1. GENERAL POINTS

- A. RATE OF REFUGEES RETURNING TO RWANDA FROM GOMA AREA CONTINUES TO INCREASE. ~~NOW AVERAGES 12 TO 1500 PER DAY~~ THERE IS STILL CONSIDERABLE UNCERTAINTY AND FEAR OF RETURN/RECEPTION EVIDENT IN THE GOMA CAMPS. EVENTS IN SECTOR 4 ARE BEING CLOSELY WATCHED.
- B. THERE IS CONCERN THAT A SIGNIFICANT NUMBER OF PERSONS IN THE SOUTH OF SEC 5 ARE EXPERIENCING FOOD SHORTAGES. LOCAL GOVT IS VERY WORRIED ABOUT THE SITUATION. ~~UNACR IS COORD WITH CARE~~ AND WFP AND MAY INITIATE EMERGENCY ACTION. UNAMIR MAY BE REQ TO ASSIST FOOD DISTRIBUTION.



AN AGREEMENT CONCERNING THE HANDOVER OF A SUSPECTED CRIMINAL<sup>^</sup>  
CRIMINALS FROM UNAMIR TO THE RWANDESE PATRIOTIC ARMY GOVERNMENT

*Government*

1. Through this correspondence it is agreed that the Rwandese Patriotic Army will take possession from UNAMIR of the individual or individuals as noted by the ICRC and as accused by the Rwandese Patriotic Army of having committed criminal acts and that they will be subjected to detention and treated according to the Geneva Convention until such time as they are tried by a court of law to determine guilt of criminal activity.

2. Specifically, we agree to the following as discussed with representatives of UNAMIR at their HQ on 22 Jun, 1994:

- GOVERNMENT*
- a. The Rwandese Patriotic Army will treat the prisoner/prisoners as prisoners of war until such time as a legitimate court of law decides otherwise.
  - b. The individual/individuals handed over to the Rwandese Patriotic Army will be afforded the status of prisoner of war as defined under the Geneva Convention.
  - c. The Geneva Convention will be strictly adhered to with regards to their treatment.
  - d. UNAMIR will record the names of those handed over.
  - e. The ICRC will be in attendance during the handing over of the individual/individuals and data on the individual(s) will be given to the ICRC.
  - f. The ICRC will be permitted to monitor the condition of the prisoner(s) in the future in accordance with the Geneva Convention.

GENERAL SITUATION

1. The security situation in this sector continued to remain calm for the period under review.

POLITICAL

2. The Government's announcement of the RPAs entry into the sector 4 must be preceded by the preparation of the minds of the people in the camps to prevent any mass exodus. It is suggested that leaflets are dropped at the camps and Government members are sent to explain to the displaced people at the camps the good reasons. Additionally the mass media could be used extensively to pass on the Government's intention.

3. Very little was observed in the form of the peoples reaction to the decision to deploy RPA into Sector 4, however young men were observed in small groups listening to radio sets.

4. The absence of these actions in para 2 might provoke mass exodus or reaction from the displaced people.

MILITARY

6. The HQ assisted in the registration and evacuation of refugees from the sector to KIGALI. A/sect comd went to patrol various camps of displaced persons in the southern part of AOR. The camps are RURAMBA, RWAMIKO, KIBEHO, NDAGO, MUNINI, NSHILI, SHORORO and KAMANA. It is felt that food does not reach the NSHILI camp due to the distance and as well as bad roads. The strength observed was about 2,000 people who could be fed from BUSANZE both in the South.

TEAMS 1 AND 2

7. One Team went to patrol to MUKO displaced person camp. The Chadian platoon informed the Team that the strength of the camp has

increased by 6000. It is believed that the new entrants might have come from KIBUYE and CYANGUGU. The present strength in the camp at MUKO is 37,530. This camp has not received any plastic sheeting, and has neither good sanitation nor medical attention. Another team went to patrol Northern part of AOR. The British medical contingent has established two medical care units in MBOGO and KAMWAMBI camps. The Team has put under control the dysentery cases in these camps. The Team also conducted recce to the road from KAMWAMBI camp towards BUTARE up to the bridge (6630) and found that the road is in good condition and can be used for evacuating displaced persons from these camps to BUTARE. It could also be used for bringing food to these camps during the rainy season.

#### HUMANITARIAN AFFAIRS

8. The two trucks of foodstuff sent by UNAMIR, KIGALI as gift to the local population reached this location at 1700 hrs. ✓

#### CIVILIAN AFFAIRS

9. The two suspects picked by GHANBATT for interrogation from KAMWAMBI camp were involved in the killing of one person with a hand grenade and stealing of cattle. Investigation continues.

10. The Team leader will be at MILOB HQ on Tuesday and Wednesday to discuss logistics requirement for the sector. Issues to be discussed include requirement of three more base stations and additional vehicles for the Team.







THIS FIGURE IS A LITTLE DUBIOUS SINCE HE WENT ON TO CLAIM THAT HE HAD HAD TROUBLE REGISTERING PEOPLE AND DID NOT REALLY KNOW HOW MANY HAD COME. HE ALSO STATED THAT THERE HAD BEEN NO ARRESTS IN HIS COMMUNE SINCE 19 JAN BUT, SINCE THEY KNEW THAT MANY CRIMINALS HAD COME IN, THEY WOULD BEGIN ARRESTS AGAIN IN THE NEW FUTURE. THE MURAMA COMMUNE BOURGEMESTRE WAS MORE PRECISE AND REPORTED 979 REGISTERED RETURNEES. HE ESTIMATED THAT ANOTHER 6000 WERE STILL TO COME FROM RUKONDO CAMP. HE HAD NOTHING TO SAY ABOUT ARRESTS AND SEEMED QUITE POSITIVE ABOUT THE PROSPECT OF RECONCILIATION.

ii) THE REMAINING TEAMS WERE INVOLVED IN THE PREPARATION FOR THE SECTOR COMMANDERS CONF TOMORROW.

iii) THE WEEKLY OP RETOUR COORD MEETING IN GITARAMA WAS ATTENDED BY THE SECTOR COMD. IT WAS AGREED THAT THE SYSTEM FOR CONVEYING IDPS BACK TO THEIR HOME COMMUNES IS IMPROVING AND THAT A FEW MORE EFFORTS TO CONVINCE ALL AGENCIES OF THE

IMPORTANCE OF DELIVERING IDPS TO THE DOOR OF THEIR COMMUNES SHOULD BE SUFFICIENT. THE ISSUE OF PRISON OVERCROWDING WAS ALSO DISCUSSED AND EACH AGENCY AGREED TO TRY TO CONVINCE THEIR PRINCIPALS OF THE URGENT NEED TO EASE THE OVERCROWDING. THE ISSUE OF FOLLOW UP OF RETURNING IDPS WAS ALSO DISCUSSED AND IT WAS AGREED THAT MILOBS WOULD ATTEMPT TO FIND AS MANY AS POSSIBLE OF THOSE WHO HAD BEEN REGISTERED OVER THE LAST FEW WEEKS. THE UNHCR REP HAD FOLLOWED UP TWO FAMILIES IN THE MURAMA COMMUNE AND REPORTED THAT THEY ARE IN GOOD HEALTH AND ARE BEING ASSISTED IN SETTLING IN BY THEIR NEIGHBOURS. THE TEAM SUBSEQUENTLY VISITED SHOGWE AND RULLI SECTORS OF NYAMABUYE COMMUNES WHERE THEY RECEIVED COMPLAINTS CONCERNING AN INORDINATE NUMBER OF ARRESTS BY THE RPA. BOTH COUNSELLORS STATED THAT ARRESTS CONTINUE TO BE FREQUENT AND CARRIED OUT WITHOUT REGARD TO THE CIVIL AUTHORITIES. NO WORD HAS BEEN RECEIVED FROM ANY OF THOSE ARRESTED. THE TEAM REQUESTED A LIST OF NAMES OF THOSE WHO HAVE BEEN TAKEN AS THE FIRST STEP IN FOLLOWING UP THE COMPLAINTS. WE WILL TAKE MORE INTEREST IN THE IMMEDIATE AREA AS THE POPULATION IS LARGELY HUTU AND VERY NERVOUS ABOUT THE LARGE RPA GARRISON IN GITARAMA.

ii) A SECOND TEAM VISITED FOUR SECTORS IN THE KIGOMA COMMUNE AND OBSERVED COMMUNAL WORK PROJECTS UNDERWAY IN ALL OF THEM. THE LOCALS EXPRESSED NO FEELINGS OF INSECURITY.

iii) THE SECTOR COMMANDER ACCOMPANIED THE HUMAN RIGHTS MONITOR TO THE GITARAMA PRISON. THE CONDITIONS ARE APPALLING. APPROX 4200 OCCUPY A FACILITY DESIGNED FOR 1000. FEW PRISONERS HAVE

ROOM TO LIE DOWN. MOST ARE CONFINED TO AN OPEN COURTYARD AND ARE SO TIGHTLY PACKED IN THAT THEY MUST SLEEP IN SHIFTS. AS MENTIONED EARLIER, IT IS BELIEVED THAT MANY MORE PRISONERS WILL NEED ACCOMODATION BEFORE THE COURTS CAN BE SET UP TO DEAL WITH THEM. FOR THIS REASON, SOME ATTEMPT TO ASSIST THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES TO EXPAND THEIR DETENTION FACILITIES WOULD SEEM TO BE ESSENTIAL. POW TYPE CAGES MIGHT BE CONSIDERED AS A TEMPORARY MEASURE.

i) ONE TEAM VISITED THE RUNDA COMMUNE TO UPDATE SECTOR INFO FILES AND GATHER DATA ON MASS GRAVES. NO MAJOR PROBLEMS BUT SEEDS AND TOOLS ARE STILL IN SHORT SUPPLY. THE RPA HAVE A PLATOON STATIONED NEAR THE COMMUNE HQ COMMANDED BY A SERGEANT. CARE INTERNATIONAL WAS OBSERVED DISTRIBUTING FOOD.

THE TEAM WAS INVITED TO COME BACK FOR A DETAILED RECCE OF MASS GRAVE SITES. THE COMMUNE IS FENCING THESE OFF AND IS PLANNING TO BUILD MONUMENTS AT EACH.

iii) DURING A VISIT TO MURAMA COMMUNE, A MILOB TEAM WAS ADVISED THAT THEFTS OF CATTLE BY FORMER MILITIA MEMBERS IN THE RUKONDO CAMP CONTINUE TO BE A PROBLEM DESPITE RPA PATROLS. THE BOURGEMESTRES OF BOTH MURAMA AND MASANGO BELIEVE THAT THE HIGH NUMBER OF RECENT RETURNEES ON FOOT IS DUE TO THEIR RECENT UNREO SPONSORED VISITS TO RUKONDO.

iv) A TEAM VISITED NTONGWE COMMUNE TO OBSERVE THE ARRIVAL OF RETURNING IDPS AND TO ASSESS THE EFFICIENCY OF THE PROCEDURE

REPORTED YESTERDAY. IT DID NOT GO WELL. WE PARTED AMICABLY ENOUGH AFTER AN HOUR OF HEATED DISCUSSION IN WHICH HE REVEALED THAT HIS WHOLE FAMILY HAD BEEN MASSACRED ALONG WITH 12000 OTHER MEMBERS OF HIS COMMUNE. THE CONVOY FINALLY ARRIVED WITH 7 MEN, 10 WOMEN AND 35 CHILDREN. WE HAD BEEN ADVISED TO EXPECT 38. TOMORROW, A MILOB TEAM WILL GO TO THE BUTARE WAY STATION TO TRY TO DISCOVER WHERE THE MIX UP OCCURS.

UNHCR WILL ADVISE US DIRECTLY ONCE THEIR BUSES ARE LOADED AND WILL GIVE NUMBERS AND DESTINATIONS. IDPS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO DISEMBARK ANYWHERE EXCEPT AT THE ORC IN THEIR COMMUNE. FIRST TRIAL FAILED AS, AFTER UNHCR DULY ADVISED US OF THE IMPENDING ARRIVAL OF 35 IDPS AT KIGOMA, ONLY ONE WOMAN AND CHILD SHOWED UP. IT IS BELIEVED THAT THE REST MANAGED TO DISEMBARK ALONG THE WAY. THE BOURGEMESTRE IS VERY ANNOYED. WE WILL MODIFY THE PROCEDURE TOMORROW IN COOPERATION WITH UNHCR.

GENERAL

1. THE SITUATION REMAINS CALM IN THE SECTOR THOUGH THERE WERE SEVERAL MINOR INCIDENTS WHICH MAY HAVE A SIGNIFICANT IMPACT ON OP RETOUR. COMMERCIAL ACTIVITIES HAVE IMPROVED STEADILY OVER THE PAST FEW WEEKS AND THIS WEEK THERE WAS A NOTICEABLE AIR OF OPTIMISM IN THE LARGER TOWNS.

RPA ACTIVITIES

2. THE LOCAL RPA UNITS HAVE CARRIED ON WITH ROUTINE PATROLLING AND SECURITY DUTIES. THE LOCAL BRIGADE AND BATTALION COMMANDERS HAVE BEEN VERY COOPERATIVE THIS WEEK AND ON SEVERAL OCCASIONS HAVE TAKEN THE INITIATIVE TO CONTACT US TO DISCUSS ISSUES OF MUTUAL CONCERN. SEVERAL OF THEIR OFFICERS AND SENIOR NCOS ATTENDED THE MALICOY CELEBRATIONS OF MALI NATIONAL ARMY DAY.

MORE IMPORTANTLY, WE HAVE FOUND WAYS TO SHARE THE INFORMATION WITH HUMAN RIGHTS AND HUMANITARIAN ORGANIZATIONS.

5. THE INCIDENT RESULTING FROM A PRECIPITOUSLY ORGANIZED COMMUNE VISIT BY IDPS FROM CYANIKA IN WHICH THREE IDPS WERE ARRESTED HAS BEEN THOROUGHLY ANALYZED AND DISCUSSED BY A COMMITTEE CONSISTING OF REPS FROM UNREO, UNHCR, UNAMIR, UNHCHR AND THE RPA. THE THREE PERSONS DETAINED WILL NOT BE RELEASED DESPITE THE EFFORTS OF CIVPOL, UNHCHR AND UNAMIR. IT WAS AGREED BY ALL THAT FUTURE SUCH VISITS SHOULD BE MUCH BETTER PLANNED AND THAT THE PLANNING SHOULD INCLUDE THE PROVISION OF A LIST OF VISITORS THAT CAN BE VETTED BY THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES TO AVOID A REPETITION. THE RPA LO PRESENT CONFIRMED THE PREVIOUSLY UNDERSTOOD ARRANGEMENT THAT PERSONS IN THE ORCS WOULD BE CONSIDERED TO BE UNDER UN PROTECTION BUT REQUESTED THAT WE DO OUR UTMOST TO AVOID BRINGING "MURDERERS" FACE TO FACE WITH THE FAMILIES OF THEIR VICTIMS. THE NEXT VISIT IS PLANNED FOR NEXT WEEK TO KIGOMA.

9. VERY FEW RETURNING IDPS THIS WEEK TO THIS SECTOR. THE DAMAGE DONE TO THE PROGRAMME AS A RESULT OF THE NTONGWE IS NOT LIKELY TO BE FATAL BUT MAY REQUIRE A LITTLE PATIENCE TO OVERCOME. THE CONCEPT OF COMMUNE VISITS SHOULD BE REVIEWED SINCE, NO MATTER WHAT SYSTEM WE USE, WE CAN ANTICIPATE THAT WE WILL BRING MURDERERS FACE TO FACE WITH RELATIVES OF THEIR VICTIMS AT SOME POINT. THE LOCAL AUTHORITIES CAN HARDLY BE BLAMED FOR MAKING ARRESTS IN THESE CASES.

#### HUMANITARIAN ACTIVITIES

10. MALICOY PROVIDED 3 TRUCKS FOR RELIEF WORK AND LOANED ONE TRUCK TO THE PREFECT OF GITARAMA TO COMPLETE ROAD REPAIRS ON THE GITARAMA KIGALI ROAD. MALAWICOY PROVIDED 2 TRUCKS PER DAY FOR RELIEF WORK.

11. MALICOY PROVIDED MEDICAL TREATMENT TO 157 RWANDESE; MALAWICOY TO 56.

12. THERE WERE 82 PERSONS CROSSING INTO RWANDA FROM BURUNDI DURING THIS PERIOD FIGURES GOING THE OTHER WAY ARE BEING HELD AT YOUR HQ WITH THE FOUR SITREPS THAT WE HAVE NOT RECEIVED.

#### ASSESSMENT


13. RELATIONS WITH THE RPA CONTINUE TO IMPROVE. THEIR WILLINGNESS TO DEAL WITH LOCAL ISSUES AND TO CONTRIBUTE TO POLICY WITH RESPECT TO IDP SECURITY IS SEEN AS PROMISING. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT THE RPA POSITION IS THAT IF THEY DO NOT ARREST ACCUSED PERSONS THEN THEY RUN THE RISK OF ANARCHY AS AGGRIEVED INDIVIDUALS TAKE VENGEANCE. THUS, EVEN THOUGH THEY DO NOT YET HAVE A FUNCTIONING JUDICIAL SYSTEM, THEY MUST ACT NOW AS THE LESSER OF TWO EVILS.

14. OF LINGERING CONCERN IS THE IDEA OF ENCOURAGING THE RETURN OF IDPS TO COMMUNES WHERE THEIR PRESENCE IS RESENTED. THE REACTION AT LOCAL LEVEL IS NOT ALWAYS CLEAR BUT IT IS EVIDENT THAT THE MASSACRES HAVE NOT BEEN FORGOTTEN. BOTH HUTU AND TUTSI HAVE REASON TO FEAR EACH OTHER. REPATRIATION WILL, TO SOME DEGREE, RECREATE THE CONDITIONS THAT EXISTED BEFORE THE MASSACRES OF APRIL AND MAY. OUR MOST PRESSING TASK IN THIS SECTOR IS THEREFORE CONSIDERED TO BE THE MAINTENANCE OF CLOSE CONTACT WITH THE COMMUNE AND SECTOR AUTHORITIES TO MONITOR THE MOOD OF THE PEOPLE. TO THIS END, PERSONNEL STABILITY IN THE SECTOR IS CRITICAL AS CLOSE CONTACT

DEPENDS VERY MUCH ON PERSONAL RELATIONS THAT TAKE TIME TO ESTABLISH. IT IS ALSO SUGGESTED THAT AN ACTIVE PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN IN BOTH THE CAMPS AND THE COMMUNES WILL BE ESSENTIAL TO AN EVENTUAL RECONCILIATION.

15. OF FURTHER CONCERN IS THE INABILITY OF UNAMIR TO SEE WHAT GOES ON IN THE NIGHT. THE RPA ARE VERY ACTIVE IN THIS AREA AT NIGHT. THEY GO OUT READY FOR TROUBLE AND SEEM QUITE EFFECTIVE IN DOMINATING THE COUNTRYSIDE. THE PROSPECT OF UNAMIR CONDUCTING NIGHT PATROLS IN AREAS WHERE THE RPA ARE OPERATING IS RATHER DAUNTING GIVEN THE DISADVANTAGES THAT WE WOULD BE OPERATING UNDER. IT SHOULD BE NOTED THAT THE RPA SEEM TO ENJOY THE ACTIVE SUPPORT OF THE POPULATION AND THAT THERE HAVE BEEN SEVERAL INCIDENTS RECENTLY IN WHICH LOCALS HAVE SUCCESSFULLY CALLED ON THE RPA TO CHASE AWAY BANDITS.

GENERAL

1. The general situation in the sector was calm. There were no unusual movements of any RPA, RGF or militia activity except in TONGWE where some RPA troops deployed due to alleged Militia activity. No political activities were reported during the week.

2. MILOBS in the sector continued to patrol and monitor the movement of displaced persons. Some assistance was given to displaced persons trying to return to their homes and those trying to locate their families. Humanitarian assistance and activities increased substantially this week.

SITUATION

3. RPA. On 21 Sep 94, RPA 101 Bn comd reported to Sector 3 Comd that he was deploying some troops to the NTONGWE (9057) area to flush out Interahmwe reported to be operating in the area. It is not yet known how many troops were deployed or the exact areas of their deployment.

4. RGF/Militia. No activity was reported on the RGF and Militia except alleged Militia activities in NTONGWE area.

5. Local Population. Commercial activities in most communes have increased. Also primary schools in the sector re-opened on 22 Sep 94. In BUTARE, a large percentage of those who reported (85%) were girls. It is believed that most of the boys absent are either displaced persons, refugees, or were killed during the war. The Minister of Education on 22 Sep 94, announced in BUTARE that the government intended to employ teachers from BURUNDI to beef up the strength of the teaching staff. he also announced the imminent payment of teachers' salaries. In GITARAMA, three which school were visited by MILOBS reported that some of the teachers and a lot of the pupils did not report. There are also reported to shortages of stationery and furniture. Schools visited were at RULI, and GITARAMA.

OPERATIONAL MATTERS.

6. MILOBS Ops. Highlights of MILOB ops during the week are as follows:

a. 17 Sep 94. DCMO, CHAC, and sector Comd held a

conference with RPA 301 Bde Comd at BUTARE to discuss ways of reducing the time for screening the refugees along the western boundary of the sector. RPA Comd insisted that the process was the only way he could be sure that those there were no security threats among the returnees. He also revealed that he had issued instructions to his troops to allow UNAMIR troops freedom of movement.

b. 21 Sep 94. Sector comd convened a conference with all the NGOs operating in the sector. Reps of all NGOs present briefed the conference on their activities, areas of specialisation and operation and future plans. The conference was aimed at coordinating the activities of the NGOs operating in the sector to avoid duplication of effort.

c. 17 and 18 Sep 94. MILOBS in GITARAMA and BUTARE combined with MALAWICOY troops and trucks assisted displaced persons who wanted to move back home or search for their relatives within the sector with transport. Details will be covered under humanitarian activities.

d. Location of Displaced Persons' Camps. Some new camps were located in the sector. The general concentration is around commune centres within the sector.

#### ADMIN MATTERS

7. Str as at 22 Sep 94 is as Follows:

a. MILOBS

(1) Posted Str.	-	35.

b. MALAWICOY. 7 Officers and 160 men.

8. Medical. One NCO from MALAWICOY was injured when he fell from a rotten roof on 21 Sep 94. He has since been admitted to the Australian Med Centre in KIGALI and is being treated for fractures to the arm and the hip.

9. CTO/Pay. There is a lot of controversy about the payment of MSA to MILOBS on CTO. Information available indicates that MILOBS on 12 days accumulated CTO will be paid only 6 days MSA, thereby losing MSA for the remainder of the days. This information is lowering morale and a policy letter to clear the air will be of great help.

#### LOGISTICS MATTERS.

10. Transport. The current low veh holdings in the sector are well known. It is however recommended that in the light of the

forthcoming OP HOMEWARD, 4 vehicles be released to this HQ as a matter of urgency. This is the absolute minimum transport requirement if all the earmarked check points are to be permanently manned in addition to escort of convoys through the sector.

11. Communication. Comms have improved slightly but it is still difficult to communicate with MILOB teams on patrol. It is recommended that this issue is tackled as a matter of urgency.

#### HUMANITARIAN ISSUES.

12. Displaced Persons. MILOBS in the sector monitored the following numbers of displaced persons at the under-listed locations.

- a. MASAKA (9840) - 300.
- b. NGOMA (9371) - 140.
- c. MUKINGA (9065) - 600.
- d. MUGINA (9268) - 600.

13. Refugees. On the following dates, the under-listed numbers of refugees were reported to have been processed through the check point at KIZI.

- a. 18 Sep 94. 450 persons.
- b. 19 Sep 94. 1013 persons.
- c. 20 Sep 94. 2850 persons.
- d. 21 Sep 94. 1000 persons.

14. Location of families/Transport for Returning Displaced Persons.

- a. On 17 and 18 Sep 94, MILOBS and MALAWICOY troops assisted a total of 36 families to locate their relatives in the RWAMIKO (4914) area. 15 relatives were found.
- b. On 18 Sep 94, 20 returnees headed for RUHANGO (7654) and NTONGWE (8957) were assisted with trucks provided by MALAWICOY to return home.

15. NGO's Activities.

- a. CONCERN. CONCERN distributed more than 3500 hoes to the people in the MUKINDI (7061) and distributed food items in MUSAMBIRA.
- b. ICRC. ICRC has been documenting displaced persons in

GITARAMA Prefecture for the distribution of food, seeds and plastic sheeting to be used as shelter. After detailed assessment, it was decided that all persons in the selected communes should benefit because they all needed help. The distribution programme is to be carried out in two phases. Phase I is to begin in the first week of Oct 94. Phase II is to start in the first week of Nov 94. The communes to benefit are as follows:

- (1) MUSAMBIRA.
- (2) NTONGWE.
- (3) MUGINA.
- (4) MURAMA.
- (5) TAMBWE.

c. Food for the Hungry. 33 tons of food items meant for distribution in GITARAMA were moved to a store house in KABGAYI with the assistance of MALAWICOY.

d. MSF. Food and seeds were distributed as follows on 20 Sep 94:

- a. MAZA (7334) - 8,000 persons.
- b. RUSATIRA (7431) - 20,000 persons.
- c. NYABISINDU (7138) - 22,504 persons.

e. Other NGOs continued with their normal activities during the week.



I shall handle the essential elements of this SITREP + 11/10

1. SITREP 2000 9 Oct - 1100 10 Oct.

2. CAS 320 Ptl to RUKIRA discovered several mass graves after assistance by a local. In area of GR 635526. several in close proximity average size 5x4 m. Each grave holds approx. 100-150 people. Atrocities occurred 14-15 APR 74. They were committed by the INTERHAMWE led by a militiaman called GATETE from MURAMBI in the ~~BY~~ BYUMBA area. His ZIC was NIYONSHUTI. They were the organizers of the killings in the RUKIRA-RURENGE area. The area GR 6462 to GR 6762 to GR 6548 to GR 6248. The local village leader and all those we were talking to were adamant that 10,000 people were killed in the area by GATETE and follow. The people were collected, bound and ~~and~~ killed beside the pits which they fell into.

3. The killers are reported to be in the DENACO camp. The local village elder expressed what is becoming a common theme. They wish to be


3 cont. to tell their people that it is safe to return and that life is returning to normal. The only power the INTERHAMWE have is in the camps through disinformation and intimidation. The elder asked me if it was possible to have transport and security <sup>and from</sup> to the camps to free his people from the INTERHAMWE. An operation by ~~the~~ UNAMIR in conjunction with TANZANIA taking the elders to the camps would be welcomed by the elders. The need for accurate information <sup>to get to</sup> the refugees is paramount. The feeling is that the elders could persuade their people to return and defeat the INTERHAMWE propaganda. All they wish from us is the mechanism to facilitate transport and ensure security.

4. Security Sit General. Despite local rep of INTERHAMWE activity in the N 2B my patrols have not been able to substantiate or confirm INTERHAMWE presence. Fear is a potent weapon which the INTERHAMWE is

will not find any posters or

4 cont. deliberate or coordinated campaign by the INTERHAMWE. The villagers concern is genuine but based on fear and uncertainty. Also the record of atrocities committed by the INTERHAMWE makes even the slightest suggestion of a return cause for alarm/concern in their ~~eyes~~ villagers eyes. INTERHAMWE/BANDI Activity on the borders have been limited to looting and theft. Further we have had no reps of civilians being attacked. As reported previously the hospitals in KIBUNGO and RWAMAGANA have not had a machette or gunshot wound for 5-6 weeks. The only incidents in 2B were the encountered/ambush of the RPA veh 25 Sep and the grenade/booby trap incident 29 Sep. I believe the situation at present in 2B is stable <sup>liv.</sup> and people wish to get on with their ~~liv.~~ The sector is certainly safer than the refugee camps that ~~are~~ due to disinform people are reluctant to leave.

5 I have recieved reports that UNHCR and other NGOs still believe that the security situation in SE RWANDA (Sector 2B) is such that ~~refugees~~ no attempt to repatriate refugees should be made at this time. The assessment is based on unsubstantiated reports, incomplete information and incorrect information. The assessment has not even taken into account that there is a UNAMIR presence, several NGOs and a UNHRC office in KIBUNGO. HQ UNAMIR should get subject report to confirm its contents. I would be more than pleased to discuss the SIT in 2B with any NGO. Otherwise such disinformation is at cross purposes with UNAMIR, undermines the mission in 2B and is not in accordance with those in RWANDA who wish there friends and family to return to restart there lives

Village GR 549 900 - 150 pers - 90% still in BURUNDI - left 12 Apr and returned last week. Local complained of lack of guidance at the commune level, lack of social structure other than check points. Crops and homes being fixed with resources avail.  
Have not seen or heard of any Interhamwe  
Did not rep any security problems. Med care 7km away.
3. Village GR 552 898 - Orphanage and school - Save The Children - 85% 0-5 yrs old, 15% 5-25yrs. Using older children to assist staff to care for 150 children. Children are logged in and attempts are made to find NOK or relatives. Compassion International supplies the bulk of the basics. Water is delivered by trailer 2 times daily from RWAMAGANA. Med problems are mostly malaria, worms, respiratory disorders - the staff have little supplies to treat them. No looting or security problem as RPA visits orphanage on a regular basis.



4. PRISON - GR 498 877. In disrepair and is abandoned. Structure is sound and the well is being used by the local pop. One room appears to have been used for executions. The corner wall was bullet riddled with a large template of splattered blood. No sign of graves, bones or expended ammo.
5. Village - GR 493 893 - Locals rep 6-10 INTERHAMWE/MILITIA living in the ~~town~~ village. Also rep a large number G2 (could not get a specific number) living in the hills GR 5188. They come into the village randomly and have placed posters and leaflets stating they are going to start killings again soon. The villagers believe that this will happen. The INTERHAMWE are armed with machette, spears, arrows and small arms.
6. Village - NSINDA - GR 493 893 - Pop 1000 approx 300 killed. Locals rep most INTERHAMWE have fled to TANZANIA but some are still around. When seen the people have been pointing them out and the RPA arrest them. The locals described the methods of the murders. Pregnant women were cut open shown their fetus and made to watch the fetus be decapitated.

6cont. The mother once witnessing her child murdered would then be killed. Others were rounded up and put in a house, The house was then torched, those attempting to escape were machetted as they fled. Second week of April is when the killings took place. The murderers were from KIGALI and killed those they came upon as they withdrew to TANZANIA. Nearest hospital in RWAMAGANA has many machette wounds. Latest date of wounds will be checked on 7 Oct. Locals also report many were killed by RGF mostly shot. Those surviving did so by hiding in the hills and bush.

7. Village - KINIWGA - GR 534 885 - Pop was 5000 about 60% are back. ~~to~~ A lot of people rep killed, no numbers given. Village has organized their own secur force as no RPA around. Pop fled to TANZANIA in May and returned in Sep. Locals also claim INTERHAMWE amongst them. School is open but lacks supplies (common problem). Nearest med facility RWAMAGANA. Locals rep people stealing bananas, could be INTERHAMWE for subsistence.

7. Village - GIKAGA - GR 545 865 - Pop 6000 over 1000 killed. INTERHAMWE and RGF were culprits, machette primarily used. Pop fled in May via RUSUMO bridge on MSR - started returning in JUN and still returning. RPF visit weekly. Some INTERHAMWE still living in village RPA apparently knows but ~~has~~ not arrested these people yet. Villagers are afraid, to the point they will not go to hospital because they fear INTERHAMWE attacking them enroute. Locals cleaned up atrocities themselves, burying people by their homes. Most people killed Tutsi and wealthy HUTUS.

8. GENERAL. The North portion of 2B in area bounded by RWAMAGANA - MSR - KAYONZA - KABARONDO - ANA GR 4879 appears to be an area of continued INTERHAMWE influence and activity. The lack of RPA off the main tracks has allowed the condition to exist. Will increase presence in this area to try to reassure villagers. Villagers have a strong desire to get on with their lives and require seeds for planting and supplies for schools. A common theme was for local direction and assistance. (for self help)

8 cont. Routes in N 2B are mostly overgrown and too narrow for AVGP. Access to interior mostly by foot, therefore good hiding area for INTERHAMWE. Medical problems of malaria and parasites ~~are~~ common to area.

9. Other Forces. Villagers speak highly of RPA and rep no reprisals or atrocities committed by them. We have not encountered any difficulties at check points in 2B other than MSR to KIGALI reported previously.

10. INTERHAMWE - RGF. People make a clear distinction between RGF and INTERHAMWE. INTERHAMWE committed most atrocities by machette. RGF was contented to simply shoot people.

11. Total kms ptl 6 Oct - 386 km.

12. Future Ops - Will continue presence in N 2B until 8 Oct. Will shift ~~to~~ c/s 32 to SC 2B and SW 2B 8 and 9 Oct. latent ptl cap to continue visitations to N 2B.

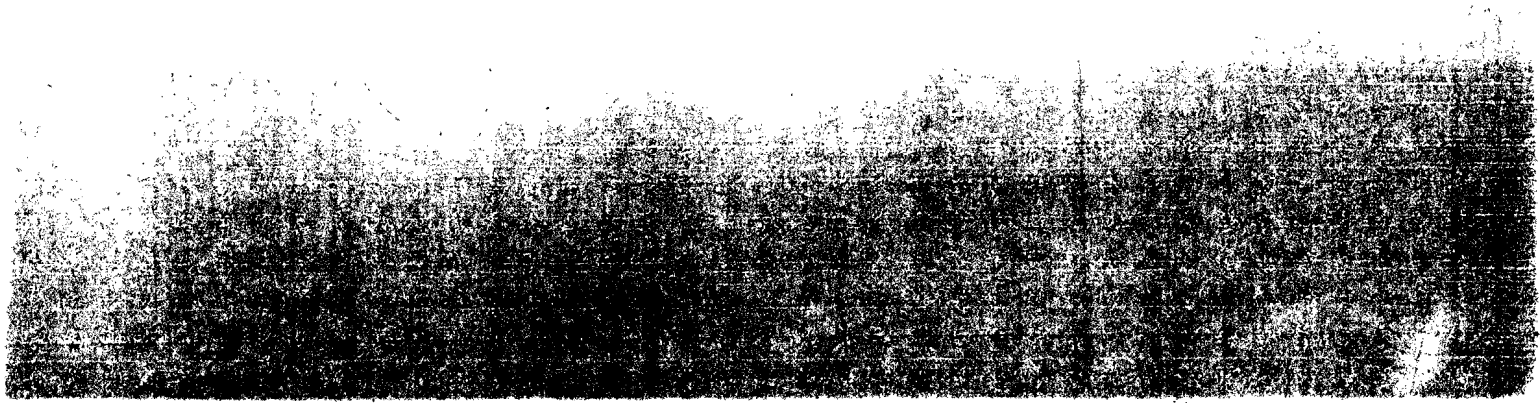
