others still require a military presence, round the clock, to ensure security of the premises and equipment contained therein.

2. Premises UNAMIR currently occupies or hopes to occupy in Kigali are as follows:

- a. Airport Warehouse;
- b. Chez Lando;
- c. Communications Compound;
- d. Meridien Hotel;
- e. "IVECO" compound;
- f. Logistics Base;
- g. Current MT Compound;
- h. Belgian Village;
- j. MAN Diesel Compound;
- k. 500 Man Camp;
- m. Amahoro Hotel;
- n. Amahoro Stadium;
- p. Kigali Central Hospital;
- q. Military Academy;
- r. Kyovu Hotel; and
- s. Village Umgurio.

3. I believe locations at d, e, f, h, m, n, p and q, by virtue of being occupied by military troops are probably already adequately secured, although the Belgian Village (h) would seem to require some enhancements to the current facility.

4. The airport warehouse (a) is located within the confines of the airport proper, secured by the RPA. However, we continue to lose material every night. What is needed here, I suggest, is a permanent picket to patrol the area on a 24 hour basis, or at least during the hours of darkness.

5. The Communications Compound (c), is currently occupied by the Tunisian Advance Party, who expect to be quartered there for the next week to ten day, pending the arrival of their main body. As a result of their presence, the CCO has commenced moving communications equipment, generators and other equipment into the compound with a view to recommencing operations there. I am most concerned that, with the departure of the Tunisians, large quantities of valuable equipment will be unprotected at night and may will disappear. I would be grateful if a standing picket could be assigned to this location, to be in place prior to the departure of the Tunisians.

6. The MAN Diesel compound is one recently taken on to ease the current pressures on existing vehicle maintenance facilities. It is intended that this become the site for the maintenance of heavier wheeled vehicles. The facility will shortly be repaired and ready for use, however, without security, it will not be possible to bring in the tools and equipment required to put it to use. Also, for the future, when Britcon leave the current MT compound, security will then be required at that location. The third facility, the IVECO compound, currently has a security detail on duty there.

7. Construction of the 500 man camp has already commenced in the area behind the stadium. Once construction is completed and troops are located there, security will cease to be a problem. During the construction phase however, I am concerned that equipment and parts will disappear during silent hours. I would therefore request that a picket be placed on the site during silent hours.

8. The Meridien Hotel, the Chez Lando and possibly the Hotel Kyovu and the Urugwiro Village are current and potential sites for the accommodation of UNAMIR staff. As long as the current situation in Rwanda is considered as volatile, it is the intention to group staff in locations where security and other considerations can be more easily handled in case of trouble. As the contracts for the locations involved call for exclusive occupation by the UN, security is therefore needed at the entrances of each. The Meridien already has a security picket in place, one is now required at Chez Lando and, once negotiations are finalized, may also be required at both the Urugwiro Village and the Kyovu Hotel.

9. I appreciate that the requirements outlined above represent a large number of troops, however, without the provision of security, it is becoming increasingly difficult for sections of the Administration to become fully effective and to bring the requisite staff into the mission. Without security, it will be difficult to prevent the disappearance of material and equipment, without which, mission operations might well be jeopardized.

We consider it crucial to reassure the displaced population of their security through UNAMIR presence in the area. In addition to ourselves, there is a presence of NGOs and an International Organization within the centre, even at late hours of the night.

The presence in the centre of different populations, i.e. IDPs, old and new refugee returnees has given rise to tensions and I should therefore request your assistance in UNAMIR regular patrols for the UNHCR Transit Centre in Ndera, South Kigali.

We would suggest for your consideration that regular UNAMIR patrols on a 24 hour basis within the centre itself and it's environs would create a sense of confidence and security for all parties concerned.

1. Reference A has been reviewed. I would like to point out that the tasks and coordinating instructions for 1 CDHSR (referred to as CANSIGS) are not practical. I ask that you review the instruction.

2. The problems with the instruction from the 1 CDHSR view are:

a. Para 3.e.(1)(a) tasks us with providing one section to reinforce the Ghanbatt RRF on order; and

b. Para 3.f.(1) tasks us with having this section at 30 minutes NTM daily.

3. 1 CDHSR is not in a position to meet this tasking. 30 minutes notice to move implies that they are at a stand-by position and cannot be employed at other tasks. Our D&S Pl already has three section tasks, one at the UNAMIR HQ gate, one at the gate to the Amahoro Stadium, and the third section is our convoy escort/QRF section.

4. It should also be noted that 1 CDHSR could meet the second task of providing guards at any UN facility on order (Para 3.e.(1)(b)).

5. Therefore, it is requested that you review the Instruction at Reference A. It is recommended that the RRF task be removed. 1 CDHSR would be available for formal tasking during any emergency situation, as are all UNAMIR forces. It is the standby task of maintaining a section at 30 minutes NTM that is beyond our capability.

SUBJECT: PROVISION OF SECURITY FOR VULNERABLE POINTS (VPs)

1. The phased integration of sector 4 with rest of Rwanda by UNAMIR may see an increase in sabotage attacks by elements opposed to the Rwandese Government.




