Request for an audience with PNND delegation

Your excellency,

The network of Parliamentarians for Nuclear Non-proliferation and Disarmament (PNND) is inspired by your leadership in working towards a world free of nuclear weapons. We offer our fullest support towards this aim. We thus request a short meeting on October 12 with a delegation of PNND members led by PNND Co-Presidents Ms. Mikyung Lee, Secretary-General of the South Korean Democratic Party, and Ms. Uta Zapf, Chair of the Bundestag Subcommittee on Disarmament and Arms Control. A full list of other members of the delegation is affixed.

PNND, a program of the Global Security Institute, is a cross-party organization of over 700 legislators from 75 countries working to reverse nuclear proliferation and achieve nuclear disarmament. PNND members have been very active in promoting UN initiatives, including the five-point plan for nuclear disarmament which you released on 24 October 2008. Recently, we were successful in moving the Inter-Parliamentary Union, which represents over 150 parliaments, to adopt a resolution on nuclear disarmament and the role of parliaments, which specifically called for parliamentarians to promote your five-point plan.

PNND is holding its Annual Assembly in New York from 10-13 October. The PNND delegation would like to meet with you to discuss how parliamentarians could further their support for UN initiatives in this field.

We look forward to your reply and we take this opportunity to extend our highest considerations for your health and well-being.

Dear Mr. Secretary-General:

American Program Bureau is putting together a series of talks by world leaders to simultaneously address audiences of students from 300-500 American universities. This series titled "The Word in Your Hands" will provide an absolutely unique and fascinating opportunity for the world's most powerful leaders to engage in a direct, open and informal communication with the college students of the United States. Leaders of today will have the opportunity to meet the potential leaders of the future. For American college students, this will, no doubt, be the experience of a lifetime.

To achieve the above, we plan on using **today's** most sophisticated and advanced videoconferencing technology - Teleportec - on the campus of our lead sponsoring university. Teleportec portrays the speaker in an almost magical holographic image, creating an unprecedented sense of physical presence, as if the students were seeing the speaker behind a lectern in their own campus auditorium. The remaining universities would receive the program on their campuses via more conventional two-dimensional state-of-the-art live-via-satellite videoconferencing technology.

We are planning to begin the series in September/October 2010 and it would be our honor to have you, Mr. Secretary-General, become the first world leader to participate in this series as your position is representative of many nations. We already have major interest and commitments from people such as Russian President Medvedev.

A series of dialogues across generations and cultures

This series will bring hundreds of thousands of American college students into contact with Presidents and Prime Ministers they never would have even imagined having the opportunity to hear, let alone engage in dialogue.

The world is adrift; past American foreign policy left our nation **out** of step with global realities. The goal of this program is to bring the voices of global powers into dialogue with the next generation of American intellectuals, entrepreneurs and policy practitioners.

This will be a forum to pose both questions and ideas, to reassess the relations, misunderstandings and difficulties that have defined us for generations, and to find commonality in the struggles posed by the twenty-first century.

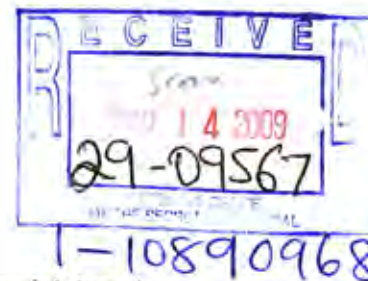
